

'JACK' BE NIMBLE IN SPLASHY SOUTHWEST SCORE

Last time out, making his first start on dirt since his debut, Don't Tell My Wife Stables and Monomoy Stables LLC's My Boy Jack broke well from the rail, but didn't do much right after that, wasting energy pulling against his rider before ending up an even, well-beaten third in the GIII Sham S. Monday at Oaklawn Park, My Boy Jack broke well from the rail again, but this time, did everything right after that, and the result was a powerful victory in the muddy-track, \$500,000 GIII Southwest S. to put himself squarely on the road to the GI Kentucky Derby.

Made the fourth choice at 8-1 behind heavily-favored 'TDN Rising Star' and local Smarty Jones S. hero Mourinho (Super Saver), the dark bay hugged the fence around the clubhouse turn while running third-last as the chalk was pressured up top through splits of :23.46 and :47.70. Galloping along smoothly down the backside with Kent Desormeaux sitting chilly, My Boy Jack continued to stay inside while advancing on the far bend and moved into contention past the quarter pole. Bursting through a rail opening soon after kicking for home as Mourinho began to sputter, he quickly took charge and poured it on in the final furlong to score by 4 1/2 lengths over Combatant (Scat Daddy), who took the long way around on the final turn.

WITH JUSTIFY, GLENNWOOD HAS ANOTHER DAZZLING PROSPECT *by Bill Finley*

The father-daughter team of John and Tanya Gunther, who operate Glennwood Farm, only own about 20 mares. Anyone can get lucky with those kind of numbers and produce an occasional good horse. But this many good horses?

Glennwood's hot streak continued Sunday at Santa Anita when **Justify** (Scat Daddy) broke his maiden in his debut by 9 1/2 lengths while earning a Beyer figure of 104 and '**TDN Rising Stardom**.' Trainer Bob Baffert was so impressed that he said afterwards he will point the colt to the GI Kentucky Derby, even though the race is less than 11 weeks away.

"It's not too late," said Baffert Sunday. "I've got a plan. We're looking for a graded stakes race. He's shown his brilliance in the morning."

'TDN Rising Star' Sporting Chance, making his first start since capturing the GI Hopeful S., ran admirably to be third after chasing the pace and getting steadied in the stretch, while Mourinho held on to complete the superfecta.

Runner-up at fourth asking in the Del Mar Juvenile Turf S. Sept. 3, My Boy Jack broke his maiden in the Zuma Beach S. at Santa Anita Oct. 9 before running seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf and finishing behind unbeaten 'Rising Star' McKinzie (Street Sense) in the Sham. **Cont. p4**

My Boy Jack picks up 10 points in the Road to the Kentucky Derby standings for his triumph.

"It looked like a repeat of the Razorback," winning rider Kent Desormeaux said of his trip, referencing Hawaakom's rail-skimming victory one race earlier. "I have to say it was a great training job by Keith. Last time, the horse left the gate quiet as a church mouse, but got very aggressive early and I was just skiing around there. When I turned him loose, he just galloped home. He didn't power home like he did today. It was a complete turnaround effort from his last start. Today he was quite calm and let me ride him and that was the biggest difference. He didn't waste any energy, so he flew home."

Remarking on the condition of the racetrack after daylong rains, Desormeaux added, "This was an eight-goggle day. The track's consistency is like peanut butter. Their feet go into the ground and it's trying to suck their shoes off. It's sticky. The great thing is now we're going to run in the Derby--it might be the Arkansas Derby, but we're Derby-bound."

