

Divining Rod, Stanford to Try Preakness

Lael Stables' GIII Coolmore Lexington S. winner **Divining Rod** (Tapit) is on track for a start in the GI Preakness S., according to trainer Arnaud Delacour. Divining Rod breezed five panels in 1:00.80 Saturday at Fair Hills in preparation for that start.

"He started nice and easy, he was relaxed and he really kicked on at the end," Delacour said of the work. "That's the kind of work that you like to see when you go to a race that's going longer. I was very pleased with it."

Delacour continued, "The horse is doing very well. He breezed on Saturday and right now I am leaning toward the Preakness. I think he's great. I don't want to jinx myself, but at the moment he's doing very well. He has matured quite a bit and he understands more now what's going on. The first three horses I would say are going to be very tough to take on, but the thing is they all had a pretty hard race. They all had to fight for it. I didn't see any of them having to do it easy, so I hope that they're going to maybe be a little bit tired coming back in two weeks."

Stonestreet, Magnier Tabor and Smith's **Stanford** (Malibu Moon), will enter the Preakness, the owners told the Maryland Jockey Club Monday. The Todd Pletcher trainee, who was recently runner-up in the GII Louisiana Derby, was scratched from a start in the Kentucky Derby.

Bodhisattva, Mr. Z Possible for Preakness

Frederico Tesio S. winner **Bodhisattva** (Student Council) is a possible for a start in the GI Preakness S., trainer Jose Corrales stated. "If the possibility comes, I think I will probably run," Corrales said Monday. "I will not run a horse just to run the horse. If I don't feel a horse can run in the first three, why run? That's the way I think."

Zayat Stable's **Mr. Z** (Malibu Moon), who finished 13th in the Derby, could also possibly take a shot in the Preakness. "I haven't talked to Mr. Zayat, but we will get together," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "My vote would be to go. He never got a chance to run [in the Derby]. We were the whipping boy, but you get that in an 18-horse field."

AMERICAN RACING:

PLENTY TO BE PROUD OF by Barry Weisbord

Last Thursday, world traveler/trainer extraordinaire Mike de Kock got me thinking. While walking his Kentucky Derby-bound Mubtaahij toward his morning gallop at Churchill Downs, he turned to me and said, "I knew this was big, but I really had no idea how big." He was right.

We have become very gun shy, we devotees of Thoroughbred racing in America. Our industry media is constantly finding fault with what we do; some deserved, some not. The non-industry media rarely pays attention to us, and lately, when they do, it hurts. Two congressmen have introduced a bill that would economically destroy us because they feel they should. Animal-rights groups would like to see us be a trivia question. Our position in the worldwide Thoroughbred industry has never been weaker (again, some deserved due to our permissive use of raceday medication and lack of meaningful penalties and enforcement), but much of the turning-up of the collective noses is not merited. A few days in Louisville reminded me of that.

Mike de Kock was right. Derby week in Louisville is unique and world-class. The morning we spoke saw thousands of fans turn out to watch horses gallop. The barn area was packed with the participants' entourages, national and international media and industry members, and hundreds of just plain fans, many with kids cutting school to take their own picture of a Derby starter, or get an autograph from one of the top trainers and jockeys. cont. p5

Michael Tabor and Rachel Hood's **Christophermarlowe** (Tapit), the unbeaten winner of the Investec Derby Trial at Epsom Apr. 22, is among the 14 entries for Saturday's Listed Derby Trial S. at Lingfield.

"Christophermarlowe goes to Lingfield on Saturday for the Derby Trial," said trainer John Gosden. "We've put him in the [G3] Chester Vase [May 7] as well, but he'd only run there if it was a monsoon at Lingfield."

Christophermarlowe, who is a general 16-1 for the G1 Epsom Derby, could face up to five from Ballydoyle, including the stakes-placed winner **Order Of St George (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), and the entries also include Godolphin's **Future Empire (GB)** (New Approach {Ire}), twice group-placed and second to Christophermarlowe at Epsom; and recent 10-furlong maiden winner **Storm The Stars (Sea The Stars {Ire})**.

