



ANDREW CHESSER: A SELF-STARTER FLYING HIGH

Andrew Chesser is one of the men at the forefront of the International Conference of Horseracing Authorities held annually in Paris as well as the Longines World's Best Racehorse and World's Best Horse Race ceremony in London and, at age 32, already holds two senior positions in the Thoroughbred industry. One wonders, then, how far he will have risen by the age of most of the racing establishment's grandees. Even more surprisingly, this self-starter had not even seen a horse race until he was nearly 15.

The day job is manager of registration services at The Jockey Club, while since October 2015, Chesser has been appointed secretary general of the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities (IFHA). All because of stumbling upon the televised GI Preakness victory of Charismatic (Summer Squall), who rose from claiming level to be narrowly denied Triple Crown glory.

"It was pretty much after that race that I persuaded my family to take me down to Saratoga for the racing and to the Fasig-Tipton sales and I knew then that I wanted to be involved in the industry," he said. "I grew up in New York and I was then able to work at Stonewall Farm on weekends and holidays, but I knew that if I wanted to make racing my career than I would have to go to the centre of it all in Lexington."

BREEDERS' CUP DREAM ALIVE FOR 'GOLD'

The first Japanese Group 1 of 2017 was a Breeders' Cup "Win And You're In" race with the victor gaining an automatic berth to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Del Mar later this year. **Kafuji Take (Jpn)** (Precise End) went off favourite for the race over a mile on the Tokyo dirt and despite running on strongly in the last two furlongs from what seemed a hopeless position, he could not get to grips with the winner **Gold Dream (Jpn)** (Gold Allure {Jpn}) and the runner up **Best Warrior** (Majestic Warrior). Gold Dream, the punters' second choice, was delivered with a perfectly timed challenge by jockey Mirco Demuro who grabbed the lead a furlong out and was always just doing enough to see off the determined challenge of the runner-up to win by a neck with Kafuji Take another three parts back in third.

Chesser enrolled and graduated from the University of Kentucky with a degree in agricultural economics and business, but had already spread his wings far beyond the campus walls. He learned from another greatly respected UK graduate, Walter Hillenmeyer, who was managing the former Woodlyn Farm at the time and completed a year's internship in the advertising department of the Blood-Horse, crediting the now Darley head of marketing Jim Cox for his development.

All this experience led to an opportunity in the offices of The Jockey Club, firstly in digital customer service and internal procedure, and he has now been at the venerable institution for 11 years full-time.

"The Jockey Club is the keeper of the American Stud Book and my role involves working with others in registering and naming all Thoroughbreds born in the US, Canada, and Puerto Rico, including microchipping and DNA, the imports and exports, as well as budgeting and training," he said.

Chesser's integration into the business led to Jockey Club president, Jim Gagliano, asking him if he would be interested in helping out with some work with the IFHA, and the role became more formal after the departure of deputy secretary general Aki Akitani at the end of 2013.

"Day to day, it was planning conferences and organising the internal and external communication, such as the website and social media," said Chesser. "It was around that time that Longines had become involved in sponsorship and I've been working with them for the Longines World's Best Racehorse Rankings, helped by the likes of the British Horseracing Authority and Hong Kong Jockey Club."

"I think it has done well in terms of coverage and it was wonderful to be able to be in London last month to have Bob Baffert and Chris Waller there," Chesser continued. "It's greatness recognised as greatness. Since 2013, we've also had the Longines and IFHA International Award of Merit, the first one of which was presented to Jim Bolger, and most recently to the Romanet family. There is also the World's Best Jockey ceremony in Hong Kong in December and the World's Best Race."

This involves a considerable amount of travel, including three annual visits to France-Galop's headquarters in Paris, and Chesser believes he clocked up 13 different countries last year.

"Lexington is home but France has very much become a second home," he said. "If I'm not there, it'll be an airport somewhere. I'm very fortunate as it has allowed me to go to Royal Ascot, the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and I've been to my first G1 Melbourne Cup. Each racecourse has its own influences but we're all speaking the same dialect."

