

TIME TO GET CREATIVE

contender this Saturday in the \$1-million GI Santa Anita Derby. Having finished third by a length in his seasonal opener--the sevenfurlong GII San Vicente S. (video) Feb. 19--the grey colt prevailed in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 10 despite racing

half yesterday in :48 2/5 (5/14) at Hollywood Park. Creative Cause has been equipped with blinkers in each of seven career starts, but will not have his usual blue hood Saturday.

"He's going to be running without blinkers," trainer Mike Harrington said during a national teleconference Tuesday. "He got to wandering around last time, and he's never really been focused in the stretch. He's worked last three or four times without blinkers. Now's the time to find out how he runs without them. We didn't want to try it in the Kentucky Derby."

Though Harrington would love to take home the Santa Anita Derby trophy, he has his eye on the "Run for the Roses" four weeks hence at Churchill Downs.

"This is a stepping stone to Louisville," he confirmed. "Obviously we'd like to win it; it's a lot of money. But the main thing is the Derby."

Creative Cause captured the GI Norfolk S. last season en route to completing his 2-year-old campaign with a third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill. Harrington believes that was an invaluable experience for his charge.

"It's very important," said the conditioner. "As you know, the Kentucky Derby is a circus. My horse can get a little hot, but he handled the Breeders' Cup fine. I schooled him several times. At this point in time, the [Juvenile] is looking like a pretty strong race."



Samaready's successful dual-hemisphere sire More Than Ready accounts for nearly a third of this year's Slipper field and sired back-to-back winners of the event in Sebring (Aus) and Phelan Ready (Aus) in 2008 and 2009, respectively. WOOD IS GO TIME FOR GEMOLOGIST

WinStar Farm's **Gemologist** (Tiznow) is perfect in four career starts, including a pair under the Twin Spires.



But, with just \$103,855 in graded earnings to date, the handsome bay colt will likely need a onetwo finish in Saturday's \$1-million GI Resorts World Casino Wood Memorial S. in order to secure a spot in the starting gate of the GI Kentucky Derby. "Hopefully, he gets enough graded earnings

in Wood," trainer Todd Pletcher said during a national teleconference Tuesday. "There's not a lot of margin for [error]. He could finish third, and that would put him on the bubble."

Gemologist was the front-running winner of a Churchill allowance Oct. 30 (video) before stalking the pace en route to victory in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at that track Nov. 26 (video). Freshened up afterwards, he looked sharp in his lone outing this season going a one-turn mile in a Gulfstream allowance Mar. 16 (video).

"He's had an outstanding winter and spring," Pletcher reported. "Knock on wood, everything has gone according to plan. He's been willing in his works, not too overzealous."

Should he make it to the "Run for the Roses," Gemologist will have a few points in common with Super Saver (Maria's Mon), who gave Pletcher and WinStar their first Kentucky Derby trophy in 2010. Both colts captured the Kentucky Jockey Club at two, and Super Saver came into the first Saturday in May with just a pair of outings under his belt that spring.

"It all depends on each particular year and each particular horse," Pletcher said when asked about whether two preps was the ideal scenario. "There's not an exact science to get to the Kentucky Derby. A lot of so-called rules about getting there have been shattered. When you have a horse like Gemologist that has twoturn experience at Churchill, that's a little different. He has two wins at Churchill, which to me is a huge advantage." **Cont. p4** EVEN THE SCORE

March Madness just came to a close with Kentucky taking the national title, and Pletcher gave out his seedings for current Derby contenders.

"Union Rags would be a No. 1 seed, Gemologist would be a No. 1 seed, Hansen would be a No. 1 seed, and Creative Cause would be a No. 1 seed," said the Eclipse Award-winning conditioner.

Another Pletcher trainee, Repole Stable's **Our Entourage** (Street Cry {Ire}), will take his chances in the GIII Illinois Derby Saturday at Hawthorne. Fifth in both the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland and GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct in 2011, the son of Grade I winner Sand Springs (Dynaformer) prevailed as the favorite in his sole start this year, a grass allowance at Gulfstream Feb. 25.

"I've had many conversations with Mike Repole," said Pletcher. "He's a decent turf horse, but he's trained very well all along on the dirt. We thought we weren't given any major grass opportunities at this point. He's got a stout pedigree with a lot of stamina."

