



PLETCHER FILLIES BREEZE FOR OAKS

Trainer Todd Pletcher put his GI Kentucky Oaks hopefuls through their final major works for next Friday's race with works at Churchill Downs Thursday morning.

First to go at 6 a.m. was King of Prussia Stable's **Mo d'Amour** (Uncle Mo), heroine of Aqueduct's Busher S. and third-place finisher behind Lewis Bay (Bernardini) in the GII Gazelle S. With Amy Mullen aboard and working in company with maiden Noble and True (Giant's Causeway), Mo d'Amour clocked a half-mile in :48.20 (7/22) over a good surface. Fractions for the work were :13, :25, :36.60, :48.20 and a five-eighths gallop-out time of 1:00.60 and six furlongs in 1:13.60.

Next up at 6:40 a.m. was Michael Tabor's **Thrilled** (Uncle Mo), who worked in company with Grade I winner Curalina (Curlin). With Ovel Merida aboard, Thrilled, a last-out heroine of Sunland's Plum Pretty S. Mar. 20, covered five furlongs in 1:00.20 (2/12) with fractions of :13.20, :25.20, :36.60, :48.20 and out six furlongs in 1:14.20.

After the break, Stonestreet Stables' **Rachel's Valentina** (Bernardini), working in company with maiden Caribbean (Harlan's Holiday), drilled a half-mile in :47.80 (5/22) over a track that was upgraded to fast. With jockey John Velazquez aboard, Rachel's Valentina posted fractions of :12.80, :24.80 and :36.40 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:00.80 and six panels in 1:14.20. **Cont. p3**

DEL MAR, STRONACH GROUP OFFER \$1-MILLION 'CALIFORNIA' BONUS






Santa Anita will host the Breeders' Cup for a record ninth time this year.



AT CONGRESSIONAL HEARING, DEFRANCIS EMERGES AS POWERFUL VOICE FOR REFORM

WASHINGTON-A new day, another hearing, a familiar story. That's often been the case over these many years as

reform-minded politicians have held several hearings to discuss efforts to bring reform to horse racing, particularly in the area of drugs. Thursday's hearing of the Congressional Horse Caucus, which has been pushing for passage of the Horse Racing Integrity Act of 2015, didn't exactly crack the mold as it failed to accomplish much in the area of breaking new ground.

But it did feature a relatively new player in the debate over federal intervention and drugs and one who came with a powerful message. Joe DeFrancis, the former chief executive of Pimlico and Laurel

who is currently advising the Humane Society of the United States, brought his A game to the nation's capital Thursday. DeFrancis was unwavering and unapologetic when he warned the racing industry that if major changes are not made, the sport could suffer dire consequences.

DeFrancis repeatedly referred to the tragic breakdown of Barbaro (Dynaformer) in the 2006 GI Preakness and said the only reason the sport's reputation came off relatively unharmed was due to the high regard the public had for owners Roy and Gretchen Jackson and trainer Michael Matz. He painted an ugly picture of what would happen should a horse suffer a catastrophic breakdown in a future Triple Crown race and its connections had any hint of scandal attached to them.

"Barbaro's injury was not the result of medication use," he said. "It was just tragic bad luck. But had it been traceable to some form of medication abuse, you can forget about it. Millennials and people of all generations will abandon horse

racing so fast it will make everyone's head spin. That's why this is so critical and so critical it be done right now. We are in a state of crisis. We are one catastrophic accident away from what would be irreparable damage to sport."

DeFrancis added that the reputation of American racing elsewhere in the world could not be worse.


"Internationally, we are literally a joke," he said.

He recounted a conversation he had recently with foreign horsemen.

"Someone said, 'Don't you

have bleeders in Australia?' and they all laughed and said, 'Yeah, we just send them all to the United States," DeFrancis said. "We've become a dumping ground for horses with infirmities. We are fiddling while Rome is burning when we talk about the ability to do this by states all coming together. We're talking about the states doing something they haven't been able to do for 50 years."

Representatives Andy Barr (R-KY) and Paul Tonko (D-NY) head the Congressional Horse Caucus and are the political leaders behind the movement to pass the Thoroughbred Horseracing Industry Integrity Act of 2015. **Cont. p2**

He said he has many wealthy friends he has tried to interest in

racing, including allowing it to pass uniform medication rules across the country and turning over all drug testing to the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency (USADA). The majority of those invited to speak Thursday strongly supported the act. The many Congressmen who came and went during the hearing also unanimously voiced their hopes that the act would some day be passed.

