

LATE FIREWORKS AT KEENELAND TUESDAY

LEXINGTON, Ky - A pair of million-dollar transactions punctuated the second session of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale, with **Mrs McDougal** (Medaglia d'Oro) (hip 781A), the very last horse through the ring Tuesday evening, creating the day's biggest fireworks when selling for \$1.6 million to bloodstock agent Steve Young. Earlier in the session, M.V. Magnier of Coolmore purchased a short yearling by Triple Crown winner American Pharoah for \$1 million.

During the two-day Book 1 section of the January sale, Keeneland sold 415 horses for \$28,302,000. The average rose by 21.39% to \$68,198 and the median increased 23.33% to \$37,000. With 199 horses reported not sold, the buy-back rate was 32.41%.

Last year's Book 1 saw 384 horses sell for \$21,573,600 for an average of \$56,181 and a median of \$30,000. Seventeen horses sold for \$200,000 or more during the book, with Siren Serenade (Unbridled's Song) bringing top price of \$1,025,000.

Twenty eight horses have sold for \$200,000 or more during the 2018 auction.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS: MASK

The New Year may be little more than a week old, but the Kentucky Derby hype machine is already cranking into action, thanks to 'TDN Rising Star' **Mask's** highly impressive romp in the **Mucho Macho Man S**. Incidentally, the race is named after a Breeders' Cup Classic winner who finished third in the Derby when still more than five weeks short of his actual third birthday.

Mask doesn't face problems of that sort, as he was born Feb. 2, and his maturity was there for everyone to see as he controlled his Gulfstream Park opponents virtually from the start three days ago. Despite being the least experienced in the seven-horse field, he was soon traveling smoothly on the lead and his rivals began to struggle rounding the far turn. However, the most encouraging part of Mask's effort was still to come. As soon as they straightened up, the son of Tapit cruised away to score by more than six lengths, chased home by a pair of black-type winners. **Cont. p13**

“It was a very strong session, which I think shows the continuation of what started in September,” said Keeneland’s Director of Sales Operations Geoffrey Russell. “There is great enthusiasm in the market. There is great desire to own horses at the moment be they broodmare prospects like Mrs McDougal--so we thank Mrs. [Ty] Sheumann and Eaton Sales for her--and of course the American Pharoah foal who speaks for himself and we thank Mr. Imbert for entrusting us with him to sell today. Selling two million-dollar horses in January shows the strength of the market at the moment.”

Reiley McDonald’s Eaton Sales, which consigned Mrs McDougal, was Tuesday’s leading consignor by average.

“The weanlings are selling through the roof,” McDonald said. “The mare market may be a bit spotty, but the quality is so divergent here that you don’t know if you are going to sell a

\$200,000 horse or a \$2,000 horse. It is hard to tell if it is the market so much, or just the quality.”

Consigned by Paramount Sales, the seven-figure yearling

(hip 533) was American Pharoah’s second million-dollar sale and was the third-highest price for a yearling in January sale history.

“American Pharoah is special,” Russell said. “He’s had a buzz about him from the minute he started racing as a 2-year-old to when he capped off his Grand Slam in the Breeders’ Cup here at Keeneland. And this first crop of weanlings, now short yearlings, demonstrated what the market feels about them. Of course, they are out of the greatest book of mares that a stallion has ever

seen. So that doesn’t hurt. But obviously, they have the physicals to match and they have sold very, very well.”

The Keeneland January Sale continues through Thursday with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m.



Keeneland Saves Best for Last

Mrs McDougal (Medaglia d'Oro) (hip 781A) gave the Keeneland January sale its second seven-figure transaction of the day when bringing a final bid of \$1.6 million from bloodstock agent Steve Young, bidding on behalf of an undisclosed client. The 6-year-old broodmare prospect, consigned by Reiley McDonald's Eaton Sales on behalf of Ty Scheumann, was the final lot through the ring during Tuesday's second session of the four-day sale.

"She is a terrific filly who, earlier in her career, was arguably the best 3-year-old filly in America on the grass when she won at Saratoga," said Young.

Mrs McDougal won the 2015 GII Lake George S., as well as the 2016 GIII Noble Damsel S. and was third in the 2016 GI Just a Game S.

Tuesday's transaction was the second time Young had been involved in the sale of the mare, who is out of stakes winner and multiple graded stakes-placed Distorted Passion (Distorted Humor). She was purchased privately by Sheumann a year ago and made four starts this past summer and fall in California with trainer Richard Mandella.

