

200 PRE-ENTERED FOR BREEDERS' CUP

Triple Crown winner **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile), GI Pacific Classic heroine **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe victor **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) headline a group of 200 Thoroughbreds pre-entered for the 2015 Breeders' Cup World Championships to be held at Keeneland Oct. 30-31.

A record 44 horses qualified for automatic starting positions through the "Win and You're In" program and 32 entrants come

from overseas. Ten of the 13 Breeders' Cup races have been oversubscribed with more than 14 entrants. A maximum of 14 starters are allowed in each race with the exception of the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf, which are limited to 12. Chad Brown

has the most entries of any trainer with 14 and the Coolmore partners lead the owners with 10 pre-entrants.

"We are very excited by the remarkable quality and depth of our international fields for this year's World Championships, led by the top rated horse in North America with American Pharoah and the most accomplished horse in Europe this year in Golden Horn," said Craig Fravel, Breeders' Cup President and CEO. "With such intense interest focused on having the first Triple Crown winner to attempt a victory in the Classic against a dominant mare in Beholder and a solid group of 3-year-olds and older horses, is a race that will capture the imagination of sports fans around the world in a terrific setting at Keeneland."

American Pharoah and Beholder lead the field of 10 signed on for the Classic, which boasts a combined 29 Grade I/Group 1 victories. The Triple Crown winner, who has not raced since finishing second to fellow Classic contender **Keen Ice** (Curlin) in the GI Travers S. Aug. 29, faces older horses for the first time as he attempts the Grand Slam.

"Once we enter, I think the draw is very important," trainer Bob Baffert said during a media teleconference Wednesday afternoon. "I think the draw and the trip of the race, the pace. There are some crazy things that go on in the Breeders' Cup, as we saw last year. You just have to lead the best horse up there you can get ready. When the gates come open, it's a tough race. They run hard from the word 'Go.' Right now, I feel confident that I have him to that level where he is going to run a good race." **Cont. p3**

AS JENNIE REES LEAVES HER BEAT, A PROFESSION PREPARES FOR ITS EXTINCTION

There used to be a job called turf writer. Maybe you've heard of it. It thrived before anyone ever heard of Twitter, the Internet or blogs or television stations that broadcast sports around the clock, and virtually every major newspaper in a city that had a racetrack had one. These were men and, yes, women, who worked a beat, the racetrack. They were there every day, mingling with the jockeys, trainers, touts, agents and racetrack characters to get the latest news so that when you picked up your local paper the next morning, you knew everything there was to know about what was going on at the track. Several papers employed more than one person, be they handicappers or columnists, to handle the racing.

Then society changed. The Internet made the daily newspaper something only your grandfather read and horse racing went into an inexorable slump, falling further and further behind the more mainstream sports. Papers closed and circulation sunk at those that did not. Racetrack grandstands emptied out. Turf writers were either laid off or they retired and when they did they were not replaced.

The Hall of Famer added, "I get him ready as much as I can and he has to do the rest of it. A lot of these horses, you just have to depend on their heart to get you that little extra bit. That's where the horses really come in. I just hope I get one more like him in my lifetime."

Keen Ice also enters the Classic off an eight-week layoff since the Travers and Dale Romans feels his charge has continued to improve in that time.

"Keen Ice is the type of horse that gets better with every day with training," Romans remarked. "He is one of the few horses I've had that the more work you do with him, the better he gets. We saw him getting better every day since the beginning of the year, but the big leap was in the Haskell and the big leap to back it up was in the Travers. You aren't going to see those big leaps anymore I don't think, but you are going to see a horse that is happy with what he is doing, and has figured the game out and is mentally and physically improving daily."

Dual Eclipse winner Beholder looks to be the first horse ever to win three different Breeders' Cup races after taking the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in 2012 and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff in 2013. Conditioner Richard Mandella reported that she is completely back to normal and "jumping out of her hide" after spiking a slight fever yesterday.

"I've said all along if I didn't think she was at the top of her game, I would not try the Classic, I would go for the race that is written for her [the Distaff]," the Hall of Famer said. "I am standing here and she is going crazy for a carrot in my hand and I don't see any signs of what we saw [Tuesday] and I think she is going to be fine. To run in the Classic, you have to be at the best of your game. I think we are fine and I am not looking for an excuse today."

Beholder has only run outside of California twice, finishing second in the 2013 GI Kentucky Oaks and fourth in last term's GI Ogden Phipps S., but Mandella is not overly concerned about that being an issue.

"Any time you run in a race like this, you are concerned about everything, so it is no more [of a concern] than anything else that concerns me," Mandella commented. "My only concern right now is to get her in the best shape I can get her for the race and what happens, happens."

He added, "This time we brought the pony that takes her every day and the pony boy that handles him. We are trying to surround all our problems and head them off."

