



TAKE TWO FOR AIR FORCE BLUE



Air Force Blue will attempt to reverse his G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas flop in Saturday's G1 Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas | Racing Post

Those unable to believe that Air Force Blue (War Front) can bounce back from such a tame effort in the G1 2000 Guineas three weeks ago and win the G1 Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh on Saturday should bear in mind that when it comes to reviving fortunes in that short turnaround, Aidan O'Brien has previous form. Four years ago, Power (GB) ran a similar race at Newmarket before prevailing here, and that followed the win of the fellow Guineas also-ran Roderic O'Connor (Ire) for the stable 12 months previously. With a record 10 renewals to his name already, the current Ballydoyle conductor said in a recent interview that his biggest concern is whether Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G1 Phoenix S., G1 National S. and G1 Dewhurst S. winner has the stamina for a mile. "He is a very quick horse. The thing is, we're not probably going to be sure about whether he will get a mile or drop back to shorter distances, and the next couple of weeks will tell us a lot about him," he said of the bay, who will not be re-fitted with a tongue tie. "Anything I did for the English Guineas, I won't do again as it was a dramatic failure, really. Sometimes when you put a tongue tie on a horse and a cross noseband, it can make them slow down a little bit and he did that straight away in his canters." Cont. p2

HOLLINDALE REMATCH IN DOOMBEN CUP

Saturday's G1 Hardy Brothers Doomben Cup shapes up as somewhat of a rematch of the Gold Coast's G2 A.D. Hollindale S., with most of the leading contenders here exiting that 1800metre contest May 7. Leebaz (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) won the Hollindale for the second straight year, rebounding from a 13thplace finish in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at The Championships, which came on the back of a win in Caulfield's G3 Easter Cup over this trip. The Team Hawkes-trained Leebaz finished second in this two years ago, but beat just one home last year after leading early. Godolphin's Hauraki (Aus) (Reset {Aus}) was second in the Hollindale and has been consistent all season, hitting the board in all but one of five tries, including twice in Group 1 company, but he has not won for over a year and needs to prove once again that he wants to get his head in front. O'Brien continued, "I still won't believe that he is going to get a mile until I see it, but I would imagine looking at his work recently he is going to travel very strong early. The Curragh comes at a good time and it sorts out your plans for Ascot."

Like the 2009 winner Mastercraftsman (Ire), Air Force Blue's stablemate **Air Vice Marshal** (War Front) fared reasonably well in the Newmarket Classic, finishing fourth, and he is in the line-

up again alongside the two who were withdrawn from the Guineas at the declaration stage, **Bravery (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Shogun (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). All have to beat Al Shaqab Racing's 2000 Guineas titleholder **Galileo Gold (GB)** (Paco Boy {Ire}), with Michael O'Callaghan keen to accept the challenge with Qatar Racing Limited and Sheikh Khalifa Abdulla Al Thani's G3 Killavullan S. scorer **Blue de Vega (Ger)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}). Runner-up

to the re-opposing **Awtaad (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) attempting to give that rival three pounds in the May 2 Listed Tetrarch S. over seven furlongs here, he is expected to take closer order with that run under his belt.

"He is very well, in good order and we're looking forward to running him," O'Callaghan said. "He's come on a lot from his first run in the Tetrarch a couple of weeks ago. A mile is going to be his absolute minimum from now on. With his stout German pedigree, I'd say he's going to end up stepping up in trip. We'll take in the Guineas first and see where we go after that."

Chantilly's G3 Prix Vanteaux on Friday features the exciting **Maquette** (Tapit), Khalid Abdullah's homebred who earned '**TDN Rising Star**' status for Andre Fabre over a mile at Saint-Cloud in October. A daughter of the 2011 G1 Prix Jean Romanet winner Announce (GB) (Selkirk), the grey has everything in place for a bright future, but first has to come through this pattern test against some similarly unexposed rivals. Alain de Royer-Dupre supplies two, with His Highness The Aga Khan's **Dourdana (Fr)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) successful on her Maisons-Laffitte debut over a mile Apr. 26, and the Wildenstein Stables representative **Asterina (GB)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) coming in off a win also over that course and distance May 2. On that occasion, the half-sister to last year's G1 Prix du Moulin runnerup Akatea (Ire) (Shamardal) had a length to spare over stablemate Rosvana (Fr) (Dansili {GB}), who was only beaten just over three lengths when sixth in Monday's G1 Prix Saint-Alary.

