



**WAR FRONT STARS AT KEESEP OPENER**

A trio of yearlings by Claiborne Farm resident War Front sat atop Monday's opening session of the Keeneland September Sale, which saw solid overall trade. A total of 150 head changed hands for gross receipts of \$44,642,000, yielding an average of \$297,613. The median price Monday was \$265,000. With a slightly smaller Book 1 catalogue this year conducted over three days rather than the four it was in 2014, comparative statistical analysis is somewhat difficult, but last year's cumulative Book 1 average was \$300,535 with a median of \$240,000. The RNA rate Monday was 31.19%. It was 27.71% during last year's first session, and 27.3% overall for Book 1.

"The buyback rate ticked up a little bit, but everything else was very positive," offered Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "It was good from start to finish with a good cross-section of buyers. The number of million-dollar horses was the same as last year in the first session. There was very active bidding on all sides. We always talk about Book 1 as horses that are highly prized, and they're also highly prized by their owners who aren't afraid to race them--they're just as selective themselves."

Topping all returns Monday was [hip 116](#), a War Front filly purchased by Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Company, Ltd. for \$1.45 million. Purchased in utero by Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm for \$5.2-million at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton November sale, the daughter of Irish Group 3-placed Betterbetterbetter (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was consigned to the sale by Wayne and Cathy Sweezey's Timber Town.

"It's great to see Mandy Pope, who has invested a lot of money in the horse business, now recouping some of that investment," Russell said of the topper.


Twelve horses were purchased for \$600,000 or more by 10 distinct buyers.

Of the buying bench, Russell added, "There was good Japanese presence here. It was good to see [Shadai Farm's Teruya] Yoshida, who hasn't been here in many years. There was a very strong European presence, with John Ferguson and Shadwell at the top of the list, so overall I thought it was very good."

Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor John Ferguson was leading buyer with 15 horses purchased for \$6.3 million, while Taylor Made Sales Agency led all consignors with 27 yearlings grossing \$8,695,000.

"So far we've had positive reactions," Russell said when asked about the tweaked format. "When we announced it to our consignors, and we talked to the buyers at the same time, they were all very much in favor of it. Our goal here is to try to put as many horses in front of buyers that we possibly can. Both consignors and buyers felt that last year on the Thursday there wasn't enough for them to do, and they want to be kept going. By adding horses on the first three days and getting all the horses on the grounds for Book 2, it keeps everybody going and the momentum going."





Betterbetterbetter with this filly in utero for \$5.2 million at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton November sale.

Asked what he liked about the yearling, Nichols said simply, "Everything." He added, "It's a great page. She is a very nice mover. She has everything."

Betterbetterbetter, group-placed in Ireland, is closely related to Irish Group 1 winners Yesterday (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Quarter Moon (Ire) (Sadler's Wells).

Nichols admitted the filly would most likely join Sheikh Hamdan's European division.

"I think you could go either way with her," Nichols said. "Sheikh Hamdan likes to see them run and he can do that easier in England. She's awful pretty. He might want her pretty close where he can keep an eye on her."

Betterbetterbetter was one of a bevy of high-priced broodmare purchases Pope has made in the last three years. After watching the first product of that buying spree bring seven figures Monday, Pope was ecstatic.

"It's a dream," she said while smiling broadly. "This is harder to do than to spend the money to buy one. To actually sell one that you raised. It's a fantasy. It's surreal right now that I've actually done this--with the help of a lot of people. Just to get the program off to a good start is very exciting."

According to Pope, the yearling has a personality to match her seven-figure price tag.

"She has a bit of an attitude," Pope said. "She's her own girl. When she was here being shown, she and Wayne kind of developed a love affair. Wayne showed her because she liked Wayne and she did anything he wanted her to do. So she has a lot of personality, as does Betterbetterbetter." **Cont. p4**



Among Pope's high-profile purchases was the \$10-million Horse of the Year Havre de Grace and \$4.2-million GI Kentucky Oaks winner Plum Pretty. Pope's game plan is to keep fillies and sell colts, but basic economics and this filly's international appeal led to the decision to send her through the September sale ring.

