

CLOUD COMPUTING CONFIRMED FOR TRAVERS

After some deliberation by trainer Chad Brown, Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence's GI Preakness S. winner **Cloud Computing** (Maclean's Music) will compete in Saturday's GI Travers S. at Saratoga, the Eclipse Award-winning conditioner said Monday morning. The latest addition to the expected full field augments an already competitive race that is expected to draw GI Kentucky Derby winner **Always Dreaming** (Bodemeister) and GI Belmont S. hero **Tapwrit** (Tapit) from the Todd Pletcher barn.

Second in the Mar. 4 GIII Gotham S. and third in the Apr. 8 GII Wood Memorial S. prior to his win in the Preakness May 20, Cloud Computing returned from a two-month layoff with a disappointing last-of-five finish as the 6-5 second choice in the July 29 GII Jim Dandy S., the traditional prep for the Travers. He was asked to stay closer to a decidedly moderate pace that day and came up empty in the stretch, despite being beaten just 4 3/4 lengths by **Good Samaritan** (Harlan's Holiday). The colt has worked twice since then, most recently posting a five-furlong move in 1:01.65 Saturday.

"He couldn't have worked any better," said Brown. "I was very happy with the work and Javier [Castellano] was pleased, and he came out of his work well."

STELLAR WIND TO BE OFFERED AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER

Eclipse Champion and six-time Grade I winner **Stellar Wind** (Curlin) will be consigned by Lane's End to the 2017 Keeneland November Sale, it was announced Monday afternoon. Owned by Kosta and Peter Hronis's Hronis Racing and trained by John Sadler, the chestnut is unbeaten in three starts in 2017, all in Grade I company. To date, Stellar Wind has compiled a record of 10-2-1 from 15 starts with earnings of \$2,233,200.

"Stellar Wind is without a doubt one of the classiest horses I've ever been around, and is everything you could want in a racehorse and a broodmare prospect," said Sadler. "She has a high cruising speed, is sound, and has an incredible will to win. That was on display last year when she beat [four-time champion] Beholder (Henny Hughes) on the square, not once, but twice, in the GI Clement L. Hirsch S. and the GI Zenyatta S."



Brown added that recently inducted Hall of Fame jockey Javier Castellano will retain the mount on Cloud Computing for the Travers—a race the jockey has won a record five times. With Always Dreaming and Tapwrit also confirmed, it marks the first time that the individual winners of all three Triple Crown races will meet in the Travers since 1982.

L and N Racing's Lookin At Lee (Lookin At Lucky) posted his final work in preparation for the Travers Monday morning, clocking a steady half-mile in :50.99 seconds over the Oklahoma training track. The Kentucky Derby runner-up enters the Midsummer Derby off a third-place finish in the Aug. 5 GIII West Virginia Derby.

“The work went well,” said trainer Steve Asmussen, who also sent out MGISW Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}) to breeze five furlongs in a bullet 1:00.40 Monday in preparation for a start in the GI Woodward S. Sept. 2. “I didn't get a time and it was pretty foggy, but he traveled well and [Angel Garcia] thought he went well. He came out of it good and we are very pleased with him.”

Kosta Hronis added, "It's been an absolute privilege to campaign a mare of Stellar Wind's caliber. Stellar Wind has brought me and my family many thrills, and with the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff at Del Mar this year, we're hoping there might be a few more."

The 5-year-old is the leading money-winning female by Curlin. A daughter of the Malibu Moon mare Evening Star, she hails from the immediate family of this year's GI Met Mile winner Mor Spirit and Grade I-winning juvenile Great Hunter.

"We are honored to have the opportunity to sell a true superstar of the sport," said Keeneland Vice-President of Racing and Sales Bob Elliston. "Our thanks to the Hronis family and Lane's End who recognize Keeneland November as the most important breeding stock sale in world. It's where a world-class mare belongs."

Stellar Wind has won three times at the Grade I level in 2017, tallying Oaklawn's Apr. 14 Apple Blossom H. before returning to Southern California to annex the June 3 Beholder Mile S. and July 30 Clement Hirsch S.

"We have the opportunity to bring some terrific mares to Keeneland November, and Stellar Wind is certainly at the top," said Lane's End's Will Farish. "She's been a Grade I winner at three, four and five, winning six Grade I races in total against some of the best filly and mare competition of recent times. With her pedigree, she'll hold tremendous appeal to both domestic and international buyers. Stellar Wind is one the finest broodmare prospects to come to market in recent times."

ERUPT LEADS EXPECTED SARATOGA EURO TRIO *by Michael Adolphson*

A trio of Europeans are slated to invade New York for Saratoga's impressive weekend stakes action, including six Grade I races topped by the GI Travers S. While there are no across-the-pond competitors for the featured event, said contingent may prove strong in the two races in which they compete, topped by multiple Grade/Group I winner **Erupt (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) in the GI Sword Dancer S., a Breeders' Cup Challenge Series 'Win and You're In' event for the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Turf.

