

GUN RUNNER IMPRESSES IN WORK

Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}), working towards a rematch with GI Kentucky Derby winner Nyquist (Uncle Mo) in the July 31 GI Betfair.com Haskell Invitational, turned heads at Saratoga Monday morning with a five-furlong work in :59.92 for trainer Steve Asmussen. It was the fastest of 10 works at the distance over the Oklahoma training track.

"We're pretty happy with the work; everybody said he worked really well," said David Fiske, racing manager for Winchell Thoroughbreds, which co-owns the colt with Three Chimneys Farm and Besilu Stables.

Gun Runner opened his sophomore season with wins in the GII Risen Star S. and GII Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds. He was a gritty third behind Nyquist after contesting the pace in the Derby and opened the second half of his season with a resounding 5 1/4-length tally in the June 18 GIII Matt Winn S.

"He has been getting bigger and stronger throughout the entire year," Fiske said. "He's feeling great and moving great and apparently worked great this morning.

Fiske continued, "I was able to look at him a lot when he was at Churchill, since I'm in Lexington all the time, but he gets out of my sight from time to time when he is in New Orleans or up at Saratoga. So whenever I see him, I am always a little surprised by how well he looks and how much bigger and more mature he is." **Cont. p3**

Gaudet's Star Shines Bright *(cont. from p1)*

A daughter of retired multiple graded stakes-winning conditioner Ed Gaudet, Gabby heads back to The Spa less than four years after writing for the *Saratoga Special*, her first serious racing media gig.

"I'm looking forward to returning to Saratoga because it's my favorite track," Gaudet said, beaming. "The feeling you get when you walk on the backstretch is almost magical and there's nothing like it. On a professional level, I'm really excited to get experience working with a television network like Fox Sports 2, while also working with the best in the industry in terms of on-air hosts. I also hope that it exposes me to work for the top events like the Breeders' Cup, the Triple Crown and with networks like NBC. If the opportunity arises to dive into other sports, I'm definitely a big sports fan and am striving for that, as well."

"My dad was a trainer in the Mid-Atlantic for many years and officially retired a few years ago after we ran a horse in the Preakness," Gaudet continued. "My mom was his right-hand woman the entire time and now is a trainer, as is my sister. I also had an uncle who trained, two aunts who were jockeys and another uncle who was a farrier--so being in racing started from birth, practically. I galloped horses for [trainers] Tim Keefe and Hamilton Smith and interned at Maryland Horse Radio, but I really started in media after my junior year of college when I went to work with Sean Clancy at the *Saratoga Special*. From there, the Maryland Jockey Club offered me a job doing on-air analysis during the Pimlico meet and followed that with Arlington in 2014, the 2014 Breeders' Cup with HRRN (Horse Racing Radio Network) and then worked for the Breeders' Cup itself in 2015 before joining Gulfstream Park for the Championship Meet--all the while working for the Maryland Jockey Club in the fall and spring." *Cont. p4*

Gaudet continued, "So, needless to say it's sort of all taken off and I feel very blessed."

Studious in profession as she is infectious in personality, Gaudet has impressed even the most rooted of racing fans with her knowledge and performance the last few years. This past winter, in her first stretch at Gulfstream, she more than held her own with one of the game's most respected racing analysts, NYRA's Andy Serling.

"Working alongside Andy this winter really was a huge part of why Saratoga is happening," she explained. "I had hoped Gulfstream would lead to other opportunities and it did. I learned a lot from working on air with him and also got to meet some great people in the process. I'm really thankful that the Maryland Jockey Club has been extremely supportive of me going to Gulfstream and Saratoga. They not only want what's best for their own tracks and obviously would love to have me there all year, but they also want what's best for me--and that's been really helpful and says a lot about the MJC."

While it can obviously be helpful in a legacy-heavy industry to come from a racing family, especially in a state as entrenched in racing history as Maryland, Gaudet recognizes that the kindred coin has two sides.

"When I first started out a lot of people would say I only got jobs because my parents were trainers," Gaudet said. "That

negative connotation that I didn't work hard to get where I am is never fun to deal with. Yes, maybe it did create opportunities, but--and I hate to be corny--*luck is where preparation meets opportunity* and you don't get far without doing the work. Coming from a racing family can feel like an anchor with your critics, but it also gives me a perspective that not a lot of people have had and can be a springboard, too. I've experienced the hard work in the mornings with grooming, galloping and training and know how to incorporate that into analysis in the afternoon.

"I'm a perfectionist at my craft and I can be very 'Type A' when it comes to being prepared," she continued. "I don't like the uneasy feeling of not knowing, so I do my homework."