With only one win so far this year, **Untapable** (Tapit) does not come into the Breeders' Cup off the type of stellar season she had last term, but she cannot be counted out as she attempts to defend her title in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. The Winchell homebred faces a strong field of Grade I winners that includes **Wedding Toast** (Street Sense), **Curalina** (Curlin), **I'm a Chatterbox** (Munnings), **Sheer Drama** (Burning Roma) and **Got Lucky** (A.P. Indy).

One of the likely Distaff favorites, Wedding Toast enters on a three-win streak at Belmont, most recently capturing that venue's GI Beldame Invitational S. Sept. 26.

"Wedding Toast is doing very well out of her race," trainer Kieran McLaughlin said. "She will have her final work [Thursday] morning and she is just doing great. Obviously she loves one turn at Belmont. Keeneland happens to be two turns. She has won two turns before and she has just been better this year than last year. She drifted a little bit as a 3-year-old, but now as an older filly, she doesn't drift at all. She is hanging in great and running very well. We think she will run very well on [Breeders' Cup] Friday."

Also looking to defend his title is **Karakontie (Jpn)** (Bernstein), who will face several top European milers, as well as **Tepin** (Bernstein) and **Grand Arch** (Arch) who headline the American contingent, in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

"**TDN Rising Star**" and GI Woodward S. hero **Liam's Map** (Unbridled's Song) looks formidable in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, while a pair of Ramsey homebreds, **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) and **Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy), look to continue strong seasons in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf and GI Breeders' Cup Turf, respectively. Both will face major challenges from the European contingent, which is represented in both races by several Group 1 winners.

The GI Breeders' Cup Sprint looks to be a duel between speed balls **Runhappy** (Super Saver) and **Private Zone** (Macho Uno), while **Judy the Beauty** (Ghostzapper) looks to return to previous form and capture her second GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint. One that stands out in this loaded field set to take on last year's champion is sophomore and "TDN Rising Star" **Cavorting** (Bernardini), who enters off a trio of victories that include the GI Test S.



McLaughlin continued, "Since that time, she has trained great and run outstanding in all three of her races. She is working weekly and she is scheduled to work [Thursday] morning and then van on Monday. She couldn't be doing better. This will be her first time facing older fillies and there are some tough ones out there. She is doing well and we anticipate her running well."

Bobby's Kitten (Kitten's Joy) hopes to get back on track and become a two-time winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, where he will face speedy **"TDN Rising Star" Lady Shipman** (Midshipman), **Ageless** (Successful Appeal) and G1SW **Undrafted** (Purim).

The juvenile races all boast very strong fields with a pair of undefeated **"TDN Rising Stars"** leading the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in the form of royally bred **Rachel's Valentina** (Bernardini) and **Songbird** (Medaglia d'Oro).

The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile is headlined by several Grade I winners in **Nyquist** (Uncle Mo), **Ralis** (Square Eddie), **Greenpointcrusader** (Bernardini) and **Brody's Cause** (Giant's Causeway). After a disappointing debut effort on the turf at Ellis Aug. 1, Brody's Cause came charging late to earn his diploma when switched to the dirt at Churchill Sept. 11 and displayed that same late turn of foot when winning Keeneland's GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity S. Oct. 3.

"Brody is just a machine," Romans enthused. "He ran a great race at Keeneland. He shows he likes the racetrack and does nothing but show me he is going to run his 'A' race come Breeders' Cup. **Unbridled Outlaw** (Unbridled's Song) I think is a very talented horse we have in the race also. I was so happy the selection committee decided to let him in and he will be a horse to be heard from."

James McIngvale's GI King's Bishop S. hero **Runhappy** (Super Saver) caught the attention of many members of the racing community Wednesday after a six-furlong breeze in 1:09.80 at Keeneland. The sophomore is preparing for a start in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint in Lexington Oct. 31.

Shipping in from his home base at The Thoroughbred Center, Runhappy clocked splits of :11.80, :23.40, :34.60, :46.40, :58 and 1:09.80 with regular exercise rider Omar Torres aboard. He galloped out in 1:23 and 1:36.80. ([Video](#))

"It was pretty explosive at the beginning," trainer Maria Borell said. "I was like, 'Easy boy.' He definitely really wanted to go in the beginning. I had guessed he was going to do 1:10. That's just how this horse is. Omar was asking him to slow down."

Runhappy followed his success in the King's Bishop with a defeat of older horses, including champion Work All Week (City Zip), in Keeneland's GIII Stoll Keenon Ogden Phoenix S. Oct. 2.

"He came out of the Phoenix really excellent; we couldn't ask him to be training any better," Borell said. "He's training better for this race than he was before the King's Bishop and the Phoenix, so he's really coming into himself. He wants to run. He wants to be in front of everybody, even the pony at home."

"He'll get turned out and next week, probably Wednesday when we come back, we might just blow him out a little eighth--we'll see," Borell commented. "We'll see how he comes out of [this breeze]. Looks like he came out pretty well so far."

Fellow resident of The Thoroughbred Training Center and GI Thoroughbred Club of America S. winner **Fioretti** (Bernardini) remained at her home base for her breeze Wednesday. The GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint contender covered five furlongs in 1:02.40 (1/4).

