A SWAN 'SONG'? NOT QUITE YET AT KEENOV

And then there was one. One session left at Keeneland November, that is, following yesterday's penultimate day of selling in Lexington. Numbers were down a bit from last year's corresponding 10th session.

A total of 258 horses sold for \$2,917,500, an average of \$11,308 that dipped 2.1% from 2013. The median was \$6,750, down 10%. The RNA rate was a low 16.5%, but still off last year's figure of 11.4%.

As it stands now, 2,350 horses have sold at November for \$204,830,100. The

cumulative average is \$87,162, an 8.6% gain from a year ago, while the median is \$40,000, up 14.3%. The cumulative RNA rate is 21.4%; last year it was 14.5%.

Topping Thursday's session was the 5-year-old broodmare **Songs and Sonnets** (Unbridled's Song--Bedanken, by Geri), who elicited a bid of \$115,000 from Jane Buchanan, agent. The handsome gray sold in foal on a Feb. 20 cover to **Alternation** (Distorted Humor). **Cont. p3**

BOLGER LEAVING LEGACY AS A BREEDER

Trainer Jim Bolger has left an indelible mark on the Irish--and indeed, the global--racing world in his nearly 40 years as a racehorse trainer. The equine luminaries to have passed through his hands include the likes of G1 Hong Kong Cup and five-time Group 1 winner Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}), G1 Investec Derby, G1 Irish Champion S. and G1 Champion S. hero and leading sire New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), triple Group 1 and dual Classic victress Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) and triple Group 1 heroine Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Bolger has sent out Group 1 winners in five countries, and his trophy haul includes the hardware of eight Classics, including the 1000 and 2000 Guineas and Derby, the Irish 1000 Guineas and both the Irish Derby and Oaks twice. In the midst of all this success, however, the majority of the horses trained by the 72-year-old Bolger have been his own homebreds and he has been, somewhat quietly, building a breeding dynasty. What has perhaps been Ireland's best-kept breeding secret is under wraps no more, however, and next week Bolger will offer his largest-ever draft of eight foals at the Goffs November Foal Sale, as well as 10 mares at that auction house's Breeding Stock Sale. **Cont. p13**

GLOWING 'REVIEW' FOR COLEBROOK

Trainer Ben Colebrook is anything but a new kid on the block, even though he has only been training horses on his own for just over two years. It's been a slow process in building up to a current count of 34 horses in the barn for a variety of clients, and the stable star, **Sparkling Review** (Lemon Drop Kid) will look to make it two graded stakes in a row in tomorrow's GII Mrs. Revere S. at Churchill Downs.

Colebrook, 36, cut his teeth in the late 1990s and early 2000s working for Bill Harrigan at Miacomet Farm and helping with its sales consignments. Colebrook would go on to become an assistant to trainer Christophe Clement

and held that position for about 4 1/2 years while in charge of a string of 2-year-olds, including a colt named Tonalist (Tapit). **Cont. p7**

Buchanan, sitting along the aisleway just under the press box, said she was buying on behalf of an undisclosed client and confirmed the mare would resume her breeding career in the States.

Jody and Michelle Huckabay's Elm Tree Farm consigned the homebred Songs and Sonnets as [Hip 3661](#) on behalf of Pin Oak Stud, which stands Alternation.

"She's just a beautiful Unbridled's Song mare," said Jody Huckabay, who joined with Pin Oak's Clifford Barry in thanking Buchanan. "We're all big fans of Alternation, and she was put in here with the hopes of topping the session, and thankfully she did."

A daughter of Pin Oak's very good MGSW Bedanken, Songs and Sonnets broke her maiden at second asking

in an Arlington Park maiden special in 2011. She later romped by eight lengths in a one-mile Oaklawn N2X in her first start on conventional dirt. She was trained by Donnie Von Hemel.

Some have commented over the last few days that good mares were

being overlooked in preference of weanlings, but Huckabay said he wasn't worried that Songs and Sonnets would attract the right attention. **Cont. p4**

“It seems if you bring a good one up, someone jumps on the phone and finds the money for her,” he said. “This was a mare I saw six months ago who I just fell in love with. She’s absolutely gorgeous, and the price reflected that. If you have the horse at Keeneland, they’re going to give you the money. Everybody was lined up behind her coming up from the barn. It’s a lot of fun to sell a good one.”

A former **“TDN Rising Star”**, the millionaire Alternation won nine of 19 starts, including the 2011 GII Peter Pan S. and the following season’s GII Oaklawn H.

