JUDDMONTE'S LATEST CLAIM TO SUCCESS

Resumes don't come much more impressive than the one compiled by Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms since Known Fact gave the Prince his first Classic success in the 1980 G1 2000 Guineas. There have been three more wins of the 2000 Guineas, thanks to Dancing Brave, Zafonic and the mighty Frankel, and the famous green, pink and white colors have also been carried to success in the G1 1000 Guineas (twice), G1 Oaks, G1 Derby (three times) and the G1 St Leger. In Ireland, there have been wins in the G1 2000 Guineas, G1 Derby and G1 Oaks (two), while the extensive Classic haul in France features two in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club, the so-called French Derby. There have also been a highly impressive four winners of the G1 Arc and four in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris, including one by Flintshire, who initiated a spectacular Grade I double for Juddmonte at Saratoga three days ago.

Over in the U.S., there have also been an impressive number of Grade I turf successes from the likes of Banks Hill, Beat Hollow, Cacique, Champs Elysees, Chester House, Heat Haze, Intercontinental, Middy, Proviso, Ryafan and Ventura.

However, horse racing in the U.S. is mainly about dirt and that surface has been less rewarding for the Juddmonte homebreds, with their predominantly turf pedigrees.

KENNEALLY RUNNERS SHARP FOR SPA CLOSING WEEKEND

Trainer Eddie Kenneally looms as a major player on closing weekend at Saratoga with veteran **Bradester** (Lion Heart) carrying a three-race win streak in Saturday's G1 Woodward S. and unbeaten juvenile '**TDN Rising Star**' **Bitumen** (Mineshaft) slated to make his Grade I debut in Monday's Hopeful S. The latter, who won the GIII Sanford S. at the Spa July 23, worked four furlongs in :48.65 in company with the 3-year-old filly Blast (Harlan's Holiday) on the main track Monday morning--the fastest of 46 works at the distance.

"He worked super," Kenneally said of the Joseph Sutton colorbearer. "He likes the track. He's had a while since the Sanford and he's done well training here this summer. He's trained along nicely here all summer and hasn't missed a beat since the Sanford. He's still has an advantage over some of the other horses, he's run twice. Some of them have only run once. So the timing is ideal, really." **Cont. p5**

Juddmonte's Latest Claim to Success (cont. from p1)

Of course there have been a few notable exceptions, thanks largely to some distinguished dirt stallions. Seattle Slew supplied Juddmonte with Flute (GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Alabama S.), Honest Lady (GI Santa Monica H.) and Sleep Easy (GI Hollywood Oaks), while his son A.P. Indy was responsible for Aptitude (GI Hollywood Gold Cup and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup). Unbridled excelled by siring the GI Belmont S. winner Empire Maker and another of his sons, Unbridled's Song, sired First Defence, winner of the GI Forego H. First Defence himself sired Close Hatches, who did so well on dirt that she was named champion older mare.

The fact that Aptitude and Empire Maker both finished second in the Kentucky Derby only intensified the desire to add this historic Classic to Juddmonte's CV, to complete the set of major Northern Hemisphere Derbys. A slight change of policy therefore ensued. Juddmonte has bought only the occasional yearling in recent decades, but in 2012 a bolder approach was

adopted. The farm signed for yearlings by Curlin, Elusive Quality, First Defence and Tapit at Keeneland, with the youngsters starting a new relationship for Juddmonte by going to Bob Baffert.

It was a similar story in 2013. This time sons of Malibu Moon, Speightstown and Street Cry were purchased, but it was in 2014 that the new venture gathered momentum. This time the haul stretched to eight colts, for an average price of just under \$400,000. They comprised sons of Candy Ride, Harlan's Holiday, Midnight Lute, Scat Daddy, Speightstown, Trappe Shot (two) and Unbridled's Song, with the Unbridled's Song colt out of Bubbler being the second-most expensive at \$560,000.

It was back to the Keeneland well in 2015, with the haul made up of colts by Bernardini, Ghostzapper, Harlan's Holiday, Malibu Moon and Sidney's Candy. These have been joined under Baffert's care by a Mineshaft colt bought at the 2-year-old sales.

These latest purchases have a lot to live up to now that **'TDN Rising Star'** Arrogate--the 2013 Unbridled's Song--Bubbler colt--has burst onto the racing scene with all the elan and swagger of a superstar. His winning margin of 13 1/2 lengths in the [GI Travers S.](#) was stunning enough, but then we saw that he had stopped the clock at a magical 1:59.36.

His winning margin has been bettered on two occasions. Damascus came home 22 lengths clear in the 1967 Travers, but he was faced by only three rivals. Then, in 1979, General Assembly scored by 15 lengths in setting a track record of 2:00.00 on a sloppy track, which effectively meant he was racing on the hard base. No Travers winner before Arrogate had previously dipped below the two-minute mark, even though the roll of honor includes nine horses which went on to be named Horse of the Year at the age of three.

