TRIO OF MILLION-DOLLAR BABIES SET OBS APRIL ALIGHT

Going into the third session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's April Sale of 2-Year-Olds-in-Training Sale, the auction had produced a total of two million-dollar sales in its entire history. That number was doubled within minutes Thursday as a filly by More Than Ready (hip 778) brought an even \$1 million from Alessandro Marconi on behalf of a Middle Eastern client and, before the buzz had died down in the sales pavilion, a colt by Tiznow (hip 793) sold for an all-time OBS record \$2.45 million to Coolmore's M.V. Magnier. Both youngsters shared the under-tack show's furlong bullet time of :9 3/5. A Union Rags colt (hip 899) provided the exclamation point on the day when selling for \$1 million as the fifth-last horse through the ring.

"Certainly the day exceeded our expectations," said OBS Director of Sales Tod Wojciechowski. "There was obviously a lot of talk on the grounds about the Tiznow colt, but he went beyond, probably the consignor's expectations, and ours as well. It was an exciting day, with not just him, but two million-dollar horses along with him."

ROYAL ASCOT A POSSIBILITY FOR 'PATRIOT'

WinStar Farm's **American Patriot** (War Front), who came running late to post a 10-1 upset in the GI Maker's 46 Mile S. at Keeneland Apr. 14, has been given an entry for the G1 Queen Anne S., the traditional opening race of the Royal Ascot meeting that is scheduled this year for Tuesday, June 20. Trainer Todd Pletcher is reported to be "seriously considering" a start in the one-mile event, famously won by America's Tepin (Bernstein) in 2016. "The horse is in great form and came out of his win at Keeneland really, really well," Pletcher told Ascot officials. "We have been very pleased with the winter and spring he has had and it seems he is in career-best form at the moment. I feel American Patriot has made a step forward this year. He was a bit unlucky last year in the [GI] Secretariat S. and has come on well over the winter. He has matured into a big, strong beautiful horse. He has a nice turn of foot and a great disposition to go along with it, so we feel he is a good candidate to take a look at travelling over to England." **Cont. p12**

The previous OBS record was set at April in 2015 when a filly by Tapit brought \$1.9 million. A colt by Broken Vow became the auction's second seven-figure sale when bringing \$1.2 million in 2016.

The million-dollar sales are a continuation of the evolution of the April market, which has seen its average and gross explode over much of the last decade.

"As someone told me today, this isn't your father's April sale anymore," Wojciechowski said. "We've seen this evolution of the April sale where consignors are comfortable bringing any type of horse here and buyers are comfortable buying those type of horses here. We have the high-end buyers, we have the mid-range buyers. There is a comfort level there knowing that stock like that is here. Each year, it just keeps building on itself."

Through three of four sessions of the April sale, 521 head have grossed \$47,382,700. The cumulative average is \$90,946--up 18.2% from a year ago, while the median is up 4.4% to \$47,000. With 108 horses reported not sold, the cumulative buy-back rate is 17.3%.

For the session, OBS sold 171 horses for \$17,397,500. The average jumped 19.3% to \$101,740 and the median rose 3.1% to \$50,000. Thursday's buy-back rate was a sparkling 13.2%.

In addition to the strength at the top of the market, this week's April sale has also featured a robust middle market, something which has been lethargic at recent auctions. The strength of the middle market was a trend Wojciechowski saw developing during OBS's record-setting March sale.

"I think there were signs of that in March," he commented. "I think that gets lost a little bit. There actually was some strength for middle-market horses and it's just carried through to April."

Brad Grady, who sold the record-setting Tiznow colt through the Bobby Dodd consignment, agreed there was strength throughout the market.

"I think the top end of the market hasn't softened any," said Grady. "If anything, I think it's gotten stouter with more competition. I've seen more of a middle market for these horses than we've seen in years past, last year especially. Those top-end horses are always going to command the most because the wealthy play in that wheel house."

Bloodstock agent Mike Recio saw plenty of positive trends in the market.

"I think there is depth to the market," Recio said. "I think if you're a middle-market guy you should come. There is so much variety, there is 1200 horses. There are still a lot of good horses left. We're still pounding the pavement."



Grady Over the ‘Moon’ After Record-Breaking Sale

Texas businessman and pinhooker **Brad Grady** of Grand Oaks set a new OBS record and new personal best when selling a son of Tiznow for \$2.45 million halfway through Thursday’s session of the April sale. After a lengthy round of bidding, it was John Moynihan who came out on top on behalf of Coolmore’s M.V. Magnier for **hip 793**, who breezed in a bullet :9 3/5.

