



GORMLEY CAPS MOSS 1-3 IN SA DERBY

Jerry and Ann Moss's Gormley (Malibu Moon) showed a new dimension Saturday and wore down extremely game pacesetter and 'TDN Rising Star' Battle of Midway (Smart Strike) by a half-length to reassert himself as one to watch for at Churchill Downs next month. Fellow Moss colorbearer and John Shirreffs trainee Royal Mo (Uncle Mo) checked in a solid third after chasing the pace out wide (+68 ft. according to Trakus), while co-favorites Reach the World (Tapit) and Iliad (Ghostzapper) settled for fourth and fifth, respectively. READY FOR 'WAR' IN THE WOOD

'TDN Rising Star' Irish War Cry (Curlin) bounced back in a big way in Saturday's GII Wood Memorial S. at the Big A to punch his ticket to the GI Kentucky Derby in style. It was 3 1/2 lengths back to fellow 'Rising Star' and 2-1 favorite Battalion Runner (Unbridled's Song) in second. "It's extremely gratifying to get this horse back on track," winning trainer Graham Motion commented. "That was huge. I don't remember having a situation like this, when I felt so much was on the line. I thought he won pretty comfortably and it doesn't seem like distance [1 1/4 miles] of the [GI Kentucky] Derby will be an issue." Cont. p7

IRAP GRADUATES IN STYLE

Not since Strike the Gold now better than a guarter-century ago has a horse paired up victories in the GII Toyota Blue Grass S. with another in the GI Kentucky Derby. Reddam Racing LLC's Irap (Tiznow) will not be fancied to break the streak, but the well-traveled colt earned his ticket to Louisville in Saturday's renewal, outlasting Practical Joke (Into Mischief) to become the first horse in history to break his maiden in the race. 'TDN Rising Star' McCraken (Ghostzapper) was sent off the 8-5 favorite in the Blue Grass to run his winning streak to a perfect five-forfive, but raced keenly behind modest fractions and could not summon the necessary late response in third. McCraken will try to follow in the hoofprints of horses like Thunder Gulch and Street Sense, who faltered to varying degrees at Keeneland before rediscovering their better form beneath the Twin Spires. A clear-cut debut winner for his famously patient barn at Del Mar late in the summer meet last year, Gormley took a giant step forward from a speed figure perspective when inheriting an easy lead and never looking back in the local GI FrontRunner S. in October. He simply never looked comfortable after failing to find a good foothold when seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile the following month, but bounced back with aplomb when gamely fending off well-regarded **American Anthem** (Bodemeister) in the GIII Sham S. over a sloppy mile Jan. 7. Gormley pressed the brilliantly talented '**Rising Star**' Mastery (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GII San Felipe S. last out Mar. 11, but was the first to blink and backed up to fourth behind that romping runner, who suffered a condylar fracture on the gallopout. **Cont. p4**

Gormley took up a perfect drafting spot early along the rail as Battle of Midway, American Anthem and Royal Mo lined up


across the track and ran off through hot splits of :22.66, :46.55 and 1:10.92. Guided off the rail to avoid the fading American Anthem turning for home, the bay took a stride or two to get his feet under him in upper stretch, but eventually leveled off late to kick past the valiant Battle of Midway and Royal Mo in the final sixteenth.

"I think the key was [Victor] Espinoza rating Gormley and then making his big move," Shirreffs said. "This is very exciting. It's thrilling to have a Kentucky Derby horse and it's

for the same owners as [2005 Derby winner] Giacomo. Royal Mo ran really big. If he had a better post position, you wonder how he would have done. I really wasn't paying attention to the fractions. I just saw my horse and he got behind horses including Royal Mo. Gormley is an evolving horse. He's very precocious



and very excitable. I just need to turn that energy of his into positive use. It's a lot of growing pains with a talented horse. I think using the tongue tie certainly helped us today. We'll see

> how this shakes out. We'll see how he comes out of this race in the morning and if all is well, we'll point to the Kentucky Derby."

Royal Mo, drawn widest Saturday, annexed the GIII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 4 before fading to ninth in Oaklawn's GII Rebel S. Mar. 18. This owner/trainer combination upset the 2007 Santa Anita Derby with Tiago (Pleasant Tap).

"It's been such a great time bringing both of these horses up and both came through

beautifully today," said Jerry Moss. Cont. p5

Both Gormley and Royal Mo had been ridden by Espinoza in each of their prior outings.

"Today the big difference was that he was ready," said the 2002, 2014 and 2015 Kentucky Derby-winning pilot. "Something went wrong last time, he was good, but not quite where I wanted. I was a little bit disappointed, but it seems like today he was on his toes, on his game and I was really ready for it. All it takes is having a lot of confidence in him against the other horses and with John [Shirreffs] we were hoping he chose the right one."

Both Shirreffs and Espinoza are finalists for the 2017 National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame.

Pedigree Notes:

Gormley was acquired by these connections shortly after he RNA'd for \$150,000 as a Keeneland September yearling. Castleton Lyons acquired Gormley's second dam Miss Mambo privately after she finished third in the 2004 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and second in the G2 Prix de Sandringham. She'd go on to win a listed event in Ireland and annex a Gulfstream allowance for the Ryan family. Race to Urga took the grassy 2012 Wait a While S. for Castleton Lyons and Christophe Clement. She produced a Smart Strike colt in 2015 and a Gio Ponti colt in 2016 before being bred to Justin Phillip.

Though he entered the Blue Grass winless in his seven career starts, Irap had arguably earned the right to run in races like the Blue Grass, with runner-up efforts behind the now-sidelined Mastery (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GI Los Alamitos Futurity last December and to Royal Mo (Uncle Mo) in the GIII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 3. The bay, runner-up to Conquest Mo Money (Uncle Mo) in the Mine That Bird Derby Feb. 26, was exiting a fourth in the GIII Sunland Derby Mar. 26.

Wild Shot (Trappe Shot), a latest third to Tapwrit (Tapit) in the GII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 11, hit the ground running and led them under the line for the first time, with Irap pressing from second and Practical Joke alongside in third. McCraken broke out at the break and was more on the bridle in reasonably close attendance to a moderate pace of :23.79 to the quarter and :48.34 to the half-mile. Wild Shot began to beat a retreat nearing the three-eighths marker and Irap inherited the lead, chased now by Practical Joke and McCraken, who was shuffled back more or less to last entering the turn, but who was soon back in forward gear progressing towards the front. Irap turned for home clearly ahead, with Practical Joke trying his best, but despite racing on his incorrect lead, Irap got the job done. McCraken flattened out in the final furlong in his first start since annexing the GIII Sam F. Davis S. in his seasonal return Feb. 11.

