

## MAIN SEQUENCE RETIRES

Flaxman Holdings' **Main Sequence** (Aldebaran--Ikat {Ire}, by Pivotal {GB}), 2014 champion turf horse and older male, has been retired from racing after a tendon tear was discovered in the aftermath of his seventh-place run in the GI United Nations S. July 5, Flaxman Holdings racing manager Alan Cooper said Monday.

"Following Main Sequence's poor performance in the United Nations [S.], a thorough veterinary examination was carried out last week," Cooper stated in a post on the website of trainer Graham Motion's Herringswell Stables. "A tendon tear was discovered and the decision has been taken to retire him. The 2014 Eclipse Champion Turf Male and Eclipse Champion Older Male has given his owners great pleasure throughout his career." **Cont. p3**

## JRHA YEARLING SALE SETS NEW RECORDS

Eclipsing record overall results from the past two years, the Japan Racing Horse Association select sale soared into new territory during the opening yearling session July 13, raising the bars for gross and average.

Kenny Troutt's WinStar Farm helped contribute to the records, buying three colts in a historic first for an American-based stable since the JRHA sale was started in 1998.

"We've never been so high before. We are so

surprised, so happy," exclaimed a beaming Katsumi Yoshida, the leading consignor through his Northern Farm and affiliates, after seeing session gross reach

¥7,104,500,000 (about \$57,294,355), up a whopping 17.9% compared to the corresponding 2014 yearling session.

Average price leapt up 20.7% to ¥33,830,952 (\$272,830) for the 210 yearlings sold from 238 offered, even though the numbers offered and sold were substantially less than the comparable numbers for yearlings in 2013 and 2014. **Cont. p10**

The posting by Herringswell Stables added: "It is with heavy hearts that we share this information along with the news that his regular rider, Rajiv Maragh, is recovering from serious injuries sustained last week during a race at Belmont. Having a horse of this calibre who consistently performed at the highest level is an exceptional privilege. We are grateful to the Niarchos family's Flaxman Holdings and to David Lanigan, who facilitated the transfer of Main Sequence to Herringswell at the beginning of 2014."

"[Retirement] is something we've been talking about since we discovered the injury," Motion told the *TDN*. "It's a lesion right in the center of his tendon. He's perfectly sound on it, but the tendon is inflamed and he does have a small tear in it. At the end of the day, this is an injury that some horses can come back from, but the [Niarchos family] felt that he'd done enough and he doesn't owe anyone anything and he's going to be a year older. He's going out a champion and we felt that it's the right thing to do."

Main Sequence won all four of his starts against Grade I company last season in America, capped by a triumph in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 1. Winner of Gulfstream's GII Mac Diarmida S. to begin his 2015 campaign, the chestnut finished seventh in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 28 prior to his appearance in the United Nations earlier this month.

**“AMERICAN PHAROAH” ON THE BLOCK AT SARATOGA...AGAIN**

A fiberglass statue of American Pharoah, painted by the world’s most celebrated equine artist, Pierre Bellocq (PEB) will be on display at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearling Sale and auctioned for charity at the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation’s Aug. 9 fundraiser, confirmed Fasig CEO Boyd Browning.

Fasig-Tipton, of course, offered the 2015 Triple Crown winner at their 2013 yearling sale, and thought the fiberglass representation was not only a good way to memorialize the sale, but to raise money for charity, Browning said.

“We wanted to celebrate the amazing accomplishments of American Pharoah in a positive manner,” said Browning. “Peb, the TRF and American Pharoah make a great team.”

Bellocq, the celebrated cartoonist and artist who currently does commissions as well as working regularly for the *TDN*, was given a blank canvas to do as he wished with the horse.

Reached in his Princeton, New Jersey studio, Bellocq said, “I did a few of these years ago and somebody remembered it at Fasig-Tipton and they asked me if I wanted to do one for the sales grounds at Saratoga. I said I would be happy to do it. They said to decorate a horse to celebrate American Pharoah.”

Bellocq developed a whimsical representation containing the Triple Crown trophy, a flower from each race and a saddle towel commemorating America, as well as owner Ahmed Zayat’s signature silks.

