LYNCH HOPING GRASS IS GREEN ON BOTH SIDES

Trainer Brian Lynch will be in New York to saddle the promising 3-year-old **Hammers Vision** (Court Vision) in Belmont's GIII Pennine Ridge S. Saturday, but the 52-year-old will also be keeping a close eye on the action on the West Coast some two hours later when turf stalwart **Heart to Heart** (English Channel) bids for his first Grade I victory in the Shoemaker Mile at Santa Anita. The latter, known for doing his best work on the front end, set the pace and held on to be a gritty second behind Miss Temple City (Temple City) in Keeneland's GI Maker's Mark Mile Apr. 15. Contacted by phone Wednesday afternoon, Lynch confirmed that the 5-year-old has emerged from that effort in good order and is seemingly primed for another top performance.

"We're really happy with him going into the race," Lynch said. "It doesn't look like a really big field out there, but Grade Is are never easy to win. Hopefully he takes his A-game out there, and if he does, I think he'll be very tough."

Lynch said he received some good news Wednesday when he learned that confirmed speedball Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}), winner of the Shoemaker in both 2013 and 2014, would not be in the starting gate for this year's renewal.



Nevertheless, the trainer acknowledged that West Coast turf races often feature more hotly contested paces than their East Coast counterparts, leaving some uncertainty about the likelihood of Heart to Heart securing his ideal trip.

"He's very effective when he's left alone on the lead, but who knows with how races are run in California," Lynch continued. "There might be other speed as quick as him."

While Heart to Heart's game is old hat to Lynch at this point in his career, the conditioner is still in the process of assessing what works best for the younger Hammers Vision. Scooped up by owner Terry Hamilton for a modest \$47,000 as a Fasig-Tipton October yearling, the bay returned immediate dividends with a first-out victory going six furlongs over the Belmont lawn last July. Hammers Vision subsequently competed in three stakes events--including a third-place finish in the GII Saratoga Special behind GI Preakness S. hero Exaggerator (Curlin)--and returned from a winter layup with a sharp runner-up finish in a seven-panel turf dash in New York May 7.

Although Hammers Vision's three best efforts have come at sprint distances, Lynch said he hopes the Pennine Ridge will give him a better read on his trainee's ability to handle an extended distance.

"He's an Ontario-bred horse and he's obviously eligible for the [10-furlong] Queen's Plate, so I thought we'd give him a chance going a mile and an eighth against that group of horses on the turf," Lynch explained. "If he was to run well, it gives us a little incentive to maybe contemplate the Queen's Plate. I thought he ran a great race off the bench. Can he run [nine furlongs]? That's going to be the test for him. He obviously likes the course there,

and he sort of made a bit of an early move in his comeback race and it emptied him out a bit."

Lynch's undefeated sophomore filly Lightstream (Harlan's Holiday), winner of Keeneland's GIII Beaumont S. in her second career start Apr. 17, proved her versatility in capturing the Soaring Softly S. in her first try on turf at Belmont May 21. The Aussie said that although that win gives him plenty of options with Lightstream

going forward, the plan is to return her to dirt for the GI Mother Goose S. in New York July 2.

"She came out of the race well and we'll probably think about the Mother Goose for her," Lynch offered. "We'll give her a little time and it falls into what we're trying to do with her, a mile and a sixteenth going one turn at Belmont."



Lynch also reported that his pair of veteran turfers, GISW **Grand Arch** (Arch) and GSW **Power Alert (Aus)** (Alert {Arg}), exited their respective third-place finishes in the May 21 GII Longines Dixie S. and May 6 GIII Twin Spires Turf Sprint S. in good order. Power Alert will be given a brief freshening prior to a try in the GIII Parx Dash H. in July, while Grand Arch will target the GIII Poker S. at Belmont June 18.

Even though I wasn't surprised--after all, I witnessed the end of live Thoroughbred racing in 2002, watched the last harness horse depart in 2009, saw what was once the stable area sold to a local developer and demolished, and knew the rest of the property was on the market--the finality of it all hit home. Hard.

"It's one of those places, like the house you grew up in, that you think will always be there. It's so strange and sad to find out that it's really going to be gone," said Donna Barton Brothers, who was an apprentice in Rockingham's jockey colony in 1987 before she went on to become one of the sport's most successful female riders and an on-air analyst and reporter for NBC Sports and TVG. *Cont. p4*

"That track was where I cut my teeth as far as riding goes," she said. "I learned so much about riding there from people like Phil Ernst and Bennie Carrasco and some of those really good, old riders like Carl Gambardella and Rudy Baez, who for whatever reason ended up at Rockingham. I rode with some world class riders."