IRELAND'S TURN FOR BREEZE-UP ACTION

The picturesque Co. Kilkenny racecourse Gowran Park is again the scene where 238 horses galloped on Thursday in advance of Friday's Goresbridge Breeze Up Sale. The track was riding on the easy side of good following some overnight rain that lingered on well into the morning. That didn't stop a large turnout of prospective buyers arriving in their quest to find the next Fiesolana (Ire) (Aussie Rules) or Music Show (Ire) (Noverre), two subsequent Group 1 winners sourced from the sale for a



combined total of just over €50,000. The European breeze-up market has been slightly hitand-miss this year, but Martin Donohoe is confident he has assembled the right cast of horses to help drive the sale up another notch.

Last year, turnover came in at \in 4.6 million, up just over a million on the previous year, and Donohoe said, "I'm very happy with the catalogue and I'd like to thank all the vendors who have supported us with such a good bunch of horses. Thankfully we've seen a lot of activity here today and yesterday. Cont. p4

He continued, "A lot of the major players seem to be present, so let's hope that plays out into some good, strong bidding."

Grove Stud provided the sale topper last year when selling the subsequent winner Semra (Candy Ride {Arg}) for €170,000, but unfortunately one of their interesting offerings, lot 89, a half-sister to Giovanni Boldini (War Front) by The Factor, has been withdrawn. Brendan Holland's farm, fresh from another successful Argana sale, still offers an interesting trio including lot 49. This son of Kyllachy (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) has had a nice pedigree update recently with his half-sister Squash (GB) (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}) finishing second in the G3 Lanwades Stud Nell Gwyn S. and third in the G3 Betfred Chartwell Fillies S. at Lingfield. He put in a good, professional breeze and looks sure to be popular. Following a Group 1 double last weekend courtesy of Belardo (Ire) and Jemayel (Ire), stock by Lope De Vega (Ire) (Shamardal) are bound to be sought after, and Con Marnane consigns a filly by the Ballylinch Stud sire through his Bansha House Stables. Lot 102 has an attractive pedigree, being a half-sister to a stakes-winning 2-year-old in Boca Dancer (Ire) (Indian Ridge {GB}), and cost €30,000 as a yearling at Goffs last year.

Charles O'Neill and the team at Irish Thoroughbred Marketing have worked hard over the years alongside Martin Donohoe to bring this sale to where it is now, and O'Neill is hopeful their latest innovation involving Kranji Racecourse in Singapore will prove a success. "The sale will be streamed live in the owners' lounge at Kranji and prospective buyers have the ability to bid on horses through a Goresbridge representative at the track. It's exciting and hopefully something we can build on in the future," said the ITM CEO. "We're also pleased to see increased representation from Greece and the Middle East, so we're hoping for a solid day of trade," added O'Neill.

After breezing and some further inspections, those still at Gowran Park attended the Mark O'Hanlon memorial buffet, a now annual event held in memory of the former ITM executive who died last year. The sale commences at 10 a.m. on Friday morning in the Goresbridge Sales complex, and footage of the breeze show and the catalogue are available at www.irishhorse.com.