The website govtrack.us gives the act only a 4% chance of passage. Despite those odds, those in favor of government oversight apparently aren't going to go down without a fight. Celebrity chef and horse owner Bobby Flay was among those

"Representative [Gregory] Meeks [D-NY] said he's concerned that at some point the public is going to look down upon the sport," Flay said. "Well, that's why we're here today. It's already happened; it happened a long time ago and we're trying to climb out of that. I try to bring as many people as I can to a horse race and get possibly can because I know that once I actually expose them to it they'll fall in love with it. But when they have to think about investing their money and their time it becomes a problem because they're not sure it's on

Afterward, Barr said hearings such as Thursday's help build momentum for legislation and that this hearing definitely moved the needle.

"If the wagering public does not have confidence in the integrity or the safety of the sport we're going to lose fans," he said. "We need those fans to come to the racetrack to wager on these races and to fall in love with the sport like so many generations before them. The key to preserving, promoting and enhancing this sport for future generations is to establish a national uniform medication program that everybody will have confidence in."

PRINCE GAGARIN (IRE) (c, 4, Dubawi {Ire}--Cara Fantasy {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells) won two starts in England in 2014--including Pontefract's Silver Tankard S.--but went on a prolonged losing streak during the 2015 season. Privately purchased from Windflower Overseas following a series of three races in which he was beaten a combined 105 lengths, the colt was shipped across the Atlantic to join the Michael Matz barn in hopes of reversing his fortunes in 2016. Prince Gagarin posted a steady series of five-furlong drills in preparation for this North American debut and was given a 5-1 chance breaking from the far outside post. The chestnut was a bit headstrong into the opening bend and took up the chase in fourth position as a loose leader rattled off fractions of :23.62 and :47.88. Given his cue cornering for home, Prince Gagarin rallied down the center of the course alongside Vici (War Front) and got up to best that rival by a half-length on the wire. The winner is a half to Palavicini (Giant's Causeway), GSW, \$193,930; and Elusive Pimpernel (Elusive Quality), MGSW & GISP, \$242,622. Cont. p4

GRANNY'S KITTEN (c, 4, Kitten's Joy--Granny Franny, by Grand **Slam)** displayed considerable promise early in his career, capturing his first two starts and reporting home third, beaten less than a length, by Force the Pass (Speightstown), in the GIII Penn Mile May 30. The bay found 10 furlongs to be a bit beyond his scope when eighth behind that rival in the July 4 GI Belmont Derby and seventh next out in the Aug. 15 GI Secretariat S., but rebounded nicely with a runner-up finish behind Courtier (Pioneerof the Nile) in Indiana Grand's one-mile Centaur S. Sept. 9. A well-beaten eighth in the GIII Hawthorne Derby Oct. 17, the Ramsey homebred closed out his sophomore campaign with a tiring fourth-place finish in Churchill's GIII Commonwealth Turf S. Nov. 27. Granny's Kitten was last seen finishing 10th in a one-mile optional claimer at Gulfstream Mar. 12, and added blinkers for the first time in his career here. Away in midpack, the colt settled into stride down the backstretch as the leader completed a half-mile in :48.63. Sent up four wide on the far turn, Granny's Kitten rallied in tandem with Munjaz (GB) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) down the center of the strip and hit the front in the dying strides to score by a nose. Munjaz edged out Blarp (War Front) to complete the exacta. The winner is a full to Kitten's Dumplings, GISW, \$797,815; and Granny Mc's Kitten, SW & GSP, \$305,793. Tabbed as the 5-2 favorite for this first venture outside of the Sunshine State, the chestnut settled in midpack in the early stages and made steady headway to reach a stalking position through six furlongs in 1:18.07. Racing between horses on the final turn, she exchanged bumps with a rival while searching for running room and found a narrow seam in midstretch. Bold Contender responded readily and kicked clear through the opening to notch a much-the-best 2 1/2-length victory over Sight Reading (Shakespeare), who rallied belatedly to secure place honors. Guidry Finds New Career as an Agent:

Mark Guidry tried to get the racetrack out of his system. There were dalliances with golf and fishing and other activities, but nothing filled the void created when he retired from riding in 2007 after 33 years in the saddle.

"I'm an old racetracker and I'm going to die an old racetracker because there ain't nothing like it," Guidry said.

After a turn as a trainer and then a brief return to riding, Guidry retired for good in 2014 and began searching for a way to stay involved in racing. At the encouragement of friends, he decided to become a jockey agent and picked up James Graham as a client when the rider moved his tack from Santa Anita to Fair Grounds at the outset of 2016.

