

ANGELA RENEE ON TOP AT F-T NOVEMBER

During a frenetic few hours of selling Sunday evening in Lexington, Grade I winner **Angela Renee** (Bernardini) ([hip 152](#))



Angela Renee | Fasig-Tipton

led a parade of 14 mares selling for seven figures when she attracted a final bid of \$3 million during the Fasig-Tipton November sale. The 3-year-old racing or broodmare prospect, a full-sister to multiple Grade I winner To Honor and Serve, was purchased by the Solari family's Don Alberto Corporation. Taylor Made Sales Agency consigned the filly on behalf of her breeder, Siena Farm.

In all, 92 horses sold for \$43,666,000, compared to 108

grossing \$63,678,000 in 2014. The average decreased 19.5% to \$474,630 and the median increased 17.5% to \$235,000. The buy-back rate was 34.3%. It was 28.9% in 2014.

"Overall, I thought we saw a very similar marketplace to what we saw in November of 2014 and it was pretty consistent with all of the sales that we've seen in 2015," commented Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "There was lots of competition for what are perceived to be the highly desirable offerings. Buyers bid with enthusiasm, but still restraint. You don't have the magical breakout situations that we did several years ago. People have some ideas and 'limits' in mind and they adhere to those limits rather than not paying attention to them. All in all, I think it is a fairly rational marketplace. Not any great movement either upward or downward."

The 14 million-dollar mares sold Sunday was dwarfed by the 23 that hit that mark a year ago, but Browning attributed the decline to an exceptionally strong 2014 catalogue.

"It was a deeper catalogue last year," Browning explained. "That's why it is so hard to compare from year to year--particularly with the limited number of offerings we've got. It's hard to compare from one year to the next because the composition changes. We had a remarkable depth last year--just an amazing depth. We had a very good catalogue this year, but we certainly didn't have the depth from 1-25 that we had last year and we kind of knew that going in." **Cont. p3**

KEENELAND NOVEMBER STARTS MONDAY

A brief one day removed from hosting its first Breeders' Cup championships, action returns to Keeneland Monday with the first session of the November Breeding Stock Sale. The first of two Book 1 sessions of the 12-day auction begins at 11 a.m.

"We are very pleased with our catalogue," commented Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "I think there is a lot of depth to the catalogue. We've just come back from the barns and people are busy out there looking at them."

A total of 491 weanlings, broodmares and racing prospects have been catalogued for Book 1, including several with Breeders' Cup updates. The dam of GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Runhappy (Super Saver) will be offered Tuesday, while half-sisters to GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Liam's Map (Unbridled's Song) and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Songbird (Medaglia d'Oro) go through the ring Monday. Also on offer Monday is the dam of GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint third-place finisher Taris (Flatter).

"We hope that the same thing that has happened in the past when the Breeders' Cup was in Kentucky will happen again," Russell said. "When the Breeders' Cup is in Kentucky, it enhances the sale. Having hosted the Breeders' Cup, we hope we have the same benefit this year." **Cont. p17**

ANGELA RENEE ON TOP AT F-T NOVEMBER

Angela Renee's \$3-million price tag topped Sunday's sale, while a year ago, three mares brought that figure or better, led by the \$3.1-million Princess of Sylmar. The 14 million-dollar mares were purchased by nine separate buyers.

After that topper by Darley stallion Bernardini, another Darley stallion, Street Sense, was represented by the next three highest priced fillies--all Grade I winners. Callback (Street Sense) sold for \$2.8 million, Sweet Reason (Street Sense) fetched \$2.7 million and Aubby K (Street Sense) brought \$2.4 million.

Sunday's auction included several high-priced buy-backs, including Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf winner **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy), who was bought back for \$2.95 million. **Tiffany's Honour** (Street Cry {Ire}) was another buy-back at \$2.3 million.

"There are always a few disappointments," Browning acknowledged. "You are going to have, in a mixed sale like this, an emotional attachment with the owners to many of these fillies and mares. They have achieved, in many instances, the highest of highs on the racetrack with them. There is a deep and emotional attachment to those horses and oftentimes there is a reluctance to part with them. I think a few high-priced RNAs are generally the rule rather than the exception in this upper-end November marketplace."

Expensive Date for Empire Maker

The Solari family's Don Alberto Corporation extended to \$3 million to land the FTKNOV sale-topping GISW **Angela Renee** (Bernardini--Pilfer {SW, \$126,360}, by Deputy Minister) Sunday evening in Lexington, Kentucky.

The full-sister to MGISW and promising young sire To Honor and Serve will be heading to leading sire Empire Maker, who was, of course, recently repatriated to Kentucky by Don Alberto in an equal partnership with Gainesway Farm.

"It will be an excellent combination and hopefully she produces beautiful babies for us," Don Alberto advisor Fernando Diaz-Valdes said.

The Siena Farm homebred secured last term's GI Chandelier S. at Santa Anita and was also third in the GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga. Second in this year's GI Central Bank Ashland S. at Keeneland in April, she was unplaced in Saratoga's GI Test S. Angela Renee has bankrolled \$462,000 to date.

Don Alberto currently owns around 85 broodmares, but is still growing with a focus on quality, according to Diaz-Valdes.

"She has everything," Diaz-Valdes continued of Angela Renee's appeal. "She's beautiful and has the best pedigree that you could imagine and also she's a Group 1 winner by Bernardini. What else can we ask for? She's a full-sister to To Honor And Serve, so it made a lot of sense."

Angela Renee is also a half-sister to Elnaawi (Street Sense) (\$500,000 KEESEP yearling), SW & GISP, \$338,885.

Pilfer brought \$1.95 million from Borges Torrealba Holdings at the 2012 FTKNOV sale. Her Bernardini yearling filly realized \$1.5 million from the Zayat family at KEESEP.

Angela Renee was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent XV, as [Hip 152](#).