Skiffle could hardly have shaped with more promise on debut when third after a slow break in the 10-furlong Ascot maiden won by the giant Abingdon (Street Cry {Ire}) and confirmed that with a first black-type success in this former Oaks trial which used to be known as the Lupe. Better from the gate to race contentedly with two behind throughout the early stages, the bay needed to thread through rivals in early straight and when in the clear to pursue The Black Princess gave plenty to wear her down in the last 100 yards. "She was a different filly today. She was a bit more on her toes and jumped alertly, took a keen hold for a couple of furlongs but then just settled into a nice passage and rhythm and got a nice run round there," trainer Charlie Appleby said. "She's learnt a lot again today--as William [Buick] said, she is only going to improve stepping up to a mile and a half. She doesn't quicken, she lengthens well. She's a filly we've thought about for the [G2] Ribblesdale [S. at Royal Ascot June 16] and we thought we could just test the water here. I feel she's justified that now." Skiffle's group-placed dam Princesse Dansante is out of a half-sister to the leading sire Green Dancer from a family generally jam-packed with pattern-race performers. They include the G3 Prix Cleopatre winner Brooklyn's Dance (Fr) (Shirley Heights {GB}), dam of the Arc heroine Solemia (Ire) (Poliglote {GB}) and the G1 Prix du Jockey Club runner-up Prospect Park (GB) (Sadler's Wells), the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac and G1 Prix Saint-Alary heroine Silasol (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}), the G1 Grand Criterium-winning sire Okawango (Kingmambo) and the G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Juddmonte International hero and sire Authorized (Ire). NEW INTEGRITY UNIT FOR VICTORIA

Racing in the state of Victoria looks set to establish a new integrity unit after the Andrews Labor Government agreed in principle to recommendations made by Paul Bittar, according to *Racing.com*. Bittar last summer undertook a review of the integrity functions in Victoria under all three codes of racing–Thoroughbred, harness and greyhound–and recommended the establishment of the Victorian Racing Integrity Unit to encompass integrity services for all three codes. The VRIU would be a private, independent company, with the three codes are equal stakeholders and a five-member independent board. Bittar also recommended a cross-code Racing Appeals and Disciplinary Board.

"A criticism that is often made is that there is real or perceived interference from boards or the executive in integrity matters,"



Bittar told Racing.com. "I am hopeful that the creation of the VRIU as a fully independent body will eliminate the perception of conflict. I have had great access and direct engagement

with key executives from the three codes throughout the review process. I understand that the legislative timetable can be difficult, but I believe that the faster that these recommendations can be implemented then the better the chance of success. The idea and concept is one thing but successful implementation is the key."

The recommendations would be expected to take two years to implement. Racing Victoria Chairman Davie Moodie released a statement supporting the review, which read, "Racing Victoria acknowledges the receipt of the Bittar Review and welcomes the opportunity to discuss the report with government. Having just received the report, management and the board will take its time to digest the information within and the recommendations made and consider the implications for thoroughbred racing in Victoria. We support the principle of collaboration between the three racing codes and believe that our expertise and processes will be invaluable in helping to inform future discussions with Government, HRV and GRV. We also believe in continual development and strengthening of our integrity programs and resources, as maintaining the integrity of Victorian Thoroughbred racing is at the core of our existence."

The next breeding season in Australia is still three months away from its commencement on Sept. 1, yet already studs are putting up the 'book full' signs as the market becomes increasingly polarised towards the proven stallions, while of course the freshmen also remain as popular as ever. In this column we take a look at the five new stallions in Australia for 2016 standing for fees in excess of A\$25,000.

VANCOUVER (AUS) (Medaglia d'Oro--Skates {Aus}, Danehill) Coolmore Australia, A\$66,0000

After his European campaign, Vancouver will be arriving to commence his new position on the Coolmore Australia roster a matter of weeks prior to the beginning of the breeding season, as his return quarantine will begin the day after his planned G1 July Cup start. Vancouver was a brilliant 2-year-old in a country that craves as such, unbeaten in his four juvenile starts for Gai Waterhouse. He began with a victory in the first Sydney stakes race of the 2-year-old season, the Listed Breeders' Plate,



which has a remarkable record for producing future stallions, particularly in recent years. Current leading stallions Snitzel (Aus), Sebring (Aus) and Choisir (Aus) are all past winners, as are exciting young

stallions Smart Missile (Aus) and Pierro (Aus). Vancouver followed that up with victory in the G3 Canonbury S. before a sensational performance in the G2 Todman S., his performance on the clock exemplary, almost 1.5 seconds faster than the fillies' equivalent on the same day, won by subsequent Group 1 winner and Golden Slipper runner-up English (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}). In the Slipper he showed toughness and grit to go with his ability, overcoming barrier 16 to defeat English by almost a length.

