NATIONAL TREASURE

Sent off at odds of 14-1 that would have been scarcely believable 12 months ago, Al Shaqab Racing's **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}) once again turned Longchamp's G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe into a procession to become only the seventh horse to win the great race twice, and the first since Alleged in

1978. Unlike last year when she was trapped outside, the bay--who had been winless in three starts in 2014--was buried on the rail throughout and it was clear in early stretch that Thierry Jarnet's only problem was when to let her fly. Striking the front passing the quarter pole, the filly who

had looked a shadow of her former self when only fourth in the G1 Prix Vermeille over this track and trip last time Sept. 14 reproduced her renowned dynamism to put her rivals to the sword. At the line, with her rider saluting the crowd, she had produced a remarkable career finale with a comfortable two-length margin to spare over **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), with **Taghrooda (GB)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) 1 1/4 lengths behind in third. "With all the problems we have had, I found it tricky dealing with the people who said she should be retired already," an emotional Criquelette Head-Maarek commented. "Last year, I thought she would win, but this year I was coming with a filly who was not 100%. For me, she is a very special horse. Sheikh Joaan was very nice to me and never lost faith." **Cont. p3**

FOUND FINDS HER WAY HOME FIRST

Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), tabbed a **"TDN Rising Star"** after her winning debut at The Curragh Aug. 23, stamped her authority on a solid-looking renewal of Sunday's G1 Total Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp. Sent off the 3-1 second favorite, the daughter of multiple Group 1 heroine Red Evie (Ire) (Intikhab) surged to the lead with 150 meters to run and powered clear to score by 2 1/2 lengths. "She's a big filly with a lovely temperament and you would imagine she will get much more than a mile next year," trainer Aidan O'Brien said. "She has all the right attributes. She has the pace to be a Guineas filly and she might get a mile and a half, so she's very exciting." Coolmore stallion Galileo missed out on the Longchamp juvenile exacta when Found's stablemate **Gleneagles (Ire)** was disqualified from first in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, giving the win to **Full Mast** (Mizzen Mast). **Cont. p8**

the starting gate of the G1 Breeders' Cup Distaff yesterday with an upset victory in Keeneland's G1 Juddmonte Spinster S, as heavily favored **Close Hatches** (First Defense) faltered to fourth. Shortly after the break, Close Hatches, who was coming off three straight Grade I wins, established the early lead and ticked off the first quarter in :24.19

as GII Iowa Oaks runner-up **Ria Antonia** (Rockport Harbor) pressed the pace and Don't Tell Sophia spotted the field about 10 lengths. After a half in :47.47, Ria Antonia moved up alongside Close Hatches and overtook that rival on the far turn as Don't Tell Sophia began to pick off foes on the bend. Angled out four wide at the top of the lane, Don't Tell Sophia continued to rally, and despite running on the incorrect lead, caught Ria Antonia in the stretch to win going away. **Molly Morgan** (Ghostzapper) rallied to complete the trifecta. **Cont. p12**

Unwanted as an Arqana October yearling, Treve rose from relative obscurity to stardom in a short spell last summer when inflicting impressive defeats on high-class opponents Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Wild Coco (Ger) (Shirocco {Ger}) in Chantilly's G1 Prix de Diane and the G1 Prix Vermeille, respectively. Her brilliant display in this event last October was all the more meritorious while breaking from a disadvantageous stall in 15 on testing ground with the likes of Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) in attendance and visually as lasting as any of its kind in recent memory. Despite the scintillating nature of her performance, it is hard to escape the influence of this contest's weight-for-age bias toward the sophomores on top of the sex allowance, and she had to return this year to prove herself again. On her return here, she faced real adversity with the first of those benefits stripped away along with the feeling of invincibility she had carried along with her during her pomp in 2013. Her return short-neck second to Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) in the G1 Prix Ganay over 10 1/2 furlongs here Apr. 27 had been met with shock, but that was replaced by a sense of disillusionment as she scrambled into third in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 18. Diagnosed with back problems after that eclipse, she was quietly restored by Criquette Head-Maarek as the world slowly forgot her and cast her achievements to history, but her wily conditioner, with her bank of stored knowledge and understanding of training the racehorse, persevered. Still indignant after Treve had put in a relatively flat effort when fourth behind fillies she would have toyed with last year on her comeback in the Vermeille, Head-Maarek's voice was alone in the wilderness in the build-up to the latest renewal.

