

GLEN HILL FARM FOUNDER LEONARD LAVIN DIES AT 97

“Winners make it happen. Losers let it happen.”

That was the motto of self-made entrepreneur, World War II combat veteran, racehorse owner/breeder and philanthropist Leonard H. Lavin, who died at age 97 Wednesday, Aug. 2, surrounded by his family at his home from complications related to pneumonia.

Although Thoroughbred endeavors occupied only a slice of Lavin’s richly diverse life, he enjoyed immense pleasure from founding Glen Hill Farm in Ocala, Florida, in 1966. A half-century later, Lavin was honored with the **2015 Eclipse Award of Merit** for his decades of service within the Thoroughbred industry.

The Glen Hill racing and breeding operation has produced more than 80 stakes winners, including One Dreamer, who upset the 1994 GI Breeders’ Cup Distaff at 47-1 odds. Other Glen Hill stakes winners include Relaunch, Convenience, Top Rung, Concept, Win, Repriced, Rich in Spirit, Closeout, and Marketing Mix.

15 YEARS IN THE REARVIEW: THE 2002 TEST

As the 2017 renewal of the GI Test S. draws near, Saratoga’s Saturday patrons would be fortunate to witness a race half as exhilarating as the 2002 edition of the seven-furlong dash. An instant Saratoga classic highlighted by a stretch-long battle between Edmund Gann’s 4-5 favorite You (You and I) and the previously unbeaten New York-bred Carson Hollow (Carson City), the race established the two fillies as local legends and highlighted the brilliance of a number of exemplary careers.

In many ways, it was the perfect race. The blinding early speed of Carson Hollow beneath 2012 Hall of Fame inductee John Velazquez stood in sharp contrast to a tardy start that left You and fellow Hall of Famer Jerry Bailey at the rear of the pack. Following a bold inside move by the latter, the stage was set for a dramatic, neck-and-neck stretch run and, in the indelible words of famed NYRA announcer Tom Durkin, “a photo finish that doesn’t deserve a loser.” In the end, You claimed victory by a nose over her stubborn rival, but together, the pair created a lasting moment in Saratoga history. **Cont. p7**




Glen Hill Farm's One Dreamer upsetting the BC Distaff | Breeders' Cup

Craig Bernick, Lavin's grandson, who has overseen the daily operations of Glen Hill since 2008, confirmed Lavin's death via phone Thursday, explaining that his grandfather passed while surrounded by family members.

"Most people couldn't live to 97 and do a tenth of what he did," said Bernick. "He was a very tough guy, he did a lot of things in the Thoroughbred business and helped a lot of people. He could not have lived a fuller life. He really loved horses and horse racing. He wasn't the kind to buy 'made' horses. He really liked mining for gold and making his own horses.

"He liked racing, but he really liked being at the track in the mornings and the days on the farm," Bernick continued. "He loved the process and being around the horses. He wasn't one of those guys who'd just show up on days he was favored for the

stakes race. He appreciated people and treated everyone well. He grew up going to the track and never forgot it."

Born in Chicago Oct. 29, 1919, Lavin came of age during the Great Depression. As a 9-year-old in 1928, his father took him on a train from Chicago to see Reigh Count win the GI Kentucky Derby. As a teenager, he skipped school to bet on Equipoise when he ran at Washington Park or Arlington Park.

Lavin studied at the University of Washington

prior to serving in the United States Navy during World War II, and he participated in a dozen Pacific invasion maneuvers.

When the war ended, Lavin embarked upon a career as a salesman, but quickly discovered he would rather own a company than work for one. He purchased a fledgling West Coast-based beauty supply firm called Alberto Culver Corporation, which would come to be nationally known for a hairstyling product called VO5 (for five vital oils). Over decades, he grew that regional company into a Fortune 500 corporation.

As a young man, Lavin had dreamed of one day being able to own racehorses. But because the commercial market in the 1960s didn't allow for newcomers to gain a significant foothold by buying top horses from well-established generation-to-generation breeding families that preferred to race their best stock, Lavin made a go of starting from scratch by buying a few bargain yearlings, then later selecting his own matings and raising the offspring himself.

Early on, Lavin established working relationships with eventual Hall-of-Fame trainer Willard Proctor, and his brother, Allen Proctor, who managed the 325-acre Glen Hill Farm. A second generation of Proctors, brothers Tom (who currently trains) and Hap (the farm manager), have continued the family partnership through multi-decade associations with Glen Hill Farm.

"He was one of the most important men in my life," Tom Proctor told the Del Mar notes team. "He was one of the toughest men I've ever known. He lived a full life on his own terms and that's a good thing." **Cont. p5**

Lavin counted among his racing career highlights a 1972 match race victory by his filly Convenience over national champion Typecast, which drew more than 50,000 people to Hollywood Park.

Yet among some 184 stakes wins at 28 tracks, Bernick said his grandfather's proudest moment was winning the GIII Equipoise Mile with homebred Split Run in 1993.

That's because that race coincided with the 50th reunion of Lavin's naval shipmates aboard the USS DuPage, and 100 of the men he fought alongside in battle made the trip to Arlington Park for the race.

"The 50th year reunion was a big deal, and the reunion was being held in Chicago and he took everyone to Arlington," Bernick recalled. "I know it was wonderful for him to win that race. Obviously he'd won bigger races, but that was a special day for him."

In 2008, Lavin appointed Bernick as president and chief operating officer of Glen Hill, but he remained very much involved in an advisory role.

