GLIDAWN STANDING THE TEST OF TIME

An early fascination with Thoroughbred pedigrees has led Waterford farmer Gerry Burke to quietly carve out a very successful niche over the last three decades from his Dungarvan-based Glidawn Stud. Pinhooking foals is a pursuit fraught with pitfalls, but it has served Burke extremely well since he began trading bloodstock while still a teenager. Burke, though, is first and foremost a farmer, as he explains, "I'm a full-time farmer, I rear calves but I also try and pinhook about 20 foals a year. I've been doing it since I was 17, which is quite a while, 30 years in fact."

Burke, unfailingly modest and polite, is getting ready for another round of battle as he puts the finishing touches to a batch of four yearlings for this week's Orby Sale at Goffs. He has been a regular at the foal sales in America for the last two decades and his Orby draft this year reflects another 2015 shopping spree at Keeneland, as Glidawn offers colts by Exchange Rate ([lot 57](#)), and Haynesfield ([lot 254](#)). He also offers a filly by City Zip ([lot 452](#)), while the quartet is rounded off by [lot 246](#), a European-bred colt by Dragon Pulse (Ire) (Kyllachy {GB}).

With four engaged, it was long odds-on that Aidan O'Brien would be collecting a 16th renewal of this traditional Derby pointer, especially after the chief opposition Firey Speech (Street Cry {Ire}) was withdrawn by Dermot Weld, and so it proved. Ryan Moore faced a tough choice, with each one of the quartet having shown quality in their brief careers so far, and he correctly opted for the proven one, as **Capri (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) had already scored in black-type company in the Aug. 5. Listed Coolmore Canford Cliffs S. over an extended seven furlongs at Tipperary.

Settled in a share of third early, the grey was driven past Exemplar with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and stayed on from **Yucatan (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who denied **Exemplar (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) second as Ballydoyle enjoyed a one-two-three for good measure. **Cont. p8**

Explaining his affinity for the U.S. market, Burke says, "I've been going to America for the last 20 years; I've been very lucky there. In no way have I been competing at the top end, but I think I've gotten some great value there over the years."

It's always beneficial both for business and also your own confidence as a pinhooker to unearth either a significant sales horse or a successful racehorse early in one's career, and Burke achieved such a milestone relatively early in his endeavour when he bought a filly foal by Woodman (Mr. Prospector) at Keeneland in 1996 for \$40,000. Re-offered at Goffs the following year, the yearling was bought by BBA Ireland for Ir£85,000 (approx. €110,000). Sent to trainer Barry Hills, she was named Hula Angel and she won the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh in 1999. It was a pivotal moment for Burke, as

not only did she make a profit in the ring but she also gave him the impetus to step his operation up a gear.

"I was very fortunate in that one of the first foals I bought from America was Hula Angel. That gave me plenty of encouragement to return. Unfortunately there haven't been too many more like Hula Angel since but it's still been good to me," he said.

Pinhooking a foal in America to sell in Ireland adds an extra layer of logistical issues with shipping and quarantine. These obstacles are much easier to overcome once you know the right people.

"Over the years I have made some great contacts in America, initially John Phillips of Darby Dan was very good to me and Peter O'Callaghan of Woods Edge Farm has been a great help. I've been lucky to have built up good relationships with people like that, as without them you can't get the job done. Also the likes of BBA Ireland and Peter Kelly of Emerald Bloodstock are a great help. They all work hard and provide such a professional service."

Burke has enjoyed some great touches in the ring with fillies so it's not difficult to understand why he tends to gravitate towards them at the foal sales. "I like to buy well-bred fillies if I can. I do buy colts also but I tend to focus more on the fillies," he admits.



Another successful foray with a filly was when he forked out 26,000gns for a Dubai Destination foal at Tattersalls in 2005. Returning to Goffs the following year Burke hit the jackpot when selling her for €360,000. While a maiden success at Kempton was the pinnacle of her racing career, the filly, named Ever Rigg (Ire), has left a lasting legacy on the Thoroughbred breed through her son Postponed (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}). Burke also set tongues wagging a few years later in 2008 when he bought the only progeny of the late George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) as a foal in Goffs for €280,000. It was a brave pinhook and it proved worthwhile, if a little nerve wracking, when she was sold at

Tattersalls the following year for 320,000gns to Julie Wood. Named Date With Destiny (Ire), she made her mark, scoring on her debut for Richard Hannon and getting stakes-placed before retiring to stud, where she has also made an impact, producing the promising Jon Kelly-owned Beautiful Morning (GB) (Galileo {Ire}).

"I was fortunate to be in the position to be able to buy her and it was very satisfying when she won first time out and even more so when she got stakes-placed," recalls Burke. "It was nice to see Newsells Park Stud buy back into her as they have had a lot of success with that family. They've done a proper job with her. Anyway, the story continues and it's nice to have had an involvement with it."

