OWEN STAYING AHEAD OF THE CURVE

What a dasher he was--a blade to make even the world's most seasoned defenders fear that all the cunning they had learned, all their snagging tricks of knees and elbows, would be cut apart by his pure pace. But Michael Owen was never just the soccer equivalent of those sharp, early juveniles so beloved of his stable nowadays, blazing along the rail at its big local meeting at Chester in May. Yes, as every English fan has lamented, the second half of Owen's career was wretchedly punctuated by injury. Towards the end, he had to depend on his own footballing acuity to redress that erosion of his cutting edge. But if he started out as a Royal Ascot colt, he retired as a true Classic Thoroughbred among footballers, the only Englishman to score in four major tournaments and the only one to win the Ballon d'Or since 1979.

Above all, however, he was not just quick to mature on the pitch. Owen was also ahead of the curve when it came to planning for a life after football. True, the racecourse would not always be the most sensible resort for a wealthy young man. But while Owen admittedly owed his original curiosity to betting, he has since become unmistakably immersed in the life and soul of the Turf.

LUMIERE POSSIBLE FOR HONG KONG TRIP

Lumiere (Ire) (Shamardal) has been ruled out of the Breeders' Cup, but the 3-year-old filly could still have a late-season target in the form of the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile. The winner of last year's G1 Cheveley Park S., the Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed al Maktoum colourbearer has had a season of mixed fortunes, including a last in the G1 1000 Guineas prior to a six-length win in Listed Sir Henry Cecil S., and the grey put in a respectable effort last out when second in the seven-furlong G2 Dubai 100 Challenge S. Oct. 7. Charlie Johnston, son of and assistant to trainer Mark Johnston, said, "Lumiere is not going to America, but we have entered her in the Hong Kong Mile and that is in the back of our minds at the moment. America would come a bit too soon for her. We will just see how she is, as that meeting is not until December. If she is fit, well and healthy then it is a definite possibility. A mile on quick ground on a fairly sharp track should suit her perfectly."

Only 24 when laying the foundations of a racing stable on a Cheshire farm, he was able to retire in 2013 unfazed by a challenge that finds many other footballers perilously unprepared. He has, indeed, secured the best of both worlds: remaining engaged with the soccer community, on the one hand, not only as a pundit on BT Sport but also through a management company for young talent; and, on the other, consolidating an ambitious partnership at Manor House Stables with Andrew Black, co-founder of Betfair, and their trainer Tom Dascombe.

"In terms of playing football, I was finished at 33--and maybe there's two-thirds of your life ahead of you," he tells *TDN*. "What then? People think: 'Oh, if I was on that kind of money I'd play golf every day and be perfectly happy.' But nobody would really





want to do that. You've got to be active, to keep the mind stimulated."

He had, moreover, had ample opportunity to observe older players who had failed to see the abyss looming. "I've seen how people can throw it

all away, and it can be very sad," he says. "You don't need me to name names, it's all over the papers all the time. From the beginning they've seen their mates buying nice cars, nice houses, and they've done the same. And then you see that self-destruct button, you see what boredom or bad advice can do, a couple of divorces maybe. I have to be careful here, I don't want anyone to think I'm playing a violin or anything. But people have that sloppy view of footballers, that they're all making an absolute fortune. They forget that a lot of players might only be on those kind of wages from maybe 22 to 30, and I know plenty who have suddenly got to 40 and realised they can't go on any more without working."

Already having a blueprint for the future, moreover, Owen was able to stand back and recognise the kind of cue to which other professional athletes, in panicked denial, often remain deaf for too long. "I had a decision to make: either go lower or get out," he recalls. "Yes, in many ways I'd been like a precocious 2-year-old. But after the first six or eight years, whatever it was, it gradually became a matter of clinging on. Eventually I wasn't playing too much, in my final season at Manchester United, and then I wasn't playing that much when I went to Stoke, either." **Cont. p3**

Added Owen, "And the way I went, when facing that crossroads, that's always been my character. Don't get me wrong: I've seen plenty of people I really admire who, for the love of the game, just want to keep playing and don't mind at what level. But that wasn't for me. I'd been the playground bully for years, and everyone knows that those never like being bullied themselves. And that was the way I felt, chasing around Anfield and Old Trafford with Stoke. So I said to myself: 'You need to get out before your head explodes.'"

"People think: 'Oh, if I was on that kind of money I'd play golf every day and be perfectly happy.' But nobody would really want to do that. You've got to be active, to keep the mind stimulated."

Mind you, there were those who misunderstood the nature of Owen's commitment to the Turf. Even his manager at Manchester United, the revered Sir Alex Ferguson, had ended up

embarrassingly at odds with its elite professionals after his breakthrough into racing at the highest level with Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire) (Danehill). That notorious affair seemed

consistent with the notion that football's flirtations with racing will only ever be frivolous, naive or spendthrift.

"I took quite a bit of stick," Owen admits. "When I was 26 or 27, and starting to lose a bit of speed—I'd had a couple of bad injuries, wasn't the flying machine I'd once been—people were saying: 'Look at him, he's got his eyes on other things now.' If I didn't score a hat-trick, it was because I was too interested in racing. You can't win, of course: if people see you planning for the future, they say you're taking your eye off the ball; and if they see that you're not, they say you're stupid."

It very soon became apparent, however, that Owen was sooner in the school of Mick Channon, another former England striker who has since achieved commensurate standing in his second career as a multiple Group 1-winning trainer. [Cont. p4](#)



“After three straight years in the €15-million range, last week’s Arqana October Sale really took off, with a 23% increase in gross, to nearly €19.4-million, and a 17% increase in average, to €42,148 – both new records. Oddly it is possible this marks a move off of market stagnation as these increases don’t seem to be due to some sudden new discovery the French-bred program is good. Overall, through last weekend, the total for the North American & European 2016 auction market is \$677-million, down 1% from last year but of course roughly in line with 2014-2015 figures.”