Arrogate's rider Mike Smith immediately drew comparisons between the Juddmonte colt and his sire Unbridled's Song. Recalling the 1995 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner, who went on to add the GI Florida Derby and GI Wood Memorial, Smith said, "He was an unbelievably talented horse, his son might even be more talented. It's crazy, he just did a mile and a quarter and as you can see, galloping out I had trouble getting him to stop."

One thing that Arrogate has done which his sire failed to do is win over a mile and a quarter. Perhaps Unbridled's Song wasn't at his best in the Kentucky Derby because of a foot problem, as he finished only fifth as the favorite. Unbridled's Song was never again asked to tackle more than 1 1/8 miles during a stop-start career which ended with a victory in the Olympic H. over seven furlongs on his only 4-year-old start.

Interestingly, Arrogate's sire Unbridled's Song, his paternal grandsire Unbridled and his broodmare sire Distorted Humor had all previously sired a Travers winner. They were respectively responsible for the 2000 winner Unshaded, the 2005 scorer Flower Alley and the 2013 winner Will Take Charge. Deputy

Minister, sire of Arrogate's second dam Grechelle, got into the act, thanks to his son Deputy Commander in 1997. Coincidentally, Will Take Charge is out of Deputy Minister's distinguished granddaughter Take Charge Lady (Dehere). Graydar, another of Unbridled's Song's high-class sons, also has a dam by Dehere.

Arrogate is the second impressive son of Unbridled's Song produced by a Forty Niner-line mare, following Liam's Map. Now a resident at Lane's End, Liam's Map also set a track record when he took the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile in 1:34.54. He had previously recorded a good time--1:47.44--in taking the GI Woodward S. over a mile and an eighth. Liam's Map is out of a mare by Trippi, a grandson of Forty Niner, whereas Arrogate is out of a granddaughter. That fast colt Zensational has a second dam by Forty Niner.

When the time comes for Arrogate to take up stallion duties, he will benefit from the presence, as his third dam, of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Meadow Star. A daughter of the giant Meadowlake, who became a Grade I winner by nearly nine lengths as a 2-year-old, Meadow Star won all seven of her juvenile starts. She continued to shine at three, extending her winning run to nine before the colts put an end to the sequence in the Wood Memorial. She bounced back to take the GI Acorn S. and GI Mother Goose S.

Arrogate's second dam, Grechelle, scraped onto the Experimental Free H. for 1997, her weight of 104 reflecting her third in the GIII Golden Rod S. Her daughter Bubbler did better, winning six of her nine starts. She was in fine form at the end of 2009 and the start of 2010, winning stakes from 7 1/2 furlongs to a mile and an eighth. She won on dirt and turf and her Grade III-placing was on grass.

Arrogate is her first foal and his Travers exploits will ensure that [hip 226](#) at Keeneland will come under the closest scrutiny. This Medaglia d'Oro filly from Clearsky Farms is Bubbler's second foal. The mare produced another filly, this one by Giant's Causeway, in March before visiting Into Mischief.

The 6-year-old has made just three starts in 2016, including a win in the GI Stephen Foster H. June 18.

Kenneally said that the lighter workload is by design after Bradester's taxing 2015 campaign culminated with a ninth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Keeneland in late October.

"He had plenty of racing last year, so after the Breeders' Cup, we thought we would give him a little extra time over the winter and focus on a summer-fall campaign with him this year," said Kenneally. "So far, it's working well. He's a fresh horse, a lightly raced horse this year. He's grown up again and he's even more mature now than he ever was."

Known for his front-running style, Bradester has led wire-to-wire while never truly tested in all three of his wins this year. Nevertheless, Kenneally said he will allow regular rider Joe Bravo to make a game-time decision.

"We'll play it by ear," Kenneally explained. "Depending on the post positions, the break, see how the race unfolds. He's shown some speed in his races, but there are other horses in there that have speed as well. So we'll just play it by ear and see how the race unfolds and leave it up to Joe Bravo, who rides him with a lot of confidence. We try to not change too much."

"We realized this is going to be one of her pretty big spaces in between races and decided we wanted to let her train a touch more aggressively today," said Casse. "She looked good today and we're happy with the work. That just shows you how great she is."

Tepin was previously under consideration for the GI Fourstardave H. earlier in the Saratoga meet, but Team Casse opted to give the dark bay more time to hit her best stride.

THOROUGHBRED RACING SOUNDNESS

Hello Mr./Mrs. Owner, this is your trainer and unfortunately your horse has an injury. Mr. Trainer, I just bought this horse and this is only his second start.