Early evidence in the race itself was conclusive that she was back to her bullish best as she tugged at Jarnet's grip around six lengths off the typically generous pace. Tracking the year-younger filly sensation of this season, Avenir Certain (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}), throughout, she tanked along the "false straight" and when the seam opened on the inner with a quarter mile remaining, quickly brushed aside that dual Classic winner and was clear. Flintshire and the wide runner Taghrooda gave honest pursuit, but Treve's acceleration set her apart once more and her rider was able to savor the last 100 meters.

"I've heard so many things, but today she has proved that she's come back to her best," Head-Maarek said.

"When I saw her going so well in the false straight, I knew that she was going to win. We had a fantastic race along the rail, not wasting a meter and everything opened up in front. She has that fantastic turn of foot and that's what she did again. I said to Sheikh Joaan after the Vermeille, 'Please don't rule her out. Let's run her in the Arc and we'll see' and I really believed she could win again. Every time she had run this year, she had run worse than the time before, but you have to keep believing in what you do."

Al Shaqab's racing advisor Harry Herbert paid tribute to the trainer's skills afterwards. "If we'd listened to Criquette all the way along, then we'd have believed it," he said. "She's a remarkable trainer and this is a remarkable filly. She has never lost faith in this filly and this week she called me and said, 'Harry, I've just seen a piece of work and she's definitely back' so it was very exciting. This filly means more to Sheikh Joaan than any horse he owns and she carries the flag of a nation--of Qatar--with her. It was a remarkable performance, a brilliant ride and we don't see animals like this very often." **cont. p4**

“She’ll be retired now, as she has little more to prove,” Harry Herbert continued. “She has proved the doubters wrong and now she’s off to the Sheikh’s stud and we’ll decide on her first husband.” Herbert also paid tribute to veterinarian Duncan Moir. “Duncan Moir, a vet with Al Shaqab, has done a remarkable job to get her back and feet right,” he said. “There are so many people involved and I’m just a spokesperson, but I have to tell you how incredible the people behind this filly are.”

Runner-Up Breeders’ Cup Bound...

For last year’s G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner Flintshire, the effort represented a career-high for the Juddmonte homebred and racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe said of the runner-up, “He has run a very good race and we always knew he was good, but he has to have it good or faster. He is a fresh horse and the plan is to go to the GI Breeders’ Cup Turf [at Santa Anita Nov. 1].”

Taghrooda, who was forced to race wide throughout, ran with credit after being up near the pace and jockey Paul Hanagan said of the G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. heroine, “I felt that she ran fantastically, but it was just a shame about that draw--I had to get after her early on just to get a good position. I just saw a flash up the inside. Treve is some horse.”

Say What?

Treve:

Thierry Jarnet, who was notching a fourth edition after also scoring on Subotica (Fr) in 1992 and Carnegie (Ire) two years later, was in turn joining an elite band of five riders to hold the joint record in the race. “I was I bit worried after the Vermeille, but she worked much better last Tuesday and, I knew coming here, she was going to run a much better race than she had recently,” he commented. “When I passed the post, it was just an amazing feeling with all my career going through my head. This filly winning a second Arc means she’s a legend now and, for me, to be at the same level as Yves Saint-Martin, Freddy Head, Pat Eddery and Olivier Peslier, is just great.”

Taghrooda:

Shadwell's Racing Manager Angus Gold added, "She's going to be retired this year. I'll check with Sheikh Hamdan and [trainer] John [Gosden], but the only other option is the [Oct. 18] G1 British Champions Fillies & Mares S. at Ascot, although Hadaatha (Ire) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) may run there after running so well in the Opera. Taghrooda won't go for the Breeders' Cup--she's too valuable to the stud to go there. She's won an Oaks, a King George and been third in an Arc, so we couldn't have asked for more. We've had an amazing year and she's been the star of it. What's been so much fun for Sheikh Hamdan is that she's homebred."

Kingston Hill:

Trainer Roger Varian was delighted with the effort of the G1 St Leger winner **Kingston Hill (GB)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), who was in front of the main peloton throughout and stayed on to be fourth as the closers gathered in the straight. "He ran a huge race and I'm really proud of him," Varian said. "You've got to do one or the other from 20. If you're stuck in two minds, you get posted four wide in midfield. We had a plan to go forward and I thought that Andrea [Atzeni] rode him very well and gave him every chance. He'll stay in training and has all the fancy races to look forward to. Hopefully, we'll be back on this day next year to have another go."