“Basically, I wanted to use the two colors of Mr. Zayat—blue and yellow—and the dots on his silks, and it started this way. I would say there is a muse somewhere that leads me, but I just decorated it to celebrate this important victory.” *cont. p5*

### STORM THE BASTILLE

Tuesday's G1 Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp sees Sheikh Juma Dalmook Al Maktoum's busy sophomore **Storm the Stars** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) lead the overseas assault on the Bastille Day feature, with no sign yet that an arduous run of races has taken its toll. Having his seventh start of the season here and third consecutively at this level after finishing third in the June 6 G1 Epsom Derby and second in the Irish equivalent at The Curragh three weeks later, the bay has no Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) or Jack Hobbs (GB) (Halling) to worry about this time and trainer William Haggas has no fears that he is feeling the effects of a heavy campaign. "He thrives on his racing--that's why he's running," he said. "It's very unlike me to run a horse six times in a season, never mind in a couple of months, but with each race he has improved and I hope he can do the same again. This was never on the agenda, but he came out of the Irish Derby very well and the owner put the idea in my mind--I hope it pays off for him." Successful on a record 13 occasions and in five of the last nine renewals of this, Andre Fabre has meticulously readied the unbeaten **Ampere (Fr)** (Galileo {Ire}) for the latest edition and Haras de Saint Pair's homebred still looked raw when taking the G2 Prix Hocquart over 11 furlongs here May 10. Also representing the home team and similarly boasting a perfect record is the Niarchos Family's **Erupt (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who has taken gentle steps to these heights by winning the Listed Coupe des Trois Ans at Lyon-Parilly May 7 and G3 Prix du Lys at Chantilly June 14 both over this trip. Aidan O'Brien relies on the unexposed **Archangel Raphael (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who sports first-time blinkers after his win on his 3-year-old bow in a Fairyhouse conditions race over this trip nine days ago. "He has just had the one run this year in a three-runner race at Fairyhouse which he won well," O'Brien said. "The step up to a mile and a half did not give him any problems. He is a horse that has been progressing well at home."

## GLENEAGLES WORKS FOR SUSSEX

**Gleneagles (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is firmly on course for a titanic clash with French ace **Solow (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) in the G1 Qatar Sussex S. at Glorious Goodwood July 29. The dual G1 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace hero delighted trainer Aidan O'Brien in a piece of work Friday and is all set to take on older horses for the first time in the mile showpiece.

Coolmore's UK representative Kevin Buckley said, "I met Aidan and Joseph on Saturday in Newmarket and they said he is in great shape and did a nice piece of work the previous day. Hopefully he will live up to expectations on the Sussex Downs. He is a specialist miler and Aidan O'Brien holds him in high esteem. He is a very tough horse, with a low action and you can see the Giant's Causeway coming through in him."

The question of who will ride Gleneagles is up in the air, however, with Ryan Moore awaiting news on how long he will be on the sidelines for after being injured in a stalls incident at Newmarket last week. His father Gary Moore said on Saturday he expected his son to be out for "more than a month."

Buckley, speaking at a Goodwood preview lunch, said, "Ryan's accident only happened recently and we are still awaiting further updates, but it is an injury that is going to take some time and he needs to take that time, so when he comes back he is back to his self. We will stick with the position of using the best available on the day."

O'Brien is assembling a formidable team in addition to Gleneagles for Glorious Goodwood at the end of this month. Last weekend's G2 Superlative S. runner-up **Air Vice Marshal** (War Front), Listed Windsor Castle scorer **Washington DC (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}) and G2 Coventry S. second **Air Force Blue** (War Front) have all been pencilled in for 2-year-old races at Goodwood, while **Father Christmas (Ire)** (Bernardini) and **Diamondsandrubies (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) are among the older brigade.

Coolmore's UK representative Kevin Buckley commented, "At this moment in time it looks like Air Vice Marshal is likely to take his place in the [G2] Vintage S. and all being well Washington DC will line up in the [G3] Molecomb [S.] and Air Force Blue will go for the [G2] Richmond [S.] after finishing a strong second in the Coventry. It's highly likely that Father Christmas will take his chance in the [G3] Gordon S., while Diamondsandrubies will go for the [G1] Nassau [S. Aug. 1]."

"Full Mast choked, he went too fast," said Head-Maarek. "He got a little upset at the stalls but he can do that, so I don't think that was the problem. The three of them went too fast, they had no chance. We'll take him to Deauville, I'll try and find a race for him there. It would have been the [G1] Jacques le Marois [Aug. 16] if he had won but now we'll have to think about it. These things happen in racing."

