The year 1945 is synonymous with the end of the second World War, but a rather more peaceful event also took place the same year when the Irish National Stud was officially formed. The farm had been taken over by a newly formed Irish Government in 1943 from the family of Colonel William Hall Walker, who had been breeding horses on the land adjacent to Kildare town with great success--Minoru's win in the 1909 Epsom Derby being a case in point. Given its deep-seated roots within Irish history it is rewarding to see the Irish National Stud, some 70 years later, thriving as a leading commercial breeding farm that also houses a world-class stallion, hosts thousands of international tourists each year while simultaneously providing an invaluable education to many young people hoping to carve out a career in the international racing and bloodstock industries.

One would think that the above activities would be more than enough to keep the Irish National Stud team busy but outgoing CEO John Osborne has fostered a 'think-outside-the-box' ethic among the staff and this is evident in the launch of the INS Breeding and Racing Club. It is run by Ciaran de Barra and it is now entering its third year in existence. What sets it apart from other racing syndicates is the fact that members are involved with a horse from the time it is born, which gives stake-holders an opportunity to be part of any potential success, be it in the sales ring or the racecourse. **Cont. p2**

BIG NAMES LINE UP FOR BLUE DIAMOND

A full field of 16 juvenile colts and fillies, plus one emergency, was drawn Tuesday for the G1 Ladbrokes Blue Diamond S. (1200m) Saturday afternoon at Caulfield in Melbourne.

Some of the world's most prominent ownership interests will be represented in the A\$1.5-million test, including James Harron and partners' **Pariah (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), who earned 'TDN Rising Star' status with a debut success in the G3 Canonbury S. in Sydney Jan. 28 before being overturned by **Property (Aus)** (Starcraft {NZ}) in the colts' and geldings' section of the G3 Blue Diamond Prelude (1100m) Feb. 11. The team's dark green colours and gold epaulettes were, of course, carried to victory by fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Capitalist (Aus) (Written Tycoon {Aus}) in the 2016 G1 Golden Slipper S. Pariah is currently a \$26 chance for the Rosehill feature with sportsbet.com.au. She Will Reign (Aus) (Manhattan Rain {Aus}) remains at the top of the market at \$3. **Cont. p8**

For an investment of €2,000, members not only have two horses to run for the club, they also have an interest in two foals which are bred at the stud each year and sold on their behalf at the Goffs November Foal Sale. De Barra explains how the members got off to a flyer in year one.

"Our first year in 2015 we had the second-top lot on day one of the foal sales at Goffs when our Worthadd colt made €38,000. In 2016 we didn't hit the same heights but still got a solid return when our two Dragon Pulse foals made €25,000."

Last year was a memorable one for the club on the track, as they enjoyed their first winner when the Willie McCreery-trained Invincible Lia (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) won a maiden at Clonmel in May at just her third attempt.

"Willie McCreery did a fantastic job in producing her early in the season with a great prep run when placed fourth behind subsequent [G1] Irish Oaks winner Seventh Heaven, and then she won her maiden in Clonmel in great style, which had all the members in great spirits and dreaming of our next run which subsequently came at the Curragh on Irish 1000 Guineas day," explains de Barra.

"A runner on a Classic day was fantastic and Invincible Lia was great because she consolidated the members' faith in the new concept of the club."

The 2017 breeding season got off to an early start for the club with the first of two foals expected born recently. The filly by Dragon Pulse (Ire) (Kyllachy {GB}) is out of Weekend Getaway (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), who is a full-sister to the Andrew Balding-trained stakes winner Absolutely So (Ire). A date at Goffs will also beckon for this filly towards the end of the year.

With Invincible Lia retired from racing, the club's fortunes on the racetrack this year lie with an unraced 3-year-old with Willie McCreery and an excitingly bred 2-year-old with Michael O'Callaghan, as De Barra outlines.

He said, "We have a Showcasing (GB) filly with Willie McCreery; she has grown into a really strong 3-year-old and we will be hoping to get going early with her this season. She is from the family of Group 1 winner Prohibit so we hope she will have inherited some of his speed. We also have a very exciting Dawn Approach (Ire) half-sister to Red Cadeaux (GB) with Michael O'Callaghan. She was pre-trained by John Shearman and she has taken everything in her stride. She has a great attitude and obviously with her strong pedigree we hope she has the talent to go with it."

