## QUALITY SHINES AT GOFFS ORBY

Four years ago, Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby made a resolution for the company's flagship Orby sale: to focus on quality. The new strategy was put into play the following year, and since 2012 the Goffs Orby yearling sale has gone from strength-to-strength, with improvements in gross and average year-on-year. In 2012, despite 32 fewer horses being sold, the gross jumped almost €7 million and the average and median were up by a whopping 46.8% and 38.1%, respectively. Things were again rosy in 2013, when a modern-day record of €2.85 million was set for the sale-topper and the average climbed 11.8% with 344 sold, 43 more than the previous year. Such a breakout

horse was always going to make it a challenge for last year's renewal to continue to build on those highs, but it too delivered, with the average up a solid 8% and the median up 23%.

"The last few years we've built on every success year-after-year, and the fact that

we improved last year's sale without the benefit of a modern-day record like the year before, the fact that we built on the average, median and turnover without that spectacular high spoke volumes," said Beeby. "It meant the sale was a more solid, steady sale than the year before."

The Orby catalogue in 2012 was trimmed down to 400 yearlings when the sale was cut to two days from three, and the numbers have gradually climbed again to 487 for this year's Orby sale, set for Sept. 29 and 30 in Co. Kildare. Beeby was adamant that the same standard of quality has been applied, and therefore expressed confidence of another strong sale.

"The reason we've gone from 450 to 487 is purely down to the quality," said Beeby, noting that the Irish breeders have been entrusting Goffs with more of their best yearlings. "We looked at just shy of 500 more yearlings this year, and as has been the case the last few years I just said to all the inspectors, 'forget about the numbers, go and find the horses and make sure they're of a certain quality.' Whether that was slightly more or slightly less, I didn't care. So we've ended up with 37 more horses than last year." **Cont. p8**

## QUALITY COLT SPARKS BOOK 3 OPENER

The first Book 3 session of the Keeneland September Yearling sale got off to a measured start Sunday in Lexington, but action picked up throughout the day with a colt by Quality Road providing the biggest bang

when selling for \$710,000 to Mark Reid of Walnut Green. It was the highest price paid for a Keeneland Book 3 horse since 2007.

"A breakout horse is a breakout horse," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "It can happen in any session and this one happened at the start of

Book 3. It shows there is plenty of money around here if the right horse shows up."

The session topper was part of a big day for Lane's End, which was the day's leading consignor with 29 sold for a total of \$3,765,000 and an average of \$129,828. The farm's stallions were represented by four of the day's tops; a pair of colts by Quality Road, a colt by Twirling Candy and a colt by Union Rags.

For the session, 266 yearlings grossed \$19,618,000. The average was \$73,752--a decrease of 4.9% compared to last year's first Book 3 session. **Cont. p3**

**QUALITY COLT SPARKS BOOK 3 OPENER**

The median fell 21.43% to \$55,000. The buy-back rate was 27.72%, up from 21.10% a year ago. During last year's first Book 3 session, 273 yearlings grossed \$21,172,000 for an average of \$77,553 and a median of \$70,000.

The session topper was one of three to surpass the \$300,000 mark. Last year, only one hit that figure. There were 11 over \$200,000 Sunday, compared to 12 a year ago.

"It was sticky today," admitted Russell. "It was tough. It started out slow, but it did gather momentum during the day and finished up very well. But I think the slow start dragged us down today, so we hope to get out of the gates better tomorrow."

Action was lively around the sales barns Sunday and Russell hopes that activity is reflected in the bidding during Monday's second and final Book 3 session.

"There are a lot of new people starting to show up," Russell said. "It's a transitional day of people arriving and people leaving. Let's hope the new people come with fresh enthusiasm and we'll start off with a good note Monday."

The Keeneland September sale resumes at 10 a.m. Monday.

Mark Reid of the Thoroughbred management company Walnut Green outlasted Donato Lanni after a spirited bidding duel to secure a colt by Quality Road for a session-topping \$710,000 during Sunday's session of the Keeneland September sale. Consigned by Lane's End on behalf of his breeder Ann Marie Farm, [hip 1814](#) is out of Paris Notion (Dehere) and is a half-brother to stakes placed Pointsman (Mt. Livermore).