The Niarchos Family's 5-year-old Francis-Henri Graffard-trained horse tops a deadly Euro duo for the 12-furlong turf event, but may not be the favorite come post time. The winner of October's GI Canadian International is winless in a pair of starts this season—including a fourth in the G1 Prix Ganay May 1 and ninth in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud July 2—and has only a solo victory in his previous 11 starts. Favoritism may go to Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's **Idaho (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who enters the \$1-million race in career form for trainer Aidan O'Brien.

"He seems to have shipped well and has been training well," Graffard said. "The ground was way too soft in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud last time, but he had a very good seasonal comeback in the Prix Ganay."

After the Canadian International, in which he defeated favored Idaho by 2 1/2 lengths, the son of top stallion Dubawi (Ire) was a lackluster 14th, beaten eight lengths, in the G1 Japan Cup. While

the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud was a non-effort in which he finished 56 3/4 lengths astern, his Prix Ganay was a solid performance, losing by a length for it all behind Group 1 winners Cloth of Stars (Ire) (Sea the Stars {Ire}), Zarak (Fr) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Silverwave (Fr) (Silver Frost {Ire}). Despite said defeats, his recent work has his connections confident the winner of the 2015 G1 Grand Prix de Paris will run well.

"In Japan, it snowed two days before the race and it upset his training, so he had an excuse," Graffard said. "I think he is coming into this race very well and I hope he runs well. Last year, he really came back to himself at the end of the summer and into the fall and you saw how he performed in Canada."

"He's doing very well," added Alan Cooper, racing manager for the Niarchos Family. "The ground was too soft for him at Saint-Cloud last time and he seems to be back in form. We are going looking for firm ground and we feel that the conditions of this type of race suit him."

Originally slated for the Breeders' Cup Turf last year after his Canadian conquering, Erupt was removed from consideration the week of the race. This year, he is less likely

to be aimed toward the Breeders' Cup, but it is not completely off the horizon.

"We have [Sir Michael Stoute-trained G1 Coral Eclipse S. winner] Ulysses (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) aiming toward the Breeders' Cup Turf, but we will have a better idea after the Sword Dancer," Cooper continued. "Erupt is obviously a horse with good form who appreciates fast ground and ships well, so hopefully he performs well on Saturday."

Idaho, a full-brother to last year's Breeders' Cup Turf champion Highland Reel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), defeated his sibling and Ballydoyle-conditioned stablemate last out when third in the G1 King George & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot behind superstar filly Enable (GB). Said effort followed an impressive victory in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot. Placed three times in Grade/Group I events, he will be looking for a breakout top-level performance at the Saratoga Springs oval.

Joining the aforementioned French and Irish, the Germans will also be taking part Saturday at Saratoga. Stall Domstadt's Peter Schiergen-trained **Ross (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) enters the G1 Forego S. against a tough field expected to be topped by locally based global sprint star Mind Your Biscuits (Posse). The son of Acclamation (GB) out of an El Corredor mare has proven left-handed dirt form, having competed seven times at Meydan's American-style dirt course, including a runner-up effort in March's G2 Godolphin Mile. In said effort, he out-finished top American sprinter-miler Sharp Azteca (Freud).

The 5-year-old bay horse shipped to New York last Saturday, and got his first feel for the local surroundings with a jog on Monday morning, along with travel-mate Erupt. He enters off a two-length allowance win over Deauville's all-weather course going 6 1/2 furlongs in a spritely 1:16.72.

"His last race was very good at Deauville and he had a break after Dubai," Schiergen said. "I think he is in good form and he travels well. It is not an easy race, but we want to see if he can do it."

Schiergen, who arrives Friday, is fresh off a frustrating trip to Arlington with Group I-placed filly Sarandia (Ger) (Dansili {GB}), who suffered from a wide trip, but ran on well to finish sixth, beaten less than three lengths, in the G1 Beverly D. S.

"We are hoping for better luck than with Sarandia, but he is a good horse and he has speed," Schiergen concluded. "It is easier coming from Germany and run on the turf, rather than a dirt race, but this is a test for him and he did well in Dubai."

Idaho is expected to join his European mates Tuesday and clear quarantine in time to train Thursday morning. No rider has been assigned for Idaho as of yet, but regular pilots Stephane Pasquier (Erupt) and Andrasch Starke (Ross) are slated to make the trip. While the Travers will be drawn Tuesday evening, the remaining quintet of Grade Is will be drawn Wednesday morning.

