He relaxes and does everything right. I think he'll settle well, and indications are he wants to go long."

#### Indian Sun In, On the Virg Out...

In other San Felipe news, Cecil Peacock's Indian Sun (Indian Charlie) will remain in California to run in the San Felipe instead of competing in the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park Saturday. "We couldn't work out shipping arrangements," trainer Dan Hendricks said. "It would have cost us double to ship, plus he's training better, so we're going to stay." Mike McCarthy, assistant to Todd Pletcher, said On the Virg (Pulpit) would pass the race for a possible start in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 5.

#### **CURLIN WORKS FOR WORLD CUP**

Curlin (Smart Strike) returned to the work tab yesterday at Nad Al Sheba, 11 days after winning a handicap at the Dubai track in his 2008 debut. The imposing



chestnut went 1000 meters in 1:02.6 under exercise rider Carmen "Carlos" Rosas in a workout that assistant trainer Scott Blasi termed "awesome." "He was traveling very well and looked great," Blasi addded. "Carlos does such a great job. I told him to go in 1:03 and that's about as close as you can get. You could tell Curlin M Pinheiro was very comfortable with where he was at. He had

Do you think the current method of preparing and offering two-year-olds for sale is the appropriate one for both the buying public and the horses themselves? How do breeze shows, the time of year and lack of uniform medication rules, among other things, affect them?

#### International Bloodstock Agent Rollin Baugh:


I think there are an awful lot of people in the industry who know exactly what my mindset is. We haven't handled a consignment group since 1996 when we sold

the Keck horses in dispersal. We sold those because we could do exactly what we wanted, and didn't apply what I considered unnecessary pressure to the horses. We galloped them strongly up to the sale, and they were by Danzig and Mr. Prospector, so it's not like I was giving away a whole lot. I've declined to participate, and the people who do it now are super-sophisticated. I

have declined to do it because I don't consider it an appropriate path for horses to take at that point in their year. That said, I'm aware that statistics show they hold up as well as any alternate preparation, but when you look at the number of outs at these sales and the buyback rate, it strikes me that the evidence shows at that stage that the horse is placed in a position where they have to do too much and that's not something they need to be doing. There are hundreds, if not thousands, of horses that passed under our consignment banner, but at the end of the day, it represents something inappropriate to me. The buyers go after the type they feel is best suited, and they do everything they feel they can to make it come out right. Cont. p3





# Juestion of the month Continued...

#### Rollin Baugh cont.

We've had some successes and Grade I winners, but that was back in the day when they didn't have to do as much. There aren't as many people who are interested in doing it now. It's a narrow market in terms of whose horses get to the sale, and the horses who make it to market. I'd rather buy them, quite frankly, privately off good farms even before they get to the September sale, and there are some people willing to sell them that way. I reduce it to one comment: I enjoyed the industry much more when it was a racing-horse industry rather than a selling-horse industry.

#### **OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura:**

Consignors of two-year-olds have become extremely proficient in preparing their horses for sale. I believe the

vast majority of consignors understand the importance of giving the buyer a well-educated, sound racehorse and prepare the horses appropriately. While time is certainly an important aspect of the pre-sale breeze, the manner in which the horse moves has become even more important in recent years. The video of the breeze not only highlights a good-moving horse under an easy ride, but is also unforgiving to the horse being ridden hard or with less fluid action. In my opinion, consign-

ors are more willing to spare a fraction of a second if it will present a better-looking breeze and video.

Buyers of two-year-olds have become more sophisticated in their approach, as well, considering many factors prior to bidding.

Again, while time is a consideration, the manner in which the horse breezes, overall athleticism, conformation, pedigree, stride and cardio analysis, biomechanics, attitude, consignor past performance and veterinary information are all part of the equation.

One of the major attractions of two-year-old sales is the buyer gets an opportunity to watch the horses perform under tack. Obviously, the breeze shows provide the buyer more information than available for horses sold as weanlings or yearlings. Being able to watch the horse perform adds important information in projecting future racing performance and soundness.

The notion that two-year-olds are asked too much too early is not valid. In fact, the OBSFEB Sale, the first sale of the year, has consistently produced the highest percentage of stakes winners in industry studies, outperforming all sales of any kind including yearling sales.

In general, two-year-old sales continue to produce racehorses competing at the very top of the game. The days of the stereotypical precocious two year olds or sprinters are long gone. Just glance at any weekend stakes results or Kentucky Derby prospects to see the impact two-year-old sale graduates are making.