He just may ride the best horse in the world...and his name is not Mike Smith. While Arrogate has taken U.S. racing by storm, the great mare Winx has done the same in Australia. The IFHA's mission is to harmonise the world's racing rules and procedures, and to attempt to grow the sport commercially, though a number of committees and an annual conference, which drew delegates from 52 countries in 2016.

"One of the main issues is medication, in the form of labs and testing," Chesser explained. "There are many amazing labs around the globe, but its important to share best practices and for there to be such resources in every part of the world. We want to bring up the standard, efficiency and quality up to the highest possible level."

"Welfare of riders and horses is obviously another subject that must be taken very very seriously," he noted. "It's important to keep raising awareness and continue bringing up the standard of care, and aftercare. Racing must also recognise there is more and more competition, not just in terms of leisure activities, but of gambling, from online, the lottery and so on. It's important to embrace new technologies and ensure that racing continues to remain an attractive product."

Any pronouncements made are not always as easy to implement, as Chesser added diplomatically, "We do everything we can, but we're not a regulatory body. We make concessions, we all want to pull in the same direction."

Chesser's life is clearly a non-stop blizzard of commitments, but his voice lit up in recollection of what was perhaps his first serious racing achievement. Back at UK, he founded the Kentucky Horse Racing Club and it continues to thrive today with visits to studs, the racetrack and inviting trainers such as Carl Nafzger and Kenny McPeek to give talks.

"It's been a joy to watch, actually," he said. "I didn't have any connections in the industry when I arrived and now I see many students that have gone on to racing internships, or working in bloodstock, sales, nomination or administrative roles. I was back there last year and it made me think 'they're a lot smarter than I was.'"

NEW SPONSOR FOR IROQUOIS CHALLENGE

A lucrative Trans-Atlantic challenge could be in store for the winner of the G1 Sun Bets Stayers Hurdle at Cheltenham next month, with the news that TVV Capital is stepping in to sponsor the second instalment of the Iroquois Cheltenham Challenge. A


\$500,000 bonus is up for grabs if the Stayers Hurdle winner follows up in the GI Iroquois Hurdle at Nashville in May or indeed does the reverse within a 12 month period. Last year's Iroquois winner Rawnaq (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}), owned by Irv Naylor, was on target to attempt the double before a training injury derailed his Cheltenham challenge and such a hefty bonus is sure to tempt winning connections this year especially considering how well the Willie Mullins-trained pair of Shaneshill (Ire) (King's Theatre {Ire}) and Nichols Canyon (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) ran in defeat when second and third in Nashville last May.

TVV Capital Founder and President Andrew Byrd feels the Challenge has elevated the sport across borders and continents in a way that truly connects Irish and UK racing with the best of American steeplechasing.

"That historical connection is strong, as is our relationship with the Iroquois, and so we are very pleased to announce the TVV Capital Iroquois Cheltenham Challenge," said Byrd.

Iroquois Chairman Dwight Hall, who also serves on the Board of Directors for the National Steeplechase Association, sees the Challenge as an opportunity to showcase the best of jump racing in the United States. Cont. p4

Breeders' Cup Dream Alive for 'Gold' cont.

Demuro was obviously thrilled with the result, allowing himself some brief 'wings' showboating after the line and he commented, "In the Champions Cup, he broke poorly and was keen--he didn't stretch at all. But today he was relaxed even

after entering the track. His start was good, he was positioned well and responded beautifully in the straight. He still had a lot left at the end."

In an eight-race career prior to Sunday, Gold Dream had always looked capable of a performance like this and he bounced back from his only sub-par effort when down the field in the G1 Champions Cup at Chukyo last December to claim his first top-level success. Unbeaten in his first three outings, he claimed his initial stakes win on his third run when winning the Listed Hyacinth S. on the same Tokyo card last year before being turned over at short odds by K T Brave (Jpn) (Admire Max {Jpn}) in a similar race at Sonoda in May. He coped well with a rise in class to win the G3 Unicorn S. at Tokyo in June before a further two placings in a pair of listed and Group 3 races. He seemed to find the competition too hot when running 12th behind Sound True (Jpn) (French Deputy) in the Champions Cup, but erased the memory of that display with a stylish performance on Sunday for trainer Osamu Hirata and owner Katsumi Yoshida.

