



JEMAYEL UPSETS THE SAINT-ALARY



Jemayel holds off Camprock in the Prix Saint-Alary | Scoop Dyga

Jemayel (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}), who ran seventh in last month's Listed Prix Finlande on seasonal return at Chantilly, upset the odds to prevail in Monday's G1 Pour Moi Coolmore Prix Saint-Alary, re-routed from its usual Longchamp slot, at Deauville. Well away from the inside gate to race under a tight grip in fifth sporting cheekpieces here, the 23-2 chance made a beeline for the inside strip passing the quarter-mile marker and was driven out once making her bid at the eighth pole to hold the late thrust of 7-5 favourite and hitherto unbeaten G3 Prix Penelope victress Camprock (Fr) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) by a head. Last term's G1 Fillies' Mile placegetter Hawksmoor (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}), from Hugo Palmer's in-form Newmarket stable, ran on to finish 1 1/2 lengths adrift in third. "We were a little disappointed with her first run of the season, which is why we fitted her with cheekpieces and she responded well," explained trainer Jean-Claude Rouget. "I saw the other filly [Camprock] come to win the race one furlong from home, but [jockey] Gregory [Benoist] said Jemayel found more with every stride to win it."

Jemayel opened up with a third going 7 1/2 furlongs here Aug. 2, finishing behind subsequent G3 Prix d'Aumale placegetter Gherdaiya (GB) (Shamardal) and Alakhana (Fr) (Dalakhani {Ire), who had bagged an earlier contest on this card (*See "France*"). Cont. p2

REDOUTE'S REACHES GROUP 1 MILESTONE

The early results of this term's bunch of European first-season sires are providing the usual interest. Several young sires have already made smart starts, while the most celebrated of the freshmen, Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), currently has statistics of one winner from one runner, courtesy of the victory at Newbury which ensured that Cunco (Ire) has the distinction of being Frankel's first foal, Frankel's first runner and Frankel's first winner. Another extremely distinguished horse among Europe's current freshmen is a stallion who is a proven sire and first-season sire simultaneously: **Redoute's Choice (Aus)** (Danehill) has been champion sire of Australia three times and notched his 30th Group 1 winner on Saturday, but he is a new-comer as far as European breeding is concerned. **Cont. p5**



Jemayel graduated going one mile at Longchamp next up Sept. 9, then ran second in the Oct. 21 G3 Prix des Reservoirs back here and was a close seventh in the Apr. 24 Listed Prix Finlande at Chantilly in her only other start last time. Looking forward to holding a strong hand in the G1 Prix de Diane back at Chantilly, trainer Jean-Claude Rouget revealed, "The programme says we now go to Chantilly for the [June 19] Prix de Diane and that's where she will go along with [unbeaten G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches victress] La Cressonniere."

Pia Brandt reflected on Camprock's first defeat and indicated a Classic re-match is very much on the cards for the runner-up, adding, "My filly came to win it on the outside and I don't think she saw the [eventual] winner on the inside until it was too late. She was gaining again at the finish so we shall try to seek revenge in the Prix de Diane."

Jemayel, a fourth stakes performer for her group-placed dam Nawal (Fr) (Homme de Loi {Ire}), is a half-sister to GI Hollywood Gold Cup S. victor Mast Track (Mizzen Mast), whose full-sister Always Auditioning produced the GII Beaumont S. victrix Ready To Act (More Than Ready). Nawal's (Fr) second dam Tarlace (Ire) (Targowice) also produced the G3 Prix de Cabourg winner Kenbu (Fr) (Kenmare {Fr}), and is a half to the stakes-winning Sunset Temple (Ire) (Golden Horus {GB}). Nawal's (Fr) youngest progeny are a 2-year-old Dream Ahead filly named Lipstick Rose (Ire), and a yearling colt by Raven's Pass.

