

## MALLOY KEEPS TRADITION ALIVE AT EDITION FARM

SARATOGA SPRINGS, New York--It only takes a few minutes spent with Vivien G. Malloy to know that she is truly the quintessential horsewoman. With decades of experience in breeding and raising horses, she is a fountain of information on the Thoroughbred and she continues to pour that knowledge into her breeding program at Edition Farm in Hyde Park, New York.

At age 84, Malloy continues to study the stud books and is very precise in selecting which sires to cross with her 12 broodmares in order to create her desired type of racehorse. It is that attention to detail that produced several black-type winners and earned her the honor of New York Breeder of the Year twice from TOBA and once from the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. She offers three yearlings from her widely-respected breeding program as part of the Denali Stud consignment at this weekend's Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Sale.

One of these three yearlings, [Hip 416](#), a Frost Giant filly named Frosty Kiss, is particularly special to Malloy, who has been prepping the filly for the sale herself with the help of her staff. Frosty Kiss is out of the unraced It's In His Kiss (Yes It's True), who is a daughter of Malloy's top mare Wake Up Kiss (Cure the Blues).

## BEHOLDER WORKS, 'PROBABLE' FOR PACIFIC CLASSIC

Hall of Fame trainer Richard Mandella called his champion mare **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) "probable" for a title defense in the Aug. 20 GI Pacific Classic Wednesday afternoon, hours after the 6-year-old mare worked a bullet five furlongs in :59 flat, and repeated the same designation Thursday morning.

Beholder and **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit) are among nine that had nomination paperwork submitted Thursday morning to the Del Mar meet centerpiece.

"**TDN Rising Star**" **Dortmund** (Big Brown), a narrow runner-up to California Chrome in the Grade II San Diego H. July 23, and **Hoppertunity** (Any Given Saturday), both from the stable of Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert, are also expected to be nominated and run.

**Malloy Keeps Tradition Alive at Edition Farm cont. from p1**

A multiple stakes winner in New York, Wake Up Kiss produced Malloy's first top-level horse in Japanese Group 1 winner and multi-millionaire A Shin Forward (Forest Wildcat), and is the dam of recent Saginaw S. hero Wake Up in Malibu (Malibu Moon). The 15-year-old mare produced a colt from the last crop of Scat Daddy this year and will now be retired from breeding due to medical issues.

"She's beautiful, very well balanced and graceful," Malloy said of Frosty Kiss while sipping coffee at a table outside of Mrs. London's. "She's me. She's what I breed for. She's a beauty and

all my horses are really beautiful. They are typey. We used to say in the horse show world that a horse was typey, meaning very Thoroughbred looking—long neck, long legs, graceful. That is what I breed for."

While Bandoroff now preps the majority of her yearlings for the sale, Malloy will often prep fillies herself and this year Frosty Kiss was her lone filly and personal project. The native New Yorker, who spent years riding and showing horses along with her five children, puts her yearlings through a very unique program at her 200-acre farm that she started with her late husband Harry Malloy in 1986.

"It's all my idea because I was a horse show person," Malloy said of her sales prep routine. "[Farm manager] Annette [Orlando] thinks it's crazy. I have a lot of hills at my farm, so we walk them up and down hills and in the indoor [ring]. I always work them both ways. I want them to go 50% one direction and 50% the other. I have a field where I have poles set up and they walk over the poles. The last month, we put them in a surcingle and draw reins and again go up and down hills to push the hind end and build up that. We also do a lot of grooming and they are in all day and out at night."

For foals born at Edition Farm, training doesn't just start before the yearling sales. It starts from birth.

"The main thing is from birth, we handle them so much," Malloy remarked. "We always lead the foal before the mare and it makes them brave. We just handle them constantly. We pet them. I have the guys pick up their feet way before the blacksmith comes. Through all of this, they learn to trust humans. The ones that I breed and raise compared to the ones I buy--it's night and day."

Malloy is also selling two other yearlings she bred and raised in [Hip 314](#), a Tale of the Cat colt out of Awesome Bull (Holy Bull); and [Hip 575](#), a Candy Ride (Arg) colt out of Talkin Indian (Indian Charlie). A half-sister to MGISW millionaire Better Talk Now (Talkin Man), Talkin Indian also produced the GSP Skinner Box (Freud). Both colts were prepped by Denali. Malloy believes the colts need the use of the pool and walker that she does not have at Edition Farm.

