## FASIG TAKES A BC FLYER INTO NOVEMBER

Take a filly who won a Breeders' Cup race over the weekend and another who won last year. Add two GI Kentucky Oaks winners. Toss in a score of further Grade I winners and producers, including a Broodmare of the Year candidate, and what do you get? You get the 2014 Fasig-Tipton November Sale, which once again should offer some of the most exciting five or six hours of selling anywhere on the globe this evening. The single-session sale begins today at 4 p.m. and includes 193 hips in the main catalog, as well as at least seven in the supplemental portion.

As is usually the case, results from this weekend's Breeders' Cup World Championships figure heavily into the catalog's make-up.

**Dayatthespa** (City Zip) put up a career effort in her wire-to-wire victory in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf, and will be one of the sale's highlights when she goes through the ring late in the sale as [Hip 184](#).

"It wasn't just that she won--it was the

way she did it," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "Clearly, she established herself as one of the leading contenders for a divisional championship. And the horse that ran second to her, Stephanie's Kitten, ran a great second, and she's also in the sale."

A rallying runner-up on Saturday, **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy), who won the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' Turf in 2011, sells as the property of Ramsey Farm as [hip 141](#).

"When you look at Stephanie's Kitten's race record from 2-, 3-, 4-, and now at 5-years-old, the ability to be competitive in the Breeders' Cup at two, and then to be competitive at five, is just remarkable," said Browning.

## NOBLE MISSION TO LANE'S END

Three-time Group 1 winner **Noble Mission** (GB) (Galileo {Ire}--Kind {Ire}, by Danehill), a full-brother to superstar Frankel (GB), will begin his stud career next season at Lane's End Farm. Lane's End has purchased a majority interest in the stallion and will stand him in association with Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms. A homebred for Juddmonte Farms, Noble Mission recently capped his career with a win in the G1 Champion S.--a race won two years ago by Frankel. The 5-year-old also won this year's Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup. *Cont. p11*

## SOUNDING THE BATTLE CRY

The Melbourne Cup is indeed 'The Race That Stops a Nation,' but that nation could be Japan if **Admire Rakti** (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) can defy his 129 pound impost and provide the country with its second G1 Melbourne Cup. The Japanese stormed onto the Melbourne Cup scene and put up the exacta in the 2006 renewal with Delta Blues (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}) and Pop Rock (Jpn) (Helissio {Fr}), and with the strength of the Japanese breed having only increased in the interim, it would not be a surprise to see Admire Rakti justify favoritism.

The 6-year-old entire has been far from a superstar in his native country, but he hasn't been a slouch, either. He put up a career best when fourth, beaten just a length, behind Gentildonna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G1 Japan Cup last November, and while he was soundly beaten when 11th in the G1 Arima Kinen a month later, he returned this year to be second behind multiple Group 1 winner Gold Ship (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) in the G2 Hanshin Daishoten on seasonal debut Mar. 23. *Cont. p6*



The GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint winner **Judy the Beauty** (Ghostzapper) was a late scratch, but there were late additions to the November sale, too. The 3-year-old broodmare prospect **Love This Kitty** (Not For Love) ([ThoroStride video](#)), is a half-sister to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Hootenanny (Quality Road). Bluewater Sales consigns her as [Hip 200](#). Bluewater also consigns both the dam of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf third **Daddy D T** (Scat Daddy), the Awesome Again mare **Issues** ([Hip 92](#)), who sells in foal to Scat Daddy; and his Sky Mesa weanling half-sister ([Hip 18](#)).

Others with Breeders' Cup connections include [Hip 180](#), the 10-year-old mare **Concinnous** (El Corredor), whose MGISW daughter **lotapa** (Afleet Alex) ran third in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Gainesway consigns Concinnous, who is in foal to leading sire Tapit.

"It's fun to be around horses of this quality," said Browning. "We had a lot of great updates over an exciting two days of racing, and it sure helps. There's always a demand for quality, and especially 'current' quality, horses that are performing well now. We try to recruit horses with current connections, and it gets everyone charged up. It's an exciting time."

Other highlights of the sale include the winners of the 2012 and 2013 renewals of the Kentucky Oaks. Brereton Jones's

Airdrie Stud offers homebred **Believe You Can** (Proud Citizen), winner in '12, in foal to Tapit as [Hip 170](#).

She's preceded into the ring by last year's winner **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior), selling from Taylor Made Sales as a broodmare prospect as [Hip 125](#). Princess of Sylmar's dam, the 10-year-old **Storm Dixie** (Catiemus) ([Hip 143](#)), sells in foal to Tapit from the Brookdale Sales consignment, on behalf of owner King of Prussia Stable.

Jim and Pam Robinson have a rare commodity on their hands with **Champagne Royale** (French Deputy), who, according to Fasig-Tipton researchers, is one of just two mares on the planet this year to produce two 2014 Grade I winners in **Danza** (Street Boss) and **Majestic Harbor** (Rockport Harbor). The possible Broodmare of the Year candidate goes from their Brandywine Farm consignment as [Hip 178](#).

The November Sale is coming off a blockbuster 2013 renewal, when 129 horses sold for \$73,859,000, an average of \$572,550. While that represented a 17.3% drop in average from 2012--due largely in part to the sale of the \$10 million Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) in '12--the \$250,000 median was up 31.6%.

Moreover, last year's RNA rate of 20.9% was a vast improvement from the '12 RNA of 35.1%. Led by the \$5.2 million **Betterbetterbetter (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire})--Jude {GB}, by Darshaan {GB}), who was purchased by Whisper Hill Farm's Mandy Pope, there were 24 seven-figure horses who sold in 2013, including seven who made \$2 million or more.