"Reiley McDonald asked me about buying a filly for these people, so I bought her privately for them a year ago," Young explained. "She trained tremendously on the dirt for Mandella after he got her and I think she has unlimited potential as a broodmare. She looks great, she's by Medaglia, she crosses with a lot of good horses. I think she's got a heck of a chance."

Of Mrs McDougal's final price tag, Young added, "It's January, but she's a terrific mare in any sale. She is owned by people, from what I understand, who didn't decide to sell her until later and that's how she ended up here. She could have been in the [Fasig-Tipton] Night of the Stars or Keeneland November just as easily. She wasn't cheap. She was where she probably needed to be." **Cont. p6**

Bred by Aaron and Marie Jones, Mrs McDougal was a \$450,000 Keeneland September Yearling purchase in 2013. On the board in eight of 15 starts, she retires with five wins and earnings of \$496,736.

The seven-figure mare was Young’s second session topper in as many days at the January sale. He signed the ticket at \$485,000 for racing prospect Bellavais (Tapit) on behalf of another client to top Monday’s session of the auction. --@JessMartiniTDN

Cool Million for American Pharoah Colt

American Pharoah was represented by the second seven-figure transaction of his young stud career when Coolmore’s M.V. Magnier went to \$1 million to secure a short yearling from the Paramount Sales consignment during Tuesday’s second session of the Keeneland January sale. The striking gray colt (hip 533), out of Mekko Hokte (Holy Bull), is a half-brother to Caravaggio (Scat Daddy), who carried the Coolmore colors to victory in the 2016 G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. and 2017 G1 Commonwealth Cup.

“American Pharoah doesn’t need any explaining and Aidan O’Brien always believed Caravaggio to be the best sprinter he ever trained, so when our team considered this colt the best individual in the sale, it was an easy decision for us to make,” Magnier, who is attending the Magic Millions sale in Australia, said in a statement. “We’re incredibly lucky to have two great partners in Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith who are fully committed to finding the next Caravaggio. We’ll leave it until later in the year before we discuss where this colt will be trained.”

Paramount Sales also sold Caravaggio’s full-sister for \$550,000 to Flaxman Stables at last year’s Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

“He is a beautiful colt--there is not a better pedigree in the book,” Paramount’s Gabriel Duignan said of the million-dollar yearling. “We all know who Caravaggio is and we all know who [the yearling’s] dad is. There was good spirited bidding for him.”

Bloodstock agent David Ingordo was underbidder on the colt and offered his congratulations to Duignan in the back walking ring.

“That was the best colt I saw come through,” Ingordo said.

Paramount was selling the yearling on behalf of his breeders, Rick Imbert’s Windmill Manor Farms and Petaluma Bloodstock.

“I bred the horse with my in-laws and we are very happy,” said Imbert’s son-in-law Charlie O’Connor. “The poor mare died a few months ago, so this is a bit of a happy ending for her. We are thrilled with the price, but even more so about where he is going, to Ballydoyle hopefully. We hope he will be very lucky for them.”

American Pharoah, who retired to Coolmore in 2016, has been an instant success in the sales ring. Eleven of his first-crop weanlings sold in 2017 for an average of \$441,363, including a \$1-million filly who was purchased by Narvick International at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale. A colt by the Triple Crown winner topped Monday’s first session of the January sale when bringing a final bid of \$400,000 from Alex and JoAnn Lieblong.

The young stallion’s success last fall prompted the decision to offer Tuesday’s seven-figure yearling in the auction.

“We put him in [January] because of how well [the American Pharoah foals] sold in November,” O’Connor confirmed.

Duignan thinks American Pharoah has passed on his famous laid back personality to his offspring.

“I have seen a lot of them and they are a stellar bunch,” Duignan said. “They are very athletic, big strong horses, a lot like their dad. And they have great temperaments--that’s probably the most outstanding thing about them. That colt walked up there and never turned a hair. They all seem to be that way and are very athletic.” --@JessMartiniTDN

Lynch Wins Out on Banree

He continued, “Physically, she was one of the best mares here. She has a great hind end, great walk, great disposition.”

Raced by **Mark Dodson** and trainer Wesley Ward, Banree retired last year with a record of 13-2-2-1 and earnings of \$164,610. The \$80,000 KESEEP yearling finished second in the 2015 GIII Schuylerville S. and was third in that term’s GIII Tempted S.

