



IT'S BROWN'S 'TIME' IN THE HOLLYWOOD DERBY

Blessed with 3-year-old turf talent of the highest order year in and year out, it may be a mild surprise that trainer Chad Brown had never accounted for the winner of the GI Hollywood Derby. But, in the span of about 107 seconds Saturday afternoon Klaravich Stable and William H. Lawrence's Annals of Time (Temple City) changed all of that, scything his way through the field before kicking impressively clear to hand stablemate, GI Secretariat S. hero and 'TDN Rising Star' Beach Patrol (Lemon Drop Kid) a 1 1/2-length beating.

The bay, an \$80,000 graduate of the 2014 Fasig-Tipton October sale, debuted exactly 370 days prior to Saturday's Grade I test, when he threw in a spectacular final sectional of :23.16 to down future graded winner Inspector Lynley (Lemon Drop Kid) going a mile at Aqueduct last Nov. 28. Gone nine months thereafter, he was a fast-finishing second, beaten a head, in a Sept. 3 Saratoga allowance and acquitted himself nicely trying graded-stakes company for the first time in the GIII Hill Prince S. at Belmont Oct. 8. Reasonably close to a modest pace that afternoon, he kicked hard in the stretch, but couldn't quite get to fellow Brown trainees Camelot Kitten (Kitten's Joy) and Beach Patrol and was forced to settle for third.

EAST COAST INVADERS LOOM LARGE IN

MATRIARCH by Brian DiDonato

Sunday's Matriarch S. is the last opportunity for female turfers to compete at the Grade I level in 2016, and a formidable fivehorse contingent of East Coast-based runners have descended on Del Mar for the occasion. Miss Temple City (Temple City) drew the outside 11 post, but has the benefit of a breeze over the strip. This year's GI Maker's 46 Mile and GI Shadwell Turf Mile heroine was most recently fifth against the boys again in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 5. Kept in California after that, the 4-year-old had a five-furlong spin here in 1:02.40 (1/4) with the dogs up Nov. 26. Her trainer Graham Motion took both the GII Seabiscuit H. and GIII Jimmy Durante S. last weekend, and was also a close second in the GIII Red Carpet H.



Drawn one from the outside in stall 11, Annals of Time was away in good order and was able to get down into about the three or four path, just to the outside of Camelot Kitten, as Blackjackcat (Tale of the Cat), third to Frank Conversation in the GII Twilight Derby Nov. 4, set an even pace to the inside of longshot Defiantly (Exchange Rate).

Javier Castellano had Annals of Time settled third or fourth last for the run down the backside, and positions were unchanged by and large, but the 5-1 fourth choice was traveling sweetly on the turn, ready to pounce.

Shifted out with a little less than a quarter-mile to race as Beach Patrol launched what looked to be a winning move three wide, Annals of Time jumped into the bridle and gained sharply outside of Isotherm (Lonhro {Aus}), then sliced through the narrowest of openings between Frank Conversation and Defiantly nearing the eighth pole. With nothing but daylight ahead from that point, it was academic, as Annals of Time hit the line hard, then galloped out a mile past his rivals.

"I tried to save ground as much as I could," said Castellano, riding Annals of Time for the first time. "I was covered up for most of the way. I give [trainer Chad Brown] all the credit for shipping out a young horse like this--a horse making only his fourth start--and shipping him to the west coast and having him ready to run a race like this. He was powerful. When I asked him in the stretch he put in a powerful kick. Very strong; very impressive. And he galloped out strong and straight. Distance will be no problem with him."

Added assistant trainer Cherie DeVaux, "He's lightly raced, he had some minor issues to deal with before we could get him started, so he was the fresher of the three [Brown entrants]. Beach Patrol and Camelot Kitten have had really hard campaigns this year, they've been travelling and running very well. It's important for us to get the lay of the land for Breeders' Cup here next year. Chad really wanted to come, but he had a family obligation in New York."

Pedigree Notes:

A half-brother to stakes winner Sharp Sally (Posse), Annals of Time's deeper female family includes two-time Grade I winner Hollywood Story (Wild Rush) and MGSW Seattle Fitz (Arg) (Fitzcarraldo {Arg}). Out of a half-sister to a pair of black-type performers, Annals of Time is the last listed produce for his dam and is the second top-level winner for his sire. The other, Miss Temple City, is the morning-line favorite for Sunday's GI Matriarch S. at Del Mar.


