EMPIRE MAKER TO GAINESWAY

Empire Maker (Unbridled--Toussaud, by El Gran Senor), sire of multiple champion Royal Delta and Triple Crown winner American Pharoah's sire Pioneer of the Nile, has been repatriated from Japan and will stand the 2016 breeding season at Antony Beck's Gainesway in Lexington. The 15-year-old stallion, who was sold to Japanese interests in 2010, will stand at Gainesway in an equal partnership with the Solari family's Don Alberto Corporation.

"We are building an international organization whose goal is to be truly world class," said Don Alberto principal Carlos Heller. "What better way to expand our base than to partner with Gainesway on three-time Grade I winner Empire Maker, who was the leading North American Sire in 2012 by worldwide earnings."

Liliana Solari, honorary President of Bethia, the parent company of Don Alberto, added, "This move clearly carries forward the vision of my father, the founding horseman of the family, who always encouraged us to seek out the best of everything."

Empire Maker, a son of GI Kentucky Derby and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Unbridled, is out of broodmare of the year Toussaud. He is a half-brother to Grade I winners Chester House (Mr. Prospector), Honest Lady (Seattle Slew)--the dam of First Defence--and Chiselling (Woodman).

"Empire Maker's pedigree is clearly one of the best in the world and his influence as a sire is enormous," said Beck. "This horse is especially meaningful as we launched the career of his sire, Unbridled, here at Gainesway. We are very pleased to welcome the Heller Solari family into our family at Gainesway."

Campaigned by his breeder Juddmonte Farms, Empire Maker won the 2003 GI Belmont S., GI Florida Derby and GI Wood Memorial. He was also second in that year's GI Kentucky Derby. He retired to Juddmonte in 2004.

Empire Maker's roster of American Grade I winners is led by two-time GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Royal Delta. Royal Delta, a six-time Grade I winner during her racing career, retired with earnings over \$4.8 million. She was named champion 3-year-old filly of 2011 and resumed her racing career after selling to Besilu Stables for \$8.5 million at the Keeneland November sale to be named champion older mare of 2012 and again in 2013. **Cont. p3**

FRANKEL IN FRONT AT GOFFS WITH €1.7M FILLY

Less than an hour into the morning's trade at Goffs Tuesday, the day's star package, a daughter of the champions Frankel (GB) and Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}), strode into the ring and stole the show with a €1.7-million price tag.

Michael Wallace of China Horse Club was late into the fray for [lot 23](#), but as early bidders Matt Coleman, Amanda Skiffington and Dermot Farrington gave way, Wallace held his nerve to have the final say over Ross Doyle. China Horse Club principal Teo Ah King beamed with delight as his agent signed the docket while commenting, "She's a very obvious filly from a really good mare and a horse like this holds great long-term potential. The Frankel side is self-explanatory and when you put sire and dam together with the filly's visual characteristics you have something that looks rather elite."

Empire Maker is also the sire of two-time Grade I winner Pioneerof the Nile, who is the sire of Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, as well as four-time Grade I winner Emollient. Emollient is one of four fillies by the sire to win Keeneland's GI Juddmonte Spinster S. The stallion has also been

represented by Grade I-winning millionaires Bodemeister, Mushka, Acoma and Grace Hall.

The leading third-crop sire in 2009, he ranked 17th on the General Sire list with three Grade I winners, including Mushka. In 2011, Empire Maker ranked eighth on the General Sire list with over \$7 million in progeny earnings and 11 stakes winners, including Grace Hall. In 2012, Empire Maker had more than \$10 million in progeny earnings on the North American General Sire list and was represented by 13 stakes winners, three of them Grade I winners, including Bodemeister. Bodemeister is currently the leading first-crop sire of yearlings, with 64 selling for an average of \$191,125.

Empire Maker, currently still in Japan, is expected to arrive in the U.S. before the Breeders' Cup.

Beck Looks to Build Empire

Antony Beck's Gainesway, which already stands leading sire Tapit, added another standout to its stallion roster with the repatriation of Empire Maker.