## HAGGAS PROVIDES UPDATE ON RUNNERS

William Haggas is yet to decide whether or not Group 2 winner **Muthmir (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) will have another run before the G1 Coolmore Nunthorpe S. at York Aug. 21. Narrowly beaten in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot, he stepped up to six furlongs for the G1 July Cup Saturday, but could only finish ninth behind Muhaarar (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}).

"In the end I thought he had a poor draw and people will have probably written him off now," said Haggas. "He tried to turn left and get cover but by the time he

did the race was over. I don't think he enjoyed the track, Dane [O'Neill] said he didn't enjoy running down the hill. We'll aim for the Nunthorpe and possibly give him one run before then, but only possibly."

Haggas had gone closer earlier in the week with **MGSP Besharah (Ire)**

(Kodiac {GB}) who was just touched off in the G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. by Illuminate (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}). **cont. p7**

"She's a very genuine little thing who tries hard," he told *At The Races*. "She's a light-framed filly who only weighs 410 kilos but she's all guts and ran with great credit. If she's OK we'll have a go at the [G3] Princess Margaret [S. at Ascot on Saturday week] and if not we'll wait for the [G2] Lowther S. [at York next month]."

**Adaay (Ire)** (Kodiak {GB}), winner of the G2 Sandy Lane S. May 30, has already won two nice races this season but where he runs next will depend on what happens with a couple of other sprinters owned by Sheikh Hamdan.

"The plan was to go for the [G1] Maurice de Gheest [at Deauville] as he's won a Group 2 and there's little point in going backwards," said Haggas. "Whether he'll take on Muhaarar I don't know, I don't know if he'll run there and Sheikh Hamdan also has Mustajeb (GB) (Nayef) with Mr [Dermot] Weld and he's planning to go there so the owner has a few balls in that court and he'll have to decide. I'm going to put him in the [G2] Hungerford [S. at Newbury] and possibly try him over seven."

### KODI BEAR TO GOODWOOD

Clive Cox thought G1 Dewhurst S. runner-up **Kodi Bear (Ire)** (Kodiak {GB}) emerged with plenty of credit after finishing fourth in the G1 Prix Jean Prat, with the colt now in the shake-up for a swift return at Glorious Goodwood. Stepping up markedly in class at Chantilly Sunday after winning a listed race upon his return to action, he was embroiled in a battle for the early lead and slipped on the final bend but still stuck on for fourth place in the Group 1. The new G3 Bonhams Thoroughbred S. at Goodwood July 31 is a possible next port of call but other options will also be considered.

"He wasn't blessed with a lot of luck," said Cox. "It was a messy race. They went hard up front and he slipped on the bend, so I thought he emerged with credit. The other two leaders were effectively tailed off. I'd just like to see him for a day or two before I make a concrete plan, but one race we'll consider is the new one at Goodwood, which is a Group 3 for 3-year-olds worth £100,000. He's also in the [G2] Celebration Mile [at Goodwood Aug. 29], so we'll just monitor things over the next few days."

Arqana is launching an online bidding platform offering the same guarantees as the physical sales held by the sales agency in Deauville and Saint-Cloud, the company announced Monday. Arqanaonline.com is being billed as a "secure, user-friendly platform to sell high-profile horses," according to the French sales company.

The site is accessible online from any PC, laptop or tablet, and there will be no pre-established sales calendar or catalogue, according to the release, which said arqanaonline.com is conceived as a tool to sell one particular horse at a particular moment, whether it be a horse in training, broodmare, stallion or stallion share, allowing buyers a liquidity that a rigid sales calendar does not. Sales will typically take place over a 48-hour period.

Arqana president Eric Hoyeau said that the popularity of the wild card format at recent sales led to the idea. **cont. p8**

"Arqanaonline.com is a rather natural extension of our core business, as it preserves the traditional rules of auction sales while taking advantage of the web's potentialities. It is not the first online auction service in the industry but the 'one horse = one sale' principle is new and was inspired to us by the success of the Wild Card system, which has highlighted the importance of timing for certain profiles--horses in training but also broodmares, etc. From a vendor's point of view, this innovative tool has two major advantages: being able to choose the most appropriate moment to sell a horse, and to take advantage of the maximum exposure offered by the combination of an online tool with Arqana's powerful communication network."