"It's very unique for a founder to turn over control of his business, but my grandfather felt I would benefit from his guidance, which has proven true," Bernick said when he accepted the 2015 Eclipse Award on Lavin's behalf. "He has been a hard, but fair boss. Our disagreements have been about horses, never business principles. Those have been consistent and straightforward: be a man of your word, pay your bills on time, be patient with horses, stand up for what you believe, whether it's popular or not, [and] never suggest an idea to someone that you wouldn't do yourself. Most of all, he has

stressed that Glen Hill Farm is an extension of the Lavin and Bernick families, so make sure everything associated with it is done properly and with class." **Cont. p6**

In a prepared statement that accompanied the acceptance of his Eclipse Award, Lavin wrote this: "From the normal Thursday cards to racing in the Breeders' Cup and everything in between I have found every moment to be a thrill and a reward. With that has come the wonderful relationships made with people throughout the industry, the camaraderie with our team at Glen Hill Farm, and of course the horses we've had the pleasure of breeding, owning and racing. And now this award provides a capstone that leaves me both humbled and grateful."

The Breeders' Cup also honored Lavin, saying, "Leonard Lavin was an enormous success in nearly every aspect of his full and remarkable life. Whether it was taking a small cosmetics beauty supply company and turning into a major consumer products giant in Alberto Culver Company or developing Glen Hill Farm into a prominent Thoroughbred racing and breeding operation, Leonard Lavin's determination and entrepreneurial spirit made him a winner in so many ways. As an owner, Mr. Lavin raced more than 80 stakes winners with such prolific horses as Relaunch, Convenience, Rich in Spirit, and Breeders' Cup champion One Dreamer. Mr. Lavin also made a significant impact on the Breeders' Cup as one of the first and enduring marketing partners of the World Championships in a sport that he loved and cherished. We remember all of his accomplishments with great pride, and extend our deepest sympathies to the Lavin family."

Beyond the world of racing, in 1997 the Illinois governor awarded Lavin the Order of Lincoln, the state's highest honor, in the area of Business and Industry. Lavin also authored a book, *Winners Make It Happen: Reflections of a Self-Made Man*. He supported a number of charities (both inside and outside of racing), made major donations to various educational institutions, and was keen to provide financial support to victims of Hurricane Katrina.

Despite declining health, Bernick said that his grandfather had made three trips to the Florida farm this past winter and spring.

"He was in good shape, not great, but he never stopped going," Bernick said. "His body had deteriorated, but his mind was still there. Even [Wednesday], he knew that we had [recently] won a couple of races at Del Mar, and knew we had horses in [Thursday]."

Lavin's wife, Bernice, predeceased him in 2007. His daughters, Carol and Karen, survive him. A son, Scott, died in 1998.

Lavin's funeral services and burial will be private. A public memorial service is in the planning stages for late next week at the Lavin Family Pavilion at the Northwestern University downtown medical campus in Chicago.

Aboard the Winner...

For Jerry Bailey, the memory of the race remains vivid. Ironically enough, the famed jockey said the tensest moments came well before You engaged Carson Hollow in their prolonged battle to the wire.

“I remember every stride of that race,” Bailey said. “You got off a little bit slowly, and I found myself a lot further back than I thought I would be...I kind of bided my time and moved up, and I was right behind [Jorge] Chavez [aboard eventual third-place finisher Spring Meadow]--he was off the rail, and I dove down, but just as I did, he started to change paths and come in. I screamed at him because he was going to be interfering with me, and he straightened up and I got through. Velazquez was on the lead with Carson Hollow. I thought there was plenty of room, but when I got there he tightened it up--just race riding. And it stayed so tight.”

Bailey admitted that he had some fleeting doubts about his predicament, but ultimately horse and rider proved their mettle.

“I said, ‘Oh, man, I’m on a filly. I don’t know how brave she is.’ But she was as courageous as they come,” Bailey said. “It wasn’t the scariest moment, because with Johnny and I, we were just shoulder-to-shoulder.”

Aside from emerging on the winning end of a close photo finish, Bailey’s ride aboard You carried added significance in completing a graded stakes double for the late Hall of Fame trainer Bobby Frankel, who also teamed with Bailey to capture the GII Diana H. with *Tates Creek* (Rahy) two races prior.

According to Bailey, the two narrow victories secured him another pair of winning Saratoga mounts on an immensely talented Gann colorbearer in the GII Jim Dandy S. and GI Travers S. later that summer.

“The funny thing is, I was trying to get the mount on *Medaglia d’Oro*,” Bailey recalled. “Bobby Frankel said, ‘Look, I have two mounts for you this weekend: You in the Test and *Tates Creek* in the Diana. Kent Desormeaux is riding two for me in California, and whoever does better gets the mount on *Medaglia d’Oro*.’ I won the Test by a nose and the Diana by a nose.”

Bailey would go on to win two more graded stakes aboard You, who retired at the end of 2003 with nine wins from 23 starts and over \$2 million in earnings.

“A Photo Finish That Doesn’t Deserve A Loser” ...

From Tom Durkin’s perch atop the Saratoga grandstand, the gifted racecaller knew he was witnessing something special as the race played out. A “sensational” opening quarter-mile carved out by Carson Hollow in :21.60 and a “daring move by Jerry Bailey” through the narrow opening along the rail were fitting precursors to what ensued in the stretch.

Equipped with over 30 years of racecalling experience at the time, Durkin captured the showdown in perfect fashion: “There’s absolutely nothing between them! You’s in so tight! Carson Hollow is unwavering!” **Cont. p8**

And so the Saratoga crowd awaited the results of a dramatic finish that would ultimately yield a well-earned victory and an agonizing defeat.

“Sometimes as a racecaller, you say the wrong thing, or you say the thing that doesn’t exactly fit the moment in a split second, but when I said, ‘a photo finish that doesn’t deserve a loser,’ I don’t think I’ve ever said anything truer in my life,” Durkin said from Saratoga Springs Thursday. “It was a thrilling stretch drive. I don’t know that I’ve ever called one that was more thrilling than that.”

When asked what made the race so special, Durkin observed that Thoroughbreds prove their greatness by responding to adversity and finding more in a tight spot. An electrifying finish between two fully extended racehorses can resonate with seasoned racetrackers and casual observers alike.