"A lot of credit to the Reddams," Jack Sisterson, assistant to trainer Doug O'Neill commented. "[Irap] went to Sunland Park and didn't run quite as well as we expected. Doug said, 'This horse is better than this, so let's send him to Keeneland.' And sure enough, he showed up on the day. [Jockey] Julien [Leparoux] rode him perfect, and it worked out. You have to toy with this horse. He's such a thinker."

Pedigree Notes:

Irap is the last produce for the Quebec-bred Silken Cat, Canada's Sovereign Award-winning juvenile filly of 1995, whose first foal, the meticulously managed Speightstown (Gone West), won the Eclipse Award as champion sprinter in 2004 and has since become a sire of considerable import. Silken Cat passed away in March 2016. The winner is bred on a cross over Storm Cat that has been successful over the years and has been responsible for the likes of champion Folklore, Tiz Wonderful and American Lion, et al. Irap was offered by Taylor Made on behalf of Aaron and Marie Jones at the 2015 Keeneland September Sale, but was led out unsold on a bid of \$140,000. He was sold post-RNA to Brad Grady's Grand Oaks for \$100,000, then was hammered down for \$300,000 as an OBSMAR juvenile.

Let go as the third choice at 7-2 to atone for a puzzling seventh-place effort when last seen in the GII Xpressbet Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Mar. 4, the Isabelle deTomaso New Jersey homebred was given a tactically perfect ride by the comebacking Rajiv Maragh after breaking well from his wide draw here.

Battalion Runner, a winner of two straight at Gulfstream, including an optional claimer in his two-turn debut Feb. 3, held a narrow advantage through opening splits of :23.50 and :47.34 with Irish War Cry in hot pursuit to his outside.


Irish War Cry reached even terms on the far turn, began to let it out a notch as they straightened for home and strode clear late to report home as a much-the-best winner.

It was the second graded win on the card for horses bred in the Garden State, joining upset GI Carter H. hero Green Gratto.

"We are unbelievably thrilled," Hope Jones, niece of Mrs. de Tomaso, and granddaughter of Mr. Haskell said. "This is the first time I've seen this horse race in person and Irish War Cry did not disappoint at all. We are so excited. I live in Queens and this is my first time at Aqueduct and the horse wins the Wood. It's amazingly exciting. I always went to Monmouth Park [because of her family]."

Irish War Cry, a winner of his first three starts, headed by a lights-out victory of Gulfstream's GII Lambholm South Holy Bull S. Feb. 4, posted two moves since the Fountain of Youth, a five-furlong breeze in 1:01 (14/34) at Palm Meadows Mar. 25 and a six-furlong spin in 1:13 2/5 (1/3) at Fair Hill Apr. 2. He was fitted with a Figure 8 bridle for the first time in the Wood.

"I think it's so good that Rajiv came to the barn and has been on him the last few mornings to see how he is," Motion said. "He's not a difficult horse. He's not a rank horse; he's a very classy horse. We both thought it was a good idea for Rajiv to get on him in the mornings."

Motion added, "I think the equipment change probably helped. It gives you a little more control. But he had the perfect trip today. I don't know what happened last time. It's just a complete puzzle to me."

Maragh, 31, returned to the saddle Nov. 4 following a serious spill at Belmont Park in July 2015. The accident left him with several broken vertebrae, a broken rib, and a punctured lung, and required extensive and often painful rehabilitation.

"When I was down and out, these are the days I dreamed about," said Maragh, who also guided home 2014 GI Wood Memorial hero Wicked Strong. "These are the days that made me feel I wanted to ride. You never know if you'll get them again after being off so long. I can't be more thankful for everyone who has been there for my recovery and supporting me now that I'm back. I've never been so emotional after a race in my life as I was after this."

On an afternoon when upsets ruled the day at Keeneland, Sailor's Valentine came from out of nowhere to blow up the tote and stamp her ticket to the GI Kentucky Oaks.

A sharp debut graduate here over a pair of next-out winners-including GIII Bourbonette Oaks upsetter Purely a Dream (Pure Prize)--going seven panels in October, Sailor's Valentine failed to really build on that promising effort in subsequent tries. Fourth as the favorite in Churchill's one-mile Rags to Riches S. 22 days later, she settled for second when cut back to six furlongs for an optional claimer Nov. 26. A no-show fifth in Gulfstream's Old Hat S. Jan. 7, she prepped for this with a runner-up effort going long on the Tampa turf Mar. 12.

"We knew she liked the track," explained conditioner Eddie Kenneally. "She won here in October very impressively. She came back here in late March and had a really good work over the track. We just decided we'd take a shot in the Ashland-mainly because she loves this track--and this is a very, very good track."

Away alertly and up to chase the pace in second down the backside, the grey seemed to be going well after a half in :49.32 set by fellow outsider Someday Soon. The pacesetter continued on past six panels in 1:14.06, and Sailor's Valentine ratcheted up the pressure as they straightened. The pair of longshots appeared to brush in upper stretch, but Sailor's Valentine righted the ship when it mattered and kicked clear before finding the line in advance of hard-charging Daddys Lil Darling.

"I hadn't been on her [since the Old Hat]," noted winning rider Corey Lanerie. "Coming into the race, [Kenneally] said, 'She's doing phenomenal. I look for her to run a big race. She's going to maybe be a longshot, but she's not going to run like one.' He was right."

Favored Elate dropped back abruptly mid-race and was pulled up and vanned off. Her connections tweeted after the race that X-rays came back clean.

Paradise Woods, named a '**TDN Rising Star**' after an impressive maiden score last out, went out to the front in the early stages of the GI Santa Anita Oaks and never looked back, crushing a half-dozen foes in a powerhouse performance and signaling herself as a force to be reckoned with in the sophomore filly division.

Well-bet when finishing second after setting the pace on debut here Jan. 26, the bay graduated by open lengths Mar. 11 to earn her Rising Star nod and the door opened for this Grade I try when overwhelming favorite Unique Bella (Tapit) had to be taken out of consideration with a sore shin.