"I thought it was a good fair price," Taylor Made President & CEO Duncan Taylor commented. "I'm glad Don Alberto got her and I think they may even race her still. I think they bought a great mare from a great family—that's Dynaformer's family down in there. It's an international family that's done well all around the world. She looks like the kind that has the ability to be the bluehen foundation mare. I hope she does that for him." - @SteveSherackTDN

Likely Date with Curlin for Callback

Callback (Street Sense), winner of this year's GI Las Virgenes S. for Spendthrift Farm and trainer Bob Baffert, is headed for a likely date with Horse of the Year Curlin after selling for \$2.8 million to Elevage Bloodstock. Elevage is a partnership between John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm and Glen Hill Farm. The two teamed up to purchase a 20% share in Curlin earlier this year before the stallion relocated to Hill 'n' Dale.

"This was, to us, the best mare in the sale," Glen Hill's Craig Bernick said after signing the ticket. "It's a great family. It's a stallion-making family and, obviously, it's a great female family."

Callback is out of half-sister to GI Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon) and to graded stakes winner Brethren (Distorted Humor). Her third dam, Get Lucky (Mr. Prospector), is the dam of Girolamo and Daydreaming. It is the family of recent GI Spinster S. winner Got Lucky (A.P. Indy).

Spendthrift Farm purchased Callback ([hip 163](#)) for \$375,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton New York Saratoga sale. Second in the GII Santa Ynez S. in her third start, the filly scored by a half-length in the Las Virgenes in January. Disqualified from a win in the Sunland Park Oaks in March, she concluded her career with a runner-up effort in the May 1 GIII Eight Belles S.

"She's was a great race mare," Bernick said. "I watched her race in California. She progressed really quickly and won a Grade I early in her career. I think she got hurt--[Hill 'n' Dale's] Donato Lanni is close with [Baffert] and had some information about how talented she was."

Of Elevage Bloodstock, Bernick added, "We are trying to buy some of the best mares and very good pedigrees and do what we can do to build something long-term. We have some good mares that we would like to breed to Curlin and he is an excellent stallion who gets dirt horses, turf horses, 2-year-olds, fillies. He gets a lot of successful horses and we think he is going to be a very important horse long-term." [@JessMartiniTDN](#)

How Sweet It Is

Japanese buying interests were out in force at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale Sunday night and they didn't spare any of their ammunition when going to \$2.7 million for three-time Grade I winner **Sweet Reason** (Street Sense). Offered by Bluewater Sales LLC, Agent I as [Hip 127](#), the 4-year-old filly was purchased by Katsumi Yoshida ([click for the Thorostride inspection video](#)).

"She is a really gorgeous mare and was a very good racehorse," explained Shunsuke Yoshida, son of Northern Farm's

maestro. "It was a little bit over our budget, but we really wanted her. She is a good looking mare and was a talented racehorse, so I think she will make a very good broodmare."

Out of stakes-placed Livermore Leslie (Mt. Livermore), the bay is a half-sister to Grade III winner Don't Forget Gil (Kafwain), who was also runner-up in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks.

"We liked her pedigree," added Yoshida. "Her sister was also a very good racehorse and [Sweet Reason] is

even better than she was, so we thought she was worth the price."

Regarding Sweet Reason's purchase price last night, Meg Levy of Bluewater Sales added, "When they are that consistent and have won three Grade I's, you think they will bring upwards of \$2 million, but you never know exactly where they will hit. When I saw the marketplace, I was hoping she would get between \$2 million and \$3 million. That was very good. We are very pleased and I'm sure her owner Jeff Treadway is very pleased too."

Purchased for \$185,000 at Keeneland September by Treadway Racing Stable, she took her two initial career outings, including the GI Spinaway S. Conditioned by Leah Gyarmati, the bay finished second in the GI

Frizette S. before closing out her juvenile season with a fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. At three, she added wins in the GI Acorn S. and GI Test S. and was runner-up behind champion 3-year-old filly Untapable (Tapit) in the GI Cotillion S. Sweet Reason retired with five wins from 11 starts and earnings just under \$1.5 million.

"This filly won the Spinaway, Acorn and the Test and that is a pretty amazing feat," said Levy. "The only thing I wish was that her trainer, Leah Gyarmati, was here to enjoy this moment too. Because that's quite a feat for any trainer. She is just an amazing mare. From the time she came to the farm in the summer to the time she walked through the ring, she has just been an amazing mare. She was all class, all racehorse. You could just tell from the time you saw her. She stands about 16.2, but she is so balanced that you don't realize how big she really is until you stand up close to her. She's just an amazing horse. When they're like that, they are just special."

Later in the session, Yoshida also secured [Hip 166](#), Condo Commando (Tiz Wonderful), for \$1.5 million. A three-time graded stakes winner, including victories in the GI Spinaway S. and GII Demoiselle S., the 3-year-old filly was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent XXII. Rounding out Yoshida's purchases yesterday was [Hip 126](#), Sugar Shock (Candy Ride {Arg}). Also offered by Taylor Made Sales Agency (XVI), the four-year-old brought \$360,000.—Christina Bossinakis

Jane Lyon of Summer Wind Farm came to last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale and walked away with the dam of a future Triple Crown winner when she bid \$2.1 million to secure Littleprincessemma (Yankee Gentleman). Lyon was back in action Sunday night in Lexington, purchasing Grade I winner **Aubby K** (Street Sense) for \$2.4 million and **More Hennessy** (Hennessy) for \$1.5 million.

"This year, we are looking to increase our broodmare band," Lyon explained. "We're kind of low due to natural attrition and retirement. So I have a goal, I don't know if I'll meet it, but hopefully we can get some nice mares that are proven this year."

Lyon said the Summer Wind broodmare band currently numbers around 20 head. She hopes to increase that number to 30.