"I think she likes being a California girl," said Tiffany Webb, assistant to trainer James Toner and the person in charge of the daughter of Tapit bred and owned by the Phillips Racing Partnership. "She just walked Tuesday

and she's been galloping ever since and she's doing very well."

It wouldn't be a Grade I on the grass without the presence of at least one Chad Brown representative, and this race has three. Lightly raced Roca Rojo (Ire) (Strategic Prince {GB}) impressed in her first Stateside start at Belmont June 30, but finished fourth with a crowded trip in a salty running of Saratoga's De La Rose S. Aug. 6. She bounced back back downstate in a Sept. 15 optional claimer, and dominated the GIII Athenia S. over soft sod Oct. 23.

Zindaya (More Than Ready), one spot ahead of her stablemate in the De La Rose, was second behind another Brown pupil in Mrs McDougal (Medaglia d'Oro) in the Sept. 24 GIII Noble Damsel S. She shipped out to Santa Anita to best Tiz a Kiss (Cee's Tizzy) in the GII Goldikova S. Nov. 6. Juddmonte homebred Mexican Gold (Medaglia d'Oro), a Group 3 winner and Group 1placed in France, annexed a Saratoga optional claimer on seasonal and U.S. debut Sept. 4 before checking in third in the Athenia.



A Group 1 winner in her native Argentina, Vale Dori gave her owner Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum his first U.S.-based graded winner with a cozy victory in Saturday's GII Bayakoa H. at Del Mar. Purchased privately ahead of last year's Dubai International Racing Carnival, Vale Dori was a pacesetting second to 'TDN Rising Star' Polar River (Congrats) in the G3 UAE Oaks and fourth to Lani (Tapit) in the G2 UAE Derby before heading stateside. Victorious in the restricted Tranquility Lake S. at this venue Aug. 31, she was a distant third to Beholder (Henny Hughes) and Stellar Wind (Curlin) in Santa Anita's GI Zenyatta S. Oct. 1 before overwhelming a field of allowance rivals by better than 10 lengths in Arcadia Oct. 28.

Camped outside of pacesetting Gloryzapper (Ghostzapper) as that one set only a modest tempo, the race was on in earnest as

Vale Dori put a head in front with just under three furlongs to travel. Wild At Heart loomed a threat as they hit the threesixteenths marker, but Vale Dori had plenty in reserve and strode home a much-the-best winner.

"I was surprised to find out how much horse I had," said winning jockey Mike Smith. "I gave her one little bit of encouragement and she just threw me in the back seat. She's got some kick. She's going to get better, too. I got on this filly when they first brought her here and she was all nervous. But now she's cool and calm. Have to give a lot of credit to Bob [trainer Bob Baffert] and his crew. They've brought her far along."

The Bayakoa represented the first victory in a U.S. graded stakes for Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum, who campaigned the winner's sire to a score in the 2007 UAE Derby before eventually shipping to the states to be runner-up in the GI Stephen Foster H. and GII Suburban H. in 2009. Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa also campaigns Mubtaahij (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), second to California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) in the G1 Dubai World Cup and again in the GI Woodward S.

The bettors figured a New York-bred filly owned by Chester and Mary Broman would find the wire first in Saturday's GIII Go For Wand H. at Aqueduct, but it was not the one most anticipated, as Highway Star knifed through between rivals in the concluding stages to pull the upset. Bar of Gold (Medaglia d'Oro), heavily favored off her wet-track, big-figure win in the Empire Distaff H. Oct. 22, finished a disappointing fourth.

Winner of her first two career trips to the post, Highway Star was third in the state-bred restricted Fleet Indian S. going nine panels at Saratoga Aug. 26 before cutting back to this trip to annex a second-level NY-bred allowance at Belmont Sept. 28.

Go For Wand H. cont.

She became her sire's fourth black-type winner in the New York Stallion S. Nov. 13 and was trying to give Girolamo his first unrestricted and graded stakes success in the Go For Wand.

With none of the seven rivals showing much initiative, 'TDN Rising Star' Wonder Gal (Tiz Wonderful) was hustled up from between horses to lead them onto the main track proper, as Highway Star and Bar of Gold eyeballed each other from the second half of the field. Sensing a slow tempo, Angel Arroyo allowed Highway Star to advance while three wide and in the

clear entering the turn. Wonder Gal still held a narrow advantage as they reached the quarter pole and went for home, but Highway Star was still plugging away and began to gain inches entering the final eighth of a mile. She kept to her task to poke

head in front a sixteenth from home and got there first, as High Ridge Road made late headway. Wonder Gal held for third ahead of the chalk, who was kept in by High Ridge Road and flattened out in the final furlong.