"I was really happy with it," said trainer Anthony Hamilton, who never has had a Breeders' Cup starter. "We plan to come over to Keeneland Tuesday night and be on the track there Wednesday morning."

SHEER DRAMA FIRES WARNING SHOT

Harold Queen's dual Grade I winner **Sheer Drama** (Burning Roma) worked a bullet five furlongs in :58.88 at her Gulfstream base Wednesday in her final work prior to the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff at Keeneland Oct. 30.

"She went excellent," trainer David Fawkes said. "She did it well and galloped out good. She's fit. She came back today, and she wasn't even blowing. It was like she didn't even do anything. She drank water, which is good, but she wasn't huffing and puffing by any means. She's doing pretty darn good right now. I hope she stays this good. Now we have to get to the next step and get her in the paddock."

Sheer Drama is one of 16 females entered for the Distaff and enters off back-to-back wins in the GI Delaware H. July 18 and GI Personal Ensign S. Aug. 29. The chestnut will leave Gulfstream Thursday night for the 15-hour drive to Kentucky.

"Once she gets there, she'll have her regular training routine," Fawkes remarked. "She likes to go out early, so she'll go out early. Whatever she needs. She doesn't need to train hard, just get over the track and let her see the surroundings. We'll school in the paddock a lot, just walk through it and let her stand a little bit; that we'll do almost every day."

This will be the fourth trip to the Breeders' Cup for Fawkes, who won his debut at the championships with Sheer Drama's half-brother Big Drama (Montbrook) in the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint.

"You've got to bring 110%," the conditioner said. "The guys that are there, they're good horse trainers. Every single one of them, and they all know how to win. Whenever you bring big money, you better bring your big horse. It would be great [to win], absolutely; just wonderful."

GOLDEN HORN WORKS FOR BREEDERS' CUP

Star European 3-year-old **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) moved one step closer to an engagement in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf after pleasing trainer John Gosden in a work at Newmarket Wednesday. The winner of this year's G1 Investec Derby, G1 Coral-Eclipse, G1 QIPCO Irish Champion S. and G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, worked under regular race rider Frankie Dettori.

"Golden Horn worked this morning and we were happy with how he worked," said Gosden. "He worked on the long gallop

and Frankie Dettori was pleased with him. The plan is for him to head out on Saturday, all being well. He has held his condition extremely well. He put the weight back on to what he was before the Arc five days after the race. He has some constitution, and that is the one thing that gives

Another European shipper in good form for the Breeders' Cup is Khalid Abdullah's **Time Test (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who will contest the GI Mile for trainer Roger Charlton.

"Time Test is in a good place at the moment--I am very happy with him," said Charlton. "He had a gallop at Wolverhampton last week, jumping out of the gates and spinning round the tight turns under Ryan Moore, which was highly satisfactory."

"I am very excited to have another Breeders' Cup runner with a lively chance, and if he gets a good draw I think that he is capable of running very well," Charlton added. "He may still prove to be at his best over a mile and a quarter, but he has enough class and speed to be effective over a mile and I think that the turns at Keeneland will suit him."

She went to work at the Louisville *Courier-Journal* in 1981 and covered her first horse race in 1983. By the 1984 Kentucky

Derby she had taken over as the horse racing beat writer for the *Courier-Journal*, a relationship that appeared to have no expiration date. From the home of the Kentucky Derby, the *Courier-Journal* had to have a full-time racing writer, or at least one would think. And Rees never wavered in her commitment to excellence or showed signs of wanting to move on. She was always there, on the backstretch, in the press box or winner's

circle, always getting the story. She never slowed down or lost her enthusiasm.

She's covered every Derby since 1984, every Breeders' Cup there has been and along the way she has won four Eclipse Awards and was included in the Joe Hirsch Media Roll of Honor in 2014 at the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame.

"When I started doing this it used to be like adult summer camp," she said. "There would be this group and you would meet them at every stop. At the Florida Derby, they had a press hotel and hospitality suite. Guys playing poker and there was an open bar. Now there are so few people doing this. When I go to the Santa Anita Derby or the Travers, with very few exceptions, I am the only out-of-market writer there."

But even someone of her stature working in the city where she worked eventually had to deal with the shifting fortunes of newspapers and horse racing. In a state where college basketball, and not horse racing, is truly No. 1, her page one stories became page four stories. Her 1,800-word features became 800-word features. The paper could no longer afford to send her to all the races she wanted to go to.

She announced recently that she has accepted a buyout from the *Courier-Journal* and that Nov. 1 will be her last day there.

Rees would never complain about those sorts of things and gives other reasons for deciding to take the buyout, but it's easy to believe her job just wasn't as fun as it used to be. When asked why she's leaving the paper, she says it's because she wants to use her talents in other areas of the sport.