"I'm so thrilled that he's coming back," Beck said of Empire Maker. "I think like most people, I was surprised that, at his stature and level of success, he left the U.S. in the first place. He was tremendously successful here. And ever since he left, a lot of breeders and farms wanted to see him return, including myself. I think a lot of people felt he was better placed in the U.S. than anywhere else. He's an amazing stallion, a true Classic stallion. He gets 2-year-olds, 3-year-olds, older horses. He did everything. He sired horses of the highest quality."

Empire Maker's return to the Bluegrass marks Gainesway's first partnership with the Solari family's Don Alberto Corporation. Don Alberto burst onto the U.S. sales scene two years ago, purchasing the former 440-acre Vinery Farm in Lexington before going on a high-profile buying spree at the 2013 November breeding stock sales.

"It is our first time partnering with them," Beck confirmed. "I just met them very recently. They've been in the horse business for three generations in Chile, and know the business very, very well. They're wonderful people, and we're very excited about the future."

Beck is no stranger to Empire Maker's sire, Unbridled. The 1990 GI Kentucky Derby, a son of Fappiano, winner began his stud career at Gainesway in 1992.

"Unbridled was a brilliant racehorse, a Derby winner, and winner of the Breeders' Cup Classic at three," Beck said. "At four, he beat [champion sprinter] Housebuster over a sprint distance. He had immense talent and versatility as a racehorse, and then as a sire. To be able to bring back his best son is very special to us."

Beck continued, "One of the reasons we bought Tapit was that he was out of an Unbridled mare [Tap Your Heels], and he represents just unbelievable blood. Empire Maker is easily the best-bred son of Unbridled, and is probably the best-performing son of Unbridled. Unbridled died quite young, yet was able to come up with many, many great superstars."

Like Tapit, Empire Maker's book will be limited. "We'll limit him to 135 mares, same as Tapit," Beck said. "We feel that's a good size to give a stallion good representation, but to not stress his libido. It also means he won't have too many yearlings in the public market. We hope to stand him for many years to come, and that's what we're focused on."

Gainesway, which bred and sold the \$2.1-million sale topper by its resident Tapit at the recent Keeneland September sale, will also be support its newest stallion.

"Very definitely, we'll buy some very good mares to support Empire Maker," Beck said. "We have over 80 mares on the farm now, so a lot of those will be bred to him, as well. But if I can breed 25 mares to Empire Maker, I'd be thrilled. Those bloodlines are genuinely unique. You look at his pedigree and it's as good as you can get. Talk about blue blood. John Nerud is arguably one of the best horsemen ever in North America, and this is a combination of his blood, including Fappiano, Dr. Fager, and In Reality. Top and bottom, it's John Nerud's amazing assembly of genetics."

Beck acknowledged Gainesway now has a formidable duo leading its stallion roster.

"It's a real honor to be standing both Empire Maker and Tapit at Gainesway," he said. "Our philosophy is to try and do better every year, and I would like Gainesway to remain an elite, boutique operation, focusing on quality over quantity."

THE RETURN OF EMPIRE MAKER

Empire Maker stood for seven seasons in Kentucky before his sale to Japan for the 2011 breeding season, and it is very good news for Kentucky breeders that he will be returning, after five seasons in Japan, to stand at Gainesway in 2016. His seven North American crops have produced thus far 48 A Runners (almost seven per crop), a North American A Runner Index of 2.25, and 19 Grade I or Grade II winners, including Pioneerof The Nile (sire of Triple Crown winner American Pharoah), Royal Delta, and the leading North American first-year sire at this year's yearling sales, Bodemeister. Equally important, though, is that his return further strengthens the influence of the Fappiano sire line, primarily through Empire Maker's sire, Unbridled, as one of the two most important lines for American dirt racing. **Cont. p5**

He's already proven as a sire of sires, and there is a high likelihood of him also being an influential broodmare sire, particularly as 15 of his 19 GI/GII winners are fillies. For breeders thinking about where he might fit their broodmare bands, we would note that, of his 50 individual A Runners (including two from his first Japanese crop, foals of 2012), he has sired 10 A Runners out of Seattle Slew-line mares (including Royal Delta); eight out of mares from other Mr. Prospector lines (including three out of Seeking The Gold mares); seven out of Danzig-line mares; four out of Storm Bird-line mares (including Bodemeister); and, if you happen to have any mares with Lord At War in their pedigrees, Empire Maker has sired GI winners Pioneer of the Nile and Icon Project out of Lord At War mares. **Contact Bill Oppenheim at bopp@erb.com (cc suefinley@thetdn.com).**