Back to the present and Burke is hopeful that his latest batch of U.S.-bred yearlings will appeal to the market at Goffs. Last year he sold a Munnings filly to China Horse Club for €130,000 and he admits that a highly successful 2015 on the track for that sire had a bearing on the auction price. "We had a good sale last year, we were lucky that Munnings had a fantastic year, whereas he's been a bit quieter this year. Fashion tends to dictate so much and having something by a popular sire at the right time is very important and can make you look cleverer than you are," he said. "I like all four of my bunch this year, they each have a European twist to them and I think there is something there that should be of interest to different tastes, and I just hope they go to good homes. I'm a big fan of Exchange Rate. I think he was a wonderful stallion, he did it the hard way and he was very capable of siring a high-class horse." **Cont. p4**

Burke will go to the Orby Sale with a successful 2016 pinhook already under his belt. He proved he can work his magic with colts as well as fillies when he offered an Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) colt at Arqana last month. The 15,000gns foal purchase at Tattersalls grew into a €140,000 yearling when bought last month by Peter & Ross Doyle Bloodstock. "He was a nice colt from a good family. Intello is a beautifully bred stallion, by Galileo out of a Danehill mare. The yearling was just one of those horses that developed and went the right way. He went forward from day one--some do and some don't, but it all came together with him."

Burke is keen to stress that he has made plenty of mistakes over the years when it comes to selecting foals that he thinks will develop into sought-after yearlings. "I continue to learn every day. I was fortunate when I started out that I met some very good people who took an interest in what I was doing and got some very good advice that I have not forgotten. But it's important to remember that while plenty of horses go the right way, so many also go wrong. That's what makes this game so exciting, the uncertainty of it all."

Minimising those errors and getting it right more often than getting it wrong is the key to staying afloat, and it's quite clear that Gerry Burke has 'getting it right' down to a fine art.

THE WEEKLY WRAP by Chris McGrath



Two Group 1 winners at 25-1, within 40 minutes and over the same strip of ground, and people still can't see what had been happening all through the meeting?

Very rarely do you see so many horses outside their comfort zone, so far out, as in the sport staged on the Rowley Mile this week. Think of the number of times you have watched whole groups of horses finishing off their races over this ancient turf: switched off early, organised through the Dip, and then bounding up to the post. This week, race after race, you saw the same thing: horses quickly off the bridle, horses reluctant to stretch, horses jamming the gearstick.

Nobody seemed to have any issues with the track's preparation, and it literally goes with the territory that Mother Nature will sometimes test a horse's capacity to handle firm ground in the autumn no less than she might deal out the odd Royal Ascot on heavy going. And of course we're getting to the end of the campaign. A lot of horses are low on fuel, not least after such a notorious season for viruses, and no longer able to suppress the cumulative effect of their various niggles.



There was a good deal of talk about a strong headwind as the meeting went on, but that represented just the rock to a genuinely hard place. And the varying degrees of inhibition evident in so many horses mean that proceedings should be reviewed with due circumspection. We should neither condemn nor praise too hastily. Some that seemed to excel perhaps found the bar lowered by conditions inimical to the free expression of superior talents. And some that seemed a little flat, equally, can be credited as simply sewing a stitch in time. Better to hold back for a minute than to lose a year. In that context, then, let's try to unpick one or two specific cases among those who have most at stake for the future: the 2-year-olds.

The Last Straw...

The number crunchers are going to struggle with **The Last Lion (GB)** (Choisir {Aus}). They could set their clocks against the plateau of form he seemed to have attained through starts four to nine of his busy debut season: Racing Post ratings of 105, 101, 100, 101, 106 and 105. And now he's suddenly supposed to have spiked a 119 in the G1 Juddmonte Middle Park S.?

Of course his success represents due reward for his dauntless connections, above all for the graft and humility of his long-serving rider. And, yes, as his trainer noted, we are too

quick to pigeon-hole horses. They are flesh and blood, not software programmes. But that's exactly why many of us would expect a very different outcome if the same field were to reconvene another day, in a more neutral

environment.

As it happens, it seems that a rematch is already in mind for the first two in the G1 Commonwealth Cup next June. If that represents another boost for that race's generous Group 1 inauguration, as discussed here recently, then it also confirms the race to be no unmixed blessing. **'TDN Rising Star' Blue Point (Ire)** (Shamardal) would surely otherwise be tried over a seventh furlong in something like the G3 Greenham S., and that might well prove a fertile experiment.

Certainly he was in no way diminished by his failure to catch the winner. Unfortunately, the same could not be said for a number of their more interesting rivals. Apologies for returning yet again to **Mokarris** (More Than Ready), but he really is a source of growing exasperation. **Cont. p6**

If any horse should have handled the fast ground it was this one, with his mini-skirted action, but once again he refused to allow his jockey to ride a race. Pulling so hard early that he almost threatened to pitch over, he must have tremendous ability to get as involved as he did before inevitably fading a couple of spots close home. Yes, he again lacked cover, but he has now had five starts and does not seem to be learning anything. I'd be pretty uncomfortable, in his shoes, next time I saw the vet reaching into a toolbag.

