FASIG-TIPTON FLORIDA SALE TODAY

The Fasig-Tipton Florida 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale will be held today at Gulfstream Park, with bidding on the first of 175 catalogued hips scheduled to begin at 4 p.m. in the track's walking ring. The boutique auction, held at Calder for a number of years, spent two years at Palm Meadows and returns to South Florida after a one-year sojourn at Adena Springs South in Williston.

"We're very enthusiastic and excited about the sale and about the new venue at Gulfstream Park," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "It's a great location, it's a great vicinity and it's a great place to be this time of year, with the best owners and trainers in the world here. There's a certain level of energy and excitement in the Ft. Lauderdale-Miami area that we haven't had for a few years. I think everyone loves to go to that part of the United States this time of the year and Gulfstream is a hotbed of racing in North America right now. I think there's a high energy and excitement level and there's

just a great atmosphere. We're very excited about the new location, and very excited about the quality of horses. We're going to have a good sale, and overall, we're very optimistic."

Fasig-Tipton and Gulfstream Park have joined together to offer a \$1-million bonus to the winner of the 2016 GI Florida Derby, should that horse be a graduate of this year's sale.

"I think the bonus demonstrates very clearly the commitment and the intention of Fasig-Tipton and Gulfstream Park to make this a signature event in the Thoroughbred industry," Browning explained. "We want to attract quality horses, we want to attract quality buyers, we want to make this an event that people look forward to and it becomes a staple on the calendar. It's a concrete example of our commitment and Gulfstream Park's commitment to energize the sales process and bring something unique to this sale."

While last year's Florida sale struggled, with only 85 of 157 catalogued head going through the ring and only 47 selling for a buy-back rate of 44%, Browning still believes boutique auctions, bolstered by an impressive roster of graduates, can attract a strong buying bench.

OCEAN KNIGHT CHANGES TARGET

Originally expected to run in Aqueduct's GIII Gotham S. Saturday, Stonestreet Stables's **Ocean Knight** (Curlin) will instead remain in Florida to contest the GII Tampa Bay Derby on the same day.

"Barbara Banke and her team decided coming back to Tampa Bay Downs was the right thing to do, and I'm happy with the decision," said trainer Kieran McLaughlin.

A debut winner at Aqueduct Dec. 13, Ocean Knight overcame the 11-hole and a wide trip to capture Tampa Bay's GIII Sam F. Davis S. next time out Jan. 31. Banke felt that performance made the Tampa Bay Derby the next logical choice.

"It's a kind racetrack, the weather is supposed to be beautiful the next five days and he came out of the [Davis] real well, so we feel like going back to Tampa is a win-win for everybody," McLaughlin said. "He is training beautifully, and the nice thing is we don't have to change his schedule. We just have to cancel his plane trip and put him on the van. We would have been happy to go to New York, too, but he has already shown he likes the track at Tampa." *Cont. p6*



“We’ve had tremendous success from our graduates,” Browning said. “There are a lot of opportunities and options in the marketplace. We certainly believe there’s a need and a place on the calendar for high-quality horses and atmospheres that are unique and different involving live racing and destination locations. We couldn’t be any more bullish on the Florida sale and Saratoga this summer--it’s a big part of what we are at Fasig-Tipton.”

Last year’s Florida sale featured a pair of seven-figure juveniles, with a colt by Malibu Moon topping the auction with a final bid of \$1.2 million. Also bringing seven figures a year ago was **Khozan** (Distorted Humor). Tabbed a ‘**TDN Rising Star**,’ the Al Shaqab runner is now unbeaten in two starts and is expected to make his next start in the GI Florida Derby. Also among the 2014 graduates are GI Hopeful S. winner **Competitive Edge** (Super Saver) and GI Saratoga Special S. winner **I Spent It** (Super Saver).

“Success on the racetrack is the greatest calling card, advertisement, or claim that any sales company can make,” Browning commented. “Everyone is in the game to be around quality horses--to sell good horses, to buy good horses to be cheering on a Saturday afternoon. We’ve certainly created a lot of interest and a lot of momentum. There’s a confidence amongst the buyers that, ‘Hey, we can buy a really good horse at Fasig-Tipton,’ and the results of recent weeks speak for themselves.”

Out of a full-sister to graded stakes winner Happy Hunting, this colt is a half-brother to stakes-placed Flores Island (Giant's Causeway). He worked a furlong in [:10 2/5](#). "He is a serious horse," said Eddie Woods. "He is a beautiful-moving, two-turn horse. He is a horse we've loved all winter."