EPICHARIS SECURES DERBY BERTH

Potential GI Kentucky Derby candidate **Epicharis (Jpn)** (Gold Allure {Jpn}) came through his latest test in the Listed Hyacinth S. (Video) at Tokyo on Sunday to remain unbeaten in four starts. His cosy three-quarter length defeat of **Adirato (Jpn)** (Rulership {Jpn}) garnered 50 points and an invitation to compete in the Run for the Roses May 6 at Churchill Downs. Epicharis had been a wide margin winner of his three juvenile starts and despite not putting quite so much distance between himself and his rivals on this occasion, his rider never had to get too serious to get the job done.

The 1600-metre Hyacinth S. was the second race in a new two-part race series in Japan that could produce a starter in the Kentucky Derby, thanks to a partnership between Churchill Downs Incorporated and the Japan Racing Association. Cont. p6

Listed Hyacinth S. Cont.

The Japanese trained G2 UAE Derby winner Lani (Tapit) took part in all three U.S. Triple Crown races last year highlighted by a third-place finish in the GI Belmont S. and Epicharis could well attempt to emulate that feat.

Should the connections of Epicharis decline to take up their offer of a berth in the Kentucky Derby, the horse with the second-most points, Listed Cattleya Sho winner Mont Saint Legame (Jpn) (Came Home) may accept. If Mont Saint Legame declines, the horse with the third-most points, Hyacinth runner-up Adirato (Jpn) may accept. No other invitation will be extended beyond the top three point earners.

GOLD ALLURE DIES AT 18

Shadai Stallion Station resident Gold Allure (Jpn) (Sunday Silence--Nikiya, by Nureyev), a four-time Group 1 winner over dirt in Japan, succumbed to heart disease Feb. 16. He was 18. Among those four top-level victories for Shadai Race Horse Co. Ltd. was the G1 February S. in 2003, with Gold Allure eventually winning half of his 16 starts and over \$3.3 million before retiring to Shadai.

Fittingly, the Oiwake Farm-bred's son Gold Dream (Jpn) captured the 2017 edition of the race, a GI Breeders' Cup Classic 'Win And You're In' race, Sunday. His 3-year-old son Epicharis (Jpn), added further luster to Gold Allure's weekend, as he took

his record to a perfect four-for-four in the Listed Hyacinth S. (JPN-G3), a race worth 50 points on the Road to the Kentucky Derby and a berth in the 1 1/4mile Grade I on the first Saturday in May at Churchill Downs.

Other progeny of Gold Allure to shine on the racetrack are: Copano Rickey (Jpn), the 2015 Japanese Champion Dirt Horse who scooped two editions of the February S. (2014/2015); Smart Falcon (Jpn), the prolific \$11-million plus earner who excelled over dirt; and Espoir City (Jpn), who won the 2010 February S. and 2009 G1 Japan Cup Dirt. In total, Gold Allure's progeny have raked in over \$170 million in prize money from 11 crops of racing age, good for dirt sire championship titles in 2014 and 2016. He has also been runner-up on that list an additional six times, with career totals currently standing at 1043 foals, 718 winners and 18 black-type winners.

Crack sprinter Terravista (Aus) (Captain Rio {GB}) will require a financial sponsor if he is to be aimed at The Everest, Australia's new A\$10-million contest which will take place at Randwick in October. The 7-year-old showed he has lost none of his dash when narrowly beating Spieth (NZ) (Thorn Park {Aus}) and Star Turn (Aus) (Star Witness {Aus}) in the G1 Black Caviar Lightning at Flemington on Saturday and despite the victory, his 10-strong team of owners feel the A\$1.8m required to nominate for The Everest is beyond their reach.

Terravista's trainer Joe Pride is now on the hunt for a suitable sponsor and commented, "I feel I have to have the horse ready for that race. I'm sure we can find a backer."

In the meantime Pride is considering shorter-term options for the gelding. These include the G1 Newmarket H. over 1200m at Flemington on Mar. 11 or the G2 Challenge S. over 1000m at Randwick a week earlier.