Michael O'Callaghan is looking forward to the prospect of training a winner for the club and likes what he has seen so far of his charge.

"She's a nice, well-bred filly and I'm glad to have her. She arrived in good shape and while she may not be a real early type I'm pleased with what she has shown so far. We have introduced her to the Old Vic gallop and she is taking to training well," he commented.

O'Callaghan, himself an award-winning graduate of the Irish National Stud Breeding Course continued, "The club itself is a great initiative. The Irish National Stud has provided them with nice stock and there's every chance a few of the members will catch the racing bug and perhaps take ownership to a further stage. From that point of view I think it's a great idea."

The Dawn Approach filly was purchased by the Irish National Stud as a yearling and has been leased to the club for two years. A similar arrangement applies to the broodmares as de Barra explains.

"The broodmares are owned by the stud, but the foals are in partnership with the club. For example, with currently 33 members, that equates to 33% of each foal owned by the club and 67% by INS and each member gets 1% of the sale proceeds of each foal." [Cont. p3](#)

The club is limited to 50 members which obviously leaves a number of subscriptions to be filled for 2017. Members come from all walks of life, from both Ireland and overseas.

De Barra adds, "With 33 members currently we have room for more. It's a diverse group, from all walks of life is right and from all corners of the country, with a few based overseas. We have a very committed Glaswegian lady called Gillian, who flies over to most of our visits and days out. We also have a member from Virginia, USA, and in France. Many are new to racehorse ownership--though some have been in syndicates in the past--but the all-in-one cost is very attractive to people with no hidden surprises and the chance for some returns, as well as a lot of fun."

In order to promote further social interaction among members De Barra organises frequent stable visits for the club and not just to the trainers on their roster. Members recently visited Willie Mullins' yard to cast their eyes over some of jump racing's household names, including the star mare Annie Power (Ire) (Shirocco {Ire}), winner of last year's G1 Champion Hurdle at Cheltenham. The club also has plans to visit York later in the year for the G1 Juddmonte International day in August.

"The one thing that strikes me is that they are all eager to learn a bit more about how it all works," says de Barra. "We have a really good bunch of members and we all enjoy each other's company which really helps with the fun of the days out."

De Barra is a graduate of the 2013 Irish National Stud Breeding Course, following up with the O'Reilly Business Internship with the stud immediately after the course, and he has remained with the farm thus far. As well as being the point of contact for members of the club, he is also on foaling duty at the stud so he was in a position to inform members of their latest arrival in real time.

"As I'm on foaling at the moment the members got a WhatsApp message last Sunday morning with a photo of their new pride and joy when their Dragon Pulse filly was just a couple of hours old," he explained.

In a recent 'Challenges & Solutions' piece with *TDN*, bloodstock agent James Delahooke noted that the racing industry would benefit long term from would-be fans being exposed to events behind the scenes, including the birth of a foal. Delahooke said in his answers to the *TDN's* questions, "I would explain that this damp, fragile, wobbly newborn animal will, in less than two years, be weighing 800lbs and galloping at 45mph. If they are not fascinated by this stage I will not bother with them anymore."

The INS Breeding and Racing Club has certainly embraced this concept and offers fans a highly cost-effective way to enjoy and participate in this great sport.

DOHERTY TAKES TOP GODOLPHIN AWARD

Terry Doherty, Manager of Lord and Lady Lloyd Webber's Watership Down Stud, has been named employee of the year at the Godolphin Stud and Stable Staff Awards in London.

Having been at the helm of the Berkshire operation since its formation in 1992, Doherty has helped to develop a first-class broodmare band and has overseen every foaling at the stud, whose successful graduates include treble Group 1 winner Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) and her half-brother Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}), who claimed two victories at the highest level.