For the 2010 season, he head-hunted Dascombe--then making a big impression in Lambourn, after learning the ropes with Martin Pipe, Ralph Beckett and Mike De Kock--to take over Manor House Stables. The following year Dascombe saddled winners on consecutive days at Royal Ascot, one of whom proceeded to win the 2014 G1 Irish St Leger by 6 1/2 lengths. That was the cherished Brown Panther (GB) (Shirocco {Ger}), who also won the G2 Dubai Gold Cup last year but suffered a terminal, heart-wrenching breakdown back at The Curragh.

Owen bred Brown Panther himself, from the mare who had really set him on the road: Treble Heights (Ire) (Unfuwain),

trained by John Gosden to win a listed race and finish second in a Group 2 at Deauville. But while numbed by the tragedy, Owen had developed sufficient insight to appreciate--rather than curse -- his luck.

"He was held dear

by all my family," he says. "When I open my front door, I see his

brother 50 yards away. Everyone loved him, from the lad who looked after him, to the traveling guys, to the trainer. He took us to every corner of the planet, he was a superstar. But aside from that natural sadness, when it happened, it wasn't a case of suddenly thinking: 'I hate this game.' He left us memories that will last a lifetime. In fact, I don't think anything can surpass what he did for us, not least in putting the yard on the map. He took us to a different stratosphere. Maybe I'll get another one as good, one day. But I don't think I can ever become as attached to another horse, or have such a story."

"I was extremely lucky, to have bred him, and certainly wouldn't take any credit," he added. "I just had a lovely racemare, who did me proud on the track, and because she was a black-type performer herself I invested pretty heavily in the nicer stallions. Then, just as I was beginning to think she wasn't going to be any good as a broodmare, and lowered my sights to a cheaper cover, out pops Brown Panther."



So it was that Owen was vindicated in his hopes even as he was cautioned as to the vagaries of breeding. As a result, he has concentrated on developing the business in less speculative ways: upgrading the training facilities; promoting syndicates; trying to guarantee a fulfilling social return for investors, win lose or draw. "If a horse in the yard wins, I get such a buzz even if it's nothing to do with me," he enthuses. "We party together, we watch the gallops together, we all feel that team spirit. So while I've been investing in improving the facility, so that it's now as good as I've seen in the industry, maybe to a degree I've neglected my own horses. It was only 12 years ago that I first stuck up that little shed. And at that time I owned 15 of the 20 horses on the site. Now we're up to well over a hundred. We've grown, and we've grown through turbulent times. I've learned a lot along the way. I've only got half a dozen mares, and I've never liked jumping into things without a proper understanding. But I think I've got a good grasp now. I've increasingly developed a keen interest in the veterinary side, the training side, in the whole business of what we want Manor House to stand for. And I feel the next step is to up my quality, in my mares and in my bloodstock in general."

TRADE STRONG ON TATTS DAY TWO

With sterling creaking under the strain of Brexit, it was clear from the outset that there would be a strong international market at the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale. That has proved true at all levels: one especially exotic group

yesterday produced noisy hollers and applause after a successful bid of 1,200gns, while the previous day an auctioneer had to seal another sale with the words: "Tell that gentleman on the stairs that he's just bought a


horse."

But it was at the other end of the spectrum that export cash once again helped to boost all the year-on-year indices steeply upwards. Though total lots through the ring were down to 261 from 281, at a virtually identical clearance rate of 89%, aggregate sales through the second session soared 33% to 7,390,900gns from 5,552,300gns. That produced leaps in the median of 19,000gns (up from 13,500gns) and the average of 31,721gns (up from 22,479gns)--representing gains of 41% in both cases.

Sure enough, the top lot to date is destined for sunnier climes--completing, in the process, quite a transformation since his last visit here not four months ago. Ten days after scrambling home by a nose in a Bath maiden, in the colours of Lady Rothschild, **Cloudberry (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) was sent to the July Sale here--only to be brought back to Beckhampton by his trainer Roger Charlton, to race in his stable's own silks, for just 15,000gns. Son of a Danehill half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Pounced (Rahy), he has since won three times off the reel, most recently in a mile handicap at Newbury only last Friday. The way he traveled through that race represented a timely guarantee that he remains on a roll, and he drew corresponding interest as [lot 639](#). Those to press hard included Johnny McKeever, standing alongside Gai

Waterhouse's co-trainer

Adrian Bott; Alastair Donald; and ultimately John Egan. But the last nod, at 310,000gns, went to Gassim Al Ghazali, plainly captivated by what he had seen when the horse was paraded before him earlier in the day. [Cont. p6](#)

"As soon as I saw him I knew I had to have him," said Qatar's perennial champion trainer, a regular shopper at this sale. "He was a little bit expensive but you can't control the price and I needed to have him. The races he has won might not be high quality but they show he's improving and he also has good conformation, so I hope he can become a Qatar Derby horse."

Charlton, who had reluctantly lost Imperial Aviator (GB) (Paco Boy {Ire}) to share top billing on the opening day at 270,000gns, could this time console himself with a rare windfall. "The horse has absolutely blossomed since the July Sale," he said. "He was impressive at Newbury, and he's a very sound, really nice horse who I think should continue to do well."

Brothers Navigate Yangtze Towards Melbourne...

Another destined for a long-haul flight is **Yangtze (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) ([lot 713](#)). Having seen out the trip so strongly since being stepped up to 14 furlongs by Sir Michael Stoute, he was of unsurprising interest to jumping investors, led by Harold Kirk. But the final nod at 185,000gns went to two brothers-in-arms--agent Tom and trainer Sam Pritchard-Gordon--and he will now join the latter's stable in Melbourne.

"He'll run for a syndicate hoping, as we all do, that one day he might become a Melbourne Cup horse," said Sam, who set up shop four years ago after a long apprenticeship with Lee Freedman. "His last three runs really sealed the deal for me, but this horse ticks a lot of boxes for down there: the Dansili factor; a family that improves with age; and there's a fair bit of size and substance there, too. The great thing is that everyone wants to be involved in a horse in Australia, from plumbers to schoolteachers: it's a real mainstream sport. It's such a vibrant environment, and with the prizemoney on offer this horse could win quite a chunk of his cost back if he can win a Group 3."