ADDITIONAL EQUINE SAFETY MEASURES IMPLEMENTED AT SARATOGA

In the wake of several equine fatalities at the current Saratoga meet, additional equine health and safety policies have been implemented by the New York State Gaming Commission, the New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) and the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (NYTHA), it was announced Monday afternoon. The measures include increased regulatory veterinary presence at the track, state-of-the-art monitoring of horses and a comprehensive trainer education policy. The new policies will share scientific findings of research into the types of injuries that occur at New York Thoroughbred racetracks, while highlighting risk and protective factors that can help to prevent injury.

"Our goal is to reduce the number of racehorse deaths and injuries to zero, and we have taken many productive steps toward reaching that goal over the past four years," said New York State Equine Medical Director Scott E. Palmer, VMD, highlighting the importance of examining anything from track surfaces to the past performances of horses. "However, our work is never done and there will always be challenges that require reexamination and recalibration to effectively protect horses and their riders."

The Commission has stationed an additional regulatory veterinarian on the grounds of Saratoga Race Course during training hours, while regulatory vets will utilize reports provided by The Jockey Club's InCompass Solutions software to examine

horses considered to be at an increased risk for injury. According to New York’s Equine Death and Breakdown database, there have been 15 equine fatalities on the grounds at Saratoga since the beginning of the meet July 21.

“There is no issue more important to NYRA than the safety of our equine and human athletes,” said NYRA Safety Steward Hugh Gallagher. “That is why NYRA has implemented extensive reforms and made significant investments since 2013 to improve track surface conditions, upgrade equipment, provide vets with more authority to monitor Thoroughbred health, establish committees to oversee safety measures, and actively seek out advice and guidance from independent experts and scientists. As a result of these reforms, the number of catastrophic injuries during races occurring on NYRA tracks has been reduced by nearly 50% since 2013.”

Addressing potential safeguards that can be added to an already extensive safety policy, NYTHA President Rick Violette, Jr. added, “Where safety is concerned, we need to examine every possibility, including a mandate to open all racing surfaces earlier than we have in the past before the start of the race meet.”

In 2016, NYRA’s catastrophic injury rate at Saratoga, Belmont and Aqueduct, combined, was registered at 1.14 per 1,000 starts, significantly below the industry average of 1.54.

Backed to odds-on in this scratched-down field of four, Diversify broke sharply and made a clear lead immediately, clicking off legitimate fractions of :23.59, :47.35 and 1:11.09. Governor Malibu tried to take a crack at the leader passing the three-furlong pole, but Diversify shrugged that one off under no urging and widened with every stride in the lane, rolling home to a devastating romp in an eye-popping final clocking.

"This win is awesome," said victorious trainer Rick Violette, Jr. "I thought he had it in him. I was so disappointed with his [Stymie]. I was going to use that as a launching pad for Charles Town. He didn't show up. He was done at the three-eighths pole that day, so that set the long-term planning back. Fortunately, we had some allowances races available. A lot of times, winning helps their psyche as well as the trainer's. It seems like his more brilliant races have come with a little bit of space and he ran all the way to the wire today. When they went 47-and-change, I thought, 'this is pretty cool.' He just loped around there and looked pretty comfortable. It was super."

Winning rider Irad Ortiz, Jr. added, "He's not that kind of horse that wants to go 50 [seconds for the half-mile]. You let him go, he's got a huge stride and I knew he'd respond. A modest pace, 47 or 48, that's good for him. I was cruising [and] I was so comfortable. When I asked him today, he was all business. MONCEAUX INVINCIBLE AS AUGUST SALE ENDS

DEAUVILLE, France--The benefit of a last-minute update was evident, but then so was the good sense to invest in an established Wertheimer family when an Invincible Spirit (Ire) half-sister to Saturday's G3 Prix du Calvados winner Polydream (Fr) (Oasis Dream {GB}) topped the final session of Arqana's August Sale at €400,000. Partnerships were in play on both sides of the transaction for lot 234. The vendor was the sale's dominant force Ecurie des Monceaux, which has based its successful business on strategic alliances between breeders and bought this filly in utero when purchasing her dam Polygreen (Fr) (Green Tune) for €200,000 at Arqana in December 2015. Stepping in as purchaser was the duo of David Redvers and Ghislain Bozo of Meridian International, who had the previous day gone to €750,000 to buy the Kingman (GB) half-sister to Wings Of Eagles (Fr) (Pour Moi {Ire}) for a new syndicate consisting of Qatar Bloodstock and some investors from China. The same partnership will race Monday's top lot.

Redvers commented on the top lot, "She has so much quality and is very light on her feet. When I first few her I wasn't even aware how good Polydream is but the update made her just what we're looking for. It will make the autumn even more exciting, watching Polydream win a Group 1."

Monceaux Invincible As August Sale Ends

A delighted Henri Bozo, who has presided over yet another major Monceaux draft at Arqana, added, "This is a new partnership for around 10 fairly young breeders. My aim is to bring new people into the business and to promote racing by getting them involved first in small shares in broodmares and then with some racehorses. We decided three or four years ago to have partnerships with younger people as long as they share our ambition as long-term breeders. But we've been very lucky here to buy into a good Wertheimer family and then to have an update like that on Saturday was superb."