“He’s a really nice horse that Pin Oak bred and raced, and they’ve supported him with some really nice mares,” said Huckabay. “Physically, he’s a beautiful, beautiful Distorted Humor. He’s really leggy and has a really good hind leg on him, and we think he’s got a big future. We bought a share in him ourselves.”

Tapizar Another Example of Tapit's Ascendancy..

Shortly after the results for the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile were made official, Gainesway Farm's Antony Beck and Michael Gainesway stood in the shedrow of trainer Steve Asmussen's stable. Before them was the winner of the race, the 4-year-old **Tapizar**, a powerful-looking son of Gainesway's rising star Tapit who was still fired up from his open-lengths win. But Beck and Hernon hadn't made the walk to Santa Anita's backside just to admire their stallion's third Breeders' Cup winner. They were there on business. With them was Ron Winchell, whose family's Winchell Thoroughbreds owned and bred Tapizar. The Winchells had also, of course, owned Tapit, a \$625,000 KESEP yearling purchase.

"Naturally we were very familiar with Tapizar, but we went back just to eyeball him again," said Hernon.

The men quickly came to an agreement. Gainesway purchased a significant interest in Tapizar, as it did in Tapit seven years earlier, and announced that the prodigal son would return to stand alongside his sire in Kentucky.

Two years on, the results of that agreement--weanlings from Tapizar's first crop--hit the market at November, and if Tapit's son Trappe Shot was the surprise standout at this year's yearling sales, Tapizar showed he might garner similar support next season.

Heading into yesterday's penultimate session at November, Tapizar had 15 weanlings from 17 on offer sell for \$83,600. His median was \$75,000, off a \$15,000 fee, and his offspring included a \$190,000 son of Strict Access (Mr. Greeley) from Dark Hollow Farm that was hammered down to Lakeview Stables [Hip 1666](#).

"Tapizar is a big horse; he's 16.1 [hands], and is a strong horse with a lot of bone and substance, and his first-crop foals strongly resemble him," said Michael Hernon. "He's certainly stamping them. They have size and strength, and some top horsemen are buying them: J.J. Crupi, Nick de Meric, McMahon and Hill Bloodstock, Winchell Thoroughbreds."

Tapizar's early commercial success is a reflection of how the market is looking at Tapit these days. Almost since champion Stardom Bound emerged from his first crop to win the 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, Tapit has been considered a clear source of top runners. But in recent years, and in particular thanks to a huge 2014--which included GI Kentucky Oaks and Breeders' Cup wins by Untapable and a Classic victory by Tonalist--Tapit's fee has been doubled to \$300,000. That, too, after his 2014 yearlings, from 40 to sell, averaged \$611,125. **Cont. p6**

Clearly, buyers aren't just looking at Tapit yearlings as top racing prospects. They're looking at them--well, his colts, at least--as potential stallion prospects, too.

"There's no question," said Heron. "I think he's very well positioned to be a sire of sires going forward. Horses like Tapizar, Trappe Shot and Hansen have gotten off to exciting starts at stud. And next season, he's going to breed 135 incredibly high-quality, well-managed mares. Those resulting foals will have stallions' pedigrees. Some may have balked at \$300,000, and it's obviously a very significant stud fee, but given the demand, I think it was the right decision. We have a stack of pedigrees in the office of some very, very good mares who tried to get into the horse [and couldn't]."

Tapizar isn't the only son of Tapit to have his first weanlings sell at November. The aforementioned Hansen had his first sell, too, with 15 averaging \$46,000, while weanlings from Trappe Shot's second crop have averaged \$55,125.

For Heron, it doesn't seem so long ago that he made the trip to trainer Michael Dickinson's Tapeta Farm in Maryland to first examine Tapit in person. It was the fall of 2004, and Tapit was coming off a star-crossed season that nonetheless saw him win the GI Wood Memorial S. in last-to-first fashion.

"We were approached by [Winchell Racing manager] David Fiske," remembered Heron.

"He was a horse I was very keen on, and I spoke to Antony, who said, 'Well, jump on a plane and go see him.' It didn't take long to complete a deal. He had a great pedigree, and had real ability to accelerate. If you go back and look at his Laurel Futurity, and the way he circled the field in the Wood, it was obvious he had a lot of ability."

Heron said he saw similar ability in Tapizar.