Plenty Ventured For Final Gain...

Keeping a good horse on home soil was not impossible, but it was seldom cheap. A short but pricey journey duly beckons [lot 495](#), **Final Venture (GB)** (Equiano {Fr}), after he was sold out of Alan Swinbank's yard for 260,000gns. The 4-year-old gelding will now join another North Yorkshire trainer in Paul Midgley, who already handles around a dozen horses for new owner Andrew Taylor.

Final Venture has been thriving in sprints all summer, boosting his rating from 69 to 104 after going under by barely half-a-length in a listed race last time. "We've been tracking the horse for a while," said Ian Mayson, who conducted the bidding on Taylor's behalf. "He fits our profile, as we do like sprinters: Andrew's good horses with Paul include the likes of Monsieur Joe (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}), Line Of Reason (Ire) (Kheleyf), Desert Law (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Ninjago (GB) (Mount Nelson {GB}). But this is the dearest so far."

Anthony Stroud, always active in recruiting for the Dubai Carnival at this sale, had made a strong bid for Final Venture. But he was not to be denied for **Treasury Notes (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}), [lot 580](#), at 200,000gns. Stroud knows the gelding well, having bought him at the Breeze-Ups here a couple of years ago for 54,000gns. Much improved since returned to David O'Meara from this sale 12 months ago, for just 30,000gns, he won his fourth handicap of the campaign off 97 at Ripon in August.

Stroud later paid 148,000gns for **Twin Sails (GB)** (Sir Percy {GB}), a solid 95-rated handicapper for Dean Ivory--excellent Book 3 business here for the trainer's father Ken, two years ago, at just 25,000gns.

Jet Setting Trainer Back on the Runway...

Auctioneer Alastair Pim spoke advisedly when he congratulated Adrian Keatley on his purchase of [lot 528](#) for 9,500gns. "I hope he's as good as the last one," he told the young trainer, who famously obtained subsequent G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Jet Setting (Ire) (Fast Company {Ire})--through Kilbride Equine--for just 12,000gns here last year. Rising Eagle (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) has shown still less for Charles Hills than did that filly for Richard Hannon during her first season, and a rather more obvious prospect among the Faringdon Place draft was [lot 523](#).

Stephen Hillen was duly obliged to pay 150,000gns for Shanghai Glory (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) on behalf of Jim Hay. Beaten off 75 on his reappearance, this 3-year-old gelding inflated his rating to 104 when winning a listed race at The Curragh a couple of weeks before the sale.

"He's tough, he's consistent, but the best thing is that he's a 3-year-old and there's lots more to come," Hillen reasoned. "It's hard for a 3-year-old to beat older sprinters but that's what he did the other day and there are 4- and 5-year-olds, that would be a bit more washed up, making more. He might go to Dubai, or there will be all those listed or Group 3 sprints next year."

Hillen said he did not know where Shanghai Glory would be stabled, though it will not be lost on his new owners that his present trainer has done very well for them this term with Jallota (GB) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}).

Jumpers Find The Bar Raised...

So much overseas competition has made the first couple of days tough going for the National Hunt buyers, but Eddie O'Leary held out stubbornly to bring down the hammer at 155,000gns for [lot 758](#). Tried at Group 1 level as a juvenile by Hugo Palmer, **Mengli Khan (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) won a Kempton handicap last month after castration and was signed for in the name of Gordon Elliott--whose yard is set to be in the front rank for Gigginstown Stud this winter, following its dramatic split with Irish champion trainer Willie Mullins.

The penultimate session of the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale takes place Wednesday.

TWILIGHT SON RETIRED TO CHEVELEY

Godfrey Wilson and Cheveley Park Stud's **Twilight Son (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}–Twilight Mistress {GB}, by Bin Ajwaad {Ire}), winner of this year's G1 Diamond Jubilee S. and last year's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup, has been retired to stand alongside his sire at Cheveley Park Stud.

Trained by Henry Candy, the 4-year-old went unbeaten through his first five starts, culminating in his Sprint Cup win. He suffered his first defeat when second to champion sprinter Muhaarar (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in last year's G1 Qipco British Champions Sprint S., and

took the Diamond Jubilee second-up at Royal Ascot this year. He was last seen beating one home in the British Champions Sprint Oct. 15.

Cheveley Park Stud Managing Director Chris Richardson said, "Twilight Son is a hugely talented, beautifully bred, imposing individual, very like his sire Kyllachy, who I feel offers both commercial and owner-breeders a very exciting opportunity for their mares. The addition of Twilight Son further enhances the portfolio of stallions currently standing at Cheveley Park Stud and continues to reflect David and Patricia Thompson's huge commitment to the international world of racing and breeding. We are most grateful to have been involved with Twilight Son's breeders, Caroline and Godfrey Wilson, and of course to have been re-associated with trainer Henry Candy, who has done a fantastic job guiding Twilight Son throughout his highly successful career."

MINDING LIKELY TO STAY IN TRAINING

Star 3-year-old filly **Minding (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who collected her seventh Group 1 in the Queen Elizabeth II S. Oct. 15, is likely to stay in training next year, according to trainer Aidan O'Brien.

"I think that's the plan, I think that's what the lads are thinking of at the moment," said O'Brien of the dual Classic winner. "Nothing is written in stone, but she would be one to look forward to."

O'Brien indicated the dual Classic-placed and G2 Great Voltigeur S. winner **Idaho (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) would also remain at Ballydoyle. The bay has had some poor fortune in the second half of the season, having unseated rider Seamie Heffernan in

the stretch of the G1 St Leger and having finished fifth last-out in the G1 Canadian International.

"It didn't really work in Canada," O'Brien said. "We're looking forward to him next year. We think he's something to look forward to as a 4-year-old."