Monceaux finished the August Sale in its now-familiar position as leading vendor, with 33 yearlings sold for a total of €9,597,000 at an average of €290,818. Overall, the combination of a slightly reduced catalogue and fall in clearance rate meant that the sale's three-day aggregate didn't quite match strides with last year, but it dropped by only 4% to €38,355,500 for 229 horses sold from 305 offered. The average, on the other hand, was up, by 10% to €166,409 and the median remained static at €110,000. The third session on its own brought another €9,379,500 to the sale's tally (-8%) with a median of €65,000, average of €85,268 (+4%) and a clearance rate of 76% for 110 sold.

Frankels Head East...

The buying team of Mark Richards and Nick Columb from the Hong Kong Jockey Club made an early splash at the sale when buying the first two lots through the ring on Saturday evening--sons of Frankel (GB) and Kingman (GB), respectively--but found things tougher on Sunday. They bounced back on Monday to add another two yearlings to the team for export, who won't see a racetrack until their 3-year-old seasons.

"I'm very happy to have bought two Frankels," Richards commented after bidding €300,000 for the May-born colt. "This one's very immature but that suits us ideally. We're not in a rush and he's going to be going over to Hong Kong for a sale in 19 months' time, so he's got all the time he needs to strengthen up."

Richards later went to €240,000 for **lot 231** from Haras de Montaigu, a grey colt by Siyouni out of Peinted Song (Unbridled's Song) from the strong Wildenstein family which boasts G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero Peintre Celebre among a host of black-type winners.

"Our CEO is very keen on the sire and we've been trying to get a Siyouni for a while now without luck," said Richards. "This one fitted the bill perfectly."

Gillier Branches Out At Haras Voltaire...

Fashion magnate Thierry Gillier put together the first pieces of what could be a fascinating new breeding operation when he completed the purchase of three fillies across the Arqana sale. His creation Zadig & Voltaire is a well-known Parisian upmarket label and has outlets around France. Gillier himself is descended from the family that founded Lacoste and is a renowned collector of modern art. He was introduced to racing slightly by chance as he owns a property close to Deauville at Saint Etienne la Thillaye, which neighbours the Wertheimers' Haras de Saint Leonard.

Working closely with his new farm manager Jacques Navet, a name from the French show jumping world, and bloodstock agent Marc Antoine Berghgracht, he is in the formative stages of founding the 85-hectare Haras Voltaire for thoroughbreds.


"I come very often to Normandy, I'm next to a stud, and first I was into the sport horses, so I went into buying them and they have been pretty good," Gillier said. "The plan is to have a boutique stud, it will not be a big one, maybe 10 or 12 mares--let's see how it goes--but we'll take our time."

The team began on Saturday by taking **lot 52**, Haras d'Etreham's Shamardal filly and the second foal of Purely Priceless (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) for €400,000. The dam is a half-sister to Albany S. winner September (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who were both out of the European champion Peeping Fawn. They followed up with **lot 80**, Haras du Mezeray's Invincible Spirit (Ire) daughter of Straight Lass (Ire) (Machiavallian) for €320,000.

Monday's acquisition was the cheapest of the three at €130,000 with Berghgracht's MAB Agency signing for **lot 214**, a daughter of Charm Spirit (Ire) from Ecurie Des Monceaux out of the Giant's Causeway mare Naissance Royale (Ire).

A half-sister named Jadhaba (Ire), by Galileo, sold for €620,000 at this sale three years ago and won several times for Jean-Claude Rouget.

"Now we have a team," Gillier continued. "Jean-Claude Rouget will train them. It's very exciting to buy a horse, especially the last one as the price was good--we expected to spend much more. I have three, and we might buy some more during the next sales." **Cont. p4**



Berghgracht explained further, "The plan is to have a few well-bred fillies to race, it's new to him, the plan is to create, have mares on the farm, breed, and be a commercial farm, but I'm sure he will keep a few for himself to race."

Gillier has still to get onto deciding what his silks will be, but he will have plenty of assistance on that score. "I've got some time," he said. "I'd like to work on it. I'll ask my wife [Cécilia Bönström], she's a designer, so she's going to do it."

He continued, "It's fun. When look at those horses it's amazing, it's like buying a piece of art. It's so beautiful. It's not far from art--it's the same pressure, the same way of bidding."

Gillier is reminded that horses can get injured. "But art can fall down," he chuckled.

Dabirsim In Demand...