The site will have information including photos, videos, and extended pedigree for the horses on offer, and, for a period of seven days before the sale, the horse will be available for inspection on the premises where it is kept (racing stable, stud farm), along with its veterinary file which may also be accessed by registered professionals via an online 'vet box'.

"As regards buyers," Hoyeau said, "Arqanaonline.com will provide them with additional opportunities of which they may not have been aware. And if they are not able to travel to France within the inspection period, they can call upon a local professional to carry out the due diligence on their behalf, while the vet file can be accessed online."

The bidding platform is accessible by people who have previously registered with Arqana for the sale in question, with a single-use access code allowing them to bid securely and anonymously.

As soon as a potential buyer has placed a bid, he or she will be informed of all overbids in real time, by email and text message. The website guarantees that all bidders are given a minimum of 20 minutes to bid. If a bid is placed 5 minutes before the end of the sale, the closing time is pushed back by 15 minutes for all bidders.

The same conditions of sale apply to the online sales as Arqana's physical sales.

Despite the very considerable efforts of the Sadler's Wells male line, the leading sires list in Britain and Ireland is a forceful reminder that the most dominant force at present is the male line descending from the magnificent Danzig.

Thanks entirely to his sons Danehill and Green Desert, the legendary Claiborne sire has no fewer than eight grandsons among the top 18 stallions on the Racing Post's table, plus two in-form great grandsons in Mastercraftsman and Sea The Stars. While it is the Danehill branch which is responsible for five of the eight grandsons--Fastnet Rock, Danehill Dancer, Kodiak, Exceed And Excel and Champs Elysees--it has been Green Desert who has shone the brightest so far this year, with three sons in the top six.

Cape Cross--the eldest of the three at 21--ranks second to Galileo, thanks largely to his Derby-winning son Golden Horn, who is rated 2lb superior to American Pharoah on the latest Longines rankings. **cont. p9**

The other two--fourth-ranked Oasis Dream and sixth-ranked Invincible Spirit--played their part in a Danzig-dominated few days of G1 action in Europe last week. It was Oasis Dream's 3-year-old son Muhaarar who won the July Cup, to reinforce his claim to being Europe's best sprinter.

A day later it was the turn of Invincible Spirit's son Territories, who stormed through from last to first in the Prix Jean Prat--winning impressively enough to suggest that a re-match with his 2,000 Guineas conqueror Gleneagles could be interesting. Even though Territories was a smart 2-year-old, it could be worth remembering that he has a May 7 birthday, which makes him nearly four months younger than Gleneagles. The possibility therefore exists that he could be the more progressive at this stage of the season (and he would need to be to make up the two lengths-plus by which he was beaten in the 2,000 Guineas).

Territories was the third stakes winner of the week for his sire, who had also scored with Arctic Gyr (Listed Prix de Saint-Patrick) and the 2-year-old Shalaa, who won the G2 July S. with Elronaq, another son of Invincible Spirit, in third. It's worth mentioning that

Shalaa's dam Ghurra is by the Breeders' Cup Mile winner War Chant, which means that this promising colt is inbred 3x3 to--you've guessed it--the mighty Danzig.

Interestingly, the third generation of Shalaa's pedigree

also features the top-class brothers Kris and Diesis, so he is the product of two similarly-bred parents. Kris and Diesis also feature in the third generation of another of Invincible Spirit's accomplished 2-year-old sons, Vale of York. This 2009 Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner possibly provided some of the inspiration for the 2011 mating which resulted in Territories. Another motivator may well have been Our Jonathan, a dual group winner at two years in 2009 who was inbred 3x4 to Danzig and 3x4 to Kris. More recently we have seen a G3 success by Rawaq, a filly with Kris and Diesis in her third generation.

Shalaa isn't Invincible Spirit's only good 2015 winner inbred 3x3 to Danzig, another being Muthmir. This gelding, who followed up his win in the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene with a close third in the G1 King's Stand S., is out of a Danehill mare.