REDDAM LOOKS TO STAY HOT WITH GOMO

J. Paul Reddam, who has been on a remarkable run with juveniles this season, led by Grade I winners **Nyquist** (Uncle Mo) and **Ralis** (Square Eddie), looks to keep the streak alive when **Gomo** (Uncle Mo) goes postward in Friday's GI Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland. A front-running 5 1/4-length maiden winner over the Santa Anita turf in June, Gomo was second behind Pretty N Cool (Scat Daddy) in the GII Sorrento S. over the main track at Del Mar before moving back to the lawn to finish third in the Del Mar Juvenile Fillies Turf last time out Sept. 7.

"We have always felt she would be better going long on the dirt," said Jack Sisterson, assistant to trainer Doug O'Neill. "Her first race, she was inside and pressured all the way. The reason she ran on the grass the next time was because at that time of year, Santa Anita does not write any two-turn races on dirt for 2-year-olds."

Gomo returns to the dirt for the Alcibiades, a Win and You're In event for the Oct. 31 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Sisterson admitted race selection for Gomo was less a surface choice and more an attempt to keep the filly separated from stablemate **Land Over Sea** (Bellamy Road), who was second in last week's GI Chandelier S. and third in the GI Del Mar Debutante.

"It wasn't a question of whether she was better on dirt or grass," Sisterson explained. "Mr. Reddam also had Land Over Sea for the [GI] Del Mar Debutante and also last week's [GI] Chandelier and he didn't want to run both in the same race. She trains well on the dirt and had a good work before we left."

Gomo worked five furlongs at Santa Anita last Friday in 1:00.60 (15/54).

The unbeaten Nyquist won the Sept. 7 GI Del Mar Futurity in Reddam's colors, just hours after Ralis had captured the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga. Nyquist added the GI FrontRunner S. to his resume last Saturday.

MIDWEST STARS ON DISPLAY AT KEENELAND

With nearly 350 horses in the stable at any given moment, it is rare to find a date on the calendar when Richard and Karen Papiese's Midwest Thoroughbreds does not have a runner competing or set to compete.

On opening weekend at Keeneland, the focus of the successful owners will be on the two homebred stars of their stable. Last year's champion sprinter and reigning GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero **Work All Week** (City Zip) will attempt to defend his title in the GIII Stoll Keenon

"It's hard to describe," reflected Richard Papiese when asked about the opportunity to showcase his pair of Illinois-breds at the highest level. "It's great. I don't know if I have words to describe winning races like the Arlington Million and the Breeders' Cup last year, and to have a shot to do it again this year. It's all good, and I'm just tickled."

Although this weekend's events stand alone as desirable races to win, Papiese has an eye for the future--particularly with The Pizza Man, who is slated to complete in the Nov. 29 G1 Japan Cup after his engagement in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf.

"You go into every race trying to win the race, but you want to do what's best for the horse," remarked the owner. "The biggest thing is for the horse to come out of the race good."

With that in mind, Papiese said he consulted with trainer Roger Brueggemann following The Pizza Man's score in the 10-furlong Million and ultimately decided that a cut-back to one mile made the Shadwell an ideal final prep for the World Championships. The shorter race was deemed preferable to a likely more taxing contest such as Belmont's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic.

"The Pizza Man is already in the Breeders' Cup,"

Papiese asserted. "It would be nice to win the Shadwell and we think we fit, even though it's a cut-back and people are going to think, 'Gee, why do they want to go a mile?' He holds the track record at Arlington for a mile. People forget that when he was a young horse, that's what he ran. He can go anywhere from a mile to forever, so it really doesn't matter. He'll be fine."

If Work All Week's 2015 campaign has been workmanlike compared to the three-for-three record of The Pizza Man, Papiese said he is thankful to have the opportunity to campaign a defending champion in the Phoenix and possibly the Breeders' Cup.

