SWEEP STILL SWEET ON SUNDAY

The morning after ending the 37-year Triple Crown drought, **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) was in fine form, according to trainer Bob Baffert.

"Looking at the horse today, he looked pretty darn good for a horse that just ran a mile and a half," Baffert said outside of Barn 1 in Elmont. "He's a tough horse. Today he looked like he could run back in three weeks."

Baffert allowed members of the media to pet American Pharoah outside of the barn to demonstrate the colt's demeanor.

"I just wanted to share him with everybody to show how kind and how sweet he is," Baffert said. "He's been so special to me because for some reason he connects with me. Horses of his caliber are not that nice. He's just sweet and he's so different from any other horse I've had."

Baffert continued, "Sometimes I can't believe I have him in my barn. To see this horse finally do something like this...I was starting to believe that maybe it was never going to happen. I was starting to think that maybe it's the breed, but it's not the breed. We just have to wait until a superior horse comes around, and they don't come around that often. You have to have a superior horse, and he also has to be tough and be able to handle the grind."

Owner/breeder Ahmed Zayat said he recognized the colt's potential early on.

"We were told from the time he was a young foal that he was special, and I told that to Bob from Day One," Zayat said before watching American Pharoah's Triple Crown banner unfurl in the Belmont grandstand to hang with those of the previous 11 winners.

DERBY WINNER 'WELL' THE DAY AFTER

Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby winner **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) was reported to be in good form by trainer John Gosden the morning after his Classic score. The conditioner noted the Anthony Oppenheimer colorbearer--who answered stamina questions in resounding fashion over 1 1/2 miles Saturday--will revert to 10 furlongs for the G1 Coral-Eclipse July 4, while Derby second and stablemate **Jack Hobbs (GB)**

(Halling) will target the G1 Irish Derby June 27. "He's not in the Irish Derby; it was something we discussed at the supplementary stage that we wouldn't put him in," said Gosden of Golden Horn.

"The Eclipse in July looks like the direction we'll go and then possibly on to

York for the Juddmonte [International].

He's come out of the race well and it is fair to say the Eclipse is uppermost in my mind."

Gosden, who was winning his second Derby after Benny The Dip in 1997, added, "It was a great race, run very strongly, and it was a clean affair. I thought the Dante form [where Golden Horn and Jack Hobbs were one-two] would be confirmed. I thought Jack Hobbs was a little unbalanced, but he learned a lot from York, whereas the other horse is more the finished article." Cont. p7

"Then when he went to Bob's barn, it was the same. Bob never hypes a horse, but he did tell me 'He's the one, but let's keep that between ourselves because we don't want to jinx him.' Now the secret is out."

American Pharoah, who left Belmont on a 7:30 a.m. flight Sunday headed for Kentucky, was given a hero's welcome back in the Blue Grass state. People lined up outside Barn 33 at Churchill Downs as American Pharoah arrived at 1:15 p.m.

"The feelings just go on and on; they just don't stop," Baffert's assistant Jimmy Barnes, who accompanied American Pharoah from New York, said. "Just coming here with the police escort and there were fans on the street waving--it's a lot of roller-coaster emotions."

American Pharoah will get a four-day break from training before connections decide what their game plan will be.

"After we freshen him up, we have options," Baffert noted. "We'll have time to figure it all out, and right now we just want to love on him and enjoy him."

Baffert, Espinoza Generous After Win

Bob Baffert and wife Jill, as well as jockey Victor Espinoza were quite generous following their Triple Crown victory. Espinoza will donate his \$80,000 GI Belmont S. earnings to City of Hope cancer research and treatment facility in Duarte, California, while the Bafferts will be donating \$50,000 to each of the following charities: the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance, the California Retirement Aftercare Account, the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund and Old Friends Farm in Kentucky.

Espinoza on Media Trail

Victor Espinoza will remain in New York for a number of national media commitments. The jockey threw out the ceremonial first pitch at Yankee Stadium Sunday and will be on NBC's Today Show with Matt Lauer and on the Jimmy Fallon Show Monday.