"Through his career, he always flashed real brilliance," said Heron. "He showed it when he broke his maiden at Churchill by 10 lengths, when he won the GII San Fernando S. by 3 1/2 lengths, and when he won the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile in his final career start before retiring sound to Gainesway. Because of that brilliance, he has been very popular with breeders. He bred 142 mares in his first year at stud, and 110 this past spring." Tapizar will remain at \$15,000 for the 2015 season.

Gainesway, meanwhile, announced it would cap the 13-year-old Tapit's book at 135 mares.

"We recognize that he's the asset, and you have to look after the golden goose," said Heron. "And we want to look after the shareholders who used the horse and helped make him. They're going to be rewarded."

Most of them already have been. From eight to sell from eight on offer, Tapit was the leading sire of weanlings this fall from more than one to sell. They averaged \$820,625, and included the North American record \$3-million filly from Serena's Cat.

Sweden Gets a Stallion...

The 6-year-old SW & MGSP **Barocci (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}--Bastet, by Giant's Causeway) will soon be bound for Sweden, where he'll commence stallion duties at Ivan Sjoberg's Ravdansen Stud. Marie and Naoya Yoshida purchased the full to the 2012 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine **Beauty Parlour (Jpn)** for \$57,000. Lane's End consigned Barroci, who sold as a stallion prospect only, as [Hip 3695](#).

"It's so exciting," said Marie Yoshida. "We've been following this horse for several years, and we really wanted him. He has amazing bloodlines--he's by Sunday Silence's best son Deep Impact--and is from a great Wildenstein family. Sweden does not have a big breeding program there, and we hope that this horse might help them grow."

Barocci won the Prix Omnium II in France as a 3-year-old in 2011 and was second in the G3 Prix du Prince

d'Orange before relocating to the U.S. in 2012. A winner and on the board in four of five starts for trainer Christophe Clement, Barocci ran third in the GII American H. and GII City of Hope Mile S. for owner Hronis Racing and trainer John Sadler in 2013.

Ravdansen Stud is located in the city of Arla, a roughly 70-minute drive due west from Stockholm.

Horse racing is extremely popular in Sweden, but it's Standardbreds--trotters in particular, there are no pacers--that dominate the racing scene there. The Yoshidas, however, are hoping to help Thoroughbreds gain a better foothold there, starting with a homegrown breeding program.

"They usually buy their mares at Tattersalls in England, and also buy foals and yearlings there," Marie explained. "They're very passionate about horse racing, and they have wonderful turf racing in the summer and spring. The breeding industry is very small there right now, but our plan to get Swedish and Scandinavian Thoroughbred breeding back on track."

During this stretch, Colebrook also developed a close relationship with Castleton Lyons, and one of the farm managers, Jamie Frost, introduced the young trainer to Sparkling Review's owner/breeder Ed Seltzer. It was the beginning of a partnership that has already reaped dividends.

Produced by a multiple stakes-placed half-sister to GISW No Review (Nodouble), Sparkling Review debuted without Lasix sprinting in the Churchill mud June 20, and her fifth-place effort was decent in the eyes of the trainer.

"She probably ran a little bit better than it looked and she probably wasn't 100% fit," he offered. "But she's obviously a different filly since we put her on the grass."

And how.

The bay was in receipt of Lasix when she tried the turf and two turns for the first time at Arlington Aug. 9, and she charged home to graduate by 2 1/4 expanding lengths as a 4-1 gamble. Sparkling Review was sent down to Kentucky Downs for her first go against winners Sept. 6 and was forced to wait in the gate, as no fewer than three of her rivals broke through the gates pre-start. She then endured a rough trip, exchanging bumps in upper stretch, but came with a stinging finish for a 3/4-length victory ([video](#)). Cont. p8

“We kind of asked a lot of her to go from a maiden to that a-other-than at Kentucky Downs for a lot of money and over a taxing course, but she won fairly easily with a rough trip,” Colebrook explained. “And then went from there into the Grade III, so that was a lot to ask stepping up again.”

Sparkling Review tuned up for a potential start in the GIII Pin Oak Valley View S. Oct. 17 by working a half-mile on the grass in :48 3/5 nine days prior, a time that compared favorably with horses like Hootenanny,

Sunset Glow and Judy the Beauty, who were prepping for the Breeders’ Cup over five grassy panels. The filly was pegged at 30-1 for the Valley View, but the tote board read 7-1 at post time. That fact didn’t surprise Colebrook.

“I thought she was going to run a big race,” he admitted. “Her work on the grass there at Keeneland was so good that I think a lot of people took notice of it. Her work was probably as good as any of those [Breeders’ Cup] horses. I thought she had a good chance in the Valley View.”