"I need to sell some to recoup some of the money that I put into this," Pope explained. "Obviously, the easiest way would be to sell the Tapit filly out of Havre de Grace, but I wasn't going to do that. This filly needs to go to England and I don't race in England. That's not what I do. So she needed to be in different hands than mine. She has a very international pedigree and grass is going to be her thing like the rest of her family and I think she is getting the best of homes. Hopefully she'll be a superstar over there."

Betterbetterbetter did not get in foal last year, but is now in foal to Tapit.

**Evans Sets the 'Tone'...**

A War Front filly consigned by Lane's End, agent was the first yearling to reach the seven-figure mark Monday afternoon when Robert 'Shel' Evans--who campaigns GI Belmont S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup hero Tonalist (Tapit)--went to a cool \$1 million for the dark bay miss.

"I love War Front, and I love the female family," Evans said of [hip 99](#). "I was afraid she'd go for that," he admitted, saying his plans for the filly are "To race her... and then breed her to Tonalist."

Tonalist is currently being pointed by trainer Christophe Clement towards a Jockey Club title defense Oct. 3.

Patrick Lawley-Wakelin was alongside Shel Evans out back during the bidding process.

"She was a lovely individual," said the

veteran agent. "We really liked her. She's got quite a bit of leg underneath her, and she's something like what we've been looking for. Shel loves the family--how can you not love the family? It's a really special one, and I think we've bought a special filly."

Hip 99's fourth dam is blue hen Courtly Dee. Her second dam is MGSW Atelier (Deputy Minister), while her Grade II-winning third dam Aishah (Alydar) is a full to 1983 champion 2-year-old filly Althea. Aishah also produced GISW Aldiza (Storm Cat).

Garrett O'Rourke's Breffni Farm purchased hip 99's unraced dam Azzedine (Mr. Greeley) for \$150,000 at the 2012 Keeneland January sale. Her first foal Assoulin (Candy Ride {Arg}), runner-up twice this year as a juvenile for Gainesway Stable and conditioner Wesley Ward, was a \$160,000 KEESEP yearling 12 months ago. Azzedine produced a Candy Ride colt early this season, and was bred back Exchange Rate.

"That was a great price, we thought," said Lane's End's Bill Farish. "We weren't really sure what to expect this early in the sale, but obviously the War Fronts are selling well and she sold very nicely." -[BDiDonatoTDN](#)

**Claiborne Stallion 'Front's Keeneland...**

Off standout sales in 2013 and 2014, War Front further solidified his status as one of the top standout commercial stallions in the world. Last year, War Front was responsible for the sales-topping \$2.2 million colt, and another to surpass the million-dollar mark at \$1.3 million, both of which went to Coolmore. The topper, named Air Vice Marshal, has one win under his belt and was recently runner-up in the G2 Superlative S. at Newmarket in July, while the \$1.3 million-purchase, since named Schubert, is unraced. **Cont. p7**

War Front struck the front again this year, and claimed the top three prices during Monday's opening session with [hip 116](#), a filly that went to Shadwell for \$1.45 million; [hip 99](#), a filly that was purchased by Shel Evans; and [hip 106](#), a colt that went to John Ferguson. [Hip 110](#) RNA'd for \$825,000. The son of Danzig is currently ranked 19th on the North American general sires list, and Claiborne's Walker Hancock expects the sire's popularity to continue to grow.

"It's only going to go up," Hancock said of War Front's success. "He's just starting to get to the really good mares. We've slowly raised the stud fee over the past few years and the weanlings now are [off a fee of] \$150,000. The yearlings now are from \$80,000-mares, where last year's were \$60,000-mares, and that's a big jump from where he was when he started with \$12,000-mares. You're only going to see the quality go up, so it's not surprising he's having such a good sale."

In total, seven War Fronts sold during the session for a total of \$5,155,000 for an average of \$736,429. The median price was \$600,000.

War Front's popularity has been bolstered by another strong year on the track, with 11 stakes winners on the year. Juvenile Air Force Blue, who went to Coolmore for \$490,000 at last year's sale, was victorious in the G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. and Sunday's G1 Vincent O'Brien National S.. His Lemon Drop Kid half-brother went to Shadai for \$535,000 during the session.

Other graded winners on the year include Departing, War Dispatch, Jack Milton and War Correspondent.

