TEN JUVENILES TRYING TO HIT THE JACKPOT

A field of 10 two-year-old colts and geldings will face the starter for this afternoon's GIII Delta Downs Jackpot S., the country's richest juvenile event outside of the Breeders' Cup. The morning line gives a slight edge to WinStar Farm homebred **Blue Laser** (Bluegrass Cat), who tries a conventional dirt surface for the first time in his career. A debut third in a seven-furlong turf test at Woodbine Aug. 1, the chestnut came from just off the pace in a two-turn maiden on the Polytrack Aug. 28 and exits a half-length victory in the GIII Grey S. in which

Classic Legacy (Macho Uno) was 3/4 of a length back in third. "Blue Laser's going to want to be pretty close up to the pace," trainer Mark Casse told *Daily Racing Form*. "He doesn't have to be on the lead. We'll leave that up to [jockey] Shaun [Bridgmohan]." Another expected pace presence should be **Sweet Ducky** (Pulpit), who invades from New Jersey off back-to-back wins in the Sept. 25 Garden State S. and the Oct. 23 Seton Hall University S. "I think his last race he really showed me he was putting it all together," trainer Kelly Breen told *DRF*. "I think he's just starting to learn about being competitive. I think he likes to win." **Field p4**

Crowned as champion two-year-old male following victories in the GI Del Mar Futurity, GI Norfolk S., GI CashCall Futurity, and an unlucky second-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, the \$475,000 KEEAPR two-year-old purchase came back even stronger at three for the Baffert barn. Racing in the colors of Karl Watson, Michael E. Pegram and Paul Weitman, the half-brother to MGSW Kensei (Mr. Greeley) kicked off his 2010 campaign with a thrilling win in Oaklawn's GI Rebel S. before suffering from a pair of *nightmare* trips in the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Kentucky Derby. With a rider switch to Martin Garcia, the handsome bay showed his class with a courageous win in the second leg of the Triple Crown, and stamped himself as the leader of the three-year-old division with an authoritative four-length score over a stacked field in Monmouth's GI IZOD Haskell Invitational S. Lookin At Lucky, bred in Kentucky by Gulf Coast Farms LLC, concluded his career with a win over a sloppy track in the GI Indiana Derby and a respectable fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ retires with a record of 13-9-1-1, and earnings of \$3,307,278. Lookin At Lucky's dam, Private Feeling, brought \$2 million from Live Oak Stud in foal to Mr. Greeley at the 2009 FTKNOV sale. She was bred back to Smart Strike this year. Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne added, "Lookin At Lucky is the most striking of individuals, and he is without doubt the best stallion prospect I saw in America all year." Baffert also holds Lookin At Lucky in the highest regard. "This horse is such a warrior," the Hall of Fame trainer said after the Preakness. "He wants to win; he tries so hard. He's got a great mind. He's a cool horse, a really great athlete with a very long incredible stride. He's one of the best horses I've ever had."

Lookin At Lucky proved undesirable as a KEESEP yearling and was bought back by Lance Robinson's Gulf Coast Farms for just \$35,000. Put into training with partner Jerry Bailey, the colt progressed nicely and worked an eighth of a mile in :10 flat for this year's Keeneland April Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. Purchased for \$475,000 by these top connections, the bay worked well at both Santa Anita and this track, and was dispatched the 7-10 chalk to score at first asking. Well-placed between rivals and not far from the pace of second choice Sterling Outlook (Eurosilver), the half-brother to Kensei (Mr. Greeley), GSW, \$228,628, looked ticketed for second, but knuckled down late and reeled in the front-runner to score by 3/4 of a length. It was another 3 1/4 lengths back to Ivory Fudge (Candy Ride {Arg}) in third. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, \$33,000. Just over 15 minutes later, €100,000 was also the starting point in the bidding for another with a covering by that champion. Hip [916](#), the winning four-year-old **Blas Ceoil** (Mr. Greeley) from Jim Bolger's Redmondstown Stud, shares her dam with a total of six black-type performers including Radharcnafarraige (Ire) (Distorted Humor). That current incumbent of Bolger's Coolcullen stable shaped up as a potentially top-class prospect for her sophomore year when successful in the G3 Coolmore Stud Fillies S. and fourth in both the G2 Cherry Hinton S. and G3 Albany S. With Teofilo (Ire) also on her page, Blas Ceoil had obvious star appeal and Hubie de Burgh was ultimately the one to profit when prevailing with a bid of €300,000. "She's been bought for an Australian breeder who wanted a nice, young mare in foal to Sea the Stars and she fitted the bill," the buyer said. "This mare will go down to Australia in January and she will be foaled down there and the foal will eventually race down there. She's a nice young mare from a very good family."