"I feel happy. My filly broke good. I put her on in stalking position and on the backside we were clear and went through," Arroyo explained. "I had her in good control in the stretch and she really responded. [She was] real strong, I'm excited for her future. She's good."

Pedigree Notes:

Highway Star's dam was herself a successful stakes-level horse for the Bromans, with four black-type placings and earnings in excess of \$210,000. Stolen Star is in turn a daughter of MSP Unbridled Star (Unbridled), the dam of Empire Classic winner Friend or Foe (Friends Lake) and SW Star Grazing (Sky Mesa). The winner's dam is represented by a yearling Into Mischief colt and was most recently bred to another Storm Cat-line stallion in Forty Tales (Tale of the Cat).



ROYAL POSSE CLAIMS ANOTHER JEWEL

Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables and Gary Aisquith's hard-knocking **Royal Posse** (Posse) made tough work of it, but called upon all his grit to find the line just ahead of **Diamond Bachelor** (War Front) and successfully defend his title in Saturday's

\$200,000 Claiming Crown Jewel on opening day of the Gulfstream Park winter/spring meeting Saturday afternoon. The Jewel is a starter stakes restricted to horses who have started for a \$35,000 claiming tag or less since Jan. 1, 2015.

Claimed by his current connections for \$20,000 in May of that year, the New York-bred 5-year-old had not finished out of the exacta in his 13 starts since, including his 2 1/2-length success in this event 12 months back. An iron horse in his own right, Royal Posse was having his ninth run of the season Saturday afternoon

and was exiting the richest victory of his career in the \$300,000 Empire Classic S. in the Belmont slop Oct. 22.

Allowed to track the pace after a smooth dispatch from gate three, the bay was niggled along fully a half-mile from home and by the time the field had reached the midway point on the turn, the 7-10 chalk appeared one-paced and destined to be off the board. But, kept busy by Luis Saez, he was shifted out four deep at the top of the lane and was able to peg back Diamond Bachelor in the dying strides (video).

"He's a really game horse. Every time, he tries so hard," said winning trainer Rudy Rodriguez. "I know the stretch isn't as long as the stretch at Saratoga and Belmont, but he did it. I'm very happy and proud of him."

With the win, Royal Posse now has a record of 34-11-10-0 and becomes racing's newest millionaire with earnings of \$1,011,245.

CHRB Reminds Horsemen of Medication Penalty Changes:

The California Horse Racing Board is reminding horsepeople that certain penalties for medication violations will be changing effective Jan. 1, 2017. According to the CHRB, the more consequential changes include:

- Language has been added to clarify that aggravating factors allow the Board to increase penalties above the maximum for violations when appropriate.
- The requirement that only CHRB licensed veterinarians may prescribe medications within a CHRB inclosure has been clearly specified as a factor to consider in determining a medication penalty. Similarly, whether a horse was receiving a prescribed treatment must be documented through currently required reporting processes.
- Phenylbutazone threshold violations will be a minimum \$500 fine for a first offense. Minimal Category D penalties have been eliminated for phenylbutazone violations. In addition, a trainer will not be eligible for a simple warning if the trainer has had a phenylbutazone violation in the previous three years—two years longer than the current warning period of 12 months.
- Prior medication violations will have a greater impact on penalties for subsequent violations. How prior violations are to be considered are defined. A trainer suspended for over 30 days for a medication violation will no longer be able to transfer horses to anyone who has been employed by the trainer in the previous year. Transfers to family members already are prohibited.



The European bloodstock community enters the home stretch of its grueling autumn-winter cycle still full of running, judging from proceedings on the opening day of the Arqana Breeding Stock Sale. For many, of course, yesterday's premier session represented a last chance to pull something out of the fire, and a case in point was James Delahooke, who had found himself repeatedly thwarted at Newmarket last week and feared that he was going to miss out again when offering €1-million for lot 178, Parvaneh (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}).

A 3-year-old out of a Kahyasi (GB) half-sister to the multiple stakes winner Nayyir (GB) (Indian Ridge {GB}), Parvaneh had won a Group 2 race at Baden-Baden in September for Waldemar Hickst after changing hands for €175,000 at the Breeze-Up Sale here last year.