"It's not bad having a Keeneland graduate by War Front, because you can win two Group 1 races in Ireland, one of which we sponsor ourself," said Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell. "So it's good for War Front, and it's good for everybody." [@JSeverniTDN](#)

**Ferguson Busy During Day One...**

War Front continued his roll of high-priced yearlings Monday when [hip 106](#), the first colt out of Bauble Queen (Arch) was knocked down to bloodstock advisor John Ferguson for \$900,000. He was consigned by Claiborne Farm.

"He's an athletic horse from an excellent farm in Claiborne that's raised more champions than you can remember," Ferguson offered. "And, obviously, the sire is doing very well, so I'm happy to have him."

The Apr. 7 colt is out of GII Robert J. Frankel S. winner Bauble Queen, whose third dam, By Land By Sea, was a multiple Grade I winner. Upon retirement from the track, Ramona Bass purchased Bauble Queen for \$650,000 at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton November Sale. **Cont. p8**

Hip 106 was the mare's first foal and she also has a War Front weanling.

"We're thrilled," Bass said. "The best part is we have a full-brother weanling on the farm. It's great. It's her first foal so it's hard to tell what he'd bring, but it's great."

"He's a very nice colt, and we're very happy with the sales price," Claiborne's Walker Handcock added.

The War Front colt was one of 15 yearling purchases by Ferguson Monday. A colt by Medaglia d'Oro led early returns during the session when selling for \$875,000 to Darley's bloodstock advisor. The yearling ([hip 49](#)) is the first foal out of Afleeting Lady (Afleet Alex), who won the 2012 GII Falls City H. The mare is a half-sister to GI Preakness S. winner Shackelford (Forestry) and to GI Alabama S. winner Lady Joanne (Orientate).

"It's a serious pedigree from a serious farm," Ferguson said of the colt's appeal. "He is a beautiful-looking horse, so fingers crossed he'll be a nice horse. He's just an athlete. He wasn't the biggest, but they don't have to be."

Afleeting Lady, with this colt in utero, RNA'd for \$2.7 million at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton November sale. The yearling was bred by Alpha Delta Stables and Colts Neck Stables and was consigned to the September sale by Mill Ridge Sales.

"John Ferguson and Sheikh Mohammed have been such supporters of the entire industry over the years, so anytime we sell a nice horse to them it's most meaningful to us," said Mill Ridge's Headley Bell. "He had 12 scopes, so there was a lot of interest in the horse and a lot of the proper people were interested in him. I valued him probably \$750,000 to \$1.25 million coming in, so it was right on the money. He was a proper individual and you've got to bring a proper horse into this market or you won't get done what you need to get done."

Bell acknowledged the market was still finding its way early Monday.

"It's early days, so the market is just finding its footing right now," he explained. "But this horse was a good example. If you bring a good horse in here there is good money. Again we had a lot of interest in him and that was a very fair sale--that is a huge piece of paper and a really proper horse. I think if he sells tomorrow, you might get \$1.2 million. I think you'll get some momentum with this market. We broke the ice on that. The next one will be \$1 million."

Just four hips after signing the ticket on the Medaglia d'Oro colt, Ferguson was back in action again, going to \$400,000 for a son of Lemon Drop Kid. Consigned by Indian Creek, [hip 53](#) is out of Agreeable Miss (Speightstown) and is a half-brother to Sheikh Hamdan's stakes-placed sophomore Faydhan (War Front).



The yearling is out of Compelling (Ire) (Kingmambo) and was consigned by Reiko and Michael Baum's Man O' War Farm, which purchased the mare in foal to Montjeu (Ire) for 325,000gns (\$520,358) at the 2012 Tattersalls December sale.

Juddmonte's unbeaten champion Frankel had his first yearlings go through the sales ring at the Arqana August sale, with six of his progeny selling for a total of €3.4 million, including a top price of €1.15 million.

Merry agreed Frankel's first U.S. offering likely would have brought more money at a European auction.

"Americans like a big strong horse," Merry commented. "He was only 15.1 and a half. He was a nice medium-sized horse. I think if he had been another inch bigger, he would have made a lot more money. He's a horse that looks like he'll develop and end up a lovely size."

Merry continued, "The Frankels at the moment, there have only been a handful through the ring and obviously, the currency is a big help when you convert to sterling. That's got to be a help. But half a million is no bargain in anybody's money."

