REDOUTE'S IS MAGIC AGAIN

The second session of the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale yesterday was dominated by Australia's three-time champion sire Redoute's Choice (Aus) and his successful son and fellow Arrowfield resident Snitzel (Aus), who were responsible for the top three

lots and six of the top 10. Redoute's Choice reclaimed his rightful place atop the price list with a colt and a filly that each fetched A\$720,000 (US\$584,570).

The cumulative statistics built on Wednesday's strong opening session.

The gross of A\$50,700,000 (US\$40,930,020) is well up on last year's figure of A\$41,007,500 at this point of the sale, with 296 sold for a clearance rate of 82.7% (down from 88% 12 months ago). The average shot up 28.2% to A\$171,284 (US\$138,746), while the median climbed 16.7% to A\$140,000 (US\$113,144).

"Today's just been an amazing day, it really has," said Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox. "It's been amongst the strongest yearling sales that I've been involved with in over 24 years in the business. There are some star lots to come over the next couple of days, so we may see some more fireworks yet."

Cox added, "While many horses have sold beyond expectations, there are still some great value on offer, and prospective buyers will get some great opportunities through the remainder of the sale." **Magic Millions cont. p8**

When the PETA scandal involving Steve Asmussen blew up last year I was among those leading the charge to keep the trainer out of the Hall of Fame. The story was an explosive one and an ugly one and it involved undertones of animal cruelty. The ballots had been sent out before the story broke and I thought that under the circumstances his Hall of Fame eligibility needed to be put on hold so that everyone could take a deep breath and let the story play out. We needed to know what we were dealing with and whether or not Asmussen was a cheat who also mistreated the animal, someone unworthy of being put into the Hall of Fame. **Cont. p3**



The Hall of Fame agreed and banned Asmussen from election last year. It was the right call.

The Hall of Fame is soliciting nominations for 2015 inductees and committee members have been told that Asmussen will not be allowed on the ballot. A notice

sent to Hall of Fame voters read: "Since the process leading to the 2015 election is beginning before either of the state racing commissions' investigations in Kentucky and New York into Asmussen have been concluded, the tabling of Asmussen's candidacy remains in effect for

the 2015 election."

There is something to be said for wanting the matter closed before deciding whether Asmussen should be allowed into the Hall of Fame, but everyone already knows what the investigations in New York and Kentucky are going to come up with: a big fat nothing.

Certainly, Asmussen didn't come across well in the PETA video, nor did his potty-mouthed assistant Scott Blasi. A lot of people who watched the PETA video came away disliking Asmussen and really disliking Blasi. But PETA didn't have a smoking gun. It showed that trainers can be crass, that they'll push the envelope to win races and even that they have no problem taking advantage of illegal aliens who are willing to work long hours for pitifully poor wages. The closest it came to uncovering any rule violations was talk that jockey Ricardo Santana Jr. would use a battery. But that's on Santana, and not Asmussen or Blasi, and it's something that could never be proven.

Had PETA set up the same sort of undercover operation in any one of a dozen or so barns in the U.S. they would have come away with the same sort of stuff. A lot of trainers treat the animal like a commodity and will do anything to win, and that America's medication rules are laughably lax is the reason they can do so. Taking advantage of illegal aliens is as old as the racetrack itself.

The PETA video was much more an indictment of horse racing than Steve Asmussen. You can hate the way they acted around his barn and some of the things they said and did, but there wasn't an ounce of evidence that anything Asmussen or Blasi did was illegal. **Cont. p4**

That racing commissions drag their feet in cases like this is frustrating, and both Kentucky and New York should have wrapped things up a long time ago. Eventually they will and no charges will be levied against Asmussen or Blasi, at least ones related to the care of the horses. Some issues involving immigration and the IRS could lead to charges from non-racing authorities.

In 2014 I wanted time to figure out what the right thing was to do with Asmussen when it came to the Hall of Fame. Personally, I've now had more than enough time. I know the story and there's nothing more to be learned.

This needs to be treated much like the Baseball Hall of Fame has treated players linked to PEDs. No matter how serious the charges against them might be, they are put on the ballot and the voters get to decide whether or not they deserve to be enshrined in the Hall of Fame. There are several players (e.g. Barry Bonds, Roger Clemens) whose credentials would normally merit induction into the Hall of Fame but enough voters have concluded that they cheated by using steroids and therefore don't deserve what is the highest honor in baseball.