My Boy Jack is the third graded stakes winner for descendant Airdrie Stud stallion Creative Cause from his two crops to race thus far, following in the footsteps of GIII Smarty Jones S. victor and 'TDN Rising Star' Pavel and GIII Miss Grillo S. heroine Significant Form. His unraced Airdrie-bred dam is a half-sister to SW Precious Kiss (Kissin Kris) out of GSW/GISP Gold N Delicious, who was Brereton Jones's entree into the family when snatched up for \$310,000 at the 2004 Keeneland November sale. Sold for \$8,000 to Chad Schumer at KEENOV in 2016, Gold N Shaft is responsible for a juvenile Cairo Prince filly named Play for Gold, an unnamed yearling filly by the same sire and a filly by The

The Gunthers are also the breeders of **Vino Rosso** (Curlin), a good third in the GIII Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa Bay and the co-breeders of **Mo Town** (Uncle Mo), winner of last year's GI Hollywood Derby. They're making their mark overseas as well. They are the co-breeders of **On the Warpath (GB)** (Declaration of War), a two-time winner in England who, according to Tanya Gunther, was recently purchased by Darley in order to campaign in Dubai. Then there's **Without Parole (GB)** (Frankel {GB}). They own and bred the colt who romped in his debut in December for John Gosden at Newcastle. He has been nominated to most of the 2018 European Classics.

Over the years they have also bred Grade I winners Tamarkuz (Speightstown), Stay Thirsty (Bernardini), First Samurai (Giant's Causeway), Stevie Wonderboy (Stephen Got Even) and Materiality (Afleet Alex).

"The last several years I have to give credit to my daughter," John Gunther said. "She was in investment banking in London for 10 years, so she is very analytical and she puts a lot of stats together. After 10 years of investment banking, she wanted to pursue her passion, which was horses, and she left London and went to Kentucky and managed the farm. She's very hands on and very analytical. She gets on to some of these stallions and she studies and studies pedigrees, going back several generations."

Tanya gives credit to her father for finding mares, some of which did not cost a lot of money, that keep producing quality horses.

After Justify was purchased by WinStar Farm LLC, China Horse Club and SF Racing LLC for \$500,000 at Keeneland September, Gunther said he heard little about the colt. He did catch video of some of his workouts and was impressed.

Combining the works and his remembrances of what kind of prospect Justify seemed to be when on the Gunthers' farm, he predicted something special was going to happen before the colt made his first start.

"I had a good feeling about this horse," he said. "In fact, I told my son [John Gunther Jr.] before he ran that we have two horses we bred have a good shot of shot running in the Kentucky Derby. One being Vino Rosso. He asked me who the other horse was and I said, 'His name is Justify. I think he will run in the Kentucky Derby.' He asked how many starts he had and I said none. To just break his maiden and now everyone is thinking of running him in the Kentucky Derby, that's quite special. With the way he won, he could be one of the nicest horses I've ever bred or raced."

"It sort of took your breath away," Tanya Gunther said. "He was amazing. To win like that in your debut going seven furlongs, which is a difficult distance, you just don't see [that] happen. Even though we thought very highly of this horse throughout the time we had him, and I'm sure his connections did as well, you never anticipate a horse doing something as easily as he did and as impressively as he did."

Vino Rosso was sold for \$410,000 to Repole Stable and St. Elias Stable, also at Keeneland September. The Gunthers have a small racing stable and John Gunther said it is necessary to sell well-bred horses like Justify and Vino Rosso to keep a cash flow coming in. But Without Parole is one they did keep.

"That was my dad's mating," Tanya said. "He loves Frankel. My dad is right up there as one of his biggest fans in the world."

Without Parole was put in the 2016 Tattersalls October Sale but did not meet his reserve. That may be a good thing for the Gunthers.

While the colt won a race on an all-weather track that was worth just \$9,300, he did so with the type of flourish that has everyone excited.

"He won his first start in England by six, but he could have won by 10," John Gunther said. "We think a lot of this colt. He'll be making first start as 3-year-old probably around the first week in April and John Gosden nominated him to the English and Irish Guineas. He likes him a lot."

By the time Without Parole returns to the races, the Gunthers will have a better idea if Justify can pull off what seems to be nearly impossible. Even with Baffert as the trainer, even with a horse with this kind of talent, can a horse go from making his first start Feb. 18 to winning the Kentucky Derby, let alone even making the race? The Gunthers believe that he can and so does Baffert. Then there's Vino Rosso, an improving colt trained by Todd Pletcher. For Glennwood Farm, it figures to be an exciting spring.



PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

When someone first gambled on the idea of sending a daughter of Cee's Tizzy to Awesome Again, I wonder if they really expected to see the lights flash and the jackpot cascade. In fact, the lever had to be pulled a few times before the first payout, with the nick's statistics standing at eight foals, four starters, three winners but no black-type winners by the fall of 2010.

Of course, a sample of eight foals isn't nearly big enough to draw any firm conclusions and the nick soon began to produce dividends, with Awesome Patriot winning the Alydar S. at Hollywood Park as a 3-year-old in 2011.

Now the stats for Awesome Again's foals out of Cee's Tizzy mares make most impressive reading. From 17 foals of racing age, four have become black-type winners (a terrific 23.5%) and three (17.6%) have hit the graded stakes jackpot. The latest addition to the team is **Bravazo**, a narrow winner of Saturday's GII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds. This victory qualifies him to set out on the Triple Crown trail following in the footsteps of two other Awesome Again colts with dams by Cee's Tizzy.

The first, Paynter, wasn't ready for the first two legs of the

Triple Crown but then made a very bold attempt to lead throughout in the 2012 GI Belmont S., losing out to Union Rags only in the last few strides. Paynter then became a Grade I winner in the prestigious Haskell Invitational and the sky looked to be the limit for the very progressive colt until his career was derailed by a near-fatal battle with colitis and laminitis.

A year later it was the turn of Oxbow. Although he could finish only a close fourth when he contested the 2013 Risen Star, the D. Wayne Lukas trainee contested all three legs of the Triple Crown, notably making most of the running to win the GI Preakness S. before finishing second in the Belmont S.

The original incentive for sending Cee's Tizzy mares to Awesome Again stemmed from the fact that Cee's Tizzy was a son of Relaunch. When Awesome Again was mated to Relaunch's daughter Baby Zip back in 1999, the outcome was none other than Ghostzapper, the GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner and Horse of the Year who--like Awesome Again--has proved such a valuable member of the Adena Springs stallion team.

Bravazo, Paynter and Oxbow are out of three different daughters of Cee's Tizzy--Tiz o'Gold, Tizso and Tizamazing respectively--but the three graded stakes winners have more in common than just their sire and broodmare sire.

The dams of Paynter and Oxbow are sisters, their dam being Cee's Song, a mare whose repeated visits to Cee's Tizzy provided a considerable legacy. Cee's Song was sired by Seattle Song, a son of Seattle Slew. Seattle Slew occupies the same position in Bravazo's pedigree, as the 1977 Triple Crown winner also sired Slew o'Gold, the sire of Bravazo's second dam Pep o'Gold.

It seems fair to attribute much of the credit for Bravazo's talent to the potency of the Awesome Again-Cee's Tizzy-Seattle Slew collaboration, as the Risen Star winner comes from a family which has been unexceptional in recent generations.

Although his dam Tiz o'Gold was a seven-time winner from the ages of three to six, she cost Calumet Farm only \$35,000 when offered in foal to a \$75,000 stallion in 2014.

That stallion, of course, was Awesome Again and the foal was Bravazo. Calumet also owned Oxbow by the time he won the Preakness.

Second dam Pep o'Gold RNA'd for \$8,000 as a yearling before

going on to win one of her 10 starts, for earnings of less than \$7,000. Ginged Up, the Maryland-foaled third dam, had only one black-type earner among her 10 foals.

Some of the stallions involved weren't highly fashionable, either. Ginged Up's sire, The Irish Lord, won only a maiden race from five starts, even though he was a brother by Bold Ruler to the champion 2-year-old filly Queen Empress.

Bravazo's broodmare sire Cee's Tizzy was another who started his stallion career without the benefit of a stakes success, but that didn't stop him from rising through the ranks. As a non-graded winner, Cee's Tizzy had to be attractively priced when he started his stallion career in 1991 and he was to spend his first nine seasons at fees ranging from \$1,500 to \$2,500.

Then along came Tiznow, winner of the Breeders' Cup Classic in 2000 and 2001. Tiznow's older brother Budroyale had been runner-up to Cat Thief in the 1999 Classic.

