CARAVAGGIO RETURNS IN STYLE AT NAAS

Off since winning the G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. at The Curragh last August, **Caravaggio** (Scat Daddy) returned with a vengeance to issue a shot across the bows of his potential opponents in the June 23 G1 Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot. Proven on ground with some cut in, having overcome those conditions to win the Listed Marble Hill S. at The Curragh last May and G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot in June, the grey sat fifth early with Ryan Moore wearing an air of understandable confidence. Once shaken up, he was able to gain the lead without a major effort with a furlong remaining and drew away to beat **Psychedelic Funk (GB)** (Choisir {Aus}) by the same margin that he had at last year's Royal meeting.

"He was always an unbelievably quick horse and although he never showed anything at home that said he wouldn't stay a mile, we were afraid that if we trained him for it, he might lose some of his brilliance," Aidan O'Brien said. "I'm delighted that's the route the lads decided to go, as we have never had a quicker one. His raw power is incredible, really. He was just ready to start today and we were a little bit worried, as he was a good bit above what he was last year [in weight]. He could go as short in trip as is possible, but we'll go to the Commonwealth now."

NATIONAL SALE TO HEAT UP GOLD COAST

The racing season in Australia may be winding down for the winter but the sales scene remains hot, with the Magic Millions National Sale Series on the Gold Coast expected to draw an international cast of participants from May 25 to June 8. The action begins on May 25 and 26 with the National Weanling Sale, with the National Broodmare Sale picking up proceedings from May 30 to June 2. Yearlings go under the hammer on June 6 to 8, with a racehorse section bringing the curtain down on June 8. The National Sale has earned increased interest from American investors in recent years, with the likes of Stonestreet Farm, Spendthrift Farm, Glen Hill Farm and Mt. G2 32nd Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen German 2000 Guineas Cont.

Off the mark on debut at Dusseldorf Mar. 26, Poetic Dream went on to be third behind the useful Mankib (GB) (Tamayuz {GB}) in a well-contested conditions event at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 18 and made another step forward to overcome adversity and take this Classic. Settled in mid-division early, the bay was denied a run in the straight as the British raider Lockheed threatened to get away along with Empire of the Star. When the gap finally came on the fence, he was able to make up significant ground and reel in Lockheed in the final yards in what amounted to an impressive finishing burst.

Pedigree Notes...

Zain Al Boldan, who captured the Listed Lingfield Oaks Trial by six lengths and finished third in the 13-furlong G3 Bahrain Trophy, is a half-sister to the G3 Prix Edmond Blanc-winning miler and sire Svedov (Fr) (Exit To Nowhere). Their respective dam Carla was a dual listed scorer and is a half to another Edmond Blanc scorer in Golani (Ire) (Nikos {GB}), as well as to the dam of the G2 Prix de Malleret scorer Never Forget (Fr) (Westerner {GB}). The Japanese owner Takaya Shimakawa made the right move, purchasing the G2 Derby Italiano candidate last week. The colt, who had made a winning debut in his lone start at two, was unbeaten and stepped into the Derby picture with wins in the Premio San Giuseppe, at Capannelle, and the Listed Premio Emanuele Filiberto, two of the most reputed trials for this Classic.

Mac Mahon, with the in-form jockey Cristian Demuro, relished the solid pace set by Back On Board and came charging up the middle of the track at the 600-metre pole. Shimakawa's colt put the race to the bed in few strides, while Back On Board drifted left despite the whip correction of his jockey Antonio Fresu. In the end, the margin was five lengths between the pair, with a notably green Back On Board fighting back late to defend his runner-up position by a head when challenged by Anda Muchacho.

Mac Mahon is the seventh winner of the Derby Italiano for the Botti family and the second for Cristian Demuro.

Takaya Shimakawa said, "I was thinking about purchasing a horse in Italy and Mac Mahon was the right one. He won well and I enjoyed every moment of this day. Mac Mahon will stay in Italy and he is a brilliant horse. [Next] Sunday I will have a runner in the G2 Oaks d'Italia, Paiardina (Ire) (Casamento {Ire}), that I bought with Mac Mahon."

Pedigree Notes...

Mac Mahon is the first Classic winner sired by Ramonti (Fr) (Martino Alonso (Ire) and second group winner after Montiridge (Ire) landed the G3 Bonhams Thoroughbred S. at Goodwood in 2013. Ramonti won the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua and, purchased by Godolphin, scored another four top flight victories, before spending one season at Kildangan Stud in Ireland. Returned to Italy, Ramonti stands at SAB Allevamento di Besnate since 2010. The dam of Mac Mahon, the listed placed Miss Sultin (Ire), produced Mickai (Ity) (Mujahid) three years in advance of Mac Mahon. GODOLPHIN COLT ON TARGET FOR EPSOM

Saeed Bin Suroor is hoping to saddle recent Newbury maiden winner and '**TDN Rising Star**' **Dubai Thunder (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G1 Investec Derby June 3. The Godolphin colt made an explosive debut under Adam Kirby, winning by 10 lengths last Friday and Bin Suroor feels he is well capable of fulfilling his entry at Epsom.

"Yes, of course I would like to take him to Epsom," said the trainer. "We will talk to Sheikh Mohammed and he will make the decision. I want to check the horse next week, but the good thing is that he is in the Derby."

Dubai Thunder never made it to the track as a juvenile and it seems the patience Bin Suroor showed is now paying dividends.

"You couldn't run him last year, he was very backward," Bin Suroor continued. "It was only in October time that he started to show something. I didn't want to push him, it would have been the wrong time to do that. I have looked after him over the winter. He has come back and the way he won on Friday was good."