"Obviously there will be more emphasis for Work all Week [this weekend]," said Papiese, acknowledging that the gelding has won once [Senator Robert C. Byrd Memorial S. at Mountaineer Aug. 1] from three starts in 2015. "He's in a position where he may need this race to qualify for the Breeders' Cup. We're not sure how it's going to shake out. You control your own destiny here. If you win the race, you're in the Breeders' Cup."

In many ways, The Pizza Man and Work All Week are embodiments of Midwest Thoroughbreds' increasing emphasis on quality over quantity. Papiese quipped that he is not an "action junkie," unlike what some might expect from someone who heads an operation that has sent out nearly 2,300 winners since 2003.

"I love the business and I love the industry," he explained. "It just gets to the point where you're responsible for everything that goes through your barn. When it's time to retire all these horses and find other jobs for them, it's a full-time commitment and we want to do everything the right way. It got to the point where it was just overwhelming."

As such, the once claiming-centric stable is in the process of refining its breeding stock and becoming more active at the sales with an eye for higher-level runners.

"We had a pretty good Keeneland sale," Papiese continued. "We're down to a handful of mares--they're in Kentucky right now. We have about three solid mares out of a broodmare band of about 40 something when we started."

Papiese concluded, "The emphasis has been on quality for a little bit. As I told everybody over the last year and change, it's going to take a little while. We're not turning around a jet ski, we're turning around a barge."

While Papiese is understandably thrilled at the immediate prospect of running homebreds in the Breeders' Cup or Japan Cup, the results of Monday's racing further illustrated why the owner has reason to be optimistic about the future beyond the championship season. Midwest Thoroughbreds and trainer Jamie Ness sent out three juveniles to victory at three different tracks. **Jay's Way** (Gone Astray) and homebred **She's Lethal** (Mass Media) each earned their second career victory in optional claiming events at Delaware and Presque Isle, respectively, while **Rolin With Olin** (Talent Search), owned in partnership with Jagger Inc., won impressively on debut at Parx.

COULD AUGUR SHIFT MORE THAN THE BETTING PARADIGM?

On Dec. 25, a San Francisco non-profit company named Augur is scheduled to roll out a beta version of something it calls a "decentralized prediction market platform."

The Christmas holiday launch will go practically unnoticed by anyone in the racing industry, and Augur is very likely to remain under the sport's radar for months or even a year or two after its unveiling.

That would be a mistake because the repercussions of Augur's initial public testing could rock horse racing's economic model as we know it.

My bet is that Augur (or, more likely, a finer-tuned offshoot of its original concept) will evolve into a paradigm-shifting force that has the power to change the way the world gambles on any future event.

This includes (and is by no means limited to) sports results, stock prices, the weather, political elections, public policy decisions, court trials, life expectancies, the outcomes of wars, and just about any proposition that can be articulated by a market-maker and eventually reported as a yea-or-nay result.

Casinos, betting exchanges, the corner bookie, and yes, even horse tracks might soon have to get in line behind other long-entrenched United States industries whose business

templates have been radically disrupted by emerging technologies.

Examples of innovations bringing buyers and sellers together by cutting out the middleman and slashing commissions include retailers who have been upstaged by eBay and Etsy, hotel operators losing business to Airbnb and VRBO, and the taxicab industry getting crushed by ride-sharing services like Uber and Lyft.

In the gambling sector, the best-known example of disruptive change since 2000 has been the emergence of Betfair, which has delighted consumers and rankled bookmakers and pari-mutuel operators worldwide. To date, the only effective defense against letting exchange wagering take hold in America has been to try and declare it illegal for as long as possible.

But that might not be possible with Augur, which plans to set its bet takeout at an astoundingly low 1% while offering complete anonymity to its users. A [recent article](#) on the site Reason.com explains why, reading in part:

"Here's what's truly novel about Augur: It won't be controlled by any person or entity, nor will it operate off of any one computer network. All the money in the system will be in Bitcoin, or other types of peer-to-peer cryptocurrency, so no credit card companies or banks need to be involved. If the system runs afoul of regulators--and if it's successful, it most certainly will--they'll find that there's no company to sue, no computer hardware to pull out of the wall, and no CEO to lock up in a cage. This is new legal territory. If Augur catches on as a tool for betting on everything from basketball games to stock prices, is there anything the government can do to stop it?"