With Asmussen it's time to do the same thing. A voter can decide that what they saw on the PETA video wasn't that big a deal, or at least not so egregious that it should overshadow Asmussen's on-track accomplishments, which make him a slam dunk Hall of Famer. A voter could also conclude that the PETA video, not to mention Asmussen's numerous medication violations, make him someone who does not belong in the Hall of Fame.

I probably wouldn't vote for him. The one thing the PETA video did was paint a picture of a stable that had no love for the horse and little regard for its welfare, even if it didn't break any rules. These are beautiful animals that work hard for our pleasure, and Asmussen and Blasi seemed to have no appreciation of that. That might be enough Asmussen to lose my vote.

But the time has come where whether or not Asmussen gets into the Hall of Fame should be my decision and the decision of all of those who vote. The choice should no longer be made for us.

Klaravich Stable and William H. Lawrence's **Leave the Light On** (Horse Greeley), last year's GII Remsen S. winner, is nearing a return to the worktab and is being pointed for the Feb. 21 GII Fountain of Youth S. for his seasonal debut, trainer Chad Brown reported Thursday.

"We gave him a little breather after the Remsen, and now he's been galloping steady for about the last three weeks here at Palm Meadows," Brown said. "He's probably ready to do some breezing, probably at the end of [the] week. He looks good. He's galloping really well."

A \$210,000 graduate of last year's OBS April sale, **Leave the Light On** was sixth to Daredevil (More Than Ready) in their respective racetrack debuts in the Belmont mud Sept. 13, but splashed home the 4 1/2-length winner of an off-turf Belmont maiden Oct. 16. He set a pressured pace in the Nov. 29 Remsen, but turned back all challenges for a half-length defeat of Frosted (Tapit).

"He really has gotten better with every start," Brown stated. "His first start was sprinting and in the mud, but he got a good education from that. His second and third starts, both wins going long, he really figured things out and ran well, and he seems to have gotten bigger and stronger since we've brought him here to Florida. So we're excited about him this year."

REGIS BEGINS MAKING THEIR MARK ON THE TRACK by J.M. Severni

Regis Racing had something of a coming-out party this past week, with sophomore fillies **Seduire** (Elusive Quality) taking the GII Santa Ynez S. Jan. 3 ([video](#)) and **Shook Up** (Tapit) becoming a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ with her impressive graduation at the Fair Grounds that same day ([video](#)). Regis Farm, which is owned by lifelong horseman Nat Rea, began purchasing Thoroughbreds in 2012 and is now starting to reap the benefits of those investments.

Regis Farms and Racing President Kieran Lalor noted that the operation is both excited about the recent success and grateful for all the support. "We've been overwhelmed," he said. "I've received hundreds of phone calls and text messages from both industry professional and fans of the animals congratulating us. We're so thankful for everyone who has reached out to us."

Lalor, a Kildare, Ireland, native, has been with Regis since the fall of 2013. He previously served as the Broodmare Manager at WinStar and Assistant Manager at Castleton Lyons.

Seduire was one of the first Regis Farm purchases when she was bought for \$130,000 as a weanling at the 2012 Keeneland November Sale. A first-out winner in May under the care of Jerry Hollendorfer, **Seduire** has since annexed the Wine Country Debutante S. and Golden Gate Debutante before earning the first graded win for Regis Farm in the Santa Ynez. Of last weekend's victory, Lalor said, "It has been the highlight for our budding company so far. She has given us some great thrills and we are very excited for her future. Jerry and his team have done an amazing job with her. She is all heart and we are very lucky and proud to have her." **Cont. p6**

However, that victory was nearly overshadowed by the 13 1/2-length domination from the Steve Asmussen-trained Shook Up. The gray filly was a solid second at first asking in the Churchill slop Nov. 23, but made her way onto the national stage with Saturday's win, in which she earned a 94 Beyer Speed Figure. Shook Up was bred by SF Bloodstock and is out of GI Santa Maria H. winner Sugar Shake (Awesome Again). Regis Farm purchased her privately from the breeder as a yearling.

As to what attracted Regis to the filly, Lalor explained, "She's by Tapit and is out of a Grade I-winning mare

Sugar Shake. She's a knockout physically--she's got lots of size, scope and bone, which compliments her great attitude. Nat uses the term 'magical' when around her and I think that sums it up."