Godolphin have not enjoyed much luck in the Derby in recent years and despite his lofty position in the international stallion rankings, Dubawi has only had two Derby runners so far. However, team Godolphin have certainly been going great guns this season and Bin Suroor is hopeful this top-level success will continue.

"We've got these horses running in group races and possibly the Derby that we have not had for three years," the conditioner said. "This year it has changed. We have these horses that have come back from last year and improved physically and mentally and have shown some class in their races. It is making things exciting."

Fellow Godolphin trainer Charlie Appleby had news about his one-time G1 1000 Guineas fancy **Wuheida (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) who suffered a stress fracture which ruled last year's Group 1 winning juvenile out of her early season target at Newmarket.

"She is doing well," commented Appleby. "She is back in light exercise and is jogging. We are pleased with her progression, but she still has a long way to go as yet race-fitness wise."

The trainer is reluctant to put a time-line on when she will be back in competitive action and added, "She will tell us when she is ready. She has progressed and things have been going well since the start of her recuperation. She is doing what is being asked of her and taking it well. I am not saying that she is going to go to Royal Ascot, but at the same time I am not saying she won't go there."

BUICK TO APPEAL RIDING BAN

William Buick will lodge an appeal on Monday against the five-day ban incurred at York last Friday. Buick was found guilty of 'careless riding' when winning aboard **Alqamar (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) at York and the ban in its current form will rule the jockey out of both days of the Investec Derby Festival at Epsom. The York stewards felt Buick had been slow to correct Alqamar when the horse interfered directly and indirectly with two other runners two furlongs from the finish. Had it been a four-day ban Buick would have been entitled to have the days altered so as not to coincide with a day of Group 1 racing action.

'GOLD' OPTIONS TO BE DISCUSSED

Hugo Palmer feels it is back to the drawing board somewhat with **Galileo Gold (GB)** (Paco Boy {Ire}) following his underwhelming run in the G1 Al Shaqab Lockinge S. at Newbury on Saturday. The race didn't unfold as Palmer would have liked with Galileo Gold running with the choke out and eventually folding tamely in the last furlong to finish fifth behind Ribchester (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}).

"He's pulled up in good shape," said Palmer on Sunday. "Like his team, he's a little bit deflated, but he's sound and he ate up and we look forward to another day."

Palmer has a theory that Galileo Gold is a better horse running around a bend and this, as well as a potential dropping in grade will be discussed as future options for the Al Shaqab Racing-owned 4-year-old.

"I suppose there is the option, after a series of disappointments now, that we might like to give him a penalty kick in a lower grade race to help the horse regain his confidence," Palmer continued. "There's also just a chance the horse might be better with a bend."

Galileo Gold won the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot last year, but his target this year, should he return, would be the G1 Queen Anne S. over the straight course.

Palmer concluded, "Royal Ascot is obviously an option. I know he won the 2000 Guineas last year, but conceivably the best run of his 2-year-old career was at Goodwood. The St James's Palace he won last year was over the round mile and the Queen Anne is over the new mile on the straight course. We've got a month to Ascot and we'll discuss everything."

NO DERBY FOR CHURCHILL

G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas winner **Churchill (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) looks almost certain to run at The Curragh next Saturday in the G1 Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas, thus leaving an Epsom Derby bid highly unlikely. The colt stretched his unbeaten run to six at Newmarket and given he is by the great Galileo, thoughts immediately turned to Epsom.

However, speaking to *At The Races* on Sunday O'Brien said, "I'd say it's very unlikely that Churchill will go for the Derby."

O'Brien also confirmed that **Winter (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who completed a Guineas double for the Ballydoyle/Coolmore axis at Newmarket, will take her chance in The Curragh equivalent, the G1 Tattersalls Irish 1000 Guineas on Sunday. **Cont. p7**

He confirmed the Ballygallon Stud owned **Irishcorrespondent (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) is on target for the colt's race, while HH Aga Khan's **Rehana (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) will renew rivalry with Winter on Sunday, having finished three-quarters of a length behind that rival in the G3 Ballylinch Stud 1000 Guineas Trial S. at Leopardstown last month.

He could stick to five furlongs, but we'll decide closer to the time."

True Blue Moon is the seventh winner, and first stakes scorer, from eight runners for Fancy Intense (GB) (Peintre Celebre), whose dam Joyeuse Entree (GB) (Kendor {Fr}) landed the G3 Prix d'Aumale as a juvenile. Joyeuse Entree is also the dam of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains-winning sire and G1 Prix Morny and G1 Grand Criterium runner-up Tin Horse (Ire) (Sakhee), and Listed Criterium de l'Ouest victrix Becomes You (GB) (Lomitas {GB}), who also ran third in the G3 Prix de Conde. **Cont. p8**

Earning **TDN Rising Star** status with a defeat of Actress on debut over this course and distance at the start of the month, Alpha Centauri again put that rival to the sword to earn a trip to Royal Ascot. In second initially, the imposing grey was in front before halfway and responded to the threat from her Ballydoyle nemesis passing the quarter pole to lengthen clear and register

a commanding success. “She’s so relaxed and takes everything in her stride,” trainer Jessie Harrington said. “She hardly breaks sweat. If she goes to Ascot it would be for the [G3] Albany [S. June 23]. She’s such an easy filly to train and she has some stride on her.”