A filly (lot 201) from the second crop of Dabirsim (Fr), consigned by Haras des Capuchines, made the most impact when attracting a final bid of €270,000 by Nicolas de Watrigant's Mandore Intenational Agency. Dam Mi Vida Loca (Ire) (Sakhee) is a full-sister to multiple French listed race winner Shujoon (GB) and she was described as "the filly of the day" by De Watrigant.

"I didn't buy many at the sales, but I liked her," he said. "The stallion looks as if he will be very good, but the main thing is that I liked her as an individual. She has been bought for a new syndicate and hopefully she will be successful for them. I would think she will stay in France."

Dabirsim, who was standing his second season at Gestüt Karlshof for €9,000 when these yearlings were conceived, had four sell during the August Sale for an average price of €123,000.

Roger Varian had hit the headlines when saddling Ajman Princess (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) to win Sunday's Darley G1 Prix Jean Romanet and the Newmarket trainer struck for an early session-leader. Bidding over the telephone via Arqana's Freddy Powell, Varian secured lot 193 for €180,000. The Kodiak (GB) filly, consigned by Haras du Mezeray, is the second foal of Lucrece (GB) (Pivotal {GB}). The dam is a half-sister to top-class sprinter Signs Of Blessing (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and her first foal, by Lawman (Fr), sold for €160,000 at this sale last year.

"She's for an existing client," Varian confirmed. "She was a racy filly and we liked her very much."

Trade was rather slow for the first few during the ring until there was various interest shown in lot 185, a Makfi (GB) colt and the first foal of French listed-placed Kyurem (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}). The broodmare's most notable sibling is Simenon (Ire) (Marju {Ire}), the prolific dual-purpose performer who finished fourth in both the Melbourne Cup and the Gold Cup, while there have been recent updates from Affina (Ire) Kodiak (GB), who has won twice as a 2-year-old for Simon Crisford.

Bloodstock agent Sylvain Vidal picked up the colt, from Haras de la Perelle, for as-yet undisclosed owners and trainer for €115,000. "I know the dam's family quite well," Vidal said. "He was a nice athletic colt who moved very well." **Cont. p5**

Astute Purchase Written In The Stars...

Haras du Mezeray's filly by Dutch Art (**lot 295**) had attracted four separate bidders from across the room at one stage before Australian-based French agent Louis Le Metayer secured her under his Astute Bloodstock banner for €170,000. Dam Astrologie (Fr) (Polish Precedent), third in the GIII Long Island H. herself, has proved herself in the paddocks with her three previous foals headed by Richard Hannon-trained winner Barreesh (Ire) (Giant's Causeway).

Le Metayer explained, "She's by a proven stallion and was one of our picks of the sale. The mare has had a couple of winners and she had a great attitude and a huge girth. She has been bought by a couple of Australian clients and will probably go into training over here for Henri Devin."

Michel Zerolo of Oceanic Bloodstock made a late €260,000 play for an Iffraaj (GB) filly on behalf of American owner Martin Schwartz. **Lot 313** was the first foal of Delhi (GB) (High Chaparral {Ire}), who won a Chantilly conditions race under the banner of Skymarc Farm and consigner Ecurie des Monceaux and is a granddaughter of G1 1000 Guineas S. fourth Capistrano Day (Diesis {GB}).

"She'll be trained by Jean-Claude Rouget--business as usual," said Zerolo. "Iffraaj is a good stallion and I thought she was a nice filly."

Lot 318 also attracted a flurry of bids. Already named Love Rocks (Fr) and consigned by Haras de Grandcamp (Eric Lhermite), the Le Havre (Ire) filly out of Exit The Straight (Ire) (Exit to Nowhere) is a half-sister to this year's G1 Prix Saint-Alary second and G3 Prix de Psyche winner Vue Fantastique (Fr) (Motivator {GB}).

Leonardo Gatto Roissard, who signed the ticket at €255,000 under the name of OBI Agent, revealed only that the filly is "for a friend of mine," but declined to name his client.

Remarking at the close of three solid days of trade, Arqana CEO Eric Hoyeau said, "My wholehearted thanks and that of the entire Arqana team go to all our vendors for producing and entrusting us with such a stellar collection of horses. French breeders have definitely upped their game over the past few years, both by investing in young, quality broodmares and in nominations of a very high standard. The result of those efforts is here for all to be seen and the record average price is a fair reward for having produced the best possible yearlings for the top end of the market."

He continued, "We were thrilled to welcome so many investors from all around the world, a combination of our most loyal supporters and of many new faces from Japan, America, Australia, not forgetting France."

