## BRING ON THE CUP!

For the third year in a row and for the eighth time overall, Santa Anita--"the Great Race Place"--plays host to the Breeders' Cup World Championships, which kicks off a two-day run with four seven-figure events this afternoon. They'll save the best for last on both today's and tomorrow's card, with the \$2-million GI Breeders' Cup Distaff taking center stage. Coming into her last race, Juddmonte Farms' **"TDN Rising Star"** **Close Hatches** (First Defence) looked like the one they'd all be aiming for, with Grade I wins in the Apple Blossom H., the Ogden Phipps S. and Personal Ensign. But the bloom came off the rose, at least a little bit, when the 4-year-old threw in an atypically dull performance in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S., finishing a listless fourth to **Don't Tell Sophia** (Congaree). Runner-up to the now-sidelined Beholder (Henny Hughes) in last year's Distaff, Close Hatches has worked well since and is capable on her best. She may need just that to take down the colors of leading sophomore filly **Untapable** (Tapit), who breaks just to her inside in stall 10. The Winchell homebred is perfect in five tries against her peers this season, including a one-length defeat of tomorrow's GI Filly/Mare Sprint hopeful Sweet Reason (Street Sense) in the GI Cotillion S. at Parx Sept. 20. The GI Kentucky Oaks victress is the 5-2 favorite on Jon White's morning line. **Thursday Morning's BC Report...**

A spectacular sunrise embellished with reddish and pinkish hues greeted the largest crowd of the week on a very comfortable morning at beautiful Santa Anita Park Thursday. With the Classic big three of **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit), **Shared Belief** (Candy Ride {Arg}) and **Tonalist** (Tapit) all up and at 'em early, the popular

The 6' 10" frame of NBA power forward and **Cigar Street** (Street Sense) co-owner Rashard Lewis certainly stood out from among the group near Clockers' Corner, while several Breeders' Cup runners made their

way through the paddock. **Artemis Agrotera** (Roman Ruler) and defending F/M Turf champ **Dank (GB)** (Dansili {GB})--with trainer Sir Michael Stoute trackside for the first time this week--took a tour of the Breeders' Cup-ready walking ring shortly after 7:30 a.m. They were quickly joined by the European contingent of **Aktabantay (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), **Commemorative (GB)** (Zamindar), **Karakontie (Jpn)** (Bernstein), **Mustajeb (GB)** (Nayef) and **Prize Exhibit (GB)** (Showcasing {GB}).

Even during track renovation breaks, there's still plenty to see as Santa Anita's turf course and training track both remain quite active. The gap is always a popular place to hang at this point, too. **Bourbon Courage** (Lion Heart), **Don't Tell Sophia** (Congaree), the Kaleem Shah/Bob Baffert duo of **Bayern** (Offlee Wild) and **Fed Biz** (Giant's Causeway), as well as the braided **Footbridge** (Street Cry {Ire}) and stunning **Imperative** (Bernardini) all patiently waited as the main track was being harrowed.

Trainer Aidan O'Brien and Coolmore's M.V. Magnier made their way through the grandstand as jockey Joseph O'Brien stood tall in the irons aboard **The Great War** (War Front). **Sweet Reason** (Street Sense) picked an awful time to be on her worst behavior with owner Jeff Treadway looking on from the apron. Despite the urging of her rider, she simply refused to leave her post, and when met by an outrider, immediately pinned back her ears. Sweet Reason didn't put up much more of a fight at this point though, and was quickly on her way to complete a routine day of training. **Cont. p4**

Trainer Dale Romans isn't lacking for confidence as he gets ready to saddle Zayat Stables' **Prayer For Relief** (Jump Start) in tomorrow's 10-furlong showcase and compared him to a former Breeders' Cup winner to emerge from the barn. "I feel the same way about Prayer for Relief as I did about [GI Breeders' Cup Mile upsetter] Court Vision [Gulch]," said Romans. "He's also an older horse on a major uptick. When these horses build their resumes that get them into this type of race, it causes a lot of wear and tear. Some of them may be tailing off a little and we're headed in the right direction." Third to Zivo (True Direction) and Moreno in the GI Suburban H. July 5, the 6-year-old was fourth in the Whitney and was most recently third in the GI Woodward S. at Saratoga Aug. 30.

Trainer Art Sherman and his assistant, son Alan Sherman, were basking in the afterglow of the San Francisco Giants' third World Series championship following their tense 3-2 defeat of the Kansas City Royals Wednesday evening. Art Sherman reiterated his satisfaction with GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit) having drawn post 13 at Monday's post position pull, but had baseball on his mind Thursday morning. "I'm sure happy with the post," said Sherman. "I hate to make excuses, but I rode for 23 years, and there is trouble you can get into getting crammed in there. Maybe this time I can get a better break. I just want to be clear turning for home, and let the best horse win."

heroine and Eclipse Award winner Dreaming of Anna (Rahy), Fast Anna debuted victoriously at Gulfstream this past April and took a non-two-lifetime allowance by 13 lengths July 6. The dark bay was thrown to the wolves in the


GI King's Bishop S. in just his third career appearance and made the majority of the running, only to be gunned down in the waning strides by The Big Beast (Yes It's True). He attended a searching pace last time out in the GIII Gallant Bob S. at Parx Sept. 20 and settled for second, beaten 2 1/2 lengths by Favorite Tale (Tale of the Cat). Ritvo is happy to be back in these familiar surroundings. "It feels great to be back with another good horse," Ritvo said. "I 100% believe he belongs here. He's still learning. He has so much talent, we decided to go in this direction. He's gotten more relaxed in the paddock, more relaxed in his training. When we bring him behind the gate to school him now, he practically runs in. He wants to do everything right." Fast Anna lived up to his name in his final morning workout over the Santa Anita strip, tearing a hole in the wind through a half-mile in :57 flat. It was more than two full seconds faster than the next-quickest move. "He had a fast work the other day, but he did it well within himself, and who better to work him than Gary Stevens?" said Ritvo, whose speedster is slated to be ridden by John Velazquez.