The team at Regis had always thought highly of the filly.

"She started out with Ian Brennan, who is based at Stonestreet in Florida," Lalor said. "Ian loved her from the beginning and always thought she would be special. Steve, who has had her since July, has been very high on her. She was immature and needed time to develop, but he and his team have done a tremendous job with her and I have to give them credit. We started her out at Churchill Downs knowing she would need a race and her best days would be around two turns, but in fairness, she ran a terrific race as green as she was, and was narrowly beaten by a good Juddmonte filly. We had high hopes she would win Saturday, but the way she did it absolutely floored us. She has a huge stride and looked like she was out for a stroll in the park. Jockey Robby Albarado was fantastic in how he handled her. I still have goosebumps."

Although connections are waiting to see how Shook Up exits the race and returns to training before making plans for the future, they're hopeful that she'll continue along the same path as other notable sophomore fillies from the Asmussen stable.

"I'd imagine that Steve will want to go the same path that he went with Rachel Alexandra and Untapable," Lalor speculated. "This is a game of peaks and valleys, so we try not to get too far ahead of ourselves, but is very exciting to have a

horse of her caliber in the stable and we are very fortunate to even be in the in the [GI] Kentucky Oaks discussion. It's four months away though, and there are a lot more hoops to jump through to get there. I also feel that this year's crop of 3-year-old fillies is one of the strongest I've ever seen, so it will be a great competitive year for the industry and its fan base."

Regis Farm is located on the former Hopewell Farm property in Woodford County and currently boasts 26 horses in training. They have 11 3-year-old fillies, seven 3-year-old colts and eight 4-year-old fillies dispersed between the barns of Christophe Clement, Graham Motion, Brian Lynch, Hollendorfer and Asmussen. Regis Farm also has 14 broodmares and is looking to eventually expand the band to 30-40 or so mares.

"The majority of the stable is female," Lalor continued. "Obviously, there is a safety net with a good pedigreed filly, as you always have that residual value as a broodmare. We have some really good colts in the racing stable, too--some have yet to start and some are on the improve. You have to have a lot of patience in this game and we give them the time that they need."

Regis Farm has certainly made a splash so far at auctions, with a number of expensive purchases in the three years they've been acquiring bloodstock. In 2013, Regis purchased the Keeneland January sales topper when they were extended to \$1.45 million for a Street Sense short yearling (who sold as [hip 517](#)). The filly, who has been named Bijou, will be sent to Clement in the coming weeks.

"She's exciting. She's taking a bit of time, but that's to be expected," Lalor explained.

The operation took home six yearlings from the 2013 Keeneland September sale, including Iron Fist (Tapit), who they purchased, in partnership with Stonestreet Stables, for \$1.55 million. The colt was third in the GI Del Mar Futurity this past fall. **Cont. p7**

Bullet Train (GB) is the older ¾-brother to Frankel, who has been called "the greatest horse of all time" by many. Bullet Train was a debut winner at age 2, Group 3 winner and finished 4th in two Group 1 races while racing Lasix-free.

The farm also scooped up an unraced colt ([hip 110](#)) named War Ride (Unbridled's Song). Regis' most recent million-dollar purchase was a Tapit filly ([hip 69](#)) from the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale.

"She is a stunner," Lalor said of the sale's third-highest priced hip. "She had a super attitude about her and was professional about everything she did. Nat makes the final decision on our equine purchases and, thankfully, he had her at the top of this list too."

"Nat, Ted Campion, and myself start each sale scanning through the books and looking for the pedigrees and bloodlines that make sense to us," Lalor said of Regis' approach to sales. "Then, we'll go out there and look at all of those horses and shorten it down. We like athletic looking horses with good attitude and some depth in their page."

Up to this point, the operation has mostly been on the bidding side of the sales, but they've dipped their toes into the selling side as well and will continue to do so. At this past Keeneland September sale, Regis sold a Distorted Humor filly out of their mare Sealy Hill ([hip 231](#)) for \$500,000 to Dixiana Farms.

"We're a business, at the end of the day," Lalor commented. "The farm and racing stable costs a lot of money to operate and we'll make tough decisions, like selling the Sealy Hill yearling back in September. A lot of people were wondering why we were doing that, but it basically comes down to business and we are open. Of course, It makes it easier when you have the mare and they are producing good-quality stock year after year. We breed to race and sell and also buy to race and sell."