“I watch replays, run stats and actually understand that, yes, in a race a horse was checked and I didn’t just read it in the short comments,” Gaudet continued. “The people who are actually tuning in and could use that information deserve that service. I try to constantly improve in those things and I hope that I’ve earned respect on my own merits. But don’t get me wrong--when work is over, I am the polar opposite and try to enjoy myself and live life to its fullest.”

No matter what comes of her expanded exposure on a major network in this next career cornerstone, Gaudet seems poised to prove herself even more than she has in such a short tenure. Possibly even more importantly, the 25-year-old appears to have processed and tempered her existing and past successes with diligence and maturity beyond her years.

“I just hope that I keep taking steps in the right direction and challenge myself to perfect my craft,” she concluded. “I feel very fortunate and I don’t take being able to have these experiences for granted. A Travers dead-heat, watching a Triple Crown with American Pharoah, seeing the spectacle of the Arlington Million and watching big fields filled with some of the best horses in the world... being able to witness these things doesn’t feel like work at all, but I am very lucky that it is.”

STRONG START FOR DEL MAR

Del Mar’s three-day opening weekend produced solid figures, with on-track attendance up 13.4% and overall handle up 14.3% during racing Friday through Sunday.

“It was great to see San Diegans and racing fans in general respond so positively to our opening week,” said Del Mar Thoroughbred Club president Joe Harper. “Good crowds; good racing; good action at the window--that’s what Del Mar’s all about.”

Kicked off with an opening-day crowd of 42,562, attendance for the weekend totalled 76,962 for an average of 25,654, according to figures released by the track. Last year’s three-day opening average was 22,613. Overall, the track saw wagering reach \$15,827,100 per day, a rise of nearly \$2 million above last year’s \$13,848,778 three-day average.

California off-track wagering for the weekend was up 12.3% with a rise of more than \$600,000 per day, while out-of-state wagering was up 22% at more than \$1.2 million each afternoon above the 2015 digits for the three days. After three cards, on-track wagering was up 1.7%.

The Del Mar summer meet runs through Labor Day, Sept. 5.

Kentucky Downs and Laurel Park will host automatic qualifying races for the Dec. 3, 2016 Claiming Crown at Gulfstream Park, Claiming Crown Limited announced Monday. The tracks will pay nomination fees and provide a travel stipend for the winners to compete in the main event.

The Claiming Crown, a joint venture between Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and the National HBPA, is racing's \$1.1 million showcase for the country's best claiming horses. Kentucky Downs will run a pair of automatic qualifying races for the Claiming Crown Emerald and Tiara Sept. 11. Laurel will host its Claiming Crown Preview Day and offer automatic qualifying races for all nine Claiming Crown races Nov. 6.

"Kentucky Downs is proud to host two Claiming Crown automatic qualifying races at our fall meet," said Kentucky Downs senior vice president/general manager Ted Nicholson. "Run over our unique, European-style turf course with \$75,000 purses, these races are sure to have full, competitive fields and provide quality contenders for the Claiming Crown races at Gulfstream Park in December. We are thrilled to offer these races for our horsemen and fans as we continue to improve the racing product during our race meeting."



No owner-breeder can be totally happy when a mare or filly culled from their broodmare band goes on to shine for her new owner. The practicalities, though, are that quite a few fillies and mares have to be sold simply to keep an operation's numbers manageable--especially so if the breeder is keen to keep adding new blood to the genetic pool.

In reality, occasionally letting something worthwhile slip through the net is the best way of ensuring that demand stays high and that the surplus mares and fillies achieve maximum value. In which case, the Aga Khan can expect fierce competition for his superfluous fillies and mares later this year.

In recent years the Aga Khan Studs have sold Lidana, a 3-year-old daughter of King's Best, for €38,000 at Goffs' 2008 November Breeding Stock Sale; Darkova, a 3-year-old Maria's Mon filly, for €16,000 at Arqana's 2011 Breeding Stock Sale; and Hazariya, a 12-year-old broodmare, for €480,000 at Goffs' 2014 November Sale.

In the space of less than two months, sons of these three mares have accomplished an extraordinary sequence of major successes. Hazariya's colt Harzand won the G1 Derby and G1 Irish Derby, Darkova's son Almanzor took the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and now Lidana's son Mont Ormel has won the G1 Grand Prix de Paris, with all three highlighting the latent Classic potential of the Aga's wonderful families. Although the Grand Prix de Paris doesn't officially carry Classic status, it could be considered a truer equivalent to the Derby and Irish Derby than the Prix du Jockey-Club. **Cont. p2**

'LUCIA', 'ROMAIN' TRIAL AT WYONG

Three-time Australian Group 1 winner **Lucia Valentina (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}) was given an easy time of it when last in an 845-metre Wyong trail Monday morning, according to *racing.com*. It was the Kris Lees trainee's first public appearance since landing the 2000-metre G1 Longines Queen Elizabeth S. Apr. 9. Lucia Valentina settled one from the rear early before closing three wide to finish three lengths behind the winner, while under tight restraint. She is targeting the G2 Warwick S. at Randwick Aug. 20, where she will face superstar Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}).

