





PROUDINSKY REPEATS IN SAN GABRIEL

The pre-race anticipation focused squarely on the return of three-time GI Hollywood Gold Cup winner Lava Man (Slew City Slew), but it was Proudinsky (Ger) (Silvano {Ger}) in the winner's circle after yesterday's GII San Gabriel H. at Santa Anita. Lava Man, making his



first start since 2008, set the early pace through fractions of :24.06, :48.14 and 1:11.81, while Proudinsky sat a stalking second. The six-year-old German-bred moved to challenge the eight-year-old gelding turning for home, and for a few strides it looked like a battle, but Lava Man began to tire as Proudinsky asserted control in upper stretch and drove to a neck victory over late-running favorite Loup Breton (Ire) (Anabaa). Under the


care of the late Bobby Frankel, Proudinsky won last year's GII San Gabriel H., as well as this term's GII Mervin Muniz Jr. Memorial H. Long-time Frankel assistant Humberto Ascanio now trains the bay, who was coming off a fourth-place effort in the Nov. 27 GI Citation H. "Good horses do the job," Ascanio said. "I learned from the Bobby Frankel school. I'm not Bobby Frankel, but I just do his thing. I knew Julio [Canani]'s horse [Loup Breton] was going to come running at the end, but I was real confident. [Rafael Bejarano] had a lot of horse, and he told me he had a lot of confidence in the horse. He said he was going to win." Lava Man faded to last in the seven-horse field. *Cont. p2*

DREAM JOURNEY ON TOP IN ARIMA KINEN

Fourth in last year's renewal of the G1 Arima Kinen, the five-year-old **Dream Journey (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}) came back with a hard-fought effort that put him a half length to the good of the favored filly Buena Vista (Jpn) (Special Week {Jpn}) in the prestigious race at Nakayama yesterday. Dream Journey became the first horse since Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) in 2006 and ninth horse overall to register the G1 Takarazuka Kinen and Arima Kinen double. As expected, the race started with Reach the Crown (Jpn) (Special Week {Jpn}) quickly assuming the lead as they ran past the grandstand the first time around. Dream Journey, second choice in the field of 16, sat second last, while Buena Vista was rated much nearer to the pace than usual in fifth. Reach the Crown stretched his advantage to five lengths down the backstretch, but the lead dissolved as the field closed in quickly on the last turn. Still trailing, jockey Kenichi Ikezoe and Dream Journey timed their move perfectly, swooping down in the last 100 meters to catch and then edge past Buena Vista. The win confirmed Dream Journey's liking of clockwise courses, as eight out of nine of his wins have come on right-handed tracks. Japan's champion juvenile colt in 2006, Dream Journey won the Takarazuka Kinen in June before finishing second in September's G2 Sankei Sho All Comers S. at Nakayama. In his penultimate start, he was fifth to Company (Jpn) (Miracle Admire {Jpn}) in the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) at Tokyo Nov. 1.

Lava Man Suffers Gash in Return

Lava Man returned from his last-place finish in vesterday's San Gabriel with cuts on his hind legs. "He had a gash on his hind right tibia when he came back, but I don't think that caused anything," said trainer Doug O'Neill. "It looks like he hit the side of the gate leaving there. He just got tired. I thought I had him more fit than that, but it's hard to simulate a mile and an eighth turf race in the mornings. When [Tyler Baze] asked him to kick on, he said he gave him something, but he just couldn't sustain it." O'Neill admitted he was disappointed with the race result. "I was very eager to see him run today because he had been training like the Lava Man of old, and again, he really never had much of a layoff during the whole three-year campaign that we had him on, so this was kind of a new thing to see," O'Neill added. "He definitely disappointed me in his results, but he really made me real happy, the fact that he got back here and I thought he looked great striding out. We'll talk with the boys and Dr. Doug Herthel and see how he comes out of it and just put our heads together and see what's the right thing for Lava Man." M ONE RIFLE (One Man Army)

HEADLEY'S FAITH TURNS TO MALIBU SCORE

Fourteen years ago, back in 1995, trainer Bruce Headley unearthed a striking Roman Diplomat colt at the Keeneland September Sale that he purchased for

\$35,000. Unlike many of Headley's bargain purchases--Kona Gold, Surf Cat, Got Koko, etc.-One Man Army didn't achieve much success on the racetrack. He started 24 times, won only twice, and was retired with a single stakes placing, which came in his lone black-type attempt.


But Headley believed in the colt's conformation and the innate talent he displayed on occasion, and so sent him to stud and supported him with mares from his own small band.

While it might not sound like the most conventional breeding decision to make, no one has ever accused Headley of being conventional, and on Saturday, the 75-year-old's instincts were rewarded with a long-sought-after victory in the GI Malibu S., courtesy of homebred M One Rifle, a son of One Man Army.

"He's been wanting to win this race since he was 18, and how great is it that he is able to do it with a horse whom he's had a hand in going generations back?" daughter Karen Headley said yesterday.