"The Tale of the Cat colt is very nice," Malloy commented. "Craig [Bandoroff] always liked him. Everybody likes him. I have a Candy Ride out of an Indian Charlie mare that is a half to a graded-stakes sister. He is completely black with feet just like Candy Ride's."

In addition to her three homebreds, Malloy is also offering a filly she refers to as her "personal pinhook" in [Hip 460](#), a daughter of Freud out of GSP Missunitednations (Peace Rules), who the breeder purchased for \$32,000 as a weanling at the Fasig-Tipton October sale. **Cont. p4**

“I’m at the October sale and I’m looking through the catalogue and I see this Freud. I love Freud,” Malloy recalled. “She comes in the ring, and I didn’t do any homework, but I look at the page and way down, way, way down, she is related to one of the horses I bred. So, I put up my hand and I bought her. Annette and I went running back to the barn to look at her vet report. She opens the book and goes, ‘Mrs. Malloy, you are so lucky!’ Everything was perfect, perfect, perfect. Craig prepped her because she was already in Kentucky and he really likes her.”

Though Malloy has bought and claimed many horses throughout the years, breeding is her true passion and she takes it very seriously.

“You try to give your mare the best shot, but it doesn’t always work out,” said Malloy, whose Edition Farm houses 30 broodmares owned by Malloy and various clients, including Eclipse winner La Verdad and MGSW J’Ray. “You try to give her everything you can within reason and then you wait and see what happens. It is a long wait. You may not know you have a wonderful horse until it’s 3-years-old. It’s a waiting game and in the meantime you have to decide who to breed the mare back to. I breed even my non-descript mares to top stallions to give them every chance.”

She added, “My sister said to me, ‘Vivien, you need to do these games to keep your mind working.’ I said, ‘My whole life is a game!’”

Despite the trials and tribulations that come with breeding, Malloy wouldn’t trade the feeling of watching one of her homebreds run for anything.

“There is nothing, nothing like seeing something that you have bred come in the paddock for their first race and come down the stretch,” Malloy remarked. “There is nothing like it! I have bought a lot of horses, but when my babies run, it is just incredible. I feel like God because I take this horse and that horse and I put them together.”

She continued, “It is completely different than buying a horse. That is why it is so worth while. All the waiting, all the planning and some disappointments along the way, but when they come down the stretch, you are levitating with joy.”

## MCLAUGHLIN DUO POINT FOR TRAVERS DAY

Multiple Grade I stakes-winner **Cavorting** (Bernardini), who breezed Tuesday morning, will have one more work before running the Grade I Personal Ensign S. Aug. 27, trainer Kieran McLaughlin said Thursday.

The "TDN Rising Star" captured the GI Ogden Phipps S. in her last start June 11 and covered four furlongs over Saratoga's main track in 47.47, the third fastest of 45 workers at the distance Tuesday.

The 1 1/8-mile Personal Ensign will mark Cavorting's first start around two turns. She won both the 1 1/16-mile Ogden Phipps and the one-mile Ruffian around one turn at Belmont.

Cavorting is undefeated at Saratoga, where she won the GII Adirondack S. as a 2-year-old in 2014 and last year's GI Longines Test S. and GII Prioress S.

"She's won twice long now, but we still have to try the two turns," McLaughlin told the NYRA notes team Thursday morning. "We're happy with going longer. I give a lot of credit to Javier [Castellano] because when he rode her in the first race going long [the GII Ruffian S.], he told me, 'I'm going to take her back and make a run.' I said, 'Okay, good luck.' And he did it. Once she

learned to settle and finish - she was always bred to go a mile or more being by Bernardini - it has been great. Javier helped us a lot, and then he had to take off of her in the [Phipps] and Florent [Geroux] did a great job, and now Javier is back on Cavorting for the Personal Ensign."

McLaughlin also reported that **Mohaymen** (Tapit) finished fourth as the favorite in his last start in the GII Jim Dandy S. July 31, has gained weight since that race and is on course for the GI Travers S. Aug. 27.

"We weighed Mohaymen this morning and he has put on 20 pounds since the Jim Dandy," McLaughlin said. "We've always struggled to put weight on him, so we're really happy that he is putting weight on. We're going to train toward the Travers."