"We will make a decision during the week about Zawraq," Weld said. "We will see what the weather does and what the

ground is like. He could run in the [G1] Irish [2000] Guineas [May 23]. There's been no decision yet."

Weld added, "The fact Pat can't ride him affects our thinking slightly, but the main thing is the weather. We'll see how soft the ground is and see how he works this week. He's been satisfying me at home, but he's very laid back."

BACK TO SPRINTING FOR TIGGY WIGGY

Last year's Cartier champion 2-year-old filly **Tiggy Wiggy (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}), a brave third in the G1 1000 Guineas Sunday after carving out the pace, is set for a return to sprinting.

"I was very proud of Tiggy Wiggy," said trainer Richard Hannon. "We were dipping our toes into unknown territory and she came home with her head held high. You can't say that she didn't stay the mile, but it was only her class that kept her going. We need to make full use of her electric early speed, so it's back to sprinting."

Hannon pointed to Royal Ascot, and then some of Europe's top sprints against older males, as targets for the 3-year-old.

Unbridled's influence on the Kentucky Derby also extends to the 1990 winner Grindstone, who became the grandsire of Mine That Bird, and the Fappiano branch also gave us Real Quiet, the Derby winner of 1998. American Pharoah is therefore the fifth member of the Fappiano male line to have triumphed in the first leg of the Triple Crown since 1990. Add in two winners of the GI Preakness S. and four of the GI Belmont S. and the Fappiano dynasty has strong claims to being the most powerful force in the Triple Crown events in recent decades.

Earlier in the day, at Newmarket, it had been the turn of the Sadler's Wells din-asty to strengthen its hold on the G1 2,000 Guineas.

Rather surprisingly in view of his reputation as a source of stamina, Sadler's Wells sired more winners of the 2,000 Guineas than of the Derby, with Entrepreneur, King of Kings and Refuse To Bend giving him three victories between 1997 and 2003. More recently two of his brilliant mile-and-a-half performers--Galileo and Montjeu--have been responsible for three of the last five winners.

It is Galileo, though, who has made the biggest impact on this mile Classic in recent years. Victory three days ago went to his highly likeable son Gleneagles, who was passing the winning post in first position for the sixth consecutive time. This extremely well-bred individual displayed an impressive set of gears, without quite matching the stunning impression left by Galileo's other 2,000 Guineas winner. That was the mighty Frankel, who won by six lengths in 2011, having been twice that far in front at one stage.

But that's not the sum total of Galileo's influence on the first Classic. It was his son New Approach who was responsible for Dawn Approach, the five-length winner in 2013. Then it was the turn of one of Galileo's daughters, Forest Storm, to produce the 2014 winner, in the form of her Dubawi colt Night of Thunder.

Altogether that means that four of the last five 2,000 Guineas winners have Galileo in either the first or second generation of their pedigrees. This could be considered surprising in view of other aspects of Galileo's career as a racehorse and then as a stallion. The only time Galileo tackled a distance as short as a mile for Aidan O'Brien was on his only appearance at two, when heavy ground meant that it took him 1:48.20 to cover the distance in winning by 14 lengths.

Timeform's essay on Galileo in Racehorses of 2000 commented that "O'Brien doesn't rule out the Two Thousand Guineas for Galileo. **cont.10**

However, given his breeding and the manner in which he finished his race over a testing mile, distances of a mile and a quarter and more are likely to be required to bring out the best in him at three.”

Sure enough, Galileo spent his second season exclusively over a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half. Timeform concluded that the longer distance was his “natural trip,” while admitting that his narrow defeat in the Irish Champion S. showed that he was nearly as effective over a mile and a quarter.

Since then Galileo’s progeny aged three or over have established an average winning distance of 11.1 furlongs. That figure includes two winners of the Irish St Leger and Galileo has also been responsible for winners of the equivalent races in France, Germany and Italy.