Vancouver is the leading performer in Australia for Medaglia d'Oro, who is very quickly establishing himself as part of the rare group of stallions who are leading performers in both hemispheres. After a Golden Slipper winner last year, Medaglia d'Oro has followed up in Australia with a pair of group-winning juveniles in the current season: Astern (Aus), winner of the G2 Silver Slipper S.; and Tessera (Aus), winner of the G3 Canonbury S. Vancouver, like outstanding mare Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) produced from John Camilleri's select band of broodmares, also hails from an exceptional Australian pedigree, his dam Skates responsible for two further stakes winners including Group 1 winner Juste Moment (Aus). His second dam is G1 Doncaster H. winner Skating (Aus) (At Talaq), a blue hen producer of seven black-type horses, including group-winning 2-year-old Murtajill (Aus) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) and Magic Millions 2YO Classic winner Bradbury's Luck (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}).

Now in the care of Aidan O'Brien, Vancouver's European campaign of three planned races begins this Saturday at The Curragh in the G2 Greenlands S., with the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot also on the agenda before the July Cup.

PRIDE OF DUBAI (AUS) (Street Cry {Ire}--Al Anood {Aus}, by Danehill) Coolmore Australia, A\$55,000

The loss of Street Cry at just 12 years old is one which has been keenly felt worldwide, particularly in Australia, where he represented a valuable proven outcross option for a mare population saturated with Danehill blood. This affinity is ably demonstrated by his first domestically bred and raced son to retire to stud in Australia, G1 Blue Diamond S. winner Pride of

Dubai. Trained by Peter and Paul Snowden, Pride of Dubai's career began in Sydney with a third-placed effort behind 'TDN Rising Star' and subsequent Group 3 winner **Ottoman (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel

{Aus}) at Randwick before a switch to Melbourne. He was tremendously unlucky in the G3 Blue Diamond Prelude (C&G) at Caulfield, ending up too far back and meeting interference in running.

Despite this he managed to finish a fast-closing second to Of The Brave (Aus) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}). Such was the impression of the effort that he was sent off half Of The Brave's odds in the Blue Diamond itself, with only the Fillies' Prelude winner, Fontiton (Aus) (Turffontein {Aus}) shorter in the market. Much more went the way of Pride of Dubai on the big day, and he was always holding the charge of Reemah (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) to take out the race. He followed up his Blue Diamond win when completing an unprecedented double by taking the G1 ATC Sires' Produce S. at Randwick, defeating dead-heaters Rageese (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) and Odyssey Moon (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) by almost a length. Pride of Dubai then missed the entire spring campaign with bone bruising and, after disappointing on his return in the Autumn, was retired to stud as the winner of three of his five starts.

Like Vancouver, Pride of Dubai hails from an exceptional female line, his with an international flavour. He is out of the stakes-placed Al Anood, making him a half-brother to Melbourne listed winner Al Aneed (Aus) (More Than Ready). Al Anood is bred in the purple, a half-sister to G1 Prix de Diane winner Rafha (GB) (Kris {GB}), dam of four stakes winners, notably leading Irish stallion Invincible Spirit (Ire). She is also the dam of popular sire Kodiac (GB).