McLaughlin said Mohaymen will have one work, eight to 10 days out, before the Travers.

Barn star **Frosted** (Tapit) has resumed training on the Greentree training track and McLaughlin said the 4-year-old came out of his Aug. 6 GI Whitney S. win in terrific shape.

Frosted could be trained up to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 5 at Santa Anita, or have a prep before that year-end goal. McLaughlin mentioned New York's GI Woodward S. or GI Jockey Club Gold Cup as possibilities, as well as Santa Anita's local prep for the Classic, the GI Awesome Again S. Oct. 1.

Trainer Dallas Stewart was looking to finalize plans Thursday for Charles E. Fipke's Grade I-winning mare **Forever Unbridled** (Unbridled's Song) and graded stakes-placed **Tale of Verve** (Tale of Ekati).

Forever Unbridled is scheduled to breeze for the fourth time since arriving at Saratoga Friday with the GI Personal Ensign S.

Aug. 27 still her target for the summer. The 4-year-old has picked up graded stakes victories in the Gill Houston Ladies Classic and GI Apple Blossom H. this year before finishing second in the GI Ogden Phipps June 11 at Belmont Park.

"She's doing really well,"

Stewart said. "We'll watch the weather with the forecast calling for rain [Friday], but I think we'll be okay early in the a.m., so hopefully we can get her done."

Tale of Verve, who upset an allowance race at Saratoga July 23, besting heavily favored "TDN Rising Star" My Man Sam (Trappe Shot), is under consideration for the GI Woodward S. Sept. 3, according to Stewart.

"He worked last week," Stewart said. "He'll probably work tomorrow a little bit. We're trying to figure out what to do with him next. Maybe the Woodward, it's certainly an option, but we'll see how it shapes out. The horses we bought here are healthy, so that's the main thing for us. Now we'll see how they compete."



**Friday, Race 9, Tale of the Cat S.** - After **Gorgeous Bird** broke his maiden as a 2-year-old going seven furlongs at Churchill and followed with an impressive allowance win going a one-turn mile in his sophomore debut at Gulfstream in January, the grandson of champion Bird Town looked like he could be any kind. He never factored in a pair of subsequent Triple Crown prep attempts and a brief experiment on grass continued to dirty up his form. Save a blowout optional claiming win in the Indiana slop in October, Gorgeous Bird's sophomore season couldn't have been more of a disappointment. A well-beaten eighth after setting the pace going 1 1/8 miles in his second attempt this term beneath the Twin Spires in late May, Gorgeous Bird punched home nicely to get the money when turned back to 6 1/2 furlongs in a quickly run \$50,000 stakes race at Ellis July 16, good for a very respectable 88 Beyer Speed Figure. Could sprinting turn out to be what Gorgeous Bird has wanted to do all along? In a race absolutely flooded with early speed, the tactical gray could sit a dream trip against this deep bunch at what has to be an enticing number. **Selection: #10 Gorgeous Bird (12-1).**

**BD: Last Sunday's Result** - Well, I've done a good job so far finding the races with Pletcher's best 2-year-olds and then picking someone else. . . Unfortunately, **Go Glam** had more problems than just the steam horse and never made an impact.  
**Total: \$1350.**

**Friday, Race 7, Alw** - This race is full of lightly raced, well-bred, expensive 3-year-olds, but I don't particularly trust any of them--especially with what figures to be a solid pace. Instead I'll go with ultra-consistent 5-year-old New York-bred gelding **Pax in Terra**. He was third in a strong race two back won by subsequent Curlin S. scorer Connect with convincing next-out Saginaw S. winner Wake Up in Malibu second. Pax in Terra was always last of five in the Saginaw, but it seemed to me like he was simply run off his feet with the fast pace and one-turn configuration of that event. A two-turn nine panels should suit him better, and he may very well fly past all the flashier types late. **Selection: #2 Pax in Terra (12-1).**

The final Florida Derby prep, the GII Fountain of Youth S., is scheduled for Mar. 4 on a program that also includes the GII Davona Dale S., GIII The Very One S., the Palm Beach S., the GIII Herecomesthebride S. In addition to the Pegasus, top older horses will knock heads in the GII Gulfstream Park H. and GI Gulfstream Park Turf, both scheduled for Feb. 11

The 15th edition of the Sunshine Millions will offer five stakes for Florida-bred horses Jan. 21, when Gulfstream Park will host the Eclipse Awards for the fifth consecutive year in the Sport of Kings Theater that evening. The \$250,000 Sunshine Millions Classic will be supported by the Distaff, Turf, Fillies and Mares Turf and Sprint, each of which received a \$50,000 boost to \$150,000. The Claiming Crown will kick off the meet as usual Dec. 3.