Galileo has demonstrated that he is perfectly capable of siring high-class performers from mares with plenty of stamina in their pedigrees. Unfortunately the widespread prejudice against stamina means that the end product is generally not as saleable as one might hope. Consequently many breeders have been sending Galileo a speedier type of mare, and the results have been nothing short of spectacular.

In addition to exerting a strong influence on the 2,000 Guineas, he has also landed the Irish version with Roderic O’Connor and Magician, plus the G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas with Nighttime, Misty For Me and Marvellous and the G1 French 1,000 Guineas with Golden Lilac.

Of his various Guineas winners, Frankel, Roderic O’Connor and Golden Lilac are out of daughters of the sprinter Danehill, while Magician’s broodmare sire is Danehill’s fast son Mozart.

Three of the others--Misty For Me and the siblings Marvellous and Gleneagles--are all out of daughters of Storm Cat. That leaves Nighttime, and even she has a second dam by Bluebird, who shared the same sire, Storm Bird, as Storm Cat. This adds up to very interesting news for any American breeders who have used, or are considering using, one of the growing number of Galileo stallions based in the U.S.

Interestingly the three Group 1-winning sons of Galileo in Kentucky--Frankel’s brother Noble Mission, Magician and Red Rocks--are all out of fast mares, which should be a considerable help in siring progeny suited to America’s speed-obsessed industry. Extra speed in their mates would no doubt also be beneficial, but fortunately there is plenty of that available. With a bit of luck, Galileo could make a similar impact in the U.S. to that exerted by Sadler’s Wells through his champion sire descendants El Prado and Kitten’s Joy.

To get back to the Galileo/Storm Cat combination, I believe it has 38 representatives aged three or over, so it has done remarkably well to produce three Classic winners plus Global View (GIII Generous S. and GII American Turf S.), Misty For Me’s sister Twirl (a listed winner who was second in two Group 3s) and Aloft (runner-up in last year’s G1 Racing Post Trophy).

The cross has another half dozen or so 2-year-olds bidding to add to its achievements this year. One of them is a chestnut sister to Marvellous and Gleneagles which has significantly been named Coolmore. There is also a yearling brother. Another significant name--Ballydoyle--has been given to the 2-year-old sister to Misty For Me and Twirl. Typique could be another name to remember, as this filly’s dam is Denebola, a G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner out of a top-notch sister to Machiavellian.

Of course the dam of Gleneagles and Marvellous wasn’t just any old Storm Cat mare. She is You’re sothrilling, a daughter of that high-class American mare Mariah’s Storm. It is strange to think that, when John Magnier paid a sale-topping \$2.6 million for Mariah’s Storm at Keeneland in 1996, he explained that this Grade II-winning daughter of Rahy had been bought principally as a mate for new stallion Cigar.

When Cigar proved infertile, another route was required. The Storm Cat colt she was carrying at the time of her purchase must have impressed as an individual, as the mare was returned to Storm Cat in 1997 and 1998 and ended up producing seven foals to the Overbrook champion. Needless to say, the first Storm Cat colt was none other than Giant’s Causeway, who has done so well as a stallion.

None of Giant’s Causeway’s younger siblings came close to matching his achievements, which stood at six Group 1 victories, but his brothers Freud and Tumblebrutus developed into Grade I sires and You’re sothrilling could hardly have made a better start to her broodmare career.

You’re sothrilling showed the precocity and speed that was largely absent from Galileo’s first season. A Group 3 winner over six furlongs in June, she then landed the G2 Cherry Hinton S. in July. With a bit more luck she might also have won the G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot. Although she was off the course for more than a year between two and three, she was beaten little more than a length when she returned to action in the G1 Matron S. over a mile. cont. p11

Mariah's Storm won 10 of her 16 starts, with nine furlongs proving her most rewarding distance. Mariah's Storm has also spent the twilight of her broodmare career visiting Galileo, producing fillies by him in 2010, 2012, 2013 and 2014. The first of them, Hanky Panky, was third at Group 3 level over six furlongs.