AVDULLA STEPS IN FOR DOYLE

With James Doyle currently sidelined with a hand fracture, Brenton Avdulla has come in for the choice mount on **Hartnell** (**GB**) (Authorized {Ire}) in the G1 Chipping Norton S. at Randwick on Saturday. The Godolphin colt will have to face up to the unenviable task of trying to deny **Winx** (**Aus**) (Street Cry {Ire}) her 15th consecutive success and having been beaten by the mare on five occasions, Avdulla is philosophical over the task Hartnell faces next weekend. "It's a privilege to get the call up," said Avdulla. "Godolphin have been very loyal to me and given me great opportunities over the last few years, but I guess the only way she [Winx] gets beat is probably bad luck or if she has an off day. Hartnell has bigger targets in store. I will just enjoy the ride and see what happens."

For Australia's darling mare its all systems go for Saturday and her trainer Chris Waller issued a positive bulletin over her wellbeing.

"We weighed Winx and she's put on a couple of kilos since the Apollo," Waller said. "So she is holding her racing weight and that's important. She is fit and our job is to maintain that and keep her going through the preparation and she's as good as she can be."

Rated 114 and some 14 points clear of the second-best Derby contender, Rapper Dragon looked to have his 12 rivals in Sunday's Hong Kong Classic Cup over a barrel, and so it proved. The sleek chestnut raced away to a comfortable victory to become the third horse and second in as many years to complete the Classic Mile-Classic Cup double and will be favored to repeat the dose in the Hong Kong Derby in four weeks' time.

Away in good order from his low draw, Rapper Dragon was gradually eased back into a centerfield position as Winner's Way (Aus) (Starcraft {NZ}) set the pace, as expected, pressed along through a strong opening 600 metres by Beauty Generation (NZ) (Road to Rock {Aus}), the Classic Mile third who was given a more positive ride by Zac Purton this time around. Seasons Bloom, runner-up to Rapper Dragon last time, raced further back in the company of the progressive Dinozzo (Ire) (Lilbourne Lad {Ire}), while 'TDN Rising Star' Pakistan Star was snagged back to the tail by Silvestre de Sousa, in stark contrast to the ride he was given in the Classic Mile.

Winner's Way and Beauty Generation were still going a good gallop entering the final three furlongs, and sensing a move from behind from Hugh Bowman atop Dinozzo, Joao Moreira edged Rapper Dragon out into the three path for a clear shot as the field reached the top of the stretch. While the leaders were beginning to run on empty, Rapper Dragon was just getting warmed up, as he hit the front with a little better than 200 metres to travel and was ridden out to a comfortable score. Pakistan Star, quietly ridden into the lane, peeled out widest and covered his final quarter-mile in a race-fastest :22.08 to finish just ahead of the honest Seasons Bloom, who lost his right-fore plate at the 1200m. The winner's stablemate, G1 Queensland Derby hero Eagle Way (Aus) (More Than Ready), closed off nicely for fourth in what could be deemed an ideal Derby trial.

"He's a very good horse, I'd said that before, and we had no doubts about him getting the extra 200 metres today, he drew the gun gate (4)," trainer John Moore told the Hong Kong Jockey Club's David Morgan. "There was quite a lot of speed early, which was a big surprise, but he was the top-rated horse."

The Australian conditioner is now in line for a sixth Hong Kong Derby trophy and third in four years.

"We're going into the Derby full of confidence and now we just hope the owner can pull a good draw in the Derby and I think he'd be repeating," Moore offered. "He's definitely the horse to beat. He's going to be joining the elite brigade in Hong Kong."

Rapper Dragon joins Floral Pegasus (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus, 2007) and Sun Jewellery (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}, 2016) as horses to have completed the Mile/Cup double.