## STAND BY FOR MORE MONCEAUX MAGIC

For the last four years, the name dominating the leader board at Arqana's August Sale has been Ecurie des Monceaux. Even a cursory glance at the 2016 catalogue will tell you that's unlikely to change this week.

What sets the Monceaux consignment apart from some is the fact that every horse presented for sale has been raised at the 290-hectare farm just outside Lisieux. That continuity is reflected in the consistency of the draft, and is the result of an ambitious project launched 13 years ago by the farm's owner Lucien Urano and his highly respected manager Henri Bozo.

"This farm was started with the idea to put together a really international broodmare band, so there was huge investment in buying some good mares and sending them to the top stallions. What is important for us is to be able to produce a good draft every year--it's not about holding records or things like that--but what is important is that we make our budget and manage to reinvest every year," says Bozo.

The *TDN* visit is made just nine days in advance of the 34 yearlings making the 30-minute journey along Normandy country lanes to undertake their first major public test. [cont. p2](#)

## COBALT APPEALS TO RESUME IN SEPTEMBER

The appeals of trainers Mark Kavanagh and Danny O'Brien against charges for presenting horses under their care to race with cobalt overages will resume Sept. 5, according to *Racing.com*. The appeals, which have been staged over the last nine days, were initially expected to run that length of time, but it soon became clear the cross-examination of witnesses was taking longer than expected. Justice Greg Garde has earmarked five more days for the appeal, during which the likes of Dr. David Batty, Racing Analytical Services Limited chief; Terry Bailey, chief steward; and Dr. Brian Stewart, chief veterinarian, will be cross-examined. The basis of the appeal presented by Damian Sheales, representing both Kavanagh and O'Brien, has been that all three of the aforementioned were aware the testing on the samples of the trainers' horses in 2014 was not conducted within the rules of racing.

## Stand By For More Monceaux Magic cont. from p1

In Deauville, they will be asked to stand and parade, again and again, as the eyes of some of the world's leading buyers scrutinise their conformation, athleticism and temperament.

It's a different story seeing them in their familiar home environment, but watching a group of fillies being walked in hand around the vast indoor school, which endures from the farm's days of housing show jumpers, it's impossible to fault the demeanour of youngsters for whom, just two months ago, life was merely the freedom of one rolling green paddock after another.

That freedom is not entirely curtailed during their sales preparation, as Bozo explains. "To me, turning the yearlings out every day is an important part of the prep--it's as important as

the daily exercise and good for their minds as well as for developing bone and muscle. We put our colts in individual small paddocks, and the fillies are turned out in groups of four."

The exquisite Haras des Monceaux is closing in on its centenary. Developed originally by American ex-pat Ralph Beaver Strassburger in the 1920s, the farm ceased to exist as a Thoroughbred breeding operation in the last few decades of the 20th century despite Strassburger's widow and son carrying on his great passion for some years after his death in 1959.

It was not until 2003 that it began to be restored to its former glory when Urano--initially an owner-breeder of trotters--purchased the farm to expand his Thoroughbred interests. And what a glorious property it is. Beautifully manicured lawns and paddocks give way to half-timbered barns in the traditional Norman style, which manage to be both grand and rustic at the same time. Most importantly, it is a haven of calm, even as one group of yearlings is being brought in

from exercise and the next lot walked out to start their routine.

At the epicentre of this quiet activity is Bozo, for whom the workings of a stud farm are second nature after spending his

childhood growing up at Haras de Mezeray, which was managed by his father, Antoine. The familiarity has not given way to complacency, and not even the light Normandy rain can dampen his enthusiasm for the stud which he, his wife and three young sons have come to call home.

"After 13 years, I have a feeling now that the farm is running at full steam," he says. "We've recently added 40 hectares through the purchase of a local cattle farm. Most of the work has been done and we have some lovely mares who are producing good horses. It's great now to see the results on the track."