The first foal out of the extremely well-connected Alpha Lupi was another smart juvenile in Tenth Star (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), who captured the Listed Golden Fleece S. and was runner-up in the G2 Royal Lodge S. for Ballydoyle. The dam did not make it to the track, but as a daughter of the G1 Poule d’Essai des Pouliches, G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois heroine East of the Moon had substantial value to the Niarchos family. Among her siblings are four black-type performers headed by the G3 Prix d’Arenberg scorer Moon Driver (Mr. Prospector), with the dual listed-placed Canda (Storm Cat) going on to produce the G3 Horris Hill S.-winning sire Evasive (GB). East of the Moon’s dam is the indefatigable Miesque, heroine of an astounding ten races at the highest level in Europe and the States including the 1000 Guineas, Poule d’Essai des Pouliches and two editions of the Breeders’ Cup Mile and Prix Jacques le Marois. Her full-brother to East of the Moon is no less than Kingmambo, himself a leading sire and the winner of the G1 Poule d’Essai des Poulains, G1 St James’s Palace S. and G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp, while her descendants feature another Poule d’Essai des Poulains hero in Karakontie (Jpn) (Bernstein), who emulated his third dam by also capturing the Breeders’ Cup Mile, the G1 Moyglare Stud S. and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac-winning European champion Rumblestiltskin (Ire) (Danehill) and her G1 Yorkshire Oaks-winning daughter Tapestry (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Texas Rock, who closed last term with a pair of handicap scores at The Curragh Sept. 25 and Oct. 10, opened this campaign with a Mar. 10 conditions third at Dundalk and lined up for this third stab at earning black-type coming off a May 7 handicap fourth at Leopardstown. Breaking sharply from the inside gate to seize immediate control here, he poached a decisive lead soon after passing the three-furlong marker and kept on resolutely under a final-quarter drive to hold on for a first stakes rosette.

"I felt the ground was a bit quicker off the rail and it didn't look like there was going to be anything to make the running, so we said we would play to our strengths," explained trainer Michael Grassick after saddling a first stakes winner. "There were a few six-furlong horses [in the race] and we knew our horse stayed well. Turning in he got two or three lengths on them and that's what won it for him. I'm delighted as I bred him and it means that bit more, and we still have the mare at home. I was hoping to get a bit of black-type today, but didn't expect to win and we will probably look for a similar type of race again or maybe take him to England for something like the [Royal] Hunt Cup [H. at Royal Ascot]. He's entered in the [June 15 G3] Ballycorus S. at Leopardstown next month, so that's a possibility, and he has more options now than he had before today."

Texas Rock becomes the first stakes winner for his dam Vestavia (Alhaarth {Ire}), herself an unraced half to G3 Princess Margaret S. runner-up Rosabee (Ire) (No Excuse Needed {GB}). His third dam Croglin Water (GB) (Monsanto {Fr}), a half-sister to Listed Abernant S. winner and G2 King's Stand S. second up Governor General (GB) (Dominion {GB}), produced Listed Marble Hill S. winner and G1 Phoenix S. runner-up Maledetto (Ire) (Double Schwartz {Ire}) and the dual stakes scorer Bufalino (Ire) (Nomination {GB}). She is also the third dam of G2 Flying Childers S.-winning sire Sir Prancealot (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}).

Juddmonte's champion and top young sire Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) earned another accolade in his burgeoning stud career Sunday, with his first-crop daughter Soul Stirring (Jpn)'s **victory in Tokyo's G1 Yushun Himba** giving him a first Classic victory as a sire. "I got around to a lot of people that have been investors in the past and talked to some prospective clients about the National Sale," he explained. "So whether [they come to the sale] this year, next year or in five years' time, it doesn't matter, it was good to get around and see everyone and get their views."

Of course, it is not only the Americans that have shown increased interest in Australian breeding stock. Other big spenders in recent years at the sale have included China Horse Club, Katsumi Yoshida, and Dermot Farrington. Global interest combined with robust spending by locals has seen the figures for this sale skyrocket. The average as recently as 2013 was A\$71,740; last year it was A\$134,309. Figures took a slight hit in 2015 off the back of a blockbuster Teeley dispersal the year before, but leapt back up last year to four-year highs. And while numbers can't paint the whole picture when it comes to a sale catalogue, Cox said the increased number of black-type relations in the broodmare sale this year points to an even better catalogue than last year.

"There are a total of 230 stakes-performed mares--those are stakes winners or stakes-placed--which is up from 181 the year before, so it's up about 27%," he explained. "It looks like the catalogue on paper is up something like that, 27% to 30%. The number of stakes winners is up from 124 from 96, so that's up 29%."

Another figure likely to help the sale is that just over 60% of the catalogue are seven years of age or younger.

"I think that is quite astounding," Cox said. He noted that Australian racing's propensity towards racing in syndications and partnerships likely helps get young, well-performed fillies and mares on the public market.

"While a lot of breeders do race horses here, there are a lot of syndicates that race horses as well, and people that aren't necessarily breeders," Cox explained. "The big breeders that race their own fillies tend not to offer the better product, but those syndicates do, and we have a very strong culture of churn in our business. Traders will buy race fillies off the track and put them in foal or buy them here at our sale and turn them over the next year back in foal. There is a big trade culture here in Australia."

An example of such a mare raced by a partnership includes Group 2 winner **Catch A Fire (Aus)** (Sebring {Aus}) **lot 674**, who is part of a strong Bhima Thoroughbreds draft and is offered on behalf of a syndicate of owners headed by Wylie Dalziel.

Among the proven broodmares set for sale are the dams of three Group 1 winners: the 12-year-old **Condesaar (Aus)** (Xaar {GB}), the dam of G1 Sires' Produce S. and G1 Spring Champion S. winner Yankee Rose (Aus) (All American {Aus}) offered in foal to Redoute's Choice (Aus) (lot 1124); **Breccia (NZ)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), offered in foal to Brazen Beau (Aus), is the dam of this season's G1 All Aged S. winner Tivaci (Aus) (High Chaparral {Ire}) (lot 1078); and **Bubble Below (Aus)** (Hussonet), whose son Lucky Bubbles (Aus) (Sebring {Aus}) won the G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize on May 7. Bubble Below is offered carrying a full sibling to him.