Derby favourite US Army Ranger (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) will also stay in training after encouraging O'Brien with his eighth in the G1 Champion S. The trainer told *At The Races*,

"He will stay in training, we rushed him a little bit for the Derby. He had a break and none of his races really worked, but we were very happy with him on his last run. He didn't get the run of the race and we felt he would have been right there. We think he's going to be a 4-year-old to look forward to as well."

BHA TO SIMPLIFY OWNERSHIP ADMIN

Edited Press Release

The British Horseracing Authority will implement a set of changes, including the launch of a new racing administration website, in the spring of 2017 to simplify and modernize the administrative side of racehorse ownership. In addition, ownership registration types will be simplified and fees consolidated.

Charlie Liverton, Chief Executive of the Racehorse Owners Association, said, "Owners have long complained that their first steps on the road to ownership were characterised by red tape and confusing ownership structures followed by numerous fees. The ROA is delighted that the planned reforms will greatly reduce these hurdles, ensuring that both existing and new owners can concentrate on the more enjoyable aspects of our thrilling sport."

The new racing administration website, which will be supported by a telephone helpdesk, will allow owners to maintain their records digitally, removing the vast majority of paper-based forms. In addition, owners will be able to set up sponsorships, register an authority to act and check and pay invoices online.

The eight different types of ownership currently available will be reduced to five—sole, partnership, syndicate, racing club and company—to help eliminate confusion. Finally, fees for registration and re-registration of colours, an authority to act and VAT will be aligned to one date in the year.

Richard Wayman, Chief Operating Officer for the BHA, said, "At the heart of the sport's growth strategy is making racehorse ownership more attractive and accessible to both new and existing owners. This will require significant progress in a number of areas including ownership administration, where there needs to be much greater emphasis on the customer experience. The initiatives announced today are a first important step on that journey. Similar to many online transactions, the new ownership administration system means that almost all administrative tasks will be completed much more easily and quickly online, while the simplification of ownership types and fee structures will remove much of the confusion and frustration of ownership admin."

He added, "Looking further ahead we would like to get to a position where the administrative costs of ownership are greatly reduced. As we explore how that might be delivered, the changes announced today will address many of the administrative frustrations our consultation told us have been faced by owners for too long."

DERBY WINNER TARZINO RETIRED

Tarzino (NZ) (Tavistock {NZ}–Zarzino {NZ}, by Zabeel {NZ}), the winner of last year's G1 Victoria Derby and the 2016 G1 Rosehill Guineas, has been retired from racing and is likely to enter stud in New Zealand, according to *Racing.com*.

A NZ\$45,000 yearling purchase from Cambridge Stud at the 2014 NZB Select Yearling Sale, Tarzino broke his maiden at second asking and went on to win the Derby four starts later. He finished second in the G1 Australian Guineas in the autumn before adding the Rosehill Guineas, and rounded out his 3-year-old campaign with a fourth in the G1 Australian Derby. The bay failed to hit the board in four tries this season, and was scratched from the Oct. 15 G1 Caulfield Cup after trainer Mick Price detected the injury that led to his retirement.

"He injured the oblique sesamoidean ligament on the inside of the off-front and whilst the horse doesn't realise that he has an

injury, I think he's been stopped at the right time and if we had persevered then it would have blown into an injury in the Caulfield Cup," Price told *Racing.com*. "If he was a gelding then obviously he would spell and complete rehabilitation, but with where the injury is on the horse and the timing of it the ownership syndicate has decided to retire the horse."

Price added, "As a son of Tavistock, the ownership group--including Rosemont, who are the majority shareholder--believe the horse would do very well in New Zealand."

OLIVER BAN UPHELD

Jockey Damien Oliver will be watching from the sidelines on Victoria Derby Day this Saturday after a judge decided to not shorten the 20-meeting ban imposed on him for his winning ride aboard Flying Artie (Aus) (Artie Schiller) in the Oct. 12 G3 Blue Sapphire S. at Caulfield, according to *Racing.com*.

Judge Pamela Jenkins described the ban as "the minimum appropriate" and said "although no injury or death in fact resulted, the actions of the applicant created a potential risk of real and grave consequences." Oliver was penalised for pushing Flying Artie out into a horse on his outside, and Jenkins deemed he put his rival and his jockey at risk.

"It is imperative that jockeys expect to be dealt with severely in terms of such potential risks and not be prepared to take such risks, as the applicant was so clearly prepared to do," she said.

Oliver, who will miss the ride on Flying Artie in Saturday's G1 Coolmore Stud S., will return to riding Melbourne Cup Day Nov. 1.



"He's working well," Baffert told the TDN Tuesday afternoon. "All his works have been pretty strong leading up to here being that he hasn't run in a while. So far, I haven't seen any regression since his last race. I am pretty happy with the way he has been training. We have one more week to go. He will work again either Monday or Tuesday, but it won't be a really serious work."

Kaleem Shah's Dortmund breezed a best-of-28 five panels in :58.80 in company with fellow Shah colorbearer Bollywood (Bernardini) ([Video](#)). Jockey Martin Garcia, who rode MGISW Dortmund to eight victories from 10 starts during his two and 3-year-old seasons, was aboard for the work, but Baffert has not yet decided who will ride the chestnut in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile Nov. 4.

"He worked well," Baffert commented on the 4-year-old, who most recently finished second to California Chrome in the GI Awesome Again S. Oct. 1. "He has always been a good work horse. I think he is doing well and the Mile is going to suit him much better than the Classic."

Also on the worktab for Baffert Tuesday were Grade I-winning juveniles and "TDN Rising Stars" Klimt (Quality Road) and **Noted and Quoted** (The Factor). Shah's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile contender Klimt covered six furlongs in 1:11.80 (2/6) under Garcia in company with fellow "TDN Rising Star" Big Gray Rocket (Tapit) ([Video](#)). The bay captured the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 5 and was runner-up in the GI FrontRunner S. Oct. 1.