“When you get two horses that have 300 years of breeding and Thoroughbred ‘I’ve got to win this race’ blood coursing through their veins, and they meet like that, it’s just a thrilling thing to watch. Without going over the top, it’s almost inspirational,” the Saratoga icon said. “I remember people

applauding both horses when they came back to be unsaddled. I think everybody at Saratoga that day realized that they had really seen something that was quite special.”

Durkin was quick to credit both jockeys for giving their mounts every chance to hit the wire in front. In the case of the previously unbeaten Carson Hollow, the announcer noted that the courageous filly augmented her reputation in defeat.

“At first blush, it’s probably the best losing effort I ever saw--almost up there with Seattle Slew in the 1978 Jockey Club Gold Cup,” he said. “The filly was certainly gallant in defeat.”

Bailey, Velazquez, and Durkin, as well as Saratoga’s leading trainer Chad Brown--who was in his first year as an assistant to Bobby Frankel in 2002--will all be in attendance at the Spa Saturday. Brown will saddle the undefeated Your Love (Flatter) in the Test; Durkin will be rooting on Breaking Lucky (Lookin At Lucky) as one of the 5-year-old’s co-owners in the GI Whitney S.; and Bailey will be covering both races as part of NBC Sports’ live, on-site coverage.

A large portion of Saratoga’s mystique comes from unforgettable moments featuring diverse human and equine actors, and the 2002 Test leaves an enduring impression as one of the track’s greatest races of all time. [Click here to return to p1](#)

OLD CHAPEL LOOKS TO CONTINUE

FORWARD 'MOTION' *By Christie DeBernardis*

Old Chapel Farm owner and operator Andrew Motion came to the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Sale as a consignor for the first time last year with just one Ghostzapper filly to sell, but he made it count, turning that \$65,000 weanling into a \$285,000 yearling. The English native hopes to see similar results at this year's Saratoga Sale with another one-horse consignment--a filly from the first crop of MGISW Verrazano.

"It's a little bit more of an unknown quantity being she's by a freshman sire," Motion said of **Hip 3**. "Going in with a Ghostzapper last year, I was going in with a proven sire who was quite hot at the time. This filly is a lovely, lovely filly and we happen to be the only Verrazano filly in the sale. Maybe that will stand me in good stead. His foals were very well received, so I don't see why his yearlings wouldn't be. It seems they were in July. They are all very athletic looking and walk very well. I am very excited about her as an individual."

Bred by Kendall Hansen and M.D. Racing, Hip 3 is out of the

unraced mare Magic Show (Notebook), who has produced four winners from four to race, including GISP You Know I Know (Simon Pure), who earned over \$500,000 on the racetrack. Motion picked up the filly for \$70,000 as a weanling at last year's Keeneland November sale.

"I look at the individual first and then I look to see if it has enough pedigree for me to justify taking a chance on it," the 51-year-old said. "I want them to come out and walk for me like they own the place and this Verrazano filly did that last November. She just walked right out there like she was the bees knees with this big walk and kind eye on her. So that really struck me."

Motion continued, "I looked at all the fillies, but the Verrazanos were really striking my eye. It is interesting in a freshman sire group, it doesn't take long to realize which stallions are totally stamping their foals with the same walk, attitude and head carriage. I quickly could tell the Verrazanos were looking like a nice group. I firmly believe in the horse. He was a phenomenal horse himself. We vetted several, but got outbid. For whatever reason, maybe because she was the first horse through the ring in Book 2, I got lucky and got this one within my budget." **Cont. p10**

Old Chapel Farm Looks to Continue Forward 'Motion' cont.

The Verrazano filly is the only yearling Motion is bringing to Saratoga, but he has three other fillies back home in his barn in Upperville, Virginia. The remaining three yearlings, who are by Into Mischief, Orb and More Than Ready, will be sold at Keeneland September.

"I've got four really nice fillies and there is probably no reason why any of them couldn't have gone [to Saratoga], but I just felt that at this stage this filly was further along than the others," Motion explained. "She is coming right at the right time. I think she looks great. She's still got that lovely walk that I bought her with."

Last year Motion took the fillies he did not feel were ready for Saratoga to the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling Sale and saw good returns. A Discreetly Mine filly he purchased for \$60,000 as a KEENOV weanling summoned \$175,000 in Timonium and his Super Saver filly blossomed from a \$60,000 weanling to a \$90,000 yearling.

This year, however, Motion felt his group deserved a shot on the bigger stage in Lexington in September.

"I think I am getting to the level now on pedigree and individuals that they need to go to September, where there is a bigger pool of buyers," he said. "I love the Maryland sale, but doing it myself, there is no point in me spreading over three

sales in three months. The group as a whole felt like they belonged very well in Kentucky. Last year's group did not have the sire power these three fillies have."

Motion added, "To be honest, the More Than Ready filly that I have is a tall, leggy More Than Ready and there are going to be Europeans that show up in September and there won't be any Europeans at Timonium. You want the Europeans to see her because obviously they've done well with the More Than Readys just like the Americans have." **Cont. p11**

Motion may have only joined the pinhooking game five years ago, but he has been in the Thoroughbred business his whole life. His mother was an amateur jockey and assistant trainer and his father was an international bloodstock agent.

While his older brother Graham Motion was drawn to the training side of the industry, Andrew Motion was always enamored by the sales aspect.

"I left high school telling dad I was going to be Sheikh Mohammed's farm manager by the time I was 30," Motion said with a laugh. "That is all I wanted to. I never even thought about going to college. I just wanted to get straight into the horse business. I went to Kentucky and I worked for Dr. Michael Osborne at North Ridge Farm. Dr. Osborne was a wonderful mentor to me and he encouraged me to go to the Irish National Stud. So, I did. I had a wonderful experience and met a ton of great people. It was a nice sort of launching pad for me to travel the world in the Thoroughbred business. I worked at Dalham Hall for a season, sort of as a working student at Sheikh Mohammed's farm in Newmarket, and spent a few years at New Zealand breeding farms."