"This sale has produced so many incredible results for both vendors and buyers--the dams of this season's stars Winx, Foxplay, Montoya's Secret, Rapper Dragon, Heavens Above and Lasqueti Spirit were all purchased here providing buyers with impressive returns on investment," said Cox. "We've had a couple nice updates since we've taken entries, Lucky Bubbles being a Group 1 winner in Hong Kong, which is just fantastic, and also Tivaci won the G1 All Aged S. at Randwick. His dam is in the sale as well, so those are a couple of big updates that won't hurt at all."

Progeny of Frankel (GB) are sought after worldwide, and after a handful of his first yearlings sold successfully at Australian and New Zealand sales last year, six mares are offered in foal to the Juddmonte great at this sale. Three are from Yulong Park, one from Aquis Farm and Coolmore offers two: **Etched (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) (lot 1188), a winning 3-year-old filly from the immediate family of G1 Investec Derby winner Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}); and **Enchanted Dawn** (War Front) (lot 1184), a full-sister to stakes winners Intelligence Cross and Sweet Orange.

Eight mares are catalogued in-foal to American champion sire Tapit; four are offered by Newgate Farm and four by Vinery Stud. Among the mares in foal to Tapit are Grade III winners **Caminadora** (More Than Ready) (lot 1093) and **Best Behavior** (Into Mischief) (lot 1068), as well as multiple graded stakes winner **Heart Stealer** (Speightstown) (lot 1256). Best Behavior was bought by SF Bloodstock from last year's Fasig-Tipton July racehorse sale for \$250,000, while Heart Stealer was a \$650,000 buy at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton November Sale. Newgate last year sold one mare in foal to Tapit at this sale, which realized A\$620,000 from Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum's agent Tim Stakemire.

"That's a bit of a new development," Cox remarked. "Last year we sold one mare in foal to Tapit and she sold extremely well, and this year we've got a bunch more. And Frankel being as high-profile a horse as he is, some investors have purchased mares in Europe and America and put them in foal to Frankel, so they're going to test the market down in this part of the world. It brings a new dimension to our breeding stock sale, which is very exciting."

The broodmare sale follows on from the weanling sale, which will see just under 600 youngsters go under the hammer. Past graduates of the weanling sale have set a precedent for future generations, with 2-year-old Triple Crown winner and leading first-season sire Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}), as well as Group 1 winner and exciting young stallion Zoustar (Aus) (Northern Meteor {Aus}) and Group 1-winning juvenile Peggy Jean (Aus) (Myboycharlie {Ire}), among its honour roll.

"They are great poster horses to have," said Cox. "They're extremely high-calibre horses that are very commercial, whether they're standing at stud or broodmares in the paddock or still race fillies. They're a wonderful advertisement for that sale."

In addition to leading sires like Fastnet Rock (Aus), I Am Invincible (Aus), More Than Ready, Not A Single Doubt (Aus), Sebring (Aus), Snitzel (Aus) and Written Tycoon (Aus), the catalogue includes the progeny of 19 first-season sires. Those include Adelaide (Ire), Brazen Beau (Aus), Deep Field (Aus), Dissident (Aus), Eurozone (Aus), Hallowed Crown (Aus), Olympic Glory (Ire), Puissance de Lune (Ire), Rubick (Aus), Shooting To Win (Aus), The Wow Signal (Ire), Toronado (Ire), Unencumbered (Aus), Verrazano and Wandjina (Aus).

Cox noted a recent dramatic shift in perception of weanling sales in Australia that has led to the growth of the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale.

“Once upon a time weanling sales in this part of the world were seen as a cull sale,” he explained. “That dynamic has changed dramatically. It is now seen as a legitimate sale and a legitimate trade market. To that end we have a number of breeders who are selling their entire crop of weanlings, which really speaks of the evolution of that sale over that period of time. We have just under 600 weanlings to offer and the quality has jumped up dramatically this year. It’s the coming of age of the weanling market here in the Southern Hemisphere.”

“Another aspect we’re seeing a lot more is the end-user being very active in our weanling market,” he added. “People like James Harron, and high profile trainers, that are looking at weanlings and just hanging on to them longer. It speaks to the quality of horse that’s being offered.”

Like the broodmare sale, an increase in black-type relations suggests an increase in quality in this year’s weanling catalogue. There are 58 total weanlings out of stakes mares or siblings to stakes horses, compared to 41 last year, including 49 progeny of stakes winners, compared to 40 last year.

“Those are big jumps—big statistics that tell you about the quality of the catalogue,” Cox said.

While the major yearling sales for the year are in the books in Australia, the robust trade seen at all levels throughout the season suggest there will still be plenty of action at the Magic Millions National Yearling Sale. While polarization at the top of the market was the buzz phrase at Northern Hemisphere yearling sales last season, Australians have displayed an appetite for horses at all levels of the market, likely helped by its syndication model and excellent prizemoney.

“The market in Australia is certainly very strong at the moment, and that’s right through,” Cox said. “It’s not only at the elite level, it’s in the middle as well and right down to the very bottom. There’s just a fantastic market here and it’s great to see.”

There are 584 lots catalogued for the yearling sale, with all but six of those paid up for the A\$11-million-plus Magic Millions Race Series, and Cox said he expects plenty of competition from domestic shoppers as well as international, specifically those from Asia.