The farm's structure may be complete, but its livestock is constantly being assessed and upgraded. He adds, "It's nice to go to the mare sales with French partners or foreign partners and to try to improve the quality of the mares. It's good to have the input of others as long as the one thing we all agree upon is to continue to try to produce quality and to be happy to sell."

Plenty of powerful partnerships have been developed in recent times, with the likes of Coolmore buying yearlings in tandem with the China Horse Club, or Qatar Bloodstock sharing racing and breeding stock with Newsells Park Stud. This was a

tactic deployed by Urano and Bozo from the outset, and which means that 55 of the 80 broodmares on the property are owned by Monceaux in partnership with a variety of breeders, including Andreas

Putsch, Trevor and Libby Harris of Lordship Stud, Stephen Hillen, Newsells Park Stud and Joseph Allen.

"Our historical partner is of course Lady O'Reilly, and we've had a lot of success working with Patricia Boutin," Bozo explains. "There's a growing, dynamic generation of young breeders and trainers in France and hopefully things are starting to change a bit to increase the appeal of racing to the French public. I'm keen to try to work with French investors and there's currently a team of young partners willing to invest in the farm."

All young stock bar the offspring of two mares owned by Joseph Allen at the farm will be offered for sale as yearlings and, with the exception of one Monceaux-owned yearling, which is being consigned by Baroda & Colbinstown Studs at the Goffs UK Premier Sale, all are sold at Arqana.

"I thought about selling outside France but it seemed to me that this was the best approach. We are a French farm and it makes sense for us to sell in France."

Such a concentrated focus on three days in August may lead to some tense moments at Monceaux, but it's not apparent during the daily routine, even with a vet on the premises scoping sales yearlings' larynxes as our interview progresses.

Bozo admits, "I don't get as nervous as I used to. At this stage the job has been done and the staff are well-trained. Now I'm just looking forward to being on the sales ground. I'm hopeful that the really good results that the Arqana graduates have had on the track will bring more and more people to the sale. Arqana has done a great job and been very pro-active and ambitious in the right way.

There have been a lot of new young operations who have also helped to bring in new buyers and owners."

Arqana as a whole has indeed had a good year on the racecourse, with Group 1 winners Qemah (Ire) (Danhill Dancer {Ire}), Almanzor (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB})

and Signs Of Blessing (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) all being graduates of its August Sale. In recent years, Monceaux itself has been responsible for a number of group-winning graduates of the sale, including G1 Irish Oaks winner Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and the half-brothers Ectot (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}) and Most Improved (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}). While Ectot and Most Improved's dam Tonnara (Ire), a snow-white daughter of Linamix (Fr), has no yearling to be sold this year, Chicquita's dam and grandam Prudenzia (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) and Platonic (GB) (Zafonic), once again threaten to take starring roles in Deauville with fillies by Galileo (Ire) ([lot 97](#)) and his son Intello (Ger) ([lot 93](#)) on offer, respectively.

"Do you have time for me to show you Prudenzia?" enquires Bozo, as if such a suggestion would ever be turned down. In out of the rain with her sizeable Galileo filly foal, the Classic producer calmly accepts visitors to her stable in the same laidback manner as her mother, on a neighbouring part of the property, who is safely ensconced with her daughter from the first crop of Kingman (GB).

"Platonic is particularly special to me as she was really the foundation mare for the farm and she has been so good to us," says Bozo of the grand-daughter of the Fittocks Stud matriarch

Souk (Ire), who was acquired for 100,000gns in 2004.

Another Group 1 winner bred at the farm is the young stallion Charm Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who was himself a graduate of Arqana's October Sale but whose full-brother ([lot 44](#)) has unsurprisingly been upgraded to the more rarefied atmosphere of the August auction.

Ecuries des Monceaux will offer the only Dubawi (Ire) yearling of the sale, a half-sister to the G1 Falmouth S. winner Giofra (GB) (Dansili {GB}) who is likely to provide some early drama when passing through the ring as [lot 25](#). Furthermore, five of the nine Frankel (GB) yearlings to be consigned in France can be found in the same draft, including a half-sister to the €1.2- million sale-topper of two years ago, Fadillah (GB) (Monsun

{Ger}), and to Group 1 winner Seismos (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) from the strong German Classic-producing family of Sacarina (GB) (Old Vic {GB}) ([lot 113](#)).