"Our expectations are for a similar marketplace," said Browning. "I don't see any reason for it to be dramatically stronger, and I sure don't see any reason for it to be dramatically weaker. We're living in a fairly stable environment, and I think overall there's a competitive balance between buyers and sellers. I think we'll have a very solid sale. There will be some pleasant surprises, and I hope there will be some people who will hook up and be determined to buy no matter the price. But I think we still live in a world where there are limitations at the top of the market. I don't know what it is, but I don't think you're going to see \$25 million mares in Kentucky this week [laughs]. It's a healthy market."

**Dayatthespa Settles In at Fasig...**

The winner of Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf, **Dayatthespa** (City Zip), was settling in at Fasig-Tipton yesterday after an early morning flight from Southern California. "She got here at 1 p.m., came off the van and has been doing this since," said Lane's End's Allaire Ryan, pointing to Dayatthespa grazing a few feet away. The

5-year-old, who sells from Lane's End as [Hip 184](#), was alert but

relaxed as onlookers snapped photos. "The classy ones are like that," added Ryan. "They'll do it all. This time yesterday she was running her eyeballs out, and now she's just picking on some grass."

Dayatthespa was a 5-1 chance in the Breeders' Cup coming off a driving victory in the GI First Lady S. at Keeneland Oct. 4. She ran second in her belated seasonal debut facing New York-breds at Saratoga Aug. 2 before an easy win over Grade I winner Discreet Marq (Discreet Cat) in the restricted Yaddo S. Aug. 24.

"I know the goal of the partners was to get her to the Breeders' Cup," said Ryan. "They got a late start on her after giving her a well-deserved break, and she's just done everything they've asked of her. Everybody knew that the mile was her thing and that she was great at it, but for her to stretch out the way she did in the Breeders' Cup was so impressive."

Fasig officials were a little nervous Saturday when one of the co-owners of Dayatthespa intimated from the winner's circle that the filly might be kept to race another year. But in the end, the partners, which include Jerry and Ronald Frankel, Steve Laymon and Pete Bradley's Bradley Thoroughbreds, decided to keep the engagement at Newtown Paddocks.

"She's here to sell, but it is bittersweet when you have a filly like this, and all that she's done for you," said Pete Bradley, who himself arrived in Lexington late in the afternoon. "Do you keep her and try her for another year since she's at top of game? But it's a big partnership, and the plan has always been to sell her at the end of her 5-year-old year."

Bradley said he "couldn't see any reason why" Dayatthespa couldn't be returned to the track at six. "She's had an amazing career, but I think her last two races have really been her best," he said.

Admire Rakti couldn't keep up the momentum in the G1 Tenno Sho Spring May 4, finishing 13th, but he underscored the quality of Japanese-breds when running away with the G1 Caulfield Cup in his lone Australian outing thus far Oct. 18. Hung about eight wide coming off the turn on that occasion, Admire Rakti stormed down the middle of the track to win ultimately geared down under top weight of 128 pounds. The Caulfield Cup distance of 2400 meters is a different story than Melbourne's 3200 meters, however, and heavyweights haven't fared well in recent years, with the legendary Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}) being the only horse in the last 30 years to carry anything close to Admire Rakti's weight to victory in this marathon--she carried 128 pounds to her third straight win in 2005. Amongst the beaten heavyweights in recent years are Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}), who was victorious in 2011 then faltered under top weight in 2012 and last year, and Americain (Dynaformer), who suffered the same fate in 2011. So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) faltered to third under 123 pounds in 2010 less than two weeks after winning his second G1 Cox Plate, and three days after taking the G1 Mackinnon S.

Admire Rakti was handed a favor in Saturday's barrier draw, however, when landing in gate eight of 24.

"I am very pleased," trainer Tomoyuki Umeda told *Racing and Sports*. "Number eight is lucky. It is a good barrier for him and the same as he drew in the Caulfield Cup. I have a little concern with the weight at the distance, but he's a staying horse and should be good at the distance." **Cont. p7**

Underscoring the growing international nature of the Melbourne Cup, just two horses bred in Australia have captured that nation's most famous race in the last 14 years. Looking to buck the anti-Australian trend will be second-choice **Fawkner (Aus)** (Reset {Aus}), whose rock-solid recent form includes a victory in the

G1 Caulfield S. Oct. 11, and a runner-up effort in the G1 Cox Plate Oct. 25. The 7-year-old gelding burst to prominence when winning last year's Caulfield Cup prior to finishing sixth in the Melbourne Cup. Fawkner ran just once in the Australian autumn,

finishing seventh over much too short in the G1 William Reid S. over 1200 meters in March, but proved to be at his best this campaign when resuming with a second, beaten a short head, in the 1600-meter G1 Makybe Diva S. Sept. 13. The Robert Hickmott trainee earned his second Group 1 victory when stepped up to 2000 meters for the Caulfield, and lost nothing in defeat when missing by a short head to Adelaide (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Cox Plate after stumbling at the start. Fawkner certainly hails from the right barn to win the Melbourne Cup--his owner, Lloyd Williams, is the winningest owner of the Melbourne Cup with four trophies on his mantle, and Williams's two most recent winners, Efficient (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) in 2007 and Green Moon (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in 2012, both used the Cox Plate as a springboard to the first Tuesday in November.

"We're confident Fawkner has the right foundation this year," Lloyd Williams's son, Nick Williams, told *Racenet.com.au*. "Things didn't go the way we wanted them to last year but he still ran a very good race. Aside from his stumble in the Cox Plate, he's been beginning very well this year. We feel he can settle in a more prominent position and that should prove beneficial in the run home."

