BAFFERT LOOKING AHEAD FOR PHAROAH

In comments Sunday morning, trainer Bob Baffert talked as if Triple Crown winner **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile)'s racing career will continue beyond his loss in the Travers S.

While it is owner Ahmed Zayat's call on whether American Pharoah will be retired, something he speculated on following the race Saturday at Saratoga Race Course, Baffert offered a far more positive take 15 hours later. He acknowledged that the demands of traveling from California to the East Coast twice this summer probably caught up with American Pharoah in the 146th Travers. Baffert said he would likely train the colt up to the Breeders' Cup Classic and not put him on the road for another race in the interim.

Before a scheduled meeting with the media, Baffert inspected the bay, walked him a bit and let people gathered near Barn 25 pet him and feed him some baby carrots.

"He looks great today," Baffert said. "According to the sheet guys, he was the play against. He was supposed to bounce, which he did. That's what they do. He could come back and freshen up and run. I don't think he tailed off, I think he just didn't bring his 'A' game. If you look at him, he still looks pretty healthy. He doesn't look like a tired horse."

Shortly after **Keen Ice** (Curlin) collared American Pharoah in the stretch, Zayat said it was his gut feeling that it might be time to retire the colt. When the question of retirement came up Sunday, Baffert tempered Zayat's comments by putting them in perspective.

"Mr. Zayat is a very emotional man," Baffert said. "We were all pretty disappointed. We were like in shock. We were surprised he got beat. We weren't really prepared for a losing speech. When we hit it, it was like, we've just got to get through this." **Cont. p3**

'STELLAR' AGAIN IN THE TORREY PINES

Hronis Racing's **Stellar Wind** (Curlin) has had nothing short of an exceptional season. The chestnut took both the GII Santa Ysabel S. Feb. 28 and GI Santa Anita Oaks Apr. 4 going 1 1/16 miles in Arcadia. She closed decisively to finish fourth as the favorite behind Lovely Maria (Majesticperfection) when stretching out to 1 1/8 miles in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 1 and was given almost a two-month

break after that run. She returned with a nose victory in the GII Summertime Oaks at Santa Anita June 20 and has been on the bench since.

Away without incident as the 1-2 chalk, the chestnut tracked the pace set by Ultimate Holiday (Harlan's Holiday) through a half-mile in :46.43 and moved closer to turn up the pressure approaching the far turn. Seizing control on the bend, she opened up a sizeable advantage and reported 4/14 lengths clear of Big Book (Mr. Big) under minimal urging. "She's classy; she showed that," said pilot Victor Espinoza. "And I changed her style a little bit today. I wanted to keep my position going into that first turn, so I moved her up with the speed. And she was comfortable there. So I said: 'OK, let's just keep doing this.' She responded well and won like we hoped she would." **Cont. p6**



BAFFERT LOOKING AHEAD FOR PHAROAH

American Pharoah is scheduled to fly back to California--it will be his 14th flight since March--on Monday morning and will return to his stall at Baffert's barn at Del Mar. Baffert said Zayat--who returned to California after the Travers--has not decided on whether to keep the colt in training for the \$5 million Classic, the scheduled final start of his career.

"Basically, we'll let the horse tell us what he's doing," Baffert said. "I really don't know what the thought is. I know he'll be going back and forth."

Zayat has said throughout the year that he defers to Baffert on training and racing matters, but the Hall of Fame trainer described himself as more of an advisor.

"Ahmed Zayat, it's his horse," Baffert said. "My job is if I see something, if he were to come up with something I didn't like, then I'd tell him. Nothing has shown up today. We're glad that he looked fine and he's healthy. I didn't see any problem there."

Then Baffert joked about how he would deal with American Pharoah after he gets back to Del Mar.

"We'll just probably take him and throw him in the Pacific Ocean there," he said. "Like the old days, get on bareback and ride him in the waves."

After American Pharoah won the Haskell Invitational on Aug. 2 at Monmouth, Baffert gave him time to recover from the race and work twice before committing to the Travers. He said he doesn't regret the decision to come to Saratoga.

"He tried. If I had to do it again, I would have brought him here," Baffert said. "I'm glad I brought him. I think racing needed something like this. We almost pulled it off."

Baffert said Zayat deserves credit for running American Pharoah in the Travers.

"He brought him up here. You really have to thank him," Baffert said. "He wanted to share him. He's a sportsman for bringing him up here and sharing him with Saratoga. He did it for racing, and it didn't work out. We rolled the dice and it didn't work out, but he almost pulled it off. He was just valiant in defeat and he was trying so hard. He was empty, empty, at the top of the stretch and he was still trying to win. I still thought there was a chance."