Hughie Morrison has had a terrific run in France this season with his stayers and struck again with the satisfyingly stoic **Marmelo (GB)**, who, along with Big Orange (GB), is doing a great job of advertising the merits of his overlooked sire Duke Of Marmalade (Ire). The 4-year-old added the G2 Prix Kergorlay to his G3 Prix de Barbeville victory back in April and his owner-breeders Edward and Christabel Goodwin of The Fairy Story Partnership and Deepwood Farm Stud now hope to make another cross-Channel raid in October for the Arc. Everyone's favourite curmudgeon, David Elsworth, has twice been narrowly denied group victories in Deaville in the past week. The front-running **Tisbutadream (Ire)** (Dream Ahead) was overhauled at the death by Lady Frankel (GB) (Frankel {GB}) in the G3 Prix Lieurey last Tuesday, while **Desert Skyline (Ire)** (Tamayuz {GB}), the only 3-year-old in the Kergorlay field, ran home well for second having previously finished third behind Stradivarius (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) in the G1 Qatar Goodwood Cup.

Bavaria's Best...

The aforementioned **Lady Frankel** was the first of two stakes winners in France this week for Gestüt Ammerland and will have been the most satisfying as she remains in the stud's green and red silks. The half-sister to dual Classic winner and Ballylinch stallion, Lope De Vega—who had eight yearlings sold at Arqana over the weekend for an average of €190,000—is the fourth stakes winner for her dam Lady Vettori (GB) (Vettori {Ire}). French Group 3 winner Bal De La Rose (Ire) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) and Lord Of The Land (Ire) (Shamardal) complete the quartet, while her daughter Light The Stars (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) is also Group 3-placed in France.

The German stud's Normandy purple patch continued when **Bay Of Poets (Ire)**, a 3-year-old son of Lope De Vega, won the Listed Prix Pelleas for Godolphin and Charlie Appleby at Clairefontaine on Friday. His is another family of which Ammerland owner Dietrich von Boetticher is rightly proud. Bay Of Poets' third dam

Britannia (Ger) (Tarim {GB}) was responsible for the multiple Group 1-winning pair of Borgia (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) and Boreal (Ger) (Java Gold), the latter being the first German horse to win a British Group 1, which he did when beating Storming Home (GB) in the 2002 Coronation Cup. Now 19, Boreal still stands at Ammerland in Bavaria and looked in terrific order when we visited him in January,

as did Lady Vettori, who is 20 and has a yearling full-sister to Lope De Vega to race for her.

Sales Race Incentive For Gansera-Leveque...

Continuing the German theme, hard on the heels of next week's Premier and Silver Sales at Goffs UK comes the BBAG one-day yearling auction on Sept. 1. The German Elvis impersonator at the traditional eve-of-sale party is one of the many good reasons to head to Baden-Baden, but on a more serious note, a series of 17 auction races worth more than €1 million for 2-year-old and 3-year-old graduates of the sale, offers extra incentive. German-born but Newmarket-based trainer Ilka Gansera-Leveque had an eye-catching success with a first-time-out runner in the series back in 2012 when Tosca (Ger) (Amadeus Wolf {GB}) dead-heated with Jean-Claude Rouget's Molly Mara (Ger) (Big Shuffle). The vet-turned-trainer is heading back to Baden-Baden this weekend to make a second raid on the six-furlong contest for fillies with her physically imposing debutante **Folklore (Ger)**, a Lethal Force (Ire) juvenile out of Focal (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) who was bought for €22,000 last year from the Gestut Rottgen draft. **Cont. p8**

Freshman Sires Rampant...

It's turning into a battle royal at the head of the first-season sires' table in Europe with the former Tally-Ho Stud resident **Society Rock (Ire)** now having a numerical and financial advantage at the head of affairs after gaining a major boost through his first Group 1 winner, Unfortunately. It is unfortunate indeed that Society Rock is no longer with us and it's understandable, if a little depressing, that his standout son is already being talked about as a stallion prospect for next year rather than a racing prospect. It's worth remembering, however, that Society Rock didn't do his best work until he was four and older. Unfortunately's runner-up on Sunday, the immensely likeable and hardy Havana Grey will also be on the lists of various stallion masters, but in the meantime is raising the profile of **Havana Gold (Ire)**, who, with 19 individual winners, is just two behind Society Rock and is thus the most successful active freshman sire.

Tweenhills Stud

Havana Grey was bred in partnership by Mickley Stud and Lady Caroline Lonsdale, and the latter has also enjoyed stakes success as an owner this year in France. With former BHB chairman Peter Savill, Lady Lonsdale, under her Lowther Racing banner, owns the Mark Johnston-trained Izzy Bizu (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}), who has been almost as active as Havana Grey this season. In six starts, the 2-year-old filly has won four races, including last month's Listed Prix Six Perfections at Deauville.

On the freshman table, **Dabirsim (Fr)** is flying the flag for France and Haras de Grandcamp with his first German-conceived crop and has maintained a killer strike-rate all season. With 10 winners, he is now operating at 40%.