In the money in 18 of 19 prior starts, Finsbury Square finished runner-up in last year's G3 Prix Sigy and G3 Prix Texanita, and occupied the same berth in this term's Mar. 31 Listed Prix Cor de Chasse at Fontainebleau and Apr. 26 Listed Prix Servanne at Maisons-Laffitte last time. The homebred bay was reacquainted



with headgear for this third start of the year and maintained a straight line upon exiting the outside gate, tracking the pace in a group of three racing apart from the main body of the field. Cruising into contention on

the bridle from halfway, he was shaken up passing the eighth pole and driven out in the latter stages to gain a narrow verdict and a career high. "Finsbury Square has been knocking at the door for a long time in group races and deserved this win," said trainer Fabrice Chappet. "He has been fitted with blinkers in the past, but not yet this season, and I think they helped make a difference today. He loves the sprint track at Chantilly so he will go there next for the [June 5 G2] Prix du Gros-Chene, where he was a close fourth as a 3-year-old last year. Later in the season, we will try to target the [Oct. 2 G1] Prix de l'Abbaye, which is also at Chantilly this year."

Finsbury Square is the first winner and stakes scorer for Diamond Square (Fr) (Homme de Loi {Ire}), who is a half to the Listed Prix Isonomy victor King Solomon (Fr) (Simon du Desert {Fr}). The next dam, Back To One (Ire) (Doulab), is a half to three stakes performers including the dual stakes winner Nord's Lucy (Ire) (Nordico), whose own progeny is headed by the G2 Premio Emilio Turati victor Nordhal (GB) (Halling). Diamond Square (Fr) also has an as yet unraced Iffraaj (GB) filly named Diamond Lace (Fr), a 2-year-old colt by Naaqoos (GB) and a yearling filly by Excelebration (Ire).

French or German Guineas, it all comes alike when you have the innate riding skill of Ryan Moore and, 24 hours after his stirring success on The Gurkha (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Deauville, he was delivering a masterclass from the front on Knife Edge here. Impressing on his winning debut over seven furlongs at Ascot in September, the chestnut was only fourth in Newmarket's Houghton Conditions S. at that trip in October before returning to be third in the mile conditions race that used to be the Easter S. and carry listed status in its time as a Guineas trial at Kempton Apr. 2. Building on that effort to run the proven pattern-race performer Tasleet (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) to a short head when second in the G3 Greenham S. switched from Newbury onto Chelmsford's Polytrack a fortnight later, he arrived here as the lone British threat and duly carried off the prize under a typically tactically astute steering job from Coolmore's jockey. Lobbing along on the front end with his rivals content to allow him his own way, Knife Edge was cajoled as Noor Al Hawa loomed alongside towards the far rail in the straight and, after seeing off that rival, found the line just in time as last year's G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten runner-up Degas ate into his margin with every stride.

"It was quite a tight finish, but obviously Ryan gave him a great ride," trainer Marco Botti said. "There wasn't much pace and he probably just idled a little bit in front and once the runner-up came to him, he found a little bit more and kept on. He's entered in the [G1] St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 14]. We need to speak to the team and see what they want to do next. This was one of the main targets. After he ran in the Greenham at Chelmsford, we said we would aim him at the German Guineas and we've got it done."

Knife Edge's dam is a full-sister to the German listed-winning Andorn (Ger), with their dam, Anthyllis, being a half to the G1 Deutsches Derby hero and prolific young sire Adlerflug (Ger) (In the Wings {GB}) and the G2 Oppenheim Union-Rennen winner Arrigo (Ger) (Shirocco {Ger}). The fourth dam is the G2 Preis der Diana (German Oaks) runner-up Alya (Ger), a sibling of the outstanding Allegretta (GB), who made her claim to fame as dam of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine Urban Sea (Miswaki), who is course the dam of the champions and leading sires Galileo (Ire) and Sea the Stars (Ire). Attalea also has an as-yet unnamed 2-year-old filly by Peintre Celebre.

Redoute's Reaches Group 1 Milestone Cont. from p1

The offspring resultant from Redoute's Choice's first European season (at Haras de Bonneval in 2013) will be making their debuts in the coming months.