Wes Welker's **Undrafted** (Purim). The duo toured the hillside turf course Thursday morning to become acquainted with the unique configuration. No Nay Never, last-out winner of the Gill Woodford S. at Keeneland Oct. 4, broke off ahead of his stable companion and hopped slightly crossing over the

dirt track, but he never lost his momentum and continued on willingly through the lane. Undrafted, a close fourth in the G1 Darley July Cup over the summer and most recently third to Dimension (GB) (Medicean {GB}) in the Kentucky Downs Turf Dash Sept. 24, had no issues negotiating the dirt and finished well. "I think he's going to break super sharp this time and the pace will be his," Ward said of No Nay Never.

"I think the downhill might actually help him. When he makes that right turn, they make a tiny uphill run and that should relax him as he heads back down the hill. I think everything will be fine. If they do go too fast up front, I think the race will fall into Undrafted's hands--so I feel good about my chances with both horses."

The globetrotter has since made two North American starts with a sixth in the GI Belmont Derby July 5 and very solid second to fellow Classic starter Shared Belief (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 24.

Throughout his global exploits, Toast of New York has gained quite the following, and trainer Jamie Osbourne dutifully keeps his 18,000 followers informed through his twitter account (@osbornejamie).

"If I don't tweet a picture of him for a few days, I get loads of tweets wondering where he is and what's gone wrong," Osbourne said. "I've got to keep his adoring public in the picture."

Osborne began his racing career as a National Hunt jockey in the mid 80s. He rode until 2000, when he gave up the irons for a pair of binoculars and began training flat horses. He currently has about 50 horses in his yard, two of which have made the trip to Arcadia. Along with Toast of New York, Osborne will send out Prize Exhibit (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Osborne, who spent a summer at Santa Anita working for the late John Russell, said it's been nice to return to the track, especially for his first Breeders' Cup.

"It's good to be back--it's a different atmosphere, but it's great to be here," the conditioner commented.

As for Toast of New York's numerous passport stamps, Osborne said that he just looks for races that will suit his charge, no matter where they are.

"I felt that the worst \$2-million race in the world was always the UAE Derby, so after winning two races as a 2-year-old last year, I thought 'let's have a go at it,'" he explained. "Obviously, he won that. We toyed with the idea of taking him to the [G1] Epsom Derby, but we changed our mind on that and felt that, possibly, he might just fall short of being a proper Group 1 horse in Europe, so why don't we bring him [to the United States] and try and win a Grade I win."

Osborne also noted that, like in his previous starts in the States, Toast of New York will receive Lasix.

"He'll get a bit of Lasix, he had it at Del Mar and at Belmont," Osborne commented. "[By taking it] you're creating a level playing field and that's what we're doing."

The biggest question for Toast of New York will, undoubtedly, be his ability to run on dirt. In his seven previous starts, the colt has made two turf attempts and the rest have come over synthetic surfaces. Osborne understands the change could pose a problem, but believes the colt might take to the surface.

"If we thought he had no chance of going on it, we wouldn't be here, but there is, obviously, a doubt," Osborne explained.

"I think there's a bit of dirt in his pedigree. Thewayyouare--there isn't enough evidence to say whether they would handle the dirt, but on his dam's side there's a bit of dirt. So, we're hopeful that he will [take to the dirt]. We won't really know until [Saturday] night, but I think there's a fair chance he would. Everyone tells me he's got the physique of a dirt horse and the action of a dirt horse, so I'm hanging my hat on that."

Osborne also explained that the Classic will determine how he will plan out Toast of New York's 4-year-old season.

"One of the reasons for coming here was to test the dirt. The [G1] World Cup next year is being run on the dirt and that's his next obvious target. I thought with that change from Tapeta to dirt, before we put all our eggs in one basket, let's have a go at it here."

The trainer is, nonetheless, confident in his stable star.

"I think he looks magnificent," Osborne said. "He's only had three races this year and he's coming into this a relatively fresh horse."

Osborne is very proud of Toast of New York and delighted that so many others share in his enthusiasm toward the colt.

"As you can see, he's a tremendously good-looking colt with a great action," Osborne explained. "He is a bit of a character and I think he endears himself to people. Now, obviously, he's the most liked in my yard because he's the best one, but beyond that, he's just a bit of a dude. Everybody sort of takes to him, we all have and the public has as well."

"I think he'll handle the track," Head continued. "With two turns and a flat track, he'll be better than at Ascot or Deauville with a long, straight mile, so I expect him to run a really good race."



**BC, NBC REACH 10-YEAR MEDIA RIGHTS DEAL**

"The Breeders' Cup has enjoyed an expanded and revitalized presence on NBC with new fans viewing the Breeders' Cup Classic hour and NBC's ability to cross-promote the Championships on its wide variety of platforms."

NBC Sports Group's Breeders' Cup coverage will begin live from Santa Anita Friday on NBCSN from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. ET and continue Saturday from 3:30 to 8:00 p.m. ET on NBCSN and 8:00 to 9:00 p.m. ET on NBC. Coverage will also be streamed live on NBC Sports Live Extra.

We gave TDN handicappers STEVE SHERACK and BRIAN DIDONATO mythical \$1500 bankrolls to spend on Breeders' Cup win bets over the two days of racing. They must wager the entire stake, and bet no less than \$30 and no more than \$300 on each race. The contestant with the highest bankroll after the Classic wins.

**Juvenile Turf - War Envoy** may be winless in six subsequent starts since his debut score at Naas in late April, but he has turned in very smart rallies versus much tougher in his last two overseas, including a second-place finish in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster Sept. 13 and a close fifth in the prestigious G1 Grand Criterium at Longchamp Oct. 5. With no shortage of early speed signed on here, this race couldn't set up any better for the son of War Front over a ground that he should absolutely relish. Trainer Aidan O'Brien, of course, won this event in 2011 with Wrote (Ire) and in 2012 with George Vancouver. **Wager: \$200 win on #7 War Envoy (9-2).**

**Dirt Mile** - As long as defending Dirt Mile champ Goldencents doesn't get too comfortable on the front end, the coming-of-age **Tapiture** has a huge shot to pull off a slight upset here. The chestnut flashed talent early in his career, but seemed like he was his own worst enemy during the Triple Crown preps. After a nightmare trip in the Kentucky Derby, he stalked and pounced in the GIII Matt Winn S. at Churchill, then overcame a world of trouble to get the money in dramatic fashion in the GII West Virginia Derby Aug. 2. He cuts back in distance off an impossible trip when second-best over a well-documented speed-favoring track in the GII Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 20. These same connections lit up the tote board in the Dirt Mile with another son of Tapit in Tapizar two years ago. **Wager: \$100 win on #9 Tapiture (6-1).**

