SOLID START TO TATTERSALLS OCTOBER

By Emma Berry and Kelsey Riley

Tattersalls kicked off its flagship October Yearling Sale with its three-day Book 1 portion yesterday, and despite a lack of fireworks that was witnessed during this session 12 months ago when a Galileo colt was hammered down for a record 3.6 million guineas--only to be bested the following day by a 5 million guineas filly by the same sire--the

sale posted solid results.

A patchy start to the day's trade led to a drop in clearance rate to 74%--down six points on the equivalent day last year. It is important to note, however, that last year's first session was the strongest, aided by the Galileo colt. With a high of 775,000gns this time around--one of eight yearlings sold in excess of 500,000gns on the day, compared to 10 last year--turnover fell by 23% to 20,185,000gns, with the average also down, by 11%, to 188,645gns. Despite the drop, however, the average was the second highest ever for the session. A strong median of 140,000gns--the highest ever for opening day of Book 1--represented a rise of 19%. **Cont. p3**

A decline of 23% in gross and 11% in average from the corresponding opening day of Tattersalls' October Book 1 yearling sale yesterday shouldn't be taken at face value as signaling some sort of dip in the market.

Last year's first day was particularly strong, and the universal consensus among theatre-goers this week is that today and tomorrow are considerably stronger sessions than yesterday's; it's alphabetical by dam over the three days, so it's just luck of the draw that way. Also there are 8% fewer catalogued

this year than last year; if anything, the likelihood is more that at the end of the three days the gross could be down by about that 8% and the average would remain level. The average was 207,501 gns. last year. **Cont. p13**



An Attractive Proposition...

Floors Stud has experienced its finest moments courtesy of the dual Guineas winner and five-time Group 1 victress Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}), but yesterday's sale of a 775,000gns Oasis Dream (GB) colt from the same family to John Ferguson was also a crowning moment for the Duke of Roxburghe's Scottish operation, as the highest-priced yearling the stud has ever sold. The previous high came courtesy of a

450,000gns Montjeu (Ire) colt out of Attraction at this sale last year.

"It was our highest ever by some margin," the Duke of Roxburghe noted of [lot 97](#). "I'm delighted for him to go to Sheikh Mohammed."

The January foal is the second produce of the winning Titivation (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), a half-sister to Attraction. Titivation's Danehill Dancer (Ire) colt made 135,000gns here last year to the bid of John Warren Bloodstock, who was the underbidder on this colt.

Ferguson also had to see off a bevy of other bidders, including Ibrahim Araci and Jon Kelly.

"He's a very nice, quality colt, a real athlete," Ferguson said. "He's a horse that's really thrived since we saw him in the summer, and he comes from a very good family."

Floors Stud has two to sell during today's second session--a Dubawi (Ire) half-brother to Grade/Group 1 winners Viva Pataca (GB) and Laughing (GB); and a Galileo colt out of Flirtation (GB) (Pursuit of Love {GB}),

Attraction's dam and this colt's second dam. Floors was also due to sell an Oasis Dream colt out of Attraction today, but that yearling was withdrawn.

Lot 97 was the second of three Oasis Dreams purchased by Ferguson on the day. The third came late in the session when he signed for [lot 142](#) for 625,000gns. Ferguson had to see off a stubborn Jamie McCalmont bidding on the opposite side of the ring for the son of G1 Prix de l'Opera winner Zee Zee Top (GB) (Zafonic).

The colt is a half to dual Group 1 winner Izzi Top (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), and Zee Zee Top is a half-sister to Group 1 winners Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Opera House (GB) (Sadler's Wells), both campaigned by Sheikh Mohammed.

"He's a very smooth, athletic horse, and a brother to an outstanding filly, and its a family that Sheikh Mohammed knows well," Ferguson explained. "It's a family that's been lucky for us."

Ferguson, who also signed for [Lot 36](#), an Oasis Dream colt out of the stakes-winning Seta (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), for 425,000gns, embarked on a spending spree of his own alongside Sheikh Mohammed and Princess Haya yesterday, signing for 11 lots for 4,015,000, making him the day's leading buyer by a wide margin.

Other notable purchases by Ferguson included [lot 74](#), a 400,000gns Sea the Stars (Ire) colt; and [lot 125](#), a 340,000gns Teofilo (Ire) colt.