After traveling the world, Motion rejoined his parents in Virginia and decided to put down roots. He started a family and took a job at Lazy Lane Farm, where he stayed for 10 years, working the last five as Thoroughbred manager. Motion left Lazy Lane in 2000 and in 2003, he bought Old Chapel Farm with his wife Patty. She passed away from cancer a short time later, forcing Motion to put his Thoroughbred sales dreams on hold.

"I very much intended to set up my own operation when I left Lazy Lane," he said. "Sadly, life circumstances got in the way. My girls' mom, my wife, became ill with cancer and we lost her. So, I had to put my plans on hold because I had two little girls to care for. I stayed in touch with the horse business, but I stepped

needed in our Red Bank, New Jersey location.

away for a little while. I wasn't in a position to start my own business and raise two little girls. So, I sold real estate for a while. I remarried when my girls were around college age. My current wife, Janie, encouraged me to do what I had planned on doing all along."

Motion's wife and daughters, Mary and Lillibet, sent him off to Keeneland January with a budget of \$10,000. He bought two fillies to resell in Timonium, where he turned that \$10,000 into \$48,000.

"My goal is to have a small group of really quality fillies," Motion said. "I'm not necessarily in the situation where I can do colts. You need a different set up. I'm by myself and colts require a little more labor. Fillies are easier because you can turn them out together. I also like doing fillies because a filly with a good pedigree will always have good residual. I feel like even if I end up keeping a filly and racing her, if she has some pedigree, maybe that is the start of my broodmare band some day. I am just really enjoying picking out a small herd of good-looking athletic fillies that I can afford and trying to bring them along, raise them right and resell them as yearlings."

Motion has a unique and hands-on approach when it comes to raising his yearlings.

"I start my young horses the way you would start any young horse to be ridden," Motion explained. "I do an awful lot of long lining with them. We will walk through the fields or use the all-weather footing ring at the farm. We do some jogging and changing directions. We may trot some poles here and there. It keeps them interested, they don't get bored and it builds up their muscles naturally doing it. It makes it easier for the next person that has them." **Cont. p12**

He added, "I will change it up and take them out with the pony. We are lucky we are in beautiful hunt country, so all the neighbors are very welcoming and there are tons of hay fields around, so we go out and ride around the hay fields. The other morning we had deer, turkey and a fox all on one ride. It is great for their brain and I am just in a really lucky position that I can do that."

As someone with deep roots, vast knowledge and a lifetime of experience in all aspects of the Thoroughbred industry, Motion could have gone any way in his career with horses, but he felt pinhooking was the best fit.

"I think for somebody small like me without very deep pockets, it was the best way to start my own business," Motion said. "We started with \$10,000. You can't go out and buy a mare and breed to a \$15,000 stud fee and try to get as nice of a sales yearling on that kind of budget. I think that having spent so much time around my dad as a young fellow in the horse world, his mentorship and his education, and all those that I've worked with since, have given me a little bit of an eye for who is an athlete and who's not. I thought that was my best asset so I might as well try and use that."

Bricks and Mortar scraped paint for much of the Manila, but was switched out in midstretch and rallied powerfully to inhale his competition. Big Handsome didn't have nearly as easy a trip. Previously three-for-three since switching to the turf, including a 5 1/4-length romp in the May 27 Paradise Creek S. over seven panels downstate, the Tony Dutrow pupil sat in a perfect tracking spot for much of the Manila, but was completely bottled up for almost the entirety of the stretch and likely would have won with a cleaner journey.

Secretary At War defeated subsequent GII Penn Mile and GIII Kent S. hero Frostmourne

(Speightstown) in Aqueduct's Woodhaven S.

Apr. 22. He faded to seventh after chasing the pace in the nine-panel Pennine Ridge S. at Belmont June 3, but bounced back in the Manila on the cutback to a mile and back on the front end.

Highly regarded '**TDN Rising Star**' Yoshida (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) couldn't have been much more impressive flying home from another area code to take Pimlico's James W. Murphy S. going away May 20, but faded to fifth as the favorite in the 10-panel GI Belmont Derby July 8 after finding himself wide and chasing a slow pace set by the accomplished Oscar Performance (Kitten's Joy). **Arklow** (Arch) broke his maiden at Keeneland on the same day as Yoshida Apr. 9, and upended the GII American Turf S. on GI Kentucky Derby day May 6. He too was hung wide in the Belmont Derby, and checked in last of 11.

Peter Brant and Allen Stable's **Paid Up Subscriber** (Candy Ride {Arg}) is doing well following an operation to repair a fractured right ankle. The injury was found following the bay's 32 1/2-length romp in Saratoga's GIII Shuvee S. Sunday against just two rivals.

"We are picking her up today," trainer Char Brown told the NYRA notes team Thursday. "She did fine. She'll be on the shelf for a couple of months."

The conditioner continued, "There are highs and lows sometimes in horseracing. She won such a large margin with the last stages of the race. Not even exerting herself. It's hard to imagine she was injured. These things happen and thankfully it wasn't anything serious; very repairable, and she's doing fine."

Previously campaigned by William Lawrence and Klaravich Stables and trainer Al Stall, Jr., Paid Up Subscriber was purchased by these connections for \$1.1 million at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton November sale and transferred to Brown. Third in the GI Madison S. Apr. 8 and fourth in the GI La Troienne S. May 5, the 5-year-old gave champion Songbird (Medaglia d'Oro) a run for her money when second in the GI Ogden Phipps S. at Belmont June 10 prior to her Shuvee score.