“I think we were so fortunate to have, what I thought, were the two prettiest, best conformed mares in the sale,” said Reiley McDonald, whose Eaton Sales consigned Banree as **hip 730** as well as the sale and session-topping Mrs McDougal. “Banree was one of them and Mrs McDougal was the other. She is 16.2 plus [hands], a big strapping mare, who had a lot of speed on the track. She will be a really good commercial mare because she will throw great foals.” --@CDeBernardisTDN

Spring Eclipse Headed to ‘Pharoah’

Tim Hyde Sr. stretched to \$425,000 to take home the Unbridled’s Song mare **Spring Eclipse** Tuesday with the intention of mating her to Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, who was represented by a \$1-million colt earlier in the session.

“I bought her to breed to American Pharoah,” said Hyde, who signed the ticked as Green Leaf Farm. “She’s lovely and by Unbridled’s Song. I liked the mare and I liked the page. I’m glad to have her.” **Cont. p8**

A colt by War Front proved quite popular late in Tuesday's session and Chris Baccari fended off his competitors to take the bay home for \$390,000. He plans to re-offer the yearling at Keeneland this September.

"He has a very quick look about him," Baccari said. "He looks like more of an American War Front to me. I like the pedigree. He looks like a very straightforward horse. I have been trying to buy War Fronts for a while and I was finally able to get this one. War Fronts are hard to buy, so I was lucky that I was able to get him."

Bred by Frank Hutchinson, Hip 763 is the second foal out of Circle the Empire (Empire Maker), who sold for \$350,000 at the recent Keeneland November sale carrying a foal by Declaration of War. Circle the Empire is a half-sister to the MSP dam of European highweight and MG1SW Air Force Blue (War Front). This is also the family of SW Surfside Tara (Scat Daddy) and MSW and GSP Miss Double d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro).

Hip 763 was consigned by Eaton Sales, who was also responsible for \$1.6-million session topper Mrs McDougal (Medaglia d'Oro) and the \$450,000 mare Banree (Macho Uno).

Confirming the filly was purchased as a pinhook prospect, Duignan laughed, "I hope you're interviewing me when we sell her."

Lane's End consigned the yearling on behalf of breeder

The yearling is Summer Applause's third foal. Her first foal is 3-year-old Ipanema Beach (Candy Ride {Arg}), who was runner-up on debut at Keeneland in October before a fifth-place effort in the Nov. 25 Gil

Golden Rod S. at Churchill Downs. The mare also has an unraced 2-year-old filly by Tiznow. She was bred to Uncle Mo last year, but aborted the foal. --@JessMartiniTDN

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

The victory must have delighted the Gainesway team, as they not only stand Mask's sire Tapit, but also bred the colt from Hidden Expression, a mare bought by Gainesway for \$360,000 in February 2014--just weeks before the mare's visit to Tapit.

Gainesway also consigned Mask to the yearling sales, where he drew a bid of \$685,000 from Lane's End. Interestingly, Hidden Expression hasn't been returned to Tapit. She visited Empire Maker in 2016 and then went to Tapit's GII-winning son Anchor Down in his first season at Gainesway in 2017.

Six hundred and eighty-five thousand dollars may sound like an enviable amount, but Mask's price was less than \$40,000 higher than the average price for a yearling colt by Tapit in 2016, when five of Tapit's youngsters achieved prices between \$1.1 million and \$2 million. They were sired at a fee of \$150,000.

For the record, these five were headed by the \$2-million Marconi. This half-brother to Mucho Macho Man earned 'TDN Rising Star' status when he won over a mile and an eighth at Aqueduct in December. Next most expensive was a \$1.4-million Quiet Giant filly which is still unnamed, but the \$1.25-million colt out of Rote has been named Phoenix Fire (a May 14 foal, he has yet to race). Also yet to race is Temperit, the \$1.1-million filly out of Quiet Temper, while Line of Departure, the \$1.2-million colt out of Hooh Why, has raced only once so far.

It is worth adding that Mask and Marconi are just two of five **TDN Rising Stars** from Tapit's 2015 crop. The others are Stonestreet's homebred filly **Dream Pauline**, who burst onto the scene with a six-length debut win at Aqueduct in December; the \$750,000 **New York Central**, a seven-length winner at Churchill Downs in late-November; and the \$600,000 **Principe Guilherme**, who was another clear-cut Churchill Downs winner in the first of his two starts. The chances are that Tapit's name is going to be very prominent once again in the run-up to the main events in May and June.

The limiting factor on Mask's price as a yearling was arguably the fact that his dam's pedigree--though solid enough--could hardly have been described as highly fashionable. Mask's first three dams, Hidden Expression, The Hess Express and Turcomedy, are daughters of Yonaguska, Lord Carson and Turkoman, none of whom could be described as a roaring success as a stallion.