"I knew I had to do something," Guidry said. "When I had the opportunity to be an agent it was a good thing and I thought I would like it a whole lot and I really, really do. James [Graham] gave me an opportunity.

"I love doing it. You get to work with your rider on a regular basis and see your people. That's what I missed most about the game, [talking] every morning with everybody. It works good. It's a good job."

Also during Thursday's meeting, the NTRA presented a plan to grow the *Daily Racing Form*/NTRA National Handicapping Championship to a \$5 million purse within a few years. This year the NHC awarded more than \$2.75 million in cash and prizes between the NHC finals in Las Vegas and the yearlong NHC Tour.

In other news, NTRA Charities authorized the contribution of \$10,000 to the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation in memory of Ogden Mills "Dinny" Phipps, recognizing his many contributions to Thoroughbred breeding and racing, including his service as a founding member of the NTRA Board of Directors.

Godolphin, who lost '**TDN Rising Star**' Emotionless (Ire) (Shamardal) from the picture, will rely on the Mark Johnston-trained **Buratino (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) who is in stall two; the Richard Fahey-trained **Ribchester (GB)** (Iffraaj {GB}) next door in three; and Jim Bolger's **Herald the Dawn (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) who is in 11.

The six catalogued by Helmet include <u>lot 206</u>, Oak Tree Farm's half-brother to the G1 Nunthorpe S. winner Margot Did (GB), herself a 10,000gns breeze-up purchase and a daughter of Helmet's sire Exceed And Excel (Aus).

The offspring of first-season sires are always of interest, but also being put to the test at Tattersalls this week are a couple of first-time consignors. Representing Spain is EAM Bloodstock, the agency run by Alex Mahony, nephew of Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. With a range of experience on studs across Europe, including Haras de Monceaux and Watership Down Stud, as well as stints with French trainer Nicolas Bertran de Balanda and American consignor Kip Elser, Mahony started working as a bloodstock agent in October 2013 and pinhooked five yearlings last season to form his first breeze-up consignment.

"We've only brought three here to Tattersalls as we've already managed to sell two of them to trainers in Spain, and one is favourite for the first 2-year-old race in Madrid on Sunday," said Mahony, who was born and raised in Spain and works in partnership with his father, Dominic, and brother, Marcus. He added, "Marcus is my right-hand man and my assistant trainer in Spain, but he's also still in university, which is why he's not here with me this week."

The equine trio, which arrived in England a fortnight ago from the much sunnier climes of Dos Hermanas racecourse in Seville, are colts by Spain's leading sire Caradak (Ire) (lot 131) and



French-based Shakespearean (Ire) (lot 251), and a filly by Cheveley Park Stud's first-season sire Mayson (GB).

"I have two very quick horses. They are particularly quick on good ground, which is what we've

been training on at home. They've never felt temperatures of less than 12C all winter," said Mahony. "I brought a jockey over with us, Carlos Salgera, who is an amateur rider in Spain, and he's done a really good job with the horses."

Another new name among the consignors is FEP Ltd, which offers four fillies from its Newmarket base and is run by Lithuanian couple Linus Baliunas and Geidre Povilaviciute. Baliunas, who previously trained in his native country before coming to

Newmarket to work for Sir Michael Stoute, has his quartet in good order, with each member of the draft performing a professional breeze on Thursday morning. They include a Kyllachy (GB) filly (lot 228)

G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile over the course and distance some 140 days prior. In that event, Ryan Moore was forced to work out a trip from the 11 hole, and Joao Moreira, who will take over at the controls this weekend, believes the six will make life slightly easier.

"The gate is not too bad, in fact it's good in my opinion. He's going to find it much easier to find a position with cover from there than he had to do in December," the 'Magic Man' submitted.

Moreira rode the now-injured Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) to a third-place effort behind Maurice in December.

Giant Treasure (Mizzen Mast) turned in what was then a career best when second to Maurice late last year, then proved the effort was no fluke with a win in the G1 Stewards' Cup the following month. The Juddmonte Farm-bred grey drew gate nine, with Olivier Peslier set to jet in for the ride. **Cont. p7**

"With Giant Treasure's nine, I'm not too perturbed," said trainer Richard Gibson. "There'll be good speed on I expect and he'll have clear air and something to run at."

Chautauqua (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), the world's toprated sprinter on official rankings, has a little something to prove this weekend as he ventures beyond Australia for the first time. The 5-year-old, who has made a very favourable impression over the last 10 days or so, likes to get back and come with a barnstorming finish and will leave the middle of the gate Sunday.