Ferguson stayed in the fray through the end of the day, adding a 600,000gns colt by New Approach (Ire) to his haul late in the session. [Lot 147](#) is out of Ahla Wasahl (GB) (Dubai Destination), from the family of G1 Italian Oaks winner Menhoubah (Dixieland Band) and American sire Posse (Silver Deputy).

The colt was consigned by Genesis Green Stud, and Ahla Wasahl is a permanent boarder at the Swinburns' operation just outside Newmarket. This colt, her third foal, gave the family a sales-ring moment to remember.

"Her yearling last year was lovely, but this was just a really nice colt and lovely to deal with," said Michael Swinburn after hugging his tearful mother Doreen. "He has a great head on him--all the New Approaches seem to have such good temperaments--and this is a terrific result."

Dream Day for Juddmonte Sire...

Juddmonte's Oasis Dream was far and away the leading sire on the day, with nine sold for a total of 3,415,000gns and an average of 379,444gns. In addition to the aforementioned, his big prices also included [lot 19](#), a half-brother to GI Gamely S. and GI Yellow Ribbon S. winner Dubawi Heights (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). The colt has instantly recouped the 400,000gns spent buying his dam Rosie's Posy (Ire) (Suave Dancer) when she passed through the same ring carrying him in 2012. David Nagle was the buyer that day, and Barronstown Stud consigned the colt this time around, selling him for exactly the same sum to Angus Gold of Shadwell. Gold said, "The sire has been good to us and this horse is likely to stay a bit. He's a half-brother to a very good mare, consigned by a good nursery, and he looks like he'll make a lovely 3-year-old."

Sea the Stars (Ire) was the second leading sire on the day, with six sold for 1,790,000gns and an average of 298,333gns.

Euro Trip Fruitful for Solis/Litt...

The first yearlings of Zoffany (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) have been the subject of high praise this sales season, but it was the Group 1 winner's sister who stole the show on Tuesday when selling for 700,000gns from the draft of Croom House Stud. The charms of [lot 107](#), a late May

bay filly, were enough to convince American agents Jason Litt and Alex Solis to make her the top-priced female of the day, with Solis first seeing off Demi O'Byrne then Fiona Craig, who was the underbidder on behalf of Moyglare Stud.

First-time visitors to the October Sale at Tattersalls, Solis and Litt are making the most of their European sojourn and bought three yearlings in Ireland last week before taking in the Arc weekend in Paris en route to Newmarket.

"We were after a good-looking filly and we think we've found it in her," said Litt, who was acting for an undisclosed American client. "Dansili has done so well both here and in the States, and Zoffany going so well is a huge bonus."

As well as Zoffany, the filly's dam Tyranny (GB), a daughter of Machiavellian and Group 3 winner Dust Dancer (GB) (Suave Dancer), has produced the G3 Angelesey S. winner Wilshire Boulevard (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and two other winners. Her 2-year-old Galileo (Ire) filly was bought back for 600,000gns at Tattersalls last year and, named Knocknagree (Ire), is in training in Ireland with Jim Bolger for Croom House Stud owners Denis and Joan Brosnan.

Gordon-Watson Left Seeing Stars...

Charlie Gordon-Watson wasn't able to divulge the identity of his client, but the agent was kept busy during the first session of Book 1, signing for [lot 117](#), Hascombe & Valiant Studs' son of Sea The Stars (Ire), at 600,000gns. Out of the listed-placed Mark Of

Esteem (Ire) mare Victoria Cross (Ire), the colt is a half-brother to G2 Hardwicke S. winner Bronze Cannon (Lemon Drop Kid), who was trained by John Gosden at Clarehaven Stables. His younger sibling, however, will be trained just a little way along Newmarket's Bury Road at Freemason Lodge.

"He's going to Sir Michael Stoute," said Gordon-Watson. "He has a Classic pedigree, he's a Classic horse by a Classic sire, so let's hope for the best."

Seven lots later, the agent sprang back into action to claim an Oasis Dream colt from Flash Conroy's Glenvale Stud at 550,000gns. Amanda Skiffington bought the first foal of the winning Montjeu (Ire) mare Warling (Ire) [lot 124](#) and from the further family of stallions Westener (GB) and Voix Du Nord (Fr) last December for 195,000gns.

Gordon-Watson's seven purchases throughout Tuesday added 2,410,000gns to the day's turnover and put him in second place on the buyers' list behind Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor John Ferguson.