Before leaving the topic of Galileo and Storm Cat/Giant's Causeway, it is worth pointing out that the best American runner with a dam by Galileo is Lea, who is by Giant's Causeway's son First Samurai. Last year's GI Donn H. winner certainly wasn't disgraced when third in the G1 Dubai World Cup, beaten little more than a length by second-placed California Chrome. Although his good early efforts came on turf, Lea is clearly very much at home on dirt.

Incidentally, Lea's dam Greenery has a 2015 filly by War Front, who was also represented by an \$800,000 short yearling out of Galileo's daughter Up at Keeneland in January. Up was again in foal to War Front when she made \$2.2 million at the same sale, and War Front was also the covering sire when Galileo's daughter Aloof topped last year's Keeneland November sale at \$3.9 million. The 2013 Fasig-Tipton November sale was also topped by a Galileo mare in foal to War Front, with Betterbetterbetter (carrying a filly) making \$5.2 million.

Bearing in mind Galileo's tremendous results with Danzig blood in Europe, sending Galileo mares to War Front could be another highly effective strategy--and one which could again produce some American dirt runners.



10,501 MILES

It is just over 10,500 miles from the training center at Newmarket, England to Tulloch Lodge Randwick in the inner Eastern suburbs of Sydney. I was asked by a leading English trainer why us Australian trainers don't phone up our English peers and seek feedback on our imported horses and their previous race records. Well, I can only speak for myself, but the difference between Newmarket and Randwick--taking into account geography, weather and the vastly varying training facilities--is like comparing Antarctica to the Sahara Desert.

The horses that [husband] Rob [Waterhouse] finds for me to train from Europe are mostly colts. When they arrive in Australia their brains spin, as all of a sudden they have become inmates sharing very tight quarters in the middle of a metropolitan city of some five million people.

Most of my imported horses have been sourced from Newmarket and the move from the spacious grounds of Suffolk to the training facilities at Randwick and

Flemington is the first challenge I am faced with in the preparation of getting them ready to race at Group 1 level. But the Lady Trainer certainly loves a challenge, and getting European horses acclimatized upon their arrival is one of the biggest challenges a trainer can face. Horses such as Carlton House, The Offer, Glencadam Gold, Pornichet and of course the 2013 Melbourne Cup winner Fiorente have, to date, certainly made the challenge well worthwhile.

Horses that come from the Northern Hemisphere are suddenly faced with the hustle and bustle of Australia's biggest cities. They have to cross busy roads in pairs, adapt to different feeds and different galloping regimes and, of course, harder tracks. My imported horses mainly gallop on an American-style dirt track in the centre of Randwick that is 11 furlongs in circumference (2200 meters). This is a quantum leap for the imports from the miles and miles of rolling hills in Newmarket. The best way to introduce a horse from a foreign land to my training process is through increased and concentrated exercise. I gallop the horses in the AM and then exercise them again in the PM.

Swimming in the afternoons is a big part of my process. Many in the Northern Hemisphere are surprised that I swim my horses as often as I do, but I can tell you that none have drowned yet. Swimming is part of Australian life. We are taught to swim as children and most of us who live around the edges of the Sunburnt Land (which is almost everyone) swim

regularly for the majority of our lives. Swimming is a fundamental part of my process and all horses from yearlings to the older geldings enjoy a swim on a regular basis both in the pool at Randwick and in Botany Bay.

Swimming, particularly in Botany Bay, increases the horse's anaerobic levels, and coping with the surf and the waves in the bay really chills out the horses. No, I don't mean the horses get cold, but rather, a horse that has participated in a swimming session is inevitably more relaxed upon returning to the stable. cont. p12



A fresh face from Europe needs its feed changed immediately. My feed contains close to four times as much corn as the imports were previously fed. Without changing the feed, a horse can become too hot to handle due to their increased work load. The corn-based feed promotes muscle growth and body tone. Nowhere else apart from Australia is this more apparent.