Runner-up over this five-furlong stretch in the G3 Prix du Petit Couvert last time Sept. 14, **Move In Time (GB)** (Monsieur Bond {Ire}) was one of the lucky ones who had enough daylight in a rough-house renewal of the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp. Finding enough space throughout and the post in time, he provided

trainer David O'Meara and jockey Danny Tudhope with a second top-level success in the space of a month. Formerly trained by Bryan Smart, the chestnut was runner-up in the G3 Cornwallis S. over this trip at Ascot as a juvenile, but made limited progress during

his next two seasons with a third placing in the 2011 G3 Sapphire S. at The Curragh and a win in the Listed Rous S. back at Ascot later that season among his finer efforts.

Transferred to O'Meara as his fortunes dipped markedly during 2012, he regained his mojo immediately and his fourth start for his new yard yielded a second in the G3 Prix de Saint-Georges here last May. This term, his sole success came in a conditions event at this distance at Newmarket July 18, but he had again gone close over this circuit when denied a half length by his compatriot Mirza (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) on his prep for this highlight. Sent off at an inflated 30-1, he had vital space on his right throughout the early stages as he raced on the edge of the stand's side group taking a tow from the speedy fellow Brits Stepper Point (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) and Hot Streak (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}). Looking as if he was going nowhere passing the quarter pole with Tudhope grafting in the saddle, he had the room that Moviesta was denied on the rail and eventually found top gear to wear down Rangali in the shade of the post and score by a head, with the same margin back to the unlucky Moviesta in third. For O'Meara, the win capped a dream spell after the success of the stable's G Force (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}) in the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. "He's been to the track twice and been second both times," he said. "I thought we had a good chance, but the draw seemed a negative. He had a good trip and was given a good ride." Tudhope added, "There was a lot of shouting and people getting tight on the rail, but I managed to get a little gap on the outside and when that came it worked out well."

Rangali's trainer Henri-Alex Pantall said of the runner-up, "It was a great performance and his best yet. We knew we had a good horse when he won the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene and he showed it again today, so he has a nice future."

The race was full of hard-luck stories, with the 6-4 favorite Sole Power (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) one of the exceptions as Richard Hughes described him as "quiet" and reluctant to take a gap with a quarter mile to race. Among the unfortunate were last year's winner Maarek (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), who blew the start but finished like a train; the aforementioned Mirza, who was denied a run initially with 300 meters remaining; and Spirit Quartz (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who also found room too late.

While nobody could argue that Gleneagles was not clear best at the end of Longchamp's G1 Qatar Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, it was a late indiscretion that cost him the prize as the hard-and-fast French stewarding rules came into force again. Idling late on with the race

in safe keeping and leaning down toward the rail as a result, the 5-2 favorite intimidated Full Mast, who in turn was forced to take the ground of the third Territories (Ire), near the line and the damage was done. Khalid Abdullah's Full Mast, who had last won a

tactical renewal of the course-and-distance prep, the Sept. 7 G3 Prix la Rochette, from the front, had traveled easily with a lead from The Wow Signal (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) throughout the early stages as Joseph O'Brien allowed Gleneagles to settle into an easy rhythm towards the back. As the 4-1 shot Full Mast moved to the front seemingly full of run with a quarter mile remaining, his lead proved short-lived, with Gleneagles taking command out wide approaching the furlong pole.

A length ahead soon after, the Ballydoyle raider pulled himself up as he had done last time in the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. while Full Mast rallied gamely for Thierry Thulliez down towards the fence. The interference caused by the first-past-the-post was too late to have had a genuine effect on the result, but under the French rules Gleneagles had to be put behind Territories after that rival was forced to snatch up due to the concertina caused by the favorite. Trainer Criquelette Head-Maarek, who did not contend the initial result, said of Full Mast, "I think the best horse won today. My horse lacks a bit of race experience--he's won twice and both times dominated very easily. So when he came, O'Brien's came very quickly to him and he looked and was green and then he came back. He [Gleneagles] did hang and could have stopped me from being closer. He was not finished in the last 100 yards and was shying away from the other horse." Head-Maarek added that her charge would now be prepared for the French Guineas. "He is a top-class horse, but now he will be put away for next season and be targeted at the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains."

Michael Tabor said of the demoted third, "He was the best horse in the race. I wouldn't be tempted to back him for the [English] Derby, but for the Guineas."