“The yearling sale has also jumped up as a legitimate sale,” he said. “It’s at the end of the season but it’s far from that in terms of quality. We look forward to plenty of interest from Asia and domestically. There are people who still haven’t bought enough yearlings as yet, so we anticipate the yearling sale being quite strong.”

Cox said he expects the weakness of the Australian dollar to be another positive indicator for Asian spend at the sale.

“Our dollar over the last two or three weeks has dropped significantly, as low as it’s been in nearly 10 years,” he said. “That’ll have a big impact on potential Northern Hemisphere buyers, and more specifically Hong Kong into our yearling market.”

‘SOUL’ GIVES FRANKEL FIRST CLASSIC WIN

Just as she did last year when becoming Frankel (GB)’s first Group 1 winner, **Soul Stirring (Jpn)** again put her name in the history books by becoming Frankel’s first Classic winner when easily landing the G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) at Tokyo on Sunday. Sent off the 7-5 favourite despite being beaten by both **Lys Gracieux (Jpn)** (Heart’s Cry {Jpn}) and **Reine Minoru (Jpn)** (Daiwa Major {Jpn}) in the G1 Oka Sho over half a mile shorter last month, the daughter of MG1SW Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) obviously relished the step up to 12 furlongs and gave Christophe Lemaire an armchair ride throughout.

Breaking smartly, Lemaire reined back Soul Stirring to take a perfect position in third place on the rails as the 18 runners circled the first bend with **Flawless Magic (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) at the head of affairs. The positions remained so until around the 500-metre marker when Soul Stirring ranged alongside Flawless Magic and as that one’s early exertions began to kick in, it was **Mozu Katchan (Jpn)** (Harbinger {GB}) who emerged as the biggest threat to the favourite. She appeared to briefly head Soul Stirring 200 metres from home, but once Lemaire got a bit more serious with the Kazuo Fujisawa trained 3-year-old she lengthened again to draw clear close home with **Admire Miyabi (Jpn)** (Heart’s Cry {Jpn}) coming from a long way back to snatch third. 'Soul' Gives Frankel First Classic Win Cont.

Christophe Lemaire won three Group 1 races on Stacelita in 2009, including the G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly and it clearly gave him a lot of pleasure to begin to match that feat on her daughter.

"It's such a thrill for me as I also won the Oaks back home with her mother," said Lemaire. "Soul Stirring certainly has inherited the power both from her sire Frankel and her dam. I was quite confident coming into this race. I wasn't sure yet about the distance as it was her first time at 2400m, so I wanted her in a good position which I did because she is quick out of the gate. She also has a good lasting speed so I was able to give her the go from early at the stretch and sustain our bid right up to the finish.

Soul Stirring enjoyed a perfect juvenile campaign, remaining unbeaten in three starts and culminating with a comfortable success in the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies in December. She reappeared with another smart effort when taking the G3 Tulip Sho at Hanshin Mar. 4, a trial for the G1 Japanese 1000 Guineas. Soft ground at Hanshin Apr. 9 was put forth as an excuse for her defeat on that occasion and judged on her performance back on a sound surface on Sunday, that appears to have been a perfectly legitimate reason. It will be fascinating to follow her progress in the coming months.

Pedigree Notes...

As mentioned already, Soul Stirring is out of the brilliant race-mare Stacelita, who won a total of six Group/Grade I races between France and America. She landed a Group 1 hat trick in France in 2009 and added the G1 Prix Jean Romanet in 2010 when trained by Jean-Claude Rouget. Having been purchased by Martin Schwartz, she was then shipped to Chad Brown in America where she added both the GI Beverley D. S. and the GI Flower Bowl Invitational, achievements that saw her voted U.S. Champion Turf Mare in 2011.

Subsequently purchased privately by Shadai Farm, her mating with the then unproven Frankel has paid dividends. Apart from Soul Stirring, Stacelita has also produced the year older Southern Stars (GB) (Smart Strike) who failed to progress from winning a maiden for John Gosden and Teruya Yoshida at Sandown in April of last year. Stacelita herself is out of the stakes winner Soignee (Ger) (Dashing Blade {GB}) and her position as the most successful performer in her pedigree could well be under threat, as her daughter has begun to emulate her achievements and certainly has the scope to match or even supercede them in the future. **Click for the free EquineLine.com catalogue-style pedigree.**

VENTURA ON CUP TRAIL

Trainer David Hayes is confident his stable's recent acquisition **Ventura Storm (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}) can develop into a serious G1 Melbourne Cup candidate later in the year. The former Richard Hannon trainee had his first start for the Hayes/Dabernig training alliance when fifth to stable-mate **Extra Zero (Aus)** (Danzero {Aus}) over 2000m at Flemington on Saturday. He had signed off for previous connections with a win in the G1 Premio Jockey Club at San Siro in Italy last October having earlier proven his ability over a longer trip when just edged out by Harbour Law (GB) (Lawman {Fr}) in the G1 Ladbrokes St Leger at Doncaster.

"He was bought for the Melbourne Cup, so that is his spring aim," Hayes told *Racing.com*. Reflecting on the colt's first Australian start the trainer added, "I was just thrilled with his tactical speed on Saturday and I thought he was going to win halfway down the straight. He's a horse that just got beaten an inch in an English St Leger, then won the best weight-for-age race in Italy at his last start."

Hayes has already landed a Melbourne Cup when Jeune (GB) (Kalaglow {GB}) was successful back in 1994 and he intends to utilize a similar build up with Ventura Storm.

"We'll do what we did with Jeune, that one run in May, then back off him and bring him back in September and build him up gradually for the Melbourne Cup," Hayes said. "With natural improvement, he'll develop into those better class races and he'll be well-suited because he's fully qualified for Melbourne in November."