Territories is another reminder that Invincible Spirit does well with mares from the Mr Prospector male line. For example, his best son, 2014's Horse of the Year Kingman, is out of a mare by Mr Prospector's grandson Zamindar

Invincible Spirit has achieved some notable statistics with daughters of Machiavellian. Some 26 daughters of 1989's champion European 2-year-old have produced 36 foals to Invincible Spirit. Twenty-four of the 31 starters have won and as many as six--17%--have become black-type winners. These six feature that fast filly Hooray (G1 Cheveley Park S.), Conquest (G2 Gimcrack S.) and Lockwood (a speedy dual Group 3 winner). Machiavellian also crops up as the sire of the second dam of Charm Spirit, who won last year's Prix Jean Prat before taking two of Europe's most prestigious mile contests, the Prix du Moulin and Queen Elizabeth II S. And it is Machiavellian's son Medicean who ranks as the broodmare sire of Local Time, winner this year of the UAE 1,000 Guineas and G3 UAE Oaks on dirt.

I could add that Invincible Spirit is by no means the only son of Green Desert with a spectacular record with Machiavellian mares, as Oasis Dream has the Group 1 winners Goldream and Naaqoos among his 18 foals.

Invincible Spirit also thrived with daughters of Gulch. This combination produced only 12 foals, but among them were the top-class Lawman, an impressive winner of the 2007 Jean Prat after winning the Prix du Jockey-Club, and Tawhid, a Group 3-winning juvenile.

In the wider picture, crossing Green Desert's sons with Mr Prospector line mares has also yielded the formidable Golden Horn and his fellow Derby and Eclipse winner Sea The Stars, plus that very good Oasis Dream filly Middy.

I have pointed out recently that Territories' broodmare sire, Machiavellian, occupies the same position in the pedigrees of those very successful stallions Shamardal and Dark Angel, as well as the exciting first-crop sire Zoffany. Incidentally, Shamardal will be represented in tonight's Grand Prix de Paris by the Royal Ascot Group 2 winner Balios, while Dark Angel and Zoffany both enjoyed Group 2 juvenile success at last week's July meeting, courtesy of Birchwood and Illuminate respectively.

Territories' credentials as a future stallion also extend to having an impressive female line. Sheikh Mohammed has the added satisfaction of not only having bred Territories under the Darley banner, but also the colt's first three dams, Taranto, Magna Graecia and Grecian Slipper, who respectively achieved Timeform ratings of 111, 112 and 102. Considering that Magna Graecia was a Group 3 winner over nearly two miles, it is understandable that Taranto stayed quite well for a daughter of Machiavellian.

Arguably even more important is the fact that Territories' fourth dam is the Irish Oaks winner Helen Street. This daughter of Troy visited Machiavellian to produce the highly successful stallion Street Cry and the useful Helsinki, who has provided Darley with another highly successful stallion in Shamardal.

I imagine that Darley's advertising copywriters can hardly wait for Territories' stallion career to begin.



## JRHA YEARLING SALE SETS NEW RECORDS

Eight yearlings surpassed the ¥100-million level, with six of those selling for the equivalent of more than \$1 million. [Hip 107](#), a colt by the world's leading sire by progeny earnings, Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), topped the session on a bid of ¥235 million (\$1,895,162) from prominent owner and gaming executive Hajime Satomi.

"This is an amazing market," Yoshida said. "The quality of the horses we offered this year was the best ever, so I expected a strong market, but these figures are far, far more than I expected."

The clearance rate reached 88.2%, another record for a JRHA yearling session, and Yoshida pointed to that figure as one of the most significant.

"This means there are many buyers, and I am very glad to have so many horse lovers at this sale," he said.

Yoshida also acknowledged another significant sale highlight, the participation by foreign buyers. WinStar was joined in the buying action by trainer Gai Waterhouse and owner Phil Sly, both of Australia.

With bloodstock agent John McCormack signing the tickets, WinStar ranked as the sale's eighth leading buyer with a total of ¥143 million (\$1,153,228).

WinStar President and Chief Executive Elliott Walden said he felt it was an honor to take the first steps by an American stable into the rapidly evolving world of

Japanese breeding, which last year was responsible for the world's two highest-rated racehorses, Just a Way (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) and Epiphaneia (Jpn) (Symboli Kris S). Walden was joined as a first-time visitor to the sale by several of his Kentucky colleagues--Ashford

Stud Manager Dermot Ryan, Gaineway's Michael Hernon and Airdrie Stud's Bret Jones--but he was the only buyer among them during the yearling session.

Walden picked out two colts by Empire Maker (Unbridled) in addition to a colt by Heart's Cry (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) who is the second foal of American Grade I winner Hilda's Passion (Canadian Frontier). The trio will be sent back to Kentucky, with plans still to be made for their futures. (see sidebar p12)

Beyond the records and the foreign visitors, Deep Impact once again towered above all as the driving force of the JRHA sale, just as he has been ever since his first offspring arrived at this market as foals in 2008.