Regarding medication, sales companies have been proactive in adopting policies for the benefit of the well being of the horse and the protection of the buyer. Consignors have welcomed and supported the effort. Medication policy is a constant work in progress the sales companies continue to monitor. It is in the best interest of the entire industry for sales companies and all other industry participants to work together addressing the use of medication at the sales and the races. In the near future, I am confident policies will be adopted throughout the nation restricting the use of anabolic steroids. It is important to realize medication is no more of an issue at two-year-old sales than other sales or at the racetrack.

Two-year-old sale graduates continue to shine on the track as they rack up stakes wins coast to coast. International buyers are increasing their participation not only taking advantage of the weakened dollar but also recognizing the potential of their purchases to compete at the highest level.

#### Liberation Farm owner Rob Whiteley:

My hat is off to the pinhookers and two-year-old sale consignors. They do a damn good job for the most part, while lodged between a rock and a hard place. Quite a few pinhookers possess some of the keenest eyes in the business, and they show tremendous horsemanship in getting a number of their hand-picked babies to the sales in one piece. Yet, the current obsession with

speed makes their job extremely difficult and defies common sense.

Asking a young, developing horse for a maximum burst of speed on a given day in February or March (and putting him or her through such a demanding preparation) doesn't prove much, and unnecessarily risks ruining the horse. I believe we need to turn back the clock to the days when we let the babies show themselves

under a strong gallop. (I think Frank Stronach has this one right when he conducts his entire sale under something close to a two minute lick.)

I think also that we are selling trainers and other real horsemen short when we suggest that they can only tell a good horse by the time it takes them to go an eighth or a quarter. This game is all about having an eye to see athletic, fluid motion, and about inferring quality and competitiveness in an untried horse. It is not about cheap speed. Real pros used to have no trouble picking out the stars when they were galloped, so where did we blow the turn? Do we really think that Richard Mandella or Mike Ryan needs to watch a horse go in :10 flat to see that it's a promising race horse? What time did Afleet Alex or Monarchos or Stevie Wonderboy work in when they were two-year-old sales horses? Go look it up.

Making astute selections involves discerning how a horse moves and uses himself, not about how fast he can pick up his feet over a couple of football fields. Photographer Eadweard Muybridge was the pioneer in motion analysis, and he did quite well using horses at a gallop. Even the contemporary stride analysis folks at DataTrack, Equix, or EQB don't require intense speed, because you can't hide inefficiencies of movement. Furthermore, individual stride analysis can still be performed meaningfully with horses galloping strongly, because an individual sale horse's score or profile is relative to all of the other horses in that sales group.

In short, and for many reasons, speed is our enemy. Training for intense speed causes too much attrition. It's hard on pinhookers who bravely make the investment, and it's obviously hard on the immature horses. At the end of the day, are we really happy selling only 35 percent of the two-year-olds catalogued for a sale? So, what will fix this dismal reality? It's time the consignors, buyers, and sales companies sat down together and figured it out.

I'm loath to admit it, but the weekend's Grade I Santa Anita victories by Ariege and Nashoba's Key brought back vivid memories of Cawston's Pride, a filly born exactly 40 years ago in England. Of course the world of 1968 was a totally different place--America was chuckling along to Rowan & Martin's Laugh-In and watching "Hair" on Broadway--and the racing world was a much simpler place, too.

With the inflationary impact of racing's superpowers, such as Robert Sangster and the Maktoums, still to come, a small owner-breeder could race a top-class filly without being inundated with those too-good-to-refuse offers which are now par for the course.

Cawston's Pride was bred on a limited budget by Len Hall, owner of a small farm in the British midlands. Hall's father bought Cawston's Pride's third dam, the tastily named Salmonella, for as little as 90 guineas. Cawston's Pride was the product of a mating between two very different animals. Her sire Con Brio, a handsome but disappointing Ribot colt, won the Brighton

Derby Trial over a mile and a half, whereas her dam, Cawston Tower, excelled over five furlongs.