“We’re very proud of this colt,” Al Pike stated. “He’s a little on the young side, but he’s coming around really well. He’s a nice colt. We had his half-brother, Delhomme, a couple of years ago, who had the makings of being a Derby horse before he got hurt. They both had great, pretty strides. This colt isn’t as big, but he’s a pretty colt. We’re very proud of this colt, he’s coming the right way.”

“She is a gem,” said Niall Brennan. “She is a beautiful, elegant filly with a wonderful pedigree. She has tons of class and quality. I think this filly is a collector’s item. People might expect she might be better on the turf down the road, but she has so much class she handles the dirt well--she showed that in her breeze.”

Ocean Knight Changes Target cont. from p1

Ocean Knight will face some stiff competition in Tampa in the form of ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ **Carpe Diem** (Giant’s Causeway), who is also owned by Stonestreet in partnership with WinStar Farm. Winner of the GI Claiborne Breeders’ Futurity and runner-up in the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile, Carpe Diem will be making his seasonal debut in the Tampa Bay Derby.

“We are expecting the Tampa Bay Derby to be tougher [than the Davis], but we are up for the challenge,” McLaughlin remarked. “We have a lot of respect for Todd [Pletcher] and Carpe Diem and if he beats us, he beats us, but we think we’re going there with a great chance.”

With precious GI Kentucky Derby points on the line, and the Tampa Bay Derby only offering 50-20-10-15 points, the Stonestreet team originally feared pitting the two sophomores against each other would hinder one of the colt’s chances. However, Carpe Diem already sits eighth on the qualifying list with 14 points from his juvenile season, and though Ocean Knight has no points currently, McLaughlin has plans for a second 100-point Derby prep Apr. 4. **Cont. 7**

“We spoke about that, and both horses [almost certainly] will run back in a 100-point race in four weeks [for Ocean Knight, either the GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct or the GI Blue Grass S. at Keeneland, both of which offer 100-40-20-10 points to the top four],” McLaughlin said.

The conditioner added, “We don’t want to go to Kentucky just to run in the Derby; we want to have a chance to win. So with the timing of the Wood Memorial and the Blue Grass, the Stonestreet Stables people don’t think it is that big a deal if they finish first and second Saturday, or first and third or first and fourth.”

PLANETS ALIGNED FOR TAMPA BAY DERBY?

After getting the money in the 2012 GII Tampa Bay Derby with Prospective (Malibu Moon), it should be safe to say that trainer Mark Casse and owner John Oxley may be still feeling somewhat, ahem, ‘over the moon’ heading into Saturday’s renewal.

The duo will be well-represented once again by a pair of colts by the leading Spendthrift stallion--headed by the promising Ontario-bred **Danzig Moon** (Malibu Moon)--a dazzling maiden winner going a mile at Gulfstream in his

sophomore bow Feb. 7 ([video](#)).

“We’ve always been really high on him,” Casse commented. “From the beginning, he was on our ‘A’ team.”

The GIII Herecomesthebride S. at Gulfstream Feb. 28 was automatically downgraded to a Listed stakes when it was rained off the turf and it will not be reinstated.

A flat fourth at odds of 7-2 in his six-furlong Keeneland unveiling Oct. 3, the handsome bay improved to finish a good second after a slow start when stretched to a mile at Churchill 23 days later. Scratched from Woodbine’s Coronation Futurity in late November with a foot abscess, the \$160,000 KEESEP purchase blew the doors off with a 4 3/4-length graduation after making a bold four-wide sweep beneath Julien Leparoux on the far turn last time.

Danzig Moon, produced by the Danzig mare Leaveminthedust, hails from a deep Phipps female family ([free brisnet.com catalogue-style pedigree](http://free.brisnet.com/catalogue-style/pedigree)). Champions Inside Information and Smuggler as well as MGISW Educated Risk can all be found under his third dam Pure Profit (Key to the Mint).

“We were really disappointed in his first start at Keeneland, but his second start at Churchill was much better, especially after hitting the side of the gate at the start,” Casse continued. “We were expecting a big effort out of him last time. Not to sound cocky, but his effort didn’t surprise us at all. He always trains really well. He’s a colt that’s grown up. He’s a big leggy colt and he’s started to fill in.”

The hard-knocking Prospective, meanwhile, went on to add wins in the GIII Ohio Derby, Delta Mile S. and Victoria Park S. before retiring to Ocala Stud with a record of 17-7-2-1 and earnings of \$719,130.