"I feel very passionate about some areas in racing," Rees said. "My husband (Pat Dupuy) trains horses and I spend a lot of time at the barn and I decided at this point in my life I'd rather be a part of the racing world than the daily journalism world. I decided that I'd rather use my communication skills in other ways. I don't want to be a daily beat writer anymore. I don't necessarily want to be in a position where I have to be impartial about some things that I am passionate about. I am passionate about some horsemen's issues and I'd like to think that I can use my communications skills and reporting skills to not just represent horsemen's entities but also racetracks. I want to help promote Kentucky racing. I felt like I could have stayed at the *Courier* as long as I wanted to, but I thought this was a good time to pursue these other interests that I have."

Rees doesn't know what the *Courier-Journal* will do about replacing her and Sports Editor Chris White told the *TDN* in an email that no decisions have been made yet about what to do with the racing beat. But with newspapers being what they are these days it's all but guaranteed that the *Courier-Journal* will not hire someone to take her place and will instead go with a reporter-by-committee structure using the remaining staffers to handle the racing job.

When Rees leaves Nov. 1, there will be only one remaining racing writer left for a daily metropolitan paper, Alicia Wincze Hughes of the Lexington *Herald-Leader*. Working in a horse crazy town for a paper that appears to be relatively stable, it would seem that she's not going anywhere, but one never knows. When you can lose a Jennie Rees anything is possible.

Rees was well liked by just about everybody but there will be those who won't get too maudlin about her exit. Isn't this what progress is all about? If it is, then maybe progress isn't all it's cracked up to be. There were brilliant men who brought racing to life day after day in the sports pages of America, some of whom helped make the Kentucky Derby what it is today. Red Smith and Joe Palmer. Jim Murray and Bill Nack. Walter Haight, Steve Crist, Andy Beyer. And of late, Jennie Rees. They were part of the fabric of the sport and without them the sport just isn't as good.

Rees says don't be sad for her. She's excited about the next chapter in her life. But you should be sad for the game.

THE FACTOR COLT TOPS THIRD DAY AT

FTKCOCT By Lucas Marquardt

Wednesday's third session of the Fasig-Tipton October Fall Yearlings Sale dipped a touch by average and median compared to the first two days of the sale, but well-pedigreed and attractive horses continued to do well on the penultimate day of selling. The 213 horses that sold on Wednesday brought \$6,727,700, an average of \$31,585. The session median was \$15,000.

That left the cumulative 2015 figures at 639 horses sold for \$21,566,700, an average of \$33,751. The cumulative median is \$15,000.

Direct year-over-year comparisons are difficult from 2014, when the sale was held over three sessions. Last year's overall average was \$35,850, while the median was \$18,500.

Yesterday's RNA rate, from 93 horses not sold, was 30.4%. The cumulative RNA now stands at 31.6%.

"It was a very similar marketplace that we saw over the first two

days," said Fasig-Tipton President and CEO Boyd Browning, Jr. "There's lots of competition for what are perceived to be the better-quality horses. The folks downstairs are saying they can't get anything bought that they really like, and it's hard to sell a horse that's not perceived to be of a certain value."

Topping the session at \$290,000 was a colt from the first crop of the breakout freshman sire The Factor (War Front). Altimira Racing purchased the son of Salvar (Eddington), a half-sibling to the good sprinter Clearly Now (Horse Greeley), from the draft of Paramount Sales, agent. The Apr. 4-foaled bay sold as Hip [927](#).

The colt was originally purchased for \$115,000 by Springhouse Farm. "He was a very nice colt, and all the right people landed on him," said Paramount's Gabriel Duignan. "We put a stop to the scopes at 13—he was very popular."

Coming into the session, The Factor was the second-leading first-crop sire with an average of \$145,506 from 65 sold. Duignan said he's been impressed by Lane's End sire's first yearlings. "He's definitely making a very, very nice horse," he said. "They're all a uniform type—they're very athletic, sharp, precocious-looking horses. He's a stallion, I have to say, that has a great shot at making it. Mine here really threw back to War Front, or even to Danzig."

Asked about current market conditions, Duignan echoed a common theme. "If you're selling numbers, it's tough," he said. "There's money for the good ones, but it's very selective, and then there's just a huge fall off the cliff."

Duignan said an imbalance between supply and demand, at least in the bottom third of the market, seems to be the culprit.

"In past years, we had the Russians or the South Americans buy a lot of those [lower-end horses], but we don't seem to have that here. I do think it's more a lack of buyers than the horses themselves—there are going to be some good buys out here."

A colt by Uncle Mo--Scott's Aly Cat (Tale of the Cat) brought \$250,000 to be the session's second-highest lot. Paul Sharp signed for the colt, who was consigned by Van Meter-Gentry Sales, agent, as Hip [944](#).

"In general, I think the trade's been pretty good," Sharp said of the market. "Good horses are bringing relative money. But this time of year, there are a lot of horses that might not be the type we want to buy to pinhook, but that are still good horses. And those horses aren't finding the end users."