**Juvenile Fillies Turf - Qualify (Ire)** did all of the heavy lifting and faded to finish sixth--beaten only 3 1/2 lengths--in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. Sept. 14, then displayed an impressive turn of foot with a change of tactics over fast ground in the G3 CL & MF Weld Park S. at The Curragh Sept. 28. The extreme outside post position certainly doesn't do her any favors here, but a repeat of her latest performance puts her back in the winner's circle. The daughter of Fastnet Rock (Aus) gives Aidan O'Brien a huge shot to sweep Friday's 2-year-old grass races. Will be boxing her in the gimmicks in my personal wagers with three of the Chad Brown fillies--**Sivoliere (Ire)**, **Lady Eli** and **Tammy the Torpedo**. **Wager: \$200 win on #14 Qualify (5-1).**

**Distaff - Belle Gallantey** certainly won't get away easy on the front end this time around, but the impressive GI Beldame S./GI Delaware H. heroine did show the ability to come from off the pace when a close fifth in the GI Ogden Phipps S. on the GI Belmont S. undercard. She's proven a sharp claim by Michael Dubb and his partners and trainer Rudy Rodriguez has done well at Santa Anita in the past, posting a record of 4-2-1-1, granted versus much cheaper company a couple years back. More than capable of getting the money here if she brings her best to the West Coast. **Wager: \$65 win on #4 Belle Gallantey (6-1).**

**Juvenile Turf** - The odds of me taking an American horse in a race with so many Europeans was probably 99-1, but that's where I landed. **Startup Nation's** victory in the GII With Anticipation S. was by far the most impressive replay I watched when handicapping this race, and I think he has some excuses for his fourth-place run last time at odds-on in the GIII Pilgrim S. He looked to be coming with his run when they turned for home, but was never really able to stretch his legs and reach full speed. Even when the rail appeared to open up, he just didn't seem willing to go through, which is common enough not to worry about. Now we'll get inflated odds on a runner who has already flashed immense talent. **Wager: \$200 win on #10 Startup Nation (12-1).**

**Dirt Mile** - The more I look at this race, the more it seems like **Goldencents** is going to be very, very tough to beat. He's just so good at a mile and at Santa Anita that it seems like trip, pace or post are the only things that can possibly do him in. I can't pick the chalk, though, and will go with a complete unknown in **Bronzo (Chi)**. He probably wants more ground, but any kind of pace collapse could be to his advantage. **Wager: \$30 Win on #7 Bronzo (12-1).**

**Juvenile Fillies Turf - Sivoliere (Ire)** is exactly the type of European that succeeds in North America. Whether she's been on the lead or off the pace, she has displayed an extremely quick burst of speed--that's what wins grass races on a firm, flat turf course like Santa Anita. The bay is clearly at her best on dry ground--her two worst finishes came on soft turf. Chad Brown's prowess with juvenile turf runners is, of course, well-documented, as is his success with European imports for owner Marty Schwartz. Brown and Schwartz have teamed up to win graded stakes with former European fillies or mares including 2012 F/M Turf winner Zagora (Fr), Stacelita (Fr), Alterite (Fr), Samitar (GB) and Waterway Run. I look for Sivoliere to relax early and make a big late run, and will be using her with **Qualify (Ire)**, **Lady Zuzu** and **Partisan Politics**. **Wager: \$200 win on #6 Sivoliere (12-1).**

**Distaff** - I can't believe I'm going to pick **L'Amour de Ma Vie**, but I guess I have to make up for not taking a Euro in the Juvenile Turf. None of the American runners really appeal to me. **Untapable** has been great at times, but I'm still dubious of what she's beaten and if she's as good as she was earlier in the year. **Close Hatches** has looked like a monster for most of the season, but what happened last time? **Belle Gallantey's** two biggest races came when she got away with murder on the front end (though she did run well in the Phipps from off the pace). **lotapa** hasn't been consistent enough either, and while I very much respect **Don't Tell Sophia**, she hasn't run fast enough to win this all year. Back to my actual pick. **L'Amour de Ma Vie** is obviously bred for turf on top (and there's plenty of grass on her dam's side, too), but her dam was best in American dirt sprints. She has some solid races on all-weather surfaces in France, and her grass form is very strong. Clearly she's got real ability, and if it transfers to Santa Anita, she can blow up the tote. **Wager: \$60 win on #1 L'Amour de Ma Vie (15-1).**

## MOYGLARE MOMS

When Rich Tapestry (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) bursts out of the stalls at Santa Anita in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint tomorrow afternoon, the 6-year-old gelding will have brought his family full circle, all the way back to the state and track where an Irish dynasty took its first steps.

Although he now represents Hong Kong, Rich Tapestry also carries the Breeders' Cup hopes of

Moyglare Stud, the Co. Kildare farm whose reach has become global. One of the leading hopes for the Sprint springs from one of Moyglare's most successful--and influential--families, being descended from Grenzen, a mare purchased by the farm

in 1977 after racing on California's tracks.

Her granddaughter Genuine Charm (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), the dam of Rich Tapestry, is a full sister to Moyglare's 2003 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Refuse To Bend (Ire) and a half-sister to Media Puzzle (Ire) (Theatrical {Ire}), who won the G1 Melbourne Cup. Grenzen is also the dam of Twilight Agenda, the runner-up to Black Tie Affair (Ire) in the 1991 Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs.

On Tuesday, two more Moyglare-bred horses will bring the farm's name into the full glare of the global spotlight once more as the Johnny Murtagh trained pair of Royal Diamond (Ire) (King's Best) and Mutual Regard (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) contest the Melbourne Cup.

According to Fiona Craig, the farm's breeding and sales consultant, the one person who would have got the greatest thrill from this is the stud's founder, Walter Haefner, who passed away in 2012.