Darley Draft Ignites the Trading...

After a steady, but unspectacular start, the action began to heat up as it was getting dark outside and the draft responsible was that of Darley, which Hugo Merry had particular designs on yesterday. Having paid €50,000 earlier in the session for that establishment's hip [750](#), the 2003 G2 Lowther S. third **Dunloskin (GB)** (Selkirk) in foal to Teofilo (Ire), he was back for more as the choicely bred youngsters came under the hammer. His most expensive purchase was €52,000 for hip [884](#), the four-year-old **Saa'ida (Ire)** (Diesis {GB}) who is a relative of Pistolet Bleu (Ire) carrying a foal by Dubawi (Ire). Three lots later, **Paracel** (Gone West), a five-year-old daughter of the 1998 1000 Guineas heroine Cape Verdi (Ire) (Caerleon) offered in foal to Shamardal, fetched €135,000 when selling to Bertie Butler. Moments earlier, he also paid €50,000 for hip [886](#), the Listed-placed 11-year-old **Sunray Superstar (GB)** (Nashwan) who is a full-sister of the 2001 G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner and G1 Prix de Diane runner-up Nadia (GB) in foal to Manduro (Ger). Next into the ring after Paracel was **Lion Forest** (Forestry), the unraced three-year-old full-sister to the 2005 GI Hollywood Starlet S. winner Diplomat Lady and half to last year's GII Comely S. scorer Dream Play (Hennessy). Carrying the only other foal by the pre-eminent sire Dubawi (Ire), the jewel of the Darley draft was knocked down to Thursday's session-topping buyers Mertoun Paddocks for €160,000.

Hot on the heels of that consignment was the second part of the draft of His Highness The Aga Khan and the star turn was hip [894](#), the three-year-old **Edallora (Ire)** (Refuse To Bend {Ire}) whose three Group One-winning siblings include the 1997 Irish Oaks heroine Ebadiyla (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). She was knocked down to Barry Walters for €105,000, a price which was later matched by SF Bloodstock for Tinnakill House's hip [908](#), the four-year-old **Towanda** (Dynaformer). Carrying a foal by Verglas (Ire), she is a full-sister to the unbeaten G1 Fillies' Mile winner White Moonstone. The momentum carried over into Shadwell's Derrinstown Stud consignment, of which the highlight was the €75,000 paid by BBA Ireland for hip [904](#), **Za Aamah** (Mr. Prospector). Despite being 14 now, the daughter of the 1989 G1 Yorkshire Oaks winner Roseate Tern (GB) (Blakeney {GB}) has the 2008 G3 Ballysax S. winner Moiqen (Ire) (Red Ransom) to commend her and is carrying a half-sibling to that smart runner by Alhaarth (Ire). It would be hard to imagine a horse compromising his own chances more than Dialed In did at first asking. He blew the break, spotting the field double-digit lengths. He ran greenly around the turn toward the back of a crowded 12-horse field. Once the pack straightened for home, he rallied gamely, but had no interest in running straight himself, lugging in several times under Julien Lejaroux. Regardless, he got up to win by a half-length as the 5-2 favorite ([video](#)). That explains why trainer Nick Zito lights up when you ask him about Dialed In, who made his unveiling in a 6 1/2-furlong maiden special weight at Churchill Downs Nov. 12. "Like everybody says: he's a serious horse," said Zito at Keeneland November earlier this week. "I thought he'd run big. But I think everyone was amazed at the trouble he overcame. He's the real deal." He certainly could be, even though his speed figure (89 BRIS) didn't come back particularly fast and the time for the race, 1:17 3/5, wasn't noteworthy. What was noteworthy was the colt's big, loping stride, and his sheer raw talent. And, of course, anytime a Zito horse wins at first asking--he hits at just a modest seven-percent clip--it's worth mentioning.