Off sharply at a generous 8-1 in this first two-turn test, Paradise Woods shook off a brief early challenge from Princess Karen (Stay Thirsty) and found herself comfortably in front leading the field onto the backstretch. Clicking off modest splits of :23.46 and :47.35, the bay was moving sweetly while in hand on the far bend as others behind her were under drives. Suddenly putting six lengths on her rivals soon after straightening for home, it was only a question of how far from there, as Paradise Woods coasted under the wire all by herself while wrapped up late. Odds-on favorite Abel Tasman completed the exacta after a difficult trip in her first start for trainer Bob Baffert. The winning margin was the biggest in Santa Anita Oaks history, eclipsing Silver Spoon's 10-length victory in 1959.

"I've always been high on her," said winning rider Flavien Prat. "From the first time I worked her, I said, 'That one is really good.' She's so smart. If you teach her something she remembers it the next day; it sticks. She's super small, she's fast and she has stamina. She's so good. It's an honor to ride her, truly."

Victorious trainer Richard Mandella, who picked up his third Santa Anita Oaks trophy, added, "She looked like she was just cruising out there. At the half mile pole, she was going easy. She took my breath away. It means a lot to win for (Herman) Sarkowsky. He was an owner with me for 38 years. I was thinking of running her short tomorrow in the Santa Paula, but when Unique Bella scratched, I thought we should take a shot. I thought she was as good as these fillies and she showed it today. She is a young filly. She has only had three starts, so we'll see about the Kentucky Oaks and how things develop. She was really nasty to saddle today, but she ran great."

The speedy New Jersey-bred Green Gratto, second at 53-1 in the GI Carter H. after setting the pace two years ago, closed the door this time around, holding grimly late to pull a 54-1 shocker in the annual Wood day undercard event.

Up the track when eighth after dueling on a blistering pace in last year's Carter, the dark bay annexed the GIII Toboggan S. over the local inner track Jan. 16 before finishing seventh in the GIII Tom Fool H. last out Mar. 11.

Breaking well here, Green Gratto was put in his customary frontrunning spot by jockey Chris Decarlo and clicked off moderate splits of :22.56 and :45.64 while being chased by odds-on favorite and last out GIII Gulfstream Park Sprint S. winner Unified. Challenged by that one to his outside in early stretch, he gamely shook off that foe by the eighth pole. Tommy Macho came with a late run, but was stymied between horses late and lost all chance. Meanwhile, Unified mounted one final try in the final 100 yards, but came up a head short as the huge longshot found the wire first.

"The last time, he actually bled and he didn't perform any," winning trainer and co-owner Gaston Grant revealed. "When we went back to the barn, we scoped him and knew something was wrong. It wasn't like his physical ability wasn't there. We went to the drawing board and came back and he was working like a freight train. There's not much we can do with him now other than these races, so we might as well take a shot at the big guys."

How does it feel to win your first Grade I race?

"Well, I guess that's every trainer's dream," Grant replied. "I knew he had it in him, but he had to put it together in the afternoon. We finally put it together this afternoon. [Jockey] Chris [DeCarlo]--he did a great job." **Cont. p12**

"[The trip] was great; she broke really well," offered winning pilot Jose Ortiz. "When I cut the corner at the quarter pole, she kicked on. Great training job by Chad [Brown] as always, and I'm just happy to have had the opportunity." **Cont. p13**

Previously campaigned by breeder Vince Scuderi and trained by Michelle Nevin, Paulassilverlining put together back-to-back Grade III tallies in Aqueduct's Distaff H. and Belmont's Vagrancy H. in April and May, respectively, but just missed by a neck to fellow eventual 2016 filly/mare sprinter Eclipse finalist Haveyougoneaway (Congrats) in Saratoga's GII Honorable Miss H. in July. Fifth to that foe in the GI Ballerina S. a month later, she returned to winning ways in Belmont's GII Gallant Bloom H. before finishing a solid second at 15-1 in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint out at Santa Anita. The bay had last been seen taking Aqueduct's Garland of Roses S. for her old connections as an overwhelming favorite Dec. 10.

"I have to give credit to Michelle Nevin," Brown said. "I only got her [Paulassilverlining] a month ago and she did most of the work to get this horse ready, so I'll share the win with her. She did a terrific job. A lot of credit goes to [Juddmonte's] Garrett O'Rourke, who made the deal to buy her. I was lucky enough [Juddmonte owner] Prince Khalid wanted me to train her."

Completing the superfecta at 19-1 first out Sept. 11 behind Yellow Agate (Gemologist), who returned to capture the GI Frizette S., Miss Sky Warrior broke her maiden by seven lengths despite a stumbling start Oct. 15 at Parx and held on to take the GIII Tempted S. on this oval Nov. 5. Repeating in the track-andtrip GII Demoiselle S. Nov. 26, she made her seasonal debut with a half-length tally in the GII Davona Dale S. Mar. 4 at Gulfstream.

Let go as the narrow favorite over North End (Into Mischief) in this spot, the dark bay broke on top under Paco Lopez and swiftly made the point heading into the clubhouse turn while drifting in a bit, passing the opening quarter in :23.63. A two-time winner and multiple stakes-placed in 17 starts for trainer Chad Brown in the Eastern half of the U.S., Hillhouse High took a course-and-distance allowance Oct. 6 ahead of a longshot third in the GII Goldikova S. Nov. 6. The bay was a distant third in the off-turf GIII Buena Vista S. Feb. 18 and was most recently an even fourth in the Mar. 10 Wishing Well S. down the hillside turf course.

Well into stride, Hillhouse High landed in second position, chasing loose-on-the-lead Juno, but well within the grasp of jockey Corey Nakatani. Given a bit of rein to take closer order midway on the turn, Hillhouse High loomed upsides the tearaway leader in upper stretch, kicked over onto her right lead and finished well for the victory. Mokat flew home late to complete a 1-2 finish for the Richard Baltas stable, which Juno did well to hold third.

"We had a great trip," said winning jockey Corey Nakatani. "She broke really well, was tactically placed, and the inside horse asserted herself with Kent [Desormeaux]. I was able to track them and give her a target, which was really good for her. She did the rest. She's a really good filly." **Cont. p15**

The winner, just one of two horses in training for Golden Eagle Farm, hails from the deeper female family of champions Sky Classic and Classy 'N Smart. Pleasant Laughter is the dam of a 2-year-old colt by Hard Spun and is due to Karakontie (Jpn) for 2017. The Royal Heroine is the first graded-stakes victory for Golden Eagle Farm since Yearly Report won the GII Delaware Oaks in 2004.