Much of Rapper Dragon's female family was offered by Eduardo Cojuangco's Gooree Park Stud and performed well at the 2015 Magic Millions National Broodmare and Weanling Sale. The winner's dam was purchased by Michael Wallace for A\$360,000 in foal to Congrats (catalogue page) and produced a colt by that successful dual-hemisphere stallion in August 2015. He was recently purchased by KS Research for A\$110,000 from the Newgate Farm consignment at the Gold Coast Yearling Sale. Rapper Dragon's half-sister Swing Sensation (Aus) (Northern Meteor (Aus)) fetched A\$330,000 from Rosemont Stud/Blue Sky Bloodstock, while Swing Vote, sent through the ring on an October cover by Smart Missile (Aus), realized A\$360,000 from Neil Jenkinson Bloodstock. Rapper Dragon's half-sister by Your Song (Aus) (Fastnet Rock (Aus)) was subsequently knocked down to Canning Downs for A\$150,000, while Amanpour (Aus) (Northern Meteor {Aus}), a half-sister to Swing Dance and winner of the G1 Queen of the Turf S., was the second-highest priced lot at the 2015 Broodmare Sale. Then four, she was hammered down to the Rosemont/Blue Sky team for A\$1.5 million. CLASSIC EMPIRE TO SKIP FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

John Oxley's **Classic Empire** (Pioneerof the Nile) will skip the Mar. 4 GII Fountain of Youth S. as he continues to recover from a foot abscess, trainer Mark Casse said Sunday, confirming a story first reported by *Daily Racing Form*.

"He trained this morning and he trained well, but his foot is still not 100%," Casse explained. "If we were going to run him, we'd want to breeze him [Monday], and we're just not ready to breeze him. So I called Mr. Oxley up and had a nice conversation with him and we're just going to wait and see. Our hopes are that we can gallop him another week and possibly breeze next weekend."

Classic Empire captured last year's GI Breeders' Futurity and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile on his way to being named Eclipse champion juvenile colt. Heavily favored in his sophomore debut, the bay colt came home a distant third in the Feb. 4 GII Holy Bull S. and the abscess was discovered two days later.

"It's been hard on him," Casse said. "Not only did he get all worked up in the race, then two days later he could barely walk. I just want him to look better and feel better. It looks like he's lost some weight and his foot is still draining just a touch and this race wasn't a have-to-be, so why push it."

As for a potential next start, Casse said, "We're just going to wait and see. If worse came to worse, he won the Breeders' Futurity off of a three-month layoff and then won the Breeders' Cup. So if necessary, we feel like we could go with only one more [GI Kentucky Derby] prep." *Cont. p3*


A native of Bloomington, Minnesota, Lothenbach's love of racing has been a lifelong passion.

Classic Empire won the July 2 GIII Bashford Manor S. at Churchill Downs before wheeling and losing the rider at the start of the Sept. 5 GI Hopeful S. and was off another month before taking the Breeders' Futurity Oct. 8.

Casse said he wasn't concerned about the change in schedule. "I'd be worried if this was April," he said. "If you were going to have it, this was the time to have it. He has trained the last four mornings, so it's not like he isn't training."

The Casse barn unveiled another potential sophomore star Saturday at Fair Grounds in 'TDN Rising Star' Souper Tapit (Tapit). After breaking last, the colt, out of Grade I winner Zo Impressive (Hard Spun) circled the field five wide turning for home and battled to a neck victory (video).

"We're excited about Souper Tapit," Casse said. "We have been for some time. I thought his race was just special. Not too many horses can spot the field, eat all the dirt, circle the field. The move he made around the turn, running by horses like they were standing still, five and six wide, is not an easy task. I thought then he lost focus a little down the lane and then galloping out, he took off again. He is an extremely talented horse, we just have to get all his energy in one direction."

As for what is next for the Live Oak Plantation homebred, Casse added, "We're probably going to take baby steps with him. I have to talk to [owner] Mrs. [Charlotte] Weber a little bit more about it--we want to let everything calm down--but he'll probably run in an allowance race somewhere. I would think that he should improve off of yesterday's performance and if he can do that, then we can think about bigger and better things."

What has become a racing stable of some 100 runners and a breeding operation of 15 broodmares began harmlessly enough.


"There were four of us and we each threw in \$1,000 and claimed a \$4,000 horse,"
Lothenbach laughed. "And it's grown from there."

Lothenbach's biggest success on the racetrack

came via his homebred Vacare (Lear Fan), who won the 2006 GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup before selling for \$2.8 million at that year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Sale.