"I think we need more foals," she said. "But I think our goal has always been the same. It has always been to get good mares who can produce and we try to be in the top 5% of the market. We aren't always, but that is our goal. We're small and we will remain small and very involved with our horses."

Aubby K ([hip 155](#)) was the winner of the 2013 GI Humana Distaff S. She sold in foal to Tapit just hours after her first foal, a colt by that leading sire, topped the weanling portion of the

November sale when selling for \$600,000 as [hip 47](#). Lyon admitted the weanling's presence could have impacted Aubby K's final price.

"I think that was why there were quite a few people on her," Lyon said of the weanling. "I think they could see the colt and see what she could produce physically. My son-in-law Mike Malone, who is a fabulous horseman, saw the colt earlier. So it was very important in our decision to

buy this mare."

As for the mare herself, Lyon added, "She is a little more than I had hoped, but she is a lovely mare. We had five on our list and she was at the top. We are very happy to get her."

Aubby K, who raced for breeder James Spence, was consigned by Three Chimneys Farm.

"We're very glad Summer Wind bought her," Three Chimneys' Case Clay said. "She is a beautiful mare and is in foal to Tapit. She has a great temperament and is just pure class."

Barronstown Stud purchased More Hennessy, with Hootenanny in utero, for \$360,000 as part of the Ned Evans dispersal at the 2011 Keeneland November Sale.

Lyon's buying spree continued later in the night when she bid \$1.1 million to secure **Gamay Noir** (Harlan's Holiday), in foal to Tapit. The 5-year-old ([hip 181](#)) was consigned by Lane's End.


Jones Has Faith

Molly Morgan, from the extended family of Canadian champion Wavering Girl (Wavering Monarch), also posted wins in the GII Chilukki S., GII Fleur de Lis H. and GIII Gardenia S. and also owns a pair of Grade I placings. She retired with a record of 29-8-4-8 and earnings of \$882,159.

Bred in Kentucky by Mike Lauffer, Bill Cubbedge and Greg McDonald, Molly Morgan was previously a \$90,000 KEESEP yearling graduate. -@SteveSherackTDN

Bridlewood Making it Count at F-T

Bridlewood Farm didn't step up to the plate all that often Sunday night, but when it did, it certainly made it count. The operation secured two mares for seven figures each during the session. Getting things rolling for the Ocala, Florida operation was [hip 109](#), **Renda** (Medaglia d'Oro), who brought \$1.1 million. Consigned by Bluewater Sales LLC, Agent IV, the stakes winner and graded-placed mare is believed to be in foal to Grade I winner Paynter (Awesome Again). Already successful in the breeding shed, the dark bay is responsible for the ill-fated Rockfall (Speightstown), winner of seven of eight career starts, including the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. and GI Vosburgh Invitational this year. Slated for last weekend's GI Breeders' Sprint, the talented colt broke down during a morning workout and was euthanized prior to that title-defining event.

"It was heart breaking to everyone to lose a horse like Rockfall," explained Bluewater Sales' Meg Levy. "It is kind of bittersweet for us today. It's just a shame [Rockfall] didn't get to run in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, because that might have really rocked the house. He seemed like he was really ahead of his class."

Despite the disappointment of losing the mare's prized pupil before he could achieve the ultimate goal, Levy was pleased with the overall result.

“She is a very classy mare,” added Levy. “I thought she might have been able to bring a little bit more, but I think her owner [Richard Rowan] was happy with her price as well.”

Late in the session, Bridlewood offered one final blow when offering \$1.3 million for [hip 172](#), a member of the Stone Farm consignment. A full-sister to champion 3-year-old filly Untapable and a half-sibling to Grade I winner Paddy O’Prado (El Prado {Ire}), the lightly-raced Double Tapped was sold in foal to Medaglia d’Oro. In September, the 5-year-old’s dam Fun House (Prized), was named the 2014 TOBA Broodmare of the Year.—Christina Bossinakis

Casse in the Black

At several junctures in her life, **Gamay Noir** (Harlan’s Holiday) appeared to be somewhat of a tough sell, having RNA’d for for \$37,000 as a yearling, brought \$15,000 in 2013 and was claimed at Gulfstream Park for \$100,000 last season. However, everything came together for the five-year-old last night when Summer Wind Farm extended to \$1.1 million to secure the graded-stakes winning mare, who was in foal to Tapit. The sale represented a career-best score for the owner-partnership that includes bloodstock agent Justin Casse, who purchased the mare last winter. The mare was consigned by Lane’s End, agent. Retired in 2014 with a pair of Grade III victories under her belt

and \$346,866 in earnings, Gamay Noir—a half-sibling to Peruvian Group 3-placed Serafico (Suave)—is from the extended family of Grade I winners Al Mamoon and La Gueriere. She was offered at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky last February and was snapped up by Casse for \$375,000, the second highest priced offering of that sale.

“I had some friends, who had a season to Tapit, so I was looking for mare that was quality enough to send to him,” explained Casse. “We put together a deal with some partners and put her in foal to Tapit. That was the intention all along, to put her back here in the night of the stars.”

Explaining her appeal at the time of her purchase last winter, Casse offered, “She is very typical Harlan’s Holiday. She has a big hip, just under 16 hands, has a very nice presence and is a really sweet mare. Harlan’s Holiday and Tapit both have some international appeal, so the whole thing kind of worked. It was just the last [breeding stock] sale of the season and I literally bought her with my last bid that day.”

Casse, who indicated this was the first time he had tried his hand at this form of high-end pinhooking, was obviously elated moments after the sale. “I’m completely thrilled with the whole thing,” said Casse. “This is the first time we actually bought mares and bred them. I’ve done some stuff with Becky Thomas in New York and I have bought a few charity seasons, but this is

the first time I have done anything close to this level.”