Montjeu to Magnier...

Nearing the midway mark of session one, no horse had yet breached the 500,000gns barrier, but that changed when [lot 66](#), the first of six Book 1 offerings from the final crop of Montjeu (Ire), strolled into the ring. Bidding was fierce, with John Warren and Ibrahim Araci also in on the action, but in the end it was Team Coolmore that prevailed for the handsome bay from Camas Park Stud for 575,000gns.

Montjeu, who died in 2012 at the age of 16, has been pivotal in the success of Coolmore's racing stable and stallion roster. His top sons to race for the operation including six-time Group/Grade 1 winner St Nicholas Abbey (Ire), Classic and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe victor Hurricane Run (Ire), triple Classic winner Camelot (GB) and Derby hero Pour Moi (Ire), and the latter two are both promising young sires at Coolmore. *cont. p7*

Pour Moi is represented by his first yearlings this year, while Camelot covered his first book earlier this year.

“All we’re trying to do is find the next Camelot or Pour Moi, and I suppose at the end of the day, so is everyone else,” said M.V. Magnier, who signed the ticket while standing alongside his father, John Magnier. “The guys really liked him. He’s a very nice horse, very athletic,” Magnier added.

Tim Hyde of Camas Park noted he was pleased with the price.

“You never know what a horse is going to bring, but we’re very happy with the price,” he said. “He’s a homebred, and a beautiful colt. He has a lot of quality and is a wonderful mover, so I hope he’s a great racehorse.”

Bred by Lynch Bages and Camas Park Stud, the February foal is a three-quarter brother to the Group 3-placed Lord High Admiral (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), and a half to two other stakes-placed winners. He goes back to a sire-producing family, as his third dam, Balidaress (GB) (Balidar {GB}), accounted for champion filly Park Appeal (GB), the dam of dual Group 1 winner and champion sire Cape Cross (Ire).

Magnier made more waves late in the day when going to 550,000gns for [lot 154](#), a Galileo (Ire) filly from Glenvale Stud. The May foal outdid her Group 3-placed full-brother Kingston Jamaica (Ire), who made 535,000gns here two years ago. She is also a full-sister to the stakes-placed Criteria (Ire). It is also the family of European champion filly and G1 Coronation S. winner Golden Opinion (Slew O’ Gold). Magnier also purchased a colt from the first crop of Coolmore sire Canford Cliffs (Ire) for 150,000gns.

“We’ve seen a few Cape Blancos and feel that he is potentially a very nice sire,” he said. Of lot 33, he added, “He’s a free-moving, proper type of horse.” Warren noted the colt had been purchased on behalf of a client of Highclere Racing.

New Approach Colt Gets the Blue Ribbon...

A New Approach (Ire) colt ([lot 51](#)) out of a sister to the great Soviet Song (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) was bought for 300,000gns with a single bid from Sheikh Fahad’s representative Hannah Wall. Consigned by Kirtlington

Stud, the son of Sister Act (GB) has been the subject of two decent updates since the catalogue was printed, with his half-sister Ribbons (GB) (Manduro {Ger}) having won the G1 Prix Jean Romanet in August before finishing runner-up to We Are (Fr) in last weekend’s Prix

de l’Opera at Longchamp.

Wall said, “He’s a lovely horse and he’s been bought for Qatar Racing. I’m not sure who will train him yet but we’re pleased to get him, we loved him.” **cont. p8**



Not many Thoroughbreds can claim to have 10,000 breeders, but this colt is a rare exception, as he was bred by the members of the Elite Racing Club, which has enjoyed such success with the James Fanshawe-trained Ribbons this summer. Elite Racing's distinctive white and black spotted silks were also carried to Group 1 glory on five occasions by the colt's illustrious aunt Soviet Song, who was another to emanate from Fanshawe's Pegasus Stables.

"This is an absolutely lovely result for the club with the one sad note being that Sister Act died foaling an Exceed And Excel filly earlier this year," said Chris Budgett of Kirtlington Stud, where Sister Act was a boarder along with several other mares owned by Elite Racing.

"Fortunately, they still own Ribbons and I doubt the Exceed And Excel filly be sold. Elite Racing Club has been such a success story over the last 15 years--it has a really diverse membership and provides such a good access point to bring people into racing, giving so many people a chance to get involved."