Drawn wide that day, Sparkling Review raced in centerfield in and amongst horses while well in hand for Julien Leparoux. Given her cue rounding the turn, she looped her rivals, came out about five wide into the stretch and pulled away by a decisive 2 3/4 lengths (video).

“She probably won the race a little easier than I thought she would,” Colebrook recollected. “I was a little worried about the outside draw and Julien working out a trip.”

Colebrook has a total of 34 horses, split between Churchill Downs and at Keeneland on Rice Road. He has wintered in the past at Turfway Park, but is toying with the idea of keeping horses this winter at Sam Houston and shipping out to places like Oaklawn and the Fair Grounds. Colebrook also has horses for Darrell and Lendy Brown, Donamire Farm, Joe Allen and Ed Cox Jr. He maintains a straight-forward approach.

“I just want to stay in business and keep getting horses to train and keep winning races,” he offered with a chuckle. “I don’t try to think too far in advance--it’s tough enough as it is. You have to have a plan, but at the same time you don’t want to get too far ahead of yourself. He continued, “It’s one step at a time, one race at a time with the horses and just kind of go from there. I want to focus on what I’ve got and, for everyone that I train for, to get the best out of the horses for them.”

It’s early days for the Colebrook barn, but it’s reasonably safe to say: so far, so good.

JUST A WAY RETAINS LONGINES CROWN

Japan's **Just A Way (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) retained his position atop the Longines World's Best Racehorse Rankings when the latest edition of those ratings was released yesterday. The 5-year-old earned a mark of 130 for his 6 1/4-length victory in the G1 Dubai Duty Free Mar. 29 and added the G1 Yasuda Kinen next out in his return to Japan June 8. He finished eighth when stretching out to 12 furlongs for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 5.

A quartet of runners share second billing with a mark of 126, including the European sophomore trio of

Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), **Kingman (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and **The Grey Gatsby (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}). Dual South African Horse of the Year **Variety Club (SAf)** (Var) is the fourth of the group to hit 126, a mark that was achieved when he won the

G1 Champions Mile in Hong Kong May 4 in his final career start.

Progressing up the rankings from 121 to 125 is **Bayern** (Offlee Wild), who wired the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 1. He shares his mark with G1 Deutsches Derby winner **Sea the Moon (Ger)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) and **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}), who on Oct. 5 became just the most recent horse to win the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe twice.

California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) achieved a mark of 124 for his third-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Classic, equaling the figures he achieved in winning the G1 Kentucky Derby and G1 Preakness S. Six are tied with California Chrome at that mark: Arc runner-up **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again), Japan's **Gold Ship (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}), G1 Investec Oaks and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth II S. heroine **Taghrooda (GB)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}), **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) and Classic runner-up **Toast of New York** (Thewayyouare).

In another notable division shake-up, G1 Darley Classic winner **Terravista (Aus)** (Captain Rio {GB}) has moved into joint leadership, with compatriot **Lankan Rupee (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), of the sprinting division with a mark of 123.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

ROYAL ASCOT GOAL FOR ADELAIDE

After confirming Wednesday that G1 Cox Plate and GI Secretariat S. winner **Adelaide (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) would remain Down Under with trainer Chris Waller for a tilt at the A\$4 million G1 Queen Elizabeth S. in April, Coolmore connections revealed yesterday that the colt will return to trainer Aidan O'Brien in Ireland in time for a tilt at Royal Ascot.

"He could become the first horse to win Group 1s in America, Australia and Europe, and that would help him in his career after racing--it would be unique," Coolmore Australia's Racing Manager James Bester told *The Age*. "Chris has been very thorough and is a big part of any plans, and he will get him ready for the Queen Elizabeth S. and then he will return to Ballydoyle for Royal Ascot, provided everything goes to plan. Things can change day-to-day in racing, so a few months is a very long time."

Adelaide finished second at Royal Ascot in this year's G2 King Edward VII S. before his first voyage to America, where he was runner-up again in the GI Belmont Derby July 5. Adelaide returned stateside to clinch the Secretariat Aug. 16, and, after an unlucky third in the G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp Sept. 14, he relocated to Australia to scoop the Cox Plate, one of that country's most important prizes.

Goffs November Sale

17-27 November 2014

Jim Bolger's Redmondstown Stud experienced its greatest success at a foal sale in 2011 when it sent seven weanlings through the ring at Goffs November, including three from the first crop of Sea the Stars (Ire). That trio realized a combined total of €1.95 million,

headed by a colt purchased for an Irish foal record of €850,000 by Sea the Stars' breeder Sunderland Holdings.