Holding Gold, a promising sophomore turf sprinter last summer, parlayed a sweet trip into an upset victory in the GII Shakertown S. in his 4-year-old debut, giving Live Oak Plantation, Mark Casse and Joel Rosario back-to-back stakes wins on the Saturday Keeneland card.

Victorious as the crowd's pick in the Quick Call S. Aug. 4 at Saratoga, the Live Oak homebred was a dull fifth stretching out to two turns in the Centaur S. Sept. 7 at Indiana Grand before checking in seventh after a wide journey in the local GIII Woodford S. Oct. 8.

Dismissed in the wagering in this first start in over six months, the bay came away well from his rail draw and settled in sixth behind a :22.07 quarter. Saving ground on the turn, the homebred found daylight three off the rail at the threesixteenths pole and swept up to challenge Green Mask, who had inherited the lead from tiring speed Justin Squared (Zensational), at the sixteenth marker. Determined under a stiff drive from Rosario, Holding Gold put his head in front in the final strides to earn the upset tally.

Live Oak, Casse and Rosario also struck one race earlier with Awesome Slew (Awesome Again) in the GIII Commonwealth S.

"Last year we ran him here, and he got beat in his last start. I said to (owner) Mrs. (Charlotte) Weber, 'He's only 3 years old. Let's send him home, let him grow up, and if he grows up over the winter, he's going to be as good as any turf sprinter in North America.' So maybe we do have one."

The late money was right ... again.

Long Haul Bay was pounded at the windows just before they sprung the latch and narrowly delivered as the 1-2 chalk at first asking going six furlongs versus state-breds over the Big A inner Feb. 18.

Bet in half from 3-1 with zero minutes on the clock here, he was allowed to drift back off a three-way tussle for the early lead. The Alpha Delta homebred began to warm up to the task midway on the turn while three deep and was clearly going better than even-money favorite and comebacking GIII Futurity S. hero Theory (Gemologist), who was being niggled along by John Velazquez. Sweeping to the front with about a furlong and a half to run, Long Haul Bay descended upon longshot leader Even Thunder with an eighth of a mile to race and proved a much-the-best winner.

"Mid-stretch, it looked pretty good," Chad Brown assistant trainer Whit Beckman said. "I was pretty confident how he was going to finish. Obviously with the number he ran [90 Beyer Speed Figure] and how professionally he ran the first time out, we had options, and, talking with Chad, he thought this would be the best spot."

Awesome Slew spent most of last year and the beginning of this one going two turns, but he stamped himself as one to watch around one bend for the rest of this season. The Live Oak homebred bided his time in second last off the inside as Lexington-loving Limousine Liberal emerged to lead through splits of :22.97 and :46.21. Favored A.P. Indian emerged from the scrum up front to hit the lead in midstretch, but his lead was fleeting. Awesome Slew immediately caught the eye down the center of the track, and catapulted past his competition to win going away in a powerful performance.

"Very good trip," said winning rider Joel Rosario. "I knew they were going to get away from me a little bit. I rode this horse last time a little bit off the pace, and he just took his time. He had a tremendous finish today. Turning for home, he was really rolling. I was really happy when he started moving up and kept going."

Awesome Slew kicked off his 3-year-old season in the Eddie Plesa, Jr. barn with a clear-cut Monmouth optional claiming tally in May before being stretched out to routes: he was third in the GIII Pegasus S. in June, but faded to a well-beaten last after pressing a strong pace in the GI Haskell Invitational S. the following month. The bay bounced back with a seven-length romp in Parx's GIII Smarty Jones S. in September, but again turned in a speed-and-fade effort when fifth in the GII Pennsylvania Derby later that month. He was third in both Gulfstream's Dec. 17 GIII Harlan's Holiday S. and at odds-on in the Sunshine Millions Classic Jan. 21, before being transferred to Mark Casse. Awesome Slew had last been seen rallying for second behind subsequent G2 Godolphin Mile third Sharp Azteca (Freud) in the Feb. 11 GII Gulfstream Park H.

"I want to say thanks to [owner] Charlotte [Weber] for giving us this opportunity," Casse offered. "He trained really good. We went back and looked and thought maybe--he was making a big move in the middle and then flattening out--so we looked at cutting him back. Our goal is the [GI Metropolitan H. at Belmont June 10]. I said to Mrs. Weber, 'We can either go from here to the [GII] Alysheba [S. over 8 1/2 furlongs at Churchill Downs May 5] if this is too short or go to the [GII] Churchill Downs [S. over seven panels May 6 at 7 furlongs)."

A double-digit winner of the Soviet Problem S. going a mile versus Cal-breds at Los Alamitos Dec. 17, the dark bay followed with a pair of stakes victories on grass at Santa Anita, including the China Doll S. last out Mar. 11.

Stretching out to 1 1/8 miles here, Sircat Sally set an uncontested pace through easy early fractions of :24.10 and :49.06, and was never seriously asked in the stretch en route to another facile victory.

"I'm very grateful to have a filly like her," Hall of Famer Jerry Hollendorfer said. "She can do just about anything--she has speed and she can run long. You can't ask any more than that from any horse. We thought we'd be on the lead. I was wondering what the outside horse would do, but they didn't go with us."

Winning owner/breeder Joe Turner added, "This means everything to me--I've never been in this situation before. I'm hoping to get this thing going and maybe by the time we get to Del Mar, hopefully, we can win a race to get into the Breeders' Cup. I think she's better on the dirt. The track is kind of fast today, so I understand the fractions [regarding the final three-eighths in :34 flat], but she did it beautifully."

Send It In was under a heavy drive in second as Tu Brutus hit the turn racing in hand, but the favorite just kept on coming in the stretch to wear that one down for a career high.

"He's a beautiful homebred," winning owner/breeder Paul Pompa Jr. said. "He wanted it today and he's a grinder. It's very nice to have a New York-bred who is now a Grade III winner. He's by the horse I had who won the Kentucky Derby, Big Brown. I used some of my breeding rights to Big Brown and I got this horse. My Miss Chiff (Into Mischief) exits state-bred company for the first time off two romps at Fair Grounds--by six in a Jan. 26 maiden special weight and by 7 3/4 lengths in an optional claimer Mar. 5. Sine Wave (Big Brown) has a live look at a price. She got up narrowly in her Laurel unveiling Dec. 10, and blew out Parx optional claimers after a very awkward trip.