In addition to the four yearlings by Frankel expected to sell this week at Keeneland, Merry said he is finding more European pedigrees in the American catalogues as U.S. breeders look to restock broodmare bands depleted by foreign sales over the last two decades.

"I've noticed in the catalogue now there are more and more European pedigrees starting to creep back in," he said. "Americans are coming to Europe and buying and taking it very seriously to get back in to the international pedigree market again. Because there is no doubt over the last 20 years, the quality of the broodmare band has diminished through exports to Japan and into private hands through the Maktoums and Qatar. So we've seen a big weakening of the female families in the book. And a lot of the more considered breeders are coming to Europe and buying mares back to rejuvenate and get some new interesting outcrosses in." [@JessMartiniTDN](#)

**OPENING DAY**

At last year's Keeneland September Sale, 473 yearlings (62.1% of the 762 catalogued) sold for a total of \$142,153,000 and averaged \$300,535 in the four-day Book 1. That means, if Book 1 had been a three-day sale last year, each day an average of 158 yearlings would have sold for \$47,483,000 to average \$300,000. In Monday's opening session of this year's three-day Book 1, 150 yearlings (62.2% of the 241 catalogued, almost the exact same percentage as last year) sold for a total of \$44,642,000, and averaged \$297,613. So if you compare this year's opening session with one-third of Book 1 last year, the number catalogued and number sold were each down by 5%; the gross was down by

6%; and the average was down by 1%. There are no 'official' figures which will show that comparison, but that's how we assess Monday's results.

Leading sire with more than one sold yesterday was Claiborne's **War Front**, who averaged \$736,429 with seven sold of


11 offered, including the two fillies to bring \$1-million or more. Five of his seven sold are headed for Europe, which wouldn't qualify as a huge surprise. Second on average was Darley's **Medaglia d'Oro**, with seven sold from nine offered, for an average of \$440,714. WinStar's **More Than Ready** had four average \$415,000, while Gainesway's **Tapit** had eight average \$401,785, of 12 offered. He still had 34 more catalogued (before outs) Tuesday and Wednesday, so a lot could happen with that average.

Bet down to half of his morning-line quote, the 4-year-old saved ground near the back of the pack through moderate early splits. Steadily advancing on the backstretch, he tipped out two wide to take control in early stretch and powered clear to post a career high. Da Big Hoss won four of his first 10 starts for breeders Gary and Mary West and trainer Wayne Catalano, including a maiden special weight on the turf at Arlington Sept. 18, a \$50,000 claimer on the main track at Churchill Nov. 21 and an off-the-turf allowance at the Fair Grounds Jan. 17. His final win for those connections came in a \$50,000 tagger at Churchill June 21, from which he was claimed by Maker and Skychai Racing. Stretched to longer distances under Maker's tenure, the chestnut finished second, but was placed first through disqualification in his debut for the Maker barn in a grassy 1 3/8-mile Saratoga optional claimer July 31. Given even more distance next out, he captured the Spa's restricted John's Call S. going 1 5/8 miles on the sod Aug. 26.



Suitably chastened, I therefore need to be careful when discussing the comparative merits of Europe's colts and fillies. No more mentions of "the so-called weaker sex." But it isn't straight-forward is it? After yet another majestic display by the brilliant mare Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) in the G1 Prix Vermeille--her sixth win at the highest level--she surely qualifies as the queen of European racing. Or should that now be king?

By common consent the best of this year's European 3-year-old fillies are a very competitive bunch, capable of mixing it with the colts. This was confirmed by some of the weekend's Group 1 events, including the two controversial contests which provoked lengthy stewards' inquiries. In the G1 St Leger the determined Simple Verse (Ire) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) became the first filly to defeat the colts since User Friendly in 1992, only to be demoted to second. Then Galileo's daughter Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) divided the erratic Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and the hampered Free Eagle (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G1 Irish Champion S., with the half-length she had to spare over Free Eagle no doubt helping Golden Horn keep the first prize.

We also saw Ervedya (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) and Akatea (Ire) (Shamardal) prove too strong for the males in the G1 Prix du Moulin and in a battle between the 3- and 4-year-old fillies in the G1 Matron S., it was the 3-year-old Legatissimo who proved comfortably the best.

The GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf is now the target for Legatissimo, a filly who has endeared herself to me with her rare combination of class, toughness and versatility, coupled with an exciting ability to quicken. Her record in her last six starts stands at four wins--three of them at G1 level--and a couple of short-head setbacks. One of those narrow defeats prevented her from becoming the only the second G1 1,000 Guineas winner to land the Oaks since 1990.

Legatissimo is by the former champion sire Danehill Dancer, whose last crop of any size was born in 2013 (his last handful of yearlings include a couple of colts in Goffs' Orby sale at the end of September and a filly in Book 1 of Tattersalls' October Sale). **Cont. p18**

The vendor of Danehill Dancer's daughter, out of a Listed winner by Dubawi, must be happy that the 2015 season has repeatedly reminded us that the female of the Danehill Dancer species is often deadlier than the male. No fewer than five of the stallion's 2015 Group/Graded winners are fillies and among them is Esoterique (Ire), another admirably versatile and talented performer who proved too strong for the males in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois. The female quintet is completed by Waltzing Matilda (GII New York S.), Jazzi Top (GB) (G2 Prix de la Nonette) and Osaila (Ire) (G3 Nell Gwyn S.).

Danehill Dancer never won beyond seven furlongs and originally made his name as a sire of speedy 2-year-olds. However, he proved talented enough to work his way up the stallion ranks, ultimately earning himself a much more classic type of mare than had been the case during his early years at Kilsheelan Stud. The profile of his progeny has changed substantially, with five of this year's seven group winners winning over a mile and a quarter.

Of course Danehill Dancer has sired plenty of good colts, too. Indeed they include those successful stallions Mastercraftsman (Ire) and Choisir (Aus), but the fillies outnumber the colts nine to six among his 15 northern hemisphere Group 1 winners. Legatissimo follows Dancing Rain (Ire), Speciosa (Ire) and Again (Ire) as his fourth female classic winner.

Esoterique had nearly added her name to this list in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches of 2013, when victory was snatched from her in the final strides.

Legatissimo very nearly emulated Dancing Rain's Oaks victory over a mile and a half. It is hardly surprising that she stays pretty well, as her dam, the mile-and-a-quarter winner Yummy Mummy, is a sister to that admirable middle-distance stayer Fame And Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). A G1 winner at the ages of two, three, four and five, Fame And Glory numbered the G1 Irish Derby, G1 Coronation Cup and the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot among his finest efforts.

Legatissimo's second dam, the Shirley Heights mare Gryada, was owned by Plantation Stud, which sold Yummy Mummy for 460,000gns as a 4-year-old. Gryada's dam Grimpola won the German 1000 Guineas and finished third in the German Oaks.

Seven of Grimpola's eight foals were by members of the Mill Reef male line. It was a mating to Slip Anchor (GB) which produced Gonfalon (GB), a three-parts-sister to Gryada. Gonfalon also made a substantial contribution to the family fortunes by producing three Group winners led by Gonbarda (Ger). This dual G1 winner over a mile and a half in turn became the dam of Darley's top-class Farhh (GB) (Pivotal {GB}).

Yummy Mummy is the third of Gryada's daughters to have produced a smart performer. The chances are that this daughter of Montjeu has further good winners in the pipeline. Her yearling filly by Redoute's Choice (Aus) is a three-parts-sister to Legatissimo and she also has a filly foal by Shamardal, sire of last week's impressive G2 Champagne S. winner Emotionless. **Cont. p19**



With nearly 40 group-winning daughters to his credit in the northern hemisphere, Danehill Dancer surely has a bright future as a broodmare sire. Remarkably, though, his daughters--the eldest of them already 16-years-old--had not been represented by a G1 winner until Minding (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) wore down her shorter-priced stablemate Ballydoyle in Sunday's Moyglare Stud S.

To make sense of this, we have to factor in how much Danehill Dancer's fee changed over the course of his career. As I hinted earlier, he started out as cheap speed and his first five years were spent at fees ranging from only IR4,000gns to IR£9,000. Only his daughters aged 10 or under were sired at fees of €40,000 or more and it was his 2008 and 2009 foals which were conceived at his highest published fee of €115,000. It is reasonable to expect that the fillies sired at €115,000 generally have much brighter prospects as broodmares than their counterparts from the cheap early crops. Minding's dam, Lillie Langtry (Ire), was born in 2007, the result of a 75,000-euro fee.