"Walter Haefner was the original internationalist and he wanted to race worldwide," Craig explained. "He was one of the first Europeans to come to America to buy horses and he sent mares [to Kentucky in the late 1960's to Ribot and Sea Bird] before others. He would have got the biggest kick out of this weekend. It sums up what he was trying to achieve, to go back almost 40 years [to a foundation mare] with a family, and race on the [world's] biggest stage." **Cont. p14**

None of the Moyglare-bred runners competing in two of racing's most prestigious international events will carry their colors. That is a reflection of the farm's policy of quality over quantity. Currently, between their Kildare base and a small number based at Ashford Stud (Coolmore), Kentucky. Moyglare has 35 in its broodmare band, a little higher than normal, and about 100 horses in all.

Royal Diamond went under the hammer at Goffs' yearling sale in 2007, the year the farm resumed offering yearlings for sale at public auction after a 27 year break. Mutual Regard and Rich Tapestry both raced for the farm but were sold on to new owners for whom they have prospered. That is a guiding principle of Moyglare's attitude towards selling their stock whether they are yearlings, horses in training or broodmares.

The transition from Walter Haefner's stewardship to that of his daughter Eva-Maria Bucher Haefner has been seamless, and the next generation already has their Moyglare interest piqued, ensuring a secure future rooted in the success of the past.

"Eva is brilliant and knows the horses, she is very knowledgeable and is learning the families and the traits that run through them," Craig added. "She rode horses herself and has an empathy with them, just like her father, who she took the time to speak with and learn from.

"Her son Mischa led in Katimavik (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) who won at Fairyhouse last month and her daughter Chiara has a Big Bad Bob (Ire) 2-year-old filly to run for her next year. We have also re-registered two sets of colors that we used to use--the blue and white stripes of Zurich football club and the orange and cream silks that Sarah Haefner had in the seventies--for Mischa and Chiara," said Craig, who has worked for Moyglare for 25 years.

The longevity of her career with the farm is not unusual with many of the employees spending decades with Moyglare. That continuity of care and dedication is one of the reasons Craig believes that the generations of foals born and raised on the farm continue to bring global success to Moyglare horses whoever they represent.

New blood is also vital, and two winning fillies purchased by Eva in 2012, the stakes winner I'm Yours (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and Pirta (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) will retire to the broodmare band, while this sales season has already seen the arrival of daughters of Dream Ahead, Dark Angel (Ire) and Medaglia d'Oro.

Before Santa Anita and Flemington, and the glory they may bring, 2014 has already brought champagne sparkles for Moyglare Stud. Six homebreds have won eight stakes races this year and 20 horses carrying the farm's black-white-and-red silks have won 26 races worldwide, while a further seven Moyglare bred horses have won stakes races in other silks. On top of that mares bred by the stud but sold on, have produced nine more stakes performers in 2014.

"It has been a year of dreams and I suppose we will have to get used to normality again, but it is all down to a fabulous team," she reflected.

Despite the addition of a new stud manager, Malachy Ryan a year ago, little changes at Moyglare and what remains constant are the mares, who gave founder Walter Haefner the greatest joy.

After Refuse To Bend's success in the 2000 Guineas, the Swiss businessman visited the stud and went to see his dam, Market Slide, and for him that was his satisfaction. He walked down to the field where she was grazing, and stood, his arms leaning on the gateway watching. That was pure joy for him, to be able to stand and watch and say, 'That's the mare.'

In a Kildare field this weekend, as their sons grace racing's main stages, there graze the mares. For Moyglare, it has--and always will be--about the mares.

**INTERNATIONAL DOMINATION**

In a wipe-out of the domestic team, Saint-Cloud's G1 Criterium International was dominated by the British raider **Vert de Grece (Ire)** (Verglas {Ire}), who slammed his compatriot **Johnny Barnes (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) with the German raider **Sherlock (Ger)** (Areion {Ger}) bringing up the overseas trifecta. Keen early in fourth under Umberto Rispoli, the 4-1 second choice stayed wide of the stand's side hedge as the 6-5 favorite **Alea lacta (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) led the field over there in a repeat of the tactic employed when she was successful in the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon. Whereas on that occasion, Kirsten Rausing's filly dominated the race alone up the straight, she had all rivals baying for blood here and it was clear passing the quarter pole that she would be unable to shake them off.

As stamina came into play, Vert de Grece was the strongest and after striking the front approaching the furlong pole he drew away for an emphatic four-length success from Johnny Barnes, with Sherlock three-quarters of a length behind in third and Alea lacta fading to be fifth.

Campaigned by John Joseph Murphy so far, the grey followed a debut second to the subsequent listed winner Convergence (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) over seven furlongs at Leopardstown June 6 with a win over the same track and trip Aug. 7 before running second to Gleneagles (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in The Curragh's G2 Futurity S. again over that distance last time Aug. 24. Fourth behind Godolphin's subsequent multiple group scorer Fractional (Ire) (Manduro {Ger}) in another Longchamp conditions race over this trip at the start of September, he made all to register an authoritative success in the G3 Grosser Preis der Landeshauptstadt Dusseldorf last time Oct. 5. Re-applying that tactic here, Flamingo Star stayed towards the center of the track up the straight and warded off the threat of Visoriyna inside the final 300 meters before finding extra to assert close home.

## BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

### 'PRISE'-D POSSESSION

Glen Hill Farm's **Enterprising** (Elusive Quality) looks to get back to his winning ways against 11 other sophomore colts and geldings in today's GII Twilight Derby at Santa Anita. The homebred struck from close range to take the one-mile Pasadena S. at this track Mar. 22, but was overturned by **Flamboyant (Fr)** (Peer Gynt {Jpn}) and GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint aspirant Home Run Kitten (Kitten's Joy) in the La Puente S. over the track and this trip Apr. 19. Enterprising could not have been more impressive in showing uncommon acceleration to take the July 17 Oceanside S. by a neck and the GII La Jolla H. by 1 1/4 lengths, but makes his first start since a sixth to Midnight Storm (Pioneerof the Nile), **Sawyer's Hill** (Spring at Last) and **Talco (Fr)** (Pivotal {GB}) in the GII Del Mar Derby Aug. 31. Following his La Puente score, Flamboyant ventured cross-country for a pair of starts at Belmont, a runner-up effort in the May 26 Pennine Ridge S. ahead of a strong third behind Mr Speaker (Pulpit) and recent G1 Cox Plate hero Adelaide (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the GI Belmont Derby July 5. The interestingly bred colt was last of eight in the Del Mar Derby, but is a bounce-back candidate with Joel Rosario retaining the ride. **Ring Weekend** (Tapit) was under consideration for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile off victories in Saratoga's GIII Saranac S. Sept. 1 and the GIII Hill Prince S. at Belmont Oct. 4, both going this distance. The chestnut has never finished out of the exacta in four starts on the grass and should have something to say about today's outcome. **Twilight Derby field p19**

