

ANOTHER NOTCH IN RACHEL'S BELT?

Following her facile victory over GI Belmont S. and subsequent GI Shadwell Travers S. hero Summer Bird (Birdstone) in the GI Haskell Invitational S. Aug. 2, the

brain trust surrounding **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) sat down to plot a course for her next start. The decisions to be made were whether to remain with her peers, face colts or fillies, test older females or try older male handicappers. After nominations were made to five separate races, Saturday's GI Woodward S. was selected. Should she emerge victorious from a race

won by the likes of Ghostzapper, Saint Liam, Mineshaft, Cigar, Alysheba and Forego, to name but a few, she would become the first sophomore to take the race since Easy Goer in 1989, and the first three-year-old filly to beat older males in a Grade I route on dirt in New York in over 120 years.

"We try to give her hurdles," co-owner Jess Jackson told a national media teleconference Tuesday afternoon. "Each time she passes one we're delighted. It's a process of defining her greatness. If she goes up against older male horses, we'll be better able to get a measure of her greatness."

Rachel Alexandra is riding an eight-race winning streak, and the debate has already started on just where her career is going to fall in the annals of history. And if the generally accepted barometer of all-time greatness is Ruffian, how does this filly compare?

"It's hard for an owner not to love his horse," Jackson opined. "[Rachel] and I have a good relationship. I didn't know Ruffian, but she was the greatest horse of the century...until now."

However, the Kendall-Jackson winery owner is inclined to wait another year before passing final judgment.

"We're in the process of trying to define Rachel, but she's only half-defined right now," he stated, reiterating his intention to race Rachel Alexandra in 2010. "I'd want to wait until her career is over. But I can say that I think she is one of the best of all time, and I think she does compare to Ruffian."

Raising the Interest Rate...

Terry Finley, president of West Point Thoroughbreds, will pit **Macho Again** (Macho Uno) against the superfilly this weekend, and credits her with generated unexpected interest in Thoroughbred racing.

"She's brought a lot of attention to our game and we all know we need the positive attention," Finley said. "She's come along at the right time. It's great to run into people who are not in the business and they all talk about Rachel Alexandra. That being said, we're really going to try hard to beat her on Saturday."

For their part, officials at the New York Racing Association upped the ante by hiking the purse from \$500,000 to \$750,000. Similarly, the Haskell saw its purse money raised to \$1.25 million, but Jackson insists his decision making is not strictly about finances.

"We go one race at a time and we do what's best for the horse," he explained. "If financials were the top consideration, we would have gone for the [\$1-million] Travers. [The extra purse money] helps bring competition to the race, but it's not only to Rachel's benefit."

Others expected for the Woodward include Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum's **Asiatic Boy (Arg)** (Not For Sale {Arg}), GI Whitney H. upsetter **Bullsbay** (Tiznow) and **Past the Point** (Indian Charlie), runner-up to Curlin (Smart Strike) in last year's Woodward.

Premio Loco earned black-type at the first attempt in the Listed Ladybird S. at Kempton Feb. 8, but was edged out by a nose when upped in class to the G3 Winter Derby at Lingfield next time Mar. 21. He regained the winning thread in the May 30 Listed On The House S. at Goodwood, and continued his consistent run with a second in the Listed Midsummer S. at Windsor last time June 27. Racing in a share of third for much of this first overseas foray, he made solid headway under urging in the straight to lead approaching the final eighth and was ridden out in the closing stages to assert superiority. "Once Sehrezad and Wiesenpfad were scratched, Premio Loco's chances of success obviously increased," said trainer Chis Wall. RACING Round-Up

Colonel Ready to Rumble in Classic...

WinStar Farm's Colonel John (Tiznow) breezed five-eighths of a mile in :59.40 at Del Mar Tuesday morning in advance of Sunday's GI Pacific Classic at the seaside oval. The four-year-old, winner of the GI Santa Anita Derby and the GI Travers in 2008, returned from a December layoff to post an impressive victory in the grassy Wickerr

H. over the Jimmy Durante turf course July 31.

"I think he got plenty out of that race," trainer Eoin Harty said during a Tuesday teleconference. "I always felt he could run on the turf. He's always shown a good turn of foot. I felt he was the best horse in the race, but the thing that surprised me the most was the final time."

Colonel John covered the one-mile distance in a sharp 1:32.77, just about two-fifths of a second off the course record in what was his turf debut.

A respectable sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 25, Colonel John was an even fourth in the GI Malibu S. Dec. 26. He was entered for the GI Santa Anita H. in early March, but was scratched the morning of the race.

"He had a pleural pneumonia," Harty explained. "He came back, but I had to give him more time off due to some aches and pains. But once I got him to a point in his fitness where he had back-to-back works at five furlongs, he just seemed to go from strength to strength."

Though he was nominated to this weekend's Woodward S., Harty decided to leave Colonel John in California for the Classic

"I didn't have to ship and he's certainly shown a fondness for this racetrack down here," he said. "I thought the odds were stacked in my favor instead of going to New York to tackle Rachel Alexandra."