With 20 yearlings sold from 22 offered, Deep Impact generated session sales of ¥1,815,000,000 (\$14,637,097) and an average price of ¥90,750,000 (\$731,855).

The session-topping Deep Impact colt ([hip 107](#)), a half-brother to G1 Cheveley Park Stakes winner Lightening Pearl (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) produced by Irish stakes winner Jioconda (Ire) (Rossini), was among those who came from the 80-strong group of yearlings catalogued under the banner of Northern Farm. A regal bay, the colt was an obvious choice for Satomi since the owner races his half-brother, Group 2 winner Satono Crown (Jpn) (Marju {Ire}), who finished third in this year's G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby).

Satomi said his expectations for the yearling are high.

"Satono Crown has a very, very good turn of speed, and that's a specialty of Deep Impact, too. So, I believe this horse is going to have a brilliant turn of foot," Satomi said, adding that his trainer, Noriyuki Hori, gave the colt high marks.

"The price was more than I thought, but this was one I couldn't miss," Satomi said.

Not long after the session started, Satomi plunged in for his first purchase over ¥100 million, prevailing in a sparring match with Makoto Kaneko for [hip 19](#), a nearly black Deep Impact colt, on a bid of ¥195 million (\$1,572,581). Northern Farm also consigned that colt, who is the first foal out of New Zealand champion King's Rose (NZ) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}).

"When I went to Northern Farm to inspect sale horses, I liked this colt a lot," Satomi said, "and my adviser, Yasuo Ikee (who trained Deep Impact), highly recommended him, so I decided to buy him, but that was my final bid."

Satomi finished the day as the session's leading buyer, making seven purchases for a total of

¥763,000,000 (\$6,153,226). His primary rival for top-level horses was Kaneko, the savvy software services specialist who succeeded in buying the co-second highest priced yearlings, colts by Deep Impact and Tapit, that each brought ¥230 million (\$1,854,839).

Kaneko's first major purchase was [hip 50](#), the blaze-faced son of Deep Impact and multiple European Group 1 winner Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) consigned by Northern Farm, which, with its associated farms generated total sales of ¥2,283,400,000 (\$18,414,516). cont. p11

Kaneko outbid Masahiro Noda of Danox Co. Ltd. for the bay, who also hails from the family of G1 Deutsches Derby winner Buzzword (GB) (Pivotal {GB}).

Later in the session, Kaneko calmly succeeded in determined bidding for one of the other most highly prized colts, a spotted gray son of Tapit (Pulpit) ([hip 108](#)) out of multiple Grade 1 winner Champagne d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro) from Teruya Yoshida's Shadai Farm consignment.

Shadai had purchased Champagne d'Oro, a half sister to GI Belmont S. winner Ruler On Ice (Roman Ruler), for \$2.7 million at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton November sale while she was carrying the Tapit colt.

"It's a very good day for Tapit," Teruya Yoshida said with a broad grin after the sale. Shadai enjoyed a strong session overall, with 56 yearlings sold from 58 offered for a total of ¥2,129,500,000 (\$17,173,387) and average of ¥38,026,786 (\$306,668).

Kaneko, as is often his custom, declined media requests for comment after making his purchases.

He also added two colts by the late Stay Gold (Jpn) (Sunday Silence)--([hip 51](#)) for ¥64 million (\$516,130) and [hip 9](#), who is out of G1 Alcibiades Stakes winner Wickedly Perfect (Congrats) that cost ¥62 million (\$500,000)--to his spending ledger during the session.

A new major player to the JRHA scene is Kieffers Co. Ltd., which was the buyer listed for the other two yearlings that brought the equivalent of more than \$1 million, a filly and a colt both sired by Deep Impact and sold just minutes apart.

Masaaki Matsushima, based in Kyoto and best known for luxury automobile sales, is the man behind Kieffers. He is relatively new to racing but apparently unafraid to spend big money for yearlings.

Kieffers' first acquisition was [hip 71](#), Deep Impact's elegant colt out of European champion Sarafina (Fr) (Refuse To Bend {Ire}), from the Shadai consignment. The colt is Sarafina's first foal and was sold for ¥160 million (\$1,290,323).