He added, “I am really trying to diversify my portfolio, like traveling to Europe, I sell at two-year-old sales and I buy mares and put them in sales, so I do just about everything. I was used to doing strictly 2-year-old sales with [trainer] Mark Casse and my dad [Norman], but I need to have income all year long and this is the best way to do it, to pinhook in all different forms.”—Christina Bossinakis

Another RNA for Kitten

Just days after running second in last year’s GI Breeders’ Cup F/M Turf, Ken and Sarah Ramsey’s **Stephanie’s Kitten** (Kitten’s Joy) failed to sell at \$3.95 at the Fasig-Tipton November sale. The mare returned to the Fasig sales ring Sunday a day after becoming a Breeders’ Cup champion for the second time in her career, but the result was the same as bidding stalled just shy of \$3 million.

Ken Ramsey, sitting alongside his wife, admitted he was not disappointed to be taking the gritty mare, who is named after his granddaughter, home.

“I think she is worth at least \$3 million--that’s the reserve I put on her,” Ramsey said. “She didn’t bring it and I’m relieved and happy. I kind of feel like a hero instead of a heel.”

It was Stephanie’s Kitten’s fourth trip through a sales ring and the fourth time the Ramseys have bought her back. She RNA’d for \$30,000 as a Keeneland September yearling and for \$17,000 as an OBS April juvenile before going on to become a multiple Grade I winner on the racetrack.

Asked if this was Stephanie’s Kitten’s final trip through a sales ring, Ramsey laughed, “I don’t make any promises about the future. We always try to keep all our options open.”

As for possible matings for the mare, Ramsey said, “I think Tapit is probably the one to go to. He can produce a Derby horse and he’s the hottest sire in America. I’ll check with Galileo,

too—he’s the best in Europe. We might breed her to Galileo or some big European stallion and race the offspring.”

Another Topper for Tapit

Just over an hour into last night's Fasig-Tipton November Sale, a colt by leading sire Tapit (Pulpit) realized top price for weanling when realizing a \$600,000 final bid. Quickly hitting the half-a-million mark, [hip 47](#) surpassed the top price for a weanling at the 2014 renewal of the sale, when another colt by Gainesway's marquee stallion brought \$500,000. Bloodstock agent Alex Solis III signed the ticket as Mill Valley Racing for the first foal out of Grade I winner Aubby K (Street Sense). The Feb. 20 foal was consigned by Three Chimneys Farm, Agent XVII, who also offered Aubby K later in the evening. Led through the ring as [hip 155](#), the mare, carrying a full-sibling to Sunday night's weanling topper, brought \$2.4 million.

"It was pretty close to what we thought we'd get for him," commented Three Chimney's Chris Baker when asked about the price. "We were pleased with the price. He is a nice colt. It's still early and we're just getting going, but we were happy enough with that."

A daughter of graded-stakes winner Lilly Capote (Capote), Aubby K recorded her biggest victory for her owner James Spence and trainer Ralph Nicks in the 2013 GI Humana Distaff S. at Churchill Downs. The 6-year-old mare is also a half-sister to multiple graded stakes placed Flying Pegasus (Fusaichi Pegasus) and graded stakes placed Mythical Pegasus (Fusaichi Pegasus).

"He is more powerful and precocious than your average Tapit," added Baker. "I think that's what makes him different. I think he's a nice blend of the sire and dam and his overall ability probably favors the mare a little bit, because [Aubby K] is strongly made and has a very big hip on her. He seems to be a little bit more like her, but he appears to be a combination of the two." —Christina Bossinakis

Malibu Moon Fillies to Spendthrift

B. Wayne Hughes's Spendthrift Farm took home the two top-priced weanling fillies, both daughters of Malibu Moon, during Sunday's Fasig-Tipton November Sale. Bidding out back along with farm manager Ned Toffey, Hughes first signed the ticket at \$360,000 for [hip 34](#), out of Grade I winner Starship Truffles (Ghostzapper). He was in action a short while later to secure [hip](#)

[66](#), a full-sister to multiple graded stakes winner Onlyforyou for \$370,000.

After signing the ticket on the first weanling, Hughes was quick to credit his farm manager for picking out the youngster.

"I'd never seen her before," Hughes chuckled. "But Ned told me to [bid]."

Asked what he liked about the filly, Toffey said, "She is a Malibu Moon filly out of a mare who could run. She has a good pedigree and looks like a really, really athletic filly. That's the kind you're looking for."

The weanling is the first foal out of GI Princess Rooney H. winner Starship Truffles (Ghostzapper), who sold for \$1.5 million to Shadai as [hip 121](#). She was bred by Castleton Lyons, which purchased the mare for \$1 million at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Summer Horses of Racing Age Sale, and Kilboy Estates. She was consigned by Paramount Sales.

The filly was the first weanling to break the \$300,000 mark at Fasig-Tipton Sunday and Toffey said that was likely the group's final bid.

"It was all that we were probably going to do, but usually for the nice ones you have to go every bit of what you want," he said.

Consigned by Four Star Sales as agent for her breeder JSM Equine LLC and Greathouse Horse Property LLC, hip 66 is also a full to stakes winner Dress the Part. John Greathouse purchased the filly's dam, stakes placed Erhu (Tactical Cat), for \$50,000 while in foal to To Honor and Serve at the 2013 Keeneland November sale. That To Honor and Serve filly sold for \$450,000 at this summer's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale.

Hughes also gave an upbeat report on his champion Beholder (Henny Hughes), who was forced to miss Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic due to illness.

"Beholder is in her stall at Santa Anita and doing very well," Hughes said.

Toffey confirmed the current plan is to race Beholder in 2016.

"Knock on wood, that's the plan, but in this game everything is day-by-day," he said. "If everything is just right with her, then we'll go on and if it's not, it's time to breed her."