NYRA REPRIVATIZATION MOVES CLOSER TO REALITY

The long-anticipated reprivatization of the New York Racing Association (NYRA) took a major step towards coming to fruition Friday evening when New York State legislators came to an agreement on Governor Andrew Cuomo's budget proposal for FY 2018. The proposal included provisions to return NYRA to private control--New York state has had majority control of NYRA's board seats since 2012.

"We thank the governor and legislature for their support in returning the New York Racing Association to private control," NYRA President and CEO Chris Kay said in a statement. "NYRA is the cornerstone of an industry responsible for more than 17,000 jobs and \$2 billion in annual economic impact across our state. As a private entity, we look forward to continue to grow interest in our racing, expand our fan base, and promote New York's important tourism and agriculture sectors."

The NYRA reprivitization calls for the formation of a new 17member board: eight seats will be appointed by the current NYRA executive board, with an additional seat for its chief executive. The New York Governor, Senate and Assembly will each be granted the power to appoint two members, while the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (NYTHA) and New York Thoroughbred Breeders Inc. (NYTB) will each have control of one seat.

"The budget bill includes provisions that will have a positive and lasting effect on New York's Thoroughbred industry," offered NYTHA President Rick Violette, Jr. "We applaud the Governor for his support on these issues, and we appreciate the hard work of our legislators, especially Senate Majority Leader John Flanagan, Assembly Speaker Carl Heastie, Senators John Bonacic and Kathleen Marchione, and Assemblymembers J. Gary Pretlow and Carrie Woerner. New York racing is second to none, and reprivatization will allow NYRA to move forward and

optimize what is an invaluable asset to our state. The flexibility provided to the Jockey Injury Compensation Fund will open the door to lower costs, making New York a more attractive place to do business and creating an atmosphere of growth for the thousands of Thoroughbred owners and trainers and the tens of thousands of workers they employ. As the state's second largest agribusiness, horses are responsible for \$4.2 billion in economic impact, 1.3 million acres of green space and 33,000 full-time jobs. We thank the Governor and our representatives for the confidence and commitment they have shown in embracing initiatives so important to our industry."

NYTB Executive Director Jeff Cannizzo issued similar sentiments: "New York's \$4-billion equine industry is critical to the state's fiscal health and those 33,000 direct jobs it supports. Thanks to Governor Cuomo's ongoing commitment to preserving this diverse agricultural industry that touches every county of New York State, the most prestigious racing in the United States will continue for decades at NYRA."

The budget proposal must still pass the New York State Senate. The NYRA provisions also call for increased oversight by the Franchise Oversight Board--including the potential for "independent financial review of NYRA finances, a corrective action plan, and [authorization] to encumber racing support payments." NYRA will be authorized to conduct night racing and to consider reducing race dates for the Aqueduct winter meet.



WINX GETS 17TH WIN, LANDS QUEEN ELIZABETH

Sydney, AUSTRALIA--The Sydneysiders turned out in full-force to get a glimpse at Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) at The Championships at Royal Randwick on Saturday, and the world's highest-rated mare and turf horse did not disappoint, strolling to her 17th straight victory in the A\$4-million G1 Longines Queen Elizabeth S. The 5-year-old broke smartly, but dropped back to settle midpack in the nine-horse field under Hugh Bowman as No Doubt (Aus) (Not A Single Doubt {Aus}) set the tempo from Hartnell (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) on the rail and The United States (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Hartnell began to pull his way closer passing the 800-metre mark as Winx waited in behind, and it wasn't until they were approaching the top of the straight that she loomed up ominously on Hartnell's outside. Hartnell had inherited the lead after No Doubt packed it in early, but his advantage was short-lived. Winx swept to the lead on the outside under a motionless Hugh Bowman, who gave her one smack with the whip in midstretch to draw away to score by 5 1/4 easy lengths. The win provided Bowman a Group 1 double after he scored a similarly easy win aboard Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi {GB}) in the G1 Australian Oaks a race earlier, and solidified his third Nathan Berry medal as the leading rider at the meeting.

REKINDLING UPSETS BALLYSAX

With Ballydoyle's momentum seemingly relentless on the afternoon's fixture, who else but Joseph O'Brien to step forward and deny a Rosegreen whitewash as he unleashed a live Classic prospect in his own right in **Rekindling (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}). Runner-up to Capri (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) over an extended mile at Galway on his racecourse introduction in July, the former David Wachman trainee was successful in a mile maiden at Gowran Park in September which prompted his now-retired handler to try him in a fiercely-contested renewal of the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud next time. Last of 13 in that 10-furlong test in late October, the bay put that flop firmly behind him back on home soil as he forged ahead of a proven trio from his father's base in this often-significant Derby pointer.

Settled in mid-division initially by Wayne Lordan off the honest gallop, he was looking for room towards the inner as Douglas **Macarthur (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) was committed in early straight. As that rival's stablemate **Yucatan (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) failed to slingshot past, it was Rekindling who drove up a gap on the rail to grab the lead with a furlong remaining and stay on strongest of the trio. **Cont. p7**

Winx Gets 17th Win, Lands Queen Elizabeth Cont. from p1

The win was Winx's 17th straight, and pushed her earnings close to the A\$13-million mark. The streak began at the end of Winx's 3-year-old season in May 2015 when she won the G1 Queensland Oaks. She had three more wins later that year in the spring, capped by a 4 3/4 length tour-de-force in the G1 Cox Plate. She ran through four perfect starts last autumn including the G1 Chipping Norton S., G1 George Ryder S. and G1 Doncaster Mile at this meeting before being sent out for a much-deserved winter spell. Last spring she ticked off the G2 Warwick S., G1 Colgate Optic White S. and G1 Ladbrokes S. before recording an even more impressive title defense of the Cox Plate, running away with the prestigious event by eight lengths from Hartnell. Winx's autumn campaign this year had, until Saturday, mirrored last year's, starting out with a win in the G2 Apollo S. on Feb. 13 before repeating in the Chipping Norton and George Ryder. This year, connections opted to bypass the A\$3-million G1 Doncaster Mile on day one of The Championships and target the Queen Elizabeth, and that decision paid dividends.