"It was my last bid," Delahooke admitted. "I thought someone would buy her to race, and be prepared to pay more. So it was quite nerve-wracking until the hammer fell. I'd tried to buy something at Newmarket last week but couldn't, so it was nice that she was here. She's not only a good racehorse but a lovely filly, a gorgeous individual really, and I'm a big fan of Holy Roman Emperor. I've bought her for an American client who trades under the name of Pursuit Of Success, and she'll go to Kentucky to be covered in the new year." Cont. p2

STRATUM STARS FOR WEIR IN PERTH

Victorian champion trainer Darren Weir took his dominance cross-country on Saturday to plunder Perth's G1 Kingston Town Classic at Ascot—the Melbourne Cup-winning conditioner's first Group 1 win in that state. For Stratum Star, it was a second win at the highest level—the first coming in the September 2015 Sir Rupert Clarke S. at Caulfield—and a first win of any kind since last October's G3 David Jones Cup at the same course. Stratum Star was spelled after beating just one home in last October's G1 Mackinnon S. at the spring carnival, and mostly made a good account of himself despite failing to win in six autumn and winter outings, placing four times. Stratum Star kicked off this campaign with a tame eighth over a too-short 1200 metres in the Oct. 2 G2 Gilgai S., and stepped up to be fifth in the G3 Moonga S. over a furlong further two weeks later.

Such a seasoned observer, Delahooke was suitably impressed with the strength of trade. "This sale has got stronger and stronger over the years," he said. "You get good horses here, and good value, and it's now a very important sale."

Sure enough, the indices all held up very healthily. Though the number offered was considerably smaller, 165 compared with 189 last year, at a very similar clearance rate of 80.61%, the aggregate was down just 5.33% at \in 14,531,000 (from \in 15,349,000)--reflected in a 5.35% climb in the average from \in 103,709 to \in 109,526. (A \in 70,000 median was virtually unchanged from \in 69,000).

Camprock Dream Continues...

Cynics would doubtless tell her to quit while she is ahead, but for those of a more romantic disposition the sale of <u>lot 158</u> provided a 15-year-old Swedish schoolgirl with a spectacular ending to a story remarkable in any walk of sporting life--never

mind one as full of hard luck, and harder-headed judgement, as the bloodstock world.

A brief career for Pia Brandt in the first of this year established the calibre of Camprock (Fr) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) beyond doubt. She started with three wins, notably the G3 Prix Penelope at Saint-Cloud, and was then beaten only a head in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary.

Not seen again after disappointing in the Prix de Diane, she was arrived here as part of the Coulonces Consignment prepared by Anna Drion, whose tearful reaction, after her sale for €850,000 to Emmanuel de Seroux of Narvick International on behalf of Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm sooner reflected the fact that she had herself bred the filly's breeder.

"She's a fantastic looking filly and obviously a very good racehorse, almost a champion," he said. "She has everything you could want, breeding and class, we've followed her all year and are thrilled to get her. She'll surely get to visit Deep Impact (Jpn) at her new home."

"I'm overwhelmed," Drion said, after ending her call to a boarding school in Sweden. "It's a fairytale, a dream come true. It's such a reward for all the passion of my daughter, and for all the hard work not only of Pia and her team but of my team also."

Talvard Has Appetite For Reponds Moi...

The quality of French cuisine is well known, but it nonetheless felt slightly surreal to observe the sale of <u>lot 153</u>, **Reponds Moi** (More Than Ready) before a packed ring--as two rival bidders slugged it out for this precious vessel of Wertheimer blood in the sanctuary of the dining room. In the event the final word at €750,000 was traced to Pierre Talvard of the nearby Haras du Cadran, who recently cashed in the dam of this summer's dual Group 1 winner Qemah (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) to Shadai Farm in Japan. "We went slightly over budget, and she's the most expensive mare I've ever bought," Talvard said. "But I just loved her at first sight."

Reponds Moi, carrying a foal by Intello (Ger), is out of the G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Pas De Reponse (Danzig) and so a sister to three stakes performers, including the dam of Dicton (GB) (Lawman {Fr}), twice on a Classic podium this year.


Merry Catches Frankelitis...