The session's third-highest lot, and top-priced filly, was a \$160,000 Unbridled's Song miss out of Scoot On By (Catiemus). The filly, named She Has Risen, was consigned by Taylor Made Sales as Hip [943](#). She is a half-sister to MSP Triple Cross (Werblin).

Loaded for BC Bear, Sharp Reloads at F-T...

If you break and train young horses, to have a single runner in the Breeders' Cup is an accomplishment. So the fact that Paul Sharp is set to have five in the World Championships is truly noteworthy, especially considering the Florida-based horseman and his wife Sarah break only 50 or so youngsters a year.

"My horses are running like crazy this year," Sharp shrugged in a matter-of-fact manner from the back ring at Fasig yesterday.

Yes they are. Among the Sharp-broke horses pre-entered for the Breeders' Cup is the unbeaten juvenile Riker (Include) (Juvenile); the classy MGSW Hard Not to Like (Hard Spun) (F/M Turf); the Turf Sprint hopefuls Channel Marker (Purim) and Something Extra (Indian Charlie); and Catch a Glimpse (City Zip) (Juvenile Fillies Turf). **Cont. p17**

But Sharp's mind wasn't lingering on dreams of Breeders' Cup glory Wednesday in Lexington. Instead, he was looking for future stars, and hopes he found one in the form of Hip [944](#).

"He's absolutely gorgeous," Sharp said. "He looks like a good Indian Charlie, if you remember what the good Indian Charlies used to look like."

The colt, consigned by Van Meter-Gentry Sales, is the first foal from Scott's Aly Cat (Tale of the Cat), a half to SW King Henry.

Sharp said he was buying for an undisclosed partnership. "We had got some people together to buy him, and we knew he was going to cost some money," explained Sharp. "We put one figure on him for racing, and one for pinhooking, and he kind of fell in between. We'll get him home and break him, and we'll evaluate him like we do all our horses. If we think he'll be a pinhook-able horse, we'll definitely give it a try. Uncle Mo is the leading freshman sire, and if he has a good Breeders' Cup, there's a lot of upside here."

Uncle Mo is expected to pair in the Breeder's Cup, not including the GI Alcibiades winner Gomo, who has been sidelined by injury. The Ashford sire's unbeaten Nyquist will be among the favorites for the GI Juvenile, while Thrilled is cross-entered in the Juvenile Fillies and Juvenile Fillies Turf.

Likely to join the former in the Juvenile is Riker, who emerged from Sharp's program this spring to go four-for-four up at Woodbine. Sold for \$60,000 to Tucci Stables and trainer Nick Gonzalez at OBS April, Riker won the six-furlong Colin S., the seven-furlong Swynford S., and, in his latest, the 1 1/16-mile GIII Grey S.--a Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" event.

Though Riker was sold by Sharp this spring, he said the real credit goes to his longtime farm manager assistant trainer Isidro Centeno. "He's an excellent horseman and has been with me for 15 years," said Sharp. "He pinhooks some horses each year, and I just give him a platform to do it. It was really Isidro who liked the horse, and the horse really progressed as we trained him. He did things so effortlessly, and we got to thinking that this was a good horse. He didn't get the fast work at the sale to get the attention that some other horses got. I think he breezed in :10 2/5. But he galloped out in :33 flat, and we tried to get him out in front of people because we knew he was a good horse. He went to a good trainer and good connections, and he verified for them he was a nice horse."

Gonzalez sent Riker out to a five-furlong move of Woodbine's dirt training track on Tuesday, when the colt earned the bullet with a 1:00.20 move. Riker's wins have all come over Woodbine's Poly.

"It's always a question of whether they'll make the move to the dirt, but on the farm, training on the dirt track, I thought he trained just as good as he did on the synthetic at OBS," said Sharp.

NYRA REORGANIZATION BOARD RECAPS RECORD SARATOGA, REPORTS STRONG FINANCIALS AT MEETING

During a Wednesday meeting in Midtown Manhattan, the New York Racing Association's Reorganization Board of Directors recapped a successful Saratoga meeting and reported strong financial performance year-to-date.

NYRA CEO and President Christopher Kay said that the total handle at Saratoga was \$656.1 million, a 14.1% improvement over 2014 and easily broke the previous handle record of \$590.1 million set in 2012. There was also record on-track handle of \$157.6 million, a 4.8% increase over last year. This also established a new record, eclipsing the previous high of \$150.6 million in 2012.

Kay also reported that NYRA saw an increase of 13.8% in revenue from dining, concessions and merchandise over the course of the meet.

"Over the past two years, our efforts to enhance the overall experience and improve the quality of racing are clearly resonating with our horseplayers, our fans and with their families," said Kay.

Since 2013, a plethora of capital improvements have been undertaken on the grounds at Saratoga with the goal of enhanced customer experience. Some of the additions and upgrades unveiled during the 2015 season were the Saratoga Walk of Fame; the Tom Durkin Replay Center; and a revitalized Lower Carousel and new Fourstardave Sports Bar. Better than 2200 reservations for tables in the sports bar during the course of the meet.