Lalor believes this recent success is just the beginning for the up-and-coming operation.

"We're extremely excited about Shook Up and Seduire and feel like they've got very bright futures," he explained. "We also have Une Cherise (Curlin), who is being targeted to the GII La Canada S. at Santa Anita on the 17th, and several other good fillies like Zindaya (More Than Ready), Empress Maker (Empire Maker) and Jolene (Malibu Moon), amongst others. Everything is a team effort with us, I feel like every decision affects the team, so everybody gets a say in what we do and how we accomplish our goals. We're slowly growing and taking our time and learning a few lessons ourselves along the way. Nat is very passionate about the game and is a great sportsman. He has provided us the tools we need and allows us to take gambles as opposed to taking the easier path. Our focus is quality, and that applies to both who we are purchasing and racing and how we raise them."

YOSHIDA BUYS GERMAN CLASSIC WINNER

A few days after the reported sale of dual Group 1 victor Invanhowe (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) to Australia, another of Germany's top racehorses is set to leave the country as 2014 G1 Preis der Diana heroine **Feodora (Ger)** (Lord of England {Ger}) has been sold by owner-breeder Gestuet Etzean to Teruya Yoshida of Shadai Farm. Mark Dassbach, grandson of Etzean's founder Heinz Weill, told *GaloppOnline.de*, "She will have one more season in training and is leaving [Thursday] to join Andre Fabre, who will prepare her for her 4-year-old campaign."

Feodora filled the runner-up spot on her first three starts, and initially failed to sparkle when stepped up to Classic level, running seventh in the G2 German 1000 Guineas and 10th in the G1 Prix de Diane in Chantilly. However, she lost her maiden tag in outstanding fashion when posting an impressive 2 1/2-length victory in the G1 Preis der Diana, on what was her first start for Woehler. She was subsequently beaten less than a length by We Are (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) in the G1 Prix de l'Opera and wrapped up her 3-year-old season with a fourth to the aforementioned Invanhowe in the G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern.

GaloppOnline.de reported that the seven-figure deal, whose precise amount remained undisclosed, had been brokered by Jonas Grasser, the man who was also responsible for the sale of Group 3-winning filly Ovambo Queen (Ger) (Kalatos {Ger}) to Yoshida back in 2012.

The Yoshida family have manifested a keen interest in German racemares over the last decade. Teruya Yoshida entered the fray in 2005 when snapping up G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud scorer Paita (GB) (Intikhab), and made the headlines again in 2011 when securing a 50% share in the country's superstar Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) three weeks ahead of her five-length romp in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. He also bought the German-bred, French-raced La Boum (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) for €700,000 at Arqana's 2010 Breeding Stock Sale.

Yoshida's younger brother Katsumi Yoshida of Northern Farm has also been tapping into German bloodstock, notably purchasing a pair of G1 Preis der Diana heroines in Night Magic (Ger) (Sholokhov {Ire})--another Etzean-bred--in 2009 and Salomina (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) in 2012.

Worth the Wait...

When the type and pedigree match on an offering by Redoute's Choice, bidders had best be ready to dig deep into their pockets. That was certainly the case yesterday with [lot 249](#), a bay filly offered by Arrowfield Stud. Warwick Farm-based trainer Rick Worthington prevailed in a prolonged bidding battle to take home the daughter of Flavoured (Aus) (Hussonet)--who could enjoy a significant pedigree update Saturday when her three-quarter sister Aerobar (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}) starts as one of the favorites in the A\$2-million Magic Millions 2YO Classic--for A\$720,000.





"If this filly was going through after the race, it could end up being quite a good buy if the three-quarter runs well on Saturday," Worthington reasoned. He admitted his new acquisition probably wouldn't appear on next year's Magic Millions card, however.

"A filly like this, you may not expect her to be at the race, she's more of an autumn 2-year-old type," he said.

The appeal of the October foal's pedigree goes far beyond her first dam. Her fourth dam is the legendary producer Weekend Surprise, and thus she is from the family of A.P. Indy, Summer Squall and the like. Her dam is a full-sister to the stakes-winning Ego's Dare (Aus) (Hussonet).