Bolger noted breeding and selling foals from Sea the Stars' first crop was a "commercial venture, because I felt that they would be very attractive." Bolger's foal draft next week will be

his largest at the sale since 2011, and the Coolcullen conditioner noted that he needs to sell to make way for some unexpected additions to his training yard.

"I thought for the last few years I had a very tidy operation going, where I was breeding enough for me to train," Bolger explained. "I had it built up to a capacity where I was getting between 50 and 60 2-year-olds each year. And then Sheikh Mohammed this year very kindly sent me 18 2-year-olds to train that I wasn't expecting. So I have to reduce numbers a little bit; I'm getting another 20 next year. So to accommodate his I have to sell some of my own."

He continued, "I don't want the numbers to get out of hand. That's the reason I'm selling, apart from the fact that I run a commercial operation anyway; I have to make it pay, I don't have any other source of income."

The pages of Bolger's eight foals, consigned through Redmondstown, speak volumes about the success he has experienced as a breeder, and one ringing endorsement is [lot 963](#), a filly by Intense Focus, a

young sire purchased and raced by Bolger out of his homebred mare Night Visit (GB) (Sinndar {Ire}), from whom he bred last year's G1 Irish Derby winner Trading Leather (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}). Bolger sold Night Visit for €975,000 at Goffs February this year, but continued to reap the benefits of the 10-year-old mare when selling her Teofilo filly for €950,000 at Goffs Orby last month.

That wasn't the only home run horse for Bolger at Orby, however. Redmondstown sent through that sale's €1.5 million topper, a Galileo (Ire) colt out of Bolger's Scribonia (Ire) (Danehill) ([click here](#) to hear Bolger speak about the colt after the sale), and the operation will offer a full-brother to the stakes-winning Paene Magnus (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) from the same family as [lot 953](#).

Bolger purchased the future G1 Investec Derby winner New Approach (Ire) for €430,000 at Goffs Orby in 2006, and in-turn bred that sire's champion juvenile and Classic-winning son Dawn Approach (Ire). Next week he will offer two youngsters closely related to the latter. [Lot 893](#) is a son of New Approach out of Fainne (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), a half-sister to Dawn Approach, and [lot 825](#) is a filly by the same sire out of Wake Me Up (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), another half-sister to the G1 2000 Guineas winner.

[Lot 888](#) is another by Intense Focus, this time a colt out of a half-sister to Banimpire (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), a filly Bolger picked up for €52,000 at Goffs Orby in 2009 and sold two years later for €2.3 million after five group wins, including Royal Ascot's G2 Ribblesdale S. [Lot 942](#) is the lone member of the consignment by a stallion not bred or trained by Bolger. She is by Lawman (Fr), and is a half-sister to the Group 3-placed Home School (Ire) (Intense Focus).

Bolger explained that in determining which foals he would sell, a large emphasis was placed on physical attributes.

"There's no point in picking foals according to their pedigrees, because it wouldn't work like that," he said. "You have to pick foals that will be attractive at the time of the foal sale, so that they're mature enough to do themselves justice. I'm not saying that they're ones I want to get rid of or anything like that, but they were the most forward. Obviously then they have to have some pedigree as well."

Bolger noted that he will offer a handful as yearlings next year to get his numbers where he wants them.

A History of Success...

Given Bolger's successful association with Sheikh Mohammed, Godolphin's show of support is hardly surprising. It all began back in 2007 with a Bolger-bred colt named Teofilo. Crowned Europe's champion 2-year-old colt on the merit of an unbeaten season culminating with victories over Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) (Daneshill) in both the G1 National S. and G1 Dewhurst S., Teofilo failed to return to the races at three, and was retired to

Darley's Kildangan Stud in Ireland for the 2008 breeding season.

By the time Teofilo was covering his first book, Darley had cut another deal with Bolger, this time to buy his exciting colt New Approach, who had followed in Teofilo's hoofprints to win the National S. and Dewhurst. New

Approach spent his 3-year-old campaign in the colors of Sheikh Mohammed's wife, Princess Haya, and after finishing second to Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) in both the 2000 Guineas and Irish 2000 Guineas, the chestnut handed Bolger his first Derby score. After finishing third in the G1 Juddmonte International, New Approach rounded out his career with wins in the Irish Champion S. and the British equivalent, and he retired to Darley's Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket in 2009.