Breeders often arrange this type of mating in the hope that the offspring will fall somewhere in the middle of the distance scale, but,

as often as not, the foal inherits either one parent's speed or the other's stamina. In Cawston's Pride's case, she inherited all of her dam's speed--and then some. Racing entirely over Britian's minimum distance of five furlongs, she was unbeaten in eight juvenile starts. The 1970 Free Handicap provides a good idea of her brilliance. The two-year-old colts of 1970 were a phenomenal collection, headed by My Swallow (the first horse ever to win France's big four juvenile events), Mill Reef and Brigadier Gerard. The last two were to become legends of the British turf, yet Cawston's Pride was rated virtually their equal--or superior if you add in a 3lb sex allowance to her Free Handicap assignment of 130lb. She was weighted just 3lb below My Swallow, 2lb below Mill Reef and 1lb below Brigadier Gerard. No wonder this seemingly invincible filly was compared to the legendary Mumtaz Mahal.

Unfortunately, Cawston's Pride did prove to have an Achilles heel--her temperament. After extending her winning sequence to nine on her reappearance at three, she was reluctant to go to the start when favorite for the 1000 Guineas and suffered her first defeat. Dropped back to five furlongs, she dug her toes in at the start of the King's Stand S. and was retired. It seems she inherited more than just her exceptional ability from her grandsire, Ribot, whose stock could be quirky.

Nowadays, as I hinted earlier, a filly of Cawston's Pride's extraordinary talent would almost certainly have started her broodmare career in the ownership of one of breeding's superpowers. But not in 1971. Len Hall maintained ownership of his star filly, whose earnings weren't enormous, and, as a consequence, the filly's breeding career took a somewhat unconventional path.

By the time Cawston's Pride died of a twisted gut in 1978, at the age of 10, she had produced only four foals, three of them colts. The stallion selected for her in 1973 and '74, in her second and third seasons was Comedy Star. I have a sneaking suspicion that Comedy Star was chosen partly because of his location, about 40 miles away from Mr. Hall's farm, as there was no other obvious reason for picking this handsome son of Tom Fool for so good a racemare.

Although Comedy Star enjoyed a lot of success in handicaps, he wasn't quite up to beating the best milers at stakes level. The fact that he ended his days in South Africa tells us that he wasn't an outstanding success as a stallion, but both his sons out of Cawston's Pride became group winners. The first, Cawston's Clown, won the G2 Coventry S., while the second, Solinus, developed into a champion sprinter for Robert Sangster.

Cawston's Pride's last son, Man of Vision, was conceived when his sire Never Say Die was 24 years old and seemingly well past his prime. Even so, Man of Vision was good enough to contest the Derby and earned a Timeform rating of 119.

However, it has been Cawston's Pride's only daughter, Katie May, who has proved her main legacy. Although her sire Busted was a noted source of stamina, Katie May was at her best at around a mile and ran creditably in the 1976 1000 Guineas. Katie May was sold for 20,000gns at the end of her racing career and, needless to say, proved a bargain. Four of her nine foals became stakes winners, headed by the top French filly Grise Mine and the excellent American turf mare Kostroma. Grise Mine now ranks as the second dam of Nashoba's Key (her dam Nashoba sharing the same sire, Caerleon, as Kostroma), while Kostroma is the dam of Ariege. Another of Katie May's daughters, Miss Profile, is the second dam of Carry On Katie, one of the best British juvenile fillies of 2003.

17 and now Kostroma has finally lived up to expectations with Ariege, whom she foaled as a 19-year-old. What makes this late success all the more unexpected is the fact that Ballet Pacifica's sire Minardi stood at \$12,500, while Ariege's sire, the Grade II winner Doneraile Court, was

priced at \$15,000 in 2004. Among their less successful predecessors were foals by Forty Niner, Storm Cat, Danzig and A.P. Indy.

Perhaps Hail to Reason has something to do with Ariege's talent. Doneraile Court is himself inbred 4x3 to

this champion juvenile and there's a third line in Ariege's pedigree via Caerleon's excellent second dam, Regal Gleam. Doneraile Court's Grade II-winning son Ruler's Court also has three lines of Hail to Reason (and so does his recent UAE 1000 Guineas and Oaks winner Cocoa Beach, although the third line is quite distant).

It isn't as hard to establish the source of Nashoba's Key's ability, which has enabled her to become a stakes winner on turf, synthetic and dirt. She is Silver Hawk's third Grade/Group I winner from only 13 foals out of Caerleon mares, following the St Leger winner Mutafaweq and the good French filly Germance. Or perhaps she is just another example of the way Cawston's Pride's extraordinary ability resurfaces every now and then.