There should be no problems when Bravazo is asked to tackle further than the Risen Star's mile and a sixteenth. Cee's Tizzy was bred to stay quite well, as his sire Relaunch was once a close second to John Henry in the GI San Luis Rey S. over a mile and a half and Cee's Tizzy's second dam Tizna landed the Ladies H. over a mile and a quarter. Cee's Tizzy's brief racing career ended when he tackled a mile and a quarter in the 1990 Super Derby. After leading for a mile, he lost second place to Unbridled by only a neck, even though it transpired that he had suffered a career-ending knee fracture.

A mile and a quarter also suited Awesome Again very well. He won the Queen's Plate over that distance at three, followed by the GII Saratoga H. and the Breeders' Cup Classic at four. Now 24 years old, he covered 69 mares last year and 71 in 2016 (for 52 live foals). Indeed he hasn't covered a three-figure book since 2008, which is hard to understand when he has been responsible for a lengthy list of Grade I winners. Four of them won in the red-hot competition of the Breeders' Cup, with Ghostzapper taking the Classic, Wilko the Juvenile and Round Pond and Ginger Punch the Distaff.

With a figure of 1.98, he ranks a creditable 11th on the *Blood-Horse's* list of sires by cumulative Average Earnings Index, and the veteran son of Deputy Minister also basks in some reflected glory from his own son Ghostzapper, who ranks sixth with a figure of 2.19.

Hawaakom, who finished second to subsequent dual champion Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}) in last year's GIII Razorback H. at Oaklawn, returned to capture that very event with a rail-skimming run for his first graded tally Monday in Hot Springs.

Claimed for \$15,000 by his connections back in November 2014, the chestnut was fifth in the GI New Orleans H. and fourth in the GI Stephen Foster H. after last year's Razorback before throwing in three dull efforts in which he beat four horses total. Getting back on track with a solid third at 15-1 in the Louisiana S. last out Jan. 13 at Fair Grounds, the gelding was made the fifth choice in this wide-open renewal of the prelude to the GI Oaklawn H.

Dropping out to run second-last at the fence behind contested fractions of :24.02 and :48.52, Hawaakom advanced while continuing along the rail on the far turn, but still had about 10 lengths to find after three-quarters in 1:13.04. Inching ever closer through early stretch, he squeezed through the slimmest of openings behind tiring pacesetter Rocking the Boat just inside

the eighth pole and spurted clear of runner-up Leofric from there to triumph.

"I had a great trip," said winning rider Corey Lanerie. "The horse fits the trip really well. He loves the inside, a couple times I came to a couple holes I was a little scared of, but my horse showed all the courage and never hesitated and he did all the work. Thanks to the owners and trainers for giving me this opportunity."

The win was also the first of the graded stake variety for trainer Wes Hawley, who remarked, "This was a game-changer. This was huge. This was my biggest career win."

His second dam is a half to English highweight and MG1SW Haafhd (GB) (Alhaar {Ire}), SW/G1SP Irish highweight Hasbah (Ire) (Kris {GB}) and MGSW Munir (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}). Hard-trying Martini Glass, runner-up in a pair of Grade I races last year, earned her first graded stakes tally with an off-the-pace upset in the GIII Royal Delta S. Monday at Gulfstream.

Claimed out of her February 2016 debut for \$16,000 by these connections, she was second-best to multiple champion Songbird (Medaglia d'Oro) in last summer's GI Delaware H. and filled the same slot in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. Oct. 8 at Keeneland before gamely capturing the Claiming Crown Tiara S. over the local turf Dec. 2. Runner-up in the Via Borghese S. on grass here Dec. 30, she was most recently third with some traffic trouble in the GIII Houston Ladies Classic S. at Sam Houston Jan. 28.

Sent off as the fractional fourth choice in this feature, Martini Glass found a comfortable spot at the fence in fourth, just behind a three-way scrum for the lead through a :24.01 quarter. The bay continued to draft in behind dueling leaders Lewis Bay and Curlin's Approval (Curlin) past a :46.48 half before angling out three deep around the five-sixteenths marker. Lewis Bay was confidently handled as she shook clear of her pace companion into the stretch, but was soon set upon by Martini Glass, who swept past the chalk at the eighth pole and edged away despite swapping leads to post the victory. Lewis Bay was clear for the place, ahead of Verve's Tale, who ran on to be third after a slow break.