### DERBY DREAMS FOR WATERHOUSE

It has been 20 years since trainer Gai Waterhouse saddled the winner of the G1 Victoria Derby, but if punters are correct, Australia's popular Hall of Fame trainer could be in line to collect the lion's share of that A\$1.5 million prize tomorrow with **Hampton Court (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}). The A\$500,000 Inglis Easter yearling has hit his best stride as late, taking the Listed Dulcify Quality S. over a mile at Randwick Oct. 4 before jumping up to Group 1 class to romp in the Spring Champion S. over 2000 meters a week later, besting the talented filly First Seal (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). Hampton Court will be negotiating a left-handed course for the first time in his first voyage under jockey Kerrin McEvoy, but Waterhouse noted after Wednesday's barrier draw that she is "quietly confident."

"The further he goes the better and the 2500 meters won't worry him," she told *Racing and Sports*. "I don't like to get too cocky because you can fall flat on your face in this game but I am quietly confident."

Breaking just outside the favorite and likely to be racing prominently is **Moonovermanhattan (Aus)** (Manhattan Rain {Aus}), who hinted his worth at this distance with a victory in the G2 The Vase S. over 2040 meters at Moonee Valley five days ago. The grey had previously been an unlucky second in the G2 Bill Stutt S. over a mile Sept. 26 before losing a shoe when seventh in the G1 Caulfield Guineas Oct. 11.

Meanwhile, **Bondeiger (Aus)** (War Pass) will negotiate a trip from the rail draw. The Danny O'Brien charge came from a long way back to make up ground to be seventh in the Vase, which snapped a two race win streak in a Geelong maiden Sept. 26 and a Caulfield benchmark race Oct. 15.

Despite having never won a race, **Preferment (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}) is the top choice to upend Hampton Court. On the board in four of six outings, Preferment finished fast after traveling wide to be a strong second in the Listed Geelong Classic over 2200 meters Oct. 22, suggesting he should relish this further stretch out in distance. He is drawn ideally in barrier six and is from the stable of Chris Waller, who should never be ignored in a big event. Preferment is piloted by ace big race rider Damien Oliver.



Rising Romance proved herself a rising force in Australia when she won last season's Oaks in her second domestic start after relocating from New Zealand, and she has proven up to the challenge of dealing with her elders this season, having finished a narrow second in the G1 Caulfield Cup Oct. 18.

Those Classic winners are followed closely in the betting by Chris Waller's French import **He's Your Man (Fr)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), who has really come into his own this season as a 5-year-old and recently recorded a big-race double, taking the 2000 meter G3 Kingston Town S. Sept. 13 before wheeling back to a mile to add the G1 Epsom H. Oct. 4. He's Your Man once again gets the services of Joao Moreira, who partnered him in the Epsom. The reliable 7-year-old gelding Happy Trails (Aus) (Good Journey) is nearly always to be found at the finish line of these big events, and thus cannot be discounted for a spot on the board. The chestnut recorded a career highlight when winning the G1 Turnbull S. over this track and trip a little more than a year ago prior to finishing second in the Cox Plate. Happy Trails was most recently sixth, beaten less than a length, trying that weight-for-age championship again six days ago.



Diamond S. a further two weeks later, and was shelved for the season thereafter. His sophomore debut was delayed by a virus, but Rubick certainly made it worth the wait for his connections when he zipped home in the G2 Schillaci S. over 1000 meters Oct. 11. If there is a chink in Rubick's armor it is that he was beaten in his lone try over this distance, but trainer Gerald Ryan seemed pleased with Rubick's first taste of the Flemington straight last Friday. "He changed stride as he hit the course proper but unlike most horses he didn't deviate," Ryan told *Racenet.com.au*. "He ran his last 600 meters in :34.67 seconds, and his last 400 in :23.02, which was faster than any of the official jumpouts."

Rubick retains the services of his Schillaci partner Kerrin McEvoy, who has ridden Earthquake in her last five outings and was forced to choose between the two after the filly won the G3 Thoroughbred Club S. on the Schillaci card. Earthquake gets the services of James McDonald. Rubick was not handed any favors when drawing the rail, but McEvoy doesn't appear flustered.

"His draw isn't ideal but they start a few meters off the fence," McEvoy told *Racenet.com.au*. "He's got a lot of natural speed and it'll take a fast one to cross him, but if one wants to go mad it won't bother me because I don't think he has to lead. I'd say we'll be able to move further away from the fence if that's what we want to do."

On his decision to stick with Rubick, McEvoy--who won this race aboard Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality) in 2011--added, "I hadn't ridden him in a race until last start and he gave me the feel of a very good horse."

Both Rubick and Earthquake will have to be at their best to upend \$3.20 favorite **Rich Enuff (Aus)** (Written Tycoon {Aus}). After breaking his maiden at the listed level Aug. 23, the chestnut added victories in the G2 Danehill S. over this track and trip Sept. 13 and the G3 Caulfield Guineas Prelude two weeks later before finishing second in the main event, the G1 Caulfield Guineas, Oct. 11. Arrowfield and Pinecliff Racing's **Scissor Kick (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) looks like value at \$14.00 off a pair of runner-up efforts after torrid trips in the G1 Golden Rose S. Sept. 13 and G2 Stan Fox S. two weeks later.