"She reminded me a lot of The Big Beast," admitted Lieblong, seated next to his wife Jo Ann. "He stood out [as a \$150,000 OBSAPR 2-year-old]. We had his older brother [5-year-old] Big Lute (Midnight Lute), who stood out, too [as a \$275,000 KEESEP yearling]. Last year, the mare had a Trappe Shot sell [\$300,000 KEESEP yearling colt] and he was very nice, but he wasn't quite like this one or the 'Beast.' I stayed away from that one, but couldn't stay away this year."

Produced by the stakes-placed V V S Flawless (Deputy Minister), The Factor filly was bred in Kentucky by Heather and Patrick Ford and James M. Herbener Jr. The Feb. 3 foal was consigned as [hip 41](#) by Herbener Jr.

"She'll probably go to Diamond A or Three Chimneys and we'll race her eventually," Lieblong added. "I usually don't buy weanlings; she was the only one that I'd do anything in the weanling market with right now."

As for the pricetag he concluded with a laugh, "I told my wife that she was gonna cost \$350,000."





The sale, which continues through Nov. 13, features a catalogue of 4,476, up from 4,026 a year ago. Russell said the Breeders' Cup at Keeneland may have lured a few more head to the November catalogue.

"We have more horses this year and I think that has come from having people wanting to take advantage of having the Breeders' Cup here," Russell explained. "We have had all these people come to central Kentucky who might not normally come to the November sale and I think sellers wanted to take advantage of that. I think that has stretched out the quality in the first week very much."

The November sale will also feature the dispersal of Nat Rea's Regis Farm. The entire dispersal, which includes GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up Shook Up (Tapit), sells without reserve through Three Chimneys Farm.

A weanling filly by Tapit sold for \$3 million during last year's November sale and this year's catalogue features a bevy of weanlings with mouth-watering pedigrees, including a half-brother by War Front to that record setter.

"Last year we sold the Tapit filly for a North American record and I think that encouraged people to put some really once-in-a-lifetime offerings in the sale," Russell said. "And we have several

once-in-a-lifetime opportunities."

After sessions beginning at 11 a.m. Monday and Tuesday, the Keeneland November sale continues through Nov. 13 with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m.

Triple Crown winner **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) is doing very well following his romp in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, according to conditioner Bob Baffert.

"He came back in great shape," Baffert commented. "He's ready to go around again. He really put on a show yesterday. I knew at the half-mile pole [that he would win big] from the way he was running. The way he was going, he just breaks other horses' hearts. The good horses do that, they just break other horses' hearts."

The Hall of Famer continued, "Yesterday he showed the horse that he is. I know how good he is because I've trained some really good ones. I've had others who were as fast as he is, but they couldn't sustain it. You'll never see a horse travel and ship

like that and win at every track he went to, except for the Travers. His mechanics and his personality are also what set him apart. I'm glad he finally got a track record [in the Classic]. He was ready yesterday."

In what has become a post-race tradition, Baffert brought American Pharoah out to greet the fans and press Sunday morning for the last time. The Classic was the career finale for the Zayat Stables homebred, who will head from Keeneland to Ashford Stud where he will begin his new career.

"He's going to Ashford [Monday] morning," Baffert said. "I will go with him to see him get settled in. We'll be coming to Ashford to see him."

Third-place finisher and "TDN Rising Star" Honor Code (A.P. Indy) was officially retired from racing following his effort in the Classic and will take up stud duties at Lanes End Farm, the home of his famous sire.

"Obviously it's a void in your stable, but I know he's going home healthy," trainer Shug McGaughey said. "He's going to a great place and he's going to get great mares. He's going to be well taken care of."

Following spectacular victories in the GI Metropolitan H. and GI Whitney S., Honor Code is one of the leading contenders for Champion Older Dirt Male.

"His competition would be Liam's Map, and he ran against him once and beat him," McGaughey said of his charge's chances at an Eclipse Award.

Donegal Racing's **Keen Ice** (Curlin), who is the only horse to beat the Triple Crown winner this year when taking the GI Travers S. Aug. 29, finished fourth in the Classic and has returned to trainer Dale Romans's Churchill Downs base. Donegal Racing's Jerry Crawford said a decision would be made within 10 days on whether or not the sophomore would race again next year pending a deal for breeding rights.

"He'll get a little break," Crawford said. "We haven't made the plan going forward yet. We have had a lot of inquiries about stud plans. We'll have to sort that out and see if [a buyer] allows us to race him as a 4-year-old."

Godolphin Racing's GII Pennsylvania Derby winner **Frosted** (Tapit), who finished a close seventh in a blanket finish alongside **Tonalist** (Tapit) and **Hard Aces** (Hard Spun), is headed to Florida and is expected to remain in training next season.

"We were disappointed, obviously," trainer Kieran McLaughlin said. "He trained great. We thought that we could lay second to fourth and maybe American Pharoah would back up, but American Pharoah, congratulations, ran the best race of his life, to me."

McLaughlin was also represented Saturday by GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf fourth-place finisher **Sentiero Italia** (Medaglia d'Oro) and GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint fourth-place finisher **Cavorting** (Bernardini).

Whitney H. The handsome bay retires with a record of 11-6-2-2 and earnings of \$2,518,260.

Being out of Serena's Cat (Storm Cat), a granddaughter of Serena's Song, Honor Code also boasts plenty of appeal on the pedigree side.

"It goes without saying he has the pedigree on both sides," said Farish. "It's an extraordinary pedigree. He's from the last crop of A.P. Indy so we know he's going to get an incredible book of mares and we're looking forward to it."

"When we first saw him, it was an amazing thing," he added. "As a weanling and a yearling he was gorgeous. He reminded us so much of A.P. Indy, and of course being from A.P. Indy's last crop we were particularly taken by him and I don't think I've ever seen a yearling as made, in terms of conformation, as this guy; he was just terrific."