Commenting on Doherty's achievement, the Chairman of the Judging Panel Brough Scott said, "The finalists were of a quite exceptional standard and it was really inspiring for the judges to hear their stories. However, in the end, Terry emerged as a clear and very fine winner and I am sure he will be a great ambassador for the sport."

Doherty had earlier in the evening won the Stud Staff Award category and was presented with a cheque for £40,000, half of which will be shared among his colleagues at Watership Down Stud.

A total of £120,000 in prize-money was presented across six categories during the ceremony at the Jumeirah Carlton Tower Hotel in Knightsbridge.



“The first round of 2017 mixed sales in North America and Europe is now complete. There was one very positive metric, which is the percentage of withdrawals dropped by over 5%, resulting in 18% more horses being sold than last year and nearly a 4% increase in the percentage sold from those catalogued (which was up 11%, nearly 500 horses, from 2016). However, the overall gross dropped by about \$3-million, to \$57.2-million, and the average dropped by 20%, to \$18,225. The Winter Mixed Sales constitute only about 5% of the overall NA/EU annual auction marketplace, but the trends can be significant. The 2-year-old sales come next, beginning with Fasig-Tipton’s flagship Gulfstream Park sale March 1.”

THISTLECRACK OUT OF GOLD CUP

The Cheltenham Festival, which starts its four-day run on Mar. 14, has already lost a number of high-profile runners through injury and it was dealt a further blow on Tuesday when **Thistlecrack (GB)** (Kayf Tara {GB}) was ruled out of the remainder of the National Hunt season with a tendon tear. The 9-year-old had been red-hot favourite for the Timico Cheltenham Gold Cup on March 17 but will now be sidelined while he recovers from his injury.

His trainer Colin Tizzard confirmed, "Thistlecrack is out for the season, unfortunately. He had a bit of heat in his leg last night and was a bit sore. We had the leg scanned this morning and he has a slight tear on his tendon."

Thistlecrack's string of nine consecutive victories, including last year's G1 Ryanair World Hurdle at the Festival, came to a dramatic end recently when he was beaten a head in the G2 Cotswold Chase by Many Clouds (Ire) (Cloudings {Ire}), who subsequently collapsed and died from a pulmonary haemorrhage minutes after passing the post.

Despite temporarily losing his star chaser, Tizzard still has a strong hand for the Gold Cup with his Welsh National and Hennessy Gold Cup winner **Native River (Ire)** (Indian River {Fr}) taking over as favourite, with his stablemate **Cue Card (GB)** (King's Theatre {Ire}) now second in the betting.

Other star names on the absentee list for this year's Cheltenham Festival are the last two winners of the Cheltenham Gold Cup, **Don Cossack (Ger)** (Sholokhov {Ire}), who was retired last month after also suffering a tendon injury, and **Coneygree (GB)** (Karinga Bay {GB}), while the two most recent Champion Hurdle winners, **Annie Power (Ire)** (Shirocco {Ger}) and **Faugheen (Ire)** (Germany), are also out injured.

SIX-MONTH BAN FOR HAVLIN

Jockey Robert Havlin has been banned from racing for six months by France Galop after testing positive for a prohibited substance, according to Racing Post.

The Scottish-born jockey, who is attached to John Gosden's powerful Newmarket stable, was tested in Paris on Oct. 30, the day he rode Cunico (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) to finish seventh in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. The Gosden-trained colt was also ridden by Havlin when he became Frankel's first winner at Newbury on May 13.

A statement released by France Galop read, "The stewards of France Galop have been advised by the Medical Commission that jockey Robert Havlin's biological sample carried out on Saint-Cloud racecourse on Oct. 30, 2016, revealed the presence of two prohibited substances classified as narcotics, including morphine, and three prohibited substances classified as psychotropic by article 143 of the Code des Courses au Galop."

Havlin, whose big-race wins include partnering Shalaa (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) to his first black-type win in the G2 Arqana July S., has instructed French solicitor Florence Gaudilliere to act on his behalf and she has confirmed that the jockey will appeal the ban.

If the ban is upheld in France, Havlin would also be precluded from riding in other racing jurisdictions under an International Federation of Horseracing Authorities agreement.