"I liked everything about him," Reid said. "Physically he's young--he's a May 7 foal that has a perfect frame that will fill in and he'll be a pretty good horse. I think we're going to like what we'll see on him this time next year." **cont. p4**

Of the protracted bidding duel, Reid said, "I did not expect anything remotely close to that. We had him pegged at \$400,000 because he is an awful nice physical, but that got a little intense. But it's getting late for us and we wanted to get one bought. He fit the bill. He will probably go out west to our trainer out there, Michael McCarthy, and we'll hope that he develops the way he looks like he will and we'll have a nice racehorse."

Reid added he was getting a little payback with his winning bid.

"We were underbidders on the Uncle Mo that Bob [Baffert] bought on Friday," he explained. "And talking to Donato, we outbid him this time. So it was one to go the other way. We got lucky."

Ann Marie Farm, established by Noreen O'Neill and her late husband Ted in Paris, Kentucky in 1994, purchased Paris Notion for \$52,000 at the 1999 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale.

"I wasn't expecting that," O'Neill admitted in a statement. "I said, 'Are you sure we brought the right horse?' We're just dumbfounded. The horse was beautiful. We handled him right. He did everything right, never got excited. I'm glad he went to a good home. I really can't believe it. I'm just so happy."

Lane's End's Allaire Ryan said, "He was a very well-liked horse."

Of Ann Marie, Ryan added, "Usually they breed to race, but they've become a little more commercial in recent years and have been selling what they raise off the farm. So it was a huge success for them. They do everything themselves, they do it the right way and they've been rewarded for it. And that is so great to see."

**Ryan Stretches for Twirling Candy Colt**

Bloodstock agent Mike Ryan, bidding on behalf of an undisclosed client, acquired a colt by freshman sire Twirling Candy for \$320,000 during Sunday's session of the Keeneland September sale. Consigned by Lane's End, as agent for breeder Dixiana Farms, the yearling ([hip 1653](#)) is out of stakes-placed Early Vintage and is a half-brother to stakes winner Conquest Top Gun (Pioneerof the Nile). Early Vintage is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Tasha's Miracle and to the dam of multiple graded stakes winner Concord Point (Tapit).

"He is a lovely horse with a lot of quality and a great mind," Ryan said. "He's a very smooth horse. I couldn't find a hole in him. He was probably my pick of the day."

Of the colt's final price tag, which topped early returns Sunday, Ryan added, "We had to stretch. I told [my client] this would be one that we'd have to stretch on and we had to stretch. Somebody else wanted him pretty badly also." **cont. p5**

Ryan said a competitive Book 1 has provided momentum for the September sale as it moves through Book 3.

"I think the market has been very strong--Saturday was incredible," he said. "The deeper into the sale, the better horses bring more money because there are fewer of them and there are still people shopping. There is a great appetite for good horses. Book 2 had a lot of good physicals and Book 3 has them too, but you have to go find them. It's a lot of work and you have to look at a lot of horses. But the good ones stand out and the people are very prepared. They know what they want and they'll pay you for what they like."



**Trio Top \$200k Mark Early at Keeneland**

A trio of yearlings broke the \$200,000 barrier in the early hours of the opening session of Keeneland September's Book 3 Sunday. The group was led by [hip 1541](#), a colt by Harlan's Holiday out of Waving (Street Cry {Ire}). Carson Asbury, bidding on behalf of Chester Broman's Chestertown Farm, signed the ticket at \$285,000. It was Asbury's second purchase of the sale for Chestertown, having gone to \$555,000 for a colt by Unbridled's Song ([hip 651](#)) during Book 1.

The yearling was consigned by Gainesway on behalf of Don Alberto Corporation, which purchased Waving with this foal in utero for \$190,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November sale.

"He was a really quality, strong colt who made rapid progress in the last 45 days," said Gainesway's Michael Herson. "He is an excellent racing prospect."