I like to lead my imported horses off another horse in what I refer to as 'copping it on the chin.' This happens daily as to create a more user-friendly atmosphere. When an import lands, I give him 10-15 days of light work, which constitutes a 'working holiday,' before sending them to 'rough it' in the paddock for 4-6 weeks. I have done an article on the benefit of spelling previously in this publication ([click here](#)) and again I must reiterate that spelling or 'freshening up' is near on the most important tool in regards to getting an imported galloper ready to race at the top level. After a spell, a horse will come back into the stable and, voila, they have had some sun on their back, their feet are used to the hard Aussie terrain, and they are ready to step up their work in preparation for their Australian race debut.

The horses pace work over six and seven furlongs (1200-1400 meters) and they travel at between 13.5 seconds and 14 seconds for the furlong. By this stage of their acclimatization, the imports need some speed 'injected' into their work. Now I use the term 'injected' a touch loosely, but this is exactly what I am trying to do; these horses have been bred to stay, they have proved they can cruise over a trip back home, but the races are designed much differently in Australia.

They need to develop a turn of foot and they need to be able to maintain their speed for longer than they have in the past. Getting a horse to run faster for more of the race by introducing it to a new way of training is one of the final steps in getting a European horse acclimatized to Australian conditions.

If I have a difficult one--and believe me, I have had a few--I must tell you that I thrive on the challenge. Maybe a difficult one needs more low-grade work; perhaps it needs to be ridden in a cowboy saddle during the afternoon session. A horse that refuses to accept my way of training needs to show signs of adaptation, and this may come from a session over the jumps. No, I am not training these European horses to be steeplechasers, although I do have quite a team of jumpers as we speak. All my horses jump at some stage. Sending a horse, any horse, over the jumps switches them on. The bottom line, I need to switch these imported gallopers on, get their mind on the job, and I have found jumping does the trick. Horses that hit a flat spot are taken away from the stable for a brief period of time to a

property where they can work under the guidance of professional equestrian riders. Shane Rose and Ernie Connell do all the remedial jumping work with the horses. Those reading this piece in the Northern Hemisphere will be familiar with name Ernie Connell, as he is, after all, a three-time gold medal-winning show jumper. After a couple of weeks of thinking outside the box, it is amazing how many horses come back into the stable with a new lease on life.

My purchase of Glencadam Gold rose more than a few eyebrows at the 2011 Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale. The gelding won in Europe as a 2- and 3-year-old; however, in open company at his last three starts before joining my team, he had finished no closer than ninth. Once I taught

Glencadam Gold how to relax, he in turn learned how to balance and stride right out in his work in dramatic fashion. His gait changed completely and he developed into a bold frontrunner that, at his best, was impossible to get past. He transformed from a handicapper in England that was being beaten out-of-sight in weight-for-ages races over 10 furlongs to a Group 1 winner in just four starts. In fact, the grand campaigner won his first four starts in Australia before, at start six, running a very brave sixth in the Melbourne Cup won by Green Moon in 2012.

The 2012 Tattersalls Sale resulted in an entire named The Offer being knocked down to the Aussie trainer for one bid of 200,000 guineas.



The bidding had not started and the opening price for the entire was 20,000 guineas, but Rob worked out a tactic that would see The Offer making his way to Tulloch Lodge with little fuss. Bang, one bid later, the sales ring was in shock, and the future Group 1 winner was on this way. The Offer started his career at a country meeting in Scone, NSW, where he finished down the track. I believed the then entire needed to be gelded and he needed time in the paddock. Once gelded and given a decent spell, the son of Montjeu came back a different individual. He could now sit where he

pleased in the run, and he had a blistering turn of foot that was never more apparent than over the last two furlongs of the G1 3200 meter Sydney Cup of 2014, where the gelding won decisively by four lengths.