Kay also indicated that the momentum generated at Saratoga has carried over to the Fall Championship Meet at Belmont. Daily all-sources handle through Oct. 18 is 5.4% ahead of the 2014 figures through 28 race days.

The next board meeting is scheduled for Dec. 9 in New York City.

ACTION LIVELY AT ARQANA PART TWO

After a steady start to Part 1 of Arqana’s October Sale, the first of three Part 2 sessions felt an altogether livelier affair, with figures up across the board from the equivalent day in 2014. Five fewer yearlings were sold, but this didn’t prevent turnover rising by almost 9% to €3,284,000 for 100 horses at an easy-to-calculate average of €32,840. That marked a rise of 14%, while the median improved from €26,000 to €27,500. An 84% clearance rate was much more reassuring than the opening day and also an 8% rise from 2014.

David Redvers attended the October Sale Tuesday with Sheikh Fahad Al Thani, but was unable to stay to bid on his pick of the catalogue, [lot 211](#), a colt by Manduro (Ger)

offered by the Coulonces Consignment. Arqana representative Freddy Powell stepped into the breach on Redvers’s behalf and saw off a determined attempt by trainer John Best in securing the strong, rangey colt for €140,000.

Redvers later commented, “For me he was one of the best horses in the sale. He looks a very good middle-distance horse in the making. I was expecting to pay a fair bit for him as he is such a nice horse, but I had to stretch my budget.”

The colt is the first foal of the unraced Ajudicate (GB) (Dansili {GB}), a full-sister to Khalid Abdullah’s dual French winner Permit (GB), who has won two group races in Australia since being sold for 120,000gns to join Chris Waller’s stable. Another sibling, the 2-year-old Richie McCaw (GB) (Zamindar), won a Chelmsford maiden last week for Mark Johnston.

Powell was back in action later for Redvers when bidding €55,000 for a daughter of Sunday Break (Jpn) ([lot 244](#)) who was offered for sale by Haras de Grandcamp, where the son of Forty Niner stands. The filly’s unraced dam Belle Dame (Ger) (Pilsudski {GB}) is a half-sister to the G2 Prix Robert Papin winner Boccassini (Ger) (Artan {Ire}).

Kent-based John Best had managed to get his way when going to €60,000 for Jean-Pierre and Guillaume Garcon’s colt by Muhtathir (GB) ([lot 207](#)), a grandson of the G3 Prix de la Grotte winner Absurde (Fr) (Green Desert) out of her young Thunder Gulch daughter Abondante.

Haras du Quesnay will forever be synonymous with Motivator’s daughter Treve (Fr), and another filly by their resident stallion, and bred on the same cross, was in the limelight Wednesday evening when sold for €120,000 to Patricia Boutin on behalf of Edouard Rothschild. [Lot 277](#) is out of the G3 Prix Miesque winner Dalna (Fr) (Anabaa) and is a sister to the juvenile scorer Do Your Bit (Fr). The family also includes another Quesnay stallion, Dunkerque (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}).

Commenting on her selection, Boutin said, “I love granddaughters of Anabaa and Quesnay have already bred some very good fillies by Motivator. She will be trained here in France.”

Having sold the session-toppers on each of the first two days of the sale, Anna and Etienne Drion of the Coulonces

Consignment had plenty to celebrate, and that included two good results on Wednesday with yearlings by Le Havre, with whom they have a close personal association. Anna’s parents, Jan and Maya Sundstrom, bred the G1 Prix du Jockey Club winner under their

Team Hogdala banner and sold him as a yearling for €100,000 to Gerard Augustin-Normand, who now stands him at Sylvain Vidal’s Haras de le Cauviniere. This year’s offerings from Coulonces Consignment contained a Le Havre colt named Storm Trigger (Fr) ([lot 255](#)) bred by Anna’s 14-year-old daughter Moa, who led the colt around the ring with tears streaking her cheeks as his price rose to €72,000 and he was bought by Vidal.

Moa was not the only one moved by the occasion, as her tearful mother explained how her young daughter came to breed the son of the Group 3-winning mare Camporese (Ire) (Sadler’s Wells).

“We have a very good client who gave the mare to Moa,” said Anna. “She put her in foal to Myboycharlie (Ire) and that filly made €30,000 last year. Moa then reinvested her profits and bought another mare. The second mare is now in foal to No Nay Never and she needs to pay the nomination fee, so this will really help and she will probably now go out and buy another mare.”

Anna added, “Moa has to do everything herself, from making the phone calls to book the nominations to presenting the horses at the sale.”

Just five lots later Le Havre brought more joy for the Coulonces team when his filly out of the winning Linamix mare Carmelixa (Ire) was bought by Alban de Mieulle for €105,000 on behalf of Sheikh Abdulla Bin Khalifa Al Thani’s Umm Qarn Farm.