Seven hips later, Kieffers acquired a lovely and leggy daughter of Deep Impact and G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Coquerelle (Ire) (Zamindar) from Northern Farm. [Hip 78](#) is from the family of Grade 1 winner and sire Roi Normand (Exclusive Native).

Action during the session was hot most of the day, just like the Hokkaido weather, which was humid and a bit stifling. Crowds packed the Northern Horse Park pavilion, often breaking into applause when bidding reached a crescendo.

Among the observers was Gainesway's Michael Heron, who said he felt it was important to visit Japan's premier sale partly because Gainesway has Japanese clients and Japanese buyers regularly come to American sales. He also wanted to see Shadai's Tapit colt, the only yearling in the sale by the Gainesway stalwart who ranks as America's leading sire.

"He's a really good horse; there's no question he's a standout," Heron observed of the colt. "He's got a tremendous pedigree, top and bottom, and he looks the part. He's got size and scope, and he's a top yearling in this market, for sure, and he would be in the U.S. too.

Added Heron, "Bloodstock is an international commodity and becoming more so. The quality of the Japanese bloodstock has gone to the highest level and they're to be commended for it."

There were several other international connections participating in the JRHA yearling session.

Runnymede Farm of Paris, Kentucky, sold [hip 20](#), a big, flashy son of G1 Dubai World Cup winner Victoire Pisa (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}) out of a half-sister to twice leading Japanese sire King Kamehameha (Jpn) (Kingmambo) to Yu Hirai for ¥33 million (\$266,130). The colt, a half-brother to three multiple winners in Japan also sold by Runnymede, was handled by Shadai Farm.

"We are delighted with the sale," said Runnymede General Manager Romain Malhouitre. "He showed and looked very good during his time at the sale. We cannot say enough about the professional and special care that Shadai Farm has provided to our horses over the years. We understand that he is going to a good home and wish the new connections the best of luck."

The Niarchos family also offered a yearling, selling [hip](#)

[205](#), a filly by Heart's Cry out of Sapas (Kingmambo) to Hiroyuki Asanuma for ¥22 million (\$177,420).

In just one of many moments that makes the JRHA sale unique among its counterparts around the world, officials held a charming

### Walden Strikes for WinStar...

Standing as tall as some NBA guards, Elliott Walden tends to be noticeable in a crowd, but the WinStar Farm president really grabbed the spotlight when he became the first American ever to purchase a horse at Japan's premier Thoroughbred auction, the Japan Racing Horse Association select sale.

Assisted by bloodstock agents John McCormack and Tom Ryan, Walden successfully bid on three colts, haltering two by Empire Maker (Unbridled) as well as a son of successful Japanese sire Heart's Cry (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) out of American Grade 1 winner Hilda's Passion (Canadian Frontier).

"I'm honored to be the first American buyer here," Walden said after concluding his purchases on July 13 during the yearling session of the two-day sale that is capped by a session of foals on July 14.

The pace of the Japanese sale, which features enthusiastic bidding by competitive buyers who turned out in stronger than ever numbers, impressed Walden, as did the quality of horses offered.

"It's exciting to see people want horses so much," Walden noted. "The top of the market seems to sell very well, and there seems to be a nice middle market, too."

Topping WinStar's purchases was the Heart's Cry colt, who was offered as [hip 87](#) by Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm and who came close to hitting the ¥100 million mark when he was sold to WinStar for ¥94 million (\$758,065).

"He was really a special horse," Walden said. "I became enamored with him at the barn. He looks like he has a tremendous amount of class and bone, and he's out of an American Grade I winner."

The bay colt is the second foal of Hilda's Passion, who won the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga Race Course for Starlight Racing partners and added three Grade II victories, one Grade III win and a placing in the GI Humana Distaff to her record, earning \$739,493. Yoshida paid \$1.225 million for Hilda's Passion at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton November sale, and she produced her first foal for him in 2013, a colt by Deep Impact (Jpn) named Sieg Kaiser (Jpn).

Yoshida said after the colt was sold that he had been "my favorite," based on his physical attributes, of all the 80 yearlings catalogued for the sale by Northern Farm.

Walden has been intrigued for several years with the idea of bringing some of the blood of Sunday Silence, whose offspring have been successful around the world, back to the United States. Heart's Cry, who had international ability and won the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in 2006 in a romp over the likes of top European runners Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}), is one of the legendary sire's best sons at stud, having sired the world's highest rated runner of 2014, Just a Way (Jpn). **cont. p13**

"Now we're doing it," Walden declared of the move to bring a Sunday Silence-line horse to the U.S.