In the last 14 years, three New Zealand-breds have crossed the Tasman to claim the Melbourne Cup, but none since Efficient in 2007. **Lucia Valentina (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}) has a strong chance to add her name to that honor roll, however, as well as become the first filly to win since Makybe Diva. A Group 3 winner in her native country as a 2-year-old, Lucia Valentina won the G1 Vinery Stud S. last season in her third start after relocating to Australia prior to finishing third in the G1 Australian Oaks. Victorious in the G2 Tramway S. over 1400 meters to kick off her 4-year-old campaign Sept. 6, Lucia Valentina was sixth in the G1 George Main S. two weeks later before winning the G1 Turnbull S. a further two weeks later. A luckless run in the Caulfield Cup saw her chase Admire Rakti home in an admirable third. *Cont. p8*

The marathon distance of the Melbourne Cup is an unknown for Lucia Valentina, but trainer Kris Lees expressed confidence after a workout Oct. 28.

"Whether she can run the two miles, I'll know next week," he told *Racenet.com.au*. "My gut says she will based on the way she switches off in the run and attacks the line in her races. As long as she gets the right type of run and can suck through them I'm as confident as I can be."

**Signoff (Ire)** (Authorized {Ire}) was bred in Ireland but has done all his racing Down Under, and he was a late addition to the Melbourne Cup lineup after winning Saturday's G3 Lexus S. at Flemington, which grants the winner automatic entry into the A\$6-million Spring carnival showpiece. The winner of four straight races at the handicap and benchmark level last season, the Darren Weir-trained 5-year-old showed a new dimension when second in the G2 Herbert Power S. at Caulfield Oct. 11. He was third in the G3 David Jones Cup a week later, and sneaks into the lineup as the lightweight with 112 pounds, which will include world-renowned rider Joao Moreira, who steered him to victory Saturday. The last horse to complete the Lexus/Melbourne Cup double was Shocking (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) in 2009.

**Euros After 'Vintage' Success...**

Melbourne has been a popular hunting ground for the Europeans since Dermot Weld sent over Vintage Crop to win off the plane in 1993, and while a handful of European-bred imports have since clinched the prize, Vintage Crop remains the only international to win the Melbourne Cup without a local prep run. A team of seven shippers looks to join Vintage Crop on that lofty list, including **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), the globetrotting 8-year-old gelding who is no doubt a fan favorite of racegoers the world over. The Ed Dunlop charge will contest the Cup for the fourth straight year, and with two runner-up finishes under his belt--in 2011 and last year--he cannot be discounted.

Red Cadeaux was last seen finishing second in the G3 September S. at Kempton Sept. 6, and Dunlop admitted that a victory by the Ron Arculli colorbearer would likely be a career highlight.

"It would probably be the greatest victory of my training career, but I think a huge amount for Ronnie Arculli," Dunlop said. "It was his dream to try to win the Melbourne Cup with Red Cadeaux--he kindly paid and is about to do it four times. I think it would be an amazing day." *Cont. p9*

Dunlop added, "[Red Cadeaux] is as good as he's been since he's been here. His weight's good, and being drawn in 15 means we can do what we like. I think it's more open, the horse that just got in down the bottom [Signoff] is interesting. Whether there's the strength in depth, I doubt it. He's been second twice, and was very unlucky not to win the first time. Let's hope he gets a good passage and that it's a truly run race and not a sprint."

Fledgling trainer and former internationally renowned jockey Johnny Murtagh saddles a pair for the race in last-out Ebor H. winner **Mutual Regard (Ire)** (Hernando {Fr}) and the ever-reliable 2012 G1 Irish St Leger winner **Royal Diamond (Ire)** (King's Best), and Murtagh said he is pleased with the draw and hopes to channel the luck of the Irish.

"The Irish have a good record in the race, so let's hope it keeps going," he said. "I wanted to get middle draws and we got six and 12, so that was good. Mutual Regard has been in better form this year--he's the Ebor winner--but Royal Diamond has won an Irish Leger and has class on his side. He has done well since he has been down here."

Young Newmarket trainer Roger Varian has enjoyed a career-best year thanks to Group 1 winners Kingston Hill (GB) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), Cursory Glance (Distorted Humor), Belardo (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) and Vert de Grece (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}), and it would not be a surprise to see his current hot streak continue with the quirky but talented mare **My Ambivalent (Ire)** (Authorized {Ire}).

Racing as Ambivalent overseas, the 5-year-old mare tasted Group 1 glory in last year's Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh. Her lone overseas voyage thus far has been a strong third in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 29, and My Ambivalent won this season's G2 Middleton S. prior to finishing third in the G1 Coronation Cup. She was last seen finishing fourth while attempting to defend her title in the Pretty Polly June 29. Varian noted that he had intended to run his mare in the Caulfield Cup, but she was forced to the sidelines with a setback.

"Sometimes things happen for a reason," he noted. "She does run well after a break and although she's not straightforward, she behaves on the track and she's fit and well."

Saeed bin Suroor saddles a pair of Godolphin runners in **Cavalryman (GB)** (Halling) and **Willing Foe (Dynaformer)**. The former didn't quite measure up in this race when 12th two years ago, but bin Suroor noted the 8-year-old, who has won this year's G2 Princess of Wales's S. and G2 Goodwood Cup, is in top form.

"Cavalryman is a different horse-- he has won Group 2s at a mile-and-a-half and two miles," the conditioner noted. "He's doing well and is very happy here." *Cont. p10*

A trio of European raiders have taken the route of prepping in Australia, and one of those is Andreas Wohler's German shipper **Protectionist (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}), who will attempt to hand his late sire back-to-back runnings after Fiorente (Ire) (Monsun {Ger})'s success last year. Winner of the G2 Hansa Preis over 12 furlongs and the 15-furlong Prix Kergorlay in Germany and France, respectively, this summer, Protectionist finished fourth, beaten a length, in the G2 Herbert Power S. Oct. 11.