Earlier in the day, G1 Randwick Guineas winner **Le Romain (Aus)** (Hard Spun) also tuned up for his spring opener--the 1200-metre Show Country Quality--with a second-place finish in his barrier trial. The Kris Lees trainee jumped well and took up position in a stalking third before taking second, while under no encouragement.



Mont Ormel also continued the remarkable success story being enjoyed this year by owner Gerard Augustin-Normand and two of his stallions standing at the Vidals' Haras de la Cauviniere. Le Havre sired the dual French Classic winner La Cressonniere, who is co-owned by Augustin-Normand, as is Prix du Jockey-Club winner Almanzor. And it was Air Chief Marshal, a son of Danehill Dancer, who sired Mont Ormel in his second crop.

Danehill Dancer is another enjoying a notable sequence of success, in a variety of roles. Directly responsible for Qemah, winner of the G1 Coronation S., the former champion sire has made a considerable impact via his broodmare daughters, with Minding, The Gurkha and Alice Springs all winning at Classic or Group 1 level. Air Chief Marshal follows Fast Company, sire of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Jet Setting, as the second stallion son to be represented by a major 3-year-old winner this year.

It is fair to wonder how much of these impressive achievements by the Danehill Dancer clan is owed to this year's miserable weather in Europe (as related so amusingly by Bill Finley in his reports on his recent visit to Jersey).

It has been very wet and it has been cold and the ground has consequently often been on the soft side. Danehill Dancer's progeny had a reputation for being less inconvenienced by such conditions than most. For example, the Racing Post's statistics credit him with a 12% strike rate both on heavy and soft, as well as on good/firm. On the other hand, Dansili--another son of Danehill--has only 9% on heavy and 13% on good/firm. Mont Ormel has yet to race on a firm surface and this progressive colt was a wide-margin winner on heavy ground at Compiègne before his unexpected victory on good to soft in the Grand Prix.

Air Chief Marshal himself gained the first of his wins on heavy going and the ground was also heavy when he finished a half-length second in the G1 Phoenix S. He was also smart at around seven furlongs at three, when he easily won over Dundalk's all-weather track prior to taking the G3 Minstrel S. at The Curragh.

As a speedy son of a high-class 2-year-old, Air Chief Marshal could be considered an unlikely sire of a Group 1 mile-and-a-half winner. It is worth remembering, though, that Danehill Dancer occasionally came up with good middle-distance performers, such as Dancing Rain (Oaks), Legatissimo (G1 Nassau S. and a close second in the Oaks), Planteur (G1 Prix Ganay), Hillstar (G1 Canadian International) and Ave (G1 Flower Bowl Invitational S.)

To do so, Danehill Dancer usually needed a bit of help from his mares. The same could be said regarding Air Chief Marshal's son Mont Ormel, who was tackling a mile and a half for the first time when he showed improved form to take the Grand Prix.

His dam Lidana showed that she stayed an extended mile and a quarter after gaining her only win over seven furlongs as a juvenile. She shares the same sire, the G1 2000 Guineas winner King's Best, as the Derby and G1 Arc winner Workforce, the G1 Japanese Derby winner Eishin Flash and the G1 Irish St Leger winner Royal Diamond.

The idea that there must be stamina in Lidana's pedigree is supported by the fact that her versatile half-brother Linngari won the G1 Grosser Dallmayr Preis Bayerisches Zuchtrennen over a mile and a quarter, even though he was by the sprinter Indian Ridge.

The most obvious source of stamina is Kahyasi, sire of Mont Ormel's second dam Lidakiya, a useful winner at up to a mile and a half. Considering that he won the 1988 Derby and Irish Derby, Kahyasi probably didn't receive

the respect he deserved from breeders other than the Aga Khan. The Aga, though, reaped some impressive benefits from his stallion, including Zainta (G1 Prix de Diane), Khalkevi (Grand Prix de Paris), Vereva (Prix de Diane) and Enzeli (G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot). Enzeli wasn't Kahyasi's only Group 1 winner over two and a half miles, as he also sired that grand gelding Kasbah Bliss, who numbered the G1 Prix du Cadran among his many successes.