#### A NEW DAY AT BARRETTS

The 2008 Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training has been pushed back from its traditional Tuesday, and will take place on Wednesday, Mar. 13, this year. Why the move? "We're just really accomodating our local owners and trainers," explained Barretts President and General Manager Gerald McMahon. "This year, Santa Anita is running on Mondays, and we always feel that having a dark day ahead of the sale is real important to get the inspections and

vet work done. It might make it a little more difficult for some business people who like to sandwich a sale around a weekend, but I think it will help us in terms of the local buyers--and that's a really important group for us." California-based horsemen John Sadler, Dennis O'Neill and Christopher Paasch, as well as owners Arnold Zetcher and Sierra Sunset's partnership of Philip Lebherz, Al Mariani, George Schmitt and Carol Wirth, comprised five of the top 10 buyers at Barretts last year. It is for the trainers in particular that

Barretts made the date change. "If you look, the Californians are strong at every market, whether it's September in Kentucky or the Calder sale or the OBS sale," McMahon said. "But what we find is that it's a little harder for them to get their homework done when the sale is local than it is when they get on a plane and go back east. They are operating their barns here and dealing with the day-to-day pressures of that, and they have to work the sale into it, whereas when they get on a plane they can let the assistants take over. Here, we feel that the dark day and the calendar mean a lot to the local guys, and they're real important to us. We feel like we'd better make sure that they can participate here." There were 191 two-year-olds catalogued for this year's March Sale. Bidding begins at 2 p.m.

#### The SAB Story...

Scott Bergsrud and Jenny Martinez, the team behind SAB Training, have yet to hit one out of the park at the two-year-old sales, but the duo have been quietly successful. Relatively new to the pinhooking game, Bergsrud and Martinez got into the business with just 10 juveniles five years ago. The Ocala-based string grew to 80 this past winter, and SAB Training will offer its biggest Barretts consignment yet this year, with seven on the grounds at Fairplex.

It is no surpise that they head to California with some of the best they have. SAB Training brought two to Barretts in 2006 and sold them both, earning their clients a \$95,000 profit on initial investments totalling \$105,000. Last year, they found new homes for two of three through the ring, and the initial outlay of \$60,000 for the pair realized a profit of \$100,000.

"It's that middle market--that's where you're trying to stay and be successful," said Martinez. "I mean, it's nice to get the big horse, everyone wants that, but we don't spend a lot on them in the first place. We have a budget, which makes [getting the big horse] really hard. We don't have \$100,000 to spend on one, we've got to buy four with \$100,000. That's where are clients are at and where we're at."

But where did Bergsrud and Martinez come from? They two started worlds apart.

"I grew up on a little farm in North Dakota and I was a jockey," Bergsrud remarked. "I rode in Washington State and Oregon, and I won 3,000 races. I was leading rider in Washington for seven years straight.

"I quit when I was 26 because I was fighting my

weight a lot. I went down to work for Robert Scanlon in Ocala, and I worked for him for about 5 1/2 years. I broke a lot of good horses for him, and learned the ropes of pinhooking."


The former rider has had his hands on some good horses. He broke GISW Romance Is Diane and SW Dixie Dreamer, and sent

stakes runners Tactical Weapon and Vicar's Daughter to the sales ring.

Bergsrud met Martinez on the job at the Scanlon operation, but her path to Ocala was a little different. As her accent reflects, the petite horsewoman is originally from Manchester, England.

"I left school, and I didn't want to go to college, so my dad said, 'you'd better get a job--I ain't supporting you,'" she explained with a laugh. "He threw me the Racing Form and I looked through the advertisements. He said, 'you'd better call these numbers,' and I did, and off I went.

"I was 17 when I left home, and I went to Yorkshire for a season. Then I went to work for Jack Berry, who was a very good two-year-old trainer. We won a lot of races.



"Later, a friend moved to Ocala and we came to visit. That's how I started to come this way, you know, and I ended up staying."

Martinez, who still heads to the track during the summer to work as an assistant for trainer Dale Romans, broke yearlings for the Juddmonte operation in Lexington for four years before returning to Ocala. She and Bergsrud worked together for Team Scanlon. Five years ago, the two decided to strike out on their own.

"We had an opportunity to go out on our own, so that's what we did," said Bergsrud, who owns shares in 39 of the horses currently under his care. "I've been building the clientele, and I've got a lot of good people behind me now...I would probably say I've got 25 involved with me, in different partnership deals. The word of mouth has been getting around every year, and we've done pretty well. We've been successful, we're making a profit. We haven't had the big horse yet, but hopefully it's right around the corner."