TOORMORE REMOVED FROM DARLEY ROSTER

Toormore (Ire) (Arakan), the champion 2-year-old colt of 2013 and six-time group winner, will not be standing for Darley this season following insufficient demand for his services. The 6-year-old was retired from racing at the end of last year to take up duties at Dalham Hall Stud as part of the Darley Club.

"We haven't had enough mares booked to Toormore to justify

standing him so we have informed breeders that we have taken him off the roster," confirmed Darley's Director of Stallions Sam Bullard.

Trained by Richard Hannon, initially for the Middleham Park Racing syndicate,

Toormore was unbeaten in his three starts as a juvenile, culminating in his victory in the G1 Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S. at the Curragh. Returning at three to win the G3 Craven S., Toormore was later sold privately to Godolphin, for whom he won the G2 Qatar Lennox S., G2 International Topkapi Trophy in Turkey and last year's G2 bet365 Mile.

Bred by Jimmy Murphy of Redpender Stud under the banner of BEC Bloodstock, Toormore is a son of Danetime Out (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}) and is a half-brother to the dual Group 2 winner Estidhkaar (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), who was also retired to stud for the 2017 season and stands in Ireland at Tara Stud.

ASCOT BREEZE-UP CATALOGUE NOW ONLINE

The catalogue for the first European breeze-up sale of 2017 has been released by Tattersalls Ireland, which stages the auction at Ascot on Apr. 5.

No fewer than 14 of the 99 2-year-olds catalogued are by Kodiak (Ire), while his fellow popular Irish-based stallion Dandy Man (Ire) has four lots catalogued and Dark Angel (Ire) has one. There are plenty of first-season sires represented, including Epaulette (Aus), Havana Gold (GB), Lethal Force (Ire), Planteur (Ire), Red Jazz (Ire), Society Rock (Ire), Swiss Spirit (GB), Style Vendome (Fr) and Worthadd (Ire).

With just one 2-year-old to be sold from a very small number of live foals is Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate), who was himself a top-class, unbeaten juvenile whose stud career was cut short by fertility problems.

The most notable graduate of the newest addition to the breeze-up calendar is The Wow Signal (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}), who was bought for £50,000 in 2014 and went on to win the G2 Coventry S. and G1 Darley Prix Morny before retiring to Haras de Bouquetot in Normandy. The top price at last year's sale was £180,000 for Church Farm Stables' daughter of Exceed And Excel, subsequently named Bated Slumming Angel (Ire).

The horses will breeze on the turf at Ascot racecourse at 12 noon on Tuesday, Apr. 4 with the sale taking place the following day, also at noon. The catalogue is now available online and printed copies will be distributed from Feb. 24.

Understandably a Derby entry, he encounters another regally-bred newcomer in **Sun Or Shade (Ire) ([Galileo {Ire}](#))**, a John Gosden-trained half-brother to the 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Wrote (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) who races for Mt. Brilliant Farm, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor.

I AM INVINCIBLE ON TOP AS PERTH SALE CLOSES

A son of I Am Invincible (Aus) led allcomers during the second and final session of the Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale when bought by Gary Moore for A\$265,000.

Despite some notable highlights, the sale's figures took a bit of a hit, with exactly the same number of horses (254) sold as at last year's sale for a reduced aggregate of A\$9,359,000. A reduction in the clearance rate from 80% to 75% played its part in the average and median also dropping, the former to A\$36,846 and the median to \$26,000. However, last year's top price of A\$300,000 was bettered on Monday when a colt by Not A Single Doubt (Aus) brought the hammer down at A\$325,000.

Assessing the results, Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said, "We can't get away from the statistics--it has been a tougher sale than it was last year. Having said that, there's been a number of positives and exciting things coming out of this sale."

He added. "Getting \$325,000 yesterday for the Not a Single Doubt colt and \$265,000 today for the I Am Invincible colt to Gary Moore, there were some great scenes after the purchase of that horse, that was great fun. There were vendors who had very good sales. I just had one tell me he's never had a better sale in 40 years. What is happening here is I think we are lacking a domestic stallion--hopefully one of these new boys coming through like Gingerbread Man and Frost Giant can kick and we can get another in as well and that will lift the profile of the state."