Kahyasi, of course, eventually earned considerable respect as a sire of broodmares, principally through the exploits of Hasili, a Broodmare of the Year whose first six foals all won at Group 1 or Group 2 level. Several other daughters also excelled, producing the likes of that exceptional filly Zarkava and the Group 1-winning fillies Again (G1 Irish 1000 Guineas) and Promising Lead. For the record, with Kahyasi as her sire and Doyoun as her broodmare sire, Lidakiya was bred to the same pattern as Zarkasha, the dam of Zarkava. [Cont. p3](#)

It is also necessary to mention that five of Hasili's group winners--Dansili, Banks Hill, Intercontinental, Cacique and Champs Elysees--were by Danehill, as is Promising Lead, while Again was by Danehill Dancer. Mont Ormel is therefore by no means the first important winner to have a pedigree featuring Danehill and Kahyasi.

Mont Ormel's fifth dam, Licara, was a half-sister to three high achievers in Acamas and the brother-and-sister team of Akiyda and Akarad. Acamas, a son of Mill Reef, won the Prix du Jockey-Club, while Akiyda landed the Arc and Akarad the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. The family still has a toehold in the Aga Khan's broodmare band, in the form of Lidana's unraced half-sister Lidaya, an Elusive Quality mare who has youngsters by Dalakhani and Myboycharlie.

"She is in good form and is back in full work again now," said the trainer. "Everything is looking positive and the plan is to give her a run in a Group 3 at Tipperary for fillies' only, the Fairy Bridge S. That will be a nice race for her and will hopefully leave her spot-on for the Matron."

PLUSVITAL LAUNCH NEW TESTS

Plusvital, the company that acquired the equine genomic testing company Equinome earlier in December of 2015, has launched four new genetic tests aimed at the global Thoroughbred community. The new range of tests were developed by analysing 48,000 genetic markers from over 4,000 horses representing 739 unique sires and including over 800 black-type winners. The new products include the following:

- **Elite Performance v3.0:** This genetic test achieves higher strike rates by identifying the highest genetic potential for elite breeding and racecourse success. The test provides three outputs. A Genomic Racing Value, which indicates a horse's potential to be an elite racehorse. A Genomic Breeding Value which represents the potential of a broodmare or stallion to produce offspring with a higher potential for elite success. A Genomic Inbreeding Value which evaluates the actual level of inbreeding in a thoroughbred horse.
- **Distance Plus v1.0:** This genetic test refines the optimum race distance for a Thoroughbred horse through analysis of a more complex range of genetic markers, separating horses into short or long C:C, C:T or T:T.
- **Raced/Unraced v1.0:** This genetic test identifies foals with the greatest potential to have a racecourse start as a 2- or 3-year-old.
- **Dirt v Turf v1.0:** This test indicates genetic affinity of an individual horse for achieving best win on a dirt or turf surface.

Plusvital Launch New Tests Cont.

Mike Shelly, CEO, Plusvital, said, “The launch of these new genetic tests by Plusvital is a large step forward in terms of the amount of information we can provide to breeders, owners and trainers from their horses’ DNA. Our clients are already using genetic test information to inform their breeding and racing decisions and the additional information in the new tests will further strengthen the use of this technology across the industry where it is being used as a tool to complement existing horsemanship and pedigree analysis.”

Nicholson where he amassed important wins at both the Aintree and Punchestown festivals. He was bought by David and Kathleen Holmes of Pitchall Farm in 2001 and when his stock began to reach the racecourse it was clear he was upgrading his

mares to produce tough, willing, classy racehorses.

"We're very upset--he's irreplaceable and it's the end of an era," said Kathleen Holmes. "Midnight was an absolute gentleman and had never given us any trouble--so when the first thing he did this morning was refuse his feed, we knew there was a problem. His stock are tough, so genuine and just never give up trying. He also had a great record with his daughters, so if your mare had a filly there wasn't any disappointment."

Sadly, as is often the case with national hunt stallions, they often pass away before their best stock reach the racecourse, but Midnight Legend has already sired a Grade 1 winner courtesy of Sizing John (Ire), winner of the G1 Future Champions Novice Hurdle at Leopardstown in 2014.

Gold (GB) (Paco Boy {Ire}), **Full Rose (GB)** (Aqlaam {GB}) and **Hawksmoor (Ire)** (Azamour {Ire}); the latter pair winning the last two editions of the G2 German 1000 Guineas. With Goffs having added an extra day to their Sportman's Yearling Sale this year, there will now be eight days of yearling sales in Ireland over two consecutive weeks in September, two more than last year.