“Our initial valuation of this filly was A\$400,000 to A\$500,000,” Worthington revealed. “With the market the way it is and with the quality fillies such as this filly, if you want them you have to up your sights, otherwise you’ll walk away empty handed.”

Worthington also acknowledged the filly’s physical attributes.

“Whenever we buy yearlings, whether it’s a colt or a filly and regardless of their pedigree, you have to buy an athlete, because at the end of the day you can’t train a pedigree page,” he said. “The fact that this filly has a great pedigree just increases her value, of course. The fact that this filly has both [conformation and pedigree] puts her on an elite level.”

A Choice Buy For Bolton...

George Bolton has enjoyed success racing at the highest level at some of the world’s best race meetings, and he will now look to tick Australia off the list after partnering with James Harron to purchase [lot 359](#), a Redoute’s Choice (Aus) colt from Newhaven Park, for A\$720,000.

Harron and agent John Moynihan were present in the ring, but the bidding was conducted by Magic Millions’ Barry Bowditch who had to see off stiff competition from all corners of the auditorium. Like the co-topping

Redoute’s Choice filly earlier in the session, Moynihan noted the November foal, a half to a pair of stakes winners in Singapore, had the ideal combination of pedigree and conformation.

“We loved the horse,” Moynihan said. “We thought he was arguably

the best well-bred horse in the sale. If he runs like he looks, the sky’s the limit. He could be a stallion. We’re excited.”

Explaining the partnership, Moynihan said, “We both liked the horse, so there was no sense in bidding against each other. We talked about doing some things together in the past, and this was a good time to start.”

The colt will be trained by Peter and Paul Snowden.

“James Harron has a group of guys together,” Moynihan continued. “We haven’t worked out the details yet, but we’re going to do some kind of partnership with the horse.”

Bolton’s The Factor stands Southern Hemisphere time at Newgate Farm, but this colt will be the first horse Bolton will race in Australia.

“George stood The Factor here, who was a horse he raced in America,” Moynihan said. “We stood him Southern Hemisphere with Newgate, and George came down and looked at the horse in October and went to the races. George has raced horses at Royal Ascot and in Dubai. He was a part-owner of Curlin. He’s done a lot of racing in the U.S., so he thought he’d take a chance down here.”

Moynihan indicated he may not be finished shopping, saying he would look at a few more yearlings.

Snitzel Standouts...

Redoute's Choice's successful sire son Snitzel, who finished second to his sire in the 2013/14 Australian sires' premiership, was another popular sire of the session, and American Jon Kelly, who purchased a colt by Redoute's Choice for A\$450,000 Wednesday, got into the mix when signing for a filly for A\$620,000. [Lot 308](#), from the Arrowfield consignment, is out of Hokuspokus (Aus) (Red Ransom), a winning half-sister to stakes winners Come Hither (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) and Fun In Flight (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus). It is also the family of sires Not A Single Doubt (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) and Zizou (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus).

Reg Inglis did the bidding on behalf of Kelly, and he remarked, "She's a smashing filly by Snitzel and very athletic. She just took our eye the instant we saw her."

Kelly confirmed the August foal would go into training with Gai Waterhouse, who will also train Wednesday's purchase. Waterhouse has also been entrusted with the 2-year-old Redoute's Choice colt

Red Knot (Aus), who Kelly purchased to top this sale 12 months ago for A\$1 million.

"I'm just happy we were able to get her," Kelly said. "She was the pick of the litter."

Waterhouse added, "Jon's come down to Australia and he's invested in horseflesh, last year and again this year. He identified this filly as the standout Snitzel filly of the sale, so we got our heads together and talked about her. I said, 'She's going to be hard to buy,' and he said, 'I'm not leaving Australia without her.'"

"We were almost at our limit," Kelly said.

Kelly, a California businessman who races horses in the U.S., Europe and Australia, noted he's been involved in racing Down Under for a number of years.

"I had horses 10 or 15 years ago that I bought in Karaka [in New Zealand] and then brought over to Australia," he revealed. "I've been a friend of Reggie [Inglis] for a long time through contacts in America, and I've been coming to Australia for 30 or 40 years and I love it down here. Reggie and I are going trout fishing in New Zealand next week after the sale and we're just as excited about that as buying the horses."

Kelly described racing in Australia as "fun."