'COMPUTING' RETURNS TO N.Y., FAMILIAR FACES EXPECTED FOR BELMONT

As the dust settled Sunday morning following Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence's **Cloud Computing** (Maclean's Music)'s victory in the GI Preakness S., trainer Chad Brown reported the winner had arrived safely back at his barn at Belmont Park in fine condition. The colt, who forged past champion Classic Empire (Pioneerof the Nile) to prevail by a head, gave Brown his first Preakness win in his first start in the race.

"We're thrilled with the result," Brown said, adding that he was very pleased with Cloud Computing's trip beneath jockey Javier Castellano. "The horse looks well and our team here is just so happy with the race yesterday."

Now back in New York, Cloud Computing could take a crack at the GI Belmont S. at his home track. Brown noted that while the race is a possible next spot for his trainee, he would take a wait-and-see approach in the coming days.

"We haven't ruled it out," Brown said of the final leg of racing's Triple Crown. "We're just going to evaluate the horse this week and, probably by next weekend, we may have a decision."

Cloud Computing secured sufficient qualifying points for the May 6 GI Kentucky Derby, but his connections elected to bypass the race and point the lightly raced colt towards the Preakness. That decision proved fruitful Saturday, rewarding a strong partnership between trainer and owners. **Cont. p3**

"It's really gratifying, for all the hard work everyone puts in here at the barn and to be able to do it for clients like Seth Klarman and Bill Lawrence, who are so loyal, so supportive and so patient," Brown said. "To be able to reward them for their confidence in us is probably the most gratifying thing about the whole experience for me personally. They do trust us with a lot of horses, a lot of money invested in our stable and a lot of time spent dealing with good news and bad news. It's great to be able to give back to them, especially to Seth—who is from Baltimore. Everything aligned perfectly [Saturday]."

- Kentucky Derby winner **Always Dreaming** (Bodemeister), a head-scratching eighth in the Preakness after setting a pressured pace, was also in fine condition Sunday morning, according to trainer Todd Pletcher. The dark bay, who carried a four-race win streak to Pimlico and was sent off as the 6-5 post-time favorite, vanned back to Belmont Park early Sunday morning.

"When I spoke to the ownership after the race yesterday, we all decided that we wouldn't make any decisions until we got him home and evaluated how he's doing," Pletcher said. "I don't think it's a good idea to make those types of decisions right after a race. We'll process it for a little while...He looks good, bright, alert, sound, healthy, happy. We'll head to Belmont and regroup."

Pletcher was still struggling to find an obvious explanation for Always Dreaming's poor performance Saturday, but acknowledged that he was concerned with what he was seeing early in the race.

"I didn't love the way he broke," Pletcher continued. "He broke kind of awkwardly and hit the gate a little bit. Johnny [Velazquez] lost his iron for a second because he brushed the side of the gate and he had to adjust his stirrup a couple times. He said in spite of that, when he was reaching down to grab his stirrup the horse was taking him to where he wanted to be. Coming by the wire the first time I was a little bit concerned. You could see Classic Empire was right on him and he wasn't maybe taking a firm hold of Johnny."

- John Oxley's **Classic Empire**, meanwhile, appears to be headed to the Belmont after a valiant runner-up effort in which he put away Always Dreaming and nearly held off a late surge from the winner. The colt was scheduled to van back to trainer Mark Casse's Churchill Downs base Sunday evening.

"He was a better horse yesterday than he was two weeks ago for the Kentucky Derby," Casse said of Classic Empire. "Julien [Leparoux] rode him perfectly. The only thing, if Always Dreaming had carried him a little farther, I think he probably wins. But he didn't, and so we go on. He tried to re-engage. That horse had some momentum on him—he ran a great race, too."



Lookin At Lee, runner-up in the Kentucky Derby, was to van to Asmussen’s Belmont Park barn Sunday to prepare for the final leg of the Triple Crown. Hence will return to Kentucky with a yet-to-be-determined target for his next appearance.

- Trainer Antonio Sano said fifth-finishing **Gunnevera** (Dialed In) will not point to the Belmont and return to South Florida to target 3-year-old races later in the summer. Others from the Preakness under consideration for the Belmont are **Multiplier** (6th; The Factor) and **Conquest Mo Money** (7th; Uncle Mo).

PREAKNESS SHATTERS HANDLE AND ATTENDANCE RECORDS

Saturday’s 142nd GI Preakness S. set a new high bar for both attendance and handle at Pimlico Race Course, the Maryland Jockey Club announced late Saturday. The crowd of 140,327 on hand to see Cloud Computing (Maclean’s Music) capture the middle jewel of the Triple Crown broke last year’s record of 135,256. Likewise, total handle on the 14-race program was \$97,168,658, an increase of 3% over the previous record of \$94,127,434 and a 14% increase over 2015 wagering.

The Maryland Jockey Club also announced that in-state handle was up 7.1% from last year and 10.4% from 2015.

“From morning into evening, we witnessed an incredible day of world-class racing and eclectic entertainment,” said Sal Sinatra, President of the Maryland Jockey Club. “The sport of Thoroughbred racing is being rejuvenated and reimagined by the Stronach family. Their commitment to this sport is remarkable and unparalleled. Their vision is being embraced by horsemen and fans around the country.”

Among the trainers shopping on the grounds Sunday were Preakness participants Mark Casse and Steve Asmussen, as well as John Servis, Linda Gaudet, Rick Violette Jr., Simon Callaghan, Linda Rice, Mike Maker, Keith Desormeaux and Pat McBurney.