Dialed In gave some hint of his ability in the mornings--he had several eye-catching moves over Saratoga's slow Oklahoma training track, including a :48 1/5 work from the gate Oct. 18 and a bullet :48 flat work eight days later. He put in his final pre-debut prep with a :47 3/5 drill at Churchill Nov. 3 (2/32). Zito smiles when asked if he thinks he's got a legitimate Derby horse on his hands. "We'll just take him to Florida and go from there," he said. It isn't the first time Zito's had a nice son of Mineshaft in the barn. He's trained some of the Lane's End stallion's best runners, including the graded winners Fly Down, Cool Coal Man and Coal Play. The last two are owned by LaPenta, who said Dialed In's race was a roller coaster ride. "When he broke slow, I was extremely disappointed, since I had been anxiously anticipating his debut," said the owner. "While we thought he'd run a credible maiden race, aside from his greenness, his display of ability and heart exceeded our already elevated expectations. It was one of the more impressive/eventful maiden races I have ever seen." LaPenta, who often enters his yearling buys in juvenile sales, but passed with Dialed In because he was "extremely immature," said they would, "look for a one-mile allowance to begin his three-year-old campaign." Dialed In is a son of the 12-year-old Storm Cat mare Miss Doolittle, a \$1.3 million KEEJUL yearling who ran second in the GII Schuylerville S. at Saratoga in 2000. Miss Doolittle, herself a daughter of champion juvenile filly and GI Breeders' Cup heroine Eliza (Mt. Livermore), has produced SW Broadway Gold (Seeking the Gold) and SP SP Mambo Master (Kingmambo). She was sent through the Keeneland January Sale earlier this year and was hammered down to Arindel Farm for \$85,000 while in foal to Curlin. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, \$28,800. **DO WE NEED A STURDIER HORSE?
Racing Grapples With Smaller Fields, Fewer Starts**

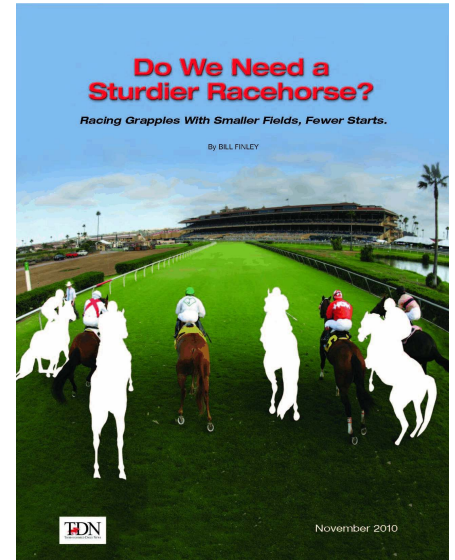
Allen Jerkens's list of feats is a mile or two long, but none is more impressive than his dismantling of Secretariat. He didn't do it just once, but twice, and did it in the span of eight weeks. First Onion beat the Triple Crown winner in the 1973 Whitney at Saratoga. Fifty-six days later, Jerkens got him again, this time with Prove Out in the Woodward.

They were different races, won by different horses, but each had one thing in common, besides their trainer: Both were running back in a week or less. Onion raced four days before the Whitney; Prove Out ran one week prior to the Woodward. Thirty-seven years later, with seemingly every owner and trainer in the sport convinced the animal is no longer sturdy and must be pampered, no one would dare try something like that.

Jerkens, the 81-year-old Hall of Famer and racing icon, can't understand why.

"The biggest change in racing is that people are of the opinion that you shouldn't run horses very often," Jerkens said. "It used to be that if a horse was sound and hadn't lost any weight from his last race and was feeling well, and if a race came up, you would run them. Now people for some reason think they shouldn't run. I can't understand it. I've had a lot of horses in my life who won real big races close together. What's going on, it's a fallacy."

Jerkens remains one of the most respected horsemen in the game, but there are probably some, maybe even many, who think he's out of touch with the modern realities of the sport and the equine athlete, a dinosaur from another era. After all, the statistics tell a very different story.

In 1970, the year Secretariat was born, the average number of starts per runner per year was a healthy 10.22. Forego, born that same year, ran 57 times, including 18 starts in 1973. But even those numbers, remarkable by today's standards, don't put the mighty Forego in the same league with some of the true iron horses in the sport's history.

Hall of Famer Stymie started 131 times.

Round Table raced 66 times and won 43 races before anyone sent him off to the breeding shed, from where he became the leading sire in North America in 1972. Whirlaway's 1941 campaign typified what horses did 70 some years ago. He had seven starts prior to the Kentucky Derby, including a win in the Derby Trial just four days prior to the Run for the Roses. After his horse won the Derby and the Preakness, trainer Ben Jones was apparently concerned there was too much time between Triple Crown races. Why else would he have started him in an allowance race at Belmont 10 days after the Preakness and 18 days before the Belmont? It was one of 20 starts he made during his three-year-old campaign.