The Sydney-based Moore, brother of fellow trainer John Moore, will be responsible for the conditioning of the day's top horse, [lot 351](#). The colt, who was consigned by Dawson Stud, is the first foal of the multiple juvenile winner Miss Solis (Aus) (Oratorio {Ire}), whose five victories include two at Listed level.

"He's from a great mare and by one of our better stallions in Australia," said the trainer. "For me he was the pick of the sale. I think he will go early (as a 2-year-old). When you have brother John spending \$560,000 on a filly by I Am Invincible, I think this horse is a very good buy. I really wanted a 2-year-old. We're so keen on getting a top-class juvenile. This could be the bloke to do it for me."

Gingerbread Man (Aus), who is currently leading the first-season sires' table in Australia, was responsible for the day's second-best price ([lot 252](#)), with A\$170,000 being paid by Aqua Trained Thoroughbreds and Andrew Noblet Racing for Korilya Stud's half-brother to dual Group 3 winner Silent Sediton (Aus) (War Chant). The colt's dam Fiorentina (Aus) (Dubai Destination) is in turn a half-sister to G1 Dubai World Cup winner Monterosso (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). Gingerbread Man, a son of Shamardal, stands at Yarradale Stud and has had two winners from four runners to date.

Trevor Andrews, who ended the sale as leading buyer with seven yearlings purchased for A\$541,000, signed for a first-crop son of Zoustar (Aus) ([lot 190](#)) at A\$155,000. Another first foal, the chestnut colt is out of four-time winner Cajun Waltz (Aus) (Hennessy Waltz {Aus}).

Champion and “TDN Rising Star” **Arrogate** (Unbridled's Song) breezed five furlongs in :59 flat (3/44) in company with Grade III winner Whiskey Ticket (Ghostzapper) at Santa Anita Tuesday morning ([video](#)). It was the Juddmonte colorbearer's second work since his impressive romp in the \$12-million GI Pegasus World Cup at Gulfstream Jan. 28.

“He went nice. He just cruised around there,” Bob Baffert told the *TDN* Tuesday afternoon. “They got him a little fast. He went in :59 and four. He broke off with horses in front and behind him. He also had company, so it kept him interested during the whole work, which is good. He was just galloping. He is just getting better. Every time I take him out there, I just see improvement on him. He's going the right way, so that's good.”

The Hall of Fame trainer has yet to pick a race for his stable star's next start.

“We have a lot of options, but we probably won't know until the beginning of next week maybe,” Baffert remarked. “The Juddmonte team has to discuss it. The Prince [Khalid bin Abdullah] has to decide between all the spots. Everything is under consideration. We don't say no to anything. We have Dubai [for the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 25], we have the Big ‘Cap [the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 11] here.” **Cont. p3**

The conditioner also offered an update on GIII Sham S. runner-up **American Anthem**



Moseley shrewdly observed that Ghostzapper would be a suitable match for her stakes-placed mare Archstone (Arch)-who did her best work at distances 10 furlongs and longer over the turf--and sent the bay to visit the Hall of Famer and 2004 Horse of the Year in the spring of 2013.

"We got the [stallion] season at the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation dinner," Moseley recalled. "And it was when Ghostzapper was just starting to warm up again, so [the price] was very reasonable at the time. He's having an unbelievable year [in 2017]. I saw he was doing well, and that's why we bought it at the charity event. But then, he really warmed up, so this year would've been a product of

everyone that bred that spring."

The product of the Ghostzapper--Archstone mating is [TDN Rising Star](#) Proctor's Ledge, who has notched two impressive victories over the Gulfstream Park turf course to begin the 2017 season, adding to a recent run of success for her sire that has included current GI Kentucky Derby co-favorite McCracken, GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational runner-up Shaman Ghost and GI San Vicente S. hero Iliad.