The Real First Lady...?

It sounds as though Wesley Ward also wants to aim 'TDN Rising Star' **Lady Aurelia** (Scat Daddy) at the Commonwealth Cup, which would again show how the undeniable benefits of the new race come at a cost--this time, to the G1 King's Stand S. Most of us will only believe that this filly can see out a stiff sixth furlong at Ascot when we see it.

Be that as it may, how splendid to see another Group 1 win for Mrs Stockwell's mare Liscanna (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), **Brave Anna** duly emulating her brother Hit It A Bomb (War Front) at the Breeders' Cup last year. This filly's recent defeats over 7f could prove something of a red herring, the faster conditions almost certainly a more significant factor when you consider that both

the Ballydoyle fillies who lassoed the tiring favourite, are by War Front. Santa Anita presumably beckons now, but both Brave Anna and 'TDN Rising Star' **Roly Poly** are also entitled to enter what has become a wide-open G1 1000 Guineas picture, not least after confirmation by **Fair Eva (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) and **Queen Kindly (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) that the foals of their invincible rookie sire do not actually have to race against each other in order to be beaten. Both, of course, should for now be indulged defeat this week on the premise set out above.

By the same token we should perhaps qualify the outstanding gains in the division made, very much out of left field, by **Spain Burg (Fr)** (Sageburg {Ire}) in the G2 Shadwell Rockfel S. Certainly few other animals at the meeting looked so luxuriantly at ease with the conditions. Regardless, she must be counted a fairly stunning advertisement for a stallion shrewdly imported from Normandy to Co Wexford by Denis Hickey of Garryrichard Stud. **Cont. p7**

A more obviously glamorous background contributes to a suspicion that the most significant performance of the week by a juvenile filly may yet prove to have been the debut success of new ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ **Talaayeb (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) in a 7f maiden the following day.

Things don't appear to have worked out for Owen Burrows with her colossal half-brother Muntazah (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}): after a promising reappearance in the G2 Dante S., he finished last at the Newmarket July Festival and has not been sighted since. But this filly has a rather more practical build and arguably brings together the premier families of two great modern breeders: her sire, of course, being a son of the mighty Juddmonte mare, Hasili (Ire) (Kahyasi {GB}); and her dam being out of a half-sister to Nashwan (Blushing Groom {Fr}) and all that crowd. Albeit Talaayeb was more professional than many in the race, that may simply reflect the fact that she is a very natural athlete. After all, whatever the quibbles and caveats, ground this firm will reliably showcase a horse commendably light on its feet.

Best Days Ahead...

And if not all the meeting's winners were flattered, nor did they all necessarily show their best. ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ **Best Of Days (GB)** (Azamour {Ire}) was one who seemed only just to get

away with it in the G2 Juddmonte Royal Lodge S., swaying unhappily as he declined to risk a switch of leads--in the process, no doubt, exaggerating the apparently strong finish of the runner-up.

His fine stride had also become a little cramped, once hitting the front, before he was mugged late at York on his previous start. Both performances would be consistent with either laziness or mental immaturity. But he hardly looked an idle type when streaking six lengths clear on his debut and, judging from the money for him on Saturday, he can't work like one, either. Out of a High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) mare, and with a strong, scopey physique, he has just been laying down foundations so far. Granted some nicer ground, and a good stretch of it, he looks guaranteed to gain massively in conviction and authority next year.

This was a case of horses for courses, as last year's winner Nightflower returned triumphant to become the first since

Taipan (Ire) to register back-to-back successes in 1998. Also joining the likes of dual winner Monsun (Ger) and Windwurf (Ger) and multiple winner Anilin, the chestnut--who was becoming the first of her sex to win it twice--was also getting

her head in front for the first time this season after two runner-up finishes in this category. The first of those came against Protectionist (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) in Hoppegarten's G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin, and the second when no match for Iquitos (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}) in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden also over this trip Sept. 4. While that rival had too much ground to make up in the straight and could only finish a never-nearer fifth, Nightflower was always well-positioned in fourth by Andrasch Starke in a race where the closers had no chance. Only Godolphin's Elite Army (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) of those placed in first four throughout the early stages faded out of contention, with the leader Kasalla and prominently-ridden Red Cardinal narrowly denied by the filly who edged ahead approaching the last furlong after being pulled wide for her run.