In a Galileo trifecta in the G1 Moyglare Stud S., third-placed Alice Springs also has a dam by Danehill Dancer. Surely it is asking far too much that Galileo will one day enjoy as much success with Danehill Dancer's broodmare daughters as he has with mares by Danehill. Only last week we saw excellent efforts by several representatives of the Galileo-Danehill nick, including at Doncaster, where Bondi Beach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Fields of Athenry (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) took first and third in the G1 St Leger and Gretchen (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) won the G2 Park Hill S.

However, with the youngest of Danehill's daughters being 12-years-old in 2016, the possibility exists that the emphasis will gradually switch to Danehill's granddaughters. Galileo already has group winners out of daughters of Mozart (the Irish 2,000 Guineas and G1 Breeders' Cup Turf winner Magician), Holy Roman Emperor (the 2-year-old Johannes Vermeer, a winner at G3 level last week), Desert King, Rock of Gibraltar and Danehill Dancer.

While Danehill's daughters have so far produced 215 racing-age progeny to Galileo, Danehill Dancer's daughters have 55 foals of racing age by him. They already include six group winners--an impressive 11%--another of them being the Queen's G3 Acomb S. winner Recorder, out of the speedy Memory. Add in two listed winners and that becomes nearly 15% stakes winners, which matches Galileo's percentage with Danehill mares. Another six of the 55 out of Danehill Dancer mares have been group-placed.

This partnership clearly has a great deal to offer, but it isn't fair to make too many comparisons at this stage. Whereas there is one G1 winner among the Danehill Dancer 55, there are now 12 among Danehill's 215 (if Bondi Beach holds on to his St Leger victory at the appeal). Clearly the Danehill Dancer squad needs to produce a few more G1 winners before it can be compared to the Danehill team. **Cont. p20**

Incidentally, Minding's dam Lillie Langtry is also responsible for another of the six group winners - Kissed By Angels, winner of the G3 1,000 Guineas Trial. Lillie Langtry also produced Galileo fillies in 2014 and 2015. Lillie Langtry's record bears comparison with that of Legatissimo, as she too won the G1 Matron S. having earlier become a G1 winner in the Coronation S. And whereas Legatissimo is out of Yummy Mummy, Lillie Langtry is out of Hoity Toity!

Hoity Toity, a cheaply-bought cast off from Gainsborough Stud, never raced but her dam was a half-sister to two Nureyev colts which won G2 races now classified as G1. The first, Lead On Time, took the Prix Maurice de Gheest and the second, Great Commotion, won the Cork and Orrery S. (now the Golden Jubilee S.). Minding's fifth dam, Vive la Reine, was a sister to the brilliant Vaguely Noble, so this is a distinguished female line.

**OSARUS A GROWING FRENCH FORCE**

When it comes to European yearlings sales, the Osarus September Sale is still regarded as the new kid on the block, but it is one which has made plenty of agents and trainers from outside France sit up and take notice over the last few years.

Held at Hippodrome du Bequet at La Teste de Buch just outside Bordeaux, the sale is now in its eighth year and has three stakes-winning juveniles to crow about from last year's edition, which saw the €100,000-mark breached for the first time.

A 2-year-old winner at Royal Ascot is decent currency in any country, and Osarus was given the perfect advertisement when Suits You (Fr) (Youmzain {Ire}) strode to victory in the Listed Chesham S., pipping the much-vaunted Ballydoyle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) en route.

Bought at La Teste by his trainer, the French-based Irishman Eoghan O'Neill, for just €12,000, Suits You has now been sold on to Hong Kong for a presumably handsome profit after winning his first two racecourse starts.

Another inexpensive purchase, Katie's Diamond (Fr) (Turtle Bowl {Ire}), who was bought by English trainer Karl Burke for €18,000 and won the Listed Empress S. at Newmarket in June, along with the Jean-Claude Rouget-trained The Turning Point (Fr) (Hurricane Cat), a stakes winner on home turf and a €23,000 yearling

purchase, are examples of the good value to be found at Osarus's headline sale. The fact that every horse offered is eligible for the lucrative French owners' premiums is an extra lure, particularly for the portion of trainers who are increasingly drawn to making cross-Channel raids in a bid to buffer earnings while British prize-money remains so woefully low.