Aside from their similar juvenile records, the most striking similarity between Teofilo and New Approach is their sire, Galileo. Bolger noted that he had flagged Galileo as a future sire prospect after first laying eyes on him at Leopardstown as a 2-year-old.

"I suppose I probably only have a 50% strike rate with the stallions I've chosen," Bolger said. "I happened to be lucky enough to pick Galileo from the word go, and I think I remember using him when [his stud fee] was €37,500. He was a bit of a bargain at that time. I'm a little bit reckless when it comes to breeding mares, because if I think a stallion is going to be a hit, I don't want one or two. I want a dozen of them. I probably at some stage would have sent 10 or 12 mares to Galileo at that kind of money, and of course that's how I got Teofilo."

Explaining his early attraction to Galileo, who was trained by his former assistant, Ballydoyle master Aidan O'Brien, Bolger said, "He's a very fine horse and a top racehorse, so it didn't take much imagination to figure him as a successful sire. I liked him from the first time I saw him at Leopardstown, so I kind of made up my mind after seeing him as a 2-year-old that if ever I got the chance to send a mare to him that's what I would do. And of course he has a top pedigree as well, and it's even better since Sea the Stars came along."

Bolger noted that he retains a handful of seasons each year in Teofilo and New Approach, which he takes advantage of. His faith in his former pupils has resulted in a further two Classic-winning homebreds purchased by Darley-- Dawn Approach and Trading Leather.

Dawn Approach made an immediate statement for his sire by becoming New Approach's first winner, stakes winner and Classic winner. Purchased by Godolphin partway through his unbeaten 2-year-old campaign in 2012, Dawn Approach collected the now-patented Bolger National/Dewhurst double, and added the 2000 Guineas and St James's Palace S. as a sophomore.

Meanwhile, from the same foal crop, Trading Leather was taking a little longer to get revved up, but he hit his peak just at the right time, winning last year's Irish Derby in Bolger's silks. He was purchased by Godolphin at the end of his 3-year-old career, and since his Classic score he has placed five times in Group 1 company in Britain and Ireland. Trading Leather is now preparing for a tilt at the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 30.

"He's going very well, I'm very happy with him," Bolger said of the 4-year-old. "He'll be going off on Sunday and he's ready to go."

Asked if Trading

Leather would be joining Dawn Approach, Teofilo and New Approach on the Darley stallion roster next year, Bolger said, "We haven't discussed beyond the Japan Cup, so we'll have to see how we get on there and then talk to Sheikh Mohammed and John Ferguson about it at that stage."

Bolger has bred three of Teofilo's five Northern Hemisphere Group 1 winners. In addition to Trading Leather, he is responsible for Teofilo's first-crop Dewhurst-winning son Parish Hall (Ire) and 2012 G1 Criterium International winner Loch Garman (Ire).

Bolger has continued the winning trend with his batch of Darley juveniles this year, the most notable member of the team being Lucida (Ire) (Shamardal), winner of the G2 Rockfel S. and second in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. Another stakes winner amongst the draft is Parish Boy (GB) (New Approach {Ire}), who drew substantial praise from Bolger after clinching the Listed Eyrefield S. Oct. 26 after breaking his maiden at Naas in August. Bolger remarked after that stakes score, "He's classy and was a horse we were looking forward to before Naas, as he's the same color as The Tetrarch, who he traces back to. I view him as a Guineas horse and he'll stay a mile and a half, so he could go the same route as his sire. I'd be encouraged by the way he's come back from a long layoff and so we may not need to give him a trial ahead of the English or Irish Guineas."

Bolger Vocal About Young Sire...

Bolger has another horse in his arsenal about which he is highly bullish, and this one's future lies not on the racetrack, but in the breeding shed at Redmondstown Stud. Bolger purchased Vocalised (Vindication)--a son of Serena's Tune (Mr. Prospector) and a half-brother to Serena's Cat (Storm Cat), the dam of graded winners Noble Tune (Unbridled's Song) and Honor Code (A.P. Indy), and this year's record-breaking \$3 million weanling Tapit filly at Keeneland November--for €560,000 at Keeneland September in 2007 from Hill 'n'

Dale and trained him to wins in the G3 Greenham S. and G3 Tetrarch S. When it came time to retire Vocalised, however, Bolger noted that he was a hard sell, so he elected to hold onto him for his own use.

"Nobody was beating a path to my door in this part of the world because the Bold Ruler line doesn't go down well in Europe," he explained. "I decided to hold onto him and I sent some mares to him."