Wallace spent €1.13 million on behalf of the China Horse Club for three yearlings at the Goffs Orby Sale, headed by an €850,000 Sea the Stars colt, and made headlines again over the weekend when buying four--including the top three lots--at Arqana's Arc Sale.

Invincible Spirit is the thread binding Kodiac to Zebedee, as the 6-year-old is a son of the Irish National Stud's leading sire. He has gotten his stud career off to a flying start, much like his own racing career which encompassed his 2-year-old season.

Ivawood (Ire) is the first foal out of Keenes Royale (GB), a half sister to last season's Royal Lodge winner Berkshire (Ire) and a daughter of Prix de l'Opera winner Kinnaird (Ire). Trained, like his sire, by Richard Hannon, the £220,000 Tattersalls purchase has showcased his sire's talents with victories in the G2 July S. and the G2 Richmond S. and is set to step up to the highest level on Future Champions' Day at Newmarket on Oct. 17 in either the G1 Dewhurst or G1 Middle Park S.

Those successes on the racecourse have helped fuel the demand for progeny of Zebedee and Kodiac in the sales ring. Tally-Ho bred and consigned Classic winner Sky Lantern (Ire), by their late sire Red Clubs (Ire), to star at Goffs in 2012 and their stallions shone in the Kill auction ring last week.

O'Callaghan is keen to underline that the farm is not just about Zebedee and Kodiac, proud though he is of there achievements, and he is excited about the upcoming foal sales.

"We have Sir Prancealot (Ire) hitting the market with his first crop of foals and there are some nice ones to come," he reveals. "He is a good-looking horse and we are pleased with what we are seeing so far. He was an expensive yearling but he is a handsome horse and stamping his progeny."

On the other hand, it is true that there is a shortage of buyers below the 200,000-gns range. There were 40 yearlings sold yesterday for 200,000 gns and above, and there were probably more bidders for those than for horses which sold for much less. Basically, if you had one of those, you were fine; if you didn't, it was a battle.

To some extent, yes, that is the nature of a select sale, but another factor can be the expense of the stud fee paid to breed the horse. The more mares better sires attract, the higher the investment in stud fee the breeder has, and the more difficult it is to make a profit when selling, say for under 100,000 gns. If you have £25,000 in a stud fee there's a lot more pressure to have a six-figure yearling than if you have £10,000 or £15,000. Better access to better sires is generally a good thing, but in any market thin on buyers having access to better sires can backfire because of the cost of doing so.

One horse who didn't have any issues in that, or any other department yesterday was Juddmonte's Oasis Dream, who had nine sell yesterday for an average of 379,444 gns, including the session-topping 775,000 gns colt bought by the session's leading buyer, John Ferguson (who bought 11 in all). Oasis Dream does always carry the reputation as being a good sales horse, but they were appearing one right after another yesterday. Coolmore's Galileo only had four catalogued yesterday (two sold, average 400,000 gns), but has 25 catalogued today and tomorrow, and will, of course, finish the week as the sale's leading sire. But Oasis Dream has another 15 to come himself, and the word from the trenches is the standard of his stock doesn't fall off at all. Of his nine sold yesterday, five brought 400,000 gns or more; not only was his average 379,444; his median for Tuesday's session was actually higher, at 400,000 gns. He had a really big day, and he's going to continue to have a really big sale.

Of course, one of the highlights of Tattersalls' October Sale is the very high standard of hospitality afforded potential buyers (and assorted sales workers, such as this columnist) by the big outfits. Once again this year, despite great competition from Highflyer consignors like Watership Down, Highclere, Castlebridge, and Ted Voute, the Newsells consignment at the top of the hill, in Somerville Barn O, are the champions. Newsells' GM Julian Dollar's missus, Georgia Dollar, has produced the killer carrot cake, the brownies--well, I sure try and get there most sale days for breakfast, that's the best way I can put it. It's the perfect way to gird yourself for that march down the hill, or reward yourself after marching up it.





GDE HEAD PROMISES DUMPING WILL RESUME

Hugues Moutouh, director general of Guy Dauphin Environment (GDE) told the news outlet ouest-france.fr that the company will not wait for the current round of environmental testing to be completed before resuming dumping activities in their landfill in the heart of Thoroughbred horse country in Normandy, France.