GOODWOOD GOING NO BOTHER FOR WINTER



Winter earns her fourth Group 1 in the Nassau S. | *Racing Post*

Becoming the first filly to win the G1 English and Irish 1000 Guineas, G1 Coronation S. and G1 Nassau S. in the same season, **Winter (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) clinched the week's leading honours as she dealt with her latest assignment in the Qatar-sponsored Goodwood highlight on Thursday with the same degree of comfort that she had her previous three. Grey fillies can gain a special following among the *turfistes*, and it is entirely possible that Susan Magnier's latest dignitary could yet join the likes of Petite Etoile and Indian Skimmer with these early achievements already marked off. If there was any genuine concern among Coolmore's collective rationale regarding the state of the ground it was overwhelmed by a concrete belief in their representative, who is already laying claim to Minding's crown as the best of her sex to have raced for Aidan O'Brien. Whereas Minding was turned over in the Irish Guineas, Winter made that May 28 Curragh test a validation of what many thought after the Newmarket Classic three weeks earlier; that she would have beaten Rhododendron (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) even if that stablemate had enjoyed a trouble-free run. At Royal Ascot, the filly that David Wachman tended at two before his retirement from training went through the Coronation with a kind of ease which could only be appreciated after the runner-up Roly Poly (War Front) beat some serious fillies and mares in the G1 Falmouth S. and G1 Prix Rothschild the next month. Tracking 'TDN Rising Star' Sobetsu and her slow-starting stablemate Hydrangea (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) throughout the early stages, the 10-11 favourite tended to race a touch exuberantly with Ryan Moore keen to keep her balanced on the deep turf. As fellow 3-year-old Sobetsu kept rolling three furlongs out, Winter was sent up the inner of the labouring Hydrangea and was able to slipstream the Godolphin rival soon after. With the overly-fresh So Mi Dar (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) failing to make any impact from behind and last year's runner-up Queen's Trust (GB) (Dansili {GB}) not picking up out wide, it was left to the sophomores to make the finale and it was the Ballydoyle ambassador who started to assert approaching the furlong pole. In the run to the line, she was extending in familiar fashion despite the ground and at the line her 1 1/2-length verdict over the closer Blond Me was a far-from-conclusive measurement of her superiority. Ryan Moore was of that opinion afterwards, "I wouldn't say she was impressive by any means, but this ground is as bad as you are going to get and it wasn't a smooth race at all," he commented.

Moore was winning his 10th Group 1 of the current campaign for Ballydoyle and holds an understandably high opinion of Winter, who it could be argued without exaggeration would have won the Sussex on Wednesday. [Cont. p3](#)

“It didn’t go the way we’d have liked for her, but she has plenty of class and that’s what came out in the end,” Moore commented. “It was quite steady in the early part of the race, we lacked cover and she is a big, long-striding filly but she listens and did everything right. She is a very professional racehorse and on these conditions on this track you are not going to see the best of any horse. She has an incredible record this year and we thought 10 furlongs would be okay for her, but the ground was a worry and you never quite know how any horse is going to deal with it. It would have blunted her today, but in the end she was well on top. I always felt I’d get there. She always feels she can pick fillies up, but in this ground they’re not quite sure where to put their feet and one bad step and the race can be over. I didn’t want it to turn into a slog, but she knows how to win.”

In an era of established star fillies where that sex has never been as prominent, Winter has a plethora of options at her feet with only Enable (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}) of either gender to fear in any of the championship events at a mile, this trip or even a mile and a half. Despite being by Galileo, the latter trip would normally seem beyond this filly on paper, with her being a daughter of the Wokingham scorer Laddies Poker Two from a fast female side but she is in the hands of Aidan O’Brien and very few trainers in history have been as skilled at getting horses to stay beyond their pedigrees. It was in this race in 2008 that he achieved it most notably with Halfway To Heaven (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), a product of two five-furlong sprinters and this winner has a freakish quality to her and an as-yet unplumbed depth which suggests anything is possible. “She’ll have a choice of York [for the Aug. 23 G1 Juddmonte] International or Leopardstown [for the Sept. 9 G1 Irish Champion S.], but she looks like she’ll get a mile and a quarter well—if she got it on that ground she’ll get it well in any type of race,” O’Brien said. “She could even get further and the Arc is a possible.”

O’Brien admitted to feeling the customary pre-race trepidation which ensures that no stone is ever unturned in the current perfectionist era of Ballydoyle’s second empire.

“I was holding my breath all the way,” O’Brien admitted. “Jamie was very happy and said she had thrived and Dermot rides her out and they had let her get bigger and stronger which is often a worry. It’s a good while since she ran last, so she was really thriving. She nearly turned from a 3-year-old into a 4-year-old in the middle of the season, which is perfect if they are coming back on soft ground but that was nearly winter ground today so we were worried. Ryan gave her a beautiful ride, he was very aware and held on to her and saved her as long as he could. Even though it’s not that long, she’s had enough time to thrive so you can look forward to the second half of the season with her.”

Trainer Andrew Balding was delighted with the effort of Barbara Keller’s G2 Middleton S. winner Blond Me, who is improving with age on easy ground that suits her well. “She’s a cracking filly and that confirms that the Middleton win was no fluke,” he said. “I have a feeling she will stay a bit further and we have her in the [Sept. 3 G1] Grosser Preis Von Baden.” Charlie Appleby said of Sobetsu, “I am delighted with that. We got a soft lead up there, but that is her ground and 10 furlongs is as far as she is going to get. Going forwards with her, we’ll see how she comes out of this but we could go to Deauville for the [Aug. 19 G2] Prix de la Nonette. Otherwise, she is a filly we could travel with to America for the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup for 3-year-old fillies over nine furlongs--Keeneland in October can get easier conditions.”

Pedigree Notes...

As mentioned, Winter is the second foal out of the speedy Laddies Poker Two, who covered Royal Ascot’s six furlongs quicker than Starspangledbanner (Aus) did in the same day’s G1 Golden Jubilee S.