American Pharoah prevailed in the duel with Frosted, who had pressed him through a testing second half mile in :46.78, but could not hold off late-running Keen Ice. As the crowd of 50,000 at the Graveyard of Favorites gasped, American Pharoah finished second by three-quarters of a length.

"It was disappointing," Baffert said. "I really thought he was going to do it. I could tell down the backside he wasn't really as powerful as he usually looks. The trip, coming back here, took a little starch out of him."

Still, Baffert was pleased that American Pharoah showed grit and did not pack it in, as stablemate Bayern has done at times, when things didn't go his way.

"It was one of those things where he didn't embarrass us," Baffert said. "If he would have stopped and run fifth, sixth, seventh, you could have scraped me off the track. I would have been so mad at myself for bringing him. He ran a good race."

"It was exciting, the whole town, Pharoah to go, everybody. Last night, I kept running into people and all they could say was thank you for bringing him. The horse has done so much for the excitement of racing, building it up. It was actually one of the most positive losses I've ever seen. We walked into a restaurant last night and everybody gave me a standing ovation for bringing him up. It was pretty cool."

American Pharoah showed the effects of a demanding race, Baffert said, and was blowing hard when he return to be unsaddled. But Baffert said the colt recovered quickly and had cooled out in 10 to 15 minutes. **cont. p4**

The Travers loss ended an eight-race winning streak that began last summer at Del Mar. This year, American Pharoah returned from an injury to win twice at Oaklawn Park, sweep the Triple Crown and after a short rest won the Haskell.

"He has been doing the impossible," Baffert said. "Sometimes, you feel like he's invincible, but they all get beat. Sometimes it makes it feel like they're invincible. He looked great today. There's no horse that's ever done it like he's done it. I've never had a horse that could bring performance after performance after performance. I've had horses throw a big performance, but they can't keep it going. He almost did it."

KEEN ICE DOING WELL AFTER TRAVERS

The morning after winning the GI Travers S. with Keen Ice (Curlin) trainer Dale Romans noted that the victory was one of the most exciting and overwhelming

and overwhelming of his career. "It's been overwhelming since last night," he said while standing outside the barn and still soaking in post-race glory. "I've been in a lot of big events and won a lot of big races, but the lingering effect of this one is bigger

than [winning] the Preakness or any of them. I had so many calls my phone froze up and I haven't been able to use it since last night. I finally got it working late this morning. I know everybody thinks I'm ignoring them, but it wouldn't work."

Romans, who spoke to Bob Baffert for a half hour Saturday night, commended the trainer for his sportsmanship and class.

"I think American Pharoah ran his race," said Romans. "His speed figure was really good. Bob is a class act and a sportsman. He was proud of his horse, as he should have been. He knew what he was up against coming over here. I thought he had his horse well prepared and that he ran well. He took the worst of it getting hooked on the lead and had to work. But great horses have to earn it. They have a target on their back."

Romans continued that Keen Ice appears to be well after his run, although he was understandably tired after the taxing affair. **cont. p5**

"He's in good shape," said McLaughlin. "He certainly put in a good effort; it just wasn't exactly the game plan. I was excited at the quarter pole, we were head and head. I thought maybe we were going to get lucky again, but it didn't work out. He ran a big race."

After regular rider Joel Rosario was injured two races before the Travers, Jose Lezcano was tapped to ride the gray.

"It's so tough to lose your jockey 30 minutes before the race," McLaughlin continued. "Joel has been working him since March and knows him so well and rides him so well. We didn't want to engage [American Pharoah] that early but Jose rode him well. It was unfortunate for us and maybe for American Pharoah, too."

McLaughlin added that Frosted could make his next start in Belmont's GI Jockey Club Gold Club Oct. 3.

Texas Red Exits Travers Fine

Although GI Jim Dandy S. winner **Texas Red** (Afleet Alex) finished a disappointing fifth in Saturday's GI Travers S., there doesn't seem to be anything the matter with the bay colt.

"He seems good," Julie Clark, trainer Keith Desormeaux's Saratoga-based assistant, said Sunday. "He certainly left us with a few questions after yesterday. I mean, they don't fire every time but we obviously expected a very different effort out of him. There's nothing obvious, we even had a vet take a look at him and didn't find anything. I guess we've got to chalk it up to 'just not his day,' which is great, but disappointing at the same time."