The Empire Maker colts represent, of course, a well known commodity, particularly for WinStar, which stands the stallion's two best sons: Pioneer of the Nile, sire of Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, and fellow Grade I winner Bodemeister, whose first foals are yearlings and which were warmly received as foals at 2014 sales.

[Hip 106](#), a bay consigned by Chiyoda Farm and boasting a pedigree of international renown, is out of Reve de Fille (Storm Cat), a daughter of European champion filly Bosra Sham (Woodman) and granddaughter of blue hen Korveya (Riverman).

"He's a beautiful horse," Walden said after buying the colt for ¥39 million (\$314,517). "I feel like he will run on the dirt--he looks like a dirt type. And he comes from a really strong family; he's out of a Storm Cat mare and we feel good about that."

Bodemeister also is out of a Storm Cat mare.

The other Empire Maker colt bought by WinStar, [hip 44](#), a bay out of Japanese Group II winner Jolly Dance (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}), is a grandson of American-raced mare Peterhof's Patea (Peterhof), who won 16 races, including 14 stakes, while also placing in three graded events. WinStar acquired the colt for ¥10 million (\$80,646) from Nishikioka Farm.

"He's a good waking horse and he's very attractive," Walden said.

Nishikioka owner Mutsuaki Doi was pleased with the sale. "I'm very happy to see my horse is regarded highly by this very famous American farm," he said.

WinStar plans to ship the three Japanese-bred colts back to Kentucky but a decision has not been made on who will train them for racing, Walden said.

### Waterhouse Lands Bago Colt for Oz...

When the hammer fell and a euphoric cheer erupted from a corner of the Northern Horse Park pavilion, it was clear something special had happened.

Australian trainer Gai Waterhouse and a bubbly group of associates could not contain their excitement after landing their first purchase at the Japan Racing Horse Association select sale.

"We saw this colt and he just filled the eye--he moves very freely," a smiling Waterhouse said after posing with [hip 175](#), a stylish, brown son of European champion and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Bago (Fr) (Nashwan) out of Japanese winner Our Oasis (Jpn) (Desert King {Ire}) acquired for ¥10 million (\$80,646). "Hopefully, we'll win the Melbourne Cup with him in years to come."

Waterhouse said she would think overnight about future plans for the colt, who was offered by Tanikawa Stud--breeder of 1964 Japanese Triple Crown winner Shinzan (Jpn) (Hindostan {GB})--and where he would be sent. She did not have to think long, however, when asked for her impressions of the JRHA sale.

"We are very impressed with how quiet the horses are; they are well educated. Many people from overseas could take great leadership from how things are done in Japan," she said, adding that the "clear cut and open" sale system that includes publication of reserve prices is advantageous to buyers.

Her acquisition of the Bago colt emerged almost spontaneously and with help from a longtime rival, Waterhouse revealed, after earlier bids on colts by Deep Impact (Jpn) and King Kamehameha (Jpn) had fallen short. She and New Zealand-based trainer Paul Moroney, who had engaged "in many bidding duels in the past," joined forces to buy the colt.

"We've taken the first step now," said Waterhouse, indicating that more purchases will be possible in the future.

Bloodstock agent Satomi Oka, who is based in Australia, and Su-Ann Khaw, who handles social media and international business for Waterhouse, accompanied the trainer and her husband, Robbie Waterhouse, in posing with the Bago colt, whose second dam is American stakes-placed Kello Mello (Eastern Echo). The colt's third dam is a half sister to English champion and Group 1 winner Flirting Around (Round Table).

The Waterhouse team plans to continue participating in sales around the world and intends to travel to New York for the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga selected yearling sale, she said.

"It's something we've wanted to do for a long time," said Waterhouse, noting that her clients include Americans Jon and Sarah Kelly and Gretchen and Roy Jackson. "We're so looking forward to it."




### Hughes to Represent GB in Turkish IJC:

Three-time champion British jockey Richard Hughes, who is slated to retire at the end of the season, will represent Great Britain in the four-race Seventh International Jockeys Challenge, sponsored by the Turkish Jockey Club at Veliefendi Racecourse in Istanbul July 15.