Speaking of the greats, old black-and-white photos of Eddie Arcaro, Johnny Longdon, and Bill Shoemaker still adorn the walls of Rockingham's clubhouse from their time here. Pat Day hung his tack in the jocks' room when he was a bug, and Chris McCarron to this day is revered as the local kid who made good. Trainer Shug McGaughey won his first race at Rockingham and

fellow Hall of Famer Bobby Frankel captured the one and only \$500,000 New England Classic with Marquetry in 1991 as part of the nationally televised American Championship Racing Series.

Dr. Fager and Roman Brother, each a Horse of the Year in the

1960s, won the New Hampshire Sweepstakes in that race's earliest days, and 1985 Filly Triple Crown winner Mom's Command made her debut a success in a stakes race at The Rock. Seabiscuit's beginnings weren't as auspicious; with Red Pollard up, they lost all five starts during the horse's juvenile season in 1935 when based here.

In more recent times, Little Silver Charm, the official "spokeshorse" for equine rescue at Old Friends, came from Rockingham. After Lorita Lindemann, now an assistant trainer in New York, pulled him off a van headed to the kill buyers, he was a backside mascot until Michael Blowen eventually took him along when he established Old Friends in Kentucky.



Incidentally, at the time Blowen was working as a groom for a claiming trainer in addition to his regular job as a successful Boston Globe columnist.

Looking back through the decades, contributions of major significance to the industry had their genesis at Rockingham.

Smith, who was affectionately known as "Uncle Lou" when he owned the track from 1931 until his death in 1969, was a founding father of the HBPA in 1956 and the idea for the national organization was said to have been hatched in the track kitchen. In 1958, Smith was the Jockey's Guild Man of the Year because Rockingham was the first track to offer insurance for riders and institute other measures to benefit their safety and welfare. *Cont. p5*

Rockingham's once lush and verdant turf course, considered by horsemen to rival only Keeneland's, has gone completely to seed and the main track is equally untended and overgrown with weeds. In three months, the last simulcasts will be shown in

"I'm grateful that I still have the win pictures," said Barton Brothers.

And I'll always be grateful for the memories.

LANI BREEZES FOR BELMONT

Koji Maeda's Lani (Tapit) breezed five furlongs in 1:02.09 (13/16) Wednesday morning at Belmont in preparation for the June 11 GI Belmont S.

Under exercise rider Eishu Maruucha, the quirky gray was



clocked in splits of :12 3/5, :25 and :37. He galloped out five furlongs in 1:02.09 and six in 1:15 4/5.

"It was quite a nice work," said Keita Tanaka, the agent representing Japan-based trainer Mikio Matsunaga. Winner of the

G2 UAE Derby, the Japanese-based colt finished ninth in the GI Kentucky Derby May 7 and fifth in the GI Preakness S. May 21. Lani joins Preakness winner Exaggerator (Curlin) as the only two Belmont runners to compete in all three legs of the Triple Crown. Cont. p6

"Before the Preakness, [he was training] quite good, so I wouldn't say [there has been] a dramatic improvement since then," Tanaka said. "But it looks like, at least, that he's keeping his very good condition before the Preakness up to now. We have been looking forward to this race of these three races. This race might be the most credible for him."

Matsunaga will be on hand for Lani's final work before the Belmont Wednesday and jockey Yutaka Take will arrive in New York Wednesday or Thursday.

Rep. Rooney also is one of 17 members of Congress who signed a letter to the Department of Treasury requesting clarification to regulations regarding the way parimutuel winnings are calculated for tax withholding and reporting purposes, an issue spearheaded by the NTRA and its lobbying team at the Alpine Group.

He romped in his first attempt on the East Coast for Francis Abbott, running off with a Pimlico maiden special weight in the mud at six furlongs May 13. Heavily favored at 3-5 here, he vied for command through a :47.39 half mile and dug in down the stretch to win going away by three lengths. Rapo (Pleasantly Perfect) was second. Moon River (Bluegrass Cat) tossed rider Keiber Coa at the start. Sales history: \$47,000 RNA Ylg '14 FTKJUL; \$120,000 Ylg '14 EASSEP. Lifetime Record: 4-2-1-0, \$55,050. KENTUCKY

Churchill Downs to Boost Overnight Purses 4%:

Effective Thursday, June 2, Churchill Downs Racetrack will raise overnight race purse offerings 4% thanks to record Kentucky Derby week business levels. Purses for overnight races--which include overnight stakes, allowance, maiden special weight, claiming and maiden claiming events--will rise by an approximate blended average of \$1,500 per race.