Lothenbach also bred and campaigned Grade I winner Mayo on the Side (French Deputy) and multiple graded stakes winner Mister Marti Gras (Belong to Me).

With the support of racing manager Drew Nardiello and trainers Chris Block, Ian Wilkes and Neil Pessin, as well as input from Werk Thoroughbred Consultants, Lothenbach was busy at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, ultimately purchasing six yearlings for a total of \$1.21 million. Three of those youngsters will return to the sales ring Mar. 1 at Gulfstream Park. A colt by Curlin out of Dress the Part (Malibu Moon) will sell as hip 48. The juvenile was purchased for \$240,000 at Saratoga. Hip 101, a filly by Oxbow out of Mexican Moonlight (El Prado {Ire}), was purchased for \$125,000 and hip 154, a colt by Into Mischief out of Sweet Seventeen (Hard Spun) was a \$200,000 buy last summer. In addition, an Arch filly, picked up for \$190,000 at Saratoga last year, is catalogued to sell as hip 254 at the upcoming OBS March sale.

Asked what his team was looking for in pinhooking prospects, Lothenbach answered perspicaciously, "Good, marketable, hot sire lines." He added, "And also an individual that, if I don't sell them, I'm totally ok with that. It's more about something that I'd be happy with keeping. The focus is on pinhooking. If I can sell them and it goes well, that's great. If not, I'll keep them."

Lothenbach founded Imagine Print Solutions in 1988 and sold the printing company last winter, freeing up capital he has been more than happy to put into his passion for racing. In addition to his Saratoga buying spree, the Minnesotan also purchased seven yearlings at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale for a total of

\$2.655 million. His highest-priced purchase at the sale was a \$650,000 son of Tapit (hip 209).

"I sold my business in March, so last year I spent a little more than I normally have," Lothenbach explained. "And this year, again, I have a little more liquid money and that is fun money."

As much as he loves the racing game, there is one place you can count on not finding Lothenbach.

"I don't like to go to the sales," he laughed. "As a matter of fact, I don't go. I went one time. I went to one

Saratoga sale and I knew I was not the guy to be sitting in that seat. So, I'll have three people that will give me an evaluation on what they appraise the horse at--and they don't communicate. I get that number.

"I look at what I appraise them at from a distance, without seeing the individual, and I come up with a number," he continued. "If I can get them for that or less, I buy them. If they are \$1,000 more, I don't. I've been very diligent that way. I guess I have bought a couple where I get above what my set

price was because I like it, but I found when I went to the sales, I exceeded it by a bigger percentage than I normally would have."


Lothenbach has already enjoyed success at the highest level on the racetrack. He'll be looking to add to his resume with his initial foray into the pinhooking game when Fasig-Tipton returns to Gulfstream Park next week.

at Saratoga in July, the bay returned at Gulfstream Jan. 26 to annex a six-panel optional claimer by daylight with an 87 Beyer Speed Figure. While Pletcher hasn't shipped a runner in for the Southwest in recent memory, he did take back-to-back runnings of the GI Arkansas Derby in 2013 and 2014 with Overanalyze (Dixie Union) and Danza (Street Boss), respectively.

"Obviously, he's stepping up to a big race Monday," said One Liner's regular rider John Velazquez. "But I think he's a very talented horse and hopefully he can put it all together and run really well. He's always shown a lot of talent in the morning. He's done everything really well. Now, it's going from an allowance race to the wolves, basically. I think he's definitely a very good horse. It's a tough task coming from a long layoff, with just one race, and then running into the tough guys. I mean, he's a tough guy himself."

Lookin At Lee (Lookin At Lucky), a stakes winner last summer at Ellis, played also-ran to two of the top juveniles from last season. He took turns finishing second to Not This Time (Giant's Causeway) and Classic Empire (Pioneerof the Nile) in the GIII Iroquois S. and GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity, respectively, before checking in fourth behind those two in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 5.

Brad Grady's Cool Arrow (Into Mischief) hasn't been out of the exacta since adding blinkers before romping in a Laurel maiden claimer in July, and was last seen dominating Remington's Springboard Mile on an uncontested lead Dec. 11. Cont. p6

Ed DeRosa of TwinSpires .com takes on TDN's Steve Sherack and Brian DiDonato as they handicap each prep race leading up to the GI Kentucky Derby. The three will make \$100 Win/Place bets--highest bankroll after the GIII Lexington S. wins.