George Isaacs, bidding on behalf of Southwind Stables, purchased [hip 1610](#) for \$235,000. A daughter of First Samurai, the yearling is the first foal out of stakes winner Celtic Chant (Songandaprayer) and from the family of Grade I winner Vicar. The chestnut filly was consigned by her breeder Clarkland Farm, which purchased the mare with this foal in utero for \$175,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November sale.

Margaux Farm owners Jim and Susan Hill made their 13th purchase of the September sale when going to \$210,000 to secure a filly by Ghostzapper out of Casey's Dreamin' (Unbridled's Song). Bred by Kingview Farms, which purchased her dam for \$80,000 at the 2012 Keeneland November sale, the yearling was consigned by Elm Tree Farm.

"We thought she was a very strong filly," Jim Hill said of [hip 1605](#). "We certainly liked her walk."

While the husband and wife team generally both go their own way during pre-sale inspections, Hill said both agreed on the Ontario-bred filly.

"We sort of split up, both my wife and I buy horses independently so that we are both involved," he explained. "And we both hit on this horse independently."

Of the final price, Hill added, "It was definitely more than I thought we'd have to go for her. I think it's starting to thin out a bit now in Book 3, so we thought we'd go a little deeper on this one."

**Keeneland Makes Sales Plan Around Breeders' Cup**

Keeneland has unveiled its game plan to facilitate the sales process ahead of its November Breeding Stock Sale while at the same time hosting the Breeders' Cup Championships for the first time this fall.

"We have tried to make it impediment-free, both for our buyers and our consignors and their staff, and for vendors," explained Keeneland's Associate Director of Sales Tom Thornbury.

Starting with Keeneland's Prelude to the Cup day on Oct. 29, buyers, consignors and their staff will be given hang tags for their vehicles to allow access through Gate 3 on Rice Road. There will also be specified marked parking areas for buyers and consignors and shuttles to the barns and back.

"We've tried to eliminate any impediment coming and going," Thornbury said. "You have your own gate and your access and parking will be close to the sales barns for buyers and consignors. There will be continual ingress and egress from Gate 3 on Rice Road for everyone involved in the sales, separated by screening and security to keep the racing fans and crowds going up to the racetrack and not filtering through the barns. And it's a short walk from the grandstand to a barn to look at a horse. It's a short walk back to the grandstand--in fact we'll have golf cart shuttles going back and forth."

Keeneland is also making sure those involved in pre-sale activities will still be able to conveniently watch and wager on the Breeders' Cup races.

"If you're involved in showing horses and you can't get up to the races, we have a Watch and Wager area between barns nine and 10 where we will have a tent and picnic tables and you can grab lunch right next door at the track kitchen and walk over, have lunch and watch and wager the races," Thornbury said.

The juxtaposition of championships and sales provides a unique opportunity for sellers, according to Thornbury.

"We're trying to make it as cozy, as comfortable, as accessible and as pleasant a situation as possible," he said. "And it's a great opportunity to showcase your horses before all of the major buyers throughout the world because they will all be right here. They won't have to take a plane from California and there won't be any delay."

Once the Breeders' Cup is over on Saturday, all gates and parking will be available.

"This is really only for a three-day period prior to the sale," Thornbury said. "Thursday's Prelude to the Cup and Friday and Saturday the Breeders' Cup days. Those will be the only days that traffic will be affected."

The Orby catalogue also features six yearlings from the first crop of Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Those offerings will certainly be keenly anticipated after the unbeaten champion had six youngsters sell for an average of €566,666 at Arqana August, and two of four through the ring sold at Keeneland September for \$800,000 and \$500,000.

The Frankel offerings are a filly out of five-time Group 1 winner Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away) ([lot 23](#)); a half-brother to French Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed US Law (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) ([lot 133](#)); a colt from the family of champion New Approach (Ire) ([lot 138](#)); a granddaughter of champion and dual Classic winner Imagine (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) ([lot 186](#)); a half-brother to champion and dual Classic winner Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) ([lot 303](#)); and a filly out of dual stakes winner Rose Bonheur (GB) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) ([lot 381](#)).

While Beeby said his team targeted Frankels for the catalogue, he noted they went after the progeny of Europe's leading sires just as aggressively.