Under the third dam Quelle Affaire is the fast and precocious Ma Yoram (Dayjur), who placed in the G2 Gimcrack S. and G2 Mill Reef S. while the fourth dam was the accomplished sprinter Ancient Regime (Olden Times), who was France’s juvenile champion when winning the G1 Prix Morny. That sister to the similarly speedy Prix Maurice de Gheest-winning sire Cricket Ball produced three talented sprinters in the G3 Concorde S.-winning sire Rami, the G3 Prix Eclipse-winning sire Crack Regiment and the G1 Prix de l’Abbaye de Longchamp runner-up La Grande Epoque (Lyphard), who in turn was responsible for the fast sire Matelot. Laddies Poker Two’s 2-year-old Snowflakes (Ire) was far from disgraced when eighth in the G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot in June and has already achieved a comparable level of form to Winter at the same stage of their careers, while the dam’s yearling filly is also by Galileo and she is in foal to him again.

Third on debut behind Tuesday's impressive G2 Vintage S. hero Expert Eye (GB) (Acclamation {GB}) in a June 15 novice heat at Newbury, Barraquero graduated at Chepstow 19 days later and stepped forward once again to register a third G2 Qatar Richmond S. for trainer Brian Meehan in Thursday's rain-affected renewal at Goodwood. Hidden under cover off the pace in sixth through the early fractions, the 4-1 chance made smooth headway from halfway to loom large passing the quarter-mile marker and was ridden out once shaken up for his challenge approaching the final eighth to claim a career high with plenty in hand. At the line he had 1 1/4 lengths to spare over Nebo, with 2-1 favourite Cardsharp, weighed down by a three-pound impost for winning Newmarket's July 13 G2 July S., 2 1/4 lengths back in third. "I rode him at Newbury first time out in a good race and he ran very well behind the horse that won the Vintage, and then won at Chepstow," explained winning rider William Buick. "I got a nice bit of cover racing into a headwind and I was impressed with him today. The ground is always a concern when it's like this and he seemed to handle it okay, but he'll be a better horse on better ground. Barraquero, whose eventful second start at Chepstow involved unshipping rider Tom Marquand and crashing through a rail after passing the line six lengths to the good, becomes the third Richmond winner for trainer Brian Meehan, following on from Easycall (GB) (Forzando {GB}) in 1996 and Carrizo Creek (Ire) (Charnwood Forest {Ire}) in 2003, and the trainer is tempted to have a crack at Deauville's Aug. 20 G1 Prix Morny, a race in which the latter finished fifth. "I'm very excited about him and he's always been that type of horse," he said. "Since the spring he's always been an exciting type and I was concerned about the ground yesterday, but this morning it seemed a bit more civilised. My other two winners were nice horses, but this is now and I think he's a Group 1 horse and will get further. I'd love to think he'll go for the Morny in two weeks, but he's got other entries."

Nebo's trainer Charlie Hills hasn't got the Morny feeling and suggested a return to the seven-furlong trip, at which the runner-up finished second in Newmarket's July 15 G2 Superlative S. last time, is more likely on the cards. "The ground is not an excuse, the winner looked good and showed a better turn of foot than we did," he reflected. "He may have bumped into [a good] one there and will probably go back to seven furlongs. We'll have a look at the [Sept. 16 G2] Champagne S. at Doncaster. He's a bonny horse and time will tell if he makes a 3-year-old."

Mark Johnston, trainer of the third home Cardsharp, is not putting a line through the Morny just yet and added, "I hope it's the ground as the jockey feels it is. He travelled like the best horse, but they've come at him and he was unable to pick up and that is par for the course on that ground. I'm not ruling out going for the Prix Morny."

It was at this track in May 2015 that Endless Time finished ahead of the subsequent G1 St Leger and G1 QIPCO British Champions Fillies & Mares S. winner Simple Verse (Ire) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) in a 12-furlong handicap that has obviously since taken on far greater significance. Ending her 3-year-old campaign with an impressive 4 1/2-length success in the Listed Bluebell S. again at that trip at Naas in October, the bay returned to capture the G2 Lancashire Oaks on the soft at Haydock last July prior to running ninth in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks on a contrasting surface the following month. Rebounding when second in the G1 Prix Vermeille at Chantilly in September, she was sent over further than a mile and a half for the first time in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak and fared well when 1 3/4-lengths second to Vazirabad (Fr) (Manduro {Ger}) over just short of two miles at Saint-Cloud in October. Beaten less than a length on her comeback when fourth in the May 19 G2 Yorkshire Cup, she wandered late on after gaining the lead there. It would have been too quick for her at Royal Ascot next time as she trailed in 10th in the June 22 G1 Gold Cup, and Charlie Appleby reached for cheekpieces as he sought to revive her fortunes.

Settled in mid-division against the rail by William Buick, Endless Time was always travelling best but with the ground riding tacky her biggest problem was finding racing room in time in the straight as Here Comes When's half-sister Melodic Motion kept her penned there in early straight. Eventually angled out approaching the final quarter mile, she had over two lengths to make up on Dubka a furlong later but her withering run down the outer took her past that rival in the final strides for an ultimately cosy success. "I can't say she is not game, but she's getting a bit older and wiser and the cheekpieces just help her travel into the race better," her handler said.

She is still a very smart filly and is likely to go for the [G2] Park Hill [S. at Doncaster on Sept. 14] next."

Battaash lines up for Friday's King George | *Racing Post*

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum looks to have an exciting sprinter on his hands in **Battaash (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) and he is set to be seriously tested in Friday's G2 Qatar King George S. at Goodwood. Impressive over this trip on his two starts at Sandown this term, the bay took the June 17 Listed Scurry S. and July 8 G3 Sprint S. with authority both on good-to-firm ground, but he has a pedigree for easier conditions.

The owner's racing manager Angus Gold is in the dark regarding that factor. "I suggest it might be sticky, but I just don't know. He's had knee problems, so you never know if they will go on this ground," he said. "It's going to blunt his speed a bit, I would have thought. Charlie [Hills] is very keen to run him, so I can only imagine we'll be there. He was very good at Sandown. You certainly can't fault what he's done this year."