Rob and I are again venturing to England for Royal Ascot this year, where I will have the champion 3-year-old colt of Australia,

Wandjina, competing in the Diamond Jubilee S. We will also be attending the second Goffs London sale, where we will be looking to secure the next Pornichet or Cafe Society, two stunning individuals I acquired at the inaugural Goffs London sale in 2014. I am looking forward to seeing you there.

The focus of the Inglis Australian Broodmare and Weanling Sale turned to select broodmares for its second session Monday, and like the Easter yearling sales at the Newmarket complex in Sydney last month, there was a decidedly international flavor to proceedings, with the top two lots going to Chinese investor Yu Long Investments.

The session saw strength at the top of the market, but figures were down across the board. A total of 136 horses changed hands for A\$6,527,100 for a buyback rate of 24.4%, up 9% from 12 months ago. The average dropped 26% to A\$47,993, while the median dipped 10% to A\$18,000.

Inglis's Managing Director Mark Webster pointed out the competition for high-quality offerings.

"There certainly isn't a lack of buyers here after quality mares, and to vendors who have supported the sale it is pleasing to see many of the better lots sell for considerably more than the offers they were receiving on the private sale market before this week's auction," said Webster. "Plenty of breeders are here to re-invest after a great yearling sales season, highlighting what a great opportunity this sale offers to vendors willing to offer their best broodmares and race fillies here in Sydney in May."

The session's top price-- which was A\$605,000 compared to A\$800,000 on this day last year--was paid by Yu Long for [lot 286](#), the 11-year-old Encosta de Lago (Aus) mare **Flame of Sydney (Aus)**. Consigned by Arrowfield Stud, the stakes winner has already produced a stakes winner in the form of last year's G3 Zedative S. victor Not Listenin'tome (Aus) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}), who was also

twice Group 1-placed before being exported to Hong Kong at the end of last year. Flame of Sydney has an unraced 2-year-old by Redoute's Choice (Aus); a yearling by that three-time champion sire and a weanling by Snitzel (Aus), and was sold Monday in foal to Snitzel.

Yu Long later swooped for [lot 456](#), the 6-year-old **Neena Rock (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), for A\$500,000. A dual Group 3 winner for trainer John Sargent, Neena Rock was retired after finishing last of 16 in the Feb. 28 G3 Guy Walter S., and was offered here as a broodmare prospect. She is out of Feminine Wiles (Miesque's Son), an unraced half-sister to Grade I winner and successful sire Quiet American. It is also the family of influential sire Fappiano.

"International appeal has been strong throughout our Select Yearling Sales Series and again here this week," Webster said.

"We've seen new international players enter the Australian bloodstock market, with the top two mares today secured for a China-based client of Inglis's for commercial breeding purposes here in Australia."

Another proven producer, **Johan's Toy (Aus)** (Johan Cruyuff {GB}), fetched six figures when hammered down to Alan Bell for A\$280,000. The 13-year-old, a half-sister to group winners Extra Zero (Aus) (Danzero {Aus}) and Operetta Lass (Aus) (Singspiel {Ire}) and a dual stakes winner herself, is the dam of four-time Group 2 and 3 winner Toydini (Aus) (Bernardini). Johan's Toy's Animal Kingdom weanling filly was purchased by New Zealand's Lyndhurst Farm for A\$200,000 Sunday, and the mare was offered in foal to another young sire, first-crop covering sire Dundee (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), Monday. **cont. p14**

Yu Long Investments wasn't the only Asian buyer making waves in Sydney Monday. The Hong Kong-based Pan Su Tong, through his Goldin Farms, spent A\$560,000 on three mares to support Goldin's resident stallion, G1 Hong Kong Cup and Hong Kong Derby winner Akeed Mofeed (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). That haul was headed by a pair for A\$220,000: [lot 378](#), the Tasmanian Oaks winner **Marchelle Belle (Aus)** (Anabaa), who was offered not in foal from the Ruane dispersal after being covered by Sebring (Aus); and [lot 433](#), the stakes-winning maiden mare **Mezeray Miss (Aus)** (Artie Schiller).