Liam's Map was one of the most visually impressive winners of the weekend, adding the GI Las Vegas Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile to his last-out GI Woodward S. romp Friday after stumbling at the start and being forced to check several times along the way. The fleet gray retires with a record of 8-6-2-0 and earnings of \$1,358,940.

Lane's End announced it had bought into Liam's Map just last week.

"Liam is one of the best-looking horses I think I've ever seen in my life," Farish said of the flashy gray. "With his speed and ability to carry that speed so far, he's got so many good things going for him."

Liam's Map was campaigned by Teresa Viola in partnership with West Point Thoroughbreds and J.J. Crupi, who bought

He's never had a bad day, has never taken a lame step; the only reason he didn't start as a 2-year-old was he popped a little split and Mrs. Viola said, 'Give him all the time he needs, I'm in no rush.' He could have started as a 2-year-old, but he started at three, and you know what he's done since then."

Liam's Map won all but two of his eight starts, finishing second on the other two occasions in his debut at Saratoga last August before romping by 9 1/2 lengths next-out, and behind Honor Code in the Whitney in August. West Point Thoroughbreds' Terry Finley admitted to feeling a sense of deja-vu seeing the two horses arrive at the farm together.

"When I saw them coming off the van together I remembered the Whitney and I told the ambassador, 'I think they'll show that race at Saratoga 50 years from now,' so I thought it was ironic and it was really cool to see them walking into the stallion barn together," he said. "I know the Violas are really excited and they're proud to partner with the Farishes, and I think the sky's the limit for both these stallions."

Pedigree expert John Sparkman was also present, and weighed in on the pages of both horses.

"These are clearly the two best older horses in the country this year," he said. "One of them will be champion older horse, but as far as pedigrees go there's no better pedigree in the stud book than Honor Code's. Liam's Map has a unique pedigree as a son of Unbridled's Song because of the closely inbred second dam, which is a characteristic of pedigrees of great sires going all the way back to Eclipse, so that's something that I think is hard to find these days."

Brown’s three victories in last year’s championships and two this year bring his total Breeders’ Cup wins to seven.

After finishing within a half-length of speedy New York-bred **La Verdad** (Yes It’s True) in Belmont’s GII Gallant Bloom H. Sept. 26, Wavell Avenue came flying late to overtake that rival in the F/M Sprint Saturday.

“Wavell Avenue has really found her niche,” said Brown. “She’s kept improving, getting stronger physically. The plan is she will leave today for New York, Belmont Park, and then we’ll decide what to do with her. She prepared for the Breeders’ Cup over the winter in New York at Aqueduct, and that seemed to work for her. I’m happy for the ownership group, they’re a great bunch of guys.”

Winner of the GII Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf in 2011, Stephanie’s Kitten, who was second to stablemate Dayatthespa (City Zip) in last year’s F/M Turf, stormed from last to first to

take this year’s renewal. Owner/breeder Ken Ramsey decided to keep the dark bay in training this year after she RNA’d for \$3.95 million at last term’s Fasig-Tipton November sale, but she returns to that sale this year as [Hip 123](#).

“Stephanie’s Kitten had a wide trip last year [in the F/M Turf] and Mr. Ramsey could have decided to sell her or send her to another trainer, but he decided to go ahead and stick with the plan and get it right,” Brown said. “Even the horses that didn’t win, Big Blue Kitten and Slumber [third and fourth in the GI Breeders’ Cup Turf] ran their hearts out to two great horses from Europe.”

Seven-time Eclipse winner Todd Pletcher gained two more Breeders’ Cup wins on Friday’s card with ultra-impressive GI Breeders’ Cup Dirt Mile winner **Liam’s Map** (Unbridled’s Song) and GI Breeders’ Cup Distaff heroine **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat) to bring his total championship wins to nine. Eclipse winner Javier Castellano was aboard for both of those victories.

Pletcher’s best finish on Saturday was with royally-bred “**TDN Rising Star**” **Rachel’s Valentina** (Bernardini), who finished second behind a dazzling display from fellow “**TDN Rising Star**” **Songbird** (Medaglia d’Oro) in the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies.

It was disappointing when Rachel’s Valentina finished second in the Juvenile Fillies, but she ran well.”

Pletcher said the Stonestreet Stables homebred would get a 30-day vacation before returning to training at Palm Meadows.

Uzziel transferred into the Keith Desormeaux stable at the start of the year and has since been knocking on the door of



It seems to me that Nyquist is not receiving the credit due him for his Breeders' Cup Juvenile win compared to the filly Songbird in her Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies victory.

While she was the visually more impressive of the two and her final time was faster, the Trakus charts prove Nyquist ran by far the better race.

Songbird traveled a total of 5666 feet([trakus data](#)) in her

1 1/16 mile race, run in 1:42.97. Only one of nine other horses in her race covered less ground than she did. Her average mph for the race was 37.5, peak mph was 41.5 and average mph for final segment was 35.0.

Nyquist traveled a total of 5747 feet ([trakus data](#)) in his 1 1/16 mile race, run in 1:44.02. That is 81 feet farther than Songbird covered! No other horse in his race ran farther than he did. He ran between 22 to 94 feet farther than any of the other 13 horses in his race.

Nyquist's average mph for the race was faster than the filly's, 37.7. His peak mph was faster at 42 as well. The only number inferior to hers was his average mph in the final segment at 34.3, but I expect she would have gone slower at the end too if she had to overcome that much ground loss.

If you just look at the final race times, it looks like she ran five lengths faster than he did. But if a length equals 10 feet, then he ran three lengths better than her.

Please bring this to the attention of your readers. Nyquist ran a spectacular race yesterday. He deserves to be recognized for it!