Harty added that if G1 Dubai World Cup winner Well Armed (Tiznow) had not suffered an injury in the Aug. 2 Gil San Diego H., he would have represented WinStar in the Classic. Colonel John would have returned to the scene of his Travers win for the Woodward.

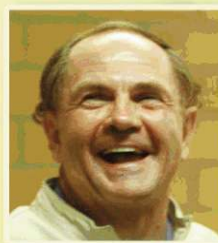

Ghanaati Back in the Groove...

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's G1 1000 Guineas heroine **Ghanaati** (Giant's Gauseway) is building back up to a race-course return, having been freshened following a third in the July 29 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood. She will point either to the Sept. 26 G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot--the scene of her June 19 G1 Coronation S. success--or the Oct. 3 G1 Sun Chariot

S. at Newmarket, according to Sheikh Hamdan's racing manager Angus Gold. "If all continues to go well with the filly, the plan will be to run in either the Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot or the following week's Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket," Gold told *Racing Post*. "She was sore after the Sussex S., and was therefore given a break. I've not yet discussed her next race with Sheikh Hamdan, and I suppose it is a question of whether or not he would like to see her run against the colts again in the Queen Elizabeth."

Younzain Pleases Fallon...

Kieren Fallon, who will return from an 18-month drug suspension Friday, partnered Jaber Abdullah's **Younzain (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}) in a gallop yesterday as the dual G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe runner-up continued his preparation for Sunday's G1 Grosser Preis von Baden. The six-time champion jockey exercised the visored bay at trainer Mick Channon's West Ilsley gallops, and expressed satisfaction at how the workout went. "I was very happy with him, he feels good and is very well in himself," Fallon told *PA Sport*. "He cruised up there, but the visor didn't make any difference and, for me, he doesn't need it. He feels good and it was a beautiful surface. It's the first time I've ridden work on this side of the country." Second by a nose in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 5, the six-year-old has not faced the starter since finishing third in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud June 28.

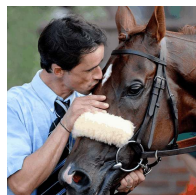

LUSH LASHES RETIRED; TO SELL AT TATTS DECEMBER Jackie Bolger's **Lush Lashes (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}--Dance for Fun {GB}, by Anabaa), a three-time winner at the highest level in 2008, has been retired and will point to the Tattersalls December Sale to be offered as a broodmare prospect, it was announced yesterday. Trained by her owner's husband Jim, Lush Lashes was an €80,000 GOFORB yearling purchase. The bay kicked off her career with a win in the Goffs Fillies Million in 2007. At three, she registered victories in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot, the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and the G1 Matron S. at Leopardstown, and also finished second in the G1 Nassau S. and G1 Prix de l'Opera. Lush Lashes ran last of 14 in the G1 Hong Kong Cup in December, and made the frame once in three outings in 2009, finishing third in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 24. "She was one of the most talented and versatile fillies I have trained," Bolger told *Racing Post*. "She was beginning to show bits of wear and tear, so we decided not to take any more chances with her." Lush Lashes retires with a career record of 14-5-2-1 and earnings of £1,199,713.

BOOK 1-2 SIRES

With the number catalogued in Keeneland September Book 1 down 16 percent, from 495 last year to 418 this year, it would be pretty difficult, even in a strong market, to anticipate the gross for the first two days being up, whatever else happens. The number catalogued in Book 2 is about even with last year, meaning that for the sale's first four days in 2009, there are 1,212 yearlings catalogued, around a six-percent drop from the 1,297 catalogued in 2008.

Of the 1,212 yearlings catalogued in the sale's first four days this year, 753 of them--a little over 62 percent--are by the 24 sires that have 19 or more catalogued each during the sale's first four days. These are really the biggest of the big names in North American breeding right now. You'll possibly not be surprised to hear that only eight of the 24 are sires with first four-year-olds or younger, while 16 of the 24 are from the more 'proven' contingent, sires with oldest foals now five-year-olds and up. Nor will you be surprised to hear that 24 of the 24 stand or stood in Kentucky.

The younger crowd is a very selective bunch. Only four sires with their first yearlings make this short list, and they are the four that have dominated this sire crop's commercial proceedings all along. They are headed by 2006 champion three-year-old Bernardini (A.P. Indy), whose 12 yearlings to sell so far have averaged \$570,833 (per *TDN* Instatistics), and who has 41 more yearlings catalogued just in the first two books. Also in the group is Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat), winner of the GI Haskell Invitational S. and second in the GI Kentucky Derby (to Barbaro), GI Belmont S. (to Jazil), and GI Travers S. (to Bernardini). His eight yearlings to sell so far have averaged \$201,875, and he has 36 more catalogued in Books 1 and 2.

Two sons of Storm Cat, Hennessy and Giant's Causeway, are responsible for the other two first-crop yearling sires with 19+ catalogued in the first two books. Henny Hughes (Hennessy), winner of the GI King's Bishop S. and GI Vosburgh S. at three, has had 12 yearlings average \$223,333 so far; he has 30 catalogued in Books 1 and 2. First Samurai (Giant's Causeway) won the GI Hopeful S. and GI Champagne S. at two (both times defeating Henny Hughes), then was third, with Henny Hughes second, to Stevie Wonderboy in the 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He's had five yearlings average \$144,000 so far, and has 19 more in Books 1-2.