His record on straight tracks entering this contest was exemplary, with wins in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot in October and Newbury's G1 Lockinge S. May 17 alongside second and third placings, respectively, in the last two renewals of the Jacques le Marois. Tardy from the gates and in last early, the 4-1 second choice was under the shove with around 10 lengths to find on the leader Noozhoh Canarias at the top of the straight and still had more than five to make up with over a furlong to race. Surging once horses started to come back around him, the blinkered bay flashed past the long-time leader and Gordon Lord Byron with 75 meters remaining en route to an ultimately snug two-length success from the latter.

Second in Longchamp’s G1 Qatar Prix du Cadran in 2012 and fifth last year, High Jinx returned to make it third time lucky under an enterprising front-running ride from Ryan Moore. First coming to the fore as a stayer when runner-up to Times Up (GB) (Olden Times {GB}) in the 2012 G2 Lonsdale Cup at York and G2 Doncaster Cup, the bay was the nearest pursuer of Molly Malone (Fr) (Lomitas {GB}) without threatening at 2 1/2-lengths distance on heavy ground in this contest and was having only his second subsequent outing when again runner-up to Times Up in the 2013 Doncaster Cup.

Closing from behind when fifth behind Altano (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) 12 months ago, he was ridden from the front when partnered by Ryan Moore for the first time since his 4-year-old days when third in the Listed Further Flight S. over 14 furlongs at Nottingham on his seasonal bow Apr. 9. Held up once more when fifth in the May 16 G2 Yorkshire Cup at that distance, High Jinx beat all bar the classy Brown Panther (GB) (Shirocco {Ger}) in Sandown’s G3 Henry II S. over an extended two miles 13 days later. Forwardly ridden by Christophe Soumillon when tackling the Listed Prix du Carrousel over nearly two miles at Maisons-Laffitte July 27, he ended a long losing run with a determined effort there before Moore returned to try and force the issue in the G3 Prix Gladiateur over the same trip here last time Sept. 14. Losing out when third to Bathyrhon there, his rider was undeterred as he re-employed the front-running tactic soon after the start. Stealing a clear advantage turning into the “false straight” with his rivals playing a waiting game, the 4-1 shot kept grinding in the drive to the line to see off Pale Mimosa and Bathyrhon and beat the latter by a neck. “We just lost out [with Ribbons (GB) (Manduro {Ger}) in the Opera], so this was nice,” trainer James Fanshawe commented. “I was a little bit concerned about the trip and thought we should take him back, but Ryan was determined to make it a stamina test as he was convinced he would stay well. He was completely right. He’s probably had a hard race there and although we’ll enter him in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak [at Longchamp Oct. 26] we’ll take our time and see how he comes back. If he’s okay, we should try as France has been very lucky for us this year.”

After sweeping Saturday's Grade I juvenile colt races with Daredevil (More Than Ready) in Belmont's GI Foxwoods Champagne S. and Carpe Diem (Giant's Causeway) in Keeneland's GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity, trainer Todd Pletcher added another feather in his cap when Blofeld annexed the GII Futurity at the Elmont oval. Blofeld, the fifth foal out of MSW Storm Minstrel (Storm Cat), went to Woods Edge Farm for \$135,000 as Keeneland November weanling before reselling to Red Wings for \$275,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. He went through the ring one more time, going to Greathouse Prop. and JSM Equine for \$225,000 after breezing in [:10 flat](#) at the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale.

Backed as the prohibitive 1-2 favorite in his five-horse debut upstate Aug. 14, Blofeld stalked a freewheeling leader and had difficulty changing leads in the stretch, but straightened late en route to one-length victory, good for a 4 *Thoro-Graph* figure.

As Cinco Charlie shot to the lead out of the stalls, Blofeld, who appeared much more seasoned in this second go, pressed the pace from along the rail. The grey had to steady down the backstretch and, as Hebronville rallied to challenge Cinco Charlie in the stretch, Blofeld was still cruising along the inside in third.

Confident pilot John Velazquez went to the whip in midstretch and the grey responded by zipping up the rail to take the late lead and hitting the wire in front.

"It wasn't the trip I was expecting, but he still won," Velazquez explained. "We got squeezed out of a spot near the half-mile pole. We were behind the top two horses and he was getting a little bit intimidated, but once he got his momentum going he came back again. I'm proud of him, because they're babies, they don't get squeezed and try to come back again in the same spot. I was getting worried that he may not get there, but once he

got close enough to the other horses he got into another gear."