A model of consistency, Nightflower also won the G2 Diana-Trial at Hoppegarten before finishing second in the G1 Preis der Diana at Dusseldorf and in the Grosser Preis von Baden last year. Her G2 Oaks d'Italia-winning dam Night of Magic is a full-sister to the G3 Fahrhofer Stutenpreis second Neele (Ire), who in turn produced the G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin heroine Nymphaea (Ire) to a mating with Dylan Thomas. Neele is also the dam of the 2015 G1 Deutsches Derby hero Nutan (Ire) (Duke of Marmalade (Ire) and this year's Listed Premio Terme di Merano winner Nazbanou (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}). The second dam, Night Teeny, is a half to the G2 Preis der Diana heroine Night Petticoat (Ger) (Petoski {GB}), who is the dam of the runaway G1 Deutsches Derby hero Next Desert (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) and the G1 Preis der Diana winner Perugina (Ger) (Perugino), who in turn produced the dual listed winner Nina Celebre (Ire) to a mating with Peintre Celebre. You learn the same as we do when we run them against each other. Sometimes we get surprised and sometimes not."

She raced a bit keen last time and relaxes that bit more in the hood."

Campaigned by Ecurie Antonio Caro and Gerard Augustin-Normand, La Cressonniere is unbeaten in eight outings. She won the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches May 15 followed by the G1 Prix de Diane June 19, and was last seen taking the G2 Prix de la Nonette by two lengths Aug. 23.

I have absolutely no doubt that many great days lie ahead for Fozzy here at Thomastown Castle."

Twilight Payment was third behind the subsequent G2 Curragh Cup winner Sword Fighter (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and G1 St Leger hero Harbour Law (GB) (Lawman {Fr}) in what turned out to be a strong renewal of Royal Ascot's Listed Queen's Vase over two miles June 17 prior to breaking his maiden over 12 furlongs here July 16. Only 1 1/2 lengths away from Order of St George (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) when second in the G3 Irish St Leger Trial S. over

14 furlongs also at this venue Aug. 20, the bay showed that he has not stopped moving forward with this spirited career-best. Settled in third early, he worked his way past the likely winner Forgotten Rules with 50 yards remaining to gain a hard-earned first

black-type success.

"He keeps improving from race to race and we haven't seen the best of him yet," jockey Kevin Manning said. "He's laid-back and stays very well, but is not a slow horse and travels very well through his races and has a few gears."

Jim Bolger added, "He could be a real decent stayer, as he does idle and there could be a lot more in the tank. We always regarded him as a horse that whatever he did this year was a bonus and he will take his races well too. We'll see how he comes out of this race and see where we go, but I would be expecting him to be a 'Cup' horse next year. He's very laid-back, honest and sound, so he ticks all the boxes."

Twilight Payment is the second foal and first black-type winner out of Dream On Buddy, whose dam My Renee (Kris S.) landed

the Listed Give Thanks S. and Listed Harvest S. before producing the ultra-tough Bolger luminary Banimpire (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor (Ire)). She won five times in group company, with success in the G2 Ribblesdale S. and G2 Royal Whip as highlights as well as placing second in the G1 Irish Oaks and third in the G1 Prix de l'Opera. The next dam, Mayenne (Nureyev), is a daughter of the outstanding racemare and producer Detroit (Fr) (Riverman), who captured the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and can boast no less than four black type-winners amongst her progeny headed by the fellow Arc hero Carnegie (Ire). Detroit is a half to the G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine Durtal (Ire) (Lyphard), who is the dam of the dual Ascot Gold Cup hero Gildoran (Ire) (Rheingold {GB}). Dream On Buddy also has an as-yet unraced 2-year-old colt by Intense Focus named Dream Focus (Ire) and a 2016 filly by New Approach (Ire). **Click for the [Racing Post result](#). Godolphin's G1 Golden Rose S. winner **Astern (Aus)** (Medaglia d'Oro) has recovered from a setback that ruled him out of the G1 Caulfield Guineas and is set for a meeting with G1 Golden Slipper winner and 'TDN Rising Star' **Capitalist (Aus)** (Written Tycoon {Aus}) in the G2 Roman Consul S. Oct. 1, trainer John O'Shea told *Racing.com*.

"He has fully recovered from his elevated temperature and has returned to normal work at Osborne Park," O'Shea said. "He will run in the Roman Consul on Saturday at Randwick before his Melbourne plans are confirmed."

Those Melbourne plans could include the G1 Coolmore Stud S. against 3-year-olds at Flemington Oct. 29, or the weight-for-age G1 Darley Classic, with double the purse at A\$1-million, a week later.

Astern, who won the G2 Silver Slipper S. and G3 Kindergarten S. last season, is a perfect two-for-two this season, having won the G2 Run to the Rose S. and the Golden Rose Sept. 10.

He finished 11th behind Capitalist in their only meeting in the Golden Slipper. Capitalist looks to rebound from a flat fourth-place finish over soft going in the G3 San Domenico S. Aug. 13.