“He is a beautiful horse and moved beautifully as well,” said Moynihan, who did his bidding on the phone from the OBS office. “He’s a great big horse. Any horse that looks like that and can move that fast, we have to take a chance on. I don’t want to have to run against him. He’s that good I think. We just hope he materializes into what we think he can be.”

Grady was still all smiles outside of consignor and Grand Oaks farm manager Bobby Dodd’s Barn 10 shortly after the sale.

“We were expecting that he would bring quite a bit of money, but it’s hard to expect anything like that,” the 37-year-old remarked.

Bred by WinStar Farm, which stands top sire Tiznow, hip 793 is out of Moonbow (Distorted Humor), a daughter of MSW Storm Beauty (Storm Cat). Brady, who pinhooks about 30 to 40 horses a year, purchased the hulking bay colt for just \$125,000 at Keeneland September last term.

“He’s a nice horse, big hip, pretty horse,” Grady remarked. “He had a lot of leg and looked like he would cover a lot of ground. We didn’t know how fast he would be. We knew he would work good and gallop out good,

but with that two-turn pedigree, it is hard to get them to go that fast. I’ve never seen one [built] like that go :9 3/5. **Cont. p7**

He continued, "I guess everyone [was surprised] and that is why he brought the money he did. When they are built like that, they aren't supposed to go that fast."

Dodd, who signed the ticket on Grady's behalf at Keeneland, echoed similar sentiments.

"He was just a pretty, strong horse and he had pedigree. We just liked him," the horseman offered. "I think the :9 3/5 was good, but the gallop-out was unbelievable. His fractions were off the charts. I had several people told me he is like the next Arrogate (Unbridled's Song). We'll see how that goes."

Grady scored his first pinhooking success five years ago with Stonestreet's MSW Kauai Katie (Malibu Moon), a \$90,000 KEESEP buy turned \$490,000 Fasig-Tipton Florida 2-year-old. The Grand Oaks team also had a big score at OBS March this year, selling a **Union Rags colt** they purchased for \$135,000 at Keeneland September to Dennis O'Neill for \$950,000 after a :10 flat breeze.

Grady also campaigns GII Louisiana Derby hero and GI Kentucky Derby contender **Girvin** (Tale of Ekati), a \$130,000 FTKOCT buy that Grady kept after he missed the 2-year-old sales. Trainer Joe Sharp moved Girvin to Lexington to swim him due to a quarter crack.

"He is swimming, but he is fine," Grady said. "He has had a quarter crack since [winning] the [GII] Risen Star [S. Feb. 25], but he is doing great and is still on track [for the Derby]."

More Than Ready Filly Heads to Europe

Bloodstock agent Alessandro Marconi was extended to an even \$1 million to secure a daughter of More Than Ready on behalf of a Middle Eastern client.

"She is quality all over, she was the only horse in the sale you could say," Marconi said after signing the ticket out back. "She was perfect all over. We couldn't see another horse after watching her. She is so light on the ground. She is really quality all over."

The filly, catalogued as **hip 778**, is out of 2002 GII Schuylerville runner-up Miss Mary Apples (Clever Trick) and is a half to graded stakes placed Dr. Diamonds Prize (Pure Prize) and multiple stakes winner Miss Red Delicious (Empire Maker). **Cont. p8**

Shortly after the juvenile went through the sales ring at OBS, Miss Red Delicious' 2-year-old filly Nootka Sound (Lonhro {Aus}) romped to a debut win at Keeneland.

The More Than Ready filly was one of two juveniles to work a furlong in :9 3/5 during Thursday's session of the under-tack preview.

"When we saw her breeze, we were looking at each other like this is something," Marconi said. "We've been here for the whole week, so we've been checking all the horses and all the breezes, but since we saw her out of the box and out on the track, we were sure she was the real deal."

Of the filly's new owner, Marconi said, "It was for a Middle East client who is also a breeder and trainer. She is the top of the top, so we were expecting to pay that." The filly will head to Europe before a final decision on her future will be made.


"She'll go to England first and then we'll make a plan," Marconi said of plans for the dark bay filly. "I think she can go everywhere because she's so light going over the ground. And she breezed that quickly and so easily and after the breeze, she didn't even look like she had done anything. She was so easy on the ground and so ready for that."

The filly was consigned by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables on behalf of Joe Minor's **JSM Equine**, which purchased her for \$390,000 at last year's Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

Dunne was quick to praise Minor for the astute pinhooking score.

"All the credit has to go to Joe Minor," Dunne said. "He came to Keeneland and he asked Justin [Casse] and I what was left for the day. When she walked in the back walking ring, he said he wasn't leaving without her. Justin and I would never have paid that for her, but Joe was bound and determined to get her."

Dunne continued, “Olin Gentry’s group came in and took a piece with him. It’s their first time pinhooking, so it’s very exciting for them.”