Among sires with their first two-year-olds in 2009, only Ghostzapper (Awesome Again) (34 catalogued) was among the 24 sires with 19+ Book 1-2 yearlings. Connections would no doubt be more confident going into the sale if he had a few more winners; at this writing he's only 30th on the Freshman Sire list. Darley's new sire sensation, Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}), with 38 catalogued in Books 1-2, is one of only two sires among F2006 sires (first three-year-olds) to have 19 or more catalogued; the other is Speightstown (Gone West) (29), who's had a very good year with his first three-year-olds, including French Group 1 winner Lord Shanakill, and dual American Grade II winner Munnings. Among sires with their first four-year-olds, Empire Maker (Unbridled) (32 catalogued) is the sole representative.

You won't collapse in shock when I tell you the overall leader in yearlings catalogued in Books 1-2 is a Coolmore stallion, namely Ashford's Giant's Causeway, currently leading Tiznow and Distorted Humor in the race for 2009 Leading Sire (by progeny earnings) honors. He has 56 catalogued in the first two books. Not far behind is Mr. Greeley, with 48 catalogued; these could be harder to place if neither Coolmore or Darley, who have both invested heavily in Mr. Greeley the last few years, is particularly interested in acquiring more of them.

Still, as Coolmore likes to say in their ads, if the big guns aren't on a sire, that just leaves more opportunity for the so-called 'little people.' Unbridled's Song has 39 catalogued, Smart Strike (38) and Distorted Humor (37). Then follow Elusive Quality with 33, Storm Cat (31) and Dynaformer (30). Street Cry (28) and Tiznow (25) come next, followed by Forestry (23), and A.P. Indy and Indian Charlie (22 each).

The table that follows lists the 112 sires represented in Books 1-2, with the relevant yearling sale information so far this year, and some key APEX (Annual Progeny Earnings index) ratings, for those sires old enough to be rated (they must have 10 or more registered three-year-olds, or older, in the current year). Besides their A Runner (top two percent earners from runners) and ABC (top eight percent) Indexes, we've also listed the age indexes for the sire's runners as two-, three- and four-year-olds. We hope you find these figures useful when deciding where to spend your hard-earned cash at the upcoming September Sale.

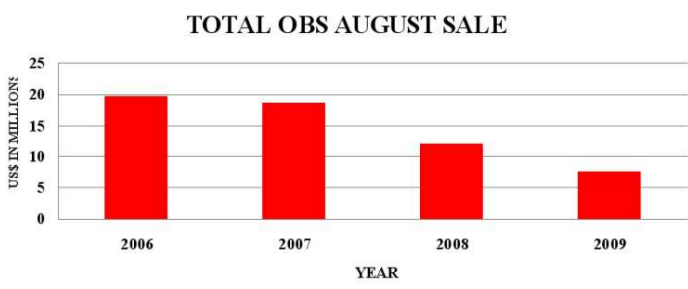

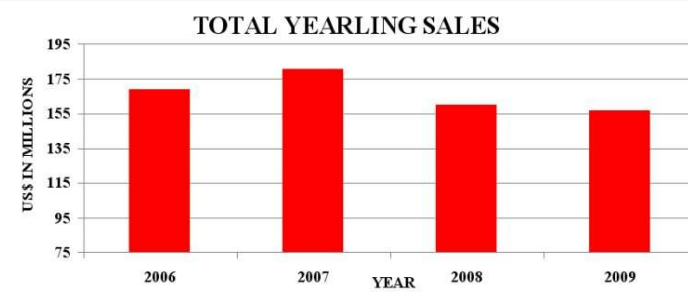

How did you become involved in racing? By watching the races at Northlands Park. When we had some money, we decided to buy a few horses.

If you could change one thing in our sport, what would it be? I'd like to see more people at the races. I'd like to see more people involved. Horse Racing Alberta has a lot to do if they want to keep it going. There are casinos all over Edmonton.

You've had success throughout Canada, from Edmonton to Toronto. What was it like coming to Saratoga and winning one of the United States' most prestigious races? It's about the most exciting thing in my life. We won a race there last year. John Terranova trains True Resurgence (Yes It's True) for me, and (winning that allowance race) was great. Saratoga, Keeneland and Del Mar are probably the best places to compete.

Your best horses--Miss Venturous (Native Regent), Nessarose (Deputy Commander), Kaylee's Magic (Magic Prospect), Victory Romance (Slew City Slew) and now Careless Jewel--have been fillies. When you acquire horses, do you focus on fillies? It's been mostly fillies we've been buying. I have a soft spot for fillies. We've been buying some two-year-old colts this year, though.

If you could have dinner with one historical figure, who would it be and why? Bob Baffert. Or Bill Shoemaker. It'd be cool to sit down and talk to one of the guys from the old days, like Shoemaker.

Favorite vacation spot? Probably Miami. The weather is great and they are racing in the wintertime.

Favorite food? Seafood.

First job? Working in the oil fields as a laborer. Actually, my first job was working as a carpenter's helper.