"He needed the prep run and could not be in better form," Wohler noted of the \$7.00 co-third choice. "I think he's fairly handicapped and hopefully he will prove it. I was impressed by Admire Rakti in the Caulfield Cup and he looks to be the main danger."

The Melbourne Cup goes off at 11 p.m. Eastern time tonight. The full result will appear in Wednesday's TDN.

"I have never seen so much animosity over a horse race," Baffert said. "It seems like people forgot how to watch a race. If the stewards had not posted the inquiry, there would not have been one. Mike Smith [rider of Shared Belief] wasn't going to [claim foul]. He said all the trouble happened a little later when the nine [Toast of New York] came over and by that time, my horse was already gone."

Baffert continued, "The sad part about all of this is that it distracts from what he did yesterday. It's not like he is a fluke. He can do it all and he's a fighter. You could tell he was not going to let that other horse [Toast of New York] by."

Winning owner Kaleem Shah added, "I just wish it would have come without all the controversy. If he is healthy, I would like [to take a shot at] the Dubai World Cup. When Bob tells me he is ready to roll, we roll. As long as he stays healthy and sound, he'll run at 4, 5 and 6."

Baffert's other runners finished as follows: **Secret Circle** (Eddington), second in the Sprint; **Indianapolis** (Medaglia d'Oro), 10th in the Sprint; **One Lucky Dane** (Lookin at Lucky), sixth in the Juvenile; **Fed Biz** (Giant's Causeway), seventh in the Dirt Mile; and **Tiz Midnight** (Midnight Lute), sixth in the Distaff.

**TOAST TRAVELS SET TO CONTINUE**

Trainer Jamie Osborne was already busy planning the racing future of GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up **Toast of New York** (Thewayyouare) yesterday the day after the British-based 3-year-old missed out on America's richest prize by a nose.

Osborne was upbeat yesterday, telling *Racing Post*, "He has the potential to be one of the highest-earning horses in the world. He's never going to run for less than a million and I can't see him running in England. We'll choose our

targets and if he runs three or four times a year for the next two years and every time he runs for a few million in prize money, that would do."

Michael Buckley's colorbearer has traveled far and wide this year, kicking off his sophomore campaign with a victory in the G2 UAE Derby on the Dubai World Cup undercard Mar. 29. He resurfaced in the GI Belmont Derby July 5, but could finish no better than sixth. It was discovered thereafter he had picked up a virus, and the bay showed his true colors next out when finishing second after a hard-luck trip to champion Shared Belief (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 25. Osborne's primary targets for next season are the G1 Dubai World Cup and the Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland.

"I have been ruing the decision of Meydan to put the dirt down there over the last few months, thinking if only we could go back to Tapeta, as he'd be nearly one of the favorites for the World Cup," Osborne told the trade daily. "But he looked like a horse yesterday who had been running on dirt all his life. He looked so at ease on it. It did suit his style. It opens up all sorts of things and if we're lucky enough, to still have him and he stays sound, he could potentially top and tail the next two years in Meydan and in a Breeders' Cup Classic."

**'CHROME' EXITS CLASSIC WELL**

Veteran conditioner Art Sherman was pleased with GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. hero **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit) following his third-place finish in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The Steve Coburn and Perry Martin homebred was shipped back to his Los Alamitos base Saturday night.

"It was a great race for him, and a game race to get beat by a neck," said Sherman. "Maybe with a stronger race the one before [in the GI Pennsylvania Derby where he finished sixth] he might have won, but I don't know."

Future plans for the flashy chestnut have yet to be determined.

"I'll have to talk to the owners," the 77-year-old conditioner commented. "It's been a great run. He's done everything we wanted...\$4 million. It's been a great year."



### SHARED BELIEF DOING OK POST CLASSIC

Last year's champion juvenile **Shared Belief** (Candy Ride {Arg}) is doing fine after suffering his first defeat in Saturday's controversial GI Breeders' Cup Classic, where he finished fourth after a troubled start.

"He came out OK," said conditioner Jerry Hollendorfer. "I don't have any plans. He will go back to Golden Gate Fields. He needs to be freshened up a bit."

Both Hollendorfer and his chief assistant Dan Ward refused to comment on the incident at the start in which Classic winner Bayern (Offlee Wild) broke sharply to the left knocking right into Shared Belief.

"We want to make sure he's OK," said Ward. "He will walk and rest for a couple of days before shipping back to Golden Gate."

Hollendorfer saddled two other Breeders' Cup runners in **Parranda** (English Channel), sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, and **Majestic Presence** (Majestic Warrior), ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Parranda was flown to Kentucky and will sell as [hip 120](#) in today's Fasig-Tipton November sale. Majestic Presence may make her next start at the upcoming Del Mar fall meet.

"She came back with a lot of dirt in her face," said Ward of Majestic Presence. "She was covered with mud. It looked like the race had been run in the mud."

He also sent out Filly & Mare Turf runner-up **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy).

"It was just incredible," Brown said. "There were so many highlights to the weekend--of course, the three winners. But it was the whole experience all week. So many of my clients came to town for the week. Santa Anita and the Breeders' Cup were incredible hosts."

Brown added, "I got to see one of my former mentors, Humberto Ascanio, who worked for Bobby Frankel for over 35 years. On Saturday, Humberto was there when we won with Bobby's Kitten, who we named after [Frankel]. "We were taking a shot, cutting him back to the hill," Brown commented. "He'd never done that before. Joel [Rosario] just rode a beautiful race. I was concerned he was too far back, but he timed it right. Mr. Ramsey mentioned possibly taking the horse to Ascot, so that will be discussed. Longer term than that would be to try to get this horse to the Breeders' Cup Mile next year at Keeneland."