That decision paid dividends for Bolger this year when Vocalised's first 2-year-olds hit the track. Bolger bred three winners by the stallion, headed by G3 Killavullan S. winner Steip Amach (Ire). Vocalised covered 25 mares in 2013 but that figure rocketed to 65 this year, and Bolger noted he could cover around 100 mares in 2015.

"I'll be sending a lot of mares to him next year," he said. "Some people who are very serious breeders want to send mares to him next year. I'd say he'll cover about half of mine and then the same number again from outside, so he'll probably have up to 100 mares. He'll have to break the Bold Ruler hoodoo in Europe."

Vocalised could be set to follow in the hoofprints of another U.S.-bred Bolger stallion in Intense Focus. Bolger purchased that son of Giant's Causeway for €340,000 at the 2007 Goffs Orby Sale, and Intense Focus went on to become Bolger's third consecutive Dewhurst winner on the same day New Approach won the Champion S. in 2008. Intense Focus, who stands at Ballylinch Stud, sired G1 Middle Park S. winner Astaire (Ire) in his first crop last year.

Bolger, who grew up on a mixed farm and has a background in show jumping and accountancy, owns about 70 mares, which reside at Redmondstown in Co. Wexford, about 35 miles from his main training base, Glebe House Stables, in Coolcullen, Co. Kilkenny. More recently, Bolger added a training satellite, Beechy Park in Co. Carlow, to his arsenal of properties.

Bolger has been breeding his own runners since he took out his training license in 1976, and he purchased the original Redmondstown property in the early 1990s.

“It was then that I bought the nucleus of the stud, and then I kept adding to it,” he explained. “At that stage there were about 100 acres, and now between Redmondstown and Beechy Park, we have about 700 acres between the two of them.”

In addition to his foal draft, Bolger will offer 10 mares at the Goffs November Breeding Stock Sale Nov. 21

and 22. Nine of the 10 are in foal to either New Approach, Teofilo, Dawn Approach, Vocalised or Intense Focus. Amongst Redmondstown's mare consignment are [lot 1299](#), Miss Ekaterina (Ire) (Teofilo), a 5-year-old out of a full-sister to champion 2-year-old filly Bint Allayl (GB) and Group 3 winner and sire Kheleyf, carrying her first foal by Vocalised; [lot 1202](#), the 10-year-old

Luminous One (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), a daughter of Bolger's multiple stakes winner Smaoineamh (GB) (Tap On Wood {GB}), the dam of stakes producer Scribonia (Ire) (Danehill), who produced this year's €1.5 million Goffs Orby topper for Redmondstown, in foal to Teofilo; [lot 1069](#), the 8-year-old Galileo mare Maria Of Venice (Ire), who has produced the stakes-placed Focus On Venice (Ire) (Intense Focus) from two foals of racing age. She is in foal to Fastnet Rock (Aus). [Lot 1140](#), Manayer (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), is in foal to Teofilo and has produced two winners. Manayer is a half-sister to Group 1 winner Alfred Nobel (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), and her second dam is Park Express (GB) (Athonoora {GB}), the dam of New Approach. It is also the family of G1 Investec Oaks winner Was (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and her full-sister Al Naamah (Ire), who set a record for a European yearling when selling for 5 million guineas at Tattersalls October in 2013. [Lot 1141](#) is the dual Group 3 winner Maoineach (Congaree), who is offered carrying her fifth foal, by Dawn Approach, and [lot 1139](#) is the 7-year-old Wake Me Up (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), a half-sister to Dawn Approach carrying to New Approach.

The majority of these offerings are from families Bolger has developed himself, with the names of his many luminaries sprinkled across the pages. Describing some of his principles for breeding, Bolger said, “What I do is sort of high-wire stuff. Initially I go to the sales and buy a filly. I wouldn't buy a filly at the sales unless I liked it, and then I'm hoping it can run a bit.”

Bolger noted he is sometimes willing to take a chance on a broodmare even if she lacked racing ability.

“Even if she can't [run] and I like her enough thinking she might make a broodmare, I'd be happy to keep her,” he said. “That's more or less what I do. That's how it started, and then of course once I get into a family I try to build it.

I've also bought some mares that weren't successful for other people hoping that a change of scenery might improve the situation. But that can take a few years to do.”

Bolger explained that the decision to cull the mares he is sending to Goffs comes down to maintaining numbers and diversity in his broodmare band.