CRITERION (NZ) (Sebring {Aus}--Mica's Pride {Aus}, by Bite The Bullet, Newgate Stud Farm, A\$35,750

As far as longevity and racecourse performance goes, they don't come much more accomplished than Criterion. In four seasons of racing on three continents Criterion amassed an incredible A\$7,268,869 in earnings and was a winner from two to five years old. Twenty-six of his 36 lifetime starts came in Group 1 company and he was a winner four times at that elite level. As a 2-year-old he was amongst the best of his crop, a



winner against subsequent Group 1winner Sweet Idea (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) in November before going on to victories in the Listed Black Opal and the G2 Todman S., a race taken by many important stallions over the years,

including current top-10 stallions Exceed and Excel (Aus) and Written Tycoon (Aus). As a 3-year-old Criterion excelled upped in trip, winning the G1 Rosehill Guineas over 2000 metres--

defeating his now studmate and 2014/15 Horse of the Year Dissident (Aus) (Sebring {Aus})--and the G1 ATC Derby over 2400 metres at Randwick. Criterion's 4-year-old season saw him go winless for the first half of the year, but again he performed with great credit at the highest level, including on his first overseas trip when third to Designs on Rome in the G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin. He chose as good a day as any to return to the winners' circle when a superbly impressive winner of the G1 Queen Elizabeth S., the country's richest weight-for-age race, at Randwick at The Championships. The field of 12 that day included nine previous Group 1 winners, so to put daylight on such a field represented a top-class effort from Criterion. He then went once more on his travels, again third at Sha Tin, this time to Blazing Speed in the G1 QEII Cup before two creditable efforts in England. As a 5-year-old he returned to his best to defeat another strong field in the G1 Caulfield S. prior to running into a superstar at the top of her game when second to Winx (Aus) in the G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley, solidly accounting for the remainder of the field. In his next start Criterion would show incredible versatility for a horse who won a G2 race over six furlongs as a 2-year-old by finishing a strong third in the G1 Melbourne Cup over two miles, and probably unlucky not to finish even closer after suffering interference in transit. His best effort this autumn came when third to The United States (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Ranvet S. at Rosehill, and he retires to Newgate as the winner of seven of his 36 starts.

Criterion was retained by his breeder Sir Owen Glenn, and hails from a family which has been exceptionally productive in Australia. He is the best of three stakes winners for his dam Mica's Pride, who is herself a Group 3 winner in Sydney. This is a family littered with recent stakes winners, notably Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed Bull Point (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), who also retires to stud this year, commanding a A\$7,700 fee. His sire, Golden Slipper winner Sebring (Aus) (More Than Ready), is now well-established as one of the leading stallions in Australia, and will stand for a career-high A\$77,000 in 2016.

EXOSPHERE (AUS) (Lonhro {Aus}--Altitude {Aus}, by Danzero {Aus})

Darley Australia, A\$27,500

When he was on-song there is little doubt that Exosphere was a tremendous talent, his peformances in the G1 Golden Rose and the G2 Roman Consul in particuar both being as impressive on the clock as they were to the eye. A son of Lonhro, like Triple Crown winner Pierro (Aus), Exosphere was out before Christmas as a 2-year-old but fluffed his lines on debut. Given time in the paddock, he returned to win twice before the end of his 2-year-old year. He was an impressive winner at Kembla Grange and took a marked step-up in grade in his stride when similarly dominant in the G2 Skyline S. at Warwick Farm, accounting for subsquent Group 1-placer Odyssey Moon (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) by four lengths, his final 600 metre time on the day bettered only



by the year-older Group 1 winner First Seal (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). He was a leading fancy for the Golden Slipper, sent off at 7/2 behind 6/4 favourite Vancouver, but proved a disappointment, finishing last and

reportedly suffering from cardiac arrythmia. In his first three starts as a 3-year-old he suffered no such problems, an imperious winner by daylight on all three occasions. He defeated subsequent Group 1 winners Press Statement (Aus) (Hinchinbrook {Aus}) and Holler (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) in the G2 Run to the Rose, a performance he followed up in tremendous style when taking Sydney's 3-year-old showcase, the G1 Golden Rose, over 1400 metres by more than two lengths from Group 1 winner Speak Fondly (Aus) (Northern Meteor {Aus}). He then stepped back to 1200 metres for the G2 Roman Consul S. and produced staggering acceleration to account for a top-class field in a matter of strides, sauntering home more than three lengths ahead of his competition. Unfortunately that would be the final victory for Exosphere, below his best in his final three starts, and he retires to Darley Australia as winner of five of his 10 starts.