Speedway Stable's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runner Noted and Quoted also covered six furlongs in 1:11.80 (2/6) with regular rider Bejarano aboard. The gray scored a half-length victory in Arcadia's GI Chandelier S. last time out Oct. 1.

"I am pretty happy with the way all my horses are doing," Baffert remarked. "We have to keep them healthy another week and need some racing luck, but I feel pretty confident that they will all be in top shape on race day."

The Hall of Famer continued, "My job is to have them ready to fire their best race. They all look great. Everything is running really smooth. I had a really smooth morning [Tuesday] and that is all you can ask for."

Baffert also offered an update on Charles Chu's "**TDN Rising Star**" **Drefong** (Gio Ponti), who fired a six-panel bullet in 1:11 flat in company with fellow "**TDN Rising Star**" **Ten Blessings** (Smart Strike) Monday at Santa Anita. The GI Breeders' Cup Sprint contender was last seen scoring a decisive victory in Saratoga's GI King's Bishop S. Aug. 27.

"He worked really well," Baffert said. "He's a heavier horse so he needed to do a little bit more. He came out of the work well and looked great [Tuesday]. We're happy."

The conditioner added, "[MGSW and BC Sprint contender] **Lord Nelson** (Pulpit) works [Wednesday]. He will have a little bit of a serious work tomorrow. We're all on pins and needles hoping everything goes well until [the Breeders' Cup]. We have a lot of rain coming in this weekend, Friday and Saturday, so I think everybody is trying to get everything out of the way before the rain hits."

Other notable Breeders' Cup workers at Santa Anita Tuesday:

- MGSW & GISP **Om** (Munnings), who will run in either the GI Breeders' Cup Mile or GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, covered five furlongs in 1:00.20 (10/28).
- Grade I-winning BC Mile contender **Midnight Storm** (Pioneerof the Nile) breezed six furlongs in 1:12.40 (6/6).
- Turf Sprint contender **Holy Lute** (Midnight Lute), who won the GIII Eddie D. S. last time out Sept. 30, worked five furlongs in 1:00.20 (10/28) ([Video](#)).

ORB COLT TOPS FASIG TUESDAY

LEXINGTON, Ky - After a strong opening session Monday, numbers dipped off during the second day of the Fasig-Tipton October Fall Yearling Sale in Lexington Tuesday, even as the buy-back rate improved. A colt from the first crop of GI Kentucky Derby winner Orb ([hip 759](#)) brought the day's top price when selling for \$300,000 to Tony Dutrow's Team D partnership.

"The average and median were a little bit lower today," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "I think if you spoke to people on the grounds, just because of the way the catalogue fell, the consensus might have been that this was the lightest group of horses at the upper end. And a couple of big horses can really influence the average of a sale that averages in the \$30,000-35,000 range. Overall, I thought trade was very consistent and very similar today to yesterday and I think there are some nice horses tomorrow."

During Tuesday's session, 251 horses sold for \$7,162,700. The average of \$28,537 was off 22.2% from last year's second session, while the median fell 37.5% to \$10,000. Through two sessions, the cumulative average of \$31,125 is off 10.6% from last year's four-day sale and the median is down 20%.

While the median and average were down, the buy-back rate through two sessions of the October sale improved to 27.7%. It was 32.2% after two sessions a year ago.

"I think every sales company professional would tell you, at the end of the day, they would rather get horses sold," Browning said. "I think the people that are transacting business with you are wanting to turn their product into cash. So I would always lean towards trying to improve the buy-back rate and hope you don't see any dramatic shift in the statistics."

Kerry Cauthen, whose Four Star Sales consigned Tuesday's second-highest priced offering, has found the October sale strong across the board.

"You're putting together a market that is books 1 through 6, so that's asking a lot of the buyers," Cauthen said. "We're finding that the top end, as it has done all year long, has done very well. But we are finding buyers at, what I think are reasonable and fair prices, down to the low part of the market--the book 6 relative horses--and I think they are bringing fair prices. It has kept up through mid-day Tuesday and I hope it keeps up all the way through to the end."

The October sale concludes with a final session Wednesday, with bidding beginning at 10 a.m.

Orb Colt on Top at Fasig Tuesday

Trainer Tony Dutrow had to fly home to New York, but bloodstock agent Bo Hunt deputized to secure a colt by Orb for Dutrow's Team D partnership for a session-topping \$300,000 during the second day of the Fasig-Tipton October sale Tuesday.

"He is a lovely horse, a really nice colt," Hunt said after signing the ticket on [hip 759](#). "Mr. Dutrow really liked the horse. He had to catch a flight back to New York, so he asked me to bid on the horse for him. That was probably as high as he was going to go on him. He was very happy to get the horse bought."

In recent years, the Team D partnership has campaigned 2014 GIII Sanford S. winner Big Trouble (Tiz Wonderful), as well as 2013 GII Futurity winner In Trouble (Tiz Wonderful).

In addition to the session-topping Orb colt, Team D was also the name on the ticket Monday for [hip 201](#), a colt by Tale of the Cat purchased for \$150,000.

Hip 759, from the first crop of GI Kentucky Derby winner Orb, is out of the unraced Zealous Gold (Medaglia d'Oro), a half-sister to graded stakes winners Friel's For Real (Sword Dance {Ire}) and Ryan's For Real (Sword Dance {Ire}). The yearling's third dam is Beaty Sark (Deputy Minister), the dam of graded stakes winner Ivanavinalot, who produced unbeaten champion Songbird (Medaglia d'Oro).

The dark bay colt was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency on behalf of breeders Fred Hertrich and John Fielding. Hertrich purchased Zealous Gold for \$50,000 at the 2012 Keeneland November sale.

"He was one that we were specifically targeting this later sale with," Taylor Made's Mark Taylor said of the May 23 foal. "I think it really paid off because Mother Nature does more to bring these horses along than anything we can do prepping. He

was just much more mature, filled out and physically ready than he was a month ago. He had the pedigree--we ran an ad the other day highlighting that he was from Songbird's family, but the whole pedigree is really

strong. He had the whole package, which is what it takes in this market."