when taking last season's G1 Australasian Oaks at Morphettville, and another high-level victory on this world-class stage would certainly bolster her reputation. The 4-year-old was just seventh on seasonal debut in the G3 Sportingbet Sprint Sept. 20, and after finishing third in the G2 Blazer S. here Oct. 4, was fourth in the G2 Tristarc S. over that

same 1400 meter distance Oct. 18. May's Dream will appreciate today's added distance, and will have to see off her Tristarc conqueror **Sweet Idea (Aus)** (Snitzel {Aus}) once again. That consistent 4-year-old still searches for her first win at the highest level, but has come close twice this season, with a second in the G1 Memsie S. Aug. 30 and a fourth, beaten just over two lengths, in the G1 Sir Rupert Clarke S. Sept. 28 preceding her Tristarc score. The form of the Tristarc is also represented by second **Girl Guide (Aus)** (Churchill Downs {Aus}) and third **Catkins (Aus)** (Dubawi {Ire}). The latter has been threatening to break through in Group 1 company since finishing second here last year, and she has proven remarkably consistent since, finishing off the board just twice in nine starts and collecting four further group wins. **Diamond Drille (Aus)** (Al Maher {Aus}) provided the owners of Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) with another Group 1 win in the Queen of the Turf S. at The Championships last season, and she was seventh second-up in the Tristarc, beaten 2 3/4 lengths.

**RECORDS FALLS AT TATTS AUTUMN**

The final session of the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-In-Training Sale may have lacked the fireworks of Wednesday's frenzied session, but yesterday's trade nonetheless produced solid results. A total of 186 horses changed hands from 210 offered for a buyback rate of 11% that was down 11 points from the same session 12 months ago. The day's average of 6,929gns marked a 17% rise from last year, while the median was up 13% to 4,500gns. The day's turnover of 1,288,800gns well exceeded last year's figure of 767,100gns. **Cont. p25**

The strength of the sale overall was highlighted by the fact that last year's cumulative gross of 20,863,800gns was surpassed during yesterday's session with still a full day of trade to go, and that figure ended up at 24,304,100gns yesterday--a record for the sale. A total of 922 horses sold over the four days at a buyback rate of 12%, down from 18% last year, while the average was up 13% to a second-best of 26,360gns and the median climbed 30% to a best-ever 13,000gns. While our prize money may not be the envy of the global racing community, the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale has yet again proved that British and Irish bloodstock is coveted throughout the world," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "Horses purchased at the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale have won races at the highest level this year in Asia, Australasia, Europe, the Gulf region and North America, and consistent racecourse success is the reason why such huge numbers of buyers come to this unique sale year after year."

The high price of the session--which far exceeded last year's day four topper of 26,000gns--came near the end of the day when Brian Ellison saw off a determined Dermot Farrington for [lot 1436](#), the 3-year-old gelding

Seamour (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}), for 110,000gns. A second-out winner of a 12-furlong Kempton maiden Sept. 25, Seamour was purchased for owner Phil Martin.

"He's a lovely horse and the form around his runs reads well," said Ellison. "Owner Phil Martin picked him out, and it is up to me to look

at any horses he has found to say if I like them and then get them vetted."

Ellison noted that he had unsuccessfully bid on a number of horses throughout the week.

"We tried on a few earlier this week, but they were making so much," he explained. "We'll take him home and tip away, get him schooled and see how we go."

The 3-year-old gelding Notnowsam (GB) (Notnowcato {GB}) ([lot 1388](#)) is set for a career change after being picked up by Raymond Tooth for 46,000gns. Winless in four outings on the flat, and most recently fourth at Dundalk Oct. 17, Notnowsam is set for a career over jumps, and has a pair of half-brothers that have raced with success under that code.

"He has lots of scope and plenty of bone and looks just the type to be running up the hill at Cheltenham," said Tony Stafford after signing on behalf of Tooth.

The 2-year-old colt Wolfowallstreet (Ire) (Bushranger {Ire}) ([lot 1456](#)) broke the track record for five furlongs at Redcar while breaking his maiden on the weekend, and he is now bound for Switzerland, where he will join trainer Karl Klein after being purchased for 35,000gns by Richard Venn Bloodstock.

"He will come back home and have a winter break," said Klein's daughter, Isabelle. "We hope he might be good enough for the top 3-year-old races in the spring--a race such as the 2,000 Guineas--and if he's good enough then go on to run in France."

A condensed Book 4 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale immediately followed the horses-in-training sale, and that session saw a buyback rate that dropped six points from last year, but the average fell 13% to 4,007gns, and the median dropped 34% to 2,300gns. Forty-six horses were sold for 184,300gns.

The top price of 18,000gns for the session was paid for [lot 1947](#), a colt by Paco Boy (Ire) from the draft of Salcey Forest Stud. Successful buyer Darren Popely of Follow the Flag Partnership noted that the colt found his way onto his radar by mistake.

"We went to see a Bahamian Bounty filly and this colt was out of his stables--we saw him and liked him," Popely explained. "He is a lovely horse, and out of an Exceed And Excel mare, so should have some speed."

The last lot through the ring commanded the second-highest price of the sale, when [lot 1958](#), a Motivator (GB) colt, sold to Dermot Farrington for 13,000gns. The Apr. 1 foal is out of the Green Desert mare Quip (GB), a full-sister to the stakes-winning Secret Charm (Ire) and half-sister to stakes winner Relish The Thought (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). He is a half-brother to three winners.

A pair of fillies hit the 12,000gns barrier, the first through the ring being [lot 1890](#), a daughter of Shirocco (Ger) out of River of Silence (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). She was knocked down to Highflyer Bloodstock. Next came [lot 1919](#), a daughter of successful first-season sire Zebedee (GB) out of Dazzling View (Distant View). She was another purchase for Dermot Farrington.

**VENNERI IS HITTING BEST STRIDE**

Alex Venneri, who owns a real-estate mortgage business in La Canada, California, decided a few years ago it was time to stop dabbling in horse racing and establish himself as a breeder. His results so far have been impressive, with a pair of graded stakes winners to his credit this year.

Venneri was represented by two-time Grade II winner and track-record setter Bright Thought (Hat Trick {Jpn}), as well as GII Del Mar Derby winner Midnight Storm (Pioneerof the Nile).

Through the Warrendale Sales consignment, Venneri will offer a Stay Thirsty half-brother to Midnight Storm at next week's Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale.

Venneri traces his love of racing back to his teenage years when he was friends with the son of actor Vic Tayback of *Alice* fame.

"Vic Tayback brought us down to Del Mar in the summer where they had a beach house and showed us around," Venneri recalled. "I always remember him driving us down that big long driveway at Del Mar. And I said, 'One day I'm going to do this.'"