Redoute's Choice's first Northern crop represent intriguing prospects, as implied by the fact that his only representative in this weekend's Arqana Breeze-Up sale at Deauville fetched €775,000, the daughter of Sunday Nectar (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) being bought by Stephen Hillen Bloodstock to join the English stable of Kevin Ryan.

Redoute's Choice has found the perfect way of keeping his name in lights as we await the debuts of his first

(Northern Dancer), Try My Best (Northern Dancer) and Malinowski (Sir Ivor). Her subsequent descendants to have achieved celebrity status in the Northern Hemisphere include Rags To Riches (A. P. Indy), Spinning World (Nureyev), Xaar (GB) (Zafonic), Peeping Fawn (Danehill) and Jazil (Seeking The Gold). Furthermore, the Hong Kong champion Designs On Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) descends from Best In Show's half-sister Stolen Date (Sadair).

Dancing Show was imported into Australia via New Zealand. She had been covered to Southern Hemisphere time in 1987 by Miswaki at Walmac International Farm in Kentucky, and the resultant colt was born in New Zealand in 1988. She subsequently moved on to Australia, imported by Norman Carlyon of Muranna Stud in Victoria. At what turned out to be the twilight of the era of the dominance of Star Kingdom (Ire) (Stardust {GB})--ie. just before Danehill began to have runners--Carlyon sent her to a couple of very good stallions from the Star

French-conceived youngsters. Many stallions find their rates of success slowing down as their third decade looms. Not so with Redoute's Choice, who will turn 20 on Aug. 1 and whose stock are currently doing him proud. At the start of March, his lifetime tally of individual Group 1 winners stood at 27. Now it stands at 30, courtesy of the successes of the ill-fated Peeping (Aus) in the Coolmore Classic at Rosehill, Abbey Marie (Aus) in the Australasian Oaks at Morphettville and, most

Kingdom line. In 1990 she visited the 1988 G1 Golden Slipper winner Star Watch (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}), and in 1991 she visited the 1990 Golden Slipper winner Canny Lad (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}).

Dancing Show's Miswaki colt turned out to be Umatilla (NZ), who won at Group 1 level as a 2-year-old in the 1990/'91 season, taking the Karrakata Plate in Perth at a time when it still was a race of national significance, worthy of Group 1 status. Her Star Watch colt

recently, Howard Be Thy Name (Aus) in the South Australian Derby at the same venue on Saturday.

For Redoute's Choice, a stint at stud in the Northern Hemisphere seems only natural. While he has been the pre-eminent Australian-bred stallion of the current century, his background is one which is as synonymous with Newmarket and Belmont as it is with Randwick and Flemington. His family has only been in Australia for two generations, the importation of his U.S.-bred granddam Dancing Show (Nijinsky) to the antipodes in 1988 ranking in retrospect as one of most notable arrivals in Australasian bloodstock history. Thanks to Dancing Show, this family has become a notable part of the bloodstock scene Down Under, just as it already was on both sides of the Atlantic, her granddam Best In Show (Traffic Judge) having been voted Kentucky Broodmare of the Year in 1982. By the late '80s, Best In Show was already ancestress of the likes of El Gran Senor became her second Group 1-winning juvenile: named Hurricane Sky (Aus), he landed the Blue Diamond S. in 1994. Her Canny Lad filly Shantha's Choice (Aus), a three-parts sister to Hurricane Sky, was less successful, winning one minor race over 1200 metres, but she now stands as a very high-achiever. By the time Shantha's Choice had retired to stud, the era of Danehill had begun. Shantha's Choice duly did what many well-credentialed Star Kingdom-line mares did during the '90s and the early years of this century: she visited Danehill, the consequence of which was that Redoute's Choice was born in 1996. He went on to be a top-class racehorse, winning the Blue Diamond at two and the Caulfield Guineas at three. Even greater achievements followed once he had retired to Arrowfield, and Dancing Show's legend continued to grow with Shantha's Choice's subsequent children including Platinum Scissors (Aus) (Danehill) and Manhattan Rain (Aus) (Encosta De Lago {Aus}). Dancing Show's next daughter after Shantha's Choice, Show Dancing (NZ) (Don't Say Halo), also went on to be a top broodmare, most notably producing G1 Australian Guineas winner Al Maher (Aus) (Danehill).