His Royal Ascot-winning daughter Different League (Fr) laid down a serious challenge to the colts when finishing a close third in the Morny. She heads next to Newmarket for the G1 Cheveley Park S. Dabirsim's yearling half-brother by Frankel was sold for €550,000 by Grandcamp to Richard Knight on Saturday night at Arqana and will race in the colours of Hussain Lootah, who also co-owns Group 3 winner Frankuus (Ire) (Frankel {GB}).

GROUP SUCCESS FOR GALILEO'S SIRE SONS

In Europe everyone has become used to seeing Galileo dominate affairs, but last week was a bit of an exception. Even though he notched up first and second in the G2 Debutante S., thanks to Magical and Happily, and saw his son Order of St George win the G3 Irish St Leger Trial, Galileo was arguably outpointed by his stallion sons.

As many as four of them--**Frankel, Teofilo, New Approach** and **Rip Van Winkle**--enjoyed stakes success last week. We also saw another son, Enable's sire **Nathaniel**, continue his good form, even siring first, second and fourth in a good-class Newbury maiden in which Frankel was responsible for the third. Nathaniel, like Frankel and Teofilo, has enjoyed group success at the Deauville meeting, thanks to God Given in the G3 Prix Minerve nine days ago.

Frankel enjoyed a terrific few days last week, with Eminent, Lady Frankel and Rostropovich all enjoying group success, while Queen Kindly showed she retains her speed by leading throughout to land the Listed Flying Fillies' S. There was nearly a fifth stakes success when the 2-year-old Red Mist failed by only a short head to land the Denford S. There was also a listed placing for Middle East, a filly who thereby became the 20th black-type earner from the 111 foals in Frankel's first crop.

Lady Frankel had reached a more noteworthy landmark when she snatched victory in the G3 Prix de Lieurey, as she became the 11th group winner from that first crop. That's a remarkable 10% group/graded winners, and that total doesn't yet include several of Frankel's highest-rated 3-year-olds, such as Cracksman (Timeform 123+), Mirage Dancer (118p), Dream Castle (118), Count Octave (111p), Atty Persse (109), UAE King (108p) and Mori (107).

Teofilo suffered a sizeable setback when Permian met with a fatal accident at Arlington Park, but the Kildangan stallion bounced back with a fine group-race double. [Cont. p9](#)

Rostropovich | *Racing Post*

Pedigree Insights Cont.

Last year's G1 2000 Guineas runner-up Massaaf did very well to win the G2 Betfred Hungerford S. after an absence of 373 days. If he can build on this bright comeback, he will earn himself a place among the Shadwell stallions--especially when Teofilo's eldest stallion son Havana Gold continues to shine with his first crop. Treasuring became his second group winner when she held on to take the G3 Curragh S. on Sunday and then his G3 Molecomb S. winner Havana Grey finished a creditable second in the G1 Prix Morny. Like Havana Gold, Massaaf is another of Teofilo's more speedily-bred sons, as he is out of a 2-year-old sprint winner by Acclamation.

Teofilo had done even better in the race before the Morny, with his tough 4-year-old daughter Ajman Princess making all to land the G1 Prix Jean Romanet. This filly had the unenviable distinction of being one of the best maidens in training last year, when she was second in her first four starts, on one occasion accounting for the likes of The Black Princess and Queen's Trust when runner-up in the G2 Ribblesdale S. That effort encouraged her connections to pay a substantial amount to supplement her to the G1 Irish Oaks, but she went down in the stalls and finished last of 11. She missed the rest of the season after being found to be lame behind following her Irish venture.

The enforced rest has subsequently proved a blessing in disguise. Her victory at Deauville was her third in six starts this year, another of her wins being a five-length success at listed level at Goodwood. Her record now stands at an enviable 11-3-5-2, with the Irish Oaks being her only unplaced effort. Her fourth dam Dunette fared much better when she tackled Classic company, as she won the G1 Prix de Diane. Dunette was one of the mares who contributed to Sadler's Wells's extraordinary first crop, as their son French Glory enjoyed group success on both sides of the Atlantic, notably taking the G1 Rothmans International.

Ajman Princess was conceived in 2012 and it isn't hard to see why a son of Galileo was chosen for her. Her dam Reem Three, a useful 10-furlong performer is a daughter of the G1 2000 Guineas winner Mark of Esteem. Galileo's nine foals out of Mark of Esteem mares had done extremely well, with three of them becoming group winners.

In fact, these three were all Group 1 performers. Treasure Beach won the 2011 G1 Irish Derby after a narrow defeat in the Epsom version; Kite Wood was a three-quarter-length second in the 2009 St Leger before becoming a Group 2 winner in the Prix Vicomtesse Vigier; and Mikhail Glinka was second in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud, before going on to win the G3 Queen's Vase and the G2 Dubai City of Gold. Galileo had also done well with mares by Mark of Esteem's sire Darshaan, the prime example being Alandi (G1 Irish St Leger and G1 Prix du Cadran).