"I had no idea that was valet parking--I thought you had to be special," he laughed.

Venneri's first foray into racehorse ownership came almost by mistake.

"Another very good friend of mine, his father was a pretty big horseplayer and he owned horses," Venneri explained. "One day we were at his house, they were having a big party, and I was talking to him and I said, 'I'm going to buy a horse with you.' At that point in my life, I was earning \$300 a week--I had no money, but I get a phone call three days later and he said, 'We're going to claim our first horse. I was like, 'Huh?' I was so embarrassed, I didn't know what to do. I said, 'Well how much is it?' He said \$25,000. This to a kid who is making \$300 a week. Fortunately, I had a lot of credit cards because I had learned about how to improve your credit and get a lot of credit. So I had high lines of credit. I actually went out and took cash advances to borrow the money to pay for half of a horse called Blade Rullah [in March 1993]."

Things didn't get off to a good start, however.

“We go out to his first race, I bring 30 people there,” Venneri chuckled. “On the first turn the horse pulled up. All I kept thinking about was how am I going to pay this back? I was devastated. I was devastated that I had 30 of my friends there and I looked like an idiot. I was devastated for the horse. And I was devastated wondering how I would ever pay for this.”

Luckily, Venneri’s business allowed him to continue to pursue his love of racing.

“My company became pretty successful--I had a pretty big mortgage company--and as my company became more successful, I decided to venture into the horse business a little bit more and a little bit more,” he explained. “I bought my second horse and then I bought my third horse. Probably about six years ago, I said to my wife, ‘I’ve just been dabbling in horses.’ I had six or eight horses at a time. I said, ‘You know, let me just do it the right way and see what happens.’”

Venneri teamed up with Kentucky-based John Downs of Blackhorse Thoroughbreds and started to build up a broodmare band. Downs leases 300 acres of the historic Overbrook Farm and Venneri currently has 11 broodmares.

“Our philosophy is really simple,” Venneri said. “We take the best mares who we thought had heart and had, obviously, good conformation, and we breed to the best sires that we can afford. I breed everything to sell and what doesn’t come out perfect, we race. I sell my best and keep my worst. That’s the way we have chosen to do our business. Because if I didn’t sell every pretty horse, it would be very difficult to stay in business.”

Both of Venneri’s recent graded stakes winners were horses that failed to sell.

“Bright Thought was crooked up front, he toed in quite a bit,” Venneri said. “We knew we wouldn’t be able to sell him. But John said that he was so athletic on the farm and he became a pretty nice racehorse.”

Bright Thought set a world record while winning last year’s GII San Luis Rey S. at Santa Anita. He added this term’s GII John Henry Turf Classic Sept. 28.

Midnight Storm, who Venneri co-owns with Marjorie Post Dye, actually almost did sell, despite a pre-sale mishap.

“Midnight Storm was in the sale and he put his foot through the fence at the farm and he actually did it right over the tendon and it swelled up right before the sale,” Venneri said. “Everybody was afraid of it. I put what I thought was a \$37,000 reserve on the horse and the horse sold for \$38,000. I thought I lost him. But we were wrong. The reserve was \$39,000 and we bought him back for \$38,000.”

Midnight Storm is now unbeaten in two starts on the turf and is coming off a 3 1/4-length win in the Aug. 31 GII Del Mar Derby.

The colt is out of My Tina (Bertrando), a filly Venneri bought for \$82,000 as a yearling in 2002 and named after his daughter.

“My Tina was in California and had four foals,” Venneri explained. “Her foals were really, really pretty. Every one of them was beautiful. So I decided to step it up and ship her back to Kentucky and breed to the best that we can afford.”

The mare produced a colt by Stay Thirsty this spring and both her and her weanling were entered in the sale. Venneri isn’t sure whether My Tina, who is carrying a full-sibling to Midnight Storm, will keep her engagement at Keeneland, but he is looking forward to seeing her weanling go through the ring.

“Her weanling by Stay Thirsty is absolutely beautiful,” Venneri said of [hip 360](#), who sells during Wednesday’s second session of the sale. “He is probably one of the most beautiful horses that I’ve bred.” **Cont. p28**



As for My Tina, Venneri is hoping Midnight Storm's expected next start in the Nov. 29 GI Hollywood Derby might make her even more attractive.

"She has a foal in her stomach right now that is a full to Midnight Storm," he said. "We really feel like he'll be the horse to beat in the Hollywood Derby, which is why we are thinking of pulling My Tina out of the sale. The Stay Thirsty colt, he is going to bring the value regardless because he's just so beautiful. I don't think he'll be cheap, I think he's going to be an expensive weanling, but anyone who buys him is going to get the real deal."

Venneri continued, "If I was a huge breeder with billions of dollars, I'd never sell this horse. But we're a small breeding operation and we live and die by selling horses."

Also during Wednesday's session of the November sale, Venneri will offer a weanling filly by Giant's Causeway ([hip 271](#)). The dark bay, a foal share with Ashford, is out of Cherryblossommiss (Langfuhr). The stakes-placed mare is a full-sister to multiple graded stakes winner Imperialism and Venneri purchased her for \$150,000 at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton November sale. Now nine and in foal to GI Kentucky Derby winner Orb, the mare is also catalogued for the Keeneland sale, but is not expected to sell.

"We really like the Giant's Causeway baby," Venneri said. "We have a More Than Ready 2-year-old filly out of Cherryblossommiss at the track now and we really like her. And we sold a Curlin filly out of her in September [for \$70,000], that we really liked. We've really liked everything we've seen out of her and we decided she was too young for us to give up on, so we won't be selling her."

The Keeneland November sale begins Tuesday. Sessions on Tuesday and Wednesday begin at 11 a.m. The sale continues through Nov. 14 with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m.