Goldin Farms, the former Lindsay Park Stud that was established in 1965 in South Australia, was purchased by Pan Su Tong's Goldin Group in 2013.

While Goldin Farms is just getting started, John Baxter's Ruane is winding down, and Monday's session marked the completion of the Ruane dispersal. Ruane sold 24 mares and two stallion shares for A\$1,299,350 Monday. Their top-selling broodmare was Marchelle Belle, but the dearest offering of their dispersal was a share in Widden Stud's leading sire Sebring (Aus), which went to Damon Gabbedy's Belmont Bloodstock for A\$350,000.

"I would like to thank John Baxter of Ruane for offering his breeding stock here [Monday]," Webster said. "John achieved great success as a breeder for over 25 years and we both look forward to watching the new owners of his stock enjoy similar success."

Strong international participation was also seen from New Zealanders, with Paul Willetts leading that charge when signing for seven mares for A\$484,000, including the stakes-winning and producing One In A Million (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) ([lot 466](#)), carrying a first-season cover to Zoustar (Aus).

WE MUST DREAM

About two-and-a-half hours after American Pharoah won the 2015 Kentucky Derby, a mare we own in partnership lay down and foaled a colt.

Another dream began.

It is a scene repeated every night in foaling barns during breeding season.

On wobbly, spindly legs they stand for the first time.

As they do, breeders dream.

Ahmed Zayat and his family had a big dream, of winning the Kentucky Derby. After three seconds in the country's most storied race, they had to wonder if they would stand in the winners' circle on the first Saturday in May.

They did just that Saturday, and they seem to know how blessed they are.

We've never had a Derby starter, most likely never will.

We know the odds.

Could this colt foaled Derby night, by Creative Cause out of the Forest Camp mare My Heavenly Sign, be the 2018 Derby winner?

Of course he could.

Just like all the other foals of 2015 could.

We have the dream.

In fact, we must have the dream, because without it, what is the point of becoming a breeder?

Derby 2015

A record crowd bet record dollars. Perhaps racing is not dead yet.

In its marquee race, it takes a good field, good favorite, good weather, good drama, and good stories.

The 2015 Derby had all of that.

But most of all the field each year carries with it the dreams of all breeders, that with every mating they plan and every foaling they witness, the next good horse may be at hand.

In fact, the next good horse is always at hand, for every crop produces them.

And, though we rarely think of it this way, we never know if a horse such as American Pharoah is actually the best of his generation.

Perhaps a better runner never made it to the races because it took a bad step or contracted a bad disease as a foal, as a yearling, as a 2-year-old. Perhaps one of those foals slipped by its dam was cut out to be a Derby winner.

Perhaps ... if ... maybe.

All that matters is that American Pharoah is the best of those who lined up in the starting gate on that day.

Just like in any other race, at any other track, on any other day. It doesn't diminish the accomplishment of American Pharoah. It only makes breeders dream more.

The Hope

There have been so many good horse names over the years. But I have always loved the name Hopespringseternal, used three times for fillies (in this country), most famously for a daughter of Buckpasser who produced Miswaki and is the granddam of Lacovia.

The name beautifully describes what every breeder feels when his mare foals, that in every foal there is the hope of the type of runner it will become.

Breeders must be dreamers, they must believe hope will spring eternally from the matings they plan and the foals those matings produce.

We don't just watch the Derby to see who is the best runner in the field. We watch the Derby to rekindle memories of champions, such as Citation and Seattle Slew. We watch the Derby to reconsider longshots, such as Lil E. Tee and Mine That Bird. We watch the Derby to ponder what would have happened had Alydar not been in the same crop as Affirmed.

We watch the specialness that is American Pharoah. We marvel in his grit, his determination, his talent.

We look at our colt foaled that night and wonder if he will be the next American Pharoah.

We have the dream.

The same one all breeders have.