The More Than Ready filly became the third million-dollar sale in the history of the April sale, but Dunne admitted he had some anxious moments prior to the sale.

“We were very confident a week ago, and we might have been three days ago, but we were fairly nervous today,” he said. “It’s a new face that bought her. We weren’t sure that the people that were on her were the people that you would normally expect to buy a \$1-million filly. But I guess that’s a testament to the market more than anything else that she was able to come up here and do that without the usual faces.”

The filly had originally been targeted for the OBS March sale, but an illness in February caused connections to delay her ring appearance.

“We wanted to come to March,” Dunne said. “But it doesn’t matter where you take one like her, they are going to find her. Bobby [Dodd]’s [\$2.45 million] colt was the same thing. The really good horses, you can sell them in the middle of 75 and they’d find them.” @JessMartiniTDN

Million-Dollar Union Rags Another ‘Sharp’ Pinhook

In an April sale dotted with big pinhooking scores, a colt by Union Rags (hip 899), purchased by Liz Crow and Paul Sharp for \$60,000 as a KEESEP yearling, became the latest home run when selling to trainer Jeff Mullins for \$1 million late in Thursday’s session. Mullins was bidding on behalf of Red Barons Barn and Rancho Temescal.

“He’s just a big, nice colt,” offered Mullins, who teamed up with Red Barons Barn to win Keeneland’s GII Dixiana Elkhorn S. last Saturday with Itsinthepost (Fr) (American Post {GB}). “He looks like the kind that might get you to the first weekend in May. He breezed nice [:10.1] and was just a nice individual.”

Bred in Kentucky by Greg Goodman’s Mt. Brilliant Farm, the bay colt is out of the A.P. Indy mare Poco Mas and is a half-brother to Argentinian Group 2 winner and Group 1-placed Carinosa (Tiznow). His second dam is SW and GISP Adel (Strawberry Road {Aus}), who produced Canadian champion Interpol (English Channel).

An ecstatic Crow and Sharp, who consigned the colt, were the first to congratulate Mullins after the hammer fell.

“Paul and I purchased him from Lane’s End out of Book 3 at Keeneland September,” Crow said. “He was a May foal and had a lot of class to him. He was a really intelligent horse. We thought he would fill into his frame.”

GI Belmont S. winner Union Rags’ first foals are 3-year-olds this year, including GI Kentucky Derby contender Patch and early GI Kentucky Oaks favorite Paradise Woods, both ‘TDN Rising Stars.’ The Lane’s End stallion was second on the 2016 leading freshman sires list by earnings and first by Grade I winners thanks to the exploits of Grade I-winning fillies Dancing Rags and Union Strike, the latter of which was purchased for \$375,000 at last year’s OBS April sale. Hip 899 marked the first seven-figure sale for the young sire, who currently stands for \$50,000.

“Union Rags was another factor,” commented Crow. “We really believed in Union Rags as a sire and thought he would pop, but sometimes people are hesitant to buy from the second crop of a sire like that. Between the Union Rags and the May foal, we thought he would fill out and grow up.”

The bloodstock agent continued, “I thought at the time that \$60,000 was about what we wanted to pay for the horse. I actually wrote in my catalogue \$60,000 was what I wanted to go to and that’s exactly what he fell to. He was just classy and intelligent from the start. He was well-conformed and a beautiful colt.”

The Union Rags colt was part of a new pinhooking partnership put together by Crow and Sharp.

“Paul and I started a pinhooking venture last year,” Crow explained. “We have 11 guys in on the venture and we bought nine horses. We sold two for a profit in March. This was our third horse through the ring. We spent \$600,000 total on all of them. So we’re ahead of the game right now and we’re thrilled about it. We have six more to sell. One sells tomorrow, a Dialed In colt (hip 1145) with Paul, and then we have three in [Fasig-Tiptn] Maryland and two in [OBS] June.” --@CDeBernardis

Colonel John an Early Highlight

A filly by Colonel John led early returns at the OBS April sale Thursday when selling for \$425,000 to Gatewood Bell's Cromwell Bloodstock. Bell had already left town, so Mark Recio handled the bidding.

"Gatewood loved her and obviously she was a standout," Recio said. "She has a pretty good physical and a great work. She's got everything, so we'll see how things shake out."

Out of stakes winner Joharmony (Johar), the bay filly ([hip 616](#)) worked a furlong in :10 1/5. Bred by Gary Chervenell, the juvenile RNA'd for \$24,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November sale. She was consigned by Stephens Thoroughbreds.

"Colonel Johns have had success on the grass, but she doesn't look like she'll be limited by anything," Recio said of the filly's possible future. "I know it's a Johar mare, but you try the dirt first and see what happens. I'm sure Gatewood will send her to a great trainer and we'll see from there."