Taylor continued to see plenty of strength at the top end of the market as the October sale neared the conclusion of its second session Tuesday.

"All of our horses who have sold the best at this sale are basically bringing about 50-100% more than what I've appraised them for," Taylor said. "Now the rest of them, you have to be very careful."

Gemologist Colt Sparkles at Fasig

Bloodstock agent Mike Ryan went to \$290,000 to secure [hip 561](#), a colt by Gemologist out of Starlicious (Cape Town) from the Four Star Sales consignment.

Ryan, who was bidding on behalf of an undisclosed client, admitted the yearling's hot freshman sire was a large part of his appeal.

"The Gemologists are well-grown horses, they will stretch, but they've got plenty of pace--which they showed at the 2-year-old sales and now they're showing it on the racetrack," Ryan said.

From his first crop to race, Gemologist has been represented recently by GI Frizette S. winner Yellow Agate and GIII Futurity winner

Theory, as well as graded placed Spirituality.

Of the yearling, Ryan added, "This was an impressive horse, a big strapping horse. There was no genius needed to pick him out. We have to pay for those kind and I knew we'd have to stretch for him. I think he's the best colt in today, in fact, he might be the best colt in the sale, in my opinion. I think he is Grade I caliber."

The bay colt, bred by Graeme Lang, is out of Starlicious, a half-sister to stakes winner Really Crafty (Crafty Prospector).

"He was a very nice colt and he was bred and raised by great folks," said Four Star's Kerry Cauthen. "He just put all the pieces together. Gemologist has got everything going on and there is nothing that can help a sale like a hot sire."

More Than Ready Colt for Pinhooking Group

A colt by More Than Ready got Tuesday's second session of the October sale off to a quick start, selling for \$230,000 to the bid of bloodstock agent Josh Stevens.

"I bought him for a partnership that's not fully put together yet, but it's for a new group of guys who will pinhook him," Stevens, who previously worked at Margaux Farm before going out on his own two years ago, commented.

[Hip 428](#), consigned by VanMeter-Gentry Sales and bred by Olin Gentry and Gaines-Gentry Stallion Holdings, is out of Ruban Bleu (Broken Vow) and is a half to graded stakes placed Tiznow R J (Tiznow). Gentry purchased Ruban Bleu, with this foal in utero,

for \$360,000 at the 2015 Keeneland January sale. The yearling RNA'd for \$325,000 at last month's Keeneland September sale.

"He was gorgeous," Stevens said of the yearling. "He has more size and scope than a lot of More Than Readys and he looks like he'll have the ability to go two turns. And his half-brother is a really good horse. It can be hard to find that combination of pedigree and individual at these later sales, but he really stuck out for us. He looks like the type that could get you to the Derby, which is everybody's dream."

Of the yearling's price tag, Stevens added, "We chased a couple yesterday and it was very competitive, so we knew we would have to pony up for this one this morning. If I'd been able to get him for less than that, I would have thought it was a real deal."

A total of 26 new sires, three of which stand at Coolmore in Ireland (Australia, War Command and No Nay Never) are represented by a total of 375 weanlings in the upcoming November sales, which is just under 20% of the 1,926 weanlings catalogued, according to statistics compiled by TDN's Heather Anderson for this column ([click here](#) for an alphabetical list of all 194 sires with weanlings catalogued).

But before discussing the new sires, headed by Coolmore Ashford's **Verrazano**--he leads all sires, with 50 weanlings catalogued from his first crop--it's worth mentioning that six established big-time sires have 10 or more foals each catalogued between Fasig, which sells on Monday, Nov. 7, and Keeneland Book 1, which is Tuesday-Wednesday, Nov. 8-9. **Cont. p9**

Coolmore, including their Kentucky arm, Ashford, is pretty famous for topping the lists by number of mares bred, and they're very prominent on these lists, too. Sire sensation **Uncle Mo**, the leading second-crop sire in North America and Europe by about five miles (considering he is number four NA/EU sire in 2016 by worldwide earnings [[click here](#)], behind only Galileo, Tapit, and Dubawi), has a total of 28 of his 49 weanlings (second only to Verrazano) catalogued by close of business Wednesday. He is the only sire with more than two at Fasig-Tipton (he has five), and has 23 in Keeneland Book 1, also the most by any sire. Former barn-mate **Scat Daddy** has 17, two at Fasig and 15 in Book 1. Darley's **Medaglia d'Oro** has 13 (one + 12); Claiborne's **War Front** has 11 (all Book 1); Gainesway's **Tapit** has 10 catalogued (all Book 1), as does Hill 'n' Dale's **Curlin** (two Fasig, eight Book 1). That's a total of 104 weanlings by those six top sires by the end of Book 1, which should precipitate some fireworks. Uncle Mo, Scat Daddy, and Curlin have another 37 catalogued total after Book 1, but War Front, Tapit, and Medaglia d'Oro have no weanlings among them catalogued after Book 1.

Overall, a total of 19 sires are represented by 25 or more weanlings catalogued in the entire Kentucky sales, and it's very

striking that only one (**Into Mischief**, first foals 2010, 26 catalogued) has older than first 3-year-olds. Uncle Mo (49) and Lane's End's **Twirling Candy** (36) have first 3-year-olds. With first 2-year-olds are: Lane's End's **The Factor** (32) and **Union Rags** (28);

Gainesway's **Tapizar** (29); and Darby Dan's **Shackleford** (26). WinStar's pair of **Gemologist** (23) and **Bodemeister** (21) also have more than 20 catalogued. Six sires with their first yearlings this year have 25+ foals catalogued from their second crops: Hill 'n' Dale's **Violence** (40), third among all sires by weanlings catalogued; WinStar's **Paynter** (35); Spendthrift's **Liaison** (28); Ashford's **Shanghai Bobby** (27); and Claiborne's pair of **Orb** and **Data Link** (26 each). Spendthrift's **Flat Out** has 23 catalogued, and three sires have 20 foals catalogued from their second crops: Ashford's Declaration of War; Taylor Made's **Graydar**; and WinStar's **Take Charge Indy**. Then six sires have 25+ weanlings catalogued from their first crops. Young sires may not make Book 1 in September, but they are sure a lot more prominent in November.