For some readers, the Bitcoin funding mechanism is bound to make Augur sound too futuristic and far-fetched to be considered a near-term threat. Since Bitcoins were invented in 2008, there has been ongoing debate over whether they represent "real money" or some different type of "medium of exchange." Converting them to cash requires trading at fluctuating (and sometimes volatile) prices on various global exchanges; last week the U.S. Commodity Futures Trading Commission declared Bitcoins to be a commodity covered by the Commodity Exchange Act.

But even if you don't quite buy into the concept of cryptocurrency, it is the "decentralized" underpinning of cryptocurrency--made possible by the fairly recent invention of a type of distributed database known as a "blockchain"--that allows participants to buy, sell, trade (and gamble) in complete anonymity.

When transactions are executed on Augur, they will get added to the system's blockchain, and that record will be instantly rebroadcast to the entire community of participants. Think of it like a massive shared file that is constantly getting updated: Records of transactions will be fluid and will not exist in any one place.

As a separate [Reason.com article](#) puts it, "This gives the network tremendous resilience. Deleting or altering past transactions recorded to the blockchain would involve invading the homes of every person in the world running a Bitcoin client and commandeering their personal computers."

A series of videos on the website www.augur.net explains how the betting will work. Simply put, users will be able to buy and sell shares in outcomes of future events, and will be rewarded for correctly predicting them. Ever-changing market quotes on shares will serve as the "odds," or the probability of the event actually occurring. The more likely the event is to occur, the higher the share price will be.

Both the actual betting and the posting of official results will rely on the "wisdom of crowds" principle, which states that if you ask enough people a question, the average answer is far more accurate than one provided by any single expert.

You don't even have to place bets to earn money on Augur: You can function as a "reporter" who shares in half of the 1% takeout for participating in the crowdsourced verification of results. **Cont. p8**

The other half gets distributed among market-makers who pose questions designed to generate handle, like "Will American Pharoah (Pioneer of the Nile) win the 2015 GI Breeders' Cup Classic?"

Augur is currently in "alpha" mode, and has raised \$4.5 million by recruiting a legion of reporters who have bought in for the privilege of serving as results verifiers and market-makers. "Reputation tokens" that can be cashed in for real money serve as the currency for making markets and reporting results, and the crowdsource aspect of Augur is the part that is designed to keep reporters honest.

For example, if you fraudulently tried to report the incorrect winner of a horse race in an attempt to manipulate the market, your result would be flagged as being inconsistent with the crowd, and you would be financially penalized (and eventually excluded from participation) for reporting a bad result.

In an [interview](#) posted in the online publication Coinjournal.net, Augur executives were specifically asked if their market prediction platform could be applied to a horse race, which isn't necessarily a yes-or-no proposition, but instead has multiple potential winners.

"Yeah," replied core developer Joey Krug, unfazed by the challenge. "We call those markets 'categorical' where you can have a bunch of outcomes."

Even though horse race betting is theoretically do-able, it's likely to be awhile before Augur evolves into a serious threat to the pari-mutuel system.

First there is the obvious problem of Augur's markets not being liquid enough to compete. They certainly won't be at first. But like any emerging paradigm, if Augur is appealing and robust enough, users will eventually flock to it. When U.S. racing first switched from betting via bookmakers to pari-mutuels in the early 20th Century, liquidity was a concern cited by early detractors. Eventually, pari-mutuels became the established platform.

Then there is the difficulty of the lag time involved in reporting results by consensus. Currently in its infant stages, Augur has set a schedule that verifies and pays out on results at certain times during the month-a timetable that is clearly not workable for hundreds of races that go off at intervals measured in minutes hundreds of times during any given day. Future iterations of blockchain technology are likely to improve upon the speed of reporting and paying out.

Plus, for the time being, you have to embrace the whole "alternative economy" thing just to participate. For most folks, the need to trade in dollars to buy Bitcoins or some other unfamiliar cryptocurrency just to open an account makes Augur a non-starter. But judging by how fast technology evolves, this too could become an irrational fear in a few years' time.