We've got some big races ahead this fall, probably one prep before the Breeders' Cup. It could be the [GI] Zenyatta [S. Sept. 26] at Santa Anita. But this is a nice stepping off point. If we go east, we'll stay east. We'll keep a check on the older mares (with a wink toward Beholder's barn), look at the scoreboard and see what's up. She's won four graded stakes this year and is undefeated in California, so we're really happy with her."

It's been a few months since Valid last saw the winner's circle in Gulfstream's GIII Fred W. Hooper S. Feb. 7, but he's run well this summer. He finished second in the Majestic Light S. May 23, completed the

trifecta in the GIII Salvator Mile behind Bradester July 5 and recently was runner-up to that foe in the GII Monmouth Cup. The 3-1 chance to turn this time, Valid was away well and sat in the two path just off the pace around the clubhouse turn and tugged up to

press the leader down the backstretch. He poked a nose in front after the opening half as Bradester moved up the outside to add pressure. Valid began to inch clear of that rival on the final turn and opened up down the lane for the victory.

"We had a few rough trips in the last couple of races, so it was nice to get this one," said winning trainer Marcus Vitali. "[Jockey] Nik [Juarez] gave him a great ride. This horse is a real fighter and we didn't want to let the horses in front get away."

Emerging as a force at this level last term with victory in Saint-Cloud's G2 Prix Corrida over 10 1/2 furlongs in May, Siljan's Saga upped her game again on her next start when a head and a short neck third behind the subsequently disqualified Spiritjim (Fr) (Galileo {Ire}) and Noble Mission (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. Seventh in Longchamp's G1 Prix Vermeille over 12 furlongs in September and 12th in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, the dark bay was sent back there a third

time and was a touch unlucky to be only fifth in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak over 15 1/2 furlongs in late October. Returning to be eighth in the 10-furlong G3 Prix Allez France at Chantilly Apr. 27, she was fifth behind Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) in the latest renewal of the Prix

Corrida back at Saint-Cloud May 29 prior to a confidence-boosting conditions win over a mile and a quarter at Vichy Aug. 18. Anchored with one behind early by Pierre-Charles Boudot as last year's winner Cocktail Queen led, Siljan's Saga arrived between that rival and the rail-runner Loresho in the straight and, after gaining the edge 150 meters from the line, asserted for a career-best success. For trainer Jean-Pierre Gauvin, the landmark win represented a triumph of persistence over a run of ill fortune. "She is a mare that we all know is soft ground-dependant and since finishing second in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud last year has not met this type of going, plus we have also had a virus in the stable," he said. "She was back in good shape last time for a perfect prep for this and showed her true quality today. As for the future, we can be ambitious again and run her in the [Oct. 4] Arc, where she ran decently last year considering she had a bad draw and the ground was totally against her. It all depends on if it rains or not."

A DAY AT SEOUL RACE PARK

Because of the last-minute nature of the trip, I didn't really have any preconceptions about the Korean racetrack experience. Had I thought about it, I probably would have been somewhat skeptical. Their racing isn't where ours is, or where Europe's is, and so why wouldn't their racetracks and fanbase reflect that?

Whether I thought about it or not, I left Seoul Race Park on Sunday evening, the pink sun dipping into the mountains behind the track's grandstand, both

impressed and inspired.

To be sure, I wasn't expecting 50,000-strong crowds, diverse in income and age and enthusiastic about the sport. Or at least betting on the sport. I wasn't expecting a sprawling, relatively modern track with seating-*seating*-for

77,000. And I wasn't expecting the grounds to be so well planned out and aesthetically appealing.

I came to Seoul last Wednesday to cover the Asia Challenge Cup, held Sunday, on the invitation of the Korea Racing Authority (and with an assist from the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association's Chauncey Morris). And I'll leave with a much different perspective. It would be no surprise to me if, in 20 years, Korea is hosting a carnival in the vein of Hong Kong's International Races. Or if its breeding industry is routinely producing horses capable of winning on the world stage. It will take money, hard work and vision, but the foundation is being laid as we speak.

That was evident walking around Seoul Race Park yesterday. It's a grand facility, made up of two separate grandstands that sit next to each other. Walk out onto the apron and there is tiered seating where fans set up for the day. That's if they don't arrive in time to land the plum spots on the big squares of artificial turf that are interspersed the length of the grandstand. **cont. p12**



I admit, it doesn't sound that appealing on paper, but hundreds of families spread out blankets were having a great time, and it seemed to me something that might work great at Belmont Park.