NYRA Registers Second-Highest Handle in History

Saturday's Belmont card witnessed the second-highest all-sources handle in the history of NYRA, with \$134,839,391 wagered on Saturday's 13-race program. On track wagering tallied over \$16.8 million, while off-track betting totaled more than \$117.9 million.

High Ratings for Belmont

American Pharoah's Triple Crown-winning Belmont S. victory, which was televised on NBC, registered a 12.3/27 meter market rating, the third best of a Belmont S. on record. NBC has posted back-to-back 12+ overnight ratings for the Triple Crown's third jewel, marking the first time in People Meter history that successive Belmont Stakes have topped a 12 overnight.

MCLAUGHLIN PLEASED WITH FROSTED

Trainer Kieran McLaughlin was pretty pleased with Frosted (Tapit)'s runner-up effort in Saturday's GI Belmont S. "It was an exciting race," said McLaughlin. "For about three strides, I started to call on [Frosted]

and then I looked back at the leader and said, 'Oops.' We were very proud of our horse, he ran very well he just ran into a star.

McLaughlin added, "It was a great day of racing, to have a Triple Crown winner. We were second best, no excuses. We got paid for second this time, last time we thought we were second

best, but finished fourth [in the GI Kentucky Derby]. American Pharoah is a great horse; he does everything right and he does it effortlessly."


Trainer Takes on the Belmont Stakes

New York trainers weigh in on the Triple Crown sweep:

"We watched the race from my box and I think it was an outstanding performance from the horse, all the connections, and particularly Bob Baffert. He deserves a lot of credit for his horsemanship. For that horse to miss the [G1] Breeders' Cup Juvenile with an injury, and then in January to not know if he was going to be racing in any of the Triple Crown races, to have him perform as well as he did in all three events dealing with a foot issue and all that. I can tell you as a trainer that's an extraordinary training job for that horse. I know he's [Bob Baffert] going to deflect a lot of attention to the horse, which is admirable, but I can tell you, being a trainer for a living, that's a remarkable feat. I don't know if I've heard that much noise at the eighth-pole at any sporting event I've ever been to so it was something I'll never forget." -**Chad Brown**

"I'm in awe about Baffert's four tries. I just can't get that out of my mind. It's just spectacular. Unbelievable. Most trainers, when they're done with their careers, maybe if they're lucky they'll have one chance. He's had four. It just shows you how good he is. That's it. You've got to give him credit." -**Nick Zito**

"The racing was great, the crowd was great. I thought American Pharoah was great. Going into it, I thought he was the best horse in the race by far. Odds say he wasn't going to win, but he dominated them yesterday and my hat's off to him. I think in the coming weeks it's going to be good for racing. I was listening to the radio this morning and that's all they're really talking about. It's all really good. I think NYRA did a really, really good job yesterday. Everything was very positive." -**Shug McGaughey**



Jeff Lifson of West Point Thoroughbreds:

I was the kid in 10th grade who never thought Jay Gatsby was pathetic. Quite the contrary.

"Gatsby believed in the green light, the orgastic future that year by year recedes before us...it eluded us then, but that's no matter. Tomorrow we will run faster, stretch out our arms farther...and one fine morning..."

Yesterday afternoon at around 6:45 at Belmont Park, I finally stared face to face with the brilliant green light. It wasn't distant any more. And it made me believe again. **cont. p5**

All American Pharoah did was take me back to Mrs. Michaud's 10th grade English class a long time ago in a small Iowa college town and the story of Jay Gatsby's sad, unrequited journey to the edge of his dock. He fell short of his dream...and the dream might have been an improbable one, destined for disappointment and failure.

Yet I always thought Gatsby angled more down the noble path than the pathetic one. I guess I too believed in the green light, even if it faded into the mist of the Long Island Sound for him.

For me, yesterday afternoon, also on Long Island, here came that elusive green light again.

From Silver Charm in '97 on... I saw 'em all. Every. Single. One. The horses I wanted to beat (Big Brown with Macho Again, California Chrome with The Curve) and the horses whose failure cut away tiny shards of my soul (Real Quiet and Smarty Jones), I bore witness to the light abruptly fading at the wire for nearly two decades.