Satono Diamond made this return to the races off a summer break a winning one, setting himself up to collect an elusive first Group 1 this autumn. Stamping himself as a leader of his generation by winning his first three outings, including this year's G3 Kisaragi Sho S., Satono Diamond was third in the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) Apr. 17 and missed victory by a nose in the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) May 29, to G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe fancy Makahiki (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}). Breaking one slot from the outside in the field of 15 for this Japanese St Leger trial, Satono Diamond sat midpack and three paths off the fence in the well strung out field around the first turn. The race favourite began to gradually make up ground as the field approached the final bend, and was poised behind a wall of rivals about five-wide swinging into the stretch. Steered to the outside and into daylight, Satono Diamond needed minimal urging to take up the lead in midstretch, but had to call on his reserves to fight off a game Mikki Rocket for a narrow win.

Pedigree Notes...

Satono Diamond is the first foal out of the three-time Argentinean Group 1 winner Malpensa, a private acquisition by Narvick International on behalf of Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm. Satono Diamond was the second-highest priced foal at the 2013 JRHA Select Sale, fetching ¥230-million (US\$2.25-million) from owner Hajime Satomi, who returned to that sale this year to pick up Satono Diamond's weanling full-brother for a co-sale topping ¥280-million (US\$2.7-million). Malpensa is also the dam of an as-yet unraced 2-year-old Stay Gold (Jpn) filly named Linate (Jpn), and she has a yearling filly by Stay Gold's first-crop son Orfevre (Jpn). The final figures ultimately were down, but by most accounts, the 2016 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, which wrapped a 13-session run Sunday in Lexington, felt like a step forward for a marketplace still defined by its polarity. At the close of selling Sunday, 2,792 horses sold for gross receipts of \$272,890,500. That resulted in an average of \$97,740 that was down 4.7% from last year's average of \$102,549. The 2016 median was \$40,000--off 20% from 2015. The cumulative RNA rate was 26.5%. It was 24.2% in 2015.

"All the people I've talked to, both consignors and buyers, have indicated it was a strong sale," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "It's always a good sign when the buyers are saying they're having a hard time buying, and sellers are saying they're having a hard time selling."

Bloodstock Marette Farrell agreed. "It was far stronger than I expected," she said. "And I think it got stronger as the sale went on, which was great for the consignors and breeders, and not so great for us buyers."

Said Andrew Cary from Select Sales, "It's been surprisingly good. It was a lot better than we anticipated coming in. All in all, we're very pleased. It was a little soft in spots early in the sale, particularly in Books 1 and 2, but Books 3, 4, and 5 were very strong. Overall, good horses sold well." **Cont. p3**

"Lady Eli is doing really well," said Brown. "She bounced out of her first defeat in good order and has come back and breezed well since. Today was another great work for her and she's on target for the Flower Bowl."

Lady Eli won the first six starts of her career, capped by a victory in last year's GI Belmont Oaks. After battling back from laminitis, she returned to finish second in the Aug. 27 GI Woodford Reserve Ballston Spa S. last time out. **Cont. p7**

There were reasons to be cautious heading into the world's largest yearling auction. The first two major yearling sales of the year, Fasig-Tipton's July and Saratoga auctions, saw declines in both average and median, and there were weak spots for middle-market horses at the juvenile-in-training auctions this spring.

But to the surprise of many, the strongest segment of Keeneland September was for that middle-market horse that makes up the bread and butter of the six-book auction.

"I think the industry in general was apprehensive about the middle market," said Russell. "Everybody was content with the upper-middle and upper segments of the market, but it was Books 3, 4 and 5 that they were worried about. But the sale started off strong, and continued strong all the way through. Early on, the increase in \$500,000+ horses from this year to last year was very impressive. Then when we got into the second week, after a successful Book 1 and 2, and that part of the market seemed vibrant and strong, as well. The amount of buyers we had here was incredible."

Topping the sale was the \$3-million Scat Daddy half-brother to champion Beholder and the successful young sire Into Mischief who sold to M.V. Magnier. The colt was bred by Clarkland Farm, and was consigned by the Mitchell family's operation as [hip 454](#).

The colt was one of nine horses to sell for \$1 million or more at September. Last year, 11 horses reached the seven-figure mark, led by a \$2.1 million Tapit--Silver Colors colt.

If that metric remained relatively static, the number of horses selling from between \$500,000 and \$999,000 increased significantly in 2016. There were a total of 84 horses that fell in that range, compared to 58 a year ago.

Another arbitrary, if not insignificant, range--\$250,000 to \$499,000--yielded different results. There were 209 horses that fell within those parameters in 2016; last year, there were 252. In yet another range--those selling between \$100,000 to \$249,999--a similar story: 519 in 2016 vs. 579 in 2015.

But those numbers didn't tell the whole story, as many buyers felt the going was especially tough landing the horses at the tops of their lists.