Two races prior to the Turf Sprint, the New York-bred Dayatthespa went box-to-wire in the Filly & Mare Turf with stablemate Stephanie's Kitten flying late for second.

"It was unbelievable," the young conditioner remarked. "She was in career form. She had just won the [GI] First Lady. It was just a matter of distance. Javier [Castellano] really deserves the credit for getting her to relax and executing the plan."

Owned by Jerry Frankel, Ronald Frankel, Steve Laymon and Bradley Thoroughbreds, the chestnut now boasts 11 victories--three of which are Grade I's--from 18 starts and earnings of \$2,288,892. She will be offered as [hip 184](#) at today's Fasig-Tipton November sale.

"She's scheduled to be offered at Fasig-Tipton," Brown said of the 5-year-old. "I'm sure the ownership will make the right decision. I couldn't blame anyone who wanted to go out on top. I could also understand if they wanted to go on with her. She's in career form right now. She isn't showing any signs of slowing down. It's a tough decision, but I'm sure they'll make the right call."

Stephanie's Kitten will also go through today's sale as [hip 141](#).

Though Brown will be losing two of his stable's stars, the undefeated Lady Eli has proven to be one quickly on the rise.

"Just when Dayatthespa is scheduled to go off into the sunset, we get Lady Eli," Brown said. "She reminds me quite a bit of [Dayatthespa]. I think she's the best 2-year-old filly in the country, regardless of the surface she's running on. Hopefully, they'll both win Eclipse Awards. They deserve it."




"All indications are good, but you really don't know for a couple of days," the conditioner said. "We are going to put him away for the year and concentrate on the spring."

The bay overcame odds of 13-1 to register a 6 1/2-length victory in the Juvenile.

"It was impossible to expect something like that against the best horses around," Desormeaux said.

Texas Red was piloted by his trainer's brother Kent Desormeaux, who just returned to the track Oct. 26 after being briefly sidelined with broken ribs suffered when he was double-barreled by a horse in the paddock.

"He lives for the Derby dream and it looks like he is going to get to do it again," Keith Desormeaux said of his brother. "He has had a rough couple of years and it looks like that is behind him now and he can concentrate on what he does best and that is riding races."

Kent Desormeaux added, "[Texas Red] was just getting into gear. When he got to the wire, he was like 'Is that it?' The road to Kentucky leads through here."

### WARD TRAINEES LOOKING GOOD

Though Wesley Ward chose to remain in Florida with his children rather than make the trip to Santa Anita, he scored a career high in Arcadia with his first two Breeders' Cup wins. **Hootenanny** (Quality Road) led home a Ward exacta that included **Luck of Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Friday. The Ward-owned **Judy the Beauty**

With the Breeders' Cup being at Keeneland [in 2015] and how well he does there, I would love to give him one more go. All my horses do so well at Keeneland and I think [No Nay Never] definitely has some good racing left in him."

On his choice to remain in Florida for his son's cross country meet, Ward said, "My being there wouldn't have made them run faster and the smile on my boy's face being here couldn't make me happier. Everybody's happy."

**BC ANNIVERSARY FOR MOTION**

Graham Motion celebrated the 10-year anniversary of his first Breeders' Cup win with Better Talk Now (Talkin Man) in the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Lone Star Park with another victory in that event courtesy of **Main Sequence** (Aldebaran).

"It's pretty neat," Motion said. "It's amazing that it would come around full circle like that, especially since [Better Talk] was the horse that kind of put me on the map and is probably the reason I have horses like this."

He showed something that we hadn't seen before--that turn of foot. With every race, he's gotten better; he really has."

Main Sequence will return to Fair Hills, but not future plans have been made as of yet.

"We haven't decided anything yet," Motion said. "We've been invited to Japan [Japan Cup at Tokyo Racecourse Nov. 30] and Hong Kong [Hong Kong Vase or Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin Dec. 14]. I don't know, I just might take him back to Fair Hill and regroup. It's a good shot we could do Dubai. The world is his oyster at the moment. I'm not sure what to do."

With four Grade I wins, the chestnut seems to have the Eclipse award for top turf male firmly in his grasp and following yesterday's victory many think Horse of the Year is not out of the question.

Fellow Motion runners **Rainha Da Bateria** (Broken Vow), ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, and **Rusty Slipper** (Lemon Drop Kid), 10th in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, both exited their races in good order.

**ALBERTRANI RUNNERS ON THE MOVE**

Tom Albertrani returned to his New York base Saturday night and his two Breeders' Cup runners **Better Lucky** (Ghostzapper), second in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint, and **Twilight Eclipse** (Purim), third in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, also had post-championship travel plans.

"Better Lucky is going to Kentucky this afternoon and Twilight Eclipse leaves for Florida on Monday night," Albertrani said. "Better Lucky, that was probably her last race and for Twilight Eclipse, the [GIII] W.L. McKnight [on Dec. 27 at Gulfstream Park] is a possibility or we may just freshen him up."

Godolphin Racing's Better Lucky is a two-time Grade I winner on grass and is now graded stakes-placed on both dirt and polytrack.

"I have been saying all along that she can run on anything--grass, Poly, dirt," Albertrani said. "I was delighted to see her run so well." **Cont. p17**

After hitting the board in five Breeders' Cup races, including a win with Main Sequence (Aldebaran) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, John Velazquez took home his third Bill Shoemaker Award as the most outstanding jockey in the championships. His victory with Main Sequence was his 13th Breeders' Cup win overall.