Of the filly's final price tag, Recio said, "I swung personally on the Munnings filly ([hip 345](#)) yesterday that David Ingordo bought for \$425,000 and I thought that was a lot, too. I just think over these last three days, we've seen that the good ones are going for a lot, more than you can imagine." [@JessMartiniTDN](#)

Into Mischief Colt Another Score for Mejia

Jaime Mejia's Thoroughbred Champions Training Center added another impressive pinhooking score to its resume when a colt by Into Mischief sold for \$400,000 to Frank Fletcher Racing Operations. Mejia purchased the youngster for \$11,000 at last year's Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"I am very happy that the horse is in the best possible hands with Bob Baffert," Mejia said through an interpreter after the sale.

[Hip 848](#) is out of Oh So Nice (Smart Strike), a half-sister to stakes winner Dynamic Cat (Dynaformer), the dam of graded stakes winner Dynamic Holiday (Harlan's Holiday) and multiple graded stakes placed Appealing Cat (Successful Appeal). He worked a quarter-mile :20 3/5.

Asked what he liked about the youngster as a yearling, Mejia said, "I knew he was a champion. I thought we would have to pay a little more to get him."

Mejia, a native of Columbia, added the April foal has matured and filled out since last fall.

"He is a big horse and he has grown up a lot," Mejia said. "The horse didn't have the attitude, the temperament, that he has now. He was an April foal and it helped that he has had the opportunity to grow up."

Of Thursday's final price, Mejia said, "I expected much more. I always expect more. This was the best colt that I've had since I've been here in the United States."

Two years ago, Thoroughbred Champions Training Center equaled a then OBS June record when selling another son of Into Mischief for \$575,000. That juvenile, also purchased by Frank Fletcher, was another \$11,000 Keeneland September graduate.

Mejia was understandably bullish on OBS. Asked what he thought of the sales venue, he said, "I love it." [@JessMartiniTDN](#)

Soldat Filly Out Sells Expectations

A filly from the first crop of Soldat, a son of War Front who scored graded stakes victories on both dirt and turf, surprised everyone, including her own connections, when dropping the hammer at \$300,000. Trainer Chad Brown signed the winning ticket on behalf of longtime client Klaravich Stable.

"That was particularly rewarding," said Matt Lyons, Vice President of [Woodford Thoroughbreds](#), which bred and consigned [hip 724](#) and stands her young sire. "That was a homebred filly. We own the stallion, so that was a huge result for us. He stands for \$5,000 and his first crop are 2-year-olds, but they've come here and worked really well. Good judges are on them. That was a nice bidding duel between Mark Casse and Chad Brown."

A :10 2/5 breezer, the Florida-bred filly is out of Lyrique (Rock Hard Ten), who John and Susan Sykes' Woodford Thoroughbreds purchased for \$25,000 carrying a foal by Artie Schiller at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton February sale. They bred Lyrique back to their stallion Crown of Thorns and the resulting foal, a colt named [Unlockthepotential](#), sold to the Brown and Klaravich team for \$220,000 at last year's April sale. **Cont. p11**

“The plan all along was to come here,” Lyons commented. “Her half-brother by Crown of Thorns sold here for \$220,000 last year, so we said we are going to take the sister and try to do the same thing.”

The \$300,00 price tag on the May 17 foal more than doubled the previous highest price brought by an offspring of Soldat when **Hip 111** sold for \$120,000 during the opening session of the April sale.

“Obviously people realize how good a runner Soldat was himself on turf and dirt,” Lyons remarked. “It looks like the babies are going to be versatile too.” --@CDeBernardis

DERBY/OAKS UPDATE--THURSDAY

Intermittent rain showers left the Churchill Downs main track on the wet side, but by the time the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Kentucky Oaks hopefuls emerged in their special window from 8:30 to 8:45, the track had been harrowed and any standing water had seeped into the surface.

- The Kelly Breen-trained Oaks contender **Miss Sky Warrior** (First Samurai) was the only one of the big-race probables to put in a timed breeze Thursday morning, breezing a half-mile in a fairly leisurely :49.20 with Paco Lopez at the controls. Miss Sky Warrior was timed in splits of :12.40, :24.80 and :36.80 with a five-furlong gallop-out time of 1:02.40.

"The work went well," Breen said. "It was just maintenance. We already have our mile and eighth and some of those other guys don't. We have eight days to go. She will walk [Friday]. All we have to do is just stay steady."

The Arlene London homebred was originally penciled in to work during the Derby/Oaks session, but when the clouds began to roll in, Breen called an audible and sent the four-time graded winner to the track about 90 minutes earlier.