That homerun horse could be in this year's consignment. Bergsrud and Martinez are very high on hip 190, a colt by top sire Forestry, from the family of millionaires Smok'n Frolic and Super Frolic. Bred by Charles Deters and Taylor Made Farm, the chestnut breezed a furlong in :10 4/5 during the first undertack show (video), but the workout did not go as the consignors had hoped.

"He is a beautiful horse and he's correct and he's fast," Bergsrud said. "All year at the farm, I was thinking, 'this horse is going to make it.' He does everything you want--he's just awesome.

"But he worked the first week, and we had a problem with him. He came around the turn and he wasn't used to being out there and he bolted--he just went straight. He went in :10 4/5 on the outside rail. I thought the exercise girl was going to get hurt--I thought it was going to be a disaster. But they got through it and the horse came back fine."

Bergsrud was confident the two-year-old would put on a whole different show during the second preview. The colt responded with a solid :10 3/5 yesterday.

"He'd never done put a foot wrong before and he'd been doing well all week, so I knew we were going to redeem ourselves on Monday," he said.

At the end of the day, however, SAB Training isn't focused on the one big score; they set more realistic goals.

"We haven't had a sale topper--we're plugging along and making our clients a few bucks every year," Martinez said. "Everybody's hoping to hit the big one--and it can happen, you know, to anyone of us. You could have the fastest work, and that's what these two-year-old sales are all about.

"But we don't drill on our horses. These are all probably a work away from going fast-fast. We don't want to break 'em down at the farm through breezing 'em, shin-bucking them---they're no good to nobody then. We want to get 'em here, we want 'em to breeze good, we want' em to come back good and we want to take 'em up to the ring. Our horses look good, you can tell they havent been overworked. A lot of horses that you see around are a little cooked, you know, they're overdone, and ours are not. We don't want to be on the scratch sheet. That's our goal--not to end up on the scratch sheet."

#### He's My Favorite Mistake...

John Brocklebank of B.C.3. Thoroughbreds freely admits that he found one of the stars of his 35-horse Barretts consignment by sheer luck. On a shopping spree at the 2007 Keeneland September Sale, Brocklebank had gone to \$75,000 to get a son of Cherokee Run out of Flirty Frosty (Pleasant Colony) and, on a whim, decided to go to the backside to take a look at him. But he stumbled into the wrong barn.

The Utah native discovered another colt by the same sire, one he had to have. He sells tomorrow as hip  $\frac{47}{2}$ .

"I found him by accident," Brocklebank admitted. "I never leave the sales ring when I am bidding, but I went back to the barn to take a look at the first Cherokee Run. I ended up going to the wrong stall and I thought, 'this is not the horse I just bought!' He was gorgeous."

Brocklebank continued, "Cherokee Runs, to me, are a little bit on the lighter side, but not this colt. He's as

good a Cherokee Run as I've seen. When I looked at him, I thought, 'Wow, what a horse.'

"He is one of only two horses I have ever vetted out at the yearling sales," he added. "I know it drives everybody crazy, but I usually just ask the consignors about their

horses. But this colt and Brother Derek are the only two that I paid to have vetted. Oddly enough, the Cherokee Run is in Brother Derek's stall at Barretts. I don't know if those are two omens, but I'm saying they are!"

Brocklebank went to \$190,000 to get the second Cherokee Run, who is out of SP Melo Note (Relaunch). The May foal worked an eighth in :10 1/5 at the first preview (video). He paid \$150,000 for Brother Derek at the 2004 KEESEP sale, and sold him to Cecil Peacock for \$275,000 at Barretts March the following year. Now five, the son of Benchmark has won five graded races, including the GI Hollywood Futurity and GI Santa Anita Derby, and has earned \$1,593,458.

Brocklebank, who runs B.C.3. Thoroughbreds with partner Shane Chipman, was the leading consignor at Barretts March last year, selling nine head for an eyecatching average of \$513,333. The operation shot to the top of the list in a very short time. B.C.3. was the sixth-leading consignor in 2005, with their six lots averaging \$116,667, and finished second behind Jerry Bailey Sales Agency in 2006, when they sold 10 two-year-olds for an average of \$199,500.

They will field their biggest consignment yet this year, partly because, after experimenting with a small consignment at the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale in 2007, they opted to skip the trip to Florida this year to concentrate on Barretts.