"The purses are good, and the enthusiasm of the Australians is fantastic," he noted. "To me, it's the greatest racing environment on the planet. It's fun down here and everyone is having a blast, and I like to be included." **Cont. p11**

Kelly also purchased two youngsters with trainer Lee Freedman yesterday. One of Australia's most celebrated trainers, Freedman handed his license over to his brother, Anthony, in 2011, but recently came out of retirement to train in partnership with his brother. Freedman will train for Kelly a Fastnet Rock (Aus) filly purchased yesterday for A\$400,000 and a A\$500,000 colt by Redoute's Choice (Aus) ([lot 389](#)).

The Redoute's Choice filly is out of the dual winner Line Honours (Aus) (Hussonet), a daughter of champion 3-year-old filly and four-time Group 1 winner Alinghi (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), who was trained by Freedman before embarking on a brief U.S. career with Bobby Frankel, where she won the Gill Ballston Spa S.

"She reminded me of her grandmother," Freedman said. "Jon liked her, so I'm very happy to get her."

Of his budding relationship with Kelly, Freedman commented, "I only met Jon in England at the Tattersalls sale a couple months ago. We got along really well, and he said, 'If you're ever coming back into training let me know.' So all the credit to Jon. He's a man of his word and he's bought some nice horses."

One For Mr Snitzel...

Gerald Ryan, who trained Snitzel for Damien Flower of Jadeskye Racing, was the underbidder on Kelly's Snitzel filly, but he will not go home empty handed, as he will be entrusted with another Snitzel filly Flower secured for A\$450,000 early in the session.

From the draft of Bell View Park Stud, [lot 230](#) is well credentialed to run early and well—her dam, Fairchild (Aus), is by Magic Millions 2YO Classic winner General Nediym (Aus) and was precocious herself, winning a prep for that prestigious event. The filly's second dam, Dancer's Joy (Aus) (Danzatore {Aus}) won the Magic Millions 2YO Fillies S.

"She's out of a really nice mare," Flower acknowledged. "And the second dam was a nice mare. She's a lovely filly with a bit of scope about her. She'll be early and Gerald's the right man to train her."

He added, "We watched every Snitzel go through the ring yesterday and this is the type we wanted to buy. She has a bit of leg under her, a good body and really looks like she can run."

In The Mood For A Sepoy...

The Sepoy frenzy that kicked off Wednesday continued into yesterday's session, and Black Caviar's trainer Peter Moody stamped himself as a fan of the first-season sire when going to A\$520,000 for [lot 252](#), a bay colt from Segenhoe Stud. The August foal is out of the G3 Gold Coast Guineas winner Florentina (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), a half-sister to Group 1 winner Gathering (Aus) (Tale of the Cat).

Interestingly, his fourth dam produced Shantha's Choice (Danzig), the dam of Redoute's Choice, and he is inbred 3x3 to Danehill.

"That's not a bad thing," Moody said. "It's worked in Australasia for many years, so I'm looking forward to getting him home and into the barn, because he looks like a really nice horse. I bought him on spec, so we'll take him home and syndicate him with some stable clients hopefully, otherwise he'll race for Mrs. Moody."

Moody said the colt's pedigree encouraged

him to take a shot on an unproven sire.

"He's a very nice colt, obviously by an unknown in Sepoy, but he was a champion 2-year-old and champion racehorse, and he's out of a mare that probably had untold ability--you didn't get to appreciate her true ability because she was injured. He fit the bill of a nice young horse--he has a hell of a pedigree, and let's hope he makes a racehorse and then the future everyone dreams of, a stallion."

Moody admitted that, while he generally leans toward proven sires, it's hard not to be taken by this year's freshman crop. **Cont. p13**

“It’s always exciting with young stallions, but only time will tell if we’re mugs or geniuses, but they look the part,” he said of the Sepoys. “It’s hard not to be attracted to [all the first-season sires]--So You Think, Smart Missile and the like. They were all very good racehorses. I’m a preacher of the tried and true--I like my Snitzels, my Sebrings and the like as well, but it’s hard not to be taken by those young horses when they come along.”

First-season sires were well-represented during Wednesday’s opening session, and that theme continued during the early part of trade yesterday when [lot 207](#), a strapping bay son of So You Think (NZ) from

Kia-Ora Stud, made A\$430,000 on the bid of Kieran Moore of Scone Bloodstock Services. The late August foal is the second produce of the dual New Zealand Group 1 winner Dorabella (NZ) (Postponed {GB}). Moore noted his new purchase would race for established clients, and

that he was specifically targeting the sire, who won 10 Group 1 races worldwide and stands dual hemisphere for Coolmore.