An also-ran in the Japanese Classics at three, Lovely Day was clearly an unfinished product back then but at the age of five, is now developing into a top-level runner with the ability to snatch some of the country's most important prizes. The winner of the G3 Nikkan Sports Sho Nakayama Kim S. Jan. 4 and the G2 Kyoto Kinen Feb. 15 over 10 and 11 furlongs, respectively, Lovely Day was sixth and eighth behind Gold Ship (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn})

when stepping up 15 and 16 furlongs, respectively, for the G2 Hanshin Daishoten Mar. 22 and the G1 Tenno Sho Spring May 3. The dark bay returned to the winner's circle when dropped back to 10 furlongs for the G3 Naruo Kinen June 6, and earned his first win

at the highest level next out in the G1 Takarazuka Kinen over 11 furlongs June 28. Given a summer holiday thereafter, Lovely Day picked up right where he left off, winning the G2 Kyoto Daishoten over 1 1/2 miles Oct. 12, and this win was his fourth-straight. Racing keenly on the fence in fourth, Lovely Day appeared full of run when moved into the clear at the top of the lane and, after overtaking the front-running Clarente (Jpn) (Dance In The Dark {Jpn}) in midstretch, had enough left in the tank to hold off a cavalry charge that included Staphanos and Isla Bonita. Trainer Yasutoshi Ikee said, "we still have future races to think about so he wasn't completely tuned up, but for a second autumn start, he was in good form. The horse has developed beautifully and has entered his prime. We have the Japan Cup in mind as his next start. We'll carefully prepare him race by race."

FAME UP FOR GRABS IN THE CUP

The Japanese have made no secret of their desire to win the world's most important racing contests, and while they put their name on the Melbourne Cup honor roll in 2006 courtesy of Delta Blues (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}), the nation has two chances to take the Cup--along with the lion's share of it's a \$6 million purse--home once again Tuesday with favorite **Fame Game (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) and **Hokko Brave (Jpn)** (Marvelous Sunday {Jpn}). The 5-year-old Fame Game, campaigned by Sunday Racing, won Tokyo's 3400-meter G3

Diamond S. Feb. 21 before finishing second to the multiple Group 1-winning Gold Ship (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) over this trip in the prestigious G1 Tenno Sho Spring May 3. The bay was making his first start for 167 days when a troubled sixth in the G1 Caulfield Cup Oct. 17, and is not hurt by his draw in gate 12. Hokko Brave finished sixth behind Fame Game in the Tenno Sho and 10th in the Caulfield Cup.

The complexion of the Melbourne Cup has changed more in recent years than perhaps any other race on the planet, with

more internationals than ever hungry to snag the contest and the participation of shippers and imports on the rise. Eleven of the 24 runners are trained outside Australia and a further seven were imported from Europe.

The Coolmore partners won their first Australian major, the G1 Cox Plate, last year with Adelaide (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), and that operation offers up two Aidan O'Brien shippers in the form of **Kingfisher (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Bondi Beach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). The 4-year-old Kingfisher, a stakes winner over 14 furlongs at Leopardstown in Ireland in June, was most recently eighth behind stable companion Order Of St George (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Irish St Leger Sept. 13 while Bondi Beach, a year younger, enters this contest off a pair of seconds: in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York Aug. 19 and in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 12. Coolmore's Tom Magnier told *Racing.com* trainer Aidan O'Brien was unable to split the chances of the two horses.

"Kingfisher's in great order and Aidan's very happy with the horse; he's got a good temperament and I think he'll handle the big occasion," Magnier told the site. "You couldn't ask for two better jockeys to be on the horses in Brett [Prebble] and Colm [O'Donoghue]. The horses have adapted very well to the travel and they're both in great form and I

think they both have great chances. The big thing is it's a Melbourne Cup and we'll need a lot of luck, but we're delighted to be here."

It's been 10 years since trainer Sir Michael Stoute brought a horse to the Melbourne Cup but he returns this year with Khalid

Abdullah's G2 Yorkshire Cup and G2 Hardwicke S. winner **Snow Sky (GB)** (Nayef), who is saddled with top weight. The 4-year-old, who was fifth in the Caulfield Cup, gets the services of Coolmore's number one jockey Ryan Moore, who was riding for that operation at the Breeders' Cup in the U.S. Friday and Saturday and in France Sunday before jetting across the globe to Australia. Stoute said he thinks his runner is capable, but needs to improve off the Caulfield effort.

"I think he's a very suitable horse--he's got top-weight but he's entitled to have that," the conditioner told *Racing.com*. "It's a tough thing to do, to carry the top-weight. I thought [the Caulfield Cup run] was OK, the race just didn't go his way. When he should've been going forward, he couldn't get rolling because he's not an instant accelerator. I thought it was satisfactory but he'll have to improve a bit."

One British trainer who has had plenty of experience at the Cup in recent years is Ed Dunlop, who has sent **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) to three runner-up efforts in four years, including last year. The ever-reliable 9-year-old gelding has not won a race since taking the G1 Hong Kong Vase almost three years ago, but can always be counted on to put on a show on the big stage. He enters this off a second in the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury Aug. 15. Red Cadeaux is this year joined by a stable companion in the form of La Grange Partnership's **Trip To Paris (Ire)** (Champs Elysees {GB}), winner of the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot over Kingfisher June 18. The 4-year-old suffered a pair of defeats when dropped back to this distance for the G2 Goodwood Cup (third) and to 3300 meters for the G2 Lonsdale Cup (fifth), but made an excellent showing when second in the Caulfield Cup, and jockey

Tommy Berry was vocal in his praise of his mount, telling *Racing.com* after exercising Trip To Paris Sunday, "he felt very sharp to me and I think he's definitely come on since the Caulfield Cup.

Full credit needs to be given to Ed Dunlop. He brings these horses from overseas and they're pretty one-paced over there for our type of racing, but when he gets them here he puts speed into their legs."

"He's a very easy horse to ride," Berry added. "He's relaxed and barely picks up the bridle and he sprints when you ask him to and he's very push-button. It's a lot easier riding a horse like him than riding one that you've got to try and get to settle, or try and run out the distance. This horse ticks all the boxes."