"We would love to get to Calder again--maybe we will go with three or four next year," Brocklebank remarked. "But we have such a strong offering here at Barretts this year, we thought it would be a good idea to pay as much attention to them as possible. I am in Utah with 50 horses, and Shane is not only a partner, but he runs the training operation. If we take Shane out of the equation to send him to Calder, it weakens the thread. We didn't want to be spread out all over the place.

"Also, the group we have this year is a little on the younger side, and sometimes that extra month helps. We do intend to go back to Calder--we'll probably go next year--but Barretts is definitely home. It's where we hang out."

#### What They're Saying At The Sales...

#### Consignor Jerry Bailey:

"We take the best of our best to this sale and they've all been well followed. But, as we've come to expect, I feel like the market will be polarized. The top horses are much more sought after than the middle or bottom of the market. That's what the two-year-old sales have become, and I think this will be more of the same."

#### Carrying on the Family Tradition...

Producing sales toppers is a tradition in the Scanlon family. Patriarch Robert Scanlon, who moved to Ocala in 1989, had the top-priced horse at the 2003 Fasig-Tipton Calder sale when a son of Tale of the Cat brought \$1.4 million; he bettered that result and then some when another colt by that sire went for a salestopping \$5.2 million in 2005. Sadly, Scanlon passed away less than eight months later, but his son, David, is maintaining the family reputation. The 38-year-old consignor was at the head of the pack at Calder this year when getting \$2.1 million for a Street Cry (Ire) colt.

Business has been good since David inherited the reins 2 1/2 years ago, but it hasn't always been easy.

"At the beginning, it was a little tough," admitted the younger Scanlon, who studied business at the University of Toledo before joining forces with his father in 1993. "You have to find your own way. We were a good team, and I always did a lot of the training, but I have to do the job of two now.

"But he left me with great clients," he added. "Not many people get to step out on their own with such great people. We have both Coolmore and Darley in the barn, and Buzz Chace and Nick Zito have really supported me. I've been blessed."

The results at Calder were somewhat mixed. The Scanlon Training Center scored with the Street Cry, as well as colts by Lion Heart and Malibu Moon. But all 13 of the juveniles consigned by Robert LaPenta were bought back. Was that disappointing?

"No, it wasn't," Scanlon said. "We are a team. Nick [Zito] picks out the horses--and what can you say about Nick? He has had a lot of success. I break them and get them ready for the sales, and Mr. LaPenta values them. He has had a lot of luck at the racetrack, and if they don't bring his prices, he is happy to take them home.

"The results speak for themselves," he added. "He has three of the top 10 on the Derby trail this year, and we'll probably be back here talking about the three or four he has for the Derby next year."

Scanlon Training, which sold just one at Barretts last year, but for a solid \$800,000, will have nine in the ring this year.







Also highlighting the day is the inaugural running of the \$50,000 St. Patrick's Day H., a six-furlong sprint for older horses. First post on the 17th is 1:10 p.m.



GALILEO FILLY TOPS MM OPENER Adelaidebased trainer Leon MacDonald, who will saddle two runners in Wednesday's Magic Millions feature races, went to a session-topping A\$160,000 to snare a chestnut filly by Galileo (Ire) during yesterday's first session of the Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling Sale at

Morphettville. The yearling is the first foal from Sizzie 'Em (Ire), an Irish-bred daughter of reigning champion Australian sire Flying Spur (Aus). That figure may look to be decidedly good value in coming weeks; Galileo has significant drafts of fourth-crop yearlings at the majors, with 16 for Magic Millions and nine for Inglis Easter, and his yearlings

fetched up to A\$420,000 last year. The filly was consigned by Serena and Peter Watson's Mill Park, which has enjoyed enviable results with recent sale graduates capturing seven Group 1 wins in the past 12 months. Among Mill Park's Group 1 winning graduate are Devil Moon (Aus), Divine Madonna (Aus) and Serious Speed (Aus). The Watsons, battling severe drought conditions in the state's northeast, switched their focus from Merino sheep to Thoroughbreds some 15 years ago with startling results as breeders Harry Perks, Trevor Robertson and Rod Fairclough, who owned the Toorak Park Stud, sent mares to the property on the Limestone coast, while trainers such as MacDonald and Mark Kavanagh sent racehorses to spell. Sizzie 'Em has a Bianconi filly at foot and was covered by Hussonet last October. Cont. p6

While Galileo has swept all before him on the other side of the globe with G1 Dewhurst S. victors Teofilo (Ire) and New Approach (Ire), G1 Irish Derby winner Soldier of Fortune (Ire), G1 1000 Guineas winner Nightime (Ire) and GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Red Rocks (Ire), his impact in Australia has been relatively muted. Galileo's first three crops have yielded four stakes winners, three of them fillies, including recent G2 AJC Breeders' Classic winner Gallant Tess (Aus), a four-year-old member of Galileo's first Australian crop. Galileo did not stand in Australia last spring, having covered books of 100-plus over five seasons.