"We've knocked on the door," said winning trainer Keith Nations. "To be where we are right now is amazing. We were just thrilled to death to run second to Songbird. That just made our whole year. That was enough there. She's just moved forward and is getting better."

Co-owner Vince Campanella reflected on plucking Martini Glass out of her debut, saying, "We'd seen her train and liked the look of her. Someone else was in on her too, so we actually won the shake to get her. We do pretty well with the claims, but this time we overachieved."

Pedigree Notes:

Martini Glass hails from the final crop of the late Kitalpha, a full-brother to Kingmambo who was imported from Zimbabwe to stand at Gerry and Dana Aschinger's War Horse Place in 2008. She is his second graded stakes winner, following Unbelievable Dream, who captured the GIII Appalachian S. in 2013. Glassy, a six-time winner in her racing career, was bought by Gerry Aschinger for \$55,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November sale. She is responsible for an unraced sophomore filly by Champ Pegasus named Pegasus Party and foaled a colt by the same sire last spring. Second dam Waver is a half-sister to MGSW/GISP turfer Montserrat (Roberto).

Kyle Wilson, Stallion Seasons Director, WinStar Farm

How did you get interested in racing?

I was raised in Toledo, Ohio which isn't exactly a hotbed of equine activity, but I was introduced to the sport by my grandfather, William Lageman. He lived on Long Island but had a few horses in Kentucky and always made a trip to the September Sale at Keeneland. My mother was also a pretty good show jumper and she had her retired Thoroughbred, Stepper, at a farm just outside of town. We began taking family trips to Lexington during the sale to spend some time with my grandparents and our interest in the game grew. I remember all of us driving to the local Standardbred track, Raceway Park, to watch the simulcast feed when Grandpa's horses were running. I ended up at the University of Kentucky to study finance, then marketing and finally economics and Spanish. Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonk were brave enough to let me work the 2004 September Sale for them and from then on I tried to get as much experience in the industry as possible. I worked as many sales as my class schedule would allow, prepped yearlings, walked hots, and even filed registration papers at The Jockey Club. I was fortunate enough to be accepted on to the Godolphin Flying Start and will be forever grateful for that opportunity. I've been very fortunate to work with some incredible people and be around some amazing horses. It's been a fun ride so far.

What's your first racing memory?

The memory that really sticks with me is our first trip to Keeneland on Bluegrass Day in 1995. Wild Syn won the Bluegrass over favored Thunder Gulch and paid \$60 to win. I think I tried to bet on every 30-1 shot I could find after that!

SECOND ANNUAL KEEP DAY SHOWCASES IMPORTANCE OF KY HORSE INDUSTRY

The Kentucky Equine Education Project staged its second KEEP Day in Frankfort, with horsemen and horse enthusiasts of all breeds and disciplines interacting with state legislators to discuss the economic importance of equines in their home districts. A prevalent message was that horses of all types contribute significant assets to local economies and have a valuable impact on the quality of life all across the Commonwealth.

"The impact of our breeds on our local economy is underestimated," said Sharon Ohler of the Kentucky Paint Horse Club. "There are thousands of horses in the state who will never run on a racetrack but whose owners pump thousands of dollars into the economy."

Horses of all breeds form a \$4 billion industry in the Commonwealth, supporting an estimated 100,000 in direct and indirect jobs and spanning all 120 counties. Kentucky is home to 35,000 operations with at least one horse, totaling 242,400 equines and \$23.4 billion when including related assets, according to a University of Kentucky Department of Agriculture survey.

Elisabeth Jensen, KEEP's executive vice president, called KEEP Day "a great opportunity for us to connect the dots" for legislators, with 20 Kentucky representatives and senators coming by the casual two-hour event.