A win in the \$500,000 event would net Our Entourage \$300,000, but wouldn't necessarily mean that the colt's van to Louisville would be booked.

"We're not even sure that even if he wins the Illinois Derby that we'll go on to Kentucky," Pletcher said.


EVER SO LUCKY TUNES UP FOR BLUE GRASS Augustin Stable's Ever So Lucky (Indian Charlie), coming off a third-place effort in the Mar. 10 GIII Swale S., worked five furlongs in company Tuesday at Keeneland in preparation fo rthe Apr. 14 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. The bay colt, with assistant Barry Wiseman aboard, started six lengths behind stablemate Piquant (Arch), and finished four lengths in front while covering the distance in :59.40. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:13. "He gobbled him up really within about an eighth of a mile," said trainer Jonathan Sheppard. "He got up to him a bit too soon. And then when he got to the front, he really didn't do that much. He leveled off a little bit coming to the wire, but it was all right." Second behind Gemologist (Tiznow) in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. last fall, Ever So Lucky was beaten seven lengths by Trinniberg (Teuflesberg) while making his sophomore debut in the Swale. The effort did not discourage Sheppard. "It was a very satisfactory race," the trainer said. "We didn't ride him too overly aggressive and dropped back inside some horses and finished nicely. The winner was loose on the lead and won by seven in an extremely fast time. That was OK. We purposely didn't try to chase the early speed." Ever So Lucky developed a quarter crack and has been working in a bar shoe.

DOGWOOD, ECLIPSE FORM JOINT VENTURE

Dogwood Stable and the California-based Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners have formed a joint venture. Under the arrangement, Dogwood will be able to offer its partners shares in Eclipse partnerships; permit Eclipse to utilize Dogwood's facilities in Aiken, South Carolina; streamline operating and financial duties of both operations; and give Dogwood a presence in California.

"Earlier I announced my 'semi-retirement' and a cutback in our operations, and we then heard some interesting propositions from a number of farms and competitors," explained Dogwood President Cot Campbell. "Among them was [Eclipse's] Aron Wellman. We have talked over the winter, and have now hashed out this logical arrangement. It benefits clients of both Dogwood and Eclipse. Dogwood will continue to form traditional four-share yearling and 2-year-old offerings, but can now have immediate access to participation in Eclipse partnerships formed with the purpose of campaigning established race horses.



"In the 80's Dogwood bought many racehorses in Europe and South America, but found that it became too complicated," Campbell continued. "It is an arena that requires constant networking and that is a specialty of Aron Wellman. So this will be an appealing, new 'product' for certain Dogwood partners."

Wellman, a former vice president at Team Valor International, started Eclipse last year. The group has already been represented by Sweet Cat (Kitten's Joy), third in last year's GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, and GIII Bourbonette Oaks winner In Lingerie (Empire Maker).

"Being hand-picked by Mr. Campbell to form this joint venture is an honor and I am truly humbed to have gained his confidence," said Wellman. "In the racehorse partnership business and throughout the industry at large, this certainly ranks as the ultimate endorsement."

Dogwood's current treasurer William Victor, will serve as chief financial officer for both organizations.

ROMANET RE-ELECTED AS IFHA CHAIRMAN

Following a meeting of the Executive Council of the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities in Paris Apr. 2, the incumbent chairman, Louis Romanet of France and three vice-chairmen, Jim Gagliano (Americas), Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges (Asia) and Brian Kavanagh (Europe) were unanimously elected to new three-year terms from October 2012 through October 2015. The Executive Council also unanimously ratified the principle of the prohibition of medication in all races. "It is a great honor to be reelected for a seventh mandate of three years," Romanet said. "With the Vice Chairmen, we intend to be more proactive on all the main international issues and especially on the no medication policy for racing." Romanet expressed his intention to implement intermediary regional structures at the level of each continental Federation, reinforce harmonization of racing rules, implement best practices for the welfare of horses and the security of jockeys and to develop more external communication. The Executive Council also agreed to publish 22 "International Screening Limits" (click here) and to instruct the international harmonization of detection times.