“We will not yield to any blackmail,” Moutouh said. “This means that we will not stop our business because every five or six months we are asked for new expert evidence. This is a reversal of the burden of proof and it's just incredible.” Monday morning, an estimated 70 French police arrived on the site of the contested landfill to force out the protestors who have blocked the entrance to the site and prevented dumping for over 350 days as they contest the legality and ecological effects of the dumping. Yesterday, GDE erected massive stone walls around the entrance with a temporary metal swinging door, presumably to allow the arrival of trucks filled with industrial waste products that will be dumped at the site. “This will obviously mean the resumption of our industrial activities, in compliance with laws and regulations,” Moutouh told ouest-france.fr. One of the contested matters is whether or not the dumped material contains car and truck tires, which environmental groups protest have been dumped illegally and are a pollutant. “The dumping of discarded tires that has been contested is the subject of a debate between experts and the courts,” Moutouh told ouest-france.fr. “It doesn't concern just the GDE site at Nonant-le-Pin, but at landfill sites all over France. It's a national problem.” Opponents told FranceTV that they would reconstruct their encampments elsewhere, and planned to stage protests this week.

A field of nine juvenile fillies will line up today at Keeneland in the GIII JP Morgan Chase Jessamine S., a 'Win and You're In' for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. The speedy **Quality Rocks** (Rock Hard Ten), who has a spotless two-for-two record over synthetic with a debut win at Presque Isle Aug. 13 and in the Arlington Washington Lassie Sept. 6, will be attempting turf for the first time. Previously trained by William Helmbrecht, the 7-2 morning-line favorite will be making her first start since transferring to the Bill Mott stable. Stablemate **Rainha Da Bateria** (Broken Vow) also adds some interest. The Three Chimney's \$435,000 Keeneland September purchase rallied to win her debut going 5 1/2 panels at Saratoga July 21, but finished fourth after being floated wide around the first turn of the 1 1/16-mile P G Johnson S. Aug. 27. The Chad Brown-trained **Fila Primera** (War Front) will make her first start against winners, having graduated in her debut going a mile at Belmont Sept. 7. Also making her second start is Ramsey homebred **Walking the Kitten** (Kitten's Joy). After having closed to win at Kentucky Downs first out Sept. 17, she boasts a solid worktab, including a five panel bullet in 1:02.50 last week over the Churchill training track.

SPORT OR BUSINESS?

Two guys with credibility and strong opinions, Jerry Brown and Barry Irwin, have discussed whether Thoroughbred racing should be more about sport or the business of gambling. At issue is race day Lasix.

There was a time when legal gambling on Thoroughbred racing was more important than the sports revenue from media rights and sponsorship.

But now the future of sports revenue is media rights and sponsorship. The NFL is projected to reach \$25 billion in revenue with 7% growth over the next 12 years. That is just one major league sport.

Racing revenue from \$10 billion in gross handle, at 20% takeout, is only \$2 billion. Does anyone project racing revenue from wagering will grow?

So whether Lasix will maintain, raise or lower, the current level of wagering on racing is not nearly as important as the potential to make Thoroughbred racing a credible sport again. The business model has changed.

I'm a marketing guy and we look at the upside of different strategies. The upside of wagering is limited to the popularity and credibility of the sport.

Brown and Irwin have worked hard on their credibility, because it means everything to the people who trust them with their money.

What about Thoroughbred racing? What about its credibility? Does it matter to the people who decide media rights and sponsorship money? As someone who has sold rights and sponsorship for racing, I assure you it is the first conversation.

The NFL knows what is at risk right now on the issue of domestic violence. Billions of dollars in media rights and sponsorship are on the line and could derail their plans to get to \$25 billion.

Is there anyone thinking about what can be gained by making our sport valuable again? Is it worth more than the current revenue from wagering? Of course it is, but racing has to become structured like a modern sport and that includes agreed upon rules that the people with the gold approve. Then racing can have great value as a sport and legal wagering will grow.

"I felt like she was not training as good as she should and decided not to take a shot," Casse said. "I know the owners want to

breed her and we had this race as a goal to get a Grade I. When we decided she would not make it, we decided to call it a day with her. She is 100% sound. We just didn't want to run her if she was not herself."

The ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ burst onto the scene at Woodbine when she took down the boys and earned a black type win on debut in the GI Summer S. last September. The dark bay followed that up with an equally impressive come from behind victory in Keeneland's Alcibiades a month later and closed out her juvenile campaign with a fourth after a wide trip in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita last November. cont. p16

TREVE TO BE BRED TO DUBAWI

According to a tweet from owner Sheikh Joaan al Thani's Al Shaqab Racing, **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}), who became the first in 36 years to record back-to-back victories in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Sunday afternoon at Longchamp, has officially been retired and will be bred to Darley stallion Dubawi (Ire) in her first year at stud in 2015. The son of Dubai Millennium (GB) is the sire of no fewer than 16 Grade or Group 1 winners, including the 2014 top-level winners Sheikhzayedroad (GB) (Northern Dancer S.), Lucky Nine (Ire) (KrisFlyer International Sprint), Night of Thunder (Ire) (QIPCO 2000 Guineas), Tiger Tees (NZ) (Galaxy S.) and Prince Bishop (GB) (Al Maktoum Challenge-Round 3). The cross of Dubawi over Sadler's Wells-line mares is responsible for the likes of G1 Dubai World Cup hero Monterosso (GB), G1SW Hunter's Light (Ire) and the aforementioned Night of Thunder. Dubawi, the fastest sire ever to reach 50 group winners, stands at Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket.

KIYOSHI AIMING FOR BREEDERS' CUP MILE

Sheikh Fahad's Qatar Racing is set to be double-barreled for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita Nov. 1, with GI Woodbine Mile hero **Trade Storm (GB)** (Trade Fair {GB}) now set to be joined by 3-year-old filly **Kiyoshi (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}). Winner of the G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot and placed in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. and G1 Cheveley Park S. in 2013, the 80,000gns TATOCT yearling purchase was runner-up to subsequent GI Beverly D. S. winner Euro Charline (Ire) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) in the Listed Valiant S. July 25 and two starts later upset the seven-furlong G3 Sceptre S. at Doncaster. She was most recently fifth to Integral (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) in the G1 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket last weekend, but connections see fit to push on. "We weren't too disheartened with Kiyoshi in the Sun Chariot," trainer Charlie Hills told his website. "The slow early pace probably didn't really suit her as she seems to run best when there's a very strong early pace and she can run at them. The ground also wouldn't have been in her favour. We are going to consider the Breeders' Cup Mile, where she should get the fast early pace and quick ground she likes." Hills sent out the ill-fated Chriselliam (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) to win last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

The G1 King's Stand S. and G1 Nunthorpe S. hero was unsurprisingly a hot favourite to clinch a third Group 1 prize of the season with conditions in Paris to suit, but the gaps failed to materialise for Richard Hughes. Sole Power finished seemingly full of running in eighth, beaten just a couple of lengths, and trainer Eddie Lynam reports his veteran sprinter to have returned to Ireland none the worse. The 7-year-old will now bid to go one better than 12 months ago in December's G1 Hong Kong Sprint. Lynam said, "He's fine. He had no race and a very easy time, so we'll aim for Hong Kong now."

ITALY SPARED BY EPC

Italy, which faced exclusion from the European pattern program barring improvements and consistent payment of prize money, has been handed a reprieve by the European Pattern Committee and will be allowed to remain in the group, at least for the time being, Racing Post reports. The country's inability to pay purse money in a timely manner prompted the EPC to threaten Italy with expulsion from the program, but indicated they could revisit the topic should certain conditions be met, specifically regarding the payment of purse money, and EPC Chairman Brian Kavanagh told the trade daily that these conditions had been met. "We have had a positive reaction and as a result Italy will remain a member of the European Pattern programme in 2015," Kavanagh told *Racing Post*. "I'm happy with the situation at the moment and the assurances we have been given, but the conditions will remain in place and have to be met. If not, we will review the matter again."

SHACKLEFORD COLT TOPS F-T SARATOGA FALL SALE AMID DECLINES

Fasig-Tipton wrapped up its two-day Saratoga Fall Sale yesterday with overall declines in average and median compared to last year's one-day sale. Tuesday's session, which featured weanlings and yearlings, saw 124 head sell for a gross of \$2,303,600, good for an average of \$18,577 and median of \$14,500. The RNA rate was 48.3%. Monday's focus was broodmare/broodmare prospects and horses of racing age. Cumulatively for the sale, 193 horses brought \$3,206,100. The average of \$16,612 declined 11.6% from last year's mark of \$18,791, while the median dropped by 9.1% from \$11,000 in 2013 to \$10,000. The cumulative RNA rate was 41.7% versus 23.17% a year ago.