At the end of the grandstand nearest the far turn is a series of statues, fountains and little parks. A bronzed mare and foal sip from a pool as children romp by; another installment has a band of wild horses leaping over a water feature. Speaking of which, it's hard to beat the one that comes into view as you walk down

the back side of the grandstand toward the huge sunken walking ring. It's a four- or five-story, man-made waterfall crafted from a rock outcropping.

The walking ring itself provides thousands of spectators great views of the horses warming

up, and as the jockeys get a leg up, many of the saltier regulars yell down unsolicited advice, much like the guys that line the paddock at Aqueduct in the winter. ("Advice"--ie. don't blow this ride like you did the last one--is really a euphemism here, isn't it?)

Inside, both the northern and southern grandstands have six or seven floors, and I didn't walk around one area that wasn't crowded. Adjacent to the spacious suite where the international guests were being treated to a huge buffet was the owners' section, which had the feel of a private club. Well-heeled older gentlemen and their serious-faced wives sat around tables in leather chairs and handicapped the races.

On the other side of the guest suite, accessible by a windowless door and monitored to keep the riff-raff out of the owners' area, is a huge open space that resembles a convention floor with maybe a hundred round tables set up. Fans pay about \$10 each to be in this area, which is lined with TVs and betting windows. As in Hong Kong and Japan, there's no verbal betting.

Tellers take the slip you've filled out, make sure there are no mistakes (for me, there were always mistakes), and register the bet.

The ground floors of the grandstand were more casual, though really, very few people I saw were dressed

up. This wasn't a social event to see and be seen; people were here to enjoy a day out, and to gamble. Here, people sat on the floor and spread out forms before them. You could buy food at various stands, and there was even a mini 7-11 to pick up a soda or whatever.

There are a large number of families here at the track with young children. One reason, normally at least, is because the infield holds a massive, tree-lined, horse-themed park, where kids can go on pony rides and whatnot. The park is currently closed now, however, and isn't set to reopen for another year or more. There are still plenty of activities for children, though. On the backstretch, there's a small, kid-friendly Museum of the Horse that includes items such as first-century earthenware relics (of horses), antique bronze stirrups, and even several horse skulls. Because what kid doesn't like skulls?

As I left Seoul Race Park last night, I thought of the line Alastair Middleton had given me the other day: "The infrastructure is great, the handle is great, the racing is developing. There's a long way to go, but we're certainly moving in the right direction."

Korea is moving in the right direction. And they're doing it quickly.

AM-BRED GIVES KOREA FIRST CUP WIN

Nam Ki Tae's **Choegang Schiller** (Artie Schiller) looked like the best chance to dethrone reigning champ **El Padrino (NZ)** (Mr. Nancho {Arg}) in Sunday's \$340,000 Asia Challenge Cup, and the locally trained gelding came up big for the home team to post the slight upset in the 1200-meter international event at Seoul Race Park. Foreign-trained horses won the first two editions of the Cup, including a smart victory by El Padrino 12

months ago, and winning trainer Ji Young Hun said he was thrilled his runner could secure an initial victory for Korea. "I ran second a year ago [with Wonder Bolt, 7th this year], so I'm really, really happy with this win," he said. Ji said he thought Choegang Schiller was coming into the race in top form, "but I was very concerned about El Padrino."

Hustled from post five under jockey Lee Chan

Ho, Choegang Schiller angled in behind the sophomore colt **Cheon Gu** (Old Fashioned) and **Super Gangja** (Simon Pure) and tracked that dueling pair in the early stages. The latter began to fade in upper stretch and Cheon Gu drifted a touch, giving Choegang Schiller enough room to slip past to his inside. Choegang Schiller began to lengthen away 200 meters out, and while El Padrino kicked into gear down the middle of the track and made up good ground late, victory was already secure as Lee stood in the irons and pointed to the sky with his stick.

Choegang Schiller was making his sixth start of the year. He won a Class 2 event on debut back in January, then added a Class 1 two starts later in May. He came up a nose short to the good local horse Watts Village (Forestry) in the Mun-Hwa S. at Seoul July 12.

From the extended family of Chris Evert and Winning Colors, Choegang Schiller is the second stakes winner bred out of Changeable by the Clay family's Runnymede Farm. Runnymede also bred the stakes winner and Grade II performer Savvy Hester (Heatseeker {Ire}).

In the other feature on the day at Seoul, the 5-year-old **Chief Red Can** (Fantasticat) won the 2000-meter KRA Cup, a local Group 3, for trainer Park Chun Seo. Bred in Maryland by Carol A. Kaye, Chief Red Can defeated **Clean Up Cheonha** (El Corredor) by three lengths.