DUBAI: EUROPE'S SIRES NIGHT

On the Blood-Horse's 2011 General Sire List (www.bloodhorse.com), which covers only North American sires, Distorted Humor was champion North American Sire, with 2011 earnings over \$10.3-million. Smart Strike finished second (\$9.4-million), Tapit third (\$9.2-million), and Giant's Causeway fourth (\$8.5-million). The TDN 2011 year-end General Sire List (click here) had the four horses in the same order-different money, depending on what gets counted where--but two European sires, Coolmore's Sadler's Wells sons Galileo and Montjeu, in fact, also had earnings over \$10-million. In a pretty stark reminder of the extent to which Europe has now re-balanced the location of top sires, Galileo, with earnings over \$14.7-million, actually topped all 2011 North American and European sires, and by a pretty wide margin.

Distorted Humor ranked second, followed by Montjeu (\$10.1-million), Smart Strike, Tapit, and Giant's Causeway. After last weekend's eight-race, \$27-million extravaganza for Dubai World Cup night, the distinction is even more pronounced. On Monday, the Blood-Horse (which counts UAE earnings, but only for North American sires) showed Scat Daddy as North America's leading sire of 2012. Considering the last two weekends (in other words, since we wrote about him on Mar. 21), he's had the winners of the \$800,000 GIII Sunland Derby (Daddy Nose Best) at nine furlongs and the \$2-million G2 UAE Derby (Daddy Long Legs) at 9 1/2 furlongs (1900m), it's not surprising that he tops the charts. Just as significantly, he's just sired the winners of two Kentucky Derby preps at nine furlongsplus with his first crop of 3-year-olds. This is huge news for any second-crop sire.

Also significantly, Daddy Long Legs was one of six horses trained by Aidan O'Brien for the Coolmore partners who ran on Dubai World Cup night. From their six runners they had one winner, one second (St. Nicholas Abbey), one third (Wrote, to stablemate Daddy Long Legs), two fourths (So You Think and Treasure Beach), and one unplaced (Await The Dawn), for earnings of \$3,150,000. I don't know about any thaw in relations, but I'll bet they thought it was a worthwhile exercise. Daddy Long Legs will almost certainly go for the GI Kentucky Derby now, and stablemate Wrote could as well. Wrote won the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Churchill last November, but Daddy Long Legs was last in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile on the dirt, so they'll be hoping he adapts better to it this time around. The leading sire with first foals 2007, Dubawi, hasn't exactly been a secret, but Monterosso's impressive win in the centerpiece \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup, with \$6-million to the winner, rockets Dubawi into the stratosphere on the *TDN* 2012 Year-to-Date General Sire List (<u>click here</u>). His earnings this year are now more than \$7-million already--he's nearly \$5-million in front of the leading sire in North America.

Is this some sort of distortion? I don't think so. The races are all Invitational, but the great thing about Dubai, given its location and the timing, is that the races are open to all comers. Of course Americans say that since Meydan opened three years ago with the Tapeta surface and turf, it's not as U.S.-friendly as when they had the dirt at Nad Al Sheba. Considering the Jockey Club statistics which showed the fatal breakdown rate on North American dirt tracks virtually twice that on the all-weather tracks, I don't think there's too much sympathy outside the U.S. for that point of view. Stay home then, I guess would be the reply.

Incidentally, on that subject I read an interesting piece which correctly pointed out the all-weather tracks might have a natural statistical advantage because only racetracks catering to better horses could afford to install (and, especially, maintain, all-weather tracks). And a NYRA response pointed out the fatal breakdown rate on their dirt tracks was similar to the AW tracks. OK, so if we could ever get back to the point where the industry recognizes the fatal breakdown rate as an important a statistic as the rest of the world realizes it is, let them keep dirt--as long as the fatal breakdown rate is no worse than that for the AW tracks.

You know how we talk about "shooting ourselves in the foot?" If the U.S. Thoroughbred industry doesn't get over its love affair with speed at the expense of safety, it's going to be more like taking the gun and pointing it straight at our head. In other words, it's suicide.


Meanwhile, while we fiddle and Rome burns, the rest of the world is out there making the money. In Dubai, they pay down to sixth. So, for the eight-race Thoroughbred card, there were 48 money-earning spots. A total of 39 sires had runners earn money in the Dubai races on World Cup night. These are listed, in order of progeny earnings on the night, in the accompanying table (*p12*). As you can easily see, three sires--all European--earned more in one race each than even Scat Daddy has in the entire first three months of the calendar year to date.