Another who is unproven on this surface is **Marsha (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}), who was surprisingly beaten in The Curragh's G2 Sapphire S. last time on July 15. Last year's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye heroine looked a world-beater when defying a penalty on her return in the G3 Palace House S. at Newmarket on May 6, but after a third to Lady Aurelia (Scat Daddy) in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot on June 20 and her latest eclipse she no longer has an air of invincibility. "She came back from Ireland fine and because we felt it was quite a long time until the Nunthorpe at York, we thought we'd let her run here first," explained Dan Downie, racing manager for owners Elite Racing Club. "Five furlongs at Goodwood is probably as sharp as she'd wanted, so we were hoping for genuine good ground rather than rattling quick ground, but obviously soft ground wouldn't be ideal."

Now 10, **Take Cover (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) bids to make history by winning this a third time and comes here on the back of a perfect confidence-building success over **Final Venture (GB)** (Equiano {Fr}) in York's Listed City Walls S. on July 15. Trainer David Griffiths said, "He worked on Monday and worked well. He's come out of it in good form and he's ready to go. I'm not worried about the draw, as we're near the favourite [Battaash] and I would imagine the rest will follow us. The one worry would obviously be the ground. He can handle soft, but he's better on quick ground and in these races you want everything spot-on. Having said that, they've all got to go through it, our horse looks a million dollars and I think he goes there with a big chance."

Clive Cox has both the G1 King's Stand S. runner-up **Profitable (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and G2 Temple S. winner **Priceless (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), and conditions could be more ideal for the former after he won the King's Stand on soft last year. "Of the two of mine, I think Profitable would probably be more favoured on the ground," he said. "He has winning form in soft ground and I thought he ran a fantastic race at Ascot on ground that was quicker than ideal for him. He was giving nine pounds to Lady Aurelia and I was very proud of his performance. Timing-wise, the gap between Ascot and Goodwood is perfect and he goes there fresh and well. Priceless probably wouldn't be as well suited on softer ground, but she's in good form."

Charlie Appleby opted to avoid last week's King George in favour of an easier task in the G3 Betfred Glorious S. with his beloved **Frontiersman (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), but after Glorious Goodwood turned into a meteorologic nightmare Friday's race no longer looks the soft option it was. On the form of his second placings in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom on June 2 and G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket on July 13, Godolphin's son of Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) has no equal in this line-up but his trainer is cautious. "He was third on his debut at Goodwood, so he has some experience of the course and I am hoping that the ground is not too testing," he said. "If we see a repeat performance of Newmarket, which I think he has come on from, he should run well. He just needs more racing experience. The more racing he gets under his belt the better. It looks like visually at home that he has come forward again. He looked great on Wednesday having his blow-out and I'm thrilled with the way he is."

If there is one who could put it up to Frontiersman it is Saeed Suhail's unexposed **Poet's Word (Ire)** (Poet's Voice {GB}), who has not been seen since finishing runner-up to Deauville (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G3 Huxley S. over 10 furlongs at Chester on May 11. He bids to provide Sir Michael Stoute with a fifth renewal, while at the other end of the training spectrum Jedd O'Keefe is hoping that the July 1 Listed Fred Archer S. winner **Lord Yeats (GB)** (Yeats {Ire}) can hold his own. Successful by a neck from the re-opposing **Second Step (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) in that Newmarket contest, the front-runner is one who will be aided by the wet conditions. "The rain is what we were hoping for and the more they get the better," his handler commented.

"I think the trip will suit him and the track will suit him. He's never been to Goodwood, but he's run well at places like Hamilton, which is not too dissimilar. He's in very good form and we'll be employing our usual tactics by riding him positively, so it's just a question of whether he's good enough. I think he deserves his place in the field and we're looking forward to it."

Aida Fustog’s **Mix and Mingle (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) beat Qemah (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the G3 Chartwell Fillies’ S. at this trip at Lingfield on May 13 before finishing 12th behind her in Royal Ascot’s G2 Duke of Cambridge S. at a mile last time on June 21, while others who warrant respect are Cheveley Park Stud’s returning Listed October S. winner **Eternally (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) and the July 22 G3 Hackwood S. runner-up **Perfect Angel (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}). She won a maiden at this meeting 12 months ago and put up a career-best when chasing home Magical Memory (Ire) (Zebedee {GB}) over six furlongs last time. “She will love the soft ground,” trainer Andrew Balding said. “The extra furlong is the question mark. She is obviously in great form as she was a very good second behind Magical Memory last time.”

New Names, Familiar Faces At Haras de Montfort & Preaux cont. from p1

“The new farm is 55 hectares, compared to 35 hectares at La Cauviniere, so we actually have more land now, and it is split into two sections, with a foaling unit close to the chateau, and then 45 hectares across the road. We are very fortunate to have been able to buy this farm. Not only have some very good horses been bred here over the years but the land has been rested for several years. The other advantage is that it is land that we know well—we are so close by and we have bred good horses here ourselves so we know it is good land that we can work with.”

The forward-thinking Jean-Louis Lucas, who died last year, inherited the farm, which had been in his family since 1924. His attempts at modernising the stunning property between Livarot and Orbec included the installation of a laboratory and surgery. Preaux was previously home to the stallion Solon (Ger) (Local Suitor), whose multiple Grade 1-winning hurdler Solwhit (Fr) was bred by Lucas, while Execute (Fr) (Suave Dancer), winner of the G1 Prix Ganay for John Hammond, was another of the farm’s notable graduates.

Having already released some land to Vidal, who took on the nearby Haras de la Touques as a yearling annexe for La Cauviniere some years ago, the Lucas family will hopefully draw some comfort from knowing that the remainder of the farm is passing to an operation that will continue the tradition of Thoroughbred breeding on site.