“It was a little more than I wanted to pay, but we were trying to buy a nice So You Think, and he was a great type--he’s far superior to the others we’ve seen by the sire,” Moore noted.

Moore purchased a colt by another popular first-season sire, Smart Missile (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), for A\$170,000 on Wednesday. That Arrowfield resident drew many admirers again yesterday, with a colt bringing A\$330,000 and two making A\$280,000.

Frankyfourfingers, a son of the 2002 GII Peter Pan S. hero and GI Belmont S. third placegetter, tracked the pace from out wide, and he and Surfer cornered as a team into the final 400 meters. The French-bred had maybe a half-head in front in upper stretch, but Richard Mullen got after Surfer in earnest soon after, shook him over onto his correct lead and edged away in the final 50 meters to a clear-cut success. Frankyfourfingers never switched his leads in his main-track debut, but stayed on well for second ahead of Haatheq, who finished nicely without threatening the top two. Outstrip (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), the 2013 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf hero who was taking the main track for a spin for the first time, never appeared comfortable and finished a distant 11th, with a return to the grass a mere formality.



WINTER KOS RACING ACROSS THE COUNTRY

Cold temperatures across the mid-section of the U.S. has forced officials at Oaklawn Park to cancel the entire first weekend of racing at the Hot Springs oval. Temperatures dipped to as low as 11 degrees overnight Wednesday and the decision to postpone the opening was made in consultation with track management and horsemen representatives Thursday morning. "Our track maintenance crews worked to maintain the racing surface all night," said Director of Racing David Longinotti. "It became clear shortly after sunrise that we were not going to be able to hold it. The safety of the horses and riders is always our first concern and this weather is just not conducive for racing. We look forward to kicking off things next week." The track will now open next Thursday, Jan. 15 for the first of five live programs, including a special holiday card Monday, Jan. 19. The \$100,000 Dixie Belle S. for 3-year-old fillies, originally scheduled for Friday, will now take place next Thursday, while the \$100,000 Fifth Season S., for older horses going two turns, has been re-programmed for next Friday. The first step on the Arkansas road to the Triple Crown, the \$150,000 Smarty Jones S., is the Martin Luther King day centerpiece. Additionally, live racing at Aqueduct was cancelled for a second consecutive day due to the cold snap. Racing did take place as scheduled at Laurel Park, with horses going directly from the paddock to the starting gate. "It was a good team effort to get it done today," said jockey Sheldon Russell, who had mounts in five of the nine races. "All the riders were willing to give it a go. [MJC Racing Secretary] Georganne [Hale] and [MJC General Manager] Sal [Sinatra] were very understanding of the situation. They allowed us to leave the jocks room with six minutes to post and go straight to the gate."

Carl Moore Management's **Zooming** (After Market), who closed out her freshman season with an 11-1 upset of the Dec. 14 Trapeze S. at Remington Park, has joined the Bret Calhoun string at the Fair Grounds and is being pointed for the \$125,000 Silverbulletday S. Jan. 17. While looking forward to see where his trainee fits in the local division, Calhoun is taken aback by the strength of the prospective field.

"The race is coming up a lot tougher than I anticipated," he admitted. "I didn't expect **Top Decile** (Congrats)--a Breeders' Cup-placed filly [second in the GI Juvenile Fillies]--or a Grade II [Golden Rod S.] winner like Catalano's **West Coast Belle** (Tapit), but with that being said we have to see who [Zooming] is. It will be a good starting point and a good line on her against two of the best fillies in her division."

The Texas-bred, well-beaten in her six-furlong debut at Remington Sept. 11, has not tasted defeat in three tries around two turns, including a maiden win in an off-turf test Oct. 11 and an allowance success Nov. 21.

In her first work since her arrival, Zooming went a half-mile over the local main track in :49 3/5 Dec. 31, the 13th best of 58 moves at the distance. She is scheduled to work again this morning.

"If she runs well, she'll fit in with the best--if not, she maybe has a future on the turf, being an After Market," Calhoun offered. "She's a nice two-turn filly and has done well since we stretched her out."