#### Happy Hunting for Kavanagh...

Adelaide has been a very happy hunting ground for current leading Group 1 trainer Mark Kavanagh. The sale provided his first Group 1 winner, the 2004 South Australian Derby winner Hard To Get (Aus), and, more recently, four-time Group 1 winner Divine Madonna (Aus), an A\$82,500 buy, as well as G1 Turnbull S. winner Devil Moon (Aus). The Flemington-based conditioner was active again yesterday. Kavanagh gave A\$105,000 for a Blevic (Aus) filly from Sunday Shoes (Aus) (Kenvain {Fr}) and A\$120,000 for a colt by Arrowfield stallion Danzero (Aus) out of Violet Tints (Aus) (Export Price {Fr}), a sister to Group-1 winning sprinter Notoire (Aus). "Both were lovely types and I'm hoping they can race on with great success in the coming couple of seasons," Kavanagh said. "I've had great success buying from Adelaide. You go through, look at all the horses, do your homework and go from there. They are there--you just have to buy them and train them right." During yesterday's first evening session, 66 yearlings went under the hammer at an average of A\$32,818. Magic Millions managing director David Chester admitted he was disappointed with a flagging clearance rate of 65.4 percent. "Each year new stakes stars graduate from the Adelaide ring," Chester said. "Three of the stakes winners at Morphettville today were local buys--including the [G2] Adelaide Cup winner Lacey Underall (Aus). The quality, well-bred, conformed and presented yearlings were the subject of strong interest and those yearlings all easily exceeded their reserve prices. I feel a number of the better yearlings in the sale will go under the hammer tomorrow. This sale is the value sale of the country--where else can you buy such bright prospects so cheaply. The SA-breds are renowned for their toughness and durability." The sale continues today at 11 a.m.

#### DONCASTER COMEBACK FOR O'SHEA STAR

Four-time Group 1 winner Racing To Win (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) is set for a showdown with boom sophomore Weekend Hussler (Aus) (Hussonet) as he seeks a second G1 Doncaster H. victory next month. The John O'Shea-trained five-year-old, who has earnings of A\$3,000,285 and has won 10 of 16 starts, scored a second-up win Mar. 8 in the G2 Winning Edge Presentations Classic at Rosehill in Sydney. "It's a pleasure to take this horse to the races...I get such a kick out of seeing him turn up and be the ultra-competitor that he is," O'Shea said. Racing To Win swept all before him in Sydney in 2006, but after finishing well down the track in the G1 Cox Plate that spring, he was not seen again for more than a year, resuming to finish fifth in the G2 Expressway S. Feb 23. The Ross McDonald-trained Weekend Hussler (Aus) is A\$2.70 favourite for Randwick's signature mile race.

HIT-AND-RUN AUTUMN FOR EFFICIENT Melbourne Cup winner Efficient (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) is expected to make his lone autumn appearance in Saturday's G2 Blamey S. Owner Lloyd Williams said the rising five-year-old gelding would then spell ahead of a second tilt at the Cup in November. "It's just a personal point of view. I don't like to train them hard for the autumn and then give them a tough spring," he said. "The Melbourne spring is the only pure classic time in Australian racing...the only thing I strive for is to win Group 1s during the Melbourne spring. It's the heart of racing. Everything else is secondary."

QUEENSLAND TRACK WORRY Prominent
Queensland trainers and jockeys have threatened to
boycott the Queensland Turf Club's Eagle Farm racetrack ahead of the Brisbane Winter Carnival unless
improvements are made to the racing surface.
Queensland Racing Limited has asked Brisbane Turf
Club track manager Warren Williams to report on the
situation urgently. QRL chairman Bob Bentley said the
track needed "urgent remedial attention." Bentley said
QRL would do whatever Williams recommended, which
could include switching Eagle Farm meetings to other