The top weanling during yesterday's session and overall sale topper was [hip 409](#), a colt from the first crop of GI Preakness S., GI Metropolitan H. and GI Clark H. hero Shackleford (Forestry) who brought \$150,000 from Palermo Farm. Rhapsody Farm LLC/Hidden Lake Farm LLC, agents consigned the chestnut. Elaine Peck's Rhapsody Farm and Chris Bernhard's Hidden Lake Farm paid \$30,000 for Spanish Post (Flatter), a daughter of MSW Spanish Play (Great Gladiator), carrying hip 409--her first foal--at last year's Keeneland November Sale. Spanish Post RNA'd for \$14,700 Monday in foal to The Lumber Guy.

The Fall Sale also included yearlings for the first time this year, and the highest price paid for one yesterday was \$62,000 for [hip 166](#), a colt from the first crop of GISW Girolamo (A.P. Indy) out of a half-sister to speedy GSW and  **"TDN Rising Star"**  Eightyfiveinafifty (Forest Camp). Dan Hayden purchased the bay from the consignment of Shamrock Hill Farm (Cheryl Prudhomme), agent.

Girl Battling Muscular Dystrophy to Meet 'Princess' at Taylor Made: Edited Press Release:

Dana Steidle has lived with a crippling form of Muscular Dystrophy called Charcot Marie Tooth for most of her life. But she hasn't let her disability steal the joy she receives from Thoroughbred racing.

On Oct. 10, after driving many hours from her home state of Texas, Steidle will arrive in Lexington to visit one of her biggest equine heroes: GI Kentucky Oaks winner Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior).

Steidle, who funded her Kentucky trip by selling homemade bracelets, will be hosted by Taylor Made, which is boarding Princess of Sylmar until the daughter of Majestic Warrior is sold at the upcoming Fasig-Tipton Kentucky fall mixed sale.

"Not many people get the chance to connect with a horse or a sport the way I have with racing," Steidle wrote in her horse racing-themed blog "Here I Am on My Way. But those who have know what I'm talking about. Watching races of horses whom I've fallen in love with has given me an outlet for my emotions. I get a sense of pride and hope watching them. Watching the horses run is beautiful to me...maybe it's my envy that I can't run like that."

Steidle was first captivated by horse racing while watching Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) win the Breeders' Cup Classic in impressive fashion in route to being named Horse of the Year. Her love for the sport grew further when Princess of Sylmar burst onto the scene.

"I watched her win the Kentucky Oaks and the Alabama Stakes from the comforts of my living room and she sucked me in," Steidle said of the Pennsylvania-bred filly, who was trained by Todd Pletcher for King of Prussia Stable. "Her charisma and her attitude was so magnetic that you can't help but smile when you see her. Watching her run has gotten me through many pain cycles and new experiences with my [disease]."

"She gave me something to look forward to when I was sick and tired and ready to just give up with trying to get stronger," added Steidle.

Dana Steidle was five years old when she was diagnosed with Charcot Marie Tooth. A neuropathy that affects the nerves in her hands and legs, the condition has caused her considerable weakness and pain over the years and has forced her to use a wheelchair or walker to complete daily tasks.

But instead of wallowing in self pity, Steidle lives each day to the fullest by immersing herself in the world of Thoroughbred racing. She maintains a horse racing-themed Facebook fan page in addition to her blog and has met some of her best friends through the industry.

"Through them I've been able to learn so much and get so much more experience than I ever thought I would," Steidle said.

Ned Bonnie To Speak at Bergstein Presentation:

Edward "Ned" Bonnie, a longtime equine attorney and member of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, will deliver the keynote speech at the third annual Stan Bergstein Writing Award presentation in Lexington Nov. 14 at the Thoroughbred Club of America.

"Ned has been at the forefront of the medication issue as long as anybody and his work has been admirable and important," said Team Valor CEO Barry Irwin, who launched the \$25,000 award not long after Bergstein died in 2011. "I look forward to hearing what he has to say at the award ceremony."

Early in his legal career, Bonnie galloped horses at Churchill Downs in the mornings before he went to work. He represented owner Peter Fuller in challenging the disqualification of Dancer's Image from victory in the 1968 Kentucky Derby. Later, he was involved in the crafting of the Interstate Horse Racing Act of 1978, and just last year he played a part in preparation of reform legislation, the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act, that would give the United States Anti-Doping Agency authority over drugs in American racing. Bonnie also was instrumental in devising drug rules for the horse show world. He currently is chairman of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission's rules committee.