"He's not going to get locked away on the fence from there," his jockey Tommy Berry surmised. "It's good. We all know he's going to settle back and I can let him do his thing from there. I realise it won't be easy coming from a long way back, but I won't be any closer early than the horse wants to be."

His compatriot, the Queenslander **Buffering (Aus)** (Mossman {Aus}), is going as well as ever at age eight and will look to add to his last-out success in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint from barrier three, just to the outside of fellow speedster **Mongolian Saturday** (Any Given Saturday).

"I wanted four but three will do," affable trainer Robert Heathcote said after Buffering was the last horse to be drawn. "The speed is largely outside us and we might have had to work a fair bit harder had he drawn out. I'm very happy with three and happy for Buffering to lead, as he's got a high cruising speed and he's a hard horse to get passed."

The hardest-luck story in either draw was **Aerovelocity (NZ)** (Pins {Aus}), who landed the riverside alley in 14. Zac Purton will have to work some magic from there, though it should be noted that **Peniaphobia (Ire)** (Dandy Man {Ire}) took out December's G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint from the same gate.

I have to admit that in the days leading up to the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile last December, I was not overwhelmed by **Maurice (Jpn)** (Screen Hero {Jpn}). His form was bulletproof, what with a win in the G1 Yasuda Kinen and another when firstup in the G1 Mile Championship. Still, there was something from a body language perspective that I couldn't get past, but he beat **Giant Treasure** (Mizzen Mast) and Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) on the square. Fair play.

The reigning Japanese Horse of the Year got in his final piece of serious work Thursday morning at Sha Tin and suffice to say



I've been won over. With Joao Moreira in the irons, Maurice emerged from the stables at the top of the 1000-metre straight and cantered past the stands inside of the dogs, then was guided back to the outside on the backstretch. Neck nicely bowed, he began to

pick it up at the 800m and two-minute licked before accelerating through a final quarter-mile in a measured :23.4, striding out powerfully while under little encouragement.

"He's a beautiful horse, he moves like a real champion and the feel that he gave me from the top is that he is a champion," said Moreira. "He hasn't achieved what he has by luck--he's done it because he's got ability and because he's got everything that a horse needs to be doing what he's done. Hopefully we can get the best out of him at the weekend, and if we do, he's the one to beat." **Cont. p8**

Godolphin's **Bow Creek (Ire)** (Shamardal) was also given a searching gallop under the watchful eye of the operation's Australian trainer John O'Shea, completing six furlongs of work with a final 400 metres in a smart :22.6. The winner of the G2 Peter Young S. at Caulfield in February, the 5-year-old entire was hard held into and around the turn and leveled off nicely down the stretch, albeit with a somewhat high head carriage.

"Very happy with his work and he looks immaculate," O'Shea assessed. "He's as good as we can have him. On his day he's a very, very good horse but he needs a few things to go his way. He needs to be smothered up behind them, get the right genuine tempo and good to firm ground. He's ready to run a race."

Buffering (Aus) (Mossman {Aus}) was followed onto the allweather track by the purple-poloed **Chautauqua (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}). Chautauqua continues to give the impression that he is doing very well approaching race day, while Buffering galloped down lane, ears straight up, with Melly Sharpe standing tall in the irons.

Mongolian Saturday (Any Given Saturday) appeared to be giving his work rider all he could handle on the turn, but when finally given his head, let down nicely and looked much more

comfortable in finishing his final two furlongs in a swift :22.3, then, as seems to be his custom, shut it down fairly quickly past the wire. He then got reacquainted with the Sha Tin parade ring. Per a Jockey Club release, Mongolian Saturday will be permitted to wear

some headgear in the prelimiaries Sunday afternoon to try to keep him calm, but will load the gate without the equipment. However, he figures to have his work cut out for him, as the Chairman's figures a much hotter race than the Hong Kong Sprint, in which he was fifth, some 4 1/2 lengths behind **Peniaphobia (Ire)** (Dandy Man {Ire}).

The progressive **Packing Pins (NZ)** (Pins {Aus}), who drew the rail for the Champions Mile, also turned in a solid piece of work over the all-weather track, going 800m in :50.2 (:27.1, :23.1).

An NZ\$260,000 yearling purchase by Guy Mulcaster for trainer Chris Waller, Kermadec won Flemington's G3 Carbine Club S. in his third start in the spring of his 3-year-old campaign, and was

GOVERNMENT ADDRESSES ILLEGAL WAGERING

Australia's Federal Government has issued its response to former New South Wales Premier Barry O'Farrell's review into illegal offshore wagering, with its action plan to combat the issue drawing praise from Racing Australia.