The catalogue boasts strong representation by such leading sires as Galileo (14, one more than last year); Invincible Spirit (Ire) (14, four more than last year); Sea The Stars (Ire) (six); Shamardal (four, three more than last year); and Teofilo (Ire) (Ire) (12, double last year's number).

"Our focus was to get the best catalogue we could, and we were conscious of Frankel's first crop," Beeby explained. "We ended up with six, which we're very pleased with, but we also have 14 Galileos, so we shouldn't underestimate them. We have Redoute's Choice, Teofilo, Nathaniel, Invincible Spirit, Dubawi--we have a very, very good spread of horses. Of course we targeted Frankels, but no more than we targeted the others."

**Orby Keeping Them Home...**

While the primary focus of Goffs for the Orby sale has been quality over quantity, another major goal for the company has been to deliver results that will encourage Irish breeders to keep more of their best yearlings in Ireland to sell at Orby. Beeby said that strategy is working.

“Our key focus in terms of horse recruitment is to get the Irish breeders to sell a bigger share of their best horses in Goffs in Ireland,” he said. “That’s proving to be successful, and that’s where our main focus remains, because happily for us Irish and European horses are doing exceptionally well on the world stage. They’re as, or more, desirable than any other horses, so that’s where our focus is.”

It can’t hurt that, as well-documented in its recent ad campaign, Goffs has produced at least one European Classic winner in all but one of the last 12 racing seasons. This year Covert Love (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}), a €26,000 Orby graduate, flew the flag when winning the G1 Irish Oaks. Simple Verse (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}) held Classic glory for 15 minutes before being controversially disqualified from the G1 St Leger, a decision that is being appealed this week. She was a €240,000 Orby graduate in 2013, and if the appeal is won would be the second Classic winner for Qatar Racing purchased from Goffs, following Just The Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) in 2011.

“Every year bar one of the last 12 there’s been a European Classic winner,” Beeby said. “And that is just the headline of what Goffs offers.”

The Orby sale is offering quality winners season after season around the globe.”

This year’s catalogue also contains a smattering of U.S.-bred or sired youngsters by the likes of Bullet Train (GB), Dunkirk, Elusive Quality, Exchange Rate, First Samurai, Kitten’s Joy, Lonhro (Aus), Mizzen Mast, Munnings, Pure Prize, Street Boss and The Factor. There are also a handful of British-bred yearlings shipping across the Irish Sea.

“That’s reversing the trend of horses going from Ireland to England,” Beeby noted. “It’s not a flood, but it’s a trickle, and trickles can lead to floods. It’s something we’re conscious of, trying to get people to come and take advantage of the Goffs experience.”

That is a concept that applies to both sellers and buyers.

“No disrespect to any of our competitors, they’re all very good, but we believe that we will go that extra mile, work that little bit harder, and we’ll certainly go out of our way to make the Goffs experience as good as any, if not better,” Beeby said. “The customer care is unrivaled, the welcome is as warm as anywhere, and without being corny about it we just make sure people enjoy themselves.” cont. p11

Goffs will roll out a new concept for this year's Orby sale that will likely be a welcome addition to American visitors. For the first time ever, Goffs will have an X-ray repository.

"A couple of American buyers the last few years told us they thought it was a negative we didn't have a repository," Beeby explained. "It's something that hasn't been evident in Goffs over the years; it wasn't considered necessary or desirable. We changed our view on that, so we have a new repository where X-rays can be lodged by the vendors in a very accessible place right next to the parade ring. It's just another element to increase transparency and increase the customer care we're offering. We've spoken to a lot of the leading vendors and also a good selection of the sales veterinarians to make sure they've told us what they want and how it works best for them."

Another attraction for international buyers at Orby could be currency trends.

"I don't know whether people think currency is relevant or a red herring; it could be a red herring, but the fact that the Euro is where it is against the dollar and the pound at the moment means that buying in the Euro currency is highly attractive to any international buyer," Beeby said. "If you mix that together with the quality of horses, I'd say the sale is unmissable."