Total overnight purses for the meet are projected to be \$13 million, up from the original forecast of \$12.4 million. The daily average purse distribution, not including stakes money, will be approximately \$341,100 per day. That number grows to \$555,500 when stakes money is included.

The purse boosts were made possible by record all sources wagering on Kentucky Derby week, which covered opening night Apr. 30 through Kentucky Derby Day May 7. The six days of racing lured a record-breaking 376,980 fans and a record \$266.8 million in wagers.

"Our record Kentucky Derby Week business levels helped generate \$17.7 million in purses that will be paid to horsemen this year," said Kevin Flanery, President of Churchill Downs Racetrack. "We're thrilled that our local owners, trainers, jockeys and breeders will benefit from the increased purse offering over the final five weeks of the Spring Meet."

Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Farm was prominent at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale two years ago when buying subsequent Group 1 winner Miracles Of Life (Aus) (Not A Single Doubt {Aus}) for A\$900,000, and the U.S.-based operation made another big splash on the opening day of that sale on Wednesday when spending A\$1.9 million on the session-topping Bounding (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) (lot 611). The 5-year-old Bounding--who was consigned by Glenn Burrows's Willow Park Stud, where she was born and raised-won the G1 Railway S. in New Zealand as a 3-year-old and was also second in the G1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas. Bounding won last year's G3 Theshark.com.au S. for trainers Peter and Paul Snowden, who trained Miracles Of Life to win last year's G1 William Hill Classic in the Stonestreet colours.

With the exact same number of horses–212–offered Wednesday as last year's opening day, figures were well-up. A total of A\$28,147,000 was realized for the 172 sold yesterday, compared to A\$22,633,500 for 178 sold on day one last year. 



BHA DISCIPLINARY PRACTICES SET FOR REVIEW

The British Horseracing Authority, in the wake of the controversy surrounding the case of trainer Jim Best, has revealed its intended actions to ensure future disciplinary panels are free of perceived bias.

Best was found guilty in March of instructing jockey Paul John to stop two horses and was handed a four-year suspension, but that decision was thrown out after it was discovered solicitor Mattew Lohn was being paid to do other work for the BHA, creating an appearance of bias. Best's case will be re-heard later this year.

The BHA has appointed Christopher Quinlan, an independent expert in the field of sports governance and regulation, to review the structure, composition and operation of its disciplinary panel, appeal board and licensing committee. This review will be accelerated, with recommendations due Sept. 13.

In the meantime, the BHA has laid out a series of steps it will take to ensure confidence in its disciplinary process, including not engaging any disciplinary member who has had paid work with the BHA outside of the panel or on directly related matters.

"The issues that have been raised in connection with our disciplinary processes primarily concern perceptions of fairness and the appearance of bias," said BHA Chief **Executive Nick Rust.**

"There have been no

suggestions of actual bias against the Disciplinary Panel or its individual members. As chief executive, I have sought to act promptly and decisively to deal with concerns raised, and following the provision by the Appeal Board of its reasons for its decision on the Jim Best case, I can now publish the actions we have already put in place to ensure that our sport and its participants can have the greatest confidence in the integrity of disciplinary cases, now and in the future."

TBA, BHA LAUNCH FILLY CAMPAIGN

Edited Press Release

The Thoroughbred Breeders' Association and the British Horseracing Authority have launched the #thisfillycan campaign to promote the benefits of buying, owning and training fillies and mares for flat racing.

The BHA recently undertook a review to better understand the profile of fillies in training, their race opportunities and their ability to compete against colts over the last decade. In part, the review showed that about 700 flat races are now programmed exclusively for fillies, 40% more than 10 years ago; the median prize fund available in fillies' races was above that of open races in each of the last 10 years; and once rated 75, the average filly earns more prize money each season than the average colt. Below 75, both sexes earn a similar amount. Cont. p5

"Despite equal numbers of fillies and colts being born each year, by the time horses are registered in training, the split between fillies and colts is more commonly 40/60," said BHA's Director of International Racing and Racing Development, Ruth Quinn. "Further, we have 1,296 more colts in training today than 10 years ago, but only 227 more fillies, albeit we are seeing a significant uplift in the quality of fillies, particularly those rated 85 and above.