"At every level, all the way through the sale, the good ones filtered up, and those horses were found," said Farrell. "Even through Book 5, things were very strong, and it really only softened up the last two days of the sale. Our sweet

spot has always been the \$40,000 horse, but I can't find the same quality of horse at that point anymore. You have to pay a bit more now."

Leading the buying bench at September was Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Company, which purchased 15 head for \$10,750,000, good for an average of \$716,667. Bloodstock agent Mike Ryan was the sale's second-leading buyer, with 29 yearlings purchased for \$6,525,000, an average of \$225,000.

Joining the usual suspects on the leading buyers list was Winchell Thoroughbreds, which signed for 17 horses for \$3.4 million (\$200,000 average). By contrast, over the last three years combined, the Winchell name appeared on the docket just five times.

"We also saw buyers from China [making an impact]," said Russell. "China Horse Club, with their relationship with WinStar Farm, they were very strong. And there was a new buyer from Australia [Aquis Farm's Hong Kong-based Tony Fung] who was very strong in Book 1."

Russell added, "Keeneland looks at itself as the marketing arm of the Thoroughbred industry, and the work we do 52 weeks of the year yields dividends. You could see that in the last few years, and especially this year, in the second week of the sale. We spend a lot of time on it, and are committed to doing it. It's good to see people from the four corners of the world here. And we made a real effort to get more people here from the regional markets in the U.S., particularly the Southwest, and that reaps rewards, too."

One buyer who was relatively quiet, at least by his own historical standards, was John Ferguson. The Darley rep signed for just five yearlings. They weren't minor purchases, however: at a gross of \$2,245,000 million, those five averaged \$449,000. Ferguson was the leading buyer at September in both 2015 (15 bought for \$6.3 million; \$420,000 average) and 2014 (22 bought for \$7,880,000; \$358,182 average).

Two sires again dominated the top end of the market. Gainesway's Tapit had 31 sell for \$19,835,000, an average of \$639,839. Claiborne's War Front had 19 sell for \$12,045,000, an average of \$633,947. Together, they combined for 1.8% of the yearlings sold at September, but 11.7% of gross receipts.

"War Front and Tapit have been at the forefront for the last few years, and they're sires that did it the hard way," said Russell. "It was the success of their progeny on the racetrack that's been transferred into the sales ring." **Cont. p5**

Taylor Made Sales was, once again, the leading consignor at September, with 282 head sold for \$32,899,300. Taylor Made-sold horses averaged \$116,664.

One point of debate among buyers, consignors and sale officials was a familiar one: the format of Book 1. September was in its second year of the three-day Book 1 format, which followed a four-day Book 1 format in 2014. In previous years, evening sessions were experimented with.

“It’s hard to figure out what to do,” said Woodford

Thoroughbreds’ Matt Lyons. “Every year we say the same thing-- what are we going to do with Book 1? But there was a lot of downtime this year, and people were looking for stuff to do. They wanted to just rock on. I heard a lot of people say there shouldn’t be a break [a dark day]--let’s just keep going. But I don’t know what the answer is.”

Cary echoed those sentiments. “It’s hard--they’ve tried a variety of formats,” he said. “People had a lot of time to look, and there weren’t 600 legitimate Book 1 horses. So the ones that aren’t quite at that elite level are going to be exposed, because there’s no one there to pounce on them.”

A colt from the first crop of Grade I winner Morning Line (Tiznow) topped Sunday’s 13th and final session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale, selling for \$45,000 to Royal Flush Racing. Consigned by Lane’s End, agent, [hip 4261](#) is out of stakes winner and graded stakes placed Angel Trumpet (Cape Canaveral) and is a half-brother to multiple stakes placed Black Bear (Midnight Lute). During Sunday’s session, 147 yearlings sold for \$1,036,600. The average was \$7,052 and the median was \$3,200. Last year’s September sale had only 12 sessions.

What They're Saying...

Allaire Ryan, Lane's End:

"For us, it started off slow and then picked up. I don't know if was the luck of the draw as far as how they were cataloged, but the last day of Book 1 was the strongest for us. And Books 3 and 4 were great. There was a high demand for physicals, and during Book 3, there was definitely a sense of urgency. Both pinhookers and end-users were still really active at that stage. We'd take horses up there with a certain appraisal on them, and they'd bring three times as much. So I think [Fasig-Tipton] October should be pretty strong, as well, because a lot of people didn't get their orders filled by Book 4 and they weren't quite liking what they saw in Book 5. The 2-year-old guys, in particular, would come to me and say, 'I can't buy a horse off you guys, it's so strong.' So I think we'll see them back in October."