“I always looked at Prospective and considered him to be an overachiever,” Casse said. “He would always train average, but run well. This horse [Danzig Moon] trains like a good horse. We’re throwing a lot at him on Saturday. Mentally, is he ready? That’s the question. In the end, if he stays healthy, I think you’ll be reading about him. He’s a really talented horse.”

CHAPA GETS 5 YEARS & \$25K PENALTY

Jockey Roman Chapa has until 5:00 p.m. Thursday to either pay a \$25,000 penalty or appeal both that fine and a five-year suspension imposed by the Sam Houston Race Park stewards, who ruled Monday that Chapa “did carry an electrical shocking device” while riding Quiet Acceleration (Silent Picture) to victory in a Texas-bred stakes race Jan. 17.

The clock is ticking on the administrative side, too. Chuck Trout, the executive director of the Texas Racing Commission, has two weeks to decide whether Chapa’s fine could be increased up to \$100,000.

The stewards’ ruling, the timetable for appeals and the possibility of the increased penalty were all confirmed Tuesday by Robert Elrod, the public information officer for the Texas Racing Commission.

The commission charges are entirely separate from Chapa’s legal woes that stem from the same incident. The 43-year-old rider is facing “unlawful influence on racing” felony criminal charges in Harris County Court while free on \$10,000 bail until a Mar. 18 arraignment.

Neither Chapa nor Paul Vick, one of the attorneys who represented Chapa at last Friday’s stewards’ hearing, returned phone messages before deadline for this story.

The SHRP stewards cited four specific rules violations--“unlawful influences on racing,” “influence of race prohibited,” “inhumane treatment of horse” and “possession of contraband”--in handing down a ban that would make Chapa ineligible for licensure until Jan. 18, 2020.

In addition, Quiet Acceleration was disqualified from the win and declared unplaced. Purse money for the \$50,000 Richard King S. is pending redistribution.

Danny Pish, the breeder/owner/trainer of Quiet Acceleration, declined to comment when asked about Chapa’s penalty and the “inhumane treatment to a horse” component of the charges.

But with specific regard to his horse’s disqualification, Pish said, “No, I don’t think it’s fair, but their ruling is their ruling.”

When asked if he believed he had a legal avenue to appeal the purse redistribution, Pish said, “I’m not certain.”

Pish isn’t the only party unclear about whether the penalty to Quiet Acceleration can be separated from Chapa’s discipline. **Cont. p9**

“I have some questions about that and I don’t know if we’ve answered those questions just yet,” said Elrod when asked for a clarification. “As far as the redistribution goes, that won’t happen at least until after any appeals process is over. It’s something [the commission] is trying to figure out.”

The issue of whether Chapa employed an illegal electrical device stems from a close-up photograph of Quiet Acceleration’s stretch run that showed what appears to be a tan, palm-sized device with protruding prongs in Chapa’s partially closed left hand.

Chapa has twice previously been suspended in Texas (1993) and New Mexico (2007) for attempting to frighten a racehorse into running faster with a prohibited object.

According to probable cause paperwork filed by Texas Department of Safety peace officer Jeffrey Green, Chapa essentially implicated himself by contacting the track photographer the day after his stakes win, demanding the removal of what appeared to be a fairly standard inside-rail photograph from the SHRP website because it was a “bad” picture. The jockey’s unusual request was then referred to the stewards, the racing commission and law enforcement authorities.

One important distinction in the allegations is that Green’s criminal charge alleges that Chapa “unlawfully, intentionally and knowingly” used an electrical device. The commission and stewards were only attempting to prove that Chapa “carried” the device.

The difference will be important in Chapa’s criminal case. Section 14.10 of the Texas Racing Act lists the possession of an electrical device as a Class A misdemeanor (one year in jail and/or a fine up to \$4,000). Possession with “intent” to influence the outcome of a race is a state jail felony (80 days to two years in jail and a fine up to \$10,000). Actual “use of” is a third degree felony (two to 10 years in jail and a fine up to \$10,000).

Unless Chapa appeals, the stewards’ ruling states that his \$25,000 fine must be paid by Thursday. Failure to do so “may result in the suspension of the subject’s occupational license(s),” although it is unclear if this would result in an extension of Chapa’s existing suspension.



AMERICAN TOURISM & GAMBLING COULD RETURN TO CUBA

Now that the United States has moved to normalize relations with Cuba, how long will it be until “normal” means a return to tourism, and inevitably, legalized gambling backed by American interests?