"She is just so dominant," Bowman told *Racenet.com.au*. "What a supreme athlete she is and what an honour it is to just be a part of her career. I don't whip her too often, but I wanted that supreme effort today. The grand final and when I gave her one she extended again."

"Just look at her: she's a supreme athlete, she's the ultimate professional, I love her and I could really feel the crowd's love for her," Bowman added.

Trainer Chris Waller said post-race that both he and his great mare "need a spell."

"I'm a racing fan through and through and like everyone I die to see horses like her, so having the responsibility that comes with training her makes you very emotional when it's over," Waller told *Racenet.com.au*. "It's just a big relief. It's indescribable really. It's me putting undue pressure on myself but it's hard not too. Get back to reality now; she's ready for a break and so am I." Connections had previously stated Winx's 2017 spring campaign would be centered around a three-peat in the Cox Plate, with the potential for international travel to come in 2018.

Pedigree Notes...

Winx is the second foal out of the stakes-winning 2-year-old Vegas Showgirl, who has proven to be a blue hen producer for John Camilleri's Fairway Thoroughbreds. Not only is she responsible for Winx, but her current 3-year-old is 'TDN Rising Star' El Divino (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}), who dead-heated for the win in last year's G3 Kindergarten S. at The Championships. The week after both Winx and El Divino won at The Championships, Vegas Showgirl's yearling Snitzel colt topped the Inglis Easter sale with a bid of A\$2.3-million from trainer Gai Waterhouse. Vegas Showgirl was barren in 2015, and produced a filly by Snitzel at Segenhoe Stud last season.

FOXPLAY ENHANCES WALLER'S LADIES' DAY

Honesty was rewarded in the final Group 1 race of The Championships at Randwick when the admirable 3-year-old filly **Foxplay (Aus)** (Foxwedge {Aus}) topped off a season of consistent endeavor by taking the G1 Coolmore Legacy S. (registered as Queen of the Turf S.), a 'Win And You're In' qualifier for the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Del Mar this November. Benefitting from a typically well-judged ride from Kerrin McEvoy, Foxplay worked home strongly to lead in the final 50m before passing the post a half-length in front of **Zanbagh (Aus)** (Bernardini), who also came from off the pace.

Foxplay Enhances Waller's Ladies Day Cont.

In breaking through at Group 1 level, Foxplay took her record for the season to four wins from eight starts, having previously won the G2 Furious S, the G2 Light Fingers S. and the G2 Phar Lap S.

Trained by Chris Waller, the filly races for Denise Martin's Star Thoroughbreds, the syndicate which was celebrating its 12th Group 1 victory, with 2012 G1 Golden Slipper winner Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) having been arguably the best horse to carry the well-known purple and white silks. Martin revealed that Foxplay lives in a stable adjacent to Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) in Waller's stable; and the connection between them does not end there as, like Foxplay, Winx also beat her male contemporaries in the Phar Lap S. when she was a 3-year-old.

"She's been a very special horse to us," Waller said. "We call her the Winx Junior, but there's a lot of similarities."

He continued, "She started off with a winning bang and has sort of been a bit forgotten and had a few hard luck stories go against her. And funnily enough, she ran in the same race two weeks ago that Winx ran in prior to running in the Oaks. Winx didn't win the Oaks and I didn't really give it a lot of thought, but I decided not to run this filly in the Oaks because I still think she's got some brilliance and some speed."

Kerrin McEvoy also paid tribute to his winning mount, saying, "It was a lovely win by this filly, she's just done a great job. I wanted to be a bit closer with the lack of speed in the race, I gave her a kick out of the gates and she was much closer than I thought I'd be. I was wide, full credit to the horse she did a good job, I just had her travelling and she picked up well."

He continued, "We were finishing strongly and I was a happy recipient of a tough little filly, she deserves a Group 1. Well done to Denise [Martin] and Chris [Waller] and his team, she's a little star."

Pedigree Notes...

Foxplay is the star of the first crop of the 2012 G1 William Reed S. winner Foxwedge (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), whose stock have done well in both hemispheres. Bred by S F Bloodstock LLC, she was produced on the ever-reliable cross of the Danehill and Sadler's Wells lines: Fastnet Rock is, of course, by Danehill, while Foxwedge's dam Butters is a daughter of the top-class Sadler's Wells stallion El Prado (Ire). Butters, winner of three races in the USA including the Swepida S. and the Bangles And Beads S., is a granddaughter of 1992 G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Eliza (Mt. Livermore).

Star Thoroughbreds principal Denise Martin bought Foxplay for A\$160,000 at the 2015 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, where she was consigned by Newgate Farm. That sum looks a great bargain now that her earnings have broken through the million-dollar barrier.

Bonneval reeled off three straight victories as the distance was

increased thereafter, taking out the G2 Sir Tristram S. stretched out to 2000 metres on Feb. 11 before adding the 2100-metre G3 Lowland S. and the G1 New Zealand Oaks when last seen on Mar. 18.

Sitting third last as the field began to spread out after the opening furlongs, Bonneval got as far as 20 lengths off the lead as last year's G1 Victorian Oaks winner Lasqueti Spirit (Aus) (Beneteau {Aus}) took up the lead and increased the tempo.

Shook up by Hugh Bowman rounding the bend and swinging five-wide, Bonneval had about five lengths to make up on Lasqueti Spirit and **Perfect Rhyme (Aus)** (Poet's Voice {GB}), but she made that look easy, charging down the middle of the track to win with the greatest of ease while nothing else emerged from behind.

"I hope she might be a weight for age horse and we will have to have a look at something for her in the spring maybe, it's a long way away," Baker told *Racenet.com.au*. "I was a bit worried about the ground but the horse is in terrific order, there are two tracks at Cambridge so the way of going wasn't an issue."

Bowman added, "It was a funny race, I had to make a few decisions today. I expected to be first four with Lasqueti Spirit out in front. When it was slow away I thought, 'what do I do here? Do I press on or do I just be patient? That's exactly what I did and this filly didn't let me down. I was humming on the turn, but I did have a good 150 metres to make up and I don't care what level you are at, that's hard to do, and she had it made up by the 100-metre mark so I could enjoy the ride with everyone

else for the last few strides."

Pedigree Notes...

Bonneval provided backto-back winners of this race for her sire Makfi, who was also responsible for Sofia Rosa (NZ) last year. Makfi formerly shuttled shuttled to Westbury Stud in New Zealand. Out of the winning Zabeel (NZ) mare Imposingly (Aus), Bonneval has shot to the head of her dam's four stakes-winning fillies with a Group 1 score.