## BAROUCHE TAPS INTO TOP U.S. FAMILIES

In 2002, Barbara Facchino's blossoming Barouche Stud crossed the Atlantic to shell out \$900,000 on the 6-year-old mare Tap Your Heels (Unbridled) at Keeneland November. At that time, the stakes-winning mare had a yearling colt and a weanling filly by Pulpit, and was sold in foal to Forestry.

While the foal she was carrying at the time of sale died, the rest of the story could hardly have worked out better: Tap Your Heels's Pulpit colt, Tapit, went on to win the GI Wood Memorial and continues to re-write the history books as a multiple champion sire and the most expensive stallion to stand in the U.S. since his paternal grandsire A.P. Indy.

"It just makes it all worthwhile," said Facchino last week, reflecting on Tapit's success. "He's very exciting."

Barouche Stud could see more excitement in the very near future courtesy of Tap Your Heels's family when it offers a Teofilo (Ire) daughter of Tapit's full-sister Caressor as [lot 80](#) at Goffs' Orby sale Sept. 29. The dark bay is the second foal out of the unraced

6-year-old Caressor, and the fact that she will be presented at Orby is no mistake; it is the product of a well-planned strategy by Facchino to bring top American bloodlines to Europe.

Facchino began racing Thoroughbreds in Europe in the late 1980s with her late husband, Tony. She explained that at a time they had a large enough stable to be among the leading owners in Britain in 1990 and 1991, and also dabbled in some foal-to-yearling pinhooking, but did not breed. Upon her husband's death in 1992, it was time to re-write the business plan.

"After Tony died, Barbara asked me what way we wanted to go, and I just felt at the time we needed to get into the breeding side," said stud manager Rory Mathews, who joined the operation in 1990. "So we started buying our mares probably in 1995, and at the same time Barbara was looking for a new farm, because we were based on the Isle of Man. It did the job, but it wasn't really suitable for breeding racehorses." **cont. p12**

Facchino discovered her current property in 1998. Construction began two years later and the farm's first crop of foals was born in 2001. At the same time, Mathews explained, "we started coming across to the States. We met up with [Dromoland Farm's] Gerry Dilger through Peter Doyle, and we started buying one or two mares in the U.S., purely to take back to Europe. Then we stumbled across Tap Your Heels in 2002, and it's snowballed from there."

Mathews explained that the initial purpose of buying American mares was to raise some commercial stock in the U.S., and while the operation still keeps around a dozen horses at Dromoland, four years ago they developed a new plan for the best of their American purchases.

"We decided to bring the best horses we could get our hands on over here over to Ireland, breed those mares to the best

blood we could get at home, and see where we could go with that," Mathews said. "At this stage they're only 2-year-olds, so we're only starting to find out what's going to happen with that whole mix."

One of those mares was Caressor, whose first foal, a Galileo (Ire) colt, was hammered down for 400,000gns at Tattersalls October Book 1 last year and is now in training in France with Rodolphe Collet. Caressor produced a filly by Frankel (GB) this year and is in foal to another of Galileo's Classic-winning sons, Australia (GB).

As for Caressor's Teofilo filly slated to sell at Orby, Mathews said, "She's a very well-balanced filly, a really good walker. She's very typical of the Teofilos we've seen, especially the good ones. You're looking probably at a filly that's going to be running as a 2-year-old and will hopefully progress from that."

While the filly already has the page to back up her physical attributes, it is possible that there is plenty still to come from the family. Tap Your Heels's first two daughters have both produced stakes winners: Home From Oz (Pulpit) is the dam of this year's G2 Peter Pan S. and G2 West Virginia Derby winner Madefromlucky (Lookin At Lucky), while Overandabeauty (Grand Slam) is responsible for last year's Cicada S. winner Noble And A Beauty (Noble Causeway). **cont. p13**

Tap Your Heels also has young daughters in Japan and Europe, so there is every reason to believe the page could continue to grow internationally.

Tap Your Heels has produced nine named fillies and just one named male since Tapit.