Yonaguska's base changed from Kentucky to Louisiana and then to Turkey, but he did better than that might suggest. He enjoyed GII success with Musket Man (Illinois Derby over a mile and an eighth), Coffee Boy (Carry Back S. over six furlongs) and Yawanna Twist (General George H. over seven furlongs). His other Graded winners included Cherokee Country (Fall Highweight H. over six furlongs) and you won't find any mile-and-a-quarter winners among his better progeny. Hidden Expression gained both her victories as a juvenile, notably taking the Colleen S. over 5 1/2 furlongs at Monmouth.

This is hardly surprising in view of Yonaguska's own record and pedigree. A son of the champion sprinter Cherokee Run, Yonaguska had been a fast and precocious 2-year-old whose juvenile efforts peaked when he dead-heated with City Zip in the GI Hopeful S. over seven furlongs. Although he finished a creditable third in the GI Champagne S. over 1 1/16 miles, his connections accepted that he was a sprinter and reaped their rewards when a 3-year-old Yonaguska won the GII Hutcheson S. over seven furlongs, as well as two GIIs over six, including the Fall Highweight H. **Cont. p15**

Lord Carson, sire of Mask's second dam, was another sprinter. This son of the quick-maturing Carson City gained all 12 of his wins over sprint distances, with his best success coming in the GII Boojum H. over six furlongs as a 4-year-old. However, there was quite a lot of stamina in the bottom half of Lord Carson's pedigree. For example, his second dam was by Beddard, an Irish colt who ran away with the Queen's Vase over two miles as a 3-year-old at Royal Ascot in 1965.

Lord Carson's best winner was Windsor Castle, winner of the GII Remsen S. over a mile and an eighth as a 2-year-old. His daughter The Hess Express won on dirt and turf and was stakes placed over six furlongs at two and a mile at three. With a dam by the champion mile-and-a-quarter performer Turkoman, The Hess Express was able to shine as a dam of stakes winners at around a mile and an eighth. Bullsbay, her colt by Tiznow, won the GI Whitney H. and Our Khrysty, her filly by the Storm Cat horse Newfoundland, took the GIII Turnback The Alarm H.

So where will Mask slot in on the distance scale? A mile and an eighth appears unlikely to trouble him, but the presence of Yonaguska and Lord Carson close up in his pedigree means that I would want to see more of Mask (who has four lines of Mr. Prospector) before accepting him as a potential Kentucky Derby

winner. His cause may well be helped by Tapit's record of having supplied three of the last four winners of the Belmont S.

Trainer Graham Motion has joined the Water Hay Oats Alliance (WHOA) in support of the group's efforts towards passage of The Horseracing Integrity Act. The GI Kentucky Derby and G1 Dubai World Cup-winning trainer is among 65 top trainers from around the world on WHOA's roster.

Motion issued the following statement Tuesday:

From what I have seen WHOA is the only group that is making a serious effort to form a national governing body with uniform rules and penalties covering all 38 racing jurisdictions and in sync with international rules of racing (IFHA) bringing transparency and integrity to US racing.

I have held off joining WHOA up until now, but frustration with the lack of a governing body continues to become more apparent as shown by the problems that several horsemen including myself have experienced in the last few years.



GOLD COAST, Australia--At the midway juncture of the racing season in Australia, one stallion has pulled well out in front in the race for champion first-season sire honours: Eureka Stud's **Spirit of Boom (Aus)** (Sequalo {Aus}). The dual Group 1-winning sprinter has notched seven winners, three stakes winners and earnings of A\$508,560. His next closest pursuers, Darley's Epaulette (Aus) and Dawn Approach (Aus), have two winners apiece.

Spirit of Boom's success is woven closely into the fabric of the McAlpine family's Eureka Stud in Queensland, which has been in the family since the 1940s. The McAlpines bought Spirit of Boom's third dam and bred and raced his second dam and his dam.

The McAlpines and Spirit of Boom are also closely integrated with the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. Indeed, the sire himself was a A\$90,000 graduate of this sale and Eureka last year sold his second stakes winner Ef Troop (Aus)--the second-favourite for Saturday's Magic Millions 2YO Classic--for A\$70,000 and his stakes-winning filly Outback Barbie (Aus), who also runs Saturday, for A\$210,000. Eureka bred both horses and offers siblings to both this week.