Originally a \$250,000 yearling bought by Let's Go Stable, the Coolmore partners bought into Verrazano in February of his 3-year-old year after two wide-margin wins at Gulfstream Park. He immediately won the GII Tampa Bay Derby and GI Wood Memorial but blew out, as many do, in the GI Kentucky Derby and, indeed, he was unplaced in his other two tries at 10 furlongs, in the GI Travers, and in his final career start, the

G1 Eclipse S. in England, in his third and final start for Aidan O'Brien as a 4-year-old. Between the Derby and the Travers he won the GIII Pegasus and scored his second Grade I win in the GI Haskell--both wins by over nine lengths--and he ran an

off-the-charts Beyer 116 in the Haskell. He was also placed in the G1 Lockinge S. and the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot in his first two starts for Aidan O'Brien as a 4-year-old. When this horse was on his game he was a killer; by More Than Ready out of a Giant's Causeway daughter of Chic Shrine from a top King Ranch family, it's not a big surprise that he's been so popular among breeders that he has 50 first-crop weanlings catalogued at the November sales--the most by any sire. Of those, 43 are at Fasig and in Keeneland Books 1-3.

Airdrie's **Cairo Prince** has 35 catalogued, of which 21 are at Fasig or in Keeneland Books 1-3. Another \$250,000 yearling, from the first crop by Pioneerof the Nile, Cairo Prince won three of his first four starts for trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, dropping a nose decision to Honor Code in the GII Remsen in 2013, then scoring an impressive

5 3/4-length win in the GII Holy Bull at Gulfstream in January, after which Godolphin bought controlling interest in him. Kiaran McLaughlin might start ducking that race, though; Mohaymen won the fourth of his fifth straight wins this year in the Holy Bull, followed up

in the GII Fountain of Youth, and hasn't won since. Cairo Prince, for his part, went straight to the GI Florida Derby, ran fourth as a 6-5 shot, and never ran again. That clever team at Airdrie misses nothing, and made a deal to go in partnership with Darley on Cairo Prince. He was so popular at \$10,000 in his first season, 2015, that they actually had to raise his price (to \$15,000) this year. **Cont. p10**

Will Take Charge, trained by the legend, D. Wayne Lukas, for Willis Horton, won the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn but then was unplaced in all three Triple Crown races. Evidently he just needed to become a second-half 3-year-old, though, because seven weeks after the

Belmont he came out and ran second to Palace Malice in the GII Jim Dandy. He then won the GI Travers and GI Pennsylvania Derby; got beat a nose by Mucho Macho Man in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic; and won the GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs to win the Eclipse Award for champion 3-year-old male of 2014. He added one Grade I win and four more Grade I placings at four, and retired to Three Chimneys with the best credentials of any son of Unbridled's Song ever to go to stud. He has 30 first-crop foals catalogued, 28 of them in Keeneland Books 1-3. Also with 30 first-crop foals catalogued (11 in Books 1-3) is WinStar's **Fed Biz** (Giant's Causeway). In 11 starts as a 4- and 5-year-old for trainer Baffert, he ran in 10 GI/GII races, winning three Grade II's in California, and placing in two Grade I's and two other Grade II's.

Three Chimneys' **Strong Mandate** (Tiznow), the 2013 GI Hopeful S. winner, also trained by Lukas, has 27 weanlings catalogued, 16 of them at Fasig and in Books 1-3. Also with 27 catalogued (12 in Keeneland Books 2-3) is Spendthrift's **Goldencents**, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile twice, and the horse who first put Into Mischief on the map. With 23

each are Lane's End's **Noble Mission** (21 in Keeneland 1-3), Frankel's brother who was a triple Group 1 winner in Europe; and WinStar's **Revolutionary** (just three in Book 3), the GII Louisiana Derby winner by the short-lived War Pass (champion 2-year-old by Cherokee Run). Hill 'n' Dale's **Flashback**, a son of Tapit who

won the GII Robert B. Lewis and ran second in the GII San Felipe and GI Santa Anita Derby (to Goldencents), is the other first-year sire with as many as 20 weanlings catalogued (four in Book 3). Spendthrift has, besides Goldencents, four more first-year sires with nine or more yearlings catalogued: **Cross Traffic** (Unbridled's Song, 16); **Shakin It Up** (Midnight Lute, 15);

Itsmyluckyday (by another short-lived but useful sire, Lawyer Ron, 12); and **Can The Man** (Into Mischief, 9). Ashford's GI Breeders' Cup Turf and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner **Magician** (Galileo) has 13 catalogued, and Adena Springs' GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) has 12. AFTERCARE A ‘NEVER-ENDING JOURNEY’ FOR WEST POINT TEAM *By T.D. Thornton*

Private Show (*Discreetly Mine*) doesn’t need to score big in either of the two \$100,000 Thoroughbred Makeover disciplines he’s entered in this weekend at the Kentucky Horse Park to win the respect and affection of his second-career trainer and rider,

Erin Birkenhauer. The 4-year-old gelding managed to do that quite some time ago.

Private Show is unique among the entrants for the Retired Racehorse Project [RRP]’s signature competition in that he previously raced for a partnership managed by

West Point Thoroughbreds, the national syndicate operated by Birkenhauer’s parents, Terry and Debbie Finley. After Private Show was retired from an zero-for-five career on the track one year ago, Birkenhauer, who works out of Bowling Green, Kentucky, as West Point’s racing manager, reacquired him from the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance-accredited facility where he had been unwinding and retraining.