Mike Ryan, who co-bred this year's GI Kentucky Derby winner Always Dreaming (Bodemeister) and purchased Saturday's Preakness winner Cloud Computing (Maclean's Music) as a yearling, was also busy looking at horses Sunday morning, as were bloodstock agents Donato Lanni, David Ingordo, Dennis O'Neill, Ben McElroy, Charlie Boden, Patrick Lawley-Wakelin, Alistair Roden, Jane Buchanan, Marett Farrell and Kim Valerio.

Owner Kaleem Shah was at the barns, as were West Point Thoroughbred's Terry Finley, WinStar Farm's Elliott Walden, Spendthrift's Ned Toffey, Three Chimneys' Jacob West and Gainesway's Michael Herson.

The Midlantic sale is popular with consignors, thanks in large part to its placement, both geographically and on the calendar.

"We're always excited about coming here," said Al Pike, who sold last year's \$1-million sales-topping Uncle Mo filly. "This is our go-to sale. We try to bring what we consider to be our best horses here. It's late in the year and you don't have to rush your horses. If you have some uh-oh moments, you have time to get over it. It just works out. It's a great time to have a sale with the Preakness going on and everybody is in town. It's makes for a good atmosphere to sell horses."

David Scanlon consigned last year's second-highest priced offering, an \$825,000 son of Friesan Fire. Now named Army Mule, the youngster was tabbed a 'TDN Rising Star' after his 8 1/2-length debut romp at Belmont Apr. 30.

"This has always been a favorite spot of ours," Scanlon admitted Sunday. "We've done well here in the past; we sold Afleet Alex here and the colt last year. Every year, it's been a pretty consistent place for us to come and get horses sold. There is always good trade going on here and horses get moved. Because of the proximity to a lot of the racetracks, you get a lot

more trainers here. The traffic is good because there is a lot of racing in the area."

A steady supply of successful graduates has only heightened the sales reputation and attracted a stronger-pedigreed catalogue. GII Rebel S. winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Malagacy (Shackleford) is a 2016 graduate of the Midlantic sale, having sold for \$190,000 to bloodstock agent Steve Young from the De Meric Sales consignment.

"This sale has grown and a lot of good horses have come out of it, so it gets shopped harder by the top-end guys," Miles said. "So we've started to bring better horses here."

This year's Midlantic sale follows on the heels of a very

successful OBS April Sale and consignors hope to see a continuation of increased competition for middle-market horses.

"I pray it's as good as April because April was as good a sale as there has been for years and years," Clovis Crane said. "Let's hope it carries over."

Wavertree Stables' Ciaran Dunne admitted, "[OBS] April was surprisingly good. It was surprisingly good in that \$50,000-\$100,000 range, which none of us really

expected. So, hopefully, that will continue here. [The Midlantic sale] has historically been a good sale. For the top horses, there is plenty of money here. The East Coast trainers support it well, so you hope to get horses sold at every level. Which is what we need. Clearance is what it's all about, especially at this stage of the game."

The Midlantic catalogue originally numbered 575 head, but 117 had already been scratched from the auction by Sunday afternoon.

"We're very excited by the horses we have in the catalogue," said Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sales Director Paget Bennett. "Obviously, we wish we didn't have so many outs, but it's just part of the 2-year-old market--you look at any 2-year-old sale and you'll see lots of outs. But this sale has become so popular and it's great the consignors feel confident bringing these horses here."

THE TAA: ACCREDIT TO THE INDUSTRY

On a warm spring morning in April, Closing Ahead, a 4-year-old colt by Closing Argument, strides out of his stall. Big by any standard, Closing Ahead is new to this small farm on the outskirts of Louisville. It is, in fact, his first day under tack since arriving, and the colt, feeling good but sensible, is steered cautiously up a small hill behind the barn, down a grass path, and to a show ring with a number of jumps. Eddie Orantes, an exercise rider at Churchill Downs who drives over a few times a week to ride, is aboard. Orantes is patient and calm, a reassuring presence to the recent arrival. After all, test drives can be nerve-racking, and this test drive will help determine Closing Ahead's future course.

Welcome to Second Stride, a 501 (c) (3) not for profit that rehabs, retrains and helps place retired Thoroughbred racehorses. It's one of dozens of organizations that have sprung up in past 15 years that have helped the racing industry with the crucial issue of finding second careers for horses when their racing days are done.

It's been a busy morning at Second Stride, and it's not just due to a curious menagerie that, on this day, includes a garrison of chickens patrolling a muck wagon for morsels.

Today, Second Stride is being inspected by the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance, or TAA. Conceived just five years ago, the TAA was the brainchild of industry leaders and set into motion by Starlight Racing's Jack Wolf.

The goal was to create a broad-based industry initiative, an organization that would pull together different power centers. If the TAA is ever in danger of being lost among the industry's alphabet agencies, it's showing on this visit what sets it apart. The TAA, through its Code of Standards ([click here](#)), is North America's lone accrediting organization of Thoroughbred retirement and retraining facilities.

That fact might be lost on some who view the TAA only as a fund-raising organization for aftercare-which it is...in part. But it's this accrediting arm that is at the heart and soul of the TAA, and is important in a day and age when people, rightly, are hyper-aware of where their donated dollars are going.

"The TAA ensures the industry that the money they invest in aftercare is being invested well," says the TAA's Operations Consultant Stacie Clark. "Having inspections, and surprise inspections, validates that an organization does what it says it's going to do; that horses are being looked after, and industry money that supports these organizations is at its best use."

For an organization to be eligible for TAA grants, it must first

be accredited. Many of these organizations, like the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation and New Vocations, already have effective fundraising arms, but can also make good use of TAA funds. Each individual farm involved with these organizations, then, needs to get the TAA stamp of approval.