Sweeping aside all of Augur's implications for the future of gambling, one of its founders did say something remarkably profound in the Coinjournal interview that had more to do with keeping existing industries honest than competing for betting dollars.

"Augur is great for creating a decentralized whistleblowing incentive system," said the firm's director of operations, Jeremy Gardner. "A market could be made for 'Evidence that senior officials at the Securities and Exchange Commission have received bribes from Goldman Sachs will be exposed and lead to top level resignations in the next ten months.'"

Gardner continued: "The market-maker could [then] bet a bunch of money that that won't happen, and then someone at the SEC or Goldman Sachs now has a massive financial incentive to bet that it does happen and anonymously give the evidence to the Department of Justice, knowing they can be rewarded without compromising their identity."

Transfer that financial industry analogy to horse racing, and imagine how the rewarding-of-whistleblowers aspect might be used to clean up our sport.

Perhaps the collective wisdom of racing's crowd just needs to be properly leveraged with incentives to bring about positive change.

No decision has yet been taken as to which lucky stable will receive the €1.7-million filly. She is the first Frankel yearling to be bought by China Horse Club, which later in the session also added to its purchases with a Galileo half-brother to GI EP Taylor S. winner Lahaleeb (Ire) (Redback {GB}) ([lot 161](#)) for €250,000 and the sole Munnings yearling in the catalogue, a filly out of Brocatelle (GB) ([lot 73](#)), a half-sister to Baratheia (Ire) and Gossamer (GB). Bought for \$27,000 at Keeneland by Ger Burke, she was sold through his Glidawn Stud for €130,000.

Wallace added, "We'll continue through to the end of the European sales before allocating the horses to trainers."

With 193 of the 229 yearlings offered being marked as sold, the first day recorded a clearance rate of 84%, down two points on last year's corresponding session, while turnover climbed 2% to €19,614,500. Thirteen yearlings sold for €250,000 or more, but the average and median both dropped slightly, the former by 2.3% to €101,630 and the median by 7.1% to €65,000.

Gold Rush for Goldrun

Alexander Goldrun, the winner of ten of her 31 races, including five Group 1 contests in Ireland, England and Hong Kong, raced for Noel O'Callaghan during her training career with Jim Bolger. She retired to her owner's

Mountarmstrong Stud, where she has produced two colts by Galileo (Ire) and, though not in foal this year, she currently has a filly foal by Shamardal.

The sales-topping Frankel filly may be the product of one champion racemare, but her bold performance in the ring at Goffs, often pawing the air with her front feet as if wanting to walk on faster, brought to mind the distinctive pre-race dance of another outstanding distaffer, Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}). She certainly seems to possess a temperament which will enable her to cope with the clamour which is bound to accompany her eventual racecourse debut and she sailed through her first public test at Goffs with aplomb.

Rob Tierney, manager of Mountarmstrong Stud, allowed onlookers to admire the filly in the sun immediately post-sale and as she posed willingly for yet more photographs. He said, "We're all thrilled--I didn't expect that. Everybody loved her and she went down really well. She's been a pure pro all week and is just a super filly to be involved with. I've known her all her life and she's always been so easy to deal with. I must thank all the lads back at the farm for all their hard work--they're a class bunch."

Exceedingly Good Day for Deer Forest

Another extremely well-related filly, the full-sister to champion juvenile and Classic winner Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) ([lot 201](#)) from Jim Bolger's

Redmonstown Stud, was knocked down to Eamonn O'Reilly for €480,000, while New Approach's Darley stable-mate Exceed And Excel (Aus) was responsible for the most expensive colt of the day.

Roger Varian's stable recently took delivery of Sheikh Mohammed

Obaid's entire string and it will also be home to the chesnut son of the Italian Group 1 winner Aoife Alainn (Ire) (Dr Fong). The colt, who was bred and consigned by Luca Somaini of Deer Forest Stud, was knocked down for €400,000 to the trainer and is a half-brother to juvenile winner First To Post (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), the mare's first foal (click [here](#) for the audio).

"He looked a racehorse," said Varian. "He had plenty of size and strength and he's by a stallion who throws horses with speed and precocity."

The colt's delighted breeder, who also bred and raced his dam, added, "We had plenty of people around and he was busy enough, but the sales have been very hard to read in recent years. It's very important for the mare that he's gone to a good trainer. She's back in foal to Kingman (GB)."