“They’re nearly all fillies, and unfortunately of the colts she had, two of them we lost as foals, one through accident and one that was sick,” Facchino explained. “So she’s never had many colts. But there are a few fillies whose stock are only just about to come to the racetrack, so that’ll be very exciting, because there are two fillies that have already produced black-type winners, which is lovely.”

Mathews added, “It’s exciting times. The reason we bought into [the pedigree] at the time was we loved the mare, but it’s an older family with a pedigree that has speed and stamina in it. That was the real attraction to it at the time, one of those real old, proper pedigrees.”

He continued, “One of the things Barbara is pretty staunch on when buying mares is that there has to be stallions in the pedigree. It’s a huge help when it comes to selling them commercially as well.”

Tap Your Heels has a 2-year-old Medaglia d’Oro filly named Rubies Are Red--named in a *TDN* contest--who was purchased by SF Bloodstock for \$400,000 at Keeneland September last year. Her latest produce is a yearling filly by Elusive Quality, which, contrary to Facchino’s U.S. business plan that sees everything sold, will be retained to race and later join Facchino’s broodmare band, giving her a daughter of Tap Your Heels on both sides of the Atlantic.

“Tap Your Heels is 19 years old now, so I’m sure isn’t going to go on producing forever,” Facchino explained. “So we’ll have her blood this side and then Ireland as well. She’s in foal to Super Saver--she was empty last year [after being covered by Super Saver], but she was allowed--she’s been a really, really fertile mare.”

While Caressor’s Teofilo filly is sure to be a standout of the catalogue, she is far from the only potential star in the Barouche draft. “We have a very nice Dark Angel filly who is a bit light on pedigree for Goffs, but she's a beautiful specimen, and she goes back to the great Niarchos family of Light Shift and Main Sequence,” Mathews noted. “Those sorts of things, buying on a lesser level with the pedigrees that are deep down to try to bring them back to fruition again, is something we also like to do, as well as spending at a higher level.”

That strategy also applies to [lot 333](#), a Poet's Voice (GB) colt who is the first foal out of a winning granddaughter of Charming Lassie (Seattle Slew), the dam of Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo) and a half-sister to the great producer Weekend Surprise (Secretariat).

Barouche will also offer [lot 33](#), a colt from the first crop of G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Power (GB) out of a daughter of one of its foundation mares, Nishan (GB) (Nashwan), who produced the dam of G3 Jersey S. winner Rainfall (Ire); [lot 337](#), a Lawman (Fr) colt out of a half-sister to multiple group winner Lord Admiral (El Prado {Ire}), with U.S.-breds Cannock Chase (Lemon Drop Kid) and Action This Day (Kris S.) further down the page; and [lot 469](#), a Mastercraftsman (Ire) half-sister to GIII Beverly Hills H. winner Turning Top (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), who has this year's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. winner Postponed (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) under the third dam.

Mathews said recent strong renewals of the Orby sale has increased his confidence in entrusting the operation's top yearlings with the Goffs team.

“I find with Goffs, the international market has improved immensely over the past three or four years,” he said. “We've gained a lot of confidence now in selling some of our best stock there. There was a time when everything that was top-class would go to [Tattersalls October] Book 1, but now we're quite happy to send them to Goffs.”

“The currency makes a huge difference at the moment, with the dollar and sterling the way it is,” he added. “We're hoping the American buyers will come across to Goffs and we certainly encourage them to do so. I think there will be great value at that sale for everybody, and Goffs seems to get the group winners as much as anyone else.”

## FAMILIES RUN DEEP IN TINNAKILL DRAFT

Dermot Cantillon and Meta Osborne know how to breed a good horse. The couple have raised and grazed three Group 1 winners at their Tinnakill House Stud in Co. Laois, Ireland: five-time international Group 1 winner Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}); G1 Matron S. and G1 Lockinge S. victress Red Evie (Ire) (Intikhab), now the dam of Group 1-winning juvenile and last weekend's G1 Irish Champion S.-runner up Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}); and, most recently, Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal), winner of the G1 Racing Post Trophy for Sheikh Mohammed and now a promising young stallion alongside his accomplished

sire at Darley's Kildangan Stud.

