**ABC BELMONT TELECAST EARNS EMMY NOMINATION** ABC Sports has been nominated for a Sports Emmy for Outstanding Live Sports Special for its telecast of the 1998 Belmont S. The telecast, hosted by Al Michaels and Jim McKay, was produced by Curt Gowdy, Jr. and directed by Craig Janoff. This is the second consecutive year that ABC Sports' horse racing coverage has been nominated for this award. Nominated in the same category this year: FOX network's coverage of Mark McGuire's record-breaking 62nd home run; the Pepsi 400 at Daytona on TNN; Super Bowl XXXII on NBC; and the Daytona 500 on CBS. Since 1986, ABC Sports has won two Emmy Awards for its Triple Crown telecasts and six Eclipse Awards for outstanding Thoroughbred racing coverage.

**DEHERE JUVENILES TOP OBS SPRING OPENER** Second-crop sire Dehere boasted the top-selling colt and filly at the opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training, which got underway in Ocala, Florida yesterday. Hip #126, a colt by Dehere out of GSP La Rouquine (GB) (Silly Season) was the day's best seller, attracting a bid of \$240,000. Consigned by Hoby and Layna Kight, agent, and purchased by Breckenridge Bloodstock, agent, the bay is a half-brother to Red Bishop (Silver Hawk), hero of the GI San Juan Capistrano and a stakes winner in England and Hong Kong as well, and MGSW Pennine Ridge (Cure the Blues). A filly by Dehere out of SW Noise Enough (Bold Ruckus) from the Blazing Meadows Farm consignment, who posted the fastest quarter of :21 2/5 at last Wednesday's Under Tack Show, brought the second-highest price on the day, going for \$150,000 to Kaaren and Hays Biggs. The opening-day average of \$23,901 was up 30 percent from last year's first session. The buyback percentage was up slightly, from 30 percent in '98 to 33 percent this year. The four-day sale continues today at 10:30 a.m.

### Baffert Looking to Test Excellent Meeting:

Trainer Bob Baffert was hoping to get a gauge on the Derby prospects of Excellent Meeting (General Meeting), but Nick Zito turned down an offer to work Gil Wood Memorial winner Adonis (Kris S.) in company with the filly. "I told him they don't pay off in the morning," said Zito. "He was serious. He said, 'let's work them together. I want to see if I have a Derby horse.'"

Excellent Meeting went out by herself and zipped a bullet five furlongs in :59 4/5 at Churchill. "It's a good thing (Adonis) didn't go with her," Baffert said. "She did it real easy." As for the Derby, he said, "The mile and a quarter with Silverbulletday might stretch her a little bit, but this filly, well, she was really good today. I have to see what develops."

Adonis went five-eighths on his own in 1:04 1/5. "We just wanted him to get a feel for the track and make sure he came out of the Wood OK," said Zito.

### Derby Work Tab:

Trainer Elliott Walden worked both of his Kentucky Derby hopefuls yesterday at Churchill Downs. GI Toyota Blue Grass hero Menifee (Harlan) went five furlongs in an easy 1:03 3/5 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:17 3/5, while Ecton Park (Forty Niner) went five-eighths in 1:02 2/5 and was out three-quarters in 1:15. "Menifee had a tough race in the Blue Grass and I wanted him to have an easy work, which he did," said Walden. "He handled the track well, switched leads well and he didn't bobble or have the track cup out from under him like you see horses do sometimes when they don't handle the track." Ecton Park worked with blinkers on. "We had him sit back and eat some dirt and then finish in front of (his workmate) and it worked out well," said the trainer. "I felt...when the dirt hit him in the face, he started throwing his head and losing his action. We wanted the to give him something that might shield him a little bit."

K One King (Apalachee) went five furlongs in 1:02 with jockey Alex Solis in the irons. "He relaxed the first part and then picked it up around the turn," Solis said. "I was impressed with him."

Godolphin's Derby duo of **Worldly Manner** (Riverman) and **Aljabr** (Storm Cat) arrived in Lexington yesterday afternoon and will spend two days in quarantine at Keeneland.

**Epic Honor Out of Derby, Talk's Cheap To Preakness?:**

**Epic Honor** (Honor Grades), fourth in the GII Coolmore Lexington S., will skip the Kentucky Derby and instead point for the May 8 GII Illinois Derby at Hawthorne. But the Preakness may have picked up a new starter in Saturday's Federico Tesio winner **Talk's Cheap** (Corporate Report). The colt is not nominated to the Triple Crown, so it would cost owner Team Canonie \$100,000 to supplement him. "We'll consider it," said Tony Canonie. "We'll see how he comes out of the race and then we'll see what happens in the Derby."

Near the back of the pack early, the colt circled the field in deep stretch and just got up. "Actually, I wanted him to take the lead, but he was not on the bit in the first stage of the race. I trusted the colt and he showed his impressive performance in the stretch," said rider Ryuji Wada. Scoring his first Group 1 win, trainer Ichizo Iwamoto said, "He hurt his left back leg after his debut (last August) and I couldn't even think about this race at that time, but he recovered nicely. We'll do our best to keep him ready for the Derby."