Indeed, Headley trained not only M One Rifle's sire, but his dam as well. Headley purchased the Bertrando filly Leanessa as a yearling for a sale-topping \$200,000 at the 1999 CTBA Del Mar Yearling Sale. Co-owned by Headley, Leanessa raced two seasons in Southern California, winning half of her eight starts and banking \$165,000. She never attempted stakes company, but was showed good speed and was subsequently retired to Headley's broodmare band. She visited One Man Army in her first two years and produced a pair of horses who failed to make it to the races, but her third visit to the grandson of Roberto resulted in M One Rifle. Karen Headley said the plan was to match horses who had been selected by Headley because of their exceptional conformation.

"He decided to breed together the bodies that he had picked out--and this is what he's got," Headley said. "If you saw One Man Army, he's a stunning animal. His conformation is perfect, and he was one of my dad's favorite horses. He loved galloping him."



And while his race record was less than stellar, "He had all the talent in the world, and the races he did win were really good," Headley added.

Leanessa, meanwhile, was by yet another horse with ties to Headley.

"She looked just like her sire, Bertrando, and we had trained Bertrando until he was sent over to [Bobby] Frankel's barn," Headley explained. "My dad said today that Bertrando is still repaying him for the good base he put into him. When we had him, he had lost to only two horsesone was Arazi, and the other was A.P. Indv."

Leanessa, for her part, carries her own bit of racing trivia: she

ran fifth to Azeri in their career debuts back in April of 1999. Leanessa was a 5-1 chance, Azeri a 17-1 bomb.

Karen Headley laughs about that tidbit when asked. "One of our horses last year, his first start was against Zensational," she said. "We had one a few years ago that finished second to Rock Hard Ten. So we help good horses break their maidens." *Cont. p5*



Fast Out of the Gate...

One Man Army made the most of his early opportunities at stud. Or to be exact, opportunity. After all, he was bred to just one mare in his first season at stud in 2001, the Headley-owned Butterfly Kiss. But that mating produced Soldier's Kiss, who won a pair of Cal-bred black-type events for the Headley barn. One Man Army eventually would be sent the bulk of Headley's broodmare band each year, typically around eight mares. One Man Army is also the sire of Woman Warrior, who won this year's Alphabet Kisses S. for Headley.

One Man Army stood all of his years at Old English Rancho in central California, but was pensioned two years ago because of fertility issues. In all, he has been represented by six crops, numbering a total of 66 foals and three black-type winners.

"The majority of them have turned out to be runners, and if they can't run very fast, they at least try," Karen Headley said of One Man Army's offspring.

With One Man Army enjoying the retired life, Headley's mares are now being divvied up between the talented MGSW Surf Cat (Sir Cat), who also stands at Old English Rancho, and the relative unknown Cyclotron (Grand Slam). The latter is a nine-year-old whom Headley purchased for \$220,000 as a KEESEP yearling.

All horses in the *TDN* are bred in North America, unless otherwise indicated

Cyclotron made four starts for Headley over three seasons, winning his last trip to the post in a six-furlong maiden special weight in July of 2005. His first foals run in 2010.

"He's doing the same thing with them--breeding the bodies that he picked out," Headley said. "Because the hardest thing to do in the world is to breed."

Headley's success with One Man Army ultimately validated the horse's moniker. When the colt first arrived at the Headley stable, he was named after the patriarch of the family run operation.

"I remember coming to work sometimes, and he had fired everybody and would say, 'I'm a one man army,'" chuckled Karen. "Because he could do everything--clean the stalls, gallop them, etc. That's what makes him good--he's a narcissist." -L Marquardt

Wishful Tomcat, acquired by IEAH and partners after taking the GIII Discovery H. at Aqueduct in November of 2008, made his next three starts under the care of Bobby Frankel. Ninth in the Mar. 14 GII New Orleans H. in the third of those apearances, he has been unbeatable since joining trainer Rick Dutrow Jr.'s barn and plying his trade exclusively in New York-bred events. The chestnut made his first start under new management in the Apr. 26 Kings Point H. at Aqueduct, and went gate to wire as the even-money chalk. He romped by 6 1/4 lengths in the May 22 Seaport Mac S. at Belmont, and was last seen taking the June 27 Fratello Ed S. at that track. The heavy favorite in his return, Wishful Tomcat broke sharply from his inside post, cut out soft splits and had little trouble fending off the late bid of Naughty New Yorker to the wire. "I just tried to slow him down as much as I could," said jockey Ramon Dominguez. "There was no other speed in the race, and I was able to get away with a very comfortable second quarter. CASH REFUND (g, 3, Petionville--Swept Away {MGSW, \$550,500}, by Mystery Storm) returned to the races with a professional victory. A 6 3/4-length winner on debut over this strip last February, Cash Refund was tabbed a **TDN Rising Star** after dominating a Churchill Downs allowance by seven lengths Apr. 25, a performance that earned him a 110 Beyer. Such was his reputation that he went off the 4-5 favorite over fellow 3 "TDN Rising Star" Capt. Candyman Can (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the Matt Winn S. under the Twin Spires May 16, but he had to settle for second to that foe, beaten 3/4 lengths. On the sidelines since, the Klein family's homebred was hammered down to 1-5 favoritism for his return. 