Tinnakill will present a typically strong draft of nine at next week's Goffs Orby sale, and will be hoping their good fortune with Shamardal continues when they offer [lot 314](#), the only colt by the sire in the catalogue. The April-

foaled bay is out of Nenuphar (Ire) (Night Shift), the dam of German champion 2-year-old filly Night Lagoon (Ger) (Lagunas {GB}) and herself the dam of G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. winner Novellist (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}). Nenuphar has produced another German stakes winner in the form of Night Tango (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}).

"He's a lovely colt; he's a very typical Shamardal in terms of physique," said Cantillon. "We're really excited about him, having bred another good son of Shamardal in Casamento."

Of the dam, Cantillon added, "She's a very good mare. She's the granddam of Novellist, and she's had a champion 2-year-old in Germany--that's the dam of Novellist--and one of her sons [Night Tango] was second in the [G1] German Derby, and she's a stakes winner herself, so it's a ready-made stallion's pedigree."

Nenuphar has an as-yet unraced 2-year-old filly by another German champion in Manduro (Ger), was barren to Teofilo this year and is now in foal to last year's G1 Deutsches Derby winner Sea The Moon (Ger).

There is also an American flair to the Tinnakill draft, as it will offer two youngsters purchased by Cantillon out of the Keeneland January sale.

Cantillon explained that he was specifically searching for a short yearling from the first crop of Frankel (GB)'s half-brother Bullet Train (GB) (Sadler's Wells) at Keeneland, and he landed on a colt that will go through the Goffs ring as [lot 345](#).

"I was there in January wanting to buy a Bullet Train, not being able to afford a Frankel," Cantillon quipped. "I'm delighted with how this horse has progressed; he's a very strong, good-looking colt that looks like a 2-year-old. He looks precocious."

Cantillon also picked up a Pure Prize colt that will be offered as [lot 337](#) next week. The colt received a boost on the top line of his pedigree last weekend when the Pure Prize filly Dothraki Queen won Churchill Downs's GII Pocahontas S.

"Pure Prize gets a lot of good grass horses, so I thought he was a cheap way to get a good grass horse and might be a stallion that works well in Europe," Cantillon explained. "Interestingly enough, one of his sons won the Singapore Derby this year, so he's getting an international profile now."

Of his reasons for seeking out American-breds to sell in Ireland, Cantillon said, "I like to swim against the tide a bit. Ten years ago, every second person at the sales [in Kentucky] was from Ireland. If you buy a nice horse and raise it well in Ireland I think the American horse can work well in Europe."

Cantillon pointed out [lot 183](#), a filly by Dalakhani (Ire), as another standout in his draft. The bay is just the eighth foal out of the 21-year-old mare Gold Dodger (Slew O'Gold), who has proven a worthwhile project for Cantillon and Osborne.

"This particular filly is all down to my wife, because a number of years ago I bought her a present for Christmas--a barren mare that hadn't got in foal for three years," Cantillon said. "Then we tried for two years to get this mare in foal and eventually succeeded."

In the meantime, Gold Dodger--who had previously produced the Group 3 winner Chintz (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), in turn the dam of Group 3-placed Queen Nefertiti (Ire) (Galileo {Ire})--enjoyed the ultimate family update when her half-sister, Solemia (Ire) (Poliglote {GB}), won the 2012 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Solemia and Gold Dodger are two of the six stakes winners produced by their dam, the G3 Prix Cleopatre winner Brooklyn's Dance (Fr) (Shirley Heights {GB}), and it is also the immediate family of G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Silasol (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}). **cont. p16**

"She's been a very difficult mare to get in foal and this is the only foal we've had in five years," Cantillon said. "We've had to be very patient and at least she's a very nice filly, and Dalakhani is a very good filly sire. It's one of the Wertheimers' best families, and it just keeps producing Group 1 winners. It's the family of Authorized and Alhaarth--there are some very good horses in that line. I think she's a standout in terms of pedigrees in the catalogue."

If the pedigrees of its Orby standouts are anything to go by, Tinnakill could be adding to its Group 1 family in the near future.