PRESS STATEMENT (AUS) (Hinchinbrook {Aus}--Kaaptive Empress {Aus}, by Kaaptive Edition {NZ}) Vinery Australia, A\$27,500

It is around 12 months ago to the day that Press Statement announced his arrival on the Australian racing scene, unbeaten



in his first three starts. After two wins in Sydney metropolitan company, he was pitched into Group 1 company at Doomben for the JJ Atkins S. Such was the impression of his two previous

victories that he was sent off second-favourite and he didn't disappoint, winning by almost a length.

As a 3-year-old he progressed to become leading 3-year-old miler of his crop in the spring, bouncing back from a below-par run in the Golden Rose to take the G2 Stan Fox S. over 1500 metres prior to a win in the G1 Caulfield Guineas over 1600 metres. Press Statement, and his pilot Hugh Bowman, did a good job in the Caulfield Guineas, overcoming a wide barrier in 14 of 16, sitting just off the pace and accounting for the field by daylight. He returned for his autumn campaign with a strong win the G2 Hobartville S. at Rosehill over 1400 metres, accounting for Le Romain (Aus) (Hard Spun) by over two lengths. That rival would turn the tables two weeks later in the G1 Randwick Guineas over 1600 metres, Press Statement enduring a chequered passage from barrier 12. Press Statement rounded off his career his a pair of efforts against older horses, the best of them when third behind Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) and Kermadec (NZ) (Teofilo {Ire}) in the G1 George Ryder S. at Rosehill. He retires to Vinery Australia the winner of six of his 11 starts.

Press Statement is the second JJ Atkins winner produced by his dam Kaaptive Empress, who is also responsible for 2001 winner Pressday (Aus) (Domesday {Aus}) when the race was known as the BRC TJ Smith Classic. He is from the first crop of Yarraman Park's stallion Hinchinbrook (Aus), a Group 3-winning half-brother to Snitzel who will stand for a fee of A\$38,500 in 2016, more than double his 2015 figure of A\$16,500.



O'NEILL SEEKS BLACK-EYED SUSAN/ PREAKNESS DOUBLE

Doug O'Neill looks to become just the third trainer ever to win the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. and GI Preakness S. in the same year, and the first since Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas completed the double in 1995 with champions Serena's Song and Timber Country. The California-based conditioner saddles morning-line favorite Land Over Sea (Bellamy Road) in the Friday feature at Pimlico, just one day before he is scheduled to send out undefeated GI Kentucky Derby hero Nyquist (Uncle Mo) as the favorite in the Preakness. The Reddam Racing colorbearer has spent the majority of her career chasing unbeaten champion Songbird (Medaglia d'Oro), finishing second to that "TDN Rising Star" in three of their six meetings. Taken to New Orleans to get away from Eclipse winner, Land Over Sea romped by 4 1/2 in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 26 and made an impressive late run to finish second behind a dominant performance from "TDN **Rising Star**" Cathryn Sophia (Street Boss) in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 6.

The chestnut's biggest competition will come from the only other Oaks runner returning in this spot, fourth-place finisher **Go Maggie Go** (Ghostzapper). A decisive debut winner sprinting at Gulfstream Mar. 13, the Mike Tarp homebred followed suit with an equally impressive victory when stretched to 1 1/16 miles in the GII Gulfstream Park Oaks next out Apr. 2. **Cont. p6**

"We at the Stronach Group believe that this is going to be an industry game changer," said Belinda Stronach, Chairman and President of The Stronach Group. "The Pegasus World Cup represents the Stronach Group's ongoing commitment to invest in the future of horseracing--to make it more viable, to make it more exciting and to modernize the sport to attract a whole new generation of fans."

"We were oversubscribed by Tuesday," added Jack Wolf, CEO of the Pegasus World Cup and founder of Starlight Racing. "We had 14 people wanting the 12 spots. One ended up partnering with another outfit and the other dropped out. Everybody is paid up and the deal is closed with the 12 entrants."