Mention of races like the St Leger, Queen's Vase and Prix du Cadran highlights that Galileo's partnership with Mark of Esteem and Darshaan was a fairly sure way of producing a stayer. Teofilo, with his Danehill blood, isn't quite as strong an influence for stamina as Galileo, but Ajman Princess stays a mile and a half well, even though her front-running victory at Deauville came over a mile and a quarter.

Frankel's son Eminent, who also made all over Deauville's 10-furlong course to land the Prix Guillaume d'Ornano, is inbred 3 x 3 to Sadler's Wells, whereas Ajman Princess's pedigree features the brothers Sadler's Wells and Fairy King in the third generation. Frankel's group winners also include Cunco, another inbred 3 x 3 to Sadler's Wells (plus 3 x 3 to Danehill) and Last Kingdom, who is inbred 3 x 4 to Sadler's Wells. His useful mile-and-a-half colt The Grand Visir is another inbred 3 x 3 to Sadler's Wells, while the tough Group 3 winner Frankuus has a second dam by Fairy King.

With Nathaniel's exceptional daughter Enable being inbred 3 x 2 to Sadler's Wells, are we seeing the start of a very rewarding new trend? [Cont. p10](#)

Teofilo could be credited with setting this trend when his first-crop son Parish Hall won the G1 Dewhurst S. in 2011. With a dam by Montjeu, Parish Hall is another inbred 3 x 3 to Sadler's Wells. Teofilo's G2-winning daughter Samba Brazil is inbred 3 x 4, while his smart Australian miler Happy Clapper is another with Sadler's Wells's brother Fairy King in the third generation. Galileo's Breeders' Cup Turf winner Red Rocks also has Fairy King in the third generation, as does his Australian Group 2 winner Sertorius.

The other point worth making while on the topic of the Galileo clan is that any breeder lucky enough to own a Kingmambo mare should be heading in that direction. Galileo has four black-type winners among his 24 foals with a dam by Kingmambo and they feature the Derby winner Ruler of The World and the Eclipse winner Ulysses. Teofilo has two group winners out of mares by Kingmambo's son Dubai Destination, while Nathaniel has one. Frankel has the very encouraging record of four winners from four runners out of Kingmambo mares, with the group winners Eminent and Last Kingdom leading the way, and his Group 2-placed daughter Mori has a second dam by Kingmambo.

And don't forget that Sea The Stars, who has reaped such rich rewards as the Group 1 winners Cloth of Stars and Zelzal from Kingmambo mares, is a half-brother to none other than Galileo.

Confirming their decision to target York, Charlie Johnston, son and assistant to Mark said, "Cardsharp was under strong consideration for the G1 Prix Morny last weekend but we have decided to go to York instead."

Cardsharp was third last time to Barraquero in the Goodwood race and the runner up that day **Nebo (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) could also take his chance for trainer Charlie Hills who won the race with Muhaarar (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in 2014. Yorkshire trainer Kevin Ryan has won the race three times and he has left two in the race. **Stormbringer (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) could represent previous winning owner Charles Wentworth who was successful with Caspar Netscher (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}) in 2011 while Ryan's **Savalas (Ire)** (Zebedee {GB}) is also a possible contender. This £100,000 Goffs UK Breeze-Up buy and last time out Thirsk maiden winner is owned by Angie Bailey who is also a previous winning owner of the Gimcrack when her Astaire (Ire) (Intense Focus {Ire}) was successful in 2013.

REDZEL LEADS HOME CLASSY TRIAL

A classy group of gallopers that included four Group 1 winners lined up for a barrier trial over 1050m at Randwick on Monday. The informative heat saw stablemates **Redzel (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus})** and **Russian Revolution (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus})** stretch out nicely in the straight with Redzel holding off fellow Peter & Paul Snowden trained Russian Revolution by half a length, the pair finishing about four lengths ahead of the main group, in which the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott trained **English (Aus) (Encosta De Lago {Aus})** caught the eye. Redzel was last seen in action in the G1 Doomben 10,000 in May when he beat Counterattack (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) by a half-length and he had previously shown how closely matched he is with Russian Revolution when going down by just a head to him in the G1 Galaxy at Rosehill in March. Redzel appears to have improved since then and his trainer is excited about his forthcoming campaign.

"He's working really well and I couldn't be happier with how he is right now. He seems to have come back a stronger, more complete racehorse this preparation," Peter Snowden told *Racing And Sports*. The G2 Shorts at Randwick on Sept. 16 is the aim for Redzel before a tilt at the G1 Moir S. at Moonee Valley on Sept. 29. Snowden would also be keen to run Redzel in The Everest should a slot open up. "The Everest is a lucrative concept and it would be fantastic to be part of the first running of the race," Snowden said. "It would be exciting if we had a runner. He's up there as one of the best sprinters in the country and would deserve a slot in the race."