Suehiro Commander raced along in mid-pack before angling to the outside for his stretch rally. The colt showed a brilliant turn of foot in deep stretch to get up late for his first graded-stakes triumph. "The pace was very fast, but I was able to take him back in good position," commented winning rider Shinji Fujita. "I was very confident today--when I asked him, he was right there." Favored Sun Place (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who had won seven graded stakes in a row coming into this race, could manage only a fourth-place showing.

**Bertrando S. cont.**

Veteran Vetheuil, winner of the 1996 G2 Prix du Muguet for trainer Andre Fabre, has accounted for only 12 starts in the three years since that victory. He made his U.S. bow in December of '96, but went on the shelf for nearly 14 months after only two American starts. The chestnut managed only three outings last season, winning the May 23 Fastness H. and ending the campaign with a fourth-place finish in the June 14 GII Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile. He came back following a nine-month absence to be sixth in a Mar. 19 Santa Anita allowance and was making his second start off the layoff here. Let go at 10-1, he was squeezed back at the break and trailed the field through six furlongs in 1:09 3/5, but rallied from between horses at the top of the lane and finished fastest of all to win going away.

The third choice in the short field of four, the filly dropped back to last and closed determinedly down the stretch to just get her nose in front of favored Olympic Charmer at the wire. "I didn't want to go too early, so I was just hoping that these guys would stop a little bit," explained winning rider David Flores. "At the eighth pole, she responded so beautifully. She gradually got into gear in the stretch, but she was at full speed the last sixteenth." Trainer Bill Morey, Jr. added, "It looked like the last jump she got a good (head) bob, she just got there. Photos are luck; when you win them, you're lucky. When you don't, you're unlucky." Olympic Charmer, second behind Three Ring in the GII Bonnie Miss S. in her latest, bobbed at the start, took a short lead at midstretch, but couldn't hold off the winner.

Storm Cat, as usual, is having a very good year and so too--to a lesser extent--is Summer Squall, the other Grade I winner sired by Storm Bird from a Secretariat mare. From a crop of around 47 three-year-olds, the Lane's End Farm stallion has already been represented by such talented performers as Weekend Squall (third in the GI Las Virgenes S.), Capsized (third to Desert Hero and Prime Timber in the GII San Rafael S.), Leave Us Leap (stakes-placed in France) and Charismatic, the ultra-tough colt who picked up over \$230,000 for his win in the GII Coolmore Lexington.

Charismatic fully deserves a shot at the Kentucky Derby, a race in which Summer Squall filled second place behind Unbridled in 1990 before turning the tables in the Preakness. As Summer Squall is a half-brother to A.P. Indy, winner of the Belmont S., Charismatic has the right connections for the Triple Crown events. He also shares the same third dam, Grass Shack, as champion sire Deputy Minister.

Summer Squall, A.P. Indy and their half-brother Honor Grades are just three of the many stallions who have the magnificent Secretariat as their broodmare sire, others being Chief's Crown, Gone West, Atticus, Mujadil (a Storm Bird horse doing very nicely in Ireland), Sword Dance (Ire) and Dehere.

With Secretariat in their pedigrees, some of these stallions made an interesting match for mares whose bloodlines feature Sir Gaylord, another top-class son of Secretariat's dam Somethingroyal.

The merits of this cross have been well advertised by the success it brought Chief's Crown, whose top-class European sons Be My Chief and Grand Lodge are both inbred 4x4 to Princequillo's daughter Somethingroyal through Secretariat and Sir Gaylord.

Similar inbreeding also appears in the pedigree of Chief's Crown's Grade III winner Three Fanfares, whose dam was by Drone, one of Sir Gaylord's most successful sons. Drone is also the sire of Charismatic's dam Bali Babe and his daughters have also produced stakes winners from comparatively few matings with Gone West and Storm Cat. This is clearly an avenue worthy of further exploration.

The mating between Bali Babe and Summer Squall takes this inbreeding one step further. Charismatic is not only inbred to Secretariat's dam, but also to his sire Bold Ruler, through Secretariat himself, and What a Pleasure, the champion sire responsible for Charismatic's second dam, Polynesian Charm.

The idea of inbreeding to Bold Ruler has obviously been one of the motivations of Tom and Ben Roach of Parrish Hill Farm as Tom Roach paid only \$7,700 for Bali Babe at Keeneland's 1987 January Sale. The stallion selected for her in 1989 was Magesterial, a Northern Dancer horse whose dam was by Bold Lad (by Bold Ruler out of Princequillo's fabulous daughter Misty Morn). This mating produced 4x4 to Bold Ruler, 5x5 to Princequillo and duplications of Polynesian, Mahmoud and Turn-to. This inbreeding worked, in that it produced Tossofthecoin, a horse at least as good as his sire. Although he finished last in the 1993 Kentucky Derby, Tossofthecoin went on to become a Grade II winner in the Mervyn LeRoy H. and to finish third behind Cigar in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup.

Summer Squall's pedigree offers many of the same things as Magesterial's and the Parrish Hill team have no reason to regret sending Bali Babe to him. Together with Will Farish, they have bred two Summer Squall colts, the first being Constant Demand, a colt weighted at 109 on the 1996 Experimental Free Handicap. The second colt, Charismatic, already has claims to being Summer Squall's best son so far and a bold run at Churchill Downs will confirm this.