Of the success Spirit of Boom has so far enjoyed, the farm's current frontman Scott McAlpine said, "It's a long process, and in this industry in Australia it's hard to buy colts that are performers, for a little farm such as ourselves in competition with the big boys. We sold Spirit of Boom for A\$90,000 at the Magic Millions and I retained 15% with the intention that if he was good enough as a racehorse and could stay a colt there was a possibility that it might fall into place to become a stallion. So far the plan has come to fruition."

Spirit of Boom was an early 2-year-old himself, winning a trial for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic. He beat just two home in the main event but rebounded in the autumn with a pair of wins and a second in Group 2 company. He stayed in training until the age of six, and remarkably in his final season rewarded McAlpine with the top-level performances he needed to stand at Eureka. Spirit of Boom won the G1 William Reid S. over 1200 metres at Moonee Valley before taking Queensland's most important sprint, the G1 Doomben 10,000. [Cont. p2](#)

McAlpine said he syndicated the horse with 40 shareholders--many small Queensland breeders--to give Spirit of Boom the chance he needed to start his stud career.

“When he won the 10,000 and the William Reid, the big breeders probably didn’t take a lot of notice of him,” he said. “His pedigree is strong enough against his performance, but his performance is what stood out. The group of shareholders are a great team of people. We’re all battlers, all trying to make a dollar and hopefully now we’re going to make a couple dollars.”

Spirit of Boom covered in the ballpark of 150 mares in his first three years at stud, and was helped by a 90% fertility rate.

McAlpine said it was apparent early on that the horse was stamping his foals.

“His foals were very much like himself, he’d very much stamped them into a mold himself,” he said. “I thought that was a great attribute to have because he was a fast, sprinting horse himself and he put his backside and shoulders on to them and gave them his intelligence.”

Rather than resting on their laurels, however, the team at Eureka set out to get the Spirit of Booms in front of buyers and trainers across the country.

“Australia is a big country, so we set out to try to market those horses across the country,” McAlpine said. “We ended up taking four to South Australia, two to Victoria, four to New South Wales and I took two to New Zealand. The rest then stayed in Queensland to be sold.”

That Queensland haul included the aforementioned Ef Troop and Outback Barbie, as well as horses sold for A\$110,000, A\$150,000 and A\$210,000. One of the colts sold in New Zealand has also shown promise and was unlucky to be beaten first-out.

“One of the two that I took to New Zealand came out and won a trial by 10 lengths,” McAlpine said. “New Zealand starts racing before Australia and he went in the first 2-year-old race in New Zealand. There were only three horses in it. He was drawn the outside barrier and the horse that was inside, they jumped together and went head-to-head the whole way and he got beaten by a nostril.” **Cont. p3**

“I think trainers realized these horses had some ability and the trials that followed in Australia showed us that,” he added. “Then when the first races started to come along we were in the money straight away. They were winning trials, everything was going right, and they’re sound sensible horses and they’ve shown they can go on to do it. The horses that are running are performing across the board, and when this wave finishes the next wave will start. There are a lot of horses in work that will be ready to race from next week on, waiting for these Magic Millions horses to go out for spells and have a break.”

McAlpine acknowledged that winning a Magic Millions with a horse he bred and sold, by a stallion that is a fourth-generation homebred, would be special.

“We produced a Magic Millions winner in Sea Captain back in 1988 when there was a fillies’ and a colts’ race, so we know what the feeling is to win a Magic Millions when we own one,” he said. “This time we’re going to have to breed the winner. And maybe we might even get a placegetter on top of that.”

Spirit of Boom will also be represented on Saturday by the stakes-winning Jonker (Aus).

“To have three runners in that race is probably a feat for any stallion, especially when it comes from a Queensland-bred horse getting Queensland mares,” McAlpine said. “He’s not getting the top line of mares. For that horse to produce racehorses that can get into that race and perform I think is a big attribute. You can’t believe a horse would get a start like this and it will continue whether he wins the Magic Millions or not. There are horses out there ready to run in Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide in the next month to six weeks and if we’re lucky enough to win a few races there, everyone will take even more notice.”

Eureka Stud has 15 to sell this week, five in Book 1 and 10 in Book 2 on Sunday. Those include a Pierro (Aus) half-sister to Outback Barbie (Aus) (lot 203), and a Spirit of Boom half-brother to the stakes-winning Tiyatrolani (Aus) (Captain Sonador {Aus}) (lot 392). Of that colt McAlpine said, “We have a nice Spirit of Boom colt out of an Encosta de Lago mare that won us three races and ran third in the Magic Millions Prelude the same year Spirit of Boom won. That mare’s first foal is already a stakes winner and the second foal by Spirit of Boom is already placed. This is the third one.”