One of the defining themes of the season has been the splash made by the first crop of Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), and so it was fitting that this bookend sale should put another feather in his cap through a wildcard Iot 170: a chestnut filly born on Apr. 7 to Ascot Family (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}). A listed winner herself, the dam is a half-sister to the G2 King's Stand S. runner-up

Flanders (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}) and to the dam of dual Group 1 sprinter Lethal Force (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}). With such a speedy pedigree, fireworks could be expected from what was also a very taking physical specimen. Sure enough, Hugo Merry was forced to go as far as €450,000 to secure the foal for Andrew Rosen. "Everyone in the world seems to have got 'Frankelitis' at the moment," he said.

"But this is a beautiful filly, a really loose mover with a great disposition. My client has a lot of very nice broodmares and I expect the idea will be to race this filly and one day send her out to join them at Claiborne."

Another wildcard to justify her inclusion was lot 150, Stone Roses (Fr) (Rip Van Winkle {Ire}), a listed winner for Freddy Head knocked down for €280,000 to Hillwood Bloodstock.

Dansili Daughters Prove Popular...

There is more than one stallion at Juddmonte, of course, including one or two with a resume Frankel will do well to match over the years, and the reputation of Dansili (GB) as a broodmare sire received a couple of fresh boosts with two of his daughters making the top six prices of the day. Unraced herself, lot 112, Silimeri (Fr) (Dansili {GB}), is a half-sister to Silasol (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}), winner of the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at two and of the G1 Prix Saint-Alary this year for the Wertheimer brothers. The second dam, the Storm Cat mare Brooklyn's Storm, is a half-sister to no fewer than six listed or group winners, notably Solemia (Ire) (Poilglote {GB}), who shocked Europe in the 2012 Arc; as a result this 3-year-old shares a third dam with one of the season's very best milers in The Gurkha (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

In order to graft from this family tree, three breeders joined forces to see off a stubborn challenge from Laurent Benoit at €420,000: Lordship Stud, Lady O'Reilly and Haras de Monceaux.

"This is exactly the type of mare we look for," Henri Bozo explained on behalf of the latter. "Young, from a lively family, and from a major breeding operation. Those are the assets we have always sought for our stud and it has worked so far."

This partnership was back in action towards the end of the session when giving €380,000 for lot 195, Qatar Power (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}), a listed winner for Freddy Head at Maisons-Laffitte this summer. "She's a magnificent filly from a family with a lot of speed and will be a good outcross," Bozo remarked.

Dansili's other big hit was lot 131, the charming dappled grey Iromea (Ire), for whom Crispin de Moubray gave €320,000. The 4-year-old, out of a half-sister to the Group 1 winner and performer Grey Lilas (Ire) (Danehill), won a listed race for Francois Rohaut last year but had failed to build on that when campaigned in the U.S. since, and was returned here by Andreas Putsch's historic Haras de Saint Pair.

As an advisor to Putsch, de Moubray had to bide his time until the reserve had been passed, but he then stepped in enthusiastically on behalf of another client, an unnamed English farm. And, listening to him listing all the various positives bubbling under the page--horses stabled with Andre Fabre, horses in foal to Dubawi etc--it was easy to understand why he had persevered with an investment initially undertaken when this filly was a 150,000gns Tattersalls yearling.

"These families don't exist unless someone starts them," de Moubray reasoned. "And I know this one backwards. I bought Grey Lilas as a yearling, would never have been able to afford her but for the fact she was covered in ringworm. The more you can get into a family, the more you can look after it, the better it will work out. It's a lot of work, you need to do your research. For instance, on the face of it this filly going to Christophe Clement in America didn't work out, but some horses just don't adapt to the environment out there and the fact is that she was working extremely well."

Chortle Headed Down Under...

It was in the Aga Khan's draft at this sale six years ago that Neil Jenkinson found the unraced dam of Khan (Aus) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) for just €30,000, and her son is now a top fancy for the G1 Golden Slipper S. Little wonder, then, that he was prepared to spend rather more on lot 72, Chortle (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), a winner discarded by Godolphin and a full-sister to their Group 1 winner Hunter's Light (Ire). The second dam, after all, is a full-sister to damsire legend Darshaan (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}) and half-sister, therefore, to that great fount Darara (Ire) (Top Ville {Ire}), dam of four Group 1 winners. As the icing on the cake, Chortle is in foal to the sire of Khan, prompting Jenkinson to go to €220,000 for the 5-year-old on behalf of John and Fu Mei Hutchins of Element Hill Stud.