By highlighting the significant opportunities available to fillies, and their overall earning potential, we hope to close the gap by positively changing the perceptions of breeders, owners and trainers to realise that fillies can be an excellent prospect on the racetrack, which can only benefit all corners of the industry."



The 2014 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale was all about the disperal of Teeley Assets, which had cultivated some of the most prized jewels of the Australia stud book including the dynasty of Shantha's Choice (Aus) (Canny Lad {Aus}), herself a descendant of the immortal Best In Show. Shantha's Choice's stakes-producing daughter Monsoon Wedding (Aus) (Danehill) was a A\$2.3 million purchase by Coolmore from the Teeley dispersal, and on Wednesday Teeley offered that mare's winning daughter **Crystal Flute (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) (lot 1348), who was hammered down to the China Horse Club's Michael Wallace for A\$1.4 million.

"World-class pedigrees are hard to acquire," Wallace said.

"She's a young mare and we can start her breeding career how we like. With a pedigree like this she's a foundation mare that you have for the next 10 or 15 years, and build families and foundations from."

Crystal Flute, a winner at Warwick Farm and Hawkesbury this autumn for trainer Gerald Ryan in the Teeley silks, is a full-sister to stakes winners Precious Lorraine (Aus) and Lucky Raquie (Aus).

Monsoon Wedding is herself a full-sister to Australia's three-time champion sire Redoute's Choice (Aus) and Group 1 winner Platinum Scissors (Aus). She is a half-sister to G1 Sires' Produce S. winner and sire Manhattan Rain (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) and Sliding Cube (Aus) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}), the dam of the speedy 'TDN Rising Star', dual group winner and young Coolmore sire Rubick (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}).

The 4-year-old Bring Me The Maid has high-class juvenile form stamped all over her catalogue page. Her dam, the winning 2-year-old Maid For Me (Aus) (Belong To Me), is a half-sister to the 2003 G1 Golden Slipper winner Polar Success (Aus) (Success

"She was a great racemare," Hawthorne said.

"She ran third in a Golden Slipper and she'd won a lot of prize money. She was a consistent performer from an early 2-year-old to her 3-year-old career. She's got a race record behind her and she's a big physical type of mare."

Hawthorne also pointed out that Bring Me The Maid has Danehill only in her fourth generation.

"Also the fact that the Danehill factor was further back, which gives us options [for stallions]," he said. "We'd been battling away all day--it's very hard to get these good mares."

Also selling to New Zealand connections Wednesday was **Real Surreal (Aus)** (Real Saga {Aus}) (<u>lot 539</u>), who was picked up by Bruce Perry Bloodstock for A\$800,000. The 5-year-old mare, offered as a breeding prospect, won the Magic Millions 2YO Classic and is a half-sister to Group 3 winner Benny's Buttons (Aus) (Refuse To Bend {Aus}).

Other high-profile sales Wednesday included the 2014 Schweppes Oaks victress May's Dream (Aus) (New Approach {Ire}) (lot 505), who sold for A\$720,000 to Willcox Bloodstock. Consigned by Edinglassie Stud as a breeding prospect, May's Dream is a daughter of the G1 South Australian Oaks winner She's Archie (Aus) (Archway {Aus}).

Agent Tim Stakemire, who often works with Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum, picked up the only mare catalogued in foal to Tapit, **Morning Fix** (First Samurai) (<u>lot 721</u>), for A\$620,000. The 5-year-old, a three-time winner and third in the GIII Senorita S., was covered by the reigning American champion sire on Southern Hemisphere-time. Her dam, Coffee (El Corredor), is a half-sister to the dam of Gl Kentucky Oaks winner Summerly (Summer Squall).

Upon the conclusion of trade Wednesday, when 14 lots fetched in excess of A\$500,000, Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said, "It's just been spectacular. From so many levels it was a pleasure to be a part of. The numbers are way, way up as you'd expect with so many high-priced horses. The average itself is up A\$36,000 and the gross is up A\$5.5 million on last year."

"There was a lot of international money and people still with their powder dry with a couple more days to come," he added. "We have some great broodmare prospects still to come and there will be some great opportunities across all levels of the market."

The second session of the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale begins at 10 a.m. Thursday.