Following the race, Pletcher offered, "I thought he lost his momentum when he got squeezed out on the turn. It took him a while to regain it and I thought it might have left him with too much to do, but he put in an explosive last sixteenth of a mile. The plan going into this race was to go next to the [GII] Nashua [at Aqueduct Nov. 2], but I will talk to the connections and see if that's still the plan." **cont. p16**

Lawn Ranger, who was purchased for just \$50,000 at the Fasig-Tipton July sale in 2013, kicked off his career with a runner-up effort behind Danny Boy as the 6-5 favorite going a mile over the Ellis Park turf Aug. 1. He got off the mark in pillar-to-post fashion next time going a mile at Kentucky Downs Sept. 13. Lawn Ranger was lightly bumped at the break, and sat about fourth lengths off the leader in third through the first turn. After the half, Lawn Ranger began to creep into contention behind the dueling leaders and swung out four wide on the bend to begin his stretch run. The bay caught the leader at the eighth pole and found the wire just ahead of the rallying duo of Danny Boy and favorite Can't Happen Here.

"I felt like he needed to go to another level," McPeck offered. "His race at Kentucky Downs was a pleasant surprise. He seems like a horse that's maturing, and I think he's gonna be even better as a 3-year-old. Our fingers are crossed that will happen."

As for running in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, McPeck said, "I imagine [we will go]. That's a pretty easy [decision]. As long as everything goes smooth, and I think it should. I'm a little concerned about the speed of the race track out there in California. You get one chance at this, right?"

The Conquest colorbearer graduated next out trying the turf here Aug. 3 and rallied to just get up in time to win the one-mile GII Natalma S. over the yearling turf, earning a 9 *Thoro-Graph* figure. The bay settled into a stalking position through the first turn and down the backstretch. She moved up to sit a little closer to the pace as the field neared the turn and split foes at the top of the lane to challenge Del Cielo. The Casse trainee soon gained the advantage, shook free late and finished comfortably ahead of Brooklynsway. "She's doing really well and we're really happy with how she has progressed," said Kathryn Sullivan, assistant to winning trainer Mark Casse. "She's a lovely filly, she's smart and everything is going the way we want it to go right now."

EXPANDED SPA FALL SALE BEGINS TODAY

Fasig-Tipton will hold the third renewal of its Saratoga Fall Sale today and tomorrow in Saratoga Springs, NY. A total of 431 broodmares/broodmare prospects, horses of racing, weanlings and yearlings will be offered, up from a catalog of 279 12 months ago and necessitating a switch to a two-day format. Monday's session will begin at 2 p.m. and will feature mares and horses of racing age, while Tuesday's session kicks off at 10 a.m and focuses on weanlings (193 catalogued) and yearlings (107 catalogued). This is the first year that yearlings have been included in the sale.

Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. hopes to build on the sale's momentum, which has been aided by an ever-growing New York-bred program and the exploits of a pair of 2013 sale graduates on the track.

"The New York-bred program is the poster child for state-bred programs in the United States," Browning said. "The racing opportunities for New York-breds are tremendous, and they continue to improve and increase each year. As a result, the quality of horses that are being raised and bred in New York has improved as well in line with the racing. So there's tremendous interest in the New York-bred program, plus last year we had the good fortune of selling a couple nice horses of racing age that went on to achieve success. Throughout the United States this year, the New York-breds have had great success...The perception of New York-breds has certainly undergone a transformation and people recognize that they can be competitive at the highest levels both inside and outside the state of New York."

Last year's topper was then-3-year-old Dixie Union filly Secret Union, who was consigned by trainer Kieran McLaughlin, agent as a racing/broodmare prospect and secured by Ken and Sarah Ramsey for \$150,000. Also from last year's McLaughlin consignment were a pair of Medaglia d'Oro geldings--Lochte and Valid--purchased by Carolyn Vogel of Crossed Sabres Farm for \$60,000 and \$115,000, respectively. Both were transferred to conditioner Marcus Vitali, and Lochte went on to post an upset victory in February's GI Gulfstream Park Turf H., while Valid annexed July's GII Monmouth Cup.

Among McLaughlin's 2014 Saratoga Fall Sale consignment is GSP **North Slope** (Elusive Quality) ([hip 128](#)), winner of a solid Belmont allowance last time Sept. 19; and unraced 3-year-old **Seagate** (Distorted Humor), a half-brother to recent GIII Pilgrim S. winner Imperia (Medaglia d'Oro) out of MGISW Cocoa Beach (Chi) (Doneraile Court) ([hip 130](#)).