So I got to thinking after the moment came around 6:45 yesterday afternoon--the moment that followed nearly two decades of personal futility, and whispers that grew to shouts that it might never happen again without drastic change. I got to thinking in the darkness of Belmont Park long after the races, long after the personal disappointments of the day (China Prince too fast early, Twilight running on a boggy turf course, Cajun Spirit swallowed up at the top of the stretch).

What I thought was this: I still believe in the green light--in all the magnificent horses we've found, we've bought and we've watched with unbridled joy with our partners and their families. And I know that along the pathway down to the edge of that dock towards the green light, we've slipped and tumbled to the deck plenty.

American Pharoah came after nearly two decades of me bearing witness to failure. And gave me a mantra worth repeating when one's high hopes run up the track or drop into the claiming ranks.

The mantra is this: Be Bigger, and Chase Harder. That's what it takes to be a long-time successful owner of racehorses. Be bigger than the disappointment of the moment, and chase harder towards the goals that others say are improbable. Because you believe and know them to be possible.

Like American Pharoah, I fly back to Louisville today. Because of him, I'll be chasing the green light again, first thing tomorrow morning.



A WITNESS TO HISTORY

We have sent TDN intern Harper Hutchins to the last two legs of the Triple Crown to report on the events from a college student's perspective. Her Belmont report follows.

As an intern for the *Thoroughbred Daily News*, I have been given incredible opportunities, varying from learning how to enter European data into TDN Progeny PPs to eating my first hard shell crab in Baltimore before the Preakness. This week, the staff at the *TDN* sent me to the Belmont to report on the race from a younger person's perspective. It turned out to be the opportunity of a lifetime; an opportunity nearly no one my age gets.

Waiting in the elevator on the ride up to the Garden Terrace at Belmont Park on Saturday to watch the big race, we were all silent. These strangers and I all had one common thing on our minds. 'Would Pharoah pull it off?'

Standing on the chairs in the Garden Terrace, the second I heard the gates open, a shiver went through my body. Goosebumps stayed on my arms throughout the race. Everyone in the entire building--the entire world, it seemed--was screaming. Mostly, they were screaming 'C'mon Pharoah' or some inaudible version of that. As he turned for home, everyone could see we were in the presence of a great, in the presence of a horse that really

does only come around every 37 years. Through the turn for home, Espinoza opened him up and just let him run. It was almost as if Pharoah were saying 'Finally!' as he tore up the track leaving the others in his wake. As he came across the finish line, I could not believe it. It was so surreal, knowing that this moment is one that will be captured for centuries. I have been watching past Triple Crown performances, and seeing the energy and feeling of a crowd gone wild and overcome with emotion that goes along with it. To be a part of that crowd Saturday felt like a dream. With tears streaming down my face, it was clear, we had just witnessed something incredible.

Running to the elevators to avoid traffic and make my train, it was hard to process what had just happened; hard to understand how monumental this moment was for avid racing fans and horse racing as a sport. Standing in the elevator with different strangers this time there was a different silence: a silence that said, 'I can't believe the drought is over. I just can't believe it.' Still in the elevator, I got waves of text messages from friends and family asking me about my experience. All I could answer was that it was unlike anything I had ever experienced. I am an emotional person. I always have been the one to cry at concerts or tear up over sweet commercials. **cont. p6**

Seventh in the Doom Bar Steventon S. at Newbury July 19, he then was second by a neck in the Prix de Boulogne S. Sept. 4 for trainer Andre Fabre. Making his first North American start for conditioner Bill Mott and receiving Lasix for the first time, the Team Valor and Gary Barber colorbearer sat a patient trip far back under Jose Lezcano, as a loose on the lead Inchcape doled out glacial splits of :25 1/5, :50 2/5 and 1:14 2/5. Angled widest of all into the lane, Triple Threat burst onto the scene in midstretch and produced a powerful turn of foot to inhale all but Middleburg, who was also making up ground. It was a head-bobbing battle to the wire, but Triple Threat got his nose down where it counted and bested his game rival in a thriller.