Although Proctor's Ledge could do no better than an even seventh in her one-mile unveiling over a damp Churchill Downs turf course Nov. 26, the Brendan Walsh trainee returned to action with a 49-1 upset score going nine furlongs on the Pegasus World Cup undercard Jan. 28 [\[video\]](#) and recently made it two in a row with a handy 3 1/4-length success over entry-level allowance foes Saturday [\[video\]](#). **Cont. p5**

Moseley, who watched Saturday's race on her i-Pad while visiting an ailing friend in nearby Fort Lauderdale, said the win made her particularly proud because of the fact that Proctor's Ledge raced without Lasix. Guided along by Walsh's steady training plan, the filly represents the payout for years of perseverance with her damside predecessors.

"It's a culmination of many generations of a family we had, dating back to Drumtop (Round Table), who Bull Hancock actually got for us," Moseley reflected. "It's always exciting to see these families come through. Bull bought her, and we actually owned her with Alice Chandler and we went on and bred her...Drumtop has been very good to us."

In addition to capturing multiple stakes races on the racetrack for the Moseleys in a career that spanned from 1968-1971, Drumtop went on to become a foundation mare for their breeding operation, producing stakes winner Topsider (Northern Dancer) and Aliata (Mr. Prospector)--herself the dam of the useful stallion Storm Boot (Storm Cat) and, of course, Archstone. Moseley said she is hopeful that Proctor's Ledge may ultimately prove to be the most talented female runner to emerge from the bloodline.

To understand the importance of the Moseleys to the history of racing in Massachusetts, one can simply browse through the stakes records of Suffolk Downs, finding events named in honor of Drumtop, Topsider, and James Moseley himself. But the current climate for racing in the Bay State is unfavorable, with legislative woes limiting Suffolk to just six days of live racing in 2016.

"I have a farm going in New York now because things got so discouraging in Massachusetts," Moseley said. "You breed a lot of Mass-breds and suddenly, there's no racing."

While Moseley can point to plenty of favorable memories of Massachusetts racing in years past, she went back over 300 years through the state's history--to the Salem Witch Trials--to find inspiration for her Ghostzapper filly's name.

"I was fishing around for names, and more or less at the same time, I read this article in the paper about them christening Proctor's Ledge, which was where they pushed the witches over," Moseley said. "With Ghostzapper, that seemed appropriate. And for a while, I thought, 'I don't know,' but a horse makes a name, doesn't it?"

As for Brendan Walsh, the 43-year-old Irish-born trainer has made a name for himself training the likes of multiple graded stakes-winning marathoners Cary Street (Smarty Jones) and Scuba (Tapit), as well as a number of talented female turf runners. Walsh said the success of Proctor's Ledge is particularly special because of Moseley's commitment to him from the outset of his career as a public trainer in 2012.

"A good friend of mine introduced me to her when I first started," Walsh recollected. "My very first winner, actually, was for her--a filly called Sandcastle (Mizzen Mast). She's been a

great supporter of mine since I started. I've always had two or three or four horses for her, so I'm delighted that this is for her. It's nice when somebody like that who has supported you since the start happens to come by a good one. She's just a great lady--loves the game, and loves horses. Nobody deserves it more than her."

In recent years, Walsh and Moseley have also paired to campaign the multiple stakes-placed 7-year-old mare **Bitty Kitty** (Kitten's Joy), who Walsh said will be bred this spring. **Sea Cloud** (Mizzen Mast), a 4-year-old Moseley homebred, cleared her first-level allowance condition at Gulfstream Feb. 11, making the recent run of success for the owner and trainer all the more sweet.

Walsh said he was thoroughly impressed, but not necessarily surprised, by either of Proctor's Ledge's victories. Although the filly was dismissed at astronomical odds for her maiden victory at Gulfstream, the Irish native noted that she was deceptively competitive in her debut at Churchill--an effort that set her up for marked improvement early in her sophomore season.

“She ran really well,” Walsh remarked. “I thought last week, just since the maiden, she had really come to hand. And a couple people said, ‘Oh, you’re running her back quickly,’ but she was just doing so good that when the race came up, I thought we’d go ahead and run her. She came out of that first race so well. I thought she was sitting on a good run, but she impressed me.”

As Walsh’s stable continues to grow in his sixth year on his own, stakes-bound Proctor’s Ledge gives him a decidedly bright outlook for the future.