It is accepted in the industry, that the Thoroughbred horse has become "less sound, less rugged, less durable and more fragile."

This is clearly reflected based on the diminishing average starts per lifetime. Based on data compiled by *The Thoroughbred Times*, during the period between 1993-2002, the average starts per foal per lifetime was 14. According to figures provided by The Jockey Club, that number has declined another 9% during

2001-2010 to 12.6 starts per lifetime. These numbers coincide with the average starts per year in the 1950's, which was 10.91. By 2015, that number was down to 6.18. These numbers represent a dramatic decline over the entire population of Thoroughbred race horses.

I have been a practicing veterinarian in New York at Belmont Park for close to 30 years. I have also been breeding horses for 25 years and my family's stable has been racing these homebreds. In addition, I have a Master's degree from Texas A & M University where I studied population genetics and speciation that has been a tremendous help as a breeder, racing manager and a veterinarian.

The information used in this article is straight from The Jockey Club. The numbers are the numbers and they do not lie or tell long tales. The horses have been bred by Dr. Russell S. Cohen

and raced by Tri-Bone stable. The mares were bought after injury at Belmont or purchased at sales for very reasonable prices. There are seven mares from five distinct female families sired by 26 different sires. A few of these were middle-range sires but the majority would be considered of limited sire power. I have bred 32 foals (small population) over 25 years and sold four of them at auction and therefore had no input on them. The 28 foals were raised at multiple farms, broken at two different farms and trained by multiple trainers--from a Hall Of Fame trainer to many lesser-known trainers. It is this 28-foal group that I refer to because I had control over them, with one exception. This exception resulted in a once-promising horse turned into a lesser one; a wasted talent.

Is there a population of race horses that defy accepted thought and conventional wisdom using information garnered from The Jockey Club and supported by simple math? Applying simple population dynamics based on the wide range of genes from this small population, the soundness of this group should be almost identical to the soundness of the larger population. The answer to the question is, yes there is a population that is different and this group is resoundingly sounder based on the numbers, facts and math.

Many of the numbers are above the industry standard and averages with the understanding that it is a small population and based on limited resources. The one GLARING number that jumps off the page is the number of starts per lifetime, which at this time stands at 20.4 versus the industry at 12.6. These numbers, based on percentages, is 62%, far above the accepted standard in the industry.

What is the reason for such a huge gap between the two populations? I will furnish a partial list of veterinary procedures,

diagnosis and accepted practices to which I adhere:

- 1) Do not train on any medication of any kind
- 2) No joint injections
- 3) Do not race on any medications, with the exception of Lasix (already discussed)
- 4) No alternative therapy: chiropractic, acupuncture, laser, or any other kind
- 5) No shock wave therapy
- 6) No ulcer medications
- 7) No E.P.M.
- 8) No weak backs, gluteal, hock or stifle treatments


It is my belief, based on many years of experience and more importantly, having my wallet and my name in the game, that the modern horse begins sound and healthy. The industry has been hijacked by third-party know-it-alls. These bleacher creatures have no exposure, but remain in the grandstand and tell everyone else how to hit a baseball. I believe it is time for the owners to tell them to put on a helmet and step into the batter's box. After they strike out, just go to the bench and stay silent.

There are many horses that get hurt, who are born with various flaws, etc. But the key to keeping horses sound starts and ends with getting out of their way and surrounding them with horsemen and women who have their best interests at heart, and financial gain last.

"After much deliberation I have decided to hand in my trainer's licence at the end of this season," said Wachman. "While not taken easily, the decision to retire will allow me to spend more time with my family as well as pursuing various other business interests. Over the last 20 years I have trained for many wonderful owners and I would like to extend my deepest gratitude and thanks to them as they have been absolutely central to the success that we have enjoyed here. The nature of training is such that you have plenty of ups and downs but I've been lucky enough to have had many good days and train some top-class horses during that time. Also a big thank you goes to each and every one of my staff members for their unwavering loyalty, dedication and commitment and I wish them all the very best for the future."

Wachman took out his license in 1996 at the age of 25 after spending stints with trainers Jessica Harrington, Michael Hourigan and Jim Bolger in Ireland; Bill Mitchell and Brian Mayfield Smith in Australia; and Jenny Pitman in England. He trained his first winner later that year in a hurdle race and his first winner on the flat came the following season. [Cont. p2](#)

LORD OUT FOR THE SPRING

Promising sprinter **Lord Of The Sky (Aus)** (Danerich {Aus}), once considered a contender for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint later this year, has been ruled out of the remainder of the spring by trainer Robbie Laing after suffering a tendon injury, according to *Racing.com*. Laing said he initially thought the injury that knocked the 6-year-old out of last Saturday's G1 Memsie S. to be career-threatening, but said it is not as bad as he first believed.