"When she got to the seven-eighths pole, I could hear the rain hitting the tents in the turn from the grandstand," Breen said. "Then, when she started her work, the rain stopped."

Since finishing a close fourth on debut to future GISW Yellow Agate (Gemologist), Miss Sky Warrior has put together a five-race winning streak, including a 13-length romp in the GII Gazelle S. at Aqueduct Apr. 8.

- One day after working six furlongs in 1:13, Coffeepot Stables' **Farrell** (Malibu Moon) walked the shedrow for trainer Wayne Catalano, who reported his filly was none the worse for the work. "She cleaned the feed tub ... licked it clean," Catalano said. "She is fine this morning."

- In California, '**TDN Rising Star**' **Paradise Woods** (Union Rags) turned in her final serious move ahead of next Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks, clocking a bullet 1:12.40 for six furlongs (**XBTV video**). She was partnered in her work by regular rider Flavien Prat, and trainer Richard Mandella--yet to win the Oaks--was duly thrilled with what he saw. "Beautiful," is how the conditioner summed up the breeze. "[Thursday] was her serious work. She galloped out [seven furlongs] in [one minute] 25 and change. It looked like a morning gallop. I'm pretty excited. She'll gallop and school at Churchill." Paradise Woods leaves for Kentucky May 1. "She's a young filly who's still learning. She's got speed and will probably be on the lead in the race. We're not going to fight her."

The Queen Anne has attracted 33 entries, including **Miss Temple City** (Temple City), who could make the trip over for a third straight season, having finished fourth in the G1 Coronation S. two years ago before filling the same spot in the G2 Duke of Cambridge S. last June.

CHRB DEBATES SPLIT SANTA ANITA MEETS

The California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) tends to operate a little more closely to the racetracks it oversees than regulatory bodies do in other states. In fact, the CHRB generally schedules its monthly morning meetings at tracks to coincide with live afternoon racing programs held later the same day, and it is not

uncommon for the host track to be on the meeting's agenda to give an overview of its business initiatives.

So when this month's host track, Santa Anita Park, earlier this week announced the cancellation of its Apr. 27 card because of insufficient entries, it established the potential for an uncomfortable (but perhaps necessary) discussion about the horse population and the short- and long-term prospects of field sizes on the southern California circuit.

Surprisingly though, the calling-off of the races only got mentioned peripherally when the CHRB convened at Santa Anita on Thursday. The topic barely surfaced when commissioner Madeline Auerbach followed up a recitation of meet-end statistics and future marketing plans by Santa Anita executives by asking several pointed questions about the way the track split up its Dec. 26-July 4 license into two "meets" even though there was not much of a gap (four days) on the actual calendar.

Auerbach wanted an explanation as to why certain aspects of Santa Anita's operation, like race-entry preferences and jockey and trainer standings, were reset after the winter/spring meet closed Apr. 9, while others, like single-ticket jackpot pari-mutuel carryovers and the track's condition books, were not started anew when racing resumed Apr. 14 for the spring/summer meet.

"I struggle with the way it was handled," Auerbach said. "I've heard everything talked about but the racing side, and my concern is the racing side.

"All of the horses that were entered, for the 'second part' of the meet, went back to a 'zero date.' It was kind of an arbitrary, artificial way to [reset the top jockey and trainer standings]," Auerbach continued. "But what in effect you did to the horsemen, in my view, was not fair to the horsemen. Because you had a lot races that were written based on 3-year-old races [and then] very early on you moved to '3-and-up.' So you had

cases where you had 4-year-olds ... coming back that were excluded from a race [and] maybe you had a 3-year-old that maybe ran a couple weeks ago that got in. So it seemed kind of an arbitrary thing to do roll back the dates for the horsemen to enter horses.

She continued, "The other thing that seemed unusual is that you ended a meet in the middle of a condition book. That didn't make any sense. If you really had two [separate] meets going, then the end of the book is the end of the meet, and then you have a new book for the next meet ... it just seemed strange. In some respects it was like a second meet, and in other respects it wasn't ... I think you've confused the horsemen, we've created some unhappiness, and we're struggling in terms of inventory management and getting these horses to run."

Joe Morris, Santa Anita's senior vice president, acknowledged Auerbach's concerns and agreed that the track is going through a figuring-out process. The entire circuit, he said, is still feeling the effects of Hollywood Park's closure in 2013.

"This is the first time since Hollywood's gone that there wasn't more of a break," Morris said. "Technically, it is one license [Dec. 26-July 4], so that's more on the mandatory payout side of it. We just felt it was best to keep that going; [bettors] had invested their money in that carryover, and we just didn't see a reason to do a mandatory payout."