“She’s a nice big filly who will be trained by Freddy Head and will be a good breeding prospect in time. I like the cross of Le Havre and Linamix,” said de Mieulle, who trains in Qatar and manages Umm Qarn Farm.

Sheikh Abdulla has been a staunch supporter of Arqana’s October Sale, and bought his multiple Group 1 winner and exciting young stallion Charm Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) from Ecurie des Monceaux for €140,000 in 2012. That support was rewarded again earlier in the day when his colt Dirgam (Ire) (Galileo {Ire})--bought for him by de Mieulle for €80,000 two years ago--won the listed Prix Vulcain next door at Deauville’s Hippodrome de la Touques.

Haras de la Reboursiere’s robust grey stallion Martaline (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) appeals to buyers of both flat horses and jumpers and both options are open to [lot 286](#), a March-born son of the multiple winner Ealore (Fr) (Kendor {Fr}) who was bought by Jean-Claude Rouget for €80,000. The Pau trainer signed for another member of the family, Fingertips (Fr), by the same sire at last year’s Osarus Breeze-up Sale in Pornichet. The colt has since won at Bordeaux le Bouscat and, still listed as owned by Rouget, has been sent to continue his career at the Somerset jumping stable of David Pipe.

Buying through Patrick Barbe, Chantilly-based Japanese trainer Satoshi Kobayashi stretched to €75,000 to buy [lot 280](#), Haras d’Haspel’s Makfi (GB) half-sister to Zarwaan (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}), the winner on Oct. 3 of the Listed Guisborough S. at Redcar for Ed Dunlop and Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum. Mandore International bought the filly’s dam, the Cheveley Park Stud-bred but unraced Develyn (GB) (Pivotal), for just 8,500gns at Tattersalls when carrying Zarwaan, who was subsequently sold as a yearling by José Delmotte’s Haspel team for €110,000 at Arqana’s August Sale. Later offered by Willie Browne’s Mocklershill stable, he fetched 320,000gns as a breezer when bought by Shadwell.

Two young French-based sires whose stock have been well received so far this week are Rio De La Plata and Rajsaman (Fr). Five yearlings by Haras du Logis resident Rio De La Plata returned an average of €25,000 from his debut fee of €7,000, with buyers including pinhooker Con Marnane, who consigned Rio De La Plata to the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-up Sale of 2007. Linamix’s son Rajsaman stands alongside Le Havre (Ire) at Haras de la Cauviniere and was the busiest freshman sire in France on his retirement. His six yearlings sold so far at the October Sale have averaged €44,833 from a starter fee of €4,000.

A fan of both stallions appears to be Lyon trainer Marc Pimbonnet, who bought a filly ([lot 257](#)) and a colt ([lot 292](#)) by Rajsaman for €60,000 and €52,000 for new client Fabrice Petit. Pimbonnet also signed for a well-made daughter of Rio De La Plata from Haras de Tourgeville ([lot 295](#)) at €38,000.

The sale continues Thursday at 11 a.m.

INT'L EXPERIENCE PAYS OFF FOR BRIERE

Yearling auctions involve being able to spot talent and gambling on how it might play out in the future. That methodology can apply to humans as well as horses.

Judging by a decent start from limited sales opportunities, Charles Briere—who just hung out his shingle this year as

Fairway Consignment Company--projects to be a decent long-term bet as he attempts to grow a fledging business in a competitive market.

This week the Normandy-based 29-year-old will wrap up his first season as a consignor at the French yearling sales, with four offerings slated to sell at Arqana in Deauville Thursday and Friday.

“Charles is very straightforward. What you see is what you get. He’s very conscientious and professional, a straight shooter,”

said French-born, California-based bloodstock agent Hubert Guy, who partnered with Briere on the newcomer’s first pair of pinhooked colts that went through the ring. “The quality of the work is there, and in time I think he’ll pick up some important clients.”

Briere has been back in his native country only about a year after more than eight years abroad gaining international bloodstock management experience.

Growing up in France, his family had no connection to horses. But after Briere started show riding and jumping at an early age, he knew that equine involvement was the direction he wanted his career path to take.

While still in high school earning an equine sciences diploma, he got jobs preparing and presenting yearlings at the August Deauville sales. “Straight away I really enjoyed it and I wanted to stay in the business,” Briere said.

After obtaining a degree in animal production at Centre de Formation Agricole in Sees in 2007, he parlayed a seven-month internship at The Castlebridge Consignment in Ireland into a three-year gig at Coolmore Stud.

At Coolmore, Briere worked in the foaling unit, broke yearlings, and eventually coordinated the running of the breeding shed.

“I didn’t really know what to expect when I arrived at Coolmore, to be honest,” Briere said. “All the operations I had experience with in France were smaller, like maybe 20 broodmares, tops.”

The commercial aspects of the business were the parts that appealed to him most, Briere said.

In 2010 he had a brief opportunity to visit Kentucky to help present horses at the Keeneland sales for Indian Creek Stud, “and I really enjoyed it, and knew I wanted to go back there,” Briere said.