“For us, the only thing that has changed is that we have a wonderful new farm and a new name. He continues, "The stallions will not move, they will remain where they have always been at Montfort, so everything will be the same for our clients."

In the decade since first launching a commercial stud venture, Vidal's feet have barely touched the ground. Appointed racing and bloodstock manager to Gerard Augustin-Normand in the year that Le Havre (Ire) (Noverre) won the G1 Prix du Jockey Club, Vidal later welcomed the Classic winner as the first stallion to his farm after some lucrative offers from Japan were refused. "It is more than I could have dreamed of, to have as we do three Group 1 stallions at the farm. There has been a lot of change but I am very happy in my life, and so is Mathieu. We love what we do and we are very fortunate," he says.

Le Havre, whose two dual Classic-winning daughters Avenir Certain (Fr) and La Cressonniere (Fr) were both bred at the farm, was subsequently joined in the new stallion unit by Air Chief Marshal (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), sire of last year's G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner Mont Ormel (Fr) (now racing in Hong Kong as Helene Charisma), and Rajsaman (Fr), who is writing his own

chapter of the farm's success story this season via his son Brametot (Fr). The winner of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey Club is not a homebred, rather an example of Augustin-Normand supporting his stallions at the sales. He is still, however, a major feather in the cap of Vidal and Alex, who bought the Jorge Cardemil-bred Brametot as a foal at Arqana for just €26,000 and raised him at the farm prior to him being sent into training. The colt is now owned in partnership with another burgeoning breeding operation in France, Al Shaqab Racing.

Brametot remains at the vanguard of the team of runners, along with Almanzor (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}), who was initially owned by Augustin-Normand in partnership with long-term associate Antonio Caro until the colt's breeder Haras d'Etream bought back into the three-time Group 1 winner last season.

Both trained by Jean-Claude Rouget, Brametot looks set to follow a similar path to Almanzor, with his next outing likely to be the G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano in Deauville on Aug. 15, followed by the G1 Irish Champion S.

Farther afield, the GI Beverly D S. winner Eclair de Lune (Ger) (Marchand de Sable) is another to have been raised at La Cauviniere, along with the multiple Group 1-placed and Group 3-winning sprinter Suedois (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}), who, like Avenir Certain, was bred by Vidal.

While sensibly not selling Le Havre, who has proved to be the jewel in the organisation's crown, Augustin-Normand has shown that he is willing to trade, as well as entering into strategic partnerships with fellow owner-breeders. With several major entities involved, it remains to be seen where Almanzor and Brametot will reside when they eventually retire to stud. In the meantime, the team at Haras de Montfort & Preaux is not resting on its laurels.

"We're looking for more stallions for next season," confirms Vidal.

The name may have changed but the desire for success remains the same, if not stronger than ever. [\(Return to p1\)](#)

On a day when David Wachman's nurturing ability was showcased on the big stage at Goodwood by Winter, another of the 2016 juveniles that passed through his hands in Music Box came to the fore at the Galway festival.

Unraced for the now-retired trainer, she was off the mark on her fourth start over seven furlongs on heavy ground at Gowran Park on June 5 and six starts later was adding to that tally in a six-furlong handicap at Naas on July 8. Back nine days later to run second to Drumfad Bay in Killarney's Listed Cairn Rouge S. over a mile, the industrious bay was barely able to rest in between that and the July 26 Listed Yeomanstown Stud Dark Angel EBF S. back at six returning to Naas but showed she was thriving when a staying-on second to Only Mine (Ire) (Pour Moi {Ire}).

Reportedly losing a shoe leaving the stalls here, the imperturbable Music Box made light of that setback to stalk in second and pounce passing the two-furlong pole en route to a straightforward first black-type success. Another advert for Aidan O'Brien's deftness with horses who like to race, the winner is a half-sister to the talented Ektihaam, who was second in the G2 Dante S. in 2012 and returned gelded a year later to beat Thomas Chippendale (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) by six lengths in the Listed Buckhounds S. only to slip on the bend and unseat his rider during a drama-filled G2 Hardwicke S. won by that ill-fated rival. The second dam is the G3 Premio Bagutta winner and G1 Premio Lydia Tesio runner-up Royal Lorna (Val de l'Orne {Fr}), whose descendants include the G1 Premio Roma hero Sunstrach (Ire) (Polar Falcon). This is also the family of the champions Dance Act (Northern Dancer), Court Royal (Chop Chop) and Awaasif (Snow Knight), who was the dam of Snow Bride (Blushing Groom {Fr}) who was awarded the 1989 G1 Epsom Oaks before producing Lammtarra. The third dam Royal Statute's 1973 foal turned out to be the G1 1000 Guineas runner-up Konafa (Damascus), who threw seven stakes performers including the sire Keos and G3 Prix Chloe winner Korveya (Riverman). The latter achieved a greater measure of fame later as the dam of the brilliant Bosra Sham (Woodman) and her five-times Group 1-winning Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero full-brother Hector Protector.

WORLDWIDE NEWS**PLUMPTRE, O'SHEA CHARGED**

Former Godolphin Australia Managing Director Henry Plumptre and former Godolphin Australia head trainer John O'Shea have been issued charges by Racing NSW stewards in relation to an improperly reported strangles case last August.

Plumptre, who resigned from his post in late July, is charged with not reporting the horse in question, Polemic (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}), as being infected with strangles from on or about Aug. 5, 2016. O'Shea, who departed from Godolphin three years into a five-year contract in April, is charged with being a party to Plumptre committing the breach, and with providing false and/or misleading evidence at a stewards interview on June 16 and at a stewards inquiry on June 27. The hearing of the charges is scheduled for Friday in Sydney.

Godolphin released a statement on Friday that read, "Godolphin confirms that two former employees have been issued with charges relating to an investigation brought, under the Australian Rules of Racing, by Racing NSW of failing to report a positive test on a horse who suffered from the bacterial condition Strep Equi (Strangles) in August 2016.