The key legislative initiatives of the plan include establishing a national consumer protection framework to minimise problem gambling, including seeking to ban lines of credit for online wagering; consultation with banks and credit card providers to limit illegal offshore transactions; and consulting with internet service providers on options to reduce illegal offshore availability to Australian customers. **Cont. p9**

The initiative also includes amending the Interactive Gambling Act 2001 to make it clear it is illegal for unlicensed overseas gambling companies to offer products to Australians if they are not licensed by a state or territory.

"The Government and Minister Alan Tudge have consulted and considered the many complex issues arising from the O'Farrell Report in the most comprehensive way since the Interactive Gambling Act was enacted in 2001" said Racing Australia Chairman John Messara. "We congratulate the Minister and Government for the decisive action taken to address the growing integrity risks to racing posed by illegal offshore bookmakers. The legislative measures proposed by the Government are proportionate to the threat, and importantly provide security to Australian consumers who are often unable to distinguish between unregulated Asian operators and regulated operators."

SILVANO COLT TOPS NATIONAL SESSION TWO

Silvano (Ger) and Varsfontein Stud continued to hit the headlines during the second session of the 2016 National Yearling sale when <u>lot 166</u>, a colt out of Jodie (SAf) (Western Winter), was knocked down to Shadwell South Africa for R2.3 million (£110,261/€141,833). Hailing from the family of multiple graded winners Annie (SAf) (Trigger Finger), Ice Cube (SAf) (Western Winter) and Grand Emporium (SAf) (National Assembly), the colt--named Pietro Mascagni--caused a protracted bidding duel between Jehan Malherbe of Form Bloodstock, standing ringside, and Mike de Kock, bidding on behalf of Shadwell South Africa at the walking ring. De Kock, who trained Grand Emporium to victory in the



G1 Daily News and the G2 Godolphin Mile, said "Sheikh Hamdan has already bought a number of horses for me in Australia and his support here at our National Sale is greatly appreciated. The colt is from a very strong family and he certainly looks the part." Carl de Vos, stud manager at Varsfontein Stud, said he was delighted the colt would be

going to De Kock. "Both De Kock and Malherbe are superb yearling selectors and for them both to want this colt is a great accolade."

Lot 286, a Trippi colt out of the Fort Wood mare Rememberance (SAf), also went the way of Shadwell South Africa with the hammer coming down at R1.4 million ($\pounds 67,107/ \in 86,323$).

Mauritzfontein Stud produced another millionaire when <u>lot</u> 226, a Silvano colt out of Mrs Brock (SAf) (Fort Wood), was knocked down to Form Bloodstock for R1.5 million (£71,909/€92,489). Mrs Brock is a full-sister to Mr Brock, who raced in Mauritius before bounding onto the international scene with a start in the G1 Dubai World Cup in 2010. The colt, named Diamondveld, is a half-brother to Miranda Frost (SAf) (Western Winter), who is unbeaten in two starts.

"I bought him for an overseas client and he will be trained by Dean Kannemeyer," said Malherbe. "Miranda Frost, the halfsister, appears to be more than useful and the mare is off to a very good start."

Silvano and Mauritzfontein seemed to go hand-in-hand, as they also consigned <u>lot 184</u>, a colt named Earl Of Warwick out of the Fort Wood mare Lady Brooke (SAf). Brett Crawford signed for the colt at R1.2 million (£57,527/€73,957). Crawford saw the colt on a visit to Mauritzfontein in Kimberley and said he liked him straight away. "He is a very nice, athletic type," the trainer said. "I liked him from the minute I saw him on the farm and I had to have him."

The only Tapit in the sale, a colt out of Pin Turn (GB) (Pivotal {GB})--a daughter of G1 Vodacom Durban July and G1 Dubai Duty Free Stakes winner Ipi Tombe (ZIM) (Manshood {GB})-- consigned by Drakenstein Stud as <u>lot 258</u>, was knocked down to Form Bloodstock, signing on behalf of Al Adiyat South Africa, for R1 million ($\pounds 47,296 / \pounds 61,631$).

"Today's sale was much more buoyant after a very slow start," said Bloodstock SA CEO Kevin Woolard. "What was very pleasing was that nine horses breached the R1-million mark. We look forward to the last session tomorrow, when the remaining 151 yearlings come under the hammer."