Redoute's Choice has been Australia's champion sire three times, and has finished in the top five on the general sires table in 10 of the past 11 years. He needs no introduction Down



Under, and such is the freedom of information in the internet era, he needs no introduction anywhere else, either. He is adept at siring both high-class juveniles and Classic horses, while eight of his Aus-bred sons have sired at least one Group 1 winner. That number seems sure to rise, and

one of the young sires who could swell that tally is Elzaam (Aus), who was conceived at Arrowfield to Northern Hemisphere time in February 2007 and who raced with distinction in England, landing the Carnarvon S. at Newbury in 2011 by six lengths after failing by only a nose in the previous year's G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot. Elzaam retired to Ballyhane Stud in Ireland in 2013. His first juveniles currently include three winners, headed by King Electric (Ire), who scored at The Curragh two weeks ago.

In the two years in which he stood as a reverse-shuttler at Haras de Bonneville, Redoute's Choice was easily the most expensive stallion in France. He thus received some very good mares, and consequently it looks certain that some very good racehorses will eventuate. Over and above the aforementioned filly out of Sunday Nectar, those for whom particularly high expectations might be held include two who sold very well as yearlings in 2015: a half-sister to last year's G1 1000 Guineas heroine Legatissimo (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and a half-brother to G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris winner Vadamar (Dalakhani {Ire}). The former was bought by MV Magnier in Tattersalls Book 1 for 725,000gns and is now named Smoulder (GB); while the latter fetched €950,000 at Argana in August to the bid of John Ferguson and is now named Valcartier (Ire). Redoute's Choice's other European 2-year-olds include the Aga Khan's homebred Zarmitan (Fr), a son of the brilliant Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar), who has joined Alain de Royer-Dupre's stable and who holds an entry for next year's Derby. Redoute's Choice's current total of 30 individual Group 1 winners is remarkably good, but what is even better is that it is almost certain to continue to rise for years to come, courtesy of good horses in both hemispheres.

EUROPEAN-BRED SUCCESS

with Darren Fox

In this series, the *TDN* catches up with European expatriats working in the Thoroughbred industry around the world. Today's installment features Darren Fox of Darley America.

Hometown? Frenchpark, Co. Roscommon (Up the Ros!) In the west of Ireland.

How did you end up where you are now? Growing up on a cattle farm, horses were always a fascination and breeding a few mares was a welcome hobby in addition to the normal routine. Early friendships with the Cullen family in the same village (the eldest being Joey Cullen of Goffs) nurtured the interest even further and I followed his career path to Equine Science at the University of Limerick.

Early hands on jobs away from home involved breeding and



yearling prep seasons at Ballyhane Stud with Joe Foley and Rathbarry Stud with Liam Cashman. They gave me a great foundation and I have fond memories and am proud to have worked at each operation. It was Pat Connell who managed Rathbarry at the time who organized for me to go and work for Jim FitzGerald's KnockGriffin Farm in Kentucky in 2000 for an eight-month work placement

during college. Jim gave me a lot of responsibility and the learning curve was steep. I am forever grateful for the opportunity and friendship since.

Early jobs out of college were with GE Capital and Tote Ireland until I was lucky enough to be selected for Darley Flying Start. I will be forever indebted to H. H. Sheikh Mohammed for that opportunity which unequivocally led me to where I am today. That ultimately led to a position on the Darley U.S. Nominations team at Jonabell for a fantastic four years. From there I spent two great years at WinStar where I learned an enormous amount in a short space of time and can't thank Kenny Troutt and Elliott Walden enough for giving me the opportunity. Last year saw me move back to where I started at Jonabell with lots to look forward to this fall.