Also among the Frankels is [lot 57](#), a grey colt out of the Unbridled's Song mare Manerbe, whose daughter Marbre Rose

(Smart Strike) was raced by Ecurie des Monceaux in partnership with Andreas Putsch after failing to reach her reserve at the yearling sales. Sent into training with Christophe Clement, her four wins included the GIII Seaway S. at Woodbine and she was among the first book of mares to visit Triple Crown hero American Pharoah at Ashford Stud, signalling a potentially exciting addition to the Monceaux draft at Arqana in 2018.

Only two yearlings by Scat Daddy are set to be sold in Deauville and they include a colt from Monceaux ([lot 65](#)) bought in utero at Keeneland in 2014 when his dam Miss Plimsoll (Arch) was sold for \$190,000.

"It's a family I love," explains Bozo. "She reminded me of my young days at Haras de Mezeray. It's the family of Pomme Rose--one of the foundation families of Mezeray." He continues, "Scat Daddy has done so well and he's a huge loss. He's a stallion that so many European breeders would have loved using as he was easy to cross with European mares and he has produced lots of fast, precocious types."

Now safely on the sales grounds at Arqana, the team of yearlings has undergone a number of shows to agents prior to leaving home, yet another vital part of their preparation for the main event.

"We do five to six shows per week. It's nice to be able to talk to people when you are less stressed than at the sales. They can see the farm--it's important for them to see where the horses have been bred. It's good practice for the yearlings too," says the manager.

"Of course there is a bit of pressure when you are this close to the sale but now I am just looking forward to it--the hard work is done and the horses are ready."

Zonderland posted a five-length debut score going seven panels atop Kempton's synthetic surface Sept. 5, but was off the board in two subsequent juvenile starts, finishing fourth in Newmarket's Sept. 24 G3 Somerville Tattersall S. and fifth in Newbury's G3 Horris Hill S. one month later. Sixth in the Apr. 30 G1 2000 Guineas back at Newmarket on sophomore return, he earned his black-type spurs in the May 26 Listed Heron S. at Sandown, but

weakened to finish eighth of nine in Chantilly's July 10 G1 Prix Jean Prat last time. The homebred bay broke on the lead and settled in a close third, racing in the wake of G1 2000

Guineas runner-up Massaat (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), after the initial exchanges here. Shaken up to seize control approaching the final quarter mile, he came under ever-increasing pressure thereafter and was comfortably on top in the latter stages, despite rolling around in front inside the final furlong, to register a career high with something in hand. Race favourite Massaat was unable to live up to earlier form and faded tamely once headed to trail home last of seven. "I think, after last time, this confirmed the promise of his listed win at Sandown," commented winning trainer Clive Cox. "It was a step up here, but it was almost a confidence-booster after his run in France. He relished the quick ground and, mentally and physically, he's improving all the time. I'm delighted to win today and I'm proud to have him on my hands. Oisin [Murphy] was very much of the opinion that he got there a bit too soon, but he is blessed with a lot of ability. He's better on a track like this where he's able to use himself properly. He was not an unlucky loser in the Guineas, he just didn't handle the dip." As for what's next, Cox added, "He has an entry in the [Aug. 27 G2] Celebration Mile [at Goodwood] and that's a possibility, but we'll see how he is first and discuss it with connections. It would be nice to follow up a win in this race with the one we won [last year] with Kodi Bear."

Trainer Owen Burrows was in reflective mood after the eclipse of odds-on favourite Massaat and said, "It's very disappointing and we'll have to go back to see if we can find an issue. I'd been happy with him and, of my last five runners, I'd had four seconds and a winner so they've been pretty consistent. Paul [Hanagan] said the [firming] ground could be a reason, but we shall see."

While all attention was focused on the returning GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf hero Hit It A Bomb, it was another long-absent 3-year-old in Tribal Beat who emerged stage centre as he made a successful comeback, having been off since finishing runner-up in the G3 Killavullan S. over seven furlongs here in October. That previous career-best followed six days on from a five-length maiden win over six furlongs at Naas, and it was as if the bay was carrying on seamlessly where he had left off here. Settled in

fourth initially before ending up worse than mid-division, the homebred was pushed along and apparently held in early straight with plenty to do as the favourite Hit It A Bomb joined the lead with over a furlong remaining. Spurred on by Cougar Mountain on his outer, Tribal Beat responded by knuckling down and swamping the previously unbeaten Ballydoyle first string and asserting for a convincing success from Aidan O'Brien's pair.