“He’s been a great horse for me,” said Birkenhauer. “I think one of the things I’ve tried to highlight through this whole process is that I’m an adult amateur. I don’t compete on horses for a living. The barn that I keep him at is 30 minutes away from where I live, so it’s at least an hour every day for me to go ride. I needed a horse who would be laid back, a gentleman, and not need to be lunged for an hour every day before I rode him. I work full time, and that was really important.”

Judging by his auction history and the promise of his pedigree, Private Show was not supposed to have been enjoying retirement so early. He initially sold for \$65,000 at the 2013 Keeneland September yearling sale and West Point and co-owner Robert Masiello bought him for \$210,000 at the Ocala Breeders’ 2-year-old sale the following April. He debuted for that partnership at Belmont Park in the autumn of 2014 but failed to hit the board in two tries.

“I remember we loved him as a 2-year-old,” Birkenhauer recalled. “He’s a big, good-looking horse. But he’s not what you would expect, because he was a speed horse on the racetrack. Normally those types of horses are kind of fiery and on edge all the time. If you look at his past performances, he was on the lead in every one of his races. It really surprised me when I got him, because [headstrong] is not how he really is. We gelded him, but mostly because of performance. It wasn’t really so much due to attitude. Then he had minor knee surgery at the end of his 2-year-old year.”

After a lackluster seventh in a Belmont maiden special weight in June 2015, “We dropped him in for a maiden \$40,000 claimer at Saratoga that summer and he didn’t run very well,” Birkenhauer said. “Then we sent him to Parx. He didn’t run well for \$25,000 either, and we didn’t want to get to the point where we’d run him for maiden \$10,000 somewhere and he’d end up in the wrong hands. More than anything, we just wanted to see him go to a good home instead of running him at the bottom.”

Even though West Point and Masiello made the decision to retire Private Show right after what turned out to be his final race Sept. 27, 2015, it was still a few weeks before the gelding could leave the racetrack. At that time, Birkenhauer said, Parx horses were under a quarantine to prevent the spread of the equine herpes virus and no Thoroughbreds could come or go.

“So eventually, as we do with most of our horses on the East Coast, we placed him with the South Jersey Thoroughbred Rescue and Adoption program,” Birkenhauer said. “We’ve worked really closely with them for years, and I grew up near that farm, so I’ve known [director] Erin [Hurley] for many years, and I trust her.”

At about the time Private Show was settling in to his transitional home, Birkenhauer was planning to compete in the 2015 version of Makeover. But 10 days before last year’s event, her horse got hurt and she had to scratch.

Now fast-forward to January 2016, when Birkenhauer was scouting around for an easygoing horse, primarily to ride for pleasure, but perhaps also to prepare for this year’s Makeover. She especially wanted to compete on a former West Point racer, and when she mentioned this to Hurley, she said the response was, “I have the perfect horse for you. Why don’t you take Private Show? This is going to be one of those horses that you’re going to be able to ride the day he gets on your farm.”

Birkenhauer said she always recalled Private Show as having a great disposition, but his take-everything-in-stride nature was even more evident after some down time in New Jersey.

“By the time I got him, he was not really a racetrack horse any more,” Birkenhauer said. “He’d been off the track for almost three months at that point. Some people have that notion that horses off the track can be crazy or ‘hot,’ but it’s not always like that. People can be kind of on the fence about getting a horse off the track, but if you do your homework, you can find the right one. **Cont. p12**

"Sure, there are ups and downs," Birkenhauer continued. "We missed a horse show a couple of weeks ago because of a foot abscess and I was really down and upset, but everybody goes through that. And I've just kind of learned that he's still growing, still filling out, and sometimes they can be a challenge when they make this transition."

Private Show will compete in the RRP's show jumping and eventing disciplines. From the perspective of somebody who both works in the Thoroughbred industry and will be participating in her first Makeover, Birkenhauer said the thing that is impressive to her is how much positive feedback she is hearing about the event from people she knows in racing and sales circles.

"I feel like everybody in the industry is really kind of looking forward to it," Birkenhauer said. "If you see the sponsors that Makeover has--the major Thoroughbred farms, the ownership groups--many of them are represented and are really supporting this, and I think this it's only going to evolve. I went to Keeneland the other day, and I probably got approached by five or six people who said, 'We're coming to the Makeover, we can't wait!'"

Terry Finley said Masiello and the other West Point partners who originally invested in Private Show "are still involved and tracking his progress." Asked if had seen any traits in Private Show that hinted at how he might perform in a second career, Finley pointed to the gelding's athleticism.

"One of the things is, you try to buy good athletes," Finley said. "[And even if that doesn't translate into success on the track,] they definitely have to be athletic to be successful in a competition like Makeover. I think it goes hand in hand, you

take a good athlete [into a cross-discipline] and they're going to do well anywhere that they perform."

Birkenhauer said the satisfaction she gets out of an event like Makeover is tied to seeing how Thoroughbreds can excel at various disciplines. It's something she wants to demonstrate to other people, she explained, even while learning more herself.

"I grew up eventing and riding jumpers," Birkenhauer said. "I don't know anything about barrel racing. I don't know anything about polo. And the fact that I'm able to go to the Horse Park and show my horse off, but then also to see people who do something that I know nothing about, with a Thoroughbred that essentially followed the same journey as my horse did, I think that's super cool. They've all been on the same path--they raced, got retired, then went through a retraining program. Being able to see all the things a retired racehorse can do--there are about ten different Makeover disciplines--is kind of amazing."

Finley, too, used the term "journey" in describing aftercare, but in a broader sense.

"One of the things we've done to get better as an industry over the past five or 10 years is we've brought attention to the different avenues that people can take to ultimately take care of the horses that they own," Finley said. "You're not really in this business very long if you don't love horses. That was never the problem, people wanting to take care of them. It was just the ability to execute on that intention, and we're doing better at that."

"Aftercare is a never-ending journey," he summed up. "This journey will go on for as long as we race horses."