As for the meet standings, Morris said, "We've got 80 years of history here. So part of it on resetting stats for jockeys and trainers was to keep that 80 years of history."

Regarding racing office preferences, Morris said, "On the zero dates with the horsemen, our thought was it gave everybody the same chance. We reset it to zero and everybody comes into the new [meet] with the same chance, and we have been a little short on entries, there's no denying that ... So giving everybody the same chance I don't think is shutting anybody out. The horses that are getting in are running."

Auerbach voiced disagreement, but did not belabor her point: "It did shut people out, but that's something to consider."

Morris continued: "We're discussing all of what you just said internally, because it wasn't as smooth as it could have been. There's no arguing that side of it ... that's something we'll look at. Maybe we'll just run the thing straight through [next year] ... As we kind of re-engineer ourselves here with the way our industry is, we're looking at many things going forward on the racing side."

Horsemen's representatives were encouraged to chime in, but none seemed overly eager to take a strong stand on the splitting of race meets.

Greg Avioli, president and chief executive officer the Thoroughbred Owners of California, said, "We were aware that this was happening, yes. We deferred to their judgment."

Alan Balch, executive director of the California Thoroughbred Trainers, said, "I agree with what Mr. Avioli said. We deferred to their judgment." --@thorntontd



IAN WILLIAMS: BRITAIN'S MOST TRAVELED TRAINER

Should anyone fancy starting up a new racecourse in Britain, one guarantee is that Ian Williams will have runners there on the opening day.

One of Britain's most successful dual-code trainers is justifiably proud of what he understands to be the unique achievement of saddling a winner at each of the country's Flat and jumps tracks, and it seems to have spawned into a minor obsession.

"I had a feeling, so I sat down with the National Trainers' Federation diary one day and started ticking of the racecourses, and I realised I only had a couple left to go," he explained. "I don't think there's anybody else and I can't think of anybody who has done it going back over the years, more so then when you were either Flat or National Hunt. Not many people would want to travel all ends of the bloody country either, but we're so well-placed to do that, it makes it a little bit easier for us than others."

"The last initially was Thirsk--it's a very nice course but not a great trip for us," he added. "It took a while before eventually everything clicked and Cruise Tothelimit (Ire) won there in 2014.

"Then, of course, they reopened Chelmsford and stuck an all-weather track at Newcastle, it started the game again but we did that too luckily."

MONARCH SET TO REIGN

Sandown plays host to Friday's G3 bet365 Classic Trial, and the early pointer to Epsom's June 3 G1 Investec Derby contains a trio of contenders by Frankel (GB) among a field of five declarations. The 10-furlong heat is headed by John Gosden trainee **Monarchs Glen (GB)** (Frankel {GB}), who caused a stir when annexing an 11-panel handicap at Kempton on seasonal return on Apr. 12 and will go postward as the likely favourite. "Monarchs Glen won very nicely at Kempton, but he is not in the Derby," said Gosden, who holds the record of seven renewals. "He is strong-headed, but is a lovely horse and Sandown should suit him. For the first run of the year they are full of it, but he has had a run and settled down. He showed a good turn of foot as they passed the junction there and it was a bit of a surprise to us."

Williams has been at Dominion Stables at Alvechurch near Birmingham, a modern and self-contained premises developed with the businessman Pat Kelly, for the vast majority of his 21 years with a licence. Not a famous training centre but certainly a geographical one, it allows the net to be spread far and wide.

His string of 80 is currently split around 50-50, with some crossover. Even without the likes of the injured Ballyalton (Ire) (Pierre {GB}), who provided a first Cheltenham Festival victory, he will be close to a half-century of winners during the National Hunt campaign and could reach around that figure again if the Flat year goes well.

“Jumping-wise it has been one of our best, numerically as well as prize-money,” he said. “There has been a nice uplift in quality and reliability of performance has been good. The horses have been healthy for a couple of years, which has helped enormously. We learned our lesson from a bad series of infections we had five or six years ago, we changed our procedures and our general management--that’s certainly been of huge benefit.”

If not at Cheltenham, Williams’s all-purpose team can deliver some exciting payoffs. **Munsef (GB)** (Zafonic) progressed from a Chester claimer on his stable debut to finishing 12th in the G1 Melbourne Cup just over four months later while sprinter **Sir Maximilian (Ire)** (Royal Applause {GB}) swiped valuable prizes at the 2015 and 2016 Dubai Carnivals.

“It makes for a good business model,” said Williams, who was tutored by National Hunt luminaries Jenny Pitman and Martin Pipe as well as Frenchman Francois Doumen, perhaps the ultimate jack of all trades. “My heart is really in the jump racing but we set up pretty good figures on the Flat. We don’t aim for speedy 2-year-old types but I think we do well with the 3-year-olds and upwards.”