Eureka sells seven Spirit of Booms, also including a half-brother to Group 1 winner Southern Lord (Aus) (Stratum {Aus}) (lot 497). **Cont. p4**

“He is out of a Rory’s Jester mare that has already produced a Group 1 winner in Southern Lord,” McAlpine said. “She has a 2-year-old in work with David Hayes who is a full-sister to this horse. He’s a lovely colt—nice, balanced and sensible.”

Sunday’s haul includes “a couple really nice fillies” as well as the full-brother to Ef Troop (lot 977). McAlpine said of Eureka’s Book 2 horses, “The pedigrees aren’t over the moon but they’re good, racing pedigrees and winning families with a bit of black-type.”

McAlpine is deservedly enjoying the accolades coming Eureka’s way with the success of Spirit of Boom.

“We’ve done it all our lives, I’m a third generation horseman and we’re a family farm that’s been operating since the late 1940s,” he said. “For a family farm to stay competitive in this very intense breeding world is very rewarding. My wife and myself have three sons and we’ve all gone the same way; once it’s in your blood you can’t get it out.”

FACT: SPEED AWARENESS

by John Boyce

Much is written about how sires add stamina or speed to the mares they are bred to. Anecdotal evidence is pervasive in the thoroughbred breeding industry. Many breeders will often base decisions on outcomes they themselves have observed. And who could blame them? But there is really good data available about the aptitude of sires’ offspring.

In the published table we have some of the best speed sires of Britain and Ireland in recent years. They all have a stamina index of less than eight furlongs for their progeny aged three and over. Moreover, they are all sires whose mares have tended to produce runners that stay further. So, not only are they producing fast horses, they are demonstrably speed influences.

That said, there are a few names present that may raise an eyebrow. **Oasis Dream (GB)**, for one, produced some very smart middle-distance performers early in his career and was given plenty of further opportunities with staying mares, hence the nine-furlong stamina index of his offspring’s siblings. Yet, his own stamina index is all of 1.3 furlongs shorter. Who knows, had he been bred to a greater number of faster mares, might we have had a few more Muhaarar (GB)s?

Pivotal (GB) is another good example in that two of his very best runners, Farhh (GB) and African Story (GB), stayed 10 furlongs. Yet our data shows that he knocks a furlong off the stamina index of his runners’ siblings. What is also interesting is that Pivotal behaved the same way early on in his career when he covered faster mares.

For his first four crops, his stamina index was 7.4 compared to the 8.3 of his mares’ other runners. From his fifth crop onwards, his numbers are 8.0 and 9.0. There is no doubt taken in its entirety, the evidence shows that both these sires are speed influences, even though with certain mares they may produce horses that stay. Next time we’ll look at the stamina influences.

PIERRO PINHOOKER BRINGS STRONG DRAFT

GOLD COAST, Australia--David Kobritz, a property investor and developer based in Victoria, has been a longtime successful racehorse owner, having plundered Australia's two most prestigious prizes, the G1 Melbourne Cup and the G1 Golden Slipper, in the early 90s, but Kobritz admits it is the pinhooking of 2-year-old Triple Crown winner **Pierro (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}) at Magic Millions that really put his Musk Creek Farm on the map. Pierro was an early marker of success in Kobritz's selling plan to supplement his annual draft of homebreds with a few pinhooks, and this week Musk Creek brings a draft of 14 to the Gold Coast: nine homebreds and five pinhooks.

"We do pinhooking to supplement the draft, particularly by stallions that we think may be popular that we didn't visit that particular year," Kobritz said. "We started pinhooking when we first bought the farm. That first year we had 70% fillies so we decided we'd better buy a few colts to even out the gender."

Kobritz picked up Pierro for A\$115,000 out of a Darley cull at the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale in 2010, and seven months later pinhooked him for A\$230,000 to Gai Waterhouse. The dark bay colt would go on to sweep the Sydney 2-year-old Triple Crown of the Group 1 Golden Slipper, Sires' Produce and Champagne S., and trained on at three to win the G1 Canterbury S. and G1 George Ryder S. He is now shaping into a successful young sire, with his first crop three, for Coolmore.

“He was a great-looking weanling and grew up to be a cracking-looking colt,” Kobritz recalled. “On pedigree and looks he looked more like a 3-year-old miler than a 2-year-old Golden Slipper horse, but Gai Waterhouse bought him and that turned him into a 2-year-old, and the rest is history. That put the farm on the map very quickly.”