Nine stallions had progeny earnings of \$1-million or more on the night--and, let me reiterate, in my view absolutely this money should be counted for sires' progeny earnings tables. But here are the really sobering statistics for North American interests: of the 39 sires, 18 are or were European, and they sired the earners of \$21.7-million--80% of the money. *Cont. p11*

Weekly Sales Ticker

"The signs really are positive after the winter mixed sales and first few 2-year-old sales of the year: though the numbers catalogued are down a further 7% (and down 37% since the corresponding 2008 sales, before The Crash), the number sold is down just 1% from 2011, reflecting a much improved clearance rate (that must be at the mixed sales, he joked). Ten Southern Hemisphere sires had money-earners (I did not include the Australian-bred Galileo filly, Mahbooba, who earned \$150,000 by running fifth in the Sheema Classic, as none of the other sires dual-hemisphered except maybe for one or two years)-five from Australia, four from South Africa, and one from Argentina. They earned \$2,410,000, or 9% of the total. Only eight North American sires had money-earners, totaling \$2,140,000--just 8% of the total. And three sires who now stand in Japan (but were all imported there after siring the respective runners) had the earners of \$750,000--just 3% of the total. Of course, they had the World Cup winner last year. So let's see: \$27-million in purses: European sires 80%, North American sires 8%. Get the picture?

Monterosso is the fifth Group 1 winner from Dubawi's first Northern Hemisphere crop, now 5-year-olds. Runner-up to Darley's Irish-based Shamardal on the 2009 European Freshman Sire List, Dubawi had, between April and June, 2010, with his first 3-year-olds: Worthadd, in Italy, won the G3 Premio Paroli (Italian 2000 Guineas), then later the G2 Italian Derby; on the first day of May, Makfi stunned the crowd by winning the G1 English 2000 Guineas; and Monterosso himself won the GII King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot, over 12 furlongs, in June.

Later in the year Makfi won the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, and Poet's Voice won another top-class Group 1 mile race, the Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. Lucky Nine won a Group 1 in Hong Kong over a mile early in 2011, and later last year Dubawi Heights won two Grade I races in California. The German colt Waldpark, winner of last year's G1 German Derby, is the only Group 1 winner so far from Dubawi's second crop. Dubawi was a miler, by Dubai Millennium, I believe still considered by Sheikh Mohammed the best horse he ever owned--so it's a pleasant irony that he's turning out to be the kind of sire Sheikh Mohammed thought Dubai Millennium would have been.

Three of Dubawi's six Northern Hemipshere-sired Group 1/Grade I winners are milers, or best at a mile: Makfi, Poet's Voice, and Worthadd. But three definitely get further: Dubawi Heights won Grade I's in California last year over nine and 10 furlongs; Waldpark's German Derby win was over 12 furlongs; and, as we saw last weekend, Monterosso is very effective at 10 furlongs, and won the King Edward VII over 12 furlongs. So that's a big plus, and also a very positive indicator about an emerging World Top 12 sire, that they can be effective from eight to 12 fulongs.

Dubawi's production of black-type horses in his first two crops makes pretty amazing reading. We think he had 234 named foals in his first two crops, then 75 in the crop which are 3-year-olds this year. Of 234 named foals in his first two (Northern Hemisphere) crops, he has 18 Group/Graded SW (7.7%); 31 Black-Type Winners (13.2%); and no fewer than 52 black-type horses in all (22.2%)--these are amazing statistics in this day and age. He's the second completely homegrown World Top 12 sire produced by Sheikh Mohammed's operation in the last five years (the first: Street Cry, sire of Street Sense and Zenyatta in his first crop).

His third crop, by the way, has seven black-type horses so far from around 75 foals; his fourth crop, 2-year-olds of 2012, numbers just 58 foals. That's too bad, but so what, we already know what we need to know: Dubawi is pretty certainly the best young sire in the world. HANA's ratings are based on an algorithm designed by board member Bill Weaver which uses studies and empirical data regarding horseplayer value and handle, takeout rate, field size, wager variety, pool size and signal distribution to come up with a composite score. Tampa Bay Downs was ranked second in the study, followed by Gulfstream Park, Churchill Downs and Oaklawn Park. HANA is a non-affiliated grassroots group of horseplayers. The group's website, www.horseplayersassociation.org, allows horseplayers

to sort racetrack data within various categories.