“Work mornings can be interesting,” he noted. “They’re pretty much mixed and matched, sometimes they will work with each other, depending on how much pace or stamina we want to do. Levels of work and the amount of work for the jumpers is far more than for the Flat horses but the basics are the same. Healthy, well-fed and well-exercised horses should be capable of doing their job if they’re placed in the right races.”

A trace of Williams’s background betrays what seems to be a methodical approach to his business. His father Billy trained the useful chaser Tom’s Little Owl but his son first spent a year studying accountancy (“I found it a little tedious”) before managing a William Hill betting shop in Devon.

“It was never my intention to train but I fell into it after working as assistant for Jenny Pitman,” he said. “I thought I’d be very privileged to have the chance to train a dozen horses at some stage, but it grew into something bigger. I suppose if had my time again I’d probably be a horse racing accountant, even though I’m not sure there’s a lot more money in that than training racehorses. It would probably have been more sensible, but who wants to be sensible.”

From Fakenham to Ffos Las and Kelso to Kempton, Williams is sure to continue churning out the winners if the opportunity is there. Chester’s May meeting, though, should be the most useful gauge of his smartest Flat crop for 2017.

“**Speedo Boy (Fr)** (Vision D’Etat {Fr}) has done very well, he won the first listed race of the season in France and will probably go for the mile-and-a-quarter Dee S.,” he revealed.

“**Duke Of Clarence (Ire)** (Verglas {Ire}) is a horse we have for Dr Marwan Koukash and we’ve been preparing him for the Chester Cup, a race we won a few years ago with Bulwark (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). Sir Maximilian ran well this winter in Dubai, even though he wasn’t able to win, and it’s probably the plan to have him go to Chester for the conditions event that he won last year. He’s been great but he’s fragile and needs to be looked after.”

He continued, “We have some nice handicappers--**Banditry (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}) has won three on the Flat and **London Prize (GB)** (Teofilo {Ire}) was looking progressive on the Flat before he went hurdling and there should be no reason why he shouldn’t continue to improve.

“Glorious Goodwood winner **Shady McCoy** (English Channel) was well below par on his reappearance but has come back in good form and will step up on his performance I’m sure,” Williams added. “There’s a lot to look forward to on the Flat.”

Gosden also saddles Frankel's first winner **Cunco (Ire)**, whose busy juvenile campaign concluded with a seventh in the Oct. 30 G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud last time. "Cunco is a whole lot calmer now," his trainer added. "When we ran him in France he ran really well. I am happy with him, he is a real stayer and a mile-and-a-half will be his trip. He is settling a lot better at home."

The Frankel triumvirate also includes the Oct. 8 G3 Prix de Conde victor **Frankuus (Ire)**, who finished one spot behind Cunco at Saint-Cloud. "He was entered at Epsom [for the Derby Trial] on Wednesday and it was just a toss of the coin which race to go for," revealed trainer Mark Johnston. "He's a big, rangy horse and there hasn't been much change physically. He was not a big yearling, but grew as a 2-year-old and everything has gone to plan over the winter. Although there is speed on the dam's side, he has already won over nine furlongs and looks more like a middle-distance type to me."

Further opposition is provided by David Simcock trainee **Fierce Impact (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who comes back off a once-out maiden win at Yarmouth in October. "He is a bit of an unknown quantity and won his maiden well last year, but he is a lazy work horse and is a difficult horse to gauge at home," explained Simcock. "He surprised us when he won his maiden and there is no set plan for him. We just want to see where we are with him."

The quintet is completed by **Intern (Ire)** (Rip Van Winkle {Ire}), who has moved to Ralph Beckett since winning a July 14 Leopardstown maiden and running third in Tipperary's Aug. 16 Listed Canford Cliffs S. for David Wachman. "Intern's been in the yard since September and has had a good winter," revealed jockey Fran Berry. "He's training very well and we're pleased with how he's come along. He has shown us plenty and is

John Gosden has registered a solitary success in Sandown's G2 bet365 Mile, partying with Handsome Ridge (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) in 1999, and the Newmarket conditioner's skills will be tested to the limit as he brings back **Tashweeq (Ire)** (Big Bad Bob {Ire}) after a near 18-month absence in Friday's open renewal. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's 2015 Listed Flying Scotsman S. winner ran fourth in that year's G1 Dewhurst, but has not been since suffering injury when sixth in Saint-Cloud's G1 Criterium International at the end of that freshman campaign. "Tashweeq ran in France and got a stress fracture to his shin, and it took a long time to heal as the blood supply there is not readily the same," Gosden explained. "He went back to Shadwell and, rather than push him back for last year, he has had a year off and has benefitted from it. He has come back fine and is in very good order."