"Scans have shown no tears and no holes [in the tendon], there's a little bit of filling there and a little bit of damage to his annular ligament at the back of his fetlock joint," Laing told *Racing.com*. "The vets are quite optimistic to have him back towards the end of the spring but I'd be more so looking to the autumn with him."

"To get a stakes winner with the first winner I have bred is fantastic, I'm very fortunate," said Cathal Beale. "Dermot bought the mare, Chantilly Pearl, and I quite liked her and he was generous enough to allow myself and Paddy to buy a leg of her each."

The vagaries of the bloodstock business were evident when the team offered Montataire as a foal in Goffs in 2014. When he was lead out unsold at €29,000 they made the wise decision to bring him home and wait for another day. That other day was 11 months later back at Goffs in the Sportsman's Sale, where he made €90,000, the second-highest price of the sale when knocked down to John Ferguson.

"We were delighted with the price he made and it more than vindicated our decision to buy him back as a foal. No doubt also the exploits of Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) throughout 2015 helped propel his sire back into the limelight."

Having been sent to Mark Johnston, Montataire has certainly thrived under his tutelage, showing admirable durability and progression through a busy summer.

He made his debut in the middle of May, finishing second at Ripon before getting off the mark two runs later at Hamilton June 23. Two easy nursery victories at Ascot and Newmarket followed before he joined the Johnston arsenal at Glorious Goodwood, where he beat all bar his stablemate Bear Valley (Ire) (Manduro {Ger}) in another nursery over seven furlongs. He was then sent to Salisbury for his first taste of stakes action where he put up a career best, making all and running away from the field to win by five lengths. That race was over a mile and connections have some interesting entries later in the season to choose from. These include the G2 At The Races Champagne S. at Doncaster, the G2 Dubai Duty Free Mill Reef S.

at Newbury and the G2 Juddmonte Royal Lodge S. at Newmarket. The important thing for the breeders is that each race takes place before the Orby Sale, offering the chance of another major update in advance of Goffs.

"We're very excited by the yearling going to Goffs," said Beale. "Obviously she is a three-parts sister to Montataire and she is a very similar type, a big, tall, rangy filly and a really good walker. The sire as well should be a good help after such a successful year on the track. Anything further that Montataire could achieve before then would also be a great bonus."

"Ian Thompson and his team did a great job rearing him at Tinnakill House," Beale added. "The stud has consistently produced tough durable racehorses including Montataire and G1 Irish Derby third Stellar Mass this year alone."

Sea the Stars is indeed enjoying an incredible year with his offspring. He currently occupies second place in the leading stallions of Ireland and Britain behind his half-brother and perennial champion Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Dual Derby winner Harzand (Ire) has been his main flagbearer this season and is current antepost

favourite for the G1 QIPCO Irish Champion S. in a fortnight. Mutakayef (GB), a 5-year-old from the first crop of Sea the Stars, posted a career-best effort recently when a slightly unlucky third in the G1 Juddmonte

International at York. The William Haggas trainee had previously won the G2 Summer Mile S. and has never finished worse than third in thirteen runs, while Zelzal (Fr), winner of the G1 Prix Jean Prat over a mile in July for Jean-Claude Rouget and Al Shaqab Racing, also showed Sea The Stars is equally adept at siring top-class milers as well as middle-distance types. The 10-year-old Chantilly Pearl, a half-sister to American and Canadian stakes winners Lemon Chiffon (Lemon Drop Kid) and Masked Maiden (Sky Mesa), does not have a foal on the ground in 2016, but is currently in foal to Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal), a horse well known to the Tinnakill team.

"With Dermot having bred Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal), we were always keen to support him as much as we could from the start," said Beale. The first-season sire table must be perused on a regular basis by the Cantillon family, given that they also bred the current table topper Sir Prancealot (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}).

Beale himself has trodden a well-worn path to where he finds himself at the moment. Following completion of an Arts Degree at University College Dublin, he then undertook the renowned Irish National Stud course before gaining a coveted place on the Godolphin Flying Start, graduating from that two-year stint in 2009, the same year as some other recognizable industry faces such as Darley's Darren Fox and Mick Flanagan of Townley Hall Bloodstock. He commenced working immediately after with Cantillon and one of his main responsibilities now is managing the Tinnakill sales drafts. The yearling sales season will be an exciting time for Beale as in addition to the Sea The Stars filly he also has a share in [lot 189](#) in the Orby, a filly by Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) out of the Grade I-placed mare Northern Mischief (Yankee Victor). A week later in Tattersalls Book 1 he has a share in [lot 509](#), a colt by Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill) out of Buffalo Berry (Ire) (Sri Pekan), also Group 1-placed and a stakes winner in both Ireland and America.