Ed Lewi Passes Away:

Ed Lewi, the clever public relations maestro, who was instrumental in the return to prominence of the Saratoga Race Course, died Aug. 29--Travers Day--at Saratoga Hospital.

A moment of silence was held at the upstate New York track prior to the start of Saturday's program.

Lewi, 81, was born New Year's Eve in nearby Schenectady, N.Y. and for a time was a sports writer when he was in high school. He found his way into marketing and promotions at the *Albany Times Union* newspaper, where he spent 18 years, and worked part-time in his own business, which became Ed Lewi Associates.

An imaginative, enthusiastic man with a great sense of humor, a ready smile, countless stories and remarkable contacts, Lewi was known for staging wacky, attention-getting events. Lewi hatched the ideas and his wife and business partner, Maureen, handled the details.

The Lewises were close friends with Marylou Whitney, the socialite, philanthropist and horse owner who has been an important figure in Saratoga Springs for nearly 60 years.

"He helped put Saratoga on the map," Whitney said. "Saratoga is the place it is today because of Ed Lewi."

Whitney and Lewi are credited with coming up with the idea of calling Saratoga "the August place to be."

Times Union writer Paul Grondahl co-authored Lewi's 2014 memoir "A Wild Ride: Bears, Babes and Marketing to the Max." In the paper's news story about Lewi's death, Grondahl wrote that Lewi "was a practical joker known to promote events with outsized props, including dancing bears, voluptuous women in bikinis and what he claimed was the world's largest top hat. He referred to himself as 'a ringmaster to the media circus.'"

Through the decades, Lewi's firm grew into a regional powerhouse, whose major clients included the New York Racing Association, the Saratoga Performing Arts Center, the Great Escape amusement park in Lake George and Price Chopper Supermarkets. Lewi was the media director at the 1980 Winter Olympics at Lake Placid and he spent a lot of time that February explaining how the organizing committee was dealing with transportation issues.

Lewi's firm, now owned by longtime employee Mark Bardack, has handled marketing and promotions duties at Saratoga Race Course since the 1970s. When Ed Lewi Associates was hired by NYRA, Saratoga was starting to recover from two tough decades following the closing of the last of the illegal casinos. The city had a worn look and the summer race meeting was nowhere near as popular as it is today.

Lewi helped develop a number of innovative promotions which continue today, including the annual hat contest, ice cream eating contest and a number of festivals and other events and activities that shined a spotlight on the Spa.

Recently victorious in the course-and-distance Coronation Cup S. facing sophomores Aug. 3, she was tabbed as the heavy favorite in this spot and did not disappoint. Lady Shipman was away from the gate in good order and took back to track a hard-sent Tahnee (Where's the Ring) through a quarter-mile in :21.86. Sent up to seize control on the turn, the filly showed her talent as she romped home well clear of the classy Free as a Bird. The final time of 1:00.46 eclipsed the previous track record of 1:00.66. The winner has a juvenile full-sister, Just Talkin. "She was impressive today and she's been pretty impressive every time, to be honest," said winning trainer Kathleen O'Connell. "She seems like she's always got more in the tank. She handles herself well, especially for a 3-year-old. I asked Irad [Ortiz Jr.] to use his own judgment. He's a good rider. She sat off the pace [in the Jan. 27 OBS Sprint S.], so it's not like she has to be in front. She's got a great mind. Amerman Joins WHOA:

John Amerman, co-founder of Amerman Racing, LLC, and member of the California Horse Racing Board, Board of Stewards of The Jockey Club, trustee of the Breeders' Cup and Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, has joined WHOA. "Over the years, I have been involved and been a member of many national and state racing organizations, Amerman said. "As hard as everyone has worked, it has become obvious that Thoroughbred racing cannot improve the American public's perception on its own. We have tried many approaches. None has worked satisfactorily. We need to take a new path. I was impressed hearing about an approach that utilizes the United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA) at the recent Jockey Club Roundtable. The experience of USADA in bringing high standards in testing and enforcement to Olympics and other sports appears to be applicable to thoroughbred racing. There is evidence from other sports that integrity and a level playing field can be a major building block to increase interest with existing fans, bettors and the public. This is why [wife] Jerry and I enthusiastically support WHOA, The Jockey Club, and others, in their efforts to appoint an outside, independent agency, like USADA, that has an objective of creating a sport that can hold its head high and say we are drug free."