The bay's fitness will be fully tested by ring-sharp veteran **Sovereign Debt (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}), who has maintained his consistency since joining Ruth Carr from the recently retired David Nicholls. The 8-year-old grey hit the board for his new yard in Kempton's Apr. 1 Listed Magnolia S. and enjoyed a bumper payday in Lingfield's Apr. 14 All-Weather Championships Mile last time. "He came out of the Lingfield race really well," said Carr. "It is a competitive race, which you expect for a Group 2, but he has every reason to be there and, hopefully, with a big shout. He deserved that win last time, it was a big payday and that box is ticked off so maybe that takes a

bit of pressure off."

Charlie Hills's G3 Prix du Pin victor **Jallota (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) has been resurgent since stepping back out of handicap company last year and returns to action coming off a second in Milan's Sept. 25 G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua and a third in the Oct. 7 G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket. "He had his first holiday ever over the winter, he's come back fresh and his work has been nice," revealed Hills. "We are trying him over a mile first time out and, while there is a question mark over the trip, it is his first time at Sandown [in 40 starts]. I would like to think he will get it and, if he doesn't, there are plenty of nice races over seven furlongs. It would be nice if he got the mile as it gives us more options."

Aidan O'Brien trainee **Cougar Mountain (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) has been on a globetrotting mission since annexing September's G2 Joel S. at Newmarket, for which he carries a three-pound impost here, and running fifth in the G2 Challenge S. back there. He returns to European action off a Feb. 24 conditions second behind Sovereign Debt in Doha and an eighth in Meydan's Mar. 25 G1 Dubai Turf.

"They enjoyed a day out at Chelmsford last week and it sharpened them up going down to that racecourse doing a bit of work. It was just nice bridle work in a pair, but it does them good mentally."

Aidan O'Brien has yet to taste success in this contest and is represented by last term's G1 Belmont Derby Invitational winner **Deauville (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who ran seventh in the Meydan's Mar. 25 G1 Dubai Turf last time. Sir Michael Stoute is the contest's winning-most trainer, with a haul of seven, and he sends forth G1 Breeders' Cup Turf fourth **Ulysses (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) for the 4-year-old's first start of the season.

EBF DEADLINE ON MAY 1

The deadline to register yearlings to the European Breeders Fund by a stallion not registered to the EBF is on May 1. "Owners and breeders looking to either campaign or sell a horse to Europe should check that it is EBF nominated, as over 80% of 2-year-old maiden races are confined to EBF eligibles," said Kerry Murphy of the EBF. "In addition, your horse will become eligible to compete for a pool of over €5-million available in added prizemoney. CLASSY OCTET SET FOR QE II CUP

It will be a case of quality over quantity Sunday at Sha Tin Racecourse, as a high-class field of eight middle-distance gallopers--including the three most recent winners of the race--will face the starter for the G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup (2000m).

Japanese raiders are not without their fair share of success in the QE II, with Eishin Preston (Green Dancer, 2002, 2003) and Rulership (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) having represented the island nation, and if international ratings are to be the barometer, **Neorealism (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn})** is the one the other seven will have to beat. The 6-year-old, who lowered the colours of none other than Horse of the Year Maurice (Jpn) (Screen Hero {Jpn}) in last year's G2 Sapporo Kinen (2000m), has

“I think in this race, I just want to make sure my horse is in the best condition and we would prefer good ground,” he commented. “I will sit down and talk to Joao about tactics.”

Werther (NZ) (Tavistock {NZ}) made it six home-team wins in the last seven renewals with a stunning defeat of 2013 winner **Military Attack (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) and **Blazing Speed (GB)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire})--the 2015 upsetter--over a rain-affected strip. It has been another wet week in the New Territories, and a Thursday morning gallop, capped by a final 400m in a smart :22.9 has trainer John Moore thinking that the reigning Hong Kong Horse of the Year is primed for his title defence.

“I’m very pleased, we’re going in with confidence,” said Moore, looking for a sixth QE II since 2007. “[Jockey] Sam [Clipperton] said he was really strong to the line here and very strong through the line. He said the horse wasn’t going to pull-up, he was going on, so that’s very indicative of what the feedback was at this time last year. We’re going in with a very fit horse.”

Werther will once again have the services of top Australian jockey Hugh Bowman from gate two.

Designs On Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) was in his prime three seasons ago, having followed up on his stirring victory over Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) in the Hong Kong Derby with a razor-thin defeat of Military Attack in this event. To be sure, at age seven, the gelding’s best days are behind, but he makes his fourth straight appearance in the QE II and is reunited with Tommy Berry from the inside barrier.