DeRosa: GIII El Camino Real Derby - The Southwest concludes the Derby Prep Season, and not a moment too soon for yours truly, who has managed just a win and a second from seven races after Saturday's El Camino Real, where my pick Ann Arbor Eddie was diqualified from second. Bankroll: \$490.

GIII Southwest S. - We'll try to bring the Derby Championship Series in with a bang by going with 12-1 Cool Arrow. That was a slow pace when he won the Springboard Mile, and he won't get that here, but he's shown an ability to rate and the rail and weight are both benefits here. Selection: #1 Cool Arrow (12-1).

DiDonato: GIII El Camino Real Derby - Sheer Flattery couldn't have made less of an impact as the 5-2 second choice. Pretty impossible to have that winner. **Bankroll:** \$1160.

GIII Southwest S. - This is a tough spot for a 3-year-old debut, but Silver Dust might be really good, and trainer Randy Morse does well with comebackers in dirt routes at Oaklawn. Extremely green both in his breeze at OBS March (\$510K) and when fifth first out at Churchill, the big, grey son of Tapit sat behind horses just waiting to explode second out Nov. 20, and did just that as soon as he saw daylight. That race has been productive enough, and, hopefully the time off has allowed Silver Dust to continue

to grow up a bit. His works look solid enough on paper, and he's got the pedigree to be a nice one. *Selection: #2 Silver Dust* (10-1).

Sherack: GIII El Camino Real Derby - Well, at least I didn't pick one of the two favorites. **Tribal Storm** was moved up to third at 10-1 via DQ after getting cut off badly in deep stretch. **Bankroll: \$590.**

GIII Southwest S. - The lightly raced Silver Dust flashed plenty of ability in his ultra-impressive maiden breaker going a one-turn mile second out at Churchill last fall to take a chance on coming off the bench in this ambitious spot. The son of leading sire Tapit has run like a horse dying to stretch out in both of his career trips to the post as well as his :21.2 breeze prior to realizing \$510,000 as an OBSMAR 2-year-old. Silver Dust sports a flashy worktab at Oaklawn this winter, including a pair of five-furlong bullets in January, and is well-drawn to make some noise in his sophomore debut. Selection: #2 Silver Dust (10-1).



CHARISMATIC DIES

Charismatic (Summer Squall--Bali Babe, by Drone), winner of the 1999 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S., died Sunday at Old Friends Thoroughbred retirement facility in Georgetown, Kentucky. The cause of death is not known. The 21-year-old stallion had been repatriated to the U.S. after standing much of his stud career at JBBA Shizunai Stallion Station in Japan. He arrived at Old Friends in early December.

"Right now, everyone is pretty much inconsolable," said Old Friends president Michael Blowen. "Last night, at 6:30, he was fine. He was a really tough horse and he deserved a much longer retirement. But none of us, unfortunately, has a magic wand. Everyone at Old Friends takes solace from the few great months that this great champion gave us."

Bred by Parrish Hill Farm and W. S. Farish, Charismatic was campaigned by Bob and Beverly Lewis and trained by D. Wayne Lukas. He graduated from the claiming ranks to capture the Derby as a 31-1 outsider and added the Preakness two weeks later. Favored to complete the Triple Crown sweep, the handsome chestnut suffered career-ending injuries just before the wire in the GI Belmont S. In an enduring image, jockey Chris Antley quickly dismounted and held Charismatic's injured left front leg off the ground, preventing further damage and likely saving the colt's life.

Charismatic was named champion 3-year-old and Horse of the Year in 1999. On the board in 11 of 17 starts, he won five times and earned \$2,038,064.

Charismatic began his stud career at Lane's End in 2000 and stood there for three seasons before relocating to Japan in 2002. He is the sire of 2005 GII Pennsylvania Derby winner Sun King and multiple graded stakes winner Gouldings Green, as well as Japanese group winner Wonder Acute (Jpn).