She is a full-sister to the Group 3 winner Imposing Lass (NZ), and a half to fellow Group 3 winners Full Of Spirit (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}) and Lady Cumquat (Aus) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}). Appearing under the fourth dam is Broodmare of the Year Magnificent Style (Silver Hawk). Imposingly has a 2-year-old colt by Redwood (GB), a yearling colt by Camelot (Ire) and a filly foal by Adelaide (Ire).

SYDNEY CUP HALTED FOR STRICKEN ALMOONQITH

Tragedy marred the second weekend of The Championships at Randwick when the G1 Schweppes Sydney Cup had to be abandoned mid-race following a fatal injury to **Almoonqith** (Dynaformer) just after the post on the first circuit.

The Sheikh Hamdan-owned 7-year-old appeared to break a hindleg in running, pitching jockey James Doyle to the turf and bringing down **Who Shot Thebarman (NZ)** (Yamanin Vital {NZ}) and his rider Blake Shinn in the process. With Almoonqith immobile on the rail, Who Shot Thebarman galloping loose with the field and both jockeys still on the track, Racing NSW stewards decided to sound the void-race claxon as the rest of the runners were into the backstretch. Most of the jockeys reacted to the warning and pulled up their mounts, but four remained unaware that the race had been stopped and kept racing to the line.

Corey Brown, who was first past the post on Godolphin's **Polarisation (GB)** (Echo Of Light {GB}), voiced his frustration at the turn of events which stripped him of victory in the \$2-million contest.



"The pony rider I thought was yelling out there was a riderless horse but I already knew that as I heard Darren Flindell's call when he said one had broken down," he told *racing.com*. "I

kept looking up to see if there was something coming head on towards us because that is a different story but nothing like that has happened. Then I come back and they said it is a no race-how does that work?"

He added, "We could have gone around them. By the time I got to the incident we were 150m past the winning post, I'd pulled up to a trot by that stage."

Addressing the media after the race, chief steward Marc Van Gestel said, "The stewards were concerned as the field approached the 1600-metre mark in respect to the safety of the two riders: Blake Shinn on Who Shot Thebarman, and James Doyle on Almoongith."

"Having regard to the condition of Almoonqith, the stewards discussed with the official starter who was positioned near the 800m in respect to the running of the Sydney Cup, as to whether or not the race would continue," said Van Gestel. "The stewards became concerned that, particularly with Almoonqith remaining motionless on the track, with the potential to get up and run back towards the field, and in also assessing both James Doyle and Blake Shinn, who were still at that point situated on the track."

He concluded, "There was a message sent from about the 800m where unfortunately several of those riders failed to hear the call to abandon and stop the race. But we are satisfied in the circumstances that given the decision we made at the 1600m to call the race a no-race, that that is in fact the decision of the stewards."

Van Gestel added that a decision will be made as to whether the Sydney Cup can be re-run at a later date.

"He ran a little bit disappointingly in France on very soft ground, but he grew a nice bit in the winter so he might have been a bit weak then," his jockey said. "He won with his ears pricked and has improved nicely." Joseph O'Brien added, "We were expecting him to run well, as he'd been working nicely at home. He did a good bit of work last week and we thought he'd be placed, but we didn't think he'd win. He looks like a nice staying horse for this year and at the moment there is no reason why he shouldn't be considered a Derby horse. We'll see how he goes in the next trial."

Rekindling was bought for a bargain sum as a foal, especially considering that he is a full-brother to another Derby trial winner Golden Sword, who followed his exploits in the G3 Chester Vase with a second in the G1 Irish Derby. Sitara, who has also produced the dam of the dual stakes winner and GII Dance Smartly S. runner-up Julie's Love (GB) (Ad Valorem), is a product of Souk. Descendants of that former listed-placed Luca Cumani trainee include the G2 Lancashire Oaks winner and G1 Yorkshire Oaks runner-up Pongee (GB) (Barathea {Ire}), the G1 English, Irish and Yorkshire Oaks heroine Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), the G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Magical Romance (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) and the G1 Epsom Derby third Masterofthehorse (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Also linked to the G1 Irish Oaks heroine Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and the winner's talented G3 Dance Design S.-winning stablemate Somehow (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), Sitara also has a yearling colt by Australia (GB).

Robert Ng's stalwart Success Days (Ire) (Jeremy) is always a hard nut to crack in these type of events and defied a penalty when beating Fascinating Rock (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), with US Army Ranger back in fourth, in the G3 Royal Whip S. at The Curragh in August. "We're pleased with the way he's going at home and hopefully the ground description stays as it is, as it's well-documented at this stage he needs it soft to be at his best," trainer Ken Condon said of the five-year-old who was last seen finishing 11th in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown in September. "The races pick themselves for a horse like him. Hopefully he'll give a good account of himself on Sunday and then we'll go on to the [G3] Mooresbridge and the [G1 Tattersalls] Gold Cup."

Firing an early cannon across the bows of the opposition to Ballydoyle in 2017, Orderofthegarter dominated this Classic trial much as he had when winning by 11 lengths on his 3-year-old bow over a mile at Naas Mar. 26. Sent straight to the lead by Seamie Heffernan bidding to exploit racefitness, he had already applied enough pressure to crack much of his rivals by the home turn and began to open up soon after. Despite the progress of his slow-starting stablemate Taj Mahal, it was all about Orderofthegarter as some Guineas hopes were dashed in behind.

"He was impressive at Naas and has improved again," his rider said. "I never felt I was going to get beaten at any stage."

Aidan O'Brien is pointing at the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 27, with the Newmarket Classic on the first Saturday of that month firmly set for Churchill (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). "He's a very smart, progressive horse who was always mature and he's done well," he said. "He might be an Irish Guineas horse, while Taj Mahal might stay further. He took a long time to come to hand last year and ran very well there."