OwnerView Thoroughbred Conference:

OwnerView's first Thoroughbred Owners Conference kicks off Monday, Oct. 13, with a tour of Keeneland racetrack and a welcome reception at Adena Springs Farm. The conference is sponsored jointly by the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, the Keeneland Association, The New York Racing Association Inc., and the Stronach Group, and all formal presentations and panel discussions will take place Tuesday and Wednesday at the Keeneland sales pavilion.

Tom Durkin, who recently retired as the track announcer at the New York Racing Association tracks, will serve as master of ceremonies for the conference. Tuesday's agenda features a series of panels involving racetrack executives, owners, trainers, jockeys and bloodstock advisors. Legendary golfer and longtime Thoroughbred owner/breeder Gary Player will deliver the keynote address for the conference late Tuesday afternoon. Player has owned the 20,000-acre Gary Player Stud in South Africa since 1974 and is consistently among the leading breeders in South Africa. He has frequently implored those involved in horse racing to come up with innovative ideas that would generate interest in the sport.

Wednesday's agenda includes a panel discussion devoted to the care of horses and people in the Thoroughbred industry and a segment with young people with a family history in the sport. Ogden Mills Phipps, the chairman of The Jockey Club, will deliver closing remarks for the conference Wednesday afternoon and a closing reception is scheduled at Stonestreet Farm.

A colt by superstar sire Fastnet Rock (Aus) out of the former North American runner Dakota Sue (Pollard's Vision) fetched a final bid of A\$360,000 (US\$317,441) to set a new record price for the Inglis 'The Star' Ready-2-Race Sale at the company's Newmarket complex Tuesday and will race in Hong Kong for a client of trainer Manfred Man.

Catalogued as hip [24](#) and consigned by Glastonbury Farms, the Oct. 15 foal is the first produce of mare Dakota Sue, who became the third of her dam Fancy Prancer (Bertrando)'s produce to win the Bird of Pay S. at Northlands Park in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, in 2009. Hip 24, who quickened up nicely to clock :10.52 during his under-tack work at Canterbury, was bought back on a bid of A\$275,000 at this auction house's Easter Yearling Sale this past April.

The three next highest-priced colts will remain in Australia for their racing careers. Hip [144](#), a Snizeal (Aus) colt consigned by New Zealand-based Lyndhurst Farm, was scooped up by local trainer Noel Mayfield-Smith for A\$240,000. A Sept. 2 foal, the half-brother to Excuse My French (Aus) (French Deputy) was purchased by Lyndhurst Stud for a sales-topping A\$140,000 out of this year's Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling Sale and breezed an eighth of a mile in :12.02 through a driving rain storm over a Cambridge turf course rated a slow 8. Hip [63](#), a Glastonbury Farm-consigned son of New Approach (Ire) whose second dam is champion sprinter Isca (Aus) (Rory's Jester {Aus}), will also remain Down Under after John McArdle's Regum Racing signed the winning ticket at A\$215,000; and hip [47](#), a colt by in-form stallion Starspangledbanner (Aus), will join the Peter Snowden barn after representatives of Inglis made the winning bid at A\$210,000. A Nov. 16 foal consigned by Wadick Racing, the bay is out of Hot'n'dreamin (Aus) (Nothin' Leica Dane {Aus}), a full-sister to dual Group 1 winner Hot Danish (Aus).

"The buying from Hong Kong, Singapore and Macau was strong in the middle to upper market, as were local Australian buyers," said Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster. "We sold almost three times as many horses to Hong Kong as last year including the top priced colt." Webster was also pleased with the participation from the locals. "A great endorsement for this sale's format is seeing respected local judges James Harron, John McArdle, Noel Mayfield-Smith, Peter Snowden, Independent Syndications and Triple Crown Syndications all purchase Ready2Race horses for \$100,000 or more," he commented. "These horses have been professionally prepared to excel on the grass surfaces familiar to the major races here in Australia."

A total of 23 horses landed final bids in excess of six figures, just shy of the 24 recorded last year from a larger catalogue. The average of A\$71,398 represented a marginal decrease of 3.6% while the median was off by 9.1%. The RNA rate was 33.6%.