“I think all her best days are in front of her, physically and mentally,” Walsh added. “She’s taking a huge leap forward every time she runs, so we’re very excited. I think there’s no limitation [in terms of distance]. I had a nice 3-year-old grass filly last year named Auntie Joy (Uncle Mo), and I think this filly’s as good as her, if not better. So we might take a similar route to what we did with her.”

ENGLEHART MARIJUANA SUSPENSION:**ENOUGH ALREADY** *by Bill Finley*

Trainer Jeffrey Englehart, 26, smoked marijuana. In eight states that's legal. In New York State, where Englehart trains, the punishment for possessing 25 grams or less of marijuana is a \$100 fine. The second offense is a \$200 fine. Get the point? It's 2017 and smoking marijuana is no longer considered a big deal; it's about as innocuous a crime as there is, right up there with having an overdue library book.

Yet, the New York Gaming Commission apparently doesn't see it that way. Englehart's license was up for renewal and because he had failed a random drug test administered by the Gaming Commission, he was told that he could not apply for a renewal for one year. As a young trainer trying to build a stable and develop a reputation, for him, this is a major blow.

This is not the first time the New York pot police have set down a trainer. Last year it was Brian Lynch, who also tested positive for marijuana and was handed an indefinite suspension, one that wound up lasting 23 days. How did Englehart get a year and Lynch got 23 days? For Englehart, this was a second offense. In 2013, Englehart was suspended for 15 days after refusing to submit to a random drug test while training at Finger Lakes. And Lynch, unlike Englehart, was not up for a license renewal at the time he tested positive, so the Gaming Board could not fall back on the tactic of failing to renew his license. Nonetheless, the 23 days-vs-one-year discrepancy for virtually the same offense seems horribly unfair.

That said, the New York Gaming Commission was within its rights to give Englehart a one-year vacation. Holding a racing license is a privilege and not a right. When you sign your application, you give the New York Commission, and any other commission, all sorts of powers. They are allowed to test you and they are allowed to penalize you or strip you of your license if you do something wrong, whether it is something as serious as robbing a bank or something as minor as smoking marijuana. Rules are rules.

And common sense is common sense.

Jockeys should absolutely be tested for drugs and alcohol because if they were ever to ride in an impaired condition they would be putting their safety and the safety of the other jockeys in the race in peril. Should one get caught attempting to ride under the influence of anything stronger than Mountain Dew set them down for a very long time.

But trainers? There's no reason to care that Jeffrey Englehart smoked marijuana, which he has admitted to. In our modern society, that's about as serious an offense as taking 15 items into the "12 items and fewer" express checkout lane at the Price

Chopper. The only people who would have even the slightest reason to be upset about Englehart smoking pot would be his owners. If they felt it was affecting his job performance, then they can fire him. Englehart won 70 races from 325 starters in 2016. Looks like he did just fine, reefer or no reefer.

It's time for the New York Gaming Commission to stop this nonsense. There are a lot of real problems in the sport that need to be dealt with and trainers doing recreational drugs on their own time is not one of them. Not one second or one dollar should ever again be spent on random drug tests for trainers, even if, as is the case with Englehart, there is a red flag in their past. They are not employees of the New York Gaming Commission, NYRA or Finger Lakes. They are employees of the owners who hire them and it should be up to them, and them only, to deal with any substance abuse issues their trainers may have.

Ironically, the New York Gaming Commission is among the best racing commissions in the country. Unlike many, it is not run by political hacks, but people who genuinely seem to care about doing the right thing. They never look the other way when a trainer is caught using illegal performance-enhancing drugs on their horses and no commission in the state has done more to help with the problem of retired horses being sent off to slaughter after they are done racing.

Someone needs to tell them they are shooting themselves in the foot with this insistence on drug testing trainers and are needlessly hurting their reputation. Jeffrey Englehart has not had any violations for drugging horses, and that's all people care about, and all they should care about. People are tired of seeing horses undergo miraculous form reversals when claimed by some guy winning 34% of his starts. And people are tired of the cheats getting 30 or 60-day suspensions when they are caught using drugs on their horses. Juxtapose that with Englehart losing his license for a year because he was caught using marijuana and it makes the Gaming Board look like it doesn't have its eye on the ball.