The Pegasus World Cup, to be contested at 1 1/8 miles, will replace the GI Donn H. on the Gulfstream Park stakes schedule for 2017. Horses running without Lasix in the Pegasus World Cup will receive a five-pound weight allowance.

Owners can choose to race, lease, contract or share a starter or sell their place in the starting gate. Original entrants will also have the first option to participate in future Pegasus World Cup races. All entrants will also share equally in 100% of the net income from handle, media rights, and sponsorships from the Pegasus World Cup. The winner's share of the purse is \$7 million. "We think it's a great new concept and obviously it was received really well," The Stronach Group's Chief Operating

Officer of Racing Tim Ritvo commented. "Gulfstream Park has been a brand like The Stronach Group to initiate new thoughts and new beliefs in racing and we hope that we can have an exceptional event."

As for the timing of the race, Ritvo said, "I think it's important to recognize that the placement of this race was not to be disruptive to any other successful series. It's in between the Breeders' Cup and Dubai World Cup and also scheduled before the breeding season."

BALTIMORE, Md. - With owners Paul and Zillah Reddam and trainer Doug O'Neill looking on from the press box porch, there were some brief anxious moments when their unbeaten GI Kentucky Derby winner **Nyquist** (Uncle Mo) went out for his



final gallop at Pimlico following the break Thursday morning. The 3-5 morning-line favorite for the GI Preakness S. stood calmly with the stable pony and assistant trainer Jack Sisterson by the outer rail near the quarter pole while a loose horse took off.

Pimlico apparently doesn't use a siren for situations like this, but lights did flash throughout the oval along the rail to warn riders of the dilemma at hand. Thanks to the heady work of an outrider, the horse was quickly apprehended near the wire before a packed house at Old Hilltop, including several enthusiastic families with young children.

With the sun attempting to find its way out through the clouds on another cool morning, Nyquist was joined on the track by **Collected** (City Zip) and '**TDN Rising Star' Cherry Wine** (Paddy O'Prado) at around 8:45 a.m.

For Nyquist, it was business as usual after the brief scare, galloping another strong 1 1/4 miles ahead of the big one Saturday with a drone from high above recording his every move.

Collected and Cherry Wine were right behind Nyquist, getting a good rise from the crowd of fans pointing out their yellow Preakness saddle towels as they came down the stretch in succession.

The handsome gray Cherry Wine, a rallying third in the GI Blue Grass S., got his first look at the track after arriving from Kentucky Wednesday afternoon and also schooled in the gate before his 1 1/2 miles of galloping. **Cont. p5** Last Chance 1200 catalogued

Nyquist is in a spot down there that if he were to get away slow it could be bad for him, because he could get caught up in the vacuum there. I'm sure they are going to be aggressive with him. Todd Pletcher saddles an interesting runner in Cheyenne Stables' **Kinsley Kisses** (Congrats), who opened her account with a pair of eye-catching victories sprinting in Florida, first at Gulfstream Jan. 16 and then at Tampa Mar. 13. Third behind the undefeated Lightstream (Harlan's Holiday) and GISW Nickname (Scat Daddy) in the seven-panel GIII Adena Springs Beaumont S. Apr. 17, the chestnut tries two turns for the first time here.

Magdalena Racing's **Dothraki Queen** (Pure Prize) gets back on dirt for the first time since last November in this event. Opening her account with a seven-length graduation on the turf last summer, the Ken McPeek trainee followed that with a win in the GII Pocahontas S. on the Churchill main track and was second in the GI Alcibiades S. Running on late to finish a respectable third behind Songbird and Rachel's Valentina (Bernardini) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Oct. 31, the bay finished fourth, but was promoted to third via DQ in the GII Golden Rod S. Nov. 28 and was a non-factor eighth last time behind Canadian Horse of the Year Catch a Glimpse (City Zip) in Keeneland's grassy GIII Appalachian S. Apr. 14.