"I was very pleased that so many individuals from throughout the horse industry in Kentucky--the Quarter Horse industry, Arabian, Paint Horse, the Hackney ponies, different breeds and associations--had an opportunity to interact with legislators who might not have realized that they had horses and horse businesses in their district," she said.

Those participating in other breeds also expressed appreciation for how Thoroughbred racing helps the larger horse industry. That includes the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund that provides award money for 11 non-racing breeds, made all the more important with some breeds' decreasing numbers. The KHBIF is funded by a percentage of the sales tax on the stud fee when a mare is bred to a Kentucky stallion, with Thoroughbreds overwhelmingly financing the program.

Rep. James Kay of Versailles said it was important for his colleagues to understand the extent of the equine industry and that it involves much more than racing.

"When you expose the entire world of the horse industry, all the different breeds and many different jobs it creates, it gives the people a new reason to be supportive," he said.

Eric Hamelback, chief executive officer of the National Horsemen's Benevolent & Protective Association that represents Thoroughbred owners and trainers across the country and Canada, said Kentucky is the beacon for other states when it comes to the horse industry.

"Kentucky is the shining example of what can be accomplished when horsemen, racetracks and other equine organizations and the legislature work together," he said. "KEEP and the various breeding funds we have that are assisted by Thoroughbred racing and breeding demonstrate that we're all better working together. Not every district has a racetrack. But every district in Kentucky has horses."

FEANE READY FOR THE NEXT LEVEL



John Feane and Not A Bad Oul Day | *Racing Post*

While not yet a household name among the Irish training ranks, John Feane achieved something quite noteworthy last year when he trained **Not A Bad Oul Day (Ire)** (Captain Rio {GB}) to win seven races in a season. If training the winning-most horse in Ireland was an achievement in itself, buying the 6-year-old gelding out of a claimer for only €5,000 before he kicked off the winning spree was even more impressive. Feane has only commenced his fifth year with a trainer's license, but he has made a serious impression in his first four seasons and following 25 winners in Ireland last year he is well placed, with a team of around 50 horses, to build on that promise. While happy with his lot, Feane is ambitious and he has a hunger for winners that will stand the young trainer in good stead as he strives to climb the training ladder.

"I think we had 39 seconds last year, so if a few more of those had gone our way it could have been even better, but yeah we had a great year," he said.

Feane never envisaged a life that did not involve horses and he credits his father Jimmy for providing a valuable early education in all things thoroughbred.

"My father was assistant manager to Stan Cosgrove at Moyglare Stud for 32 years and I spent all my summers and holidays from school with him there," said Feane. "I then went to college and while there, I worked part time for Michael Halford. When I finished college, I went to work for Frances Crowley where I rode as an amateur for a while. After a few years, myself and my girlfriend Susan decided we'd branch out and start training ourselves."

Feane is based at Hazelwood Stables, just opposite the six-furlong start at The Curragh Racecourse in a yard that belongs to his uncle, former Classic-winning jockey Declan Gillespie and having trained 12 winners in his debut season in 2014, he has firmly established himself as a trainer on the up. Like a lot of trainers starting off with limited budgets, Feane carved his reputation by winning with either cheaply bought yearlings or second hand horses sourced from HIT sales. It was the cheaply purchased **Prince Connisseur (Ire)** (Art Connoisseur {Ire}) who helped launch his career in 2014 when he won four times, including when bagging a premier handicap at The Curragh that autumn.

Recalled Feane, "He only cost €3,000 and won the prestigious Joe McGrath H. for us. He had a lot of training problems but he was very good to us." [Cont. p2](#)

While winning with average horses proved Feane had the ability to get the best out of the raw material at his disposal, it doesn't lay a particularly solid foundation for success in better class races, something the trainer is keen to start experiencing sooner rather than later.

"We started off going to the horses in training sales to pick up second hand horses that we could win a few handicaps with," he said. "We are trying to get away from that formula now, even though it has been kind to us, but you need a better class of horse in the yard if you want to compete in the bigger races. We've proved we can train successfully so it's all about improving the standard of horse in the yard. We got a good few more yearlings in last autumn so hopefully there'll be a few decent ones among them. We have a nice filly by Slade Power and a smart looking colt by Dawn Approach, to identify a few."