In 2012, after four years at Coolmore, Briere wanted to broaden his international perspectives further. “I really wanted to go to America, but I didn’t know where to go,” he said.

Coolmore trainer Aidan O’Brien solved that dilemma by giving him a reference and a point in the direction of Woods Edge Farm, where Peter O’Callaghan hired Briere as an assistant manager.

Briere said that for him, the most striking difference between how the larger international bloodstock outfits operate and what is considered the norm in France is the degree of specialization.

“You have people who are very specific in every type of job,” Briere said, giving the example of veterinarians whose entire practice might focus on only one very specific body part of the horse. But all the while he was accumulating international experience, Briere said it remained his goal to return to his home country. About a year ago, he decided it was time.

“When I first came back from America, my idea was to work on a farm in France for a couple of years and start my own business after,” Briere said. “I hadn’t been in France for almost nine years, so I was a little bit afraid to start on my own straight away.”

But good jobs like managing a farm can be hard to come by in France, so Briere took whatever horse work he could while planning with Guy to acquire several foals late last year with the intent of selling them as 2015 yearlings.

In deciding what to call his new consignment company, Briere said he didn’t want to put his own name out front because he felt it wouldn’t yet be recognized. Plus, he said, he wanted “an English name, with the hope that it might attract a little more international interest.”

He decided on Fairway. “It’s actually the name of the street where my girlfriend was living in Florida,” Briere said, good-naturedly dismissing the notion that intense market research went into the naming decision. “For the moment it’s still very small. I rent stalls at Haras Du Ma. But I’m going to be renting a farm by the end of the year, still not a huge thing for the moment. It will be in Normandy,” he said.

Brière said the first yearling he sold in Deauville in August was a Kendargent (Fr) colt that he and Guy had bought for €55,000.

“We were a little bit afraid that we had paid too much for him, but of course that’s the way the game goes,” he said. “We had to wait to see what he would bring, and he sold for €105,000, so we were very happy. The second one was a Myboycharlie (Ire) that we bought for €30,000 and sold for €35,000. It was a little short, but that’s the luck,” Brière said.

The four yearlings that Fairway will send to auction this week are consignments from new clients: [Lot 393](#), Shiferaw (Elusive City), a filly, is the third foal from a winning King’s Best mare

who has produced one winner; [Lot 467](#) is an unnamed Myboycharlie (Ire) filly who is the second foal from a listed stakes-winning Testa Rossa (Aus) mare; [Lot 513](#) is an unnamed Myboycharlie (Ire) filly who is the second foal from a Selkirk mare;

and [Lot 565](#), Lucchesio (Air Chief Marshall {Ire}), a filly, is the second foal from a winning Highest Honor (Fr) mare.

After being away from the French marketplace for the better part of a decade, Brière said, “it’s tricky for me to see what buyers are expecting in which sales, and which kind of horse you have to have. The main thing seems to be to have a good mover. A horse with good action. That’s what I really learned in America, especially with Keeneland.”

He continued: “From my perspective, I would rather have a horse with a light pedigree and a really good mover, rather than the opposite. I’m looking more for racehorses than just the pedigree. If you can get both, perfect. If you bring good horses and prep them properly and earn a reputation for selling sound horses, people will come to you, I think.”

Guy agreed: “I think people will notice the work Charles did in Deauville, and he should be quickly on his way to being one of the up-and-coming consignors in France.”

O’Callaghan said he won’t be surprised if Brière enjoys success with his new venture.

“He’s a likable person, and he’s developing his level of horsemanship and expanding his operation,” O’Callaghan said. “I think you’ll see that he won’t disappoint anyone. Anyone who puts their faith in him, I think he’ll reward it, because his work ethic and attitude are so good.”

Brière has grand visions for Fairway--but not overly grand. Farmland is expensive in France, he said, and because he is a stickler about obtaining only top-notch help, he doesn’t mind taking on the brunt of the hands-on horse work himself.

“I don’t think I want to go into huge consignments, like Castlebridge. I want to keep it small compared to a Taylor Made or a Woods Edge. If I could bring 15 to 20 horses to each major sale, that would be my goal in 10 years,” Brière said. “You really have more time to spend with your horses when you operate a smaller outfit. You really get to know them and see how they are and what you need to improve.”

Five-year-old mare **Srikandi (Aus)** (Dubawi {Ire}) would boast strong claims in most spots, and she enters this first-up after winning a pair of Group 1s in June--the Stradbroke H. and Tattersalls Tiara.

Srikandi lost her only try at Moonee Valley--a benchmark race early last year--but trainer Ciaron Maher is not discouraged, citing the similarities between Moonee Valley and Doomben, where she has a strong record.

"The Valley is not that different to Doomben," Maher told *Racing and Sports*. "They're both that sort of tightish track. I think she appreciates a bend and she can put herself pretty handy in her races."

Maher added, "She's had a nice smooth campaign but it's going to be the toughest race she's contested in her career."