Its clash with the mammoth Keeneland September Sale may keep some agents and trainers at bay, but an increasing number are making the pleasant pilgrimage to Bordeaux, including Matt Coleman of Stroud Coleman Bloodstock. He said, "I've come down here this year because the sale has had some good results--the likes of Suits You and Katie's Diamond piqued my interest--but also because I've had some luck buying horses with French premiums for British-based owners. I think the quality of the horse here is improving--probably thanks to the investment and marketing by Tattersalls, which has encouraged owners to send better horses here. I'd say there are more British buyers here as than ever before."

Across the next two days, 254 yearlings are scheduled to go under the hammer at Osarus, including 14 from last year's leading vendor La Motteraye Consignment, which set a new benchmark when selling a daughter of Le Havre (Fr) for €130,000. **Cont. p21**

“The sale has improved each year and the complex is much better here now,” says Gwen Monneraye, who runs Normandy-based La Motteraye with his partner Lucie Lamotte. “It’s great to have more choice of sales in France and we like to support this sale. It’s becoming more selective, which is a good thing.”

Haras de la Cauviniere’s Le Havre has been one of the great French stallion success stories of recent seasons, and he has a colt and a filly on offer in the sale, but one of the strongest representations numerically is from his stud-mate, the freshman Rajsaman (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), the busiest new sire in France on his retirement, who has 12 yearlings slated to sell.

Fellow first-season sires Tin Horse (Ire) (Sakhee) of Haras de Grandcamp and Haras du Logis resident Rio De La Plata (Rahy) are also among those on offer, with 10 and five yearlings apiece.

Making a debut appearance as a vendor at Osarus is Charles Briere de la Hossieraye, who operates as the Fairway Consignment and is based in Normandy.

“This is the first time I’ve ever been to La Teste and I’m very happy with the set-up,” said the young consignor, who offered his first yearlings at Arqana in August. He added, “I’ve spent time working in Ireland and America, at Coolmore and with Bill Dwan, and I did three years with Peter O’Callaghan at Wood’s Edge Farm in Kentucky.”

Briere de la Hossieraye is selling two pinhooked colts by Motivator (GB) and Sunday Break (Jpn).

Jean-Claude Rouget, who trains not far from La Teste in Pau, has been a major supporter of the sale since its inception and

bought nine yearlings last year for €232,000. He was again among those inspecting horses on Monday, along with fellow trainers Christophe Ferland, Nicholas Bertran de Balanda, Karl Burke, Giles Bravery and Eve Johnson Houghton, while overseas

agents included Alastair Donald, Liam Norris, William Huntingdon, Johnny McKeever and Paul Moroney.

The sale gets underway today at 12.30 p.m. local time.

**OPPENHEIMER THROWS BC INTO HORN MIX**

G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Coral-Eclipse S. victor **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), who bounced back from a first defeat in the G1 Juddmonte International to take Leopardstown's G1 Irish Champion S. Saturday, could have two more runs this year, according to owner/breeder Anthony Oppenheimer. While the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 4 and the G1 Champion S. Oct. 17 look the likely targets, Oppenheimer did not rule out a trip to Keeneland for the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf Oct. 31.

"The picture as I see it is there are three possible races for him and I think we have to have decent ground," Oppenheimer said. "We can't really give others the advantage. We might get good ground for the Arc, or maybe at Ascot or there is Kentucky to consider. The ideal scenario is we get good to firm ground at either Ascot or Longchamp as, while he is a good traveler, it is a long way to go to America."

Oppenheimer said Golden Horn took his first visit outside his birth country in stride.

"He traveled to Ireland and back by plane for the first time and I think he rather enjoyed it," he said. "When he came home he was quite sleepy, but very happy."

Appleby described Emotionless's romp as "the best visual performance that I have seen by a 2-year-old."

"He has always stood up like a nice horse and has got a great pedigree," Appleby added. "To see a jockey take a pull a furlong out like William [Buick] did on Saturday and have a look between his legs, you could see he had plenty left under the bonnet. At this stage of his career he is the most exciting 2-year-old we've had. Charming Thought went into the [G1] Middle Park as a 25-1 shot while Outstrip won in America [GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf], and as much as we thought he had a great chance he didn't quite have the same sort of profile as this horse."