"She'll foal here, and then we'll decide whether to have her covered to Southern Hemisphere time by a sire like Siyouni, or send her to Australia to be bred," Jenkinson said. "Either way she's a very welcome addition to the Element Hill broodmare band. Dubawi is obviously a kingpin sire in both hemispheres, and it's a champion family going back to Darshaan and all the rest. And this mare has great bone, great structure, and good body: I like her a lot. As you know we've been lucky here before and, with Exceed And Excel in the mix, I'd hope there might be a few similarities with Khan."

There were some equally delicious crumbs from Godolphin's table in lot 81, Mountain Spring (GB) (Teofilo {Ire}), a winning 3-year-old out of a half-sister to Prix du Jockey-Club winner Anabaa Blue (GB) (Anabaa)--their dam in turn a half-sister to none other than the great Urban Sea (Miswaki). Their mother Allegretta (GB) (Lombard (Ger)) was imported by the late Michel Henochsberg, whose friend Eric Puerari of Haras des Capucines was delighted to renew his links with the family for €200,000. "I did not think I would be able to get her," Puerari admitted. "I thought she would make more than that."

The justice of that remark was borne out by lot 155, Alpine Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit (Ire)), carrying her first foal by Kendargent (Fr). She is out of a grand-daughter to Allegretta and Meridian International had to go to €280,000 to secure her.

Benoit Bites For Colonialiste...

Laurent Benoit was enjoying his lunch in the restaurant when lot 88, Colonialiste (Ire) (Lord Of England (Ger)), came into the ring, but showed a greater appetite for this delightful morsel from Wertheimer & Frere. The winning 4-year-old is out of Sahel (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), a full-sister to three Group 1 winners in Schiaparelli (Ger), Samum (Ger) and Salve Regina (Ger), as well as to the dam of Sea The Moon (Ger) (Sea The Stars {Ire}). Moreover, she is carrying a foal by Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire})--a scenario that vividly demonstrated her appeal to the Broadhurst agent.

"It's not only a great family but it's almost free of Northern Dancer, as well," Benoit said, signing a €200,000 docket. "I'm delighted we've been able to buy into a family that is one of the best in Germany if not in Europe. She has been bought for a long-term client in France and will stay here."



Certain Sisters Hot Commodities...

Two half-sisters to the dam of Avenir Certain (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}) went through the ring consecutively, both in foal to the sire of that dual Classic winner. It is emerging as quite a family, their dam also being a half-sister to the dam of one of the season's most accomplished juveniles in Mehmas (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), while the third dam is that elite producer Lucayan Princess (GB) High Line (GB), responsible for Luso (GB) (Salse), Warrsan (Ire) (Caerleon) and company. As such, albeit respectively having offered little and nothing on the track themselves, they looked fair value as young mares: the 8-year-old lot 22, Java Jazz (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}), going to Sylvain Vidal, who stands Le Havre (Ire) at La Cauviniere, for €90,000; and the 7-year-old lot 21, Mishhar, to Ghislain Bozo of Meridian International for €135,000. "It's obviously a very nice family with plenty going on, and of course there's the Le Havre element too," Bozo shrugged, adding only that he was acting on behalf of "a French breeder."

Another to reflect the amazing start made by La Cauviniere's young sire was lot 38--this time a half-sister to the dam of his second dual Classic winner La Cressonniere (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}), and likewise part of the Coulonces Consignment. Herself a winner, the 5-year-old Louarn (Ire) (Elusive City) was moreover offered in foal to another rising star among French stallions in Wootton Bassett (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}) and with a page dignified, as third dam, by a full-sister to Highclere (GB).

"That's very much the kind of profile I like in a broodmare," said John Tyrrell of BBA Ireland, after signing a €150,000 docket. "A pretty, quality mare from a good, active family. She obviously has plenty going for her, between La Cressonniere and the cover of a promising sire. She's for a commercial stud in Ireland, so I imagine the foal will probably be sold as a yearling, though I've no idea at this stage who they might want to send her to next."

Australia Filly Finds Favour...

Mags O'Toole was involved in one or two knockout pinhooks in this same ring this year and her judgement of lot 128, a foal from the first crop of Australia (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)), commands due respect. She paid €120,000 for this filly, the result of Australia's glamorous appointment with an unraced half-sister to dual Arc winner Treve (Motivator). "She was the best foal here today and a fantastic advertisement for the sire," O'Toole said. "She's for an existing client and the plan would be to re-sell her next vear."