### ORFEVRE ELECTED TO JRA HALL OF FAME

Japanese Horse of the Year, 2011 Triple Crown hero and dual G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe runner-up **Orfevre (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}) was elected into the Japanese Racing Association Hall of Fame Sept. 18. The 7-year-old, who raced for Sunday Racing Co. Ltd until retirement to Shadai Stallion Station in 2013, beat out Japanese champion sprinter Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) to join the hall, with 95.9% of the votes, the JRA announced Friday.

Victorious six times at the highest level in Japan, the chestnut swept the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas), G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby), and G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St Leger), as well as the G1 Arima Kinen Grand Prix during his 2011 Horse of the Year campaign. He added a further two Group 1's en route to champion older horse titles in his native land, taking the 2012 G1 Takarazuka Kinen and 2013 G1 Arima Kinen. Overseas, the quirky runner also landed two editions of the G2 Qatar Prix Foy at Longchamp in 2012-13, prior to his near misses in the 'Arc'. Upon retirement, Orfevre's record stood at 21-12-6-1, with earnings of \$19,005,276.

"I want to express my thanks for Orfevre being selected as a Hall of Fame inductee," said Shunsuke Yoshida of Sunday Racing Co. Ltd. "It is a great honor to have him inducted into the Hall of Fame to stand alongside other Triple Crown champions that have come before him. I would like for all those who contributed, to all connections, firstly trainer [Yasutoshi] Ikee, and the fans who cheered him on, to bask together in this glory."

Bred by Shadai Corp., Orfevre is out of the winning Oriental Art (Jpn) (Mejiro McQueen {Ire}). His full-brother is Japanese champion and MG1SW Dream Journey (Jpn).

Added trainer Yasutoshi Ikee, "For me, it is a huge honor to have Orfevre selected as a member of the Hall of Fame. And at the same time, I want to give my heartfelt thanks to all those fans who gave Orfevre their support. There was his perfect conquest of the Triple Crown as a 3-year-old but also his headstrong move in the backstretch of the G2 Hanshin Daishoten. He was a horse that gave us many varied memories."

Ikee continued, "But, I think the memories that most stay with us are his 2012 run in the Prix l'Arc de Triomphe when he came so close to achieving the pinnacle of racing and his last run Arima Kinen, a performance that [showed] just how big a cut above he was."

"He wasn't able to realize our dream of winning the Arc, but it is my belief that his children will carry on that dream," concluded Ikee.

An induction ceremony will be held in the Kyoto Racecourse winner's circle Monday, Oct. 12.

**Kizuna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}--Catequil, by Storm Cat), winner of the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) in 2013, has been retired after bowing a tendon in his right foreleg training for the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn), according to the *Racing Post*. The Japanese champion 3-year-old, who carried the colors of Shinji Maeda to victory in the G2 Qatar Prix Niel, ran fourth in that year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe behind Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}). He also captured the G2 Kyoto Shimbun Hai and G3 Mainichi Hai during his sophomore season. Kept in training as a 4-year-old, the Shozo Sasaki trainee added the G2 Sankei Osaka Hai, before closing out his career at five with two more group placings-in the G2 Sankei Osaka Hai and G2 Kyoto Kinen. Kizuna retires with a record of 14-7-1-2 and earnings of \$5,203,585.

All three will enter quarantine this week, but trainer Aidan O'Brien has not made a final decision regarding his trio of hopefuls for the Flemington contest, held Nov. 3. Although O'Brien revealed that Bondi Beach, and Kingfisher were the more likely to make the trip to Australia. **cont. p19**

"Lloyd is a legend in his own lifetime," commented trainer O'Brien, after hearing the news. "We feel very privileged to have horses to train for him. The three of them are possibles for the Melbourne Cup, obviously. They have to go into quarantine with us on Tuesday and they'll possibly go in anyway. It's looking very possible that Bondi Beach and Kingfisher will go and we have to make a final decision on Order Of St George. "It's a very prestigious race and obviously a very hard race to win. Not many races stop a nation."

Though O'Brien has not had a Melbourne Cup runner in since 2008, he did send out Adelaide (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) to lift the G1 Cox Plate in 2014.