Matt Lyons, Woodford Thoroughbreds:

"Overall, it was a pretty steady sale. We had some good results in Book 1, and overall we're pleased. It started off a little shaky. People were worried about how it was going to go, but it seemed to gain momentum. If you had the right horse who jumped through all the hoops--which wasn't easy to have--you got paid plenty. But then, horses by sires who were perceived to be doing not as well right now, it was tough. You got paid extra for the really good ones, and the rest of them, it was hard to find homes for. There does seem to be a ceiling on the top, however. You see these groups partnering up and buying horses together, versus bidding against each other like they used to. As a breeder, you hate to see that happen [laughs]. But that's the world we're in today."



"It was a good day," said Brown. "We were going to breeze over a two-day period, but with the rain yesterday we pushed it all to today. With an excellent staff, it all worked out and we got it done. Everything was executed perfectly. Everyone hit it perfect and everyone is on schedule. We're in good shape."

Brown added he was thrilled with **Connect** (Curlin)'s win in Saturday's GII Pennsylvania Derby.

"We always thought a lot of Connect," Brown said of the Paul Pompa colorbearer. "He's a horse that took a while to come around. He had a couple of minor injuries along the way and he finally showed yesterday what we thought all along about him; that he could be a top 3-year-old dirt horse. We're very excited about him. So far he looks OK and we'll form a plan in the days to come. The Breeders' Cup will be considered, but there are other races as well and other routes we can take with him. He's definitely an exciting horse for the future."

Also Saturday, Brown was represented by the first two home in the GIII Noble Damsel S.--**Mrs McDougal** (Medaglia d'Oro) and **Zindaya** (More Than Ready)--and by GII Commonwealth Derby winner **Deeply Undervalued** (Kitten's Joy).

MIDWEST & THE PIZZA MAN EYE CALIFORNIA

One of the most popular horses in training over the past few seasons, Midwest Thoroughbreds' top turf gelding **The Pizza Man** (English Channel) went into last weekend's GI Northern Dancer Turf S. at Woodbine at a relative all-time low. A picture of consistency throughout his career and a winner 16 of his first 26 starts through his 6-year-old season (2015), the multiple Grade I winner did not show his routine brilliance in his first four 2016 starts.

Unable to hit the board in the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. (fifth), GII Wise Dan S. (fourth), GIII Stars and Stripes (fourth) and sixth in a GI Arlington Million defense attempt, the Eclipse Award finalist for 2015 champion turf horse showed signs of life when taking the Northern Dancer in workmanlike fashion Sept. 17, running down and holding off Grade I winners World Approval (Northern Afleet) and Wake Forest (Ger) (Sir Percy {GB}), respectively. Winning courageously from between his aforementioned rivals--under the guidance of first-time rider Flavien Prat--the homebred returned to the winner's circle for the 17th time and pushed his career earnings to more than \$2 million under the tutelage of trainer Roger Brueggemann. **Cont. p9**



“I was really happy for him and for Roger,” said Midwest principal Richard Papiese. “I thought we were too close to the front at first, but [World Approval and jockey Julien Leparoux] were walking the dog and Flavien was smart enough to not ask him for anything or to chase. He just allowed him to do it all on his own. He had plenty left and he refused to let [Wake Forest] get past him.

“What helped him win was Wake Forest coming up on the outside,” Papiese continued. “We’re thinking about putting a pair of cheater blinkers on him next time so he doesn’t hang. It would be all new for him and I think we need to get special permission off a win to do that, but I think they could help him a little.”

A course and (12-furlong) distance prep for the \$1-million GI Pattison Canadian International, the Northern Dancer sets the sizable bay up for a possible return to Ontario Oct. 16. It also earned him a 118 Equibase Speed Figure--one point below his top career figure--and also puts the GI Breeders’ Cup Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 5 in the conversation. Last year, at 6-1 odds, The Pizza Man was fifth, beaten 4 1/4 lengths, in America’s top turf event. This year, the Turf’s purse has been raised from \$3 to \$4 million and will take place in California, the state in which The Pizza Man closed out his 6-year-old season with a dominant two-length victory in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup at Del Mar.

“The horse is doing great and came out [of the race] well,” Papiese reported. “He galloped today and he’s full of himself. Roger, Jim [Schenk, racing manager] and I will talk about it and see what the best option is. We don’t duck horses or people. If you want to be the best, you have to beat them and while I would always love to run in races like the Breeders’ Cup, in Dubai, Japan or Royal Ascot, we will let him tell us and I won’t put him in the wrong place. First on the radar is the Canadian International and second is the Breeders’ Cup. We may run in one or could run back and do both. He loves it out there [in California] I know that if he is given a good ride, he loves the grass and will show up.

“He might run a little bit, maybe three or four times, next year as an 8-year-old,” he continued. “Earlier in the season is better than later for him, with Dubai being a possibility if he gets invited again. He’s getting older, so we will take our time with him and Jim and I will listen to Roger, who says he’s doing great. What’s good about these long grass races and the fact that he has only turn six or seven times per year is that he probably has the legs of a 4-year-old at this point. When he’s not happy and doesn’t want to be a racehorse, we’ll oblige him. Right now he wants to be a racehorse and he still loves to win.”