Call a do-over. Let Englehart stew for 30 days, tell him to please lay off the reefer and or move his stable to the appropriately named Mile High Park in Arapahoe, Colorado, give him his license back and get back to the real job of busting the real bad guys, those who don't drug themselves but their horses.

CAUSE OF DEATH ANNOUNCED FOR CHARISMATIC



Charismatic at Old Friends | Laura Battles

A necropsy has revealed that the 1999 Horse of the Year **Charismatic** (Summer Squall) died from a pelvic fracture, it was announced Tuesday. The GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. hero passed away suddenly at Old Friends Thoroughbred Retirement in Georgetown, KY., Sunday. "A necropsy performed at the University of Kentucky Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory revealed that Charismatic suffered a severe catastrophic fracture of his pelvis that resulted in fatal bleeding," Bryan M. Waldridge, DVM, MS, and Rhodes P. Bell, DVM, MS, said in a statement. "Pelvic fractures will in some cases also lacerate the large arteries of the pelvis and cause severe internal bleeding. Fatal pelvic fractures are uncommon and usually unforeseeable. It is not possible to know exactly how the injury happened or any factors that may have led to its occurrence."

TORNADOES WIPE OUT RETAMA TOTE BOARD, DAMAGE GRANDSTAND

One of at least four confirmed tornadoes that careened through the San Antonio, TX area late Sunday and early Monday caused significant damage at Retama Park. No injuries to people at the track were reported, and the Quarter Horses stabled on the grounds for training were unscathed.

A series of morning-after photos posted online by radio station KTSA show Retama's infield tote board almost entirely collapsed backwards, large sections of fencing torn down, and exterior siding from the main building sheared off.

"Inside, it looks like some of the ceiling tiles and insulation have literally been ripped off and thrown about," one track worker told KTSA. "There's a puddle of water on the inside of the concourse level of the grandstand [and] there are tree branches that have been snapped."

The Texas track is not currently conducting live racing but has been open during the winter months for simulcasting. The Quarter Horse meet starts June 9. Thoroughbreds race from Sep. 1-Nov. 25.

Retama is about 18 miles northeast of San Antonio, and that city was operating under a declared "state of disaster" Tuesday as crews worked to restore electricity and other services to the region.

TDN could not get through to the full voicemail box of Retama's general manager, Kevin Whalen. Several other employees confirmed via phone that damage did occur, but none would speak any further on the record.

A Twitter posting from the track's account read "every person and animal over here are OK! Thanks for the concern."

According to Equibase, there were eight gate workouts posted for unraced Quarter Horses at Retama on Tuesday, signaling at least some semblance of a return to normalcy. -@thorntontd

Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Reaches Agreement in Out-Of-Competition Sample Violation:

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission has reached an agreement with horse trainer and owner Otabek Umarov for a five-year suspension and \$5,000 fine following his refusal to comply with equine drug testing regulations.

On April 30, 2016, Umarov prevented Commission personnel from collecting an out-of-competition sample from his horse, Looks to Spare, at Churchill Downs.

State regulations permit the Commission to request a blood or urine sample from any horse eligible to race in Kentucky to screen for banned blood-doping agents. Under the rule, Umarov was obligated to consent to the testing.

“I fully accept my responsibility as a trainer to comply with the rules and standards set forth by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission,” Umarov said. “I understand that I violated one of those rules by failing to completely cooperate with the Commission, and I accept the terms of my suspension.”

Under the terms of the ruling, Umarov will be prohibited from training or participating in horse racing in Kentucky for the duration of his suspension. He will be required to appear before the Commissions’ License Review Committee if he chooses to apply for a license once the suspension is complete.

“The rules and regulations of the Commission are in place for the betterment of the equine industry and to protect the safety of the animals,” said Kentucky Horse Racing Commissioner Marc Guilfoil. “It is our job to uphold the high standards of our industry and initiate disciplinary action when those standards are violated.”