Kelly Has Spirit for Cumani

Luca Cumani may be smarting at the recent loss of Sheikh Mohammed Obaid's horses, including stable star Postponed (Ire), but he will gain some comfort in the recruitment of a smart prospect by Invincible Spirit (Ire) ([lot 48](#)), who was bought by Harriet Jellett for €370,000 on behalf of Jon and Sarah Kelly. The American owners already have an impressive filly in training with Cumani, the G1 Dubai Fillies' Mile entrant Beautiful Morning (GB). Their most recent acquisition is a colt out of the Arch mare Arty Crafty who was bred by Airlie Stud. His dam is a sister to multiple graded stakes winner Prince Arch and half-sister to juvenile Group 1 winner Kingsfort (War Chant). **Cont. p10**

During a frenetic period, which saw five horses sell for €250,000 or more within 10 lots, Tony Nerses swooped for a daughter of Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) ([lot 40](#)) at €360,000 for owners Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar. Her half-brother Order Of St George (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was the facile winner of the Irish St Leger a fortnight ago and has just entered quarantine for Australia ahead of his attempt on the Melbourne Cup.

Nerses commented, "She looks a lovely filly and has a dual purpose for us as she will make a lovely broodmare after she's finished racing. Blue Diamond Stud here she comes!"

The fact that the filly is a half-sister to four black-type winners doubtless helped sway Nerses into his decision, but so too did the fact that she was presented for sale by Clare Castle, with which the buyer has enjoyed notable success in the past.

"I bought [Derby winner] Authorized (Ire) and Green Destiny (Ire) from these guys. Let's hope this filly is also lucky," he said.

The Clare Castle/Paget Bloodstock team bought the filly's dam, juvenile winner Another Storm (Gone West), at Keeneland for \$50,000 in 2010. Sent to Galileo the following year, she produced Order Of St George, who was sold as a yearling for \$550,000. Another Storm is also the dam of a pair of Group/Grade 3 winners in Asperity (War Chant) and Angel Terrace (Ghostzapper).

Moyglare Opts for Another Angel

Another major owner-breeder operation looking to augment the broodmare ranks was Moyglare Stud, whose representative Fiona Craig was pushed to €350,000 by Charlie Gordon-Watson to secure a speedily-bred daughter of Dark Angel (Ire) ([lot 227](#)) from Yeomanstown Stud.

Craig was emboldened in her purchase by the performance of Juliette Fair (Ire), who was second in the listed Blenheim S. at Fairyhouse earlier in the day--she too is a Yeomanstown-bred daughter of Dark Angel and was purchased by Moyglare for €240,000 at last year's Orby Sale ([click here](#) for the audio interview).

"She has a nice fast pedigree and we have a desperate need for outcross pedigrees," Craig explained. "Hopefully she'll be a good racehorse--and she looks a lovely straightforward filly. I wasn't looking for mares from the Northern Dancer line as there are plenty of those stallions we need to breed back to."

The filly, out of the stakes-placed Most Welcome (GB) mare Kelsey Rose (GB), is a sister to Lady O'Reilly's Sovereign Debt (Ire), who was runner-up to Farrh (GB) in the G1 Lockinge S. and is a dual listed winner.

Just four lots from the close of the first session, John Ferguson signed for the sixth of his purchases of the day when gaining the verdict on a Dream Ahead colt ([lot 246](#)) out of a winning daughter of Oaks d'Italia victrix Valley Of Gold (Fr) (Shirley Heights {GB}).

The colt's vendor, Tally-Ho Stud, turned a reasonable profit when selling Dream Ahead himself at the DBS Breeze-up Sale of 2010 for £36,000, having bought him at Keeneland with Federico Barberini for just \$11,000. The returns for his pinhooked son are much greater, however. Bought in the same ring last November for €78,000, his price improved to €360,000 ten months later.