Among those nominated to the Cup are **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}), who would be making his fifth appearance at the HKIR in the last six years. Also engaged are: recent G1 Cox Plate hero **Adelaide (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who was also given an entry for the G1 Hong Kong Vase over the 2400 meters; Japan's **Admire Rakti (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Ire}), the G1 Caulfield Cup winner and ante-post favorite for next week's G1 Melbourne Cup; his compatriot **Just a Way (Jpn)** (Hearts Cry {Jpn}), runaway winner of the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. this past March with a first preference for the G1 Hong Kong Mile; and **Al Kazeem (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), a determined second last time out in the G1 QIPCO Champion S. at Ascot. Defending champion **Glorious Days (Aus)** (Hussonet) will race first-up in the Mile, which offers purse money of HK\$23 million (*US\$2.97 million*) and is the richest event of its kind in the world. Also representing the home team, which has won the last eight runnings of the race, is last year's runner-up **Gold-Fun (Ire)** (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}), the up-and-coming **Able Friend (Aus)** (Shamardal) and 2012 Mile conqueror **Ambitious Dragon (NZ)** (Pins {Aus}), who recently made a promising return from an 18-month absence. The overseas challenge could come from the likes of GI Breeders' Cup Mile favorite **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}); GI Woodbine Mile victor and BC Mile chance **Trade Storm (GB)** (Trade Fair {GB}); and treble Australian Group 1 winner **Boban (Aus)** (Bernardini). The John Moore-trained **Dominant (Ire)** (Cacique {Ire}) pulled the upset in last year's Hong Kong Vase and is gearing up for another run in a race historically dominated by European raiders. Among those who could invade for the HK\$16.5-million (*\$2.13 million*) test are: globetrotting **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), the 2012 winner; and Breeders' Cup Turf market leaders **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) and **Telescope (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). While Rich Tapestry (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) will fly the Hong Kong flag at Santa Anita tomorrow, he is not among the nominees for the HK\$18.5-million (*US\$2.39 million*) G1 Hong Kong Sprint going six furlongs on the turf. With two-time champion Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) off to stud, the door is open for the likes of **Gordon Lord Byron (GB)** (Byron {GB}), also nominated to the Mile; **Lucky Nine (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), victorious in 2011; crack Australian short-tracker **Buffering (Aus)** (Mossman {Aus}); G1 Haydock Sprint Cup victor **G Force (Ire)** (Tamayuz {GB}); and Sole Power (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}), who will look to improve on his runner-up effort last December. The handful of entries from North America include **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper, Mile/Sprint); **Kaigun** (Mile); **Big Blue Kitten** (Cup/Vase); and **Reneezgotzip** (City Zip, Sprint). "It's great to once again see such a depth of quality to this year's Longines Hong Kong International Races nominations," commented William A. Nader, the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Executive Director of Racing. "The horses nominated at this stage give a clear indication that this year's Turf World Championships, with its phenomenal prize money and great hospitality, will more than live up to its billing as world racing's de facto end-of-year Group 1 showcase."

### AUSSIE GOVERNMENT TO TARGET ILLEGAL OFFSHORE BOOKMAKERS

A national working group will be established by Australia's federal government to tackle illegal offshore wagering on racing and sports. The Illegal Offshore Wagering Working Group will be established under the Australian Government's Gambling Industry Advisory Council and will include representatives from the racing industry, professional sports and wagering organizations.

"There are significant numbers of illegitimate offshore operators already targeting Australian racing and sport, and it is vital that an effective regulatory regime be introduced to address the serious integrity and revenue risks that they pose," said Federal Minister for Social Services Kevin Andrews. "It is also important to discourage any Australian-based operators being tempted to relocate offshore in order to avoid the obligations to racing and sporting bodies that they face under existing Australian laws."

Victoria Premier and Minister for Racing Denis Napthine noted that paying product fees is in the long-term best interest of the bookmakers.

"Wagering revenue streams are important contributors to the funding of racing and sports facilities, implementation of integrity measures, prize money and participant payments and other operational costs," he said. "It is unfair that legitimate Australian-based and registered bookmakers pay the product fee required of them by racing and sports bodies while offshore bookmakers effectively pirate Australian product. Offshore bookmakers also refuse to adhere to integrity measures that are fundamental to the honest operation of the racing and sporting events. The working group will be asked to examine the regulatory regimes in international jurisdictions that may have an application within Australia and to also look at all other technological and legislative options available."

The Australian Racing Board welcomed the announcement.

"The ARB thanks and congratulates the Federal Government for its support of racing on this crucial issue," said ARB Chief Executive Officer Peter McGauran. "We also pay tribute to the Premier of Victoria and Minister for Racing Dr Denis Napthine, who has long advocated action on this issue and his strong leadership has been crucial to the establishment of the Working Group. The problem of illegal offshore bookmakers has long been recognized, but the Commonwealth has previously refused to become involved on the basis that racing is a state-based industry. However, only the Commonwealth has the constitutional powers to address offshore wagering and the states have been floundering for years for a solution. We are delighted to now have the Commonwealth body through which a legislative solution to the problem can be implemented."

The second of the South African Ready To Run Sales, the CTS Johannesburg Ready To Run Sale, commences at 4:30 p.m. today at the picturesque Inanda Club in the heart of Johannesburg's financial district. This is a new venture for Cape Thoroughbred Sales, who up to now have concentrated their sales efforts in Cape Town. However, a request by several vendors for a CTS Ready To Run Sale to be held in Johannesburg led to a solid book of 146 2-year-olds being offered. Prime Choice is a half-sister to international star Helene Vitality (NZ) (Zabeel), winner of the G1 New Zealand Derby and runner-up in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic.

Below are browsers that work, or ways to make your favorite browser work better.



**Internet Explorer:**  
Works as desired. Click away on a link, **click back**, and you're right back where you were.



**Firefox:**  
Works as desired. Click away on a link, **click back**, and you're right back where you were.



**Chrome:**  
If you click away, and **click the back button**, it will put you back at the top of page 1. Instead, **CTRL-click** and the link will open in a new window or tab, leaving the paper unmoved in its own window. You only need to close new window when you're finished.



**Safari on Mac:**  
Reloads the entire paper when you click **'back.'**

**Option 1:** **Right click** in the document and choose to Open in preview, which opens the paper in a new window with thumbnails down the right side. Now any clicks from the paper will open in new safari window.

**Option 2:** Read the paper in the TDN App, available in the iTunes app store by searching The TDN or Thoroughbred Daily News. Click open a new window over the paper, with an option to Close in the upper left corner bringing you back to the same spot in the paper.