I. Nelson Rose, a California attorney who specializes in international gambling law, told the *TDN* that based upon an academic research trip he made to Havana two years ago, a safe bet might be seven years.

Prior to the 1959 revolution and Fidel Castro’s subsequent ban on betting, the island nation 90 miles south of Florida enjoyed a reputation as a tropical den of sin where well-to-do Americans gambled and gorged themselves on a bounty of illicit pleasures, many of which were bankrolled and/or operated by U.S. gangsters.

Among them was Oriental Park, which between 1915 and 1959 served as a magnificent, art-deco gem of Thoroughbred racing in the Havana suburb of Mariano.

Prior to the establishment of top-level racing in Florida, Oriental Park was the place to see and be seen if you were a fashionable American abroad on winter holiday.

In its heyday, Cuba’s only commercial track drew well-stocked U.S. stables, talented jockeys, and overflow crowds that lined the sloping, palm-lined clubhouse lawn and gardens, as depicted in this [vintage newsreel footage](#).

But if gambling does return to Cuba, south Florida tracks will have little to worry about in terms of equine competition: Oriental Park’s opulent grounds were razed more than 40 years ago.

A gritty auto parts store and heavy industrial equipment warehouse now occupy the only remaining structures that once housed Oriental Park’s lavish open-air clubhouse and sprawling casino. **Cont. p10**

Behind it, the entire one-mile oval and lush infield have been encased in concrete--although the outline of a track is still discernible if you peer long and hard enough at a grainy Google satellite image.

The sorry state of Oriental Park today belies its colorful history.

"The track and its surroundings are as fine and commodious as the largest ones in this country," the *New York Times* reported upon the track's opening 100 years ago this winter. Four years later, the *Times* affirmed that the race meet "signalized the beginning of a movement to make Havana a mecca for American sportsmen during the winter months."

For prohibition-parched Americans in the 1920s, part of the attraction had to do with free-flowing liquor. But the racing quickly prospered because the Cuban government bankrolled ambitious initiatives to import breeding stock.

At Oriental Park, 2-year-old racing began in January, and entries and results were printed in American newspapers from coast to coast.

Despite idyllic surroundings, corruption and violence became synonymous with Cuban racing by the 1930s. Like scenes out of an Ernest Hemingway novel, gunfire mingled with mariachi music near the betting ring.

It was an open secret that when track-backed bookmakers thought they were going to lose money on a heavily bet horse, they would call up to the stewards' stand. Using a system nicknamed "window washing," the stewards would raise and lower a window shade corresponding to the number of the horse they wanted "protected." It was the starter's job to watch for this signal, and to make sure the hot horse was at a disadvantage when the starting tape sprang up.

"The problem was partly the Depression--crooked stewards, races fixed, horses that were hyped or nobbled," wrote Robert Lacey in his book, *Little Man: Meyer Lansky and the Gangster Life*. "American owners were becoming less and less inclined to risk their better Thoroughbreds on the sea voyage to Havana, while no sensible bettor would chance his money with the track's bookies."

In the 1940s, president Fulgencio Batista reached out to Lansky to help grow Cuba's gambling sector. Despite deep racketeering ties, Lansky believed the best way to boost business was to run squeaky-clean betting operations, so he outsourced the overhaul of Oriental Park to Rockingham Park founder Lou Smith. Paradoxically, even as the Batista regime grew increasingly corrupt, the actual races became better policed, and the betting product flourished.

By the early 1950s, top U.S. jockeys routinely ventured to Cuba to gain late-December victories while chasing winningest rider titles. Movie stars like Kirk Douglas and Rita Hayworth were listed in society pages as Oriental Park guests, and the Harlem Globetrotters basketball team even made a group appearance.

New York investors took over, and by 1956 the track was boasting record business.

But greed led to the downfall of gambling on the island. Then Cuba as a whole disintegrated into chaos.

"American and Cuban mob families opened luxurious casino resorts, each one bigger and more successful than the last," Rose wrote in an online essay titled [Cuba Will Have Casinos, Again](#). "The money poured in. Batista got a cut of everything. Still, most Cubans never shared the wealth they saw all around them, and corruption was rampant. The result was revolution."

Amid the violence of the 1959 New Year's Day revolt, Batista fled the country. So too did American racing executives. Angry crowds destroyed gaming tables and turned loose swine inside the island's ritzy casinos.

Most online sources today claim that racing ceased at Oriental Park after the 1959 revolution. But this is not so--it's just that the track's history has been extremely difficult to document since the U.S. Government cut off relations with the Castro regime in 1961.