Feane knows that if some of these 2-year-olds win or get placed on their first few runs there is a good chance they could be continuing their careers overseas. He has already sold a couple to Hong Kong since he started training, including last year's Gowran Park debut winner **Bigwood (Ire)** (Requinto {Ire}), and it is a similar fact of life for many trainers and indeed owners these days that when there is an offer on the table for a horse it can be hard to justify turning it down.

"That's the great thing about Irish racing at the moment. It's so competitive and the form is so strong that if you have a horse

that can beat or finish close up to, for example, a Ballydoyle horse in a maiden, it's suddenly very saleable," he said.

"It depends on the owner, sometimes they are sporting enough to keep them and have a bit of fun, do what they bought the horse originally for, but sometimes if there is enough on the table it's very hard to say no."

This business model has been the springboard for many successful trainers nowadays, Ger Lyons being an example, and Feane knows the bottom line counts in any business while he can also see the bigger picture when losing a horse as a result of a good sale.

"Ger Lyons is a great trainer and has excellent business sense and his model is one that young trainers should probably look at and consider implementing if they are capable of doing so," he noted. "Last year we sold Bigwood to Hong Kong after he won his maiden first time out so while it was a pity to see him go, it made very good business sense. He was bred by his previous owner who still has the dam so I can look forward to training a nice 2-year-old brother to Bigwood this year."

There is something in the psyche of Irish horse people that will always see a great many of them being traders more than end users and that is something Irish Thoroughbred Marketing hopes will aid them in a project they are hoping to roll out shortly. The ITM team have plans in place to stage barrier trials before racing at Dundalk in April in an effort to showcase unraced Irish 2-year-olds to the Asian market.

ITM's Jeremy Greene is spearheading the initiative and explained, "We have two aims, firstly to help with preparing unraced horses before they debut in Ireland and secondly, to meet demand from overseas, Asia especially, for unraced but ready to go horses. The trials will be recorded and placed online with a view to being pitched overseas. Dundalk is ideal given the consistency of the surface and everything is in situ on a race-day and we hope to start on Apr. 18 with other dates in early May also possible."

To be successful the project needs support from trainers and John Feane is one who is keen to get behind the concept. "It will be interesting to see how it pans out," he said. "Obviously it is a system that works well in Australia, but it will need support from Irish trainers to work here. Maybe it will work, maybe it won't but it's an initiative that is worth trying anyway and I'd like to try and support it."

Feane has also embraced the rise in claiming races run in Ireland the last few years and along with one of his owners, James Mescall, is a big fan of the system which he thinks facilitates people getting involved in ownership, something that can only be a positive for racing.

"Not only are claiming races an ideal source for horses that could offer a quick return for an owner, they also provide good opportunities for older horses that may be in the grip of the handicapper to compete successfully," he said. "I also think there is room for more claiming races in the current programme. At the end of the day owners love winners and if these races allow new owners to get involved with a horse that could be placed to win a race soon after, then it has to be good for the sport."

The owners of Not A Bad Oul Day are a case in point. Claimed at Laytown in September 2016 with a rating of 58, the horse finished second on his first start for Feane and owner Daniel Lynch the following month. While it was four runs and the following spring before the horse won for his new connections, that victory opened the floodgates for the next six wins that followed over the following six months. Those wins yielded over €70,000 in prizemoney and saw the gelding rise over 30lbs in the handicap, all the while advertising the merits of the claiming system and the skills of his trainer.

In four seasons training, Feane's horses have enjoyed a great strike rate on the Polytrack in Dundalk and are often towards the head of the betting in many of the premier handicaps throughout the year. While not wishing to sound too big for his own boots, the trainer is hoping to spread his wings this season and become a more regular player in pattern races and some of the bigger turf races.