Michael Bell, the trainer of **Big Orange (GB)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}), is making his first trip to the Melbourne Cup,

and he is not without a chance to take the prize. Big Orange caused a 25-1 upset when taking the G2 Princess of Wales's Arqana Racing Club S. at Newmarket July 9, and proved that was no fluke when adding the Goodwood Cup July 30. He was seventh behind **Max Dynamite (Fr)** (Great Journey {Jpn}) in both horses' most recent outings in the Lonsdale Cup.

Australia's champion trainer Gai Waterhouse won her first Melbourne Cup two years ago with Fiorente (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}), and

Waterhouse snuck another import by that late great German sire into the field Saturday in the form of **Excess Knowledge (GB)**, who would become Monsun's third-straight winner of the race after Protectionist (Ger)

last year. Excess Knowledge had been second in the Harry White Classic and G2 Herbert Power S. this season prior to Saturday, when he won Flemington's G3 Lexus S., earning an automatic starting spot in the Cup, and he backs up off three days' rest but was dealt a blow at the barrier draw when landing in the extreme outside gate 24. Waterhouse also saddles **The Offer (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who was the early favorite for last year's Melbourne Cup but failed to get to the race. The 7-year-old gelding rewarded his conditioner's perseverance last-out with a win in the G3 Bendigo Cup Oct. 28.

New Zealand-breds have a strong record in some of Australia's most important middle distance and staying races and two expatriots from that country, **Criterion (NZ)** (Sebring {Aus}) and **Preferment (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), have strong chances here. After winning the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at The Championships in April, the four-time Group 1 winner Criterion had a globetrotting spring and summer, finishing third in Hong Kong's G1 QEII Cup before running with credit in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Juddmonte International in Britain. The 5-year-old lifted the G1 Caulfield S. on his return to Australia Oct. 10 and was second in the G1 Cox Plate Oct. 24. Preferment, the winner of last year's G1 Victoria Derby a year ago Saturday, has won the G2 Hill S. and G1 Turnbull S. this season and was ninth in the Cox Plate for trainer Chris Waller.

Magnier was speaking after the two Aidan O'Brien-trained Cup runners, **Bondi Beach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Kingfisher (Ire)**, had breezed on the grass at the

international runners' quarantine center at Werribee racecourse. They timed their run perfectly to allow him to watch Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) down the colors of Golden Horn (GB) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and then race back in to the grandstand to see American Pharoah sign off his racing career in style.


Almost half the field for this year's Emirates Melbourne Cup are trained outside Australia and the 11 international raiders-- from Japan, Ireland and the UK--took turns to strut their stuff during a relaxed and fun morning on the outskirts of Melbourne.

First out was the horse that many Australians would accept as readily as a homegrown winner--**Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), in partnership with his fellow world traveler Steve Nicholson and leading stablemate and G1 Caulfield Cup runner-up **Trip To Paris (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}) in a strong canter on the grass track.

Trainer Ed Dunlop and his wife Becky are now regular travelers

to Melbourne, with this being the fifth time Red Cadeaux has raced in the Cup and his sixth appearance here in total. They were accompanied by a huge team of owners of Trip To Paris, still pinching themselves that their 20,000gns breeze-up purchase has already lifted the G1 Ascot Gold Cup and is now second-favorite to add the Melbourne Cup to his haul.

When asked by a journalist how he would feel if Red Cadeaux were to finish second in the race for a fourth time, Ed Dunlop replied simply, "very proud." He added, "the team is very happy with the horse. He looks well, his weight is good, his coat is good and he loves it here. Robin [Trevor-Jones] and Steve [Nicholson] deserve all the credit for having him in such fantastic condition."

"He's an incredibly popular horse--you know how it is with horses who stay around so long," Dunlop added. "He's as much loved in England as he is here in Australia. I stupidly ran him at Royal Ascot so people could see him but he doesn't like racing there."

The red-hot favorite is Japanese raider **Fame Game (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}), who was keen to go faster than the steady canter his work rider was insisting upon but appeared relaxed in the aftermath as he sauntered around the track for lap after lap. **Max Dynamite (Fr)** (Great Journey {Jpn}) looked rock-hard fit under recently retired jump jockey David Casey, now assistant to Ireland's champion jumps trainer Willie Mullins. This will be Mullins's third attempt at one of flat racing's greatest prizes, but a rookie in Melbourne is dual Classic-winning trainer Michael Bell, who has brought with him his Goodwood Cup winner, the 17-hand and long-striding **Big Orange (GB)** (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}).

Playfully goading his fellow Newmarket trainer Sir Michael Stoute, Bell said as Big Orange stepped onto the track, "here comes the Melbourne Cup winner." Stoute, however, was in a jolly mood himself and proclaimed himself happy with the

morning work of **Snow Sky (GB)** (Nayef), who will carry the number one saddlecloth.

"It's a tough thing to do to carry top weight, but this trip is better for him [than the 12f Caulfield Cup]," he said. "I suppose the statistics are against me, as is the fact that

Ryan [Moore] won it last year. But I'm still happy to have Ryan, however he travels from the Breeders' Cup."

As Melbourne counts down to its famous 'race that stops a nation,' the city center will come to a standstill tomorrow as the annual Melbourne Cup parade makes its way through the streets,

She came into the barn at Keeneland this spring and got a little break during the early summer and has had a really nice fall." The winner's half-brother She Digs Me won Monmouth's GIII Sapling S. as a juvenile and her other half-brother Mylute was runner-up in the 2013 GII Louisiana Derby and third in that year's GI Preakness S. He was most recently second in Belmont's GIII Bold Ruler H. Oct. 31. Stageplay's dam produced a colt by Unbridled's Song last year and was bred to Candy Ride (Arg) this term.