Kitty Kiernan, who was campaigned by Jim Bolger, beat none other than Lillie Langtry (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) on debut eight years ago before finishing runner-up to that rival in the G3 Coolmore Stud Fillies' Sprint S. She is out of Alstemeria, a full-sister to the G1 Phoenix S. and G1 Gran Criterium-winning sire Spartacus (Ire) and fellow sires Johan Cruyff (GB) and Meteor Shower (Ire) and a half to the dams of the Hong Kong champion stayer Blazing Speed (GB) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) and Hong Kong Derby hero and G1SP Super Satin (NZ) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). **Click for the Racing Post result. BAKER AND FORSMAN LAND G1 DOUBLE

In a close finish, the Murray Baker and Andrew Forsmantrained **Charmont (Aus)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) bested Mastercraftsman (Ire)'s daughters **Thee Auld Floozie (NZ)** and stablemate **Mime (NZ)** in the NZ\$200,000 G1 Fiber Fresh New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' S. Just 10 minutes later, their G1 New Zealand Oaks heroine Bonneval (NZ) (Makfi {GB}) gave the training duo their second Group 1 on the day, landing the G1 Australian Oaks at Royal Randwick on the second weekend of The Championships in Sydney.

"That's 20 Group 1 races in Australia now for Murray and his record in travelling horses to win big races is fantastic," Forsman, who was in Sydney just a week ago to saddle Jon Snow (NZ) (Iffraaj {GB}) to take the G1 Australian Derby, told *www.nzracing.co.nz.* "She [Charmont] really deserved that, she's been Group 1 placed before and she's competed well in blacktype races all of her career."

Glued to the rails in fourth as **Girl of My Dreams (NZ)** (Gold Centre {Aus}) showed the way early, Charmont drifted back to sit sixth with 600 metres remaining. Full of run and in dire need of a seam 250 metres out, the 16-1 shot was steered out to the center of the course under Matthew Cameron and began to let down, as favoured Thee Auld Floozie struck the front. Mime was also quickening up in fine style just to the outside of the Bob Emery homebred, who found herself sandwiched between the greys inside the final 50 metres. Her late rush proved superior however, defeating Thee Auld Floozie by a head, with Mime a similar distance back in third.

"I'm rapt for Bob [Emery] and I just wish he was here--he's at home a bit crook," continued Forsman. "He's a great owner and he's just let us do our own thing with the mare." **Cont. p15**

Charmont completed the trifecta in the 2015 G1 New Zealand Oaks and had been no worse than third in her four runs prior to the Breeders' S. Victorious in the Listed Breeders' S. at Tauherenikau going this trip Feb. 6, the bay was third in the G3 Grange Cuddle S. to the reopposing **Miss Wilson (Aus)** (Stratum {Aus}) and **Stylish Attack (NZ)** (Tavistock {NZ}) last out Mar. 18.

Forsman and Baker were mulling several options for their newest Group 1 winner and the China Horse Club's Mime, with the Apr. 29 G2 Travis S. a possibility.

"We'll see how they come through this race and then talk to the owners," Forsman concluded. "Mime might have been a bit dour second-up and she's possibly looking for 2000 metres now."

Pedigree Notes...

Charmont is the 17th top-flight winner for her late Coolmore shuttle sire High Chaparral (Ire), whose Whispered Secret (Aus) was successful in the Listed Fernhill H. at Royal Randwick Saturday. Charmont's dam Martique, a daughter of New Zealand highweight Champagne (NZ) (Zabeeel {NZ}), who struck twice at the Group 1 level and ran second in the G1 Melbourne Cup, scored the biggest win of her career in the 1350-metre Listed Glenlogan Park S. at Doomben in 2004. Charmont is her fifth foal, third winner of four runners and lone stakes winner. Champagne is a full-sister to fellow New Zealand highweight and G1 New Zealand Derby winner St Reims (NZ). Fittingly, Charmont shares her third dam, L'Quiz (L'Enjoleur), with Bonneval.

SOUL SEARCHING FOR CLASSIC GLORY AT HANSHIN

In 1939, the first ever running of the G1 Oka Sho was won by Soul Lady and the teams from Shadai and Juddmonte will be hoping that **Soul Stirring (Jpn)** (Frankel {GB}) can reawaken that theme when she bids to become the first Classic winner for her sire in today's mile contest.

"She has got stronger since her debut, and thankfully I've had nothing to worry about with her," said trainer Kazuo Fujisawa of the 2016 Japanese champion juvenile filly. "She's not a horse that posts fast times in training, but it's there to see in her races. She's more relaxed now, different than what she was for the Hanshin Juvenile Fillies. There's certainly a good feeling about her."

While the daughter of multiple Group 1 winner Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) was her illustrious sire's first winner at the highest level, she is not the only Frankel filly in the field, as among the 17 runners is 'TDN Rising Star' **Mi Suerte (Jpn)**, a dual winner last year who finished fourth in the G1 Asahi Hai Futurity S. for trainer Yasutoshi Ikee in December. **Cont. p16**

Soul Stirring, who won the G3 Tulip Sho on Mar. 4, has the help of the globetrotting Christopher Lemaire, who also rode her dam to victory in the G1 Prix de Diane, while Mi Suerte will be partnered by Yuga Kawada.

It's not all about the Frankel fillies, however, as **Lys Gracieux** (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}), the mount of recent G1 Osaka Hai-winning jockey Yutaka Take, will be looking to improve on her third-place finish to Soul Stirring in the Tulip Sho. The pair was split that day by **Miss Panthere (Jpn)** (Daiwa Major {Jpn}) who also lines up today for trainer Mitsugu Kon. He said of his contender, "I feel she's developed more and has more strength. Her last race came after a spell and the jockey also wasn't sure what to expect. As it was, she raced well, and this time we're up against the winner of that race again. I think if she can use her speed once more, and try to match the other filly's performance, that's going to be the key."

Mirco Demuro's mount **Admire Miyabi (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) took out the G3 Daily Hai Queen Cup on her most recent start in February--her third consecutive win from just four starts. Trainer Yasuo Tomomichi gave her a short break after that effort and has been pleased with his charge since her return. "She takes a little time to hit full throttle, but she was certainly suited to the Tokyo track last time," he noted. "Everything's been fine since her return, and while you could think of her racing better over a longer distance, she's got results over a mile."

No Group 1 race in Japan is complete without a runner in the field by the mighty Deep Impact (Jpn), but the champion sire has been reduced to just one representative in **Kawakita Enka (Jpn)** since the scratching of Elfin S. winner **Salonika (Jpn)**. Kawakita Enka again upholds the Tulip Sho form, having finished fifth in that race, but she has added to her winning tally since then with victory in Hanshin's Kunshiran Sho over 1800 metres on Mar. 25.