In addition to his Turf victory, the Hall of Famer piloted GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up Carpe Diem (Giant's Causeway), GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Turf runner-up Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy), GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint third-place finisher Undrafted

(Purim) and GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Sprint third Thank You Marylou (Birdstone).

Winner of this award in both 2004 and 2011, Velazquez missed the majority of the Breeders' Cup last year due to injuries he received when his mount, the ill-fated Secret Compass (Discreet Cat), went down in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. The last two Shoemaker awards for 2012 and 2013 were both won by fellow Hall of Famer Mike Smith.

**BREEDERS' CUP ATTENDANCE UP**

A crowd of 61,114 filled the stands for day two of the Breeders' Cup championships Saturday, which brought the two-day total attendance up to 98,319. This was a 4% increase over last year's total attendance of 94,628, as well as the 2013 Saturday attendance of 58,795.

The total two-day common-pool handle reached \$151,158,815, which was a 6% decrease from the 2013 total of \$160,704,877. The two-day wagering total was \$128,215,643 compared to a handle of \$136,549,714 for the two days in 2013.

Wagering on Saturday's 12-race Breeders' Cup card was down 3% from last year at \$105,979,291, as opposed to the 2013 figure of \$109,184,432. Saturday's handle was affected when two races on the undercard were removed from the turf and put on the main track.

As the field turned for home, Gentildonna--down on the fence--was forced to squeeze through a narrow opening, while Isla Bonita switched out a path and was winding up four wide. That pair at last hooked up again inside the final 200 meters, but in the meantime Spielberg was flying down the middle of the track, and their advantage was short lived as the bay ran them down in the closing stages to win by three-quarters of a length going away. Gentildonna stuck her head in front for second, and Isla Bonita was third. "He's never a sharp starter, but we were able to travel smoothly down the backstretch," said winning rider Hiroshi Kitamura. "I guided him out to avoid the leaders that were bunched up at the top of the stretch, and he responded beautifully. He's been lightly raced with long intervals, but he's gaining strength and is developing well. As long as he's fit, I'm sure he'll continue to show good results."

**Spielberg Steals the Sho cont.**

Raced just once at two--a victory over this course-- Spielberg got going early the following year and after placing twice in Group 3s and winning the Listed Principal S., connections opted for a tilt at the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby). Spielberg proved to be in over his head on that occasion, finishing 14th, and was not seen again until last August. Sixth in a Hakodate conditions event off a 14-month layoff, Spielberg then reeled off two straight wins at that level to close out the year. Making a belated seasonal debut in a 1 1/16-mile May 24 conditions race here, Spielberg returned a winner, and prepped for this lofty target with a third over the same track and trip in the G3 Mainichi Oka Oct. 12. Trainer Kazuo Fujisawa noted that today's distance appears to be Spielberg's game, but that he is likely to step up two furlongs for the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 30.

"He has a liking for the Tokyo course, so the Japan Cup is likely to be his next target," the conditioner said.

Gentildonna was not disgraced finishing second off the layoff, and the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic winner put a dull ninth-place effort in the June 29 Takarazuka Kinen behind her as she prepares for a tilt at a third consecutive Japan Cup victory. Isla Bonita, the lone 3-year-old in the field, also put up a bold showing in his first try against elders coming off a win in the G2 St Lite Kinen Sept. 21.

Spielberg becomes the third Group 1 winner for the 19-year-old Princess Olivia (Lycius), the dam of GI Travers S. winner and sire Flower Alley. Princess Olivia was sold to Shadai Farm for \$825,000 at Keeneland November in 2005 just months after Flower Alley won the Travers. It was Princess Olivia's fifth time in five years to go through a sales ring. She was picked up by Adena Springs for \$32,000 at Keeneland January in 2000 before being bought back by Bona Terra Farm for \$10,000 at Fasig-Tipton while carrying Flower Alley the following year. Sent through the ring again while still carrying Flower Alley at Fasig February less than three months later, she was bought back again for \$9,500. She RNA'd again, this time in foal to Victory Gallop, at the same sale two years later. Princess Olivia's first Japanese-bred foal was the Group 2-placed filly Blooming Alley, who was followed by G1 Mile Championship winner Tosen Ra and Spielberg.

The Premio Roma was Priore Philip's first try at 2000 meters, and it proved a smashing success as the sophomore drew away from his elders to win with ease. Priore Philip went six-for-seven through his juvenile season last year, capped with a win in the G1 Gran Criterium, and was dominant this year in the G2 Premio Carlo Vittadini May 25 and the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua Sept. 28, the two championship events for milers in Italy. The step up in trip looked a demanding one, but the chestnut passed the test with flying colors. He settled in fifth and moved into a clear gap with 600 meters remaining to join the front-running Cleo Fan. Jockey Dario Vargiu pushed the button just before the 200 meter mark and Priore Philip drew clear to score by six lengths over that rival with the German trained Dartagnan d'Azur, a Group 3 winner last out, in third. Priore Philip set the new stakes record of 1.58.40 and clocked the last 400 meters in a sharp :20.90. "I expected him to win, but not so easily," said trainer Stefano Botti. "Priore Philip is a fantastic horse--he improves all the time, and this win over 2000 meters will give us a lot of opportunities for the future. I think he could develop into an international performer next season--now he deserves a good rest."

Priore Philip is just the third 3-year-old to win the Premio Roma since 1988.