Cause for Excelebration

The most expensive yearling to date by Coolmore's first-season sire Excelebration (Ire) is Camas Park Stud's successful pinhook, [lot 109](#), a colt out of the unraced Sadler's Wells mare Dance Avenue (Ire) whose third dam Madame Dubois (GB) (Legend Of France) won the G2 Park Hill S. and produced the Group 1 winners Indian Haven (GB) (Indian Ridge {GB}) and Count Dubois (GB) (Zafonic). The March-born colt cost €100,000 as a foal and was resold to agent Alastair Donald for €340,000.

"I only had two on my list for this particular client and the other was the Exceed And Excel colt [[lot 40](#)]," said Donald. "I was the under-bidder on that one, but I'm delighted to get this colt. He's a lovely horse--the best I've seen by the sire--and he'll be trained by Ed Walker."

Steve Parkin of Clipper Logistics is the new owner of Airlie Stud's Galileo half-sister to Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway) ([lot 112](#)) after going to €300,000 through agent Federico Barberini. The filly's dam, Daneleta (Ire) (Danehill), was a Group 3 winner, as was her sister Danelissima (Ire), and the family also includes stallions Sholokhov (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Soldier Of Fortune (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).


Mick Flanagan opted for a colt by Galileo ([lot 191](#)), whose dam Healing Music (Fr) (Bering) has already produced the Derby runner-up At First Sight (Ire) to the champion sire. The agent gave €260,000 for the late April colt, who is to remain in Europe to race.

Gatewood Bell was another to snap up a Galileo yearling ([lot 123](#)), paying €200,000 for Barronstown Stud's daughter of Devoted To You (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), while another buyer to have traveled from America for the sale, Shawn Dugan, struck for a trio of fillies by Lawman (Fr), Zoffany (Ire) and Mastercraftsman (Ire). The most expensive of the three was a daughter of Lawman (Ire) whose second dam Interval (GB) (Habitat {GB}) won the Prix Maurice de Gheest and counts Group 3 scorer Short Pause (GB) (Sadler's Wells) among her seven winners. Bought for 72,000gns as a foal by Amanda Skiffington, the Glenvale Stud-consigned filly's yearling price rose to €270,000.

The sale continues at 10 a.m. Wednesday.

Another Storm, herself a daughter of U.S. champion juvenile filly Storm Song (Summer Squall), was acquired by Horse France for just \$50,000 at the 2010 Keeneland November sale and, in addition to Order of St George—a \$550,000 KEESEP acquisition in 2013—the mare's now 2-year-old colt by Galileo (Ire) fetched 875,000gns at TATOCT last fall.

Rathbarry Stud purchased Aquarius Star for \$130,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November Sale with this foal in utero. The filly returned a nice profit Tuesday when selling to the Doyles for €250,000.

This Poet's Voice colt fetched 31,000gns from David O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud at last year's Tattersalls December Sale. That buy looked quite smart after Tuesday's €160,000 resell.

Yeomanstown Stud had another summy score Tuesday. Galileo's Star was acquired for 16,000gns at the 2012 Tattersalls December sale. This Dark Angel filly was nice profit for Yeomanstown, who also has a Dark Angel weanling filly out of Galileo's Star.

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

September 29, 1973...Secretariat, off as the 3-10 favorite, was defeated by **Prove Out** in the mile-and-a-half Woodward S. at Belmont Park. Trained by Allen Jerkens, who also sent out Onion to beat Secretariat in the GI Whitney H., Prove Out won by 4 1/2 lengths, with the favorite second.

September 30, 1981...Jockey Laffit Pincay Jr. recorded his 5,000th career victory aboard Wander in the seventh race at Santa Anita.

September 30, 1990...Bill Shoemaker picked up his first graded stakes win, saddling Baldomero (Ire) to take the GIII Golden Harvest H. at Louisiana Downs.

October 2, 1943...Belmont Park hosted "Back the Attack" Day in support of the war effort. Admission was by purchase of \$25 or \$100 war bonds. The track raised approximately \$25 million.

October 2, 1976...Forego, assigned 137 pounds, got up in the last stride to win the Marlboro Cup H. by a head under jockey **Bill Shoemaker**.

October 2, 1981...At age 17, Behavin Jerry set the record for most career starts by a Thoroughbred, making his 307th appearance. Making his first start as a two-year-old in 1966, he raced every year through 1978, took a two-year break, then returned to race at age 17.