According to the *Times*, a group of horsemen salvaged the 1959 spring meet, running an abbreviated season in "strangely quiet" surroundings with limited betting.

Castro soon banned wagering and commandeered the track to be run by Cuba's National Institute for Sport. By 1964, the plan was for tourists from Soviet bloc nations to keep the sport alive as a pastime. Racetrack attendance dwindled even as crowds of 40,000 packed nearby ballparks to watch "socialist baseball."

By the mid-1960s, any Thoroughbreds of value had been surreptitiously sold off the island to turn illicit profits. **Cont. p11**

According to [one Cuban cultural website](#), the rest were transferred to a two-furlong bush track in Wajay, south of Havana, were clandestine betting presumably took place against socialist strictures.

When Oriental Park ceased racing for good in 1967, every scrap of tack and furniture was scavenged for other purposes. The main clubhouse portico initially housed a movie theater. Other buildings were torn down or converted to ramshackle stores.

Rose has been predicting the re-emergence of gambling in Cuba since 2009.

“Prior to island-based casinos, the first new wave would be cruise ships docking in Cuba’s territorial waters,” Rose said. “Obviously the U.S. would be such an enormous market for them. Cuba is absolutely desperate for whatever it can raise, and gambling is always seen as a painless tax, especially if the only people who can participate are foreigners.”


Unlike Oriental Park, Rose said many of the casinos are still “frozen in time.” He said he actually took in a variety act at the still-functioning Tropicana showroom--although he described the performance as dated as the dust on the chandeliers.

Rose said that the former gambling halls he toured seem small by today’s standards. But, he explained, even in the early days of Las Vegas, casinos went for a more intimate feel before expanding to “slot warehouses.”

Rose said a few of the hotels still function as lodging establishments. Many have been converted to apartments.

“The interesting thing is the buildings are still there and the casinos are still there, except there is no actual gambling going on in Cuba,” Rose said. “No one has any money.”

JOHN STUART:

Yesterday we were at Gulfstream Park admiring a new sales barn that went up last month, reportedly to the tune of \$5 million, and three different people basically made the same comment to me. The theme was: “Where in the world would we --meaning those of us in the American racing world--be without Frank Stronach?”

I first met him in 1989 when he showed up for the Keeneland September Sales and was looking at yearlings and I had four, including a little chestnut Canadian-bred colt. You would never forget the first time you met Frank, partly because of the company he kept, which at that time did not include any professional horse pickers.

Frank spent \$45,000 for the tough forward-walking little Canadian-bred colt which he named Explosive Red and with whom he won the GI Hollywood Derby and over \$800,000. I like to think this straightforward venture was a good first experience for a man who has made the biggest impact in American racing in my time. I don't really know him and never done much business with him, but I know this is one person to whom I owe a lot.

Think about it: What would have happened to Santa Anita, Gulfstream, and Maryland racing if Frank hadn't stepped up? Whether it was cable racing on TV, a sports league involving the purchase of over a hundred yearlings to get new people in the game, backstretch and horse rescue--you name it, the guy is in the forefront. When he comes to a horse sale, the tide rises quickly. He has been the leading owner and breeder of this century; he puts his money up. We should all be grateful. If you can't buy one of his horses, stallion seasons, or make it to one of his tracks, then just pray the man is with us another couple decades and please smile at him when you walk by him.

Over the past few years, the International has been won by Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), highest-rated horse in the world, 2012); Declaration of War (War Front, 2013); and Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) last season. **Cont. p12**

The remaining top 10 races, in order, were: G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, QIPCO Champion S., Breeders' Cup Classic, Prince of Wales's S., Prix Jacques Le Marois, King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S., Japan Cup (in association with Longines), Arima Kinen and Longines Breeders' Cup Turf. The top rated races in the five respective distance categories are the Black Caviar Lightning S. (Sprint), Prix Jacques Le Marois (Mile), Juddmonte International S. (Intermediate), Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Long), and Tenno Sho (Spring) (Extended). The highest rated race for fillies and mares is the Qatar Prix Vermeille.

A total of 12 countries comprise this year's list, representing the foremost racing events throughout the world across 39 different racecourses. Australia leads all countries with 26 total races, followed by the United States of America (23), Great Britain (16), Japan (10), France (9), Hong Kong (6), United Arab Emirates (5), Canada (1), Germany (1), Ireland (1), Singapore (1), and South Africa (1).