TRIO SHARE BULLET AS F-T MIDLANTIC

SHOW CONCLUDES by Jessica Martini

TIMONIUM, Md - The sun finally shown on Timonium as the three-session under-tack preview of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale concluded Thursday with a trio of youngsters tying the bullet furlong mark of :10 flat and two juveniles sharing the show's fastest quarter-mile time of :21 2/5.

Hip 527, a filly by Into Mischief, was first to turn in the bullet quarter-mile work of :21 2/5. Out of Firey Glow (Smoke Glacken), she is a half to Panamanian champion Normandia (Scat Daddy). The filly was purchased by Susan Moulton for \$110,000 out of this year's Fasig-Tipton Florida sale and is consigned to the Midlantic auction by Nick De Meric's De Meric Sales.

"That was a super breeze for a nice filly who has trained really well at home on the farm," De Meric said. "She wasn't with us, she was with my friend Danny Pate, and she had been working really well at home and she had a very good prep up here."

Asked if the intention was always to resell the filly later in the spring, De Meric said, "That would be a question for Susan Moulton. But I think at the [Florida sale] she didn't have any clear intentions, it was a little bit of an impulsive move. But when she started coming around in her training, it seemed like there was an opportunity there and she decided to take advantage of it." Cont. p9

A filly by Uncle Mo (<u>hip 490</u>) tied the <u>:21 2/5</u> mark later in the session. Consigned by Pike Racing, the dark bay filly is out of Dream Street (Tale of the Cat) and is a half-sister to graded stakes placed Lassofthemohicans (Indian Charlie).

"We thought she was special all winter," said Al Pike. "She's been fun to train--she never had a bad day, she loves her job. We're very excited that she showed up today and breezed well."

The dark bay filly was purchased privately after RNA'ing for \$80,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

"I bought her privately for a good client of mine from Lafayette, Louisiana named Danny Saloom," Pike said of the filly's ownership. "And Tom VanMeter, the breeder, stayed in and I think he has some partners in her. So it's a group of us."

Justin Casse's Casse Sales sent out its third furlong bullet worker of the show Thursday when <u>hip 568</u>, a filly by First Samurai, worked in <u>:10 flat</u> during the day's first set. Out of Grand September, the youngster is from the family of Grade I winner Grasshopper.

Also working in <u>:10 flat</u> during Thursday's first set was <u>hip 592</u>, a daughter of More Than Ready from the Grassroots Training & Sales consignment. The dark bay is out of stakes winner Holly's Way (Seattle Fitz {Arg}).

Scanlon Training & Sales was represented by a <u>:10 flat</u> worker Thursday in <u>hip 461</u>, a colt by Friesan Fire out of stakes winner Crafty Toast (Crafty Prospector).

The preview show began on a rainy and chilly Tuesday, continued with overcast skies and temperatures in the low 50s Wednesday and concluded with a sunny session and temperatures in the 60s Thursday. In all, six horses worked in :10 flat during the three-day preview. While the show's fastest quarter-mile time of :21 2/5 was hit twice Thursday, an additional six juveniles worked in the second-fastest time of :21 3/5 throughout the three sessions.

"It was a good week," said Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sales Director Paget Bennett. "Obviously today was the prettiest day, but I think the track has been pretty even. It could have been a lot worse, luckily it was just kind of a drizzle Tuesday and it was as even as you could expect with what we had. There were :10 flats throughout the three days."

De Meric, who also had a bullet quarter-mile worker in <u>hip 112</u>, who worked in <u>:21 3/5</u> Tuesday, agreed the track was fair throughout the week.

"I think the guys up here do a great job with the racetrack," he said. "Obviously, the weather wasn't perfect coming into it, but I think they kept it very safe and pretty consistent over the three days. I really don't think you could have any complaints about the surface." Of the track condition, Pike added, "It was wet and rainy earlier, but I thought the times were fairly consistent. I thought Fasig and the track crew did a great job. There were fast horses every day."