What have you found to be the major difference between racing/breeding in America and your home country? I think there is more of a progression distance wise in Ireland/Europe with a Classic horse from two to three years whereas a horse in the U.S. could tackle a distance close to its upper limits as a 2year-old. SO MI DAR OUT OF INVESTEC OAKS

So Mi Dar (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), among the favourites for the G1 Investec Oaks after winning York's G3 Musidora S. by four lengths May 11, has been ruled out of that June 3 Epsom contest after pulling out lame on Monday.

"It was one of those mornings you get," said trainer John Gosden. "She came out of the race great, but this morning she was lame on her left hind. 

ZAC SPIRIT CONFIRMED FOR JULY CUP

Zac Spirit (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}), who cemented his position as the top sprinter in Singapore by winning the Lion City Cup for the second time in three years Apr. 24 (<u>video</u>), will be programmed for a start in the G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket. Owner Andy Wong returned from an overseas trip last week and gave his stamp of approval Friday.

"I'm glad to say Andy is happy to go," commented trainer Cliff Brown. "I entered Zac first, but all this while I never really had a chance to talk to him, and we didn't know if we were going or



not. But Andy came back to Singapore this week and we had a good chat about the trip and he's very excited with the idea. Like me, he agrees there are no races for him here. We could have looked at Ascot, either the [G1] King's

Stand (1000m) or the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. (1200m), but I think Newmarket will suit him better. I know it won't be cheap, but we're definitely going and he'll make the field."

Brown said that Zac Spirit, the champion sprinter of 2014, has come out of his Lion City success in good order and could have one run at home before heading to England. In the Lion City Cup, Zac Spirit beat Emperor Max (Aus) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who was a respectable seventh to Muhaarar (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in last year's G1 QIPCO British Champions Sprint.

"I may or may not give him one run in a Kranji Stakes A race over 1200 metres on June 5," he said. "He had a quiet 10 days after the Lion City Cup, but he is back in training now. He will probably have his first gallop in two weeks' time, it's all good."

Brown added that there is a chance Zac Spirit could remain in Europe for an extra month, with a race like the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville a possible option.

While a British invasion is on for Zac Spirit, trainer Michael Clements has announced that **Kiwi Karma (NZ)** (Fast 'n' Famous {Aus}) will not travel to Royal Ascot, where she was nominated for the G1 King's Stand S. June 16.

Things looked as bleak as the late Sunday afternoon weather for Debt Collector as the field for the Singapore Guineas hit the top of the stretch of the long course. But, despite tricky underfoot conditions, the bay produced an incredible turn of speed in the final furlong and a half to stamp himself as the jurisdiction's leading sophomore.

A maiden winner over the Polytrack last November, Debt Collector earned his first turf victory in a Class 4 over 1400m Apr. 3, then produced a scintillating late burst to take out the Singapore 3YO Classic (1400m) by a widening 1 1/2 lengths Apr. 24 at odds of 18-1.

There was no such value about Debt Collector as he started the 11-5 favorite and immediately took himself out of the race as they went a solid gallop up front. Lucky to avoid traffic leaving the back when Fitzroy (NZ) (Swiss Ace {Aus}) was checked hard and plummeted through the field, Debt Collector raced inside on the turn, but had the better part of eight lengths to make up as chief market rival Magnum put it up to pacesetting Infantry. But Michael Rodd was able to get Debt Collector into the clear at the 400m and so fast was the gelding's acceleration inside the final eighth of a mile that Rodd had to do everything in his power not to run over his rivals. He covered his final quarter-mile in a phenomenal :22.18 according to the Trakus chart to score handsomely in the finish. **Cont. p14**

"I liked where he was in the race, but when they turned for home, I'd be happy if he had run third or fourth," admitted winning trainer Cliff Brown. "His last 400m was just incredible. He's a horse that doesn't excite me in trackwork but I'm really excited now. He will go for a much deserved break now. Hopefully he will be my Derby horse next year."

Added Rodd, "Hurn of foot was just out of this world. He finished so hard that he ran on top of them. He won with authority in the end. I still think Cliffy needs to put a pair of shades on him. He needs blinkers."