Back-to-back conditions victories followed in Milan Sept. 17 and here Sept. 30, and Porsenna was third in a handicap over this strip Oct. 26. The combination of strong pace and fast ground paid dividends for the 12-1 longshot yesterday. Porsenna came outside to challenge and jumped in front 100 meters from home, holding the late charge of Kramulkie, while the French shipper Dancing Sands was a bit unlucky at the 400 meter pole. Porsenna is owned by Scuderia Aleali, who also bought his yearling half-brother by Dream Ahead for €36,000 at this year's SGA Select Sale.

gate and gradually moved up to stalk runaway pacesetter El Kabeir through fractions of :23.58 and :46.85. He quickly reeled in the leader on the turn, took over in upper stretch and drifted slightly before being straightened and sailed clear to remain unbeaten. "We've always felt like he would continue to stretch out,"

commented winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "With the way everything unfolded--starting out in a five-furlong race--we felt the [six-furlong] Futurity made sense, and then [the one-mile Nashua] made sense. The bottom side of his pedigree, and being by Quality Road, everything suggests he should stretch out." As for what is next for Blofeld, Pletcher added, "We talked about running here and then giving him a little bit of break; we've also talked about coming back in the [Nov. 29 GII] Remsen. I didn't see anything today--at least from a distance standpoint--that would discourage me from looking at the Remsen." Winning rider John Velazquez has been impressed with the talented juvenile. "So far, he's done everything really good, even from his first start in Saratoga," Velazquez said. "We thought he was going to be very quick from the gate, but it actually turned out much better as it takes a little bit to get him going. You just sit with him until he gets going. He's done it every single time. He's done everything asked of him." Keats Grove Farm purchased Storm Minstrel, with Blofeld in utero, for \$150,000 from the Ned Evans dispersal at the 2011 Keeneland November sale. The mare's Mineshaft colt sold for \$375,000 to Ben Glass, agent for Gary and Mary West, at this year's Keeneland September sale. She produced a colt by Arch this spring.

Heavily supported at the windows, Filimbi paused for just a moment exiting the stalls, but broke sharply enough to avoid losing any ground and settled in her preferred position at the back of the pack. Cabooing the field, the grey saved ground early as 50-1 shot Legacy (Sightseeing) zipped along through speedy early splits of :22.67 and :46.46. Winding up on the far turn, she came charging down the center of the track to swiftly inhale her rivals and secure her first graded victory. Runner-up Emotional Kitten (Kitten's Joy) and third-place finisher I'm Already Sexy (Ready's Image) were both disqualified for interference in the stretch and placed fourth and fifth, respectively. Strathnaver was promoted to second and Wall of Sound moved to third. "We didn't really expect the race to unfold as it did," Mott's assistant Rodolphe Brisset said of the wide stretch run. "We let Joel [Rosario] make the choice from the gate. She didn't break very well, and they were going pretty quick, 22 and change and 47 and two, so he decided to sit where he was, take a hold of her, and make one run. She's a nice filly. She won pretty easy." Filimbi boasts three wins in France prior to coming to America and transferring from trainer Christine Head-Maarek to Hall of Famer Bill Mott. Capturing Chantilly's Prix Isola Bella in her final European start last November, the grey was second as the favorite to eventual GI Diana S. heroine Somali Lemonade (Lemon Drop Kid) while making her Stateside debut in a Keeneland allowance Apr. 13. Successful next time out in a Belmont optional claimer May 21, the Juddmonte homebred scored again over GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine Dayatthespa (City Zip) in Saratoga's restricted De La Rose S. Aug. 2. Filimbi failed to fire when sixth as the heavy chalk in that venue's GII Ballston Spa S. Aug. 23 and failed to run to her odds last time behind Dayatthespa and GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint runner-up Better Lucky (Ghostzapper) in Keeneland's one-mile GI First Lady S. Oct. 4. Filimbi's millionaire dam Flute (Seattle Slew) captured the 2001 GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Alabama S. Barren in 2011 after foaling Filimbi in 2010, the bay produced a Pleasantly Perfect filly in 2012 named Perfect Flute, who is currently unraced. Flute also produced a colt by Lonhro (Aus) last year and a filly by First Defence this year.

"The only question was whether she could handle the distance, and she did," commented winning rider Jose Ortiz. "I put her on the lead and she relaxed very well. She got a little tired at the end, but it was her first time at a mile. [Trainer] Mike Hushion did a great job with her." Hushion added, "I loved the way the race set up, the

way she managed to stay up in there, and that he didn't have to send her hard in the first part. I guess it [bodes well for her going farther]. You look at the time and scratch your head, but we know there were some very, very talented fillies behind her." Jacaranda's dam, Baffled was a \$350,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase by Fox Hill Farm in 2006. She was third in the 2007 G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot. "Well, if Bayern holds on to win, he will come down," I said just a few seconds into the running of the Breeders' Cup Classic Saturday at Santa Anita.

The colt had veered sharply inward at the start and clearly interfered with horses.

"Who is that?" I screamed only moments later. "There is another foul."

That second bit of mayhem was caused by Toast of New York, who came crashing toward the rail and also caused interference.

Bayern did win, and Toast of New York finished second. But incomprehensibly, neither was disqualified.

After a lengthy inquiry, somehow stewards Scott Chaney, Tom Ward and Kim Sawyer unanimously voted to leave the order of finish intact.

The stewards later said they in fact agreed there was interference, but did not change the order of finish because it could not be assumed the bumping incidents caused any horse a chance to improve their placing.

Could not be assumed?

Really?

Any handicapper could assume the interference affected the outcome of the race.

Any racing fan could assume the interference affected the outcome of the race.

The stewards referred to a bad California Horse Racing Board rule in a statement, saying, "After speaking with patrol judges and riders involved, it was our unanimous decision that, pursuant to CHRB Rule 1699, the incident occurred in a part of the race where the horses interfered with were not cost the opportunity to place where they reasonably expected to finish."