Based on the Mornington Peninsula in Flinders, Victoria, Musk Creek is a full-service farm that offers clients a range of services from agistment, foaling, sales prep and racehorse layup.

“It’s a beautiful part of the world,” Kobritz said. “We have the ocean on one side and the bay on the other, and it’s quite hilly country so it’s great for raising young horses. We sit on 135 acres and have 30 mares. Our business plan is breeding as good of horses as we can and putting them to the market for sale. We improve our broodmare band year in and year out and try to buy three or four nice mares a year and perhaps sell three or four at the bottom end. Definitely the business plan is to breed nice horses and sell, and periodically we’ll keep a share here or there. We don’t mind racing as well.”

It was in fact early success as an owner that hooked Kobritz into the game. Five years after finishing university, Kobritz was contacted by a friend who was putting together a racehorse syndicate for 10 university friends. The horse went on to win nine city races including a Group 3 and a listed race.

“We were hooked,” Kobritz said, adding that his friendship with trainer Lee Freedman led him to campaigning Subzero (Aus), winner of the 1992 Melbourne Cup, and Danzero (Aus), winner of the 1994 Golden Slipper. When Danzero began to enjoy success as a sire, Kobritz said he decided to buy a few mares and use the shares he had retained in the stallion.

“Once it’s in the system, it’s there for good,” Kobritz said of his ever-evolving racing interests. “It’s only cured by death.”

It is likely the best of this year’s Musk Creek draft will be its last, an I Am Invincible (Aus) filly set to go through Saturday evening as lot 820. The homebred is the first foal out of listed-winning If I Can I Can (NZ) (Iffraaj {GB}).

“We have a very even draft,” Kobritz said. “The standout filly is lot 820, the I Am Invincible filly. She’s a very neat, compact filly and the first foal out of a stakes-winning mare and has been very popular.”

Kobritz also pointed to lot 43, a Sebring (Aus) colt out of a strong Australian family, lot 389, a Street Boss colt bought for A\$110,000 as a weanling, lot 425, a daughter of hot sire Not A Single Doubt (Aus), and lot 574, a son of More Than Ready, as standouts.

Kobritz said when it comes to pinhooking, he likes to spend between A\$80,000 and A\$120,000 on foals, but he is not afraid to go higher for a horse he loves. That was the case with lot 576, a son of first-crop sire Deep Field (Aus) bought for A\$240,000.

“He’s a cracking colt, out of a five-time winning Exceed and Excel mare and we thought he was an absolute standout as a weanling,” he said. “He’s gone on as a yearling. We don’t mind stretching the budget a bit if we can find the right type and hopefully they grow into a nice horse.”

“We had a nice [Deep Field] on the farm that was a homebred and we thought they’d be popular, and this horse was a standout as a weanling,” he added. “As I said we stretched the budget but we hope we’ll make our money on him. Last year we sold a colt by Dundee for A\$500,000 and we paid A\$220,000 for him as a weanling. He was such a standout weanling and most of the time the standout weanlings will grow out into standout yearlings. We’ve been fortunate that way but we just supplement the draft with stallions we think will be popular.”

Another Kobritz expects to be popular is Deep Field’s Newgate Farm barnmate and fellow first-season sire Dissident (Aus). Musk Creek will offer lot 64, a colt bought for A\$160,000 as a foal, and lot 562, a homebred.

“Dissident was a strong, tough horse and his foals we had at the farm early days were very much stamped by him and also strong-looking foals, so we’ve gone back to him each year.”

We bought one as a weanling as well, we have one here, one selling in Melbourne and another for Easter in Sydney.”

Another first-crop sire among the Musk Creek pinhooks is Rubick (Aus), sire of a colt bought for A\$110,000.

“The Rubick looks like a very early runner,” Kobritz said. “Physically he looks like he’ll be an early 2-year-old.”

With the start of the sale beckoning, Kobritz said, “We run a relatively small operation but the aim of the game is to have quality horses that can grow into quality yearlings that we can bring to the main sales, and that hopefully continue winning on the track.”

**CHARGES ISSUED AGAINST EIGHT IN
AQUANITA RACING INQUIRY**

Racing Victoria charged eight licenced persons for alleged raceday treatment going back to 2010, among them trainer Robert Smerdon, *Racnet.com.au* reported on Tuesday. Stewards have leveled over 250 charges spread across the eight licenced personnel, with Smerdon charged with 115 regarding the alleged administration of alkalisng agents to horses over a seven-year period. The inquiry started regarding the alleged raceday treatment of the Smerdon-trianed Lovani (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) at Flemington in October last year and grew to include other Aquanita Racing trainers and their stable employees.