One broodmare highlight could be **Roots Run Deep** (Forestry), consigned to the sale as [hip 86](#) by Rhapsody Farm LLC/Hidden Lake Farm LLC, Agents for Sequel Thoroughbreds & Hidden Lake Farm. The 6-year-old mare is out of MGSP Indy Glory (A.P. Indy), a full-sister to Grade I winner and sire Stephen Got Even who is already responsible for Artemis Agrotera (Roman Ruler), among the likely favorites for the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint off of wins in the GI Ballerina S. and GII Gallant Bloom H. Roots Run Deep sells in foal to Desert Party.

A long list of young sires, both as covering stallions and with weanlings, are also spotlighted in the catalogue.

"People are always interested and excited to see the foals by the new stallions and also have an opportunity to buy mares in foal to young stallions," Browning offered. "The market's going to continue to gravitate towards the more desirable individuals. I don't think there's a buyer anywhere who's going to buy a foal just because of who it's by. But certainly there are some very interesting and promising young stallions represented at this sale."

Browning is hopeful for the overall market over the next two days, but is also realistic in his expectations.

"I think there will be significant demand for what are perceived to be the quality offerings, but we have to be realistic with the ones who may not be perceived to be as commercially desirable," he noted. "For those, it probably won't be an easy marketplace. The buying public is going to be selective, and they don't want every horse, they want the horses they perceive to be quality."

"He's got a lot of ability," winning rider Corey Nakatani said of Luck of the Kitten. "He's got a high-cruising speed, which is good for 2-year-olds and he's a big strong colt. I have to thank [trainer] Wesley [Ward] and the Ramseys for giving me the chance to ride him. I got to figure him out a little bit today, and hopefully, we can use this as a stepping stone. He relaxed really nice for me and had plenty left, so I think the next step could be the Breeders' Cup. He deserves a spot in there, I think."

The strong selling of Session One continued into Session Two and the sale ended with an aggregate of R32,510,000 (US\$2,863,812), an average of

R195,843 (US\$17,252) and a median of R150,000 (US\$13,214), up R50,000 from the previous year. Lot 2, selling for R1.5 million during Session One, remained the sale topper, with Balmoral Stud CC heading the vendor list with 30

lots selling for R7,225,000 (US\$636,452), while Mayfair Speculators topped the buyers list, signing for nine lots for R2,880,000 (US\$253,670).

"We are very happy with the sale and the quality of the lots on offer. This was a sale where there was something for everyone and the fact that the median rose by 50% showed solid growth across the market place. We now look forward to the CTS Ready To Run Sale to be held on the Oct. 31 in Johannesburg," commented Adrian Todd, chief operating officer of CTS.

"The vendors are happy, it was a solid sale and we are delighted with the aggregate achieved," added CTS Chairman Chris van Niekerk.

David Allan of Allan Bloodlines signed for the imported [lot 164](#) at R1.15 million (US\$101,304) on behalf of overseas interests. By Henrythenavigator out of the Australian mare Ladybird Blue (Aus), the colt had galloped well and looked the part, making it easy for Allan to sign the ticket. The colt is another who will be trained by Vaughan Marshall.

[Lot 106](#), named Beyond Limits, produced a superb gallop on Thursday and it certainly did not go unnoticed. By Archipenko out of the Dansili (GB) mare Desarmante (Ire), he hails from the family of Kingmambo and Miesque, and although the bidding started slowly, he was eventually knocked down for R1 million (US\$88,090) to up and coming trainer Brett Crawford. "I am very privileged to have him," Crawford said. "He put up an exceptional gallop and he has always been a beautiful horse, even as a foal."

[Lot 100](#), a Silvano (Ger) colt out of the Royal Chalice mare Crystal Chalice (SAf), had been the talk horse all week and he certainly did not disappoint in the ring. Bidding started at R100,000 and rose quickly before Mayfair Speculators got the final bid at R650,000 (US\$57,258). "He is a lovely scopey Silvano and he will be trained by Dennis Drier. He stands over a lot of ground and we think he will be a classic horse," said Derek Brugman, speaking on behalf of the buyer.

Van Niekerk is known as being a shrewd buyer, so it came as no surprise when he also snapped up [Lot 169](#), the very imposing Dynasty (SAf) colt out of Lyrical Linda (SAf), the dam of two graded winners and herself a Grade 1 winner, for R650,000. Sean Tarry trained the colt's half brother Lance (SAf) and he was extremely pleased to be able to train the Dynasty. "It is nice to have a Dynasty colt from such a phenomenal female family and it's a bonus that he has a ticket for the 2016 CTS Million Dollar," said Tarry.