Connections of the first three were on hand to reflect on the result, with winning trainer Jim Bolger saying of Tribal Beat,

"He's a good horse and a mile or maybe nine furlongs is as far as he wants to go. He has to have good ground or better. He was just held up by small little things--one little thing after another. We have had a good run with him for the last six weeks."

Aidan O'Brien was far from downcast following the eclipse of the favourite and commented, "Hit It A Bomb came there to win, but he just got a little bit tired. He will improve plenty for the run and may come back here on Champions Weekend for the [G2] Clipper Logistics Boomerang S. over a mile. He will need a run or two to get him right. Cougar Mountain is a solid horse and ran a solid race."

### Pedigree Notes...

Tribal Beat's half-sister Tasaday proved a classy stalwart for Godolphin, winning the G2 Prix de la Nonette Shadwell, G3 Prix des Reservoirs and G3 Prix de Psyche as well as finishing second in the G1 Prix de l'Opera and third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, G1 Prix Vermeille and G1 Yorkshire Oaks. ## HAWKBILL HAS FINAL INTERNATIONAL WORK

G1 Coral-Eclipse S. winner **Hawkbill** (Kitten's Joy) had his final piece of serious work on Thursday in preparation for next Wednesday's G1 Juddmonte International, galloping six furlongs at Godolphin's Moulton Paddocks with a lead horse.

"He went through the gears nicely, and I was pleased with him," said trainer Charlie Appleby of the 3-year-old. "It was nice building work."

Appleby noted Hawkbill, who also took Royal Ascot's G3 Tercentenary S. June 16, has thrived since his July 2 Coral-Eclipse score.

"He is the same body weight as he was going into the Eclipse, which is

surprising because visually he appears heavier," the conditioner said. "The scales say he is exactly the same, though. I would say that he is strengthening and still maturing physically.

Hawkbill rides a six-race win streak, and Appleby said the chestnut is adaptive to his conditions.

"As for the ground at York, he can handle soft, as we saw at Ascot and Sandown, and if it is sound underfoot, it would not worry him either," he said. "Being by Kitten's Joy, he would probably appreciate a sounder surface, anyway."

Appleby also provided an update on 'TDN Rising Star' **Blue Point (Ire)** (Shamardal), second to Mehmas (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) in the G2 Richmond S. July 28.

"Blue Point has done well since Goodwood and we will take a look at next week's [G2] Gimcrack S. with him before deciding whether to step him up to seven furlongs," Appleby said.

"Inexperience was probably what got him beat in the Richmond—he was rolling around and looking at the crowd while the winner is a battle-hardened, proven performer."

He added, "Blue Point has showed a lot of natural pace, but we will learn a good deal more about him once we drop him in behind horses. Given a lead and a bigger field he will be a different horse."

"If he didn't go to York, he would go to Goodwood for the [G2] Celebration Mile [Aug. 27]," Candy said. "Even though he's four years old, we're still learning a lot about him and we've got plenty of options."

Australian supermare **Winx (Aus)** (Street Cry {Ire}) underwent surgery to remove a bone chip from her near-fore fetlock nine days after her win in the G1 Doncaster Mile Apr. 2, according to *Racing.com*. Trainer Chris Waller informed Racing NSW stewards

of the arthroscopic surgery on Thursday. Stewards subsequently inquired into whether Waller had broken a rule that relates to notification of treatments.


After interviewing Waller and veterinarians Dr. Ross Alexander, Dr. Jonathan Lumsden and Dr. Craig Suann, stewards deemed no rules were violated.

Winx had initially been expected to participate in the A\$4-million G1 Queen Elizabeth S. the week after her Doncaster triumph, but was withdrawn from that contest due to her demanding run in the Doncaster. Stewards were notified of her withdrawal on those grounds Apr. 5; the veterinary exam that revealed the chip did not take place until the following day.

Winx, who has finished fourth in two recent barrier trials, is expected to kick off her spring campaign in the G2 Warwick S. Aug. 20.