Previewing Whirlaway's appearance in the Belmont allowance race for the New York Times, reporter Lincoln A. Werden wrote: "In keeping with his policy of giving the colt plenty of work, trainer Ben Jones announced that Whirlaway will not only race today (on a Tuesday), but possibly in the Peter Pan Handicap on Friday, depending on the outcome of today's test." (After winning the allowance race by 2¼ lengths, Whirlaway passed the Peter Pan). The most recent Kentucky Derby winner, Super Saver, raced just six times this year and was retired after a poor effort in the Travers. And that makes him more robust than most. In 2009, the average number of starts per horse was down to 6.23, a 39-percent decline over the 1970 numbers. That's among the reasons why so many believe the modern Thoroughbred is a veritable weakling, unable to stand up to the pressures of racing, prone to injury and no match for his tough-as-steel counterpart from the '40s, '50s and '60s.

"There's no doubt, we are breeding a weaker horse," owner and breeder Arthur Hancock said. "The big problem is all the medication. We are breeding a chemical horse." Hancock believes that the influx of drugs and medications, legal and otherwise, is at the crux of the problem, a theory many people share. Others believe the cause of the apparent weakening of the athlete is due to the changes in the way we breed horses in modern times.

Everyone, or so it seems, wants to breed for speed and not stamina, and if that means breeding a horse that raced just five times before breaking down to an unraced mare, so be it. Or maybe it has something to do with year-round racing, or problems with track surfaces.

Theories abound. Among those trying to answer the question are a number of scientists who specialize in equine genetics, smart people whose perspective is different from that of the typical horseman. Why has the breed changed? They argue that it hasn't. Dr. James MacLeod is a member of the team at the University of Kentucky's Gluck Equine Research Center.

Among other things, he studies how physical exertion and the musculoskeletal stress of athletic events predispose both horses and humans to joint injuries. In other words, he knows a lot about horses and genetics and how the animal can change from generation to generation. As a scientist, he cannot see any reason why horses now are any weaker or more injury prone than horses from 40 or 50 years ago. He says that not nearly enough time has gone by for the breed to undergo any sort of significant change.

"It is hard to arrive at a genetic explanation for a shift in the population as large and as diverse as Thoroughbreds in such a short period of time," MacLeod said. "I understand there are many variables in play in terms of how condition books are written, how we train and other factors, and separating those things out would be a challenge.

But, purely on the genetics and looking at what is this animal and the biomechanics of its tissues, it is difficult to support an inherited biological mechanism to explain why horses race much less frequently today than three to five decades ago."

Dr. Ernest Bailey is also with the Gluck Equine Research Center, and is an expert in the field of genetics and the horse. Like MacLeod, he says there's no evidence to support the theory that the modern horse is somehow less sturdy or strong than the horse of the mid-20th century.

"Many breeders believe that horses have become less durable," Bailey said. "This certainly implies a change in the genetics of the Thoroughbred horse population since the beginning of the 20th century when horses ran more frequently. The breeders are very astute and I respect their opinions. I do have some reservations. Forty to 50 years is a very short time to manifest such an extensive change in such a large population of horses, worldwide. The onset of the problem appears to be fairly abrupt, and that is more consistent with changes in management."

Recent business trends make these adjustments necessary to achieve a responsible purse balance and assure a vibrant beginning to the next Calder Meet." Officials report that even after this adjustment, purses paid during Calder, Tropical and overall are significantly higher than the last two years. Added Racing Secretary Mike Anifantis, "By rescheduling the two stakes to Jan. 1 and 2, horsemen will have well-positioned graded black-type opportunities for their fillies and mares. We understand the importance of these races to owners and breeders, including their national appeal to our fans for this and future years."

Churchill Announces Second Purse Increase:

Edited Press Release

For the second time in a week, Churchill Downs will raise its overnight purses due to higher than expected all-sources wagering levels. Effective immediately, overnight race purses will be increased by 20 percent for the final eight days of the Fall Meet, which wraps up its 21-day run on Sunday, Nov. 28. "We've been fortunate to have good weather and full, competitive fields during our boutique, four-week Fall Meet, which has limited competition from other racetracks during the fall," said Kevin Flanery, president of Churchill Downs. "Also, some of our high-level allowance and claiming races for our top-tier horses have not filled and were not used, which means there's more money available to distribute. We're thrilled that horse racing fans have responded to our product through strong all-sources wagering, and that our owners, trainers, jockeys and breeders will benefit from a 20-percent increase in prize money over the final stretch of our season." Churchill Downs announced that overnight race purses would jump 6.3 percent for the final 10 days of the season earlier this month. The revised projection for total overnight purses awarded at the meet is \$6.8 million, up from the original projection of \$6.2 million. "As we've said before, these positive purse adjustments aren't long-term solutions to the problems we continue to face in Kentucky's signature horse racing industry," Flanery continued. "Purses remain well shy of their highest levels of recent years, and Kentucky still isn't on a level playing field with states whose racetracks have an immense competitive advantage by having their purses fueled by slot machine and casino revenues."