Charged with being “a party to the administration of alkalisng agents and/or medications to a horse or horses on a race day” between June 2010 and October 2017, Smerdon is joined by trainers Stuart Webb (three charges), Tony Vasil (7), Liam Birchley (3) and Trent Pennuto (4).The trainers, along with employees Greg (123) and Denise Nelligan and Daniel Garland will also face charges relating to the ongoing inquiry. Stewards charged the trainers with breaching rule AR 175(a) which states, “any person who, in their opinion, has been guilty of any dishonest, corrupt or fraudulent, improper or dishonourable action or practice in connection with racing” as well as being party to the administration of alkalisng agents over various periods. **Cont. p10**

Charges Issued Against Eight Cont.

Among the additional charges facing Greg Nelligan, are: having “a syringe, needle, nasogastric tube or other instrument that could be used” in his possession in a vehicle used to transport a horse to a race meeting after catching him with a “modified syringe” at Flemington last October; and attempting to administer/administering sodium bicarbonate to Lovani 2 1/2 hours prior to her race at Flemington.

All of the cases will be heard by the Racing Appeals and Disciplinary Board at a later date.

KITASAN BLACK REPEATS AS JAPANESE HORSE OF THE YEAR by Alan Carasso

Kitsan Black (Jpn) (Black Tide {Jpn}) earned 287 of a possible 290 votes and was named Japanese Horse of the Year for the second straight season, it was announced Tuesday. He becomes just the seventh two-time winner of the island nation’s top accolade, joining the likes of Deep Impact (Jpn) (2005-2006) and Vodka (Jpn) (2008-2009).

The 2016 G1 Japan Cup winner, Kitsan Black employed off-pace tactics en route to winning the upgraded G1 Osaka Hai (2000mT, [video](#)), then successfully defended his title in the G1 Tenno Sho (Spring) (3200mT, [video](#)) at Kyoto in track-record time four weeks later. Victorious in a heavy-turf renewal of the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) (2000mT, [video](#)) when racing first-up for four months in late October, the bay was a gallant third when in search of back-to-back wins in the Japan Cup and signed off with a wildly popular score in the G1 Arima Kinen (2500mT, [video](#)) Dec. 24. **Cont. p11**

Kitasan Black Repeats Cont.

Bred by Yanagawa Bokujo, Kitsan Black raced in the colors of the Ono Shoji and concluded his career with 12 wins from 20 starts and earnings approaching ¥1.9 billion (about US\$16.6 million).

Vivlos (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) was on the board in just one of her three starts in Japan in 2017, but her lone victory of the season in the G1 Dubai Turf ([video](#)) in March was good enough to land her championship honours as best older mare in Japan. The bay filly, a daughter of Halwa Sweet (Jpn) (Machiavellian), is a half-sister to Cheval Grand (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}), who defeated the Horse of the Year elect in the Japan Cup.

Rey de Oro (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) ran on to split the top two in the Tokyo feature, and that performance on top of his brilliant victory in the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) (2400mT) ([video](#)) in May, secured him the champion 3-year-old male award. He also added a defeat of subsequent G1 Kikuka Sho hero Kiseki (Jpn) (Rulership {Jpn}) in the G2 Kobe Shimbun Hai (2400mT) in September.

One week prior to Rey de Oro's victory in the Derby, **Soul Stirring (Jpn)** (Frankel {GB}) took out the G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) (2400mT) ([video](#)) and was rewarded for that effort by being named best 3-year-old filly. She became her successful sire's first champion when landing 2-year-old filly honours in 2016.

Danon Premium (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) gave his sire a second 2017 champion and 27th overall with a perfect three-from-three campaign that ended with a smooth success in the G1 Asahi Hai Futurity Dec. 17 ([video](#)). Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}), the 2011 Japanese Horse of the Year, was represented by his first crop of runners in 2017 and his daughter **Lucky Lilac (Jpn)**, out of US Grade I winner Lilacs and Lace (Flower Alley), gave the stallion his first champion by virtue of her season-ending win in the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies ([video](#)).

With a barnstorming defence of his title in the G1 Sprinters' S. ([video](#)), **Red Falx (Jpn)** (Swept Overboard) took home the award for Japan's top sprinter/miler, while **Gold Dream (Jpn)** (Gold Allure {Jpn}) annexed the G1 February S. and G1 Champions Cup ([video](#)) en route to being named champion dirt horse.