So, if a foul happens at the start of a race it is OK, but if it happens in the stretch it is not OK.

No one can think that makes sense.

Here is what the official chart of the race said:


"BAYERN broke inward bumping SHARED BELIEF and also forcing that rival into MORENO, cleared after a sixteenth of a mile and was guided to the rail, set the pace under a light hold, was called upon leaving the five sixteenths marker, met oncoming challenges from TOAST OF NEW YORK and CALIFORNIA CHROME near the sixteenth marker, wandered outward a bit under left handed rousing and dug in gamely to prevail by the slimmest of margins. TOAST OF NEW YORK angled over soon after the break putting SHARED BELIEF in close quarters and bumping MORENO, straightened and stalked the winner just out from the inside, ranged up outside that one heading towards the sixteenth pole, continued gamely between rivals and just missed."

Maybe in the future, at least in California, the chartcallers should not refer to what happens at the start of a race, since the stewards have deemed that part of a race to be unimportant.

Just like Bayern, Moreno was committed to the lead. Bayern had the lead at the first call in his last three starts; Moreno in three of his prior four outings.

One can assume, unless of course you happen to be a California steward, that when Moreno was bumped hard at the start, it caused him to not make the lead, which cost him "the opportunity to place" where he reasonably expected to finish. *Cont. p26*



Previously unbeaten Shared Belief did not need the lead, but he was bumped once and was forced to steady once. His connections have the right to think their horse deserved a clean run.

And, one can reasonably assume that had Shared Belief not been interfered with twice the first time down the stretch he might have finished in a more favorable position.

Jockey Martin Garcia, who rode Bayern, said his mount broke straight.

One can only assume he was thinking of some other race on some other day.

Bob Baffert, who trains Bayern, said those things happen at the start of races.

Baffert is right, but that is why we have stewards. So when those things happen, the judges represent the best interests of the betting public and make tough, and often unpopular, rulings.

The California Horse Racing Board should review its idiotic rules.

The Breeders' Cup should be apologetic to the public, like when a league reviews a game and issues a statement saying its officials blew a call. They can't do anything about it but at least they recognize the error and acknowledge it.

Racing, as an industry, should wonder why on one of its biggest days, so many of its loyal fans are left shaking their heads in disbelief at what they have witnessed.

Moreno finished last. Bayern and Toast of New York should have been placed in a dead-heat for last behind him. California Chrome, beaten a nose and neck, should have been elevated to first, followed by Shared Belief and Tonalist.

Bayern is named for the Bayern Munich soccer club.

Stewards Scott Chaney, Tom Ward and Kim Sawyer should be given red cards.

### BERNARDINI, CAPTAIN AL COLTS STAR AT TBA SALE By Liesl King

Bloodstock South Africa's Ready To Run Sale yesterday posted solid figures across the board. A total of 119 lots passed through the ring for an aggregate of R22,340,000 (US\$2,024,229), an average of R242,826 (US\$22,002) and a median of R155,000 (US\$14,045). Owner Brian Burnard headed the buyers list, spending R2,295,000 on four lots, with bloodstock agent John Freeman in second position, buying three lots for R2,070,000. Balmoral Stud topped the vendors list, selling 57 lots for R15,685,000, while Captain Al (SAf) topped the sires list with two colts and a filly selling for R2,360,000. The joint sales toppers were Lots [27](#) and [35](#), both achieving R1.2 million (US\$108,732). "It has been a very satisfactory sale," said Kevin Woolward, chief executive officer of the TBA. cont. p8

With shuttle stallions a long way off for South Africa, imported horses are always well received and Lot 27, a Bernardini colt out of the Silver Ghost mare Coffee Shop, from the female family of Beethoven and Henrythenavigator caused quite a stir. A spirited bidding war ensued before the colt was knocked down to owner Alesh Naidoo for R1.2 million.

Brian Burnard, owner of the G1 Vodacom Durban July runner No Worries, was out to add to his string and could not resist the Captain Al (SAf) colt out of the Kabool (GB) mare Divine (SAf) from the family of Martial Eagle (SAf), winner of the prestigious G1 J&B Met. Consigned by Balmoral Stud as Lot 35, the colt put up an impressive gallop and Burnard was forced to go to R1.2 million before the colt was his. For good measure, he also bought [lot 38](#), the classy Western Winter colt, out of the Model Man mare Easyjadeasy (SAf) for R775,000.

Bloodstock agent John Freeman went to R1.1 million to acquire the strapping Star Witness (Aus) colt ([lot 15](#)) out of the Goldkeeper mare Battle Maiden (Zim). Crowned champion older middle distance female in 2003, Battle Maiden was exported to Australia, and with her only runner, a Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire) colt, already a three time winner, Freeman had some stiff competition for the colt. Freeman also signed for [lot 30](#), a Captain Al colt out of Cornucopia, a half-sister to G1 Beverly D. S. winner Crimson Palace (SAf), for R900,000.

Adriaan van Vuuren went to R700,000 for [lot 50](#), the highest-priced filly of the sale, a daughter of Western Winter out of the Primo Dominie (GB) mare Honeytrap (Fr). Honeytrap is a half-sister to top racehorse and sire Gunboat Diplomacy (Fr), and with Western Winter sadly deceased, the filly was a shrewd buy on paddock value alone. Van Vuuren also acquired [lot 13](#), a colt by sire sensation Var out of the Confidential Talk mare Avian Talk (Arg) for R900,000 and [lot 60](#), a Black Minnaloushe filly out of the National Assembly mare Jungle Assembly (SAf) for R300,000.