"Dundalk has been great, we were the second leading trainer there behind Michael Halford last year, but the plan this year is to try and step up again and win some nice races on the grass," said Feane. "We've got a good mix of horses between the old reliable campaigners and the new batch of juveniles and 3-year-olds that are coming through the ranks. We've also got great owners at the moment, they're a pleasure to train for and we are beginning to attract a better quality of horse and that's what you need to take it to the next level."

While very much in the early stages of his training career Feane talks like a man who has been in the game a long time and has confidence in his own ability, something that is vital for someone who is keen to progress.

"I like training racehorses, it's my life and I can't imagine doing anything else," he concluded. "I think we've done well placing our horses so far and I think we're knocking on the door."

Feane has stated his intentions loud and clear and if there is a young Irish trainer destined to break into the top five in the coming years, it could well be him.

Quickly into stride, the gelding sat in an eager third past the 400-metre mark, before leveling off with minimal encouragement and taking dead aim on Schifty Thinker (Aus) (So You Think {NZ}). He hit the front with 100 metres to go and drew off to win by 2 3/4 lengths from the pacesetter in :52.50 ([video](#)) in the fifth heat of the day.

"He's going really, really well," trainer Bjorn Baker told *Racing.com* of his last out Dec. 30 Listed Christmas Classic hero. MAGICS PERTH SALE CELEBRATES GAINS



Lot 19 | Magic Millions

The two-day Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale sported a new format, with Book 1 held on Monday, and there were gains across the board. A total of 130 lots found new homes for a clearance rate of 94.2%, out of 138 offered. The average rose 67.7% to A\$64,258 and the median almost doubled, at A\$50,000 (+92.3%). **Lot 19**, a colt by Arrowfield's Not a Single Doubt (Aus), topped the single-session Book 1, selling for A\$210,000 to Victoria Peak Bloodstock.

Consigned by Dawson Stud, the attractive bay is a half-brother to a winner and the fourth foal out of Australian listed heroine All Friared Up (Aus) (Blackfriars {Aus}). The winning second dam is a half-sister to MSW and GSP Chantes Path (Aus) (Chanteclair {Aus}).

"I thought he was a very good colt in conformation," said Graham Daws of Dawson Stud. "We brought him back to West Australia because he was from All Friared Up who is a WA mare. We thought he would go well over here and we have got a better than I expected result."

The dearest filly was **lot 70**, by Nicconi (Aus) from the Touchstone Farm draft. Purchased for A\$200,000 by Simon Miller Racing, she is the second foal out of a half-sister to G3 Bletchingly S. hero Ability (Aus) (Reward for Effort {Aus}), while her second dam is a half-sister to Group 2 victor Well Rounded (Aus) (Reset {Aus}). Under the fourth dam is MG1SW Campanologist (Kingmambo), as well as American MGSW Isabella Sings (Eskendereya).

"I actually trained her mum and she was extremely quick, but she never got to the races," said trainer Simon Miller of lot 70. "She's a quality filly and I was just luck I had enough gunpowder to be able to get her." [Cont. p7](#)

West Australian horseman Neville Parnham, whose name appeared in the buyers' sheets six times on Monday for an aggregate of A\$547,000, struck for the joint second highest lot, a colt ([lot 98](#)) by young sire Zoustar (Aus) consigned by Mogumber Park. By the same sire as recent Magic Millions Classic victress Sunlight (Aus), this is the extended family of MG1SW Kinjite (NZ) (Centaine {Aus}). The brown colt is the first foal out of the five-time winner Magnus Missile (Aus) (Magnus {Aus}).

"It was an amazing day," said Magic Millions Managing Director Barry Bowditch. "The positivity around the grounds before the sale was phenomenal and I'd say we've had one of the greatest day's selling in Perth Yearling Sale history. The confidence in the local racing industry was show here today. There's great prizemoney, great incentives and they've come here to buy horses."

He added, "It's an amazing clearance rate. It would have to be one of the highest clearance rates in the history of sales. We're at 94%, almost 95% and with an average of over A\$64,000, it's been a phenomenal day's selling. The revised format of the sale created great momentum and the results certainly exceeded our expectations. We look forward to tomorrow from 11 a.m.--given today's results, it all bodes well for Book 2."