The victory could not have had better timing for the Midwest team. Always at or near the top nationally in victories and purses earned, the operation's mettle and patience were being tested as health complications afflicted both Papiese and Brueggemann.

"This was really trying year for us," Papiese explained. "We go from a situation where Roger had hip surgery and then in March I started having vertigo issues and also tore my achilles tendon. You start to feel like you're 90 years old and on top of that, we had some bad racing luck and The Pizza Man was very unlucky. So, he definitely was carrying a few hundred extra pounds the other day.

"It's great having him move forward this time of year," he continued. "You want to be peaking right now and he is starting to get there. Going in that strong, you feel better about the next race. It was great to see him in the winner's circle again and put some of those demons to rest. He gets very upset when he doesn't get his picture taken and then go to the test barn. He thinks he's supposed to take a picture after every race and is hell to deal with when he doesn't."

If The Pizza Man does not head to California for the first week of November, he will likely be shipping out there one month later as part of Midwest's new expansion to California racing. With a limited presence in California before, it will now head westward with a full string, adding to its presence in most of the major American markets. Another string will be heading to Florida with Armando De La Cerda.

"I'm sending Roger out to California on Dec. 1 and we will make sure he has the stock to compete," Papiese said. "We have some decent 3-year-olds and 2-year-olds and some quality claiming horses with him I think that should set him up to be successful. We will likely only have about 20 to 30 horses with him, as he's definitely a hands-on trainer, and we'll back him up 100%. He'll be shipping into Del Mar and then heading to Santa Anita. He'll be as stocked as [stable trainer Danny] Gargan is in New York. We love it out there and we've done well before, not only with The Pizza Man, but obviously winning the [2014] GI Breeders' Cup [Sprint] with Work All Week (City Zip). We'll also be sending De La Cerda to Gulfstream Park and he will train at Palm Meadows to be [the base of] our Florida operation."

"Over the last few years we've been moving toward more allowance and stakes horses and this is all part of that," Papiese concluded. "We've done what we've said we're going to do. We raised the quality, shortened the strings and hopefully things keep going well for us."

Texas Chrome rallied determinedly up the rail to just best Sticksstatelodydude and earn his second straight graded victory in Sunday's GIII Oklahoma Derby. Off as the 23-10 favorite in this full field, the bay colt settled in sixth along the rail as Way Striking (Smart Strike) ensured an honest pace up top, going a quarter in :22.95. Sticksstatelodydude moved closer to challenge that one past a half in :47.25 and collared the pacesetter after three quarters in 1:11.69. Moving into contention behind rivals at the top of the stretch, Texas Chrome was forced to angle in sharply at the eighth pole to challenge the new leader from the rail. Sticksstatelodydude made it tight for the favorite, but he would not be denied, pushing through to get the better of his rival in the final 70 yards.

"I knew there was other speed going into the race, so my plan was to use the one hole to my advantage," explained winning rider C J McMahon. "I was looking to save ground and hope something would open up and it did. I was thinking of going outside, I could see [Rafael] Bejarano [on Fish Trappe Road] still had some horse and I knew he wasn't going to let me in if he had as much horse as I thought he did. So when I saw the inside open up, I just went for it. I knew my horse was game."

Paco Lopez, Jorge Navarro Earn Monmouth Titles:

Paco Lopez captured his fifth riding title and Jorge Navarro his fourth trainer's title when Monmouth Park concluded its 2016 racing season Sunday. Quiet Winter Farm was the meet's leading owner.

With decreases in number of races and field size, the Oceanport oval suffered declines in both handle and attendance, according to figures released by the track Sunday. On-track handle at the 57-day meet was \$22,431,306, a 26.59% decline over last year when the track hosted 58 live cards. Total handle also saw a 26.38% decline as \$196,272,397 was wagered this year on Monmouth's races. Daily average attendance was 8,833.

Monmouth Park saw a decrease in number of races run in 2016, with an average of 9.87 per day over the 57-day stand. Last year saw an average of 11.19 for the 58-day racing season. In total, there were 86 fewer races this year. Field size dropped by 11.4%, with an average of 7.28 horses per race in 2016, compared to 8.11 in 2015.

"Despite the lack of horses, we still recorded numerous accomplishments this year," said Dennis Drazin, advisor to Darby Development LLC, operators of the racetrack. "The entire Monmouth Park team continues to work hard to put on outstanding racing in a fan-friendly environment that is second to none."

Drazin continued, "Horses follow purse money and our neighbors are working with a distinct advantage. Every state surrounding us, and most of those surrounding them, have alternative gaming revenues fueling purses. These casino-fueled purses has led to a decrease in field size and carded races. Obviously this has had a direct impact on our handle both on-track and in the simulcast network."