The winner's dam, a four-time winner and multiple stakesplaced in England while under the care of James Fanshawe, was purchased by Windsor Park Stud for 57,000gns at the 2003 Tattersalls December sale. She produced fillies by Thewayyouare in 2013 and 2014 and a filly by Shamexpress (NZ) in 2015. She was not covered during the most recent breeding season. **Click for the Singapore Turf Club chart. Reddam Racing's **Nyquist** (Uncle Mo) and Big Chief Racing, Head of Plains Partners and Rocker O Ranch et. al's **Exaggerator** (Curlin), first and second in the GI Kentucky Derby, both schooled in Pimlico's paddock Monday morning in preparation for a tilt in Saturday's GI Preakness S. Exaggerator's session came one day after arriving to Baltimore by van from Churchill Downs, while Nyquist visited the paddock in between a pair of one-mile jogs around the racetrack under exercise rider Jonny Garcia [video].

"He was great," trainer Doug O'Neill said of Nyquist [video]. "He was just a true professional. He walked through the paddock and acted like he'd been there before. He went from the paddock to the gate and got to meet Bruce Wagner and his boys, Kevin [Dzbynski] and Chris [Campitelli], and they were unbelievable with him the way they acted around him and the way he acted around them. They got along great. He schooled super in there. We're just really happy. It was a really good morning."

On the heels of his May 7 Derby win in front of a massive crowd, O'Neill said that his undefeated charge has proven time and again that he has the ideal temperament to display both competitiveness on the track and composure off the track.

AT WOODBINE, HOPING WRONG WAY IS THE RIGHT WAY by Bill Finley



Nyquist is scheduled to continue his regimen of jogging and galloping on alternating days leading up to the Preakness. He will gallop Tuesday.

Meanwhile, Exaggerator had a light day of exercise in the aftermath of his travel day, walking the shedrow Monday morning. After the conclusion of training hours, the GI Santa Anita Derby winner was led over to the paddock to school with Julie Clark, assistant to trainer Keith Desormeaux [video].

"[The Sir Barton] is where we're leaning," the Kentucky-based Cox said. "Nyquist isn't in there. That has a lot to do with it."

The intent is to spice up the racing programs and to use a part of the turf course (the clubhouse turn) that is rarely run over since most normal races over Woodbine's expansive grass course are run around one turn.

The first clockwise pari-mutuel race is scheduled for June 10. Monday's trial race was the only one that will be held. Woodbine management's attempts to duplicate racing conditions including having announcer Robert Geller call the race.

"I wouldn't classify it as strange for me," she said. "I probably have a little more experience going clockwise than the horse I was on, as well as some of the other jockeys in the race. I don't

believe any of the horses in the field have gone the wrong way. They may have trained the wrong way; we've done some clockwise training sessions in the mornings. In post-race discussions with some of the other jocks, they said their horses weren't ready for the turn as much as they would have been for a left-handed turn. It took them a second to get balanced and have them prepared for the turn, but everything seemed to go well."

That Internal Bourbon won the

"race" was not a surprise. Trained by Roger Attfield, she's a top allowance horse who finished second last year in the La Prevoyante S.

Emile Ramsammy, who finished third on Zazinga (Head Chopper), said riders will have to adjust their style for the righthanded races.

"It did take me awhile to get adjusted to going the other way

> Though right-handed races are common throughout many other parts of the world, it remains to be seen how North American horseplayers will react to a new wrinkle when it comes to their handicapping.



The two fillies will break next to one another, with the latter drawing the four-post and the former getting the five-hole.

Go Maggie Go was installed as the 5-2 second choice on the morning line and will be running off just two weeks rest following her strong showing in the Oaks, when she was beaten just three lengths despite a troubled trip.

"I think if you go back and watch the race," Romans said, "you can make a case for her being second. She broke away bad and had a little traffic down the lane."

The Oaks was the first defeat in three starts for the Mike Tarp homebred, who stepped up off a maiden win Mar. 13 at Gulfstream to win the sloppy GII Gulfstream Park Oaks Apr. 2. The short turnaround for this start is of no concern to Romans.