PLENTY OF INVADERS FOR SUPER SATURDAY

With Dubai World Cup night and its \$29 million in prize money across eight races for Thoroughbreds less than a month away, Meydan will host the Super Saturday program this coming weekend, highlighted by course-and-distance preps for seven of those events.

Despite a subpar effort in his first start over the newly installed dirt track, reigning World Cup hero **African Story (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) will get one final chance to earn his way into a defense of his title as he breaks from the rail in Round 3 of the G1 Al Maktoum Challenge. He was sent off the favorite in the international pools in Round 2 of the Challenge, a Group 2 over 1900 meters Feb. 5, but never landed a serious blow as **Frankyfourfingers (Fr)** (Sunday Break {Fr}) led throughout to score by a head over **Prince Bishop (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), with Le Bernardin (Bernardini) a further 1 1/4 lengths back in third. The evening's other Group 1 event is the Jebel Hatta S. which has also attracted its 2014 winner, Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa's **Vercingetorix (SAf)** (Silvano {Ger}).

The Mike de Kock trainee, who was subsequently runner-up to Just a Way (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) in the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. (now Dubai Turf), returned from a nine-month absence to defeat **True Story (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}) in the G2 Al Rashidiya S. Jan. 29. The latter stretches out to about 12 furlongs for the G2 Dubai City of Gold S.

In that race, he'll face **Sheikhzayedroad (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), one of 15 Super Saturday runners for Team British Racing and one of a quartet entered by trainer David Simcock. He was one of a trio from his barn to launch a successful raid on Canada last season, in his case in the G1 Northern Dancer S. Sept. 14. Later that afternoon, Qatar Racing's **Trade Storm (GB)** (Trade Fair {GB}) gave the stable a remarkable Grade I double in the G1 Woodbine Mile, while **Caspar Netscher (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) crossed the Atlantic the following month to score in the G1I Nearctic S. Trade Storm takes in the Jebel Hatta for the second straight season, while Caspar Netscher tries the straight 1000 meters in the G3 Meydan Sprint. Fellow short-track specialist **Extortionist (Ire)** (Dandy Man {Ire}) will try to overcome the 16 hole and will also have to deal with top Irish sprinter **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}).

"He is incredibly well and is a little tighter than for his first run last year," trainer Olly Stevens said of Extortionist. "He worked very well under Andrea [Atzeni] at Lingfield the other day, but I will not be surprised if he needs the race--it should put him spot on for three weeks' time."

Super Saturday will also mark the international debut of Godolphin's **Sir Fever (Uru)** (Texas Fever) in the Listed Al Bastikiya S. The 2014 Uruguyan Horse of the Year, the dark bay is perfect in his 10 career starts and completed a sweep of that country's Triple Crown with a 5 1/2-length success in the Gran Premio Nacional when last spotted Nov. 9.

ACROSS-THE-BOARD RECORDS IN MELBOURNE

Session one of the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale concluded with records for the sixth consecutive year in all relevant statistical categories. With a clearance rate of 82%, the cumulative average jumped by 16.4% to A\$97,003, while the median grew by 23.1% to a record A\$80,000. Total turnover was A\$44,507,500, a 19% improvement over 2014.

"We are ecstatic that the strength of the sale has continued throughout the entirety of Session I," said Inglis Victorian Director Peter Heagney. "As Melbourne's principal yearling sale, these positive results are indicative of the progressive nature of the Victorian industry as a whole," Heagney added.

Victorians spent over A\$20 million, making up 45% of the sale's gross to date.

International support was also strong with overseas buyers spending over A\$10 million on 90 lots. Some 45 lots fetched A\$200,000 or more since Sunday, a significant jump from 24 sold in Session I last year.

A pair of offerings shared top honors Tuesday, each recognizing final bids of A\$420,000. The first of those was a Woodside Park Stud-bred and -consigned son of the ill-fated Northern Meteor (Aus), who was purchased by Mick Malone on behalf of Kitchwin Hills. The Sept. 18 foal is the first foal out of Ryzhkina (Ire) (Storm Cat), a half-sister to champion King of Kings (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and General Monash (Thorn Dance) from the extended female family of champion China Visit (Red Ransom).

The page of hip 584 stands to gain further luster over the coming weeks if its full-brother Amber Sky (Aus) can successfully defend his title in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint. His participation in that event has been in some doubt, as Amber Sky has been in generally poor form, but he trialled beautifully at Sha Tin Tuesday morning and looks set to return to Meydan for the 1000-meter test Mar. 28.

Consigned by Blue Gum Farm, the bay filly was secured by Ciaron Maher Racing.