"He had to take back going into the first turn," Lezcano offered. "That was fine because we were close to the pack anyway with the slow pace. We had to go a little wide, but once we hit the quarter pole, he had a lot of kick left for the stretch. That was my first time on the horse and he had a lot of power coming down the stretch."

Gosden, who formerly trained in the U.S., was also full of praise for Saturday's Triple Crown winner American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile).

"I thought it was brilliant," he said. "When I saw they had left him in front, I thought 'he is going to kill them.' They just let him float along. It is unbelievable for American racing. I was there for the last one in 1978; although I was young it was great to see a horse do it."

"What a tough horse he is," Gosden added. "He had a tough Kentucky Derby then he ran in the sloop at Pimlico. The horse must be made of iron. Bob Baffert has done the most brilliant job with the horse."



when we got against Jack Hobbs I knew then that he was going to win. It felt like he pulled the handbrake off and it was an impressive turn of foot he showed."

Dettori has endured a somewhat tumultuous two years, in which he split with longtime retainer Godolphin and also served a six-month suspension for a drug positive; however, his career has been resurgent as of late.

"One press person said to me that I have had a rollercoaster career. I said, 'no, I've had a colorful career,'" Dettori noted. "I have tried to be myself. Everybody has ups and downs, the most important thing is to be positive and look forward. I have had a few knockers on the way, those that like to kick you when you are down, but I never doubted myself. Yesterday was a personal satisfaction."

He added, "I'll be honest with you, when you reach 50, for a jockey it is about the average age you stop. I am going to enjoy the next six years and if I can squeeze in another Derby that would be great, but maybe I am getting a bit greedy."

Oppenheimer noted a tilt at the G1 Coral-Eclipse July 4 will give Golden Horn the chance to race right-handed for the first time.

"I would certainly be up for the Eclipse," said the 78-year-old. "I'd just like to make sure because he would be going the other way around and one or two horses don't like going a different way. We've just got to make sure he's OK leading with the correct foot."

"He's had three races [this season] and we just want to see how he handles a couple more races before we decide on anything else," Oppenheimer added. "I'd love to run him in the Arc. I want to make sure he goes the other way around and he wouldn't want to run on soft to heavy ground. He'd just hate it. There's an awful lot to think about."

Oppenheimer added that he would like to stand Golden Horn in Britain when his racing days are over so he can breed his own mares and visit the horse.

"The intention is, at the moment, to stand him somewhere in Newmarket or certainly in England, anyway," he said. "That is what I would love to see. I want to use him and go and see him when I want to. I can't stand him at my stud as it's not big enough. My ambition is to stand him for the British breeders rather than anyone else."

Dylan Mouth punched his ticket to the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. with an emphatic five-length win in the G1 Gran Premio Di Milano Sunday. The 4-year-old entire stretched his record to nine wins and his unbeaten streak in Italy, becoming the first Derby winner since Sedan in 1959 to score in the Milano and the G1 Gran Premio Del Jockey Club.

Dylan Mouth was asked not just to win but to win easily, and he delivered. Jockey Fabio Branca had him in second position, some lengths behind his rabbit Celticus, and charged to lead before the 400 meter pole when Billabong also started his move. The Moroccan-bred tried to challenge but Dylan Mouth re-broke entering the last furlong and cruised home clear, while the brave Celticus stayed on in third.

"I expected him to score in this way," said owner Felice Villa. "He is a much more mature and stronger horse than he was last season and now he has nothing to prove in Italy."

"The King George and Queen Elizabeth is the race we are dreaming about. Dylan Mouth got beaten when he first tried at Royal Ascot, last year in the G2 King Edward VII S., but we have learned a lot from that defeat."

Fabio Branca will again ride Dylan Mouth at Ascot. Villa added, "Last year everything went wrong and Dylan Mouth had a nightmare trip from an outside gate. Fabio [Branca] now knows the racecourse and he won't make the same mistake twice."