“Usually the mares we would be selling, we'd already have enough of the pedigree, so we wouldn't want to be keeping anymore of it,” he said. “As the numbers creep up it's easy enough to pick the ones to sell. But that's not to say they wouldn't be valuable to someone else, who might not have that particular pedigree.”

Regardless of where Bolger's mares and foals end up after next week's sale, his careful consideration in building his families means that will likely to be able to watch them prosper for years to come. In the meantime, with the likes of Lucida, Parish Boy and Steip Amach preparing for loftier goals next season, and Trading Leather preparing to jet off to Japan, Bolger has much to look forward to.

“I have a number of very nice colts and fillies and I'm very happy to have them,” he remarked. “They're by a good spread of stallions from all over the world.”

Gulfstream to Begin TPA of Lasix Nov. 19:

Gulfstream Park announced Thursday that it will begin third-party administration of race-day Lasix beginning Wed., Nov. 19. The policy will prohibit any private veterinarian from being in a horse's stall on race day.

By 6 a.m. of race day, horsemen will hang a red tag outside a horse's stall reading 'Horse In Today.' This will identify that horse for their pre-race exam and treatment of Lasix by a Gulfstream regulatory veterinarian. Horses being treated must be on-site one hour prior to Lasix being administered or by 11:30 a.m.

"Gulfstream Park has instituted this policy to keep the playing field level, keep private veterinarians out of horse's stalls on the day they race, and also to continue building the integrity of the sport," said Gulfstream President Tim Ritvo. "It's important for the betting public, the economic engine of our sport, to understand no horse can be seen by a private veterinarian on the day of a race and only a Gulfstream regulatory veterinarian can administer medication. The program is not for Gulfstream to make a profit. In fact, we hope the program will drive down costs, allowing us to return any profit to the Thoroughbred industry."

Phil Combest, President of the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, said, "The FHBPA and its membership support the third-party administration of Lasix on race day. Our ongoing goal is the same as that of every other horsemen's group across the country...a transparent, level playing field for all horsemen. There's no question that third party administration is an important step in that process."

Dr. Scott Hay, an equine veterinarian at Teigland, Franklin and Brokken, said, "Although third-party Lasix administration is somewhat controversial among racetrack veterinarians, we have seen it successfully put in place in several racing jurisdictions recently. I think most of us can agree that it is more important to have the ability to protect our patients from the negative effects of EIPH with race-day Lasix than which veterinarian gives it."

Trainers are required to have an attendant present when a horse is treated. If there is no attendant, the horse will not be treated. If a horse is scratched due to no attendant being present a fine will be issued at the discretion of the stewards. Fines will increase with each offense.

Muckleshoot Tribe Acquires Emerald Downs:

Edited Press Release

The Muckleshoot Indian Tribe has reached agreement in principle with Northwest Racing Associates to acquire Emerald Downs, the Northwest's premier Thoroughbred racing facility. When the transaction closes in the next 60 to 90 days, the Tribe will assume full ownership and operational control from Northwest Racing Associates, which has operated the racetrack since its beginning in 1996.

This transaction is the culmination of the Muckleshoot Tribe's support of Thoroughbred racing in Washington State over many years. The Tribe has been Emerald Downs' landlord since 2002, when it acquired the 157-acre property on which Emerald Downs sits, and since 2004, the Tribe has invested more than \$11 million in purse enhancements at Emerald Downs. Also, the Muckleshoot Tribal Classic has been the cornerstone of the Washington Cup series for Washington-bred horses.

"The Tribe's long-standing support of the state's thoroughbred racing industry continues with this transaction," said Muckleshoot Tribal Council Chair Virginia Cross. "It is the Tribe's goal to keep the Thoroughbred horse racing industry as a viable part of our state's economy. Emerald Downs sits in the center of the Tribe's historical homeland and this transaction makes it an important part of our economic development program."

After the transaction closes the Tribe will undertake an evaluation of steps to strengthen the performance of Emerald Downs. Notwithstanding a number of legislatively authorized enhancements over the years, and the tremendous efforts of Northwest Racing Associates' President Ron Crockett and his partners, Thoroughbred horse racing has struggled in an increasingly difficult environment both in Washington State and nationally.

"My goal has always been to preserve this important industry," Crockett said. "I have accomplished that goal and this is a now good time for the Tribe to step in and bring Emerald Downs to the next level."

Crockett has agreed to serve as a consultant to the Tribe to help with the transition to new ownership and the current management team will remain in place.