(US\$127,303). Hip <u>32</u> shares his second dam with the brilliant sprinter Airwave (GB) (Air Express {Ire}), who has already produced the 2010 G2 Queen Mary S. runner-up and listed-winning Meow (Ire) (Storm Cat). From Norman Williamson's Oak Tree Stud, the

February foal cost £30,000 as a yearling at Doncaster's Premier Yearling Sale in August, and will race in the colors of Pearl Bloodstock. "I'll talk to Sheikh Fahad and decide on a trainer in the next few days," Redvers told *Racing Post.* "He looked the complete package; he was just all speed, and breezed in a phenomenal time."

A Bright Start...

Yesterday's trading began in positive fashion, with the very first juvenile in the ring selling for £70,000 (US\$111,392). The sole representative of WinStar Farm resident Harlan's Holiday, he is a May-foaled halfbrother to the stakes winner Mountain Mambo (Mt. Livermore) from the extended family of Swain (Ire). He was knocked down to Jane Allison, whose bidding was done by Hugo Merry. "I've bought him for Paul Roy; he will be trained by Ed Dunlop," Merry told the *Post*. "Paul has been lucky with American-breds, and this horse was one of the nicest colts in the sale." **Cont. p3**

Hip 3, an Acclamation (GB) half-sister to the 2010 G3 Round Tower S. third Big Issue (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), continued the early momentum when selling to Angie Loder Bloodstock for £38,000 (US\$60,470). From Ballycullen Stables, the March foal has a handful of smart distaffers on her page, such as the group winner Jazz Princess (Ire) (Bahhare) and champion Blue Duster, along with her descendants Fantasia (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Pink Symphony (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). Acclamation was later responsible for another indemand 2-year-old that provided the highest price of her sex on the day. Hip 33, Bansha House Stables's March-foaled granddaughter of the 1999 G3 Premio Primi Passi heroine Palanca (GB) (Inchinor {GB}), sold to Ron Harris for £50,000 (US\$79,566). That trainer also paid £60,000 (US\$95,468) for Kilminfoyle House Stud's hip 73, the only colt catalogued by Invincible Spirit (Ire) who is a half-brother to the multiple groupwinning miler Hurricane Alan (Ire) (Mukaddamah). Also selling for that amount were sons of Exceed and Excel (Aus) and Red Clubs (Ire). Hillwood Stud consigned the former as hip 95, and the half-brother to the listedplaced Powerful Speed (GB) (Compton Place {GB}) from the extended family of Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) was the most expensive purchase by the leading buyers SackvilleDonald Agency. Noel Quinlan snapped up the Red Clubs consigned by Tally-Ho Stud's draft as hip 47, whose pedigree is light on black-type, but not short on individual winners.

American Sires In Demand...

As expected, there was a rush for the choice representatives of American bloodlines, and another member of the Kilminfoyle draft captured the imagination in late afternoon. By Speightstown, the sire of this auction's finest graduate Bapak Chinta, hip 75 is a son of stakes winner Bond Queen (Stormy Atlantic) and was snapped up by Blandford Bloodstock for £65,000 (US\$103,424). Speightstown's other juvenile to cause a splash was a colt from the draft of leading vendors Mocklershill. A half-brother to stakes winner Lemon Juice (Johannesburg), hip 12 was knocked down to Gill Richardson Bloodstock for £42,000 (US\$66,828). Mocklershill's best individual sale came courtesy of a son of Officer, who was secured by Bobby O'Ryan for £43,000 (US\$68,422). Hip 54 is out of the stakes winner and producer Willow Rush (Wild Rush). Another with a smart American pedigree was Hawthorn Villa Stud's Tapit colt consigned as hip 69. His dam is the high-class Baroness Thatcher (Johannesburg), who took the 1997 GIII Santa Ysabel S. and narrowly missed out on a top-level win on more than one occasion. He was bought by Jane Allison Bloodstock for £50,000.

This year's renewal was always going to struggle to live up to the 2011 increases of 56% and 60%, respectively, in average and median, and that was the case, with those figures dropping by almost 7% and 10%. Full results can be viewed on <u>www.goffs.com</u>.