"She's doing great," Romans said. "She's just a really good filly. She's like a colt, so I don't think the two weeks will hurt her. I've done it quite a bit, wheel horses back. We used to do it all the time. I don't know how we got away from it. It became a numbers situation--the numbers said you have to wait. Truth of the matter is, run 'em."

UNIFIED remains undefeated with Peter Pan S. (G2) victory Kyle Nagel's Ma Can Do It has yet to win a race, but finished third at 23-1 in the GI Alcibiades S. last October at Keeneland and was fifth behind champion and '**TDN Rising Star**' Songbird (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She most recently ran second in a Lexington maiden affair Apr. 23.

"I thought she was one of the most talented horses I had before," Romans said. "I just figured she's doing good, why wait for her to have a big race and hope she has it in there. If Maggie stubs her toe, Ma will be right there."

SEARCH HALTED, FBI INVESTIGATING MISSING-AT-SEA CASE by T.D. Thornton

The United States Coast Guard has called off Gulf of Mexico search-and-rescue efforts for Samantha Broberg, the wife of the nation's winningest Thoroughbred trainer, Karl Broberg.

Samantha, 33, was reported missing at sea from a Texas-to-Mexico cruise ship Friday afternoon. A subsequent check of the surveillance video revealed a woman falling overboard from the 10th deck of the Carnival Cruise Line's *Liberty*, after having climbed atop the top rung of the safety railing to sit with her back to the water around 2:00 a.m.

The intense search-and-rescue attempts that ensued were hampered by a 15-hour lag between when the woman on the video was recorded toppling over the railing and when the Coast Guard was first alerted.

Karl, 45, was not on the ship with his wife. The excursion was a four-day cruise to Cozumel for Samantha and several friends.

The cruise ship left Galveston Thursday. Samantha's companions did not realize she was unaccounted for until about noon Friday. When she was first reported missing, the ship's crew concentrated on a room-by-room search of the vessel.

Once a review of video footage determined they were instead dealing with a person falling off the ship, the crew was able to calculate the exact position of where the liner was when Samantha is believed to have gone over, and the Coast Guard responded with a "saturated" air search about 200 miles off the coast of Galveston.

Initially, there were shreds of hope that Samantha might be found alive. Assuming she survived the 10-story fall, the waters in that area are considered warm enough that hypothermia would not have immediately set in.

But after nearly 48 hours and an exhaustive criss-cross search of 4,300 square miles of ocean, the search was halted when darkness descended Sunday night.

KHOU-TV in Houston covered the Liberty's docking back in Galveston at 7:00 a.m. Monday, and yellow crime scene tape could be seen restricting access to the tenth deck. The station said the Federal Bureau of Investigation would be taking up an inquiry, which was reported as "standard procedure" when a U.S. citizen goes missing at sea.

A Carnival spokesperson told KHOU that several people who may have had contact with Samantha had been interviewed, but that "no foul play" is suspected.

"This is a tremendously sad event. I do want to mention that sitting on a cruise ship railing is akin to sitting on the balcony railing of a high-rise hotel. It is risky and dangerous and against our rules," the Carnival spokesperson told *People* magazine.

The website *CruiseLawNews*, which is published by maritime attorney Jim Walker, was critical of Carnival for not having a

"man overboard" system installed, which would have immediately alerted the crew if motion sensors detected someone or something falling over the side of the ship.

Samantha, of Arlington, is being remembered as a stay-at-home mother of four children.

Karl is currently the leading U.S. trainer in terms of wins this year (129). At this time of year, his stable competes at Prairie Meadows, Evangeline Downs, Louisiana Downs, and Lone Star Park.

The Broberg family released a statement over the weekend expressing sorrow and requesting privacy.

The Stronach Group has entered an agreement with Penn National Gaming Inc. to purchase Rosecroft Raceway, it was announced Monday. Completion of the purchase is dependent on approval of the Maryland Racing Commission and closing conditions, which are expected to be met by the end of June or early July.

Rosecroft is a Standardbred racing oval located in Fort Washington, Maryland. The Stronach Group currently operates both Thoroughbred tracks in the state, Laurel and Pimlico.