Australia, the son of Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) who won the 2014 Derby, scored a notable hit at the Tattersalls December Foal Sale when another of his daughters fetched £300,000 from Blandford Bloodstock.

Victorian champion trainer Darren Weir took his dominance cross-country on Saturday to plunder Perth's G1 Kingston Town Classic-the Melbourne Cup-winning conditioner's first Group 1

win in that state. For Stratum Star, it was a second win at the highest level—the first coming in the September 2015 Sir Rupert Clarke S. at Caulfield—and a first win of any kind since last October's G3 David Jones Cup at the same course.

Stratum Star was spelled after beating just one home in last October's G1 Mackinnon S. at the spring carnival, and mostly made a good account of himself despite failing to win in six autumn and winter outings, placing four times. Stratum Star kicked off this campaign with a tame eighth over a too-short 1200 metres in the Oct. 2 G2 Gilgai S., and stepped up to be fifth in the G3 Moonga S. over a furlong further two weeks later. A handily beaten 13th in the G1 Cantala S. going a mile a further two weeks after that, the chestnut relished a step down in class to be a narrowly beaten second in the G3 Sandown S. over 1500 metres Nov. 12 before shipping west. With his longest gap between starts this prep, Stratum Star was given two trials in Perth. "I came and looked at him last week and he looked a bit big underneath," Weir said. "I said he needed some strong work, so on Monday he had a good trial. Willy Pike rode him [in the trial] and he gave him a good hit out--so thanks to everyone involved."

Jockey Damian Lane added, "It gives you great confidence when a trainer like Darren Weir puts you on. My good mate Tyson was over here looking after the horse and he gave me a good report and some more confidence. He had a lovely run from gate one and he had the last crack at them. It worked out perfect."

Stratum Star flew late to nail last-out Group 1 winner Scales of Justice on the line, and that one's rider, Douglas Whyte, copped some criticism in the aftermath for giving an overly confident ride.

Pedigree Notes...

Stratum Star notched the second Group 1 win in the space of a week for his sire in Perth, with Takedown (Aus) having won the Winterbottom S. last weekend. He is the first and most accomplished of three foals to race for his placed dam Purely Spectacular, whose second produce is the Group 3-placed Serenade (Aus) (Star Witness {Aus}). Purely Spectacular has a 2-year-old filly by Star Witness and a yearling full-sister to Stratum Star to come.

Stratum Star's second dam Vanilla Sky (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}) produced the Group 1-placed Raid (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) while further back, his fourth dam is the great Emancipation (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}), a multiple Group 1-winning champion whose descendants include Group 1 winners Virage De Fortune (Aus) (Anabaa) and Railings (Aus) (Zabeel {NZ}). close home, Aide Memoire held on to win comfortably. A half-length separated the next two, with Scapolo (NZ) (Bachelor Duke) a further 1 1/4 lengths behind in fourth. Favored MG1SW Volkstok'n'barrell (NZ) (Tavistock {NZ}) was a running on sixth.

"Robert [Hannam] and I go back a long way and he rode my first winner," victorious trainer Fraser Auret, who also saddled last year's victor Julinsky Prince in the Trentham feature, told www.nzracing.co.nz. "This is a very special, just massive. I had a quick word with Johnathan [Parkes, the rider of Authentic Paddy] and he said the horse was just a bit quiet today, but this girl hasn't put a foot wrong since day one."

"She's the new kid on the block and while Paddy has been a great horse to me, I had to look to the future," added winning hoop Robert Hannam, who had the unenviable task of picking between Aide Memoire and veteran galloper Authentic Paddy in the lead up to the Captain Cook S. "The plan was to sit outside the leader, but they were going hard, so I slotted into the trial and put her to sleep. She really kicked well in the straight. You can't beat a Group 1, they are the pinnacle of horse racing."

Aide Memoire has been remarkably consistent in 2016 with only one off the board finish from five appearances, including a wins second up in a handicap at Otaki May 12 and in the Listed James Bull Rangitikei Gold Cup S. in her first try at black-type going this distance at Awapuni May 21. She filled the second spot in the June 25 Listed Tauranga Classic S. and ended her season with an uncharacteristic sixth-place showing in the Listed Opunake Cup S. in heavy going at New Plymouth Jul 23. The Fraser Auret trainee added another handicap victory upon resuming going 1200 metres here Oct. 22 prior to a runner-up performance last out at Tauranga Nov. 12.