That's no mean feat. Back at the TAA's Lexington-based office, located in The Jockey Club building, Janice Towles acts as

Accreditation and Grants Manager. Towles oversees a no-stone-turned application process that might best be described as grueling. To be considered, a farm must meet five requirements. Among them, the farm must be a 501(c)(3), must have been in operation for at least three years, and must have a written euthanasia policy "consistent with the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP)."

From there, the application requires extensive information in five areas: operations; education; health care management; facility standards and services; and adoption policies and protocols. In total, it's a good binder's worth of forms. If Towles and her team give an applicant a thumbs-up, the application moves to the Accreditation Committee. An up vote there means that then, and only then, is a verifying inspection scheduled.

TAA accreditation requires inspection at least every two years, and surprise inspections are conducted to ensure the integrity of the program. In its first full year, in 2013, the TAA accredited 23

setting the gold standard for aftercare."

On hand at Second Stride are several of the TAA's key players. Inspection Coordinator Suzie Picou-Oldham is here, as is Accreditation Committee Chair Kristin Werner Leshney. Leshney, who also serves as a legal associate at The Jockey Club, is conducting this inspection, and stands with a pen and notepad and chats with Second Stride founder Kim Smith.

Smith says that upwards of 60% of the horses at Second Stride need some form of rehabilitation from injury, but the farm has

organizations. Last year, that number had grown to 64 organizations.

"Every organization is different," says Clark. "Maybe 80% are retraining and rehoming facilities, and the rest may be considered sanctuaries. In either case, we want to make sure these organizations are

had to humanely euthanize just "three or four in our history."

Leshney and Smith get into the nitty gritty of the inspection. What are the feed and vaccination protocols? How does the farm and its vet handle particular injuries?

no rubber-stamp process, but it seems clear to an outsider that Second Stride has its proverbial ducks in a row.

Second Stride stands in good company should it retain its accreditation. Other operations that are accredited by the TAA include CANTER, The Exceller Fund, The Maker's Mark Secretariat Center, New Vocations, Old Friends, Our Mims Retirement Haven, ReRun, and the TRF.

So, how much does it mean to organizations that receive accreditation? Plenty, it turns out. First, they can point to this accreditation as evidence of excellent stewardship. That's no small thing when it comes to raising money for aftercare.

Second, they become eligible for annual TAA grants, which grew from \$1 million in 2013 to over \$2.4 million in 2016. (Initially funded by seed money from the Breeders' Cup, The Jockey Club, and Keeneland, the TAA has now expanded its donation base to include all four of the major U.S. sale companies and one in Canada, as well as horsemen's groups, racetracks, trainers and stallion farms.)

Third, the accreditation program itself becomes a clearinghouse for best practices. What one organization does exceptionally well might make its way into the TAA's best practices, or simply might be passed along by word of mouth.

For Second Stride's Kim Smith, that's a huge opportunity to get better.

"TAA really does do amazing work in mentoring and helping programs like ours," says Smith. "They give us access to a

professional level of help for developing a solid infrastructure. Not only are we given helpful care protocols for our horses, but all the contracts, financials, procedures and office work best-practice protocols are

touched on as well. Though we are very proud of our program and facilities, we still get lumps in our throat hoping we make the muster and make the TAA proud!"

Michael Blowen, founder of Old Friends, agrees. "I think the TAA is the best thing to happen to aftercare," he says. "There are two reasons. The most important reason is that the accreditation process is diligent-and I'm being kind. It's tougher than an audit by the IRS [laughs]. But that makes you think through all the things you're doing, and that they're up to snuff, whether it's budgeting or raising income for the farm. The

second thing is that they raise money that goes right to the horses. It goes to feed, goes to the farrier, goes to the vet clinic. One of the provisos when you get a grant from them is that you can't use the money to do something like improve your farm. It has to go directly to the horses. I just can't say enough about them."

Back at Second Stride, Eddie Orantes and Closing Ahead are slowly touring the show ring. They walk around and in between the jumps. Closing Ahead looks curiously at each obstacle, and Orantes gauges his response. After a few minutes, they turn and head back to the barn. This test drive has been a good one, and with a little luck, Closing Ahead will have a second career in no time.

Grizzel continued her upward trajectory since launching her North American campaign earlier this year, notching the first graded stakes win of her career in Woodbine's Sunday feature. The bay sat an ideal trip stalking the pace in the pocket, tipped out in upper stretch and rallied to win decisively from favored Enstone.

Grizzel began her career campaigning in England under the care of trainer Richard Hannon. After winning her first two starts in 2016, the filly failed to be a real factor in seven ensuing starts--four of which were in group stakes company. She was subsequently transferred to the barn of Michael Doyle and checked in fourth in a pair of stakes over the Gulfstream Park turf--the Feb. 25 Melody of Colors S. traveling five furlongs and the Apr. 1 one-mile Sanibel Island S. The Irish-bred was last seen annexing a no conditions allowance test over course and distance Apr. 28.

Sent postward as the second choice here, Grizzel was away without incident and saved ground around the opening bend as

Enstone showed the way through a quarter-mile in :23.83. She maintained a steady tracking spot tucked in behind the leader through a half in :47.98, paused momentarily in search of running room midway on the final turn and slipped through an opening to seize control cornering for home. Enstone stayed on stubbornly, but Grizzel drove clear in the final furlong to claim the victory.



"The easiest way for me to get somebody to buy into our project and tell them about the project is really not to have them come to a race. I get them out there at 7 o'clock in the morning to see several hundred horses training, and it's an amazing sight." --Walter Lynch, architect, on the renovations surrounding Laurel Park, which will include mixed-use residential and commercial development

"I think people having a glimpse in the day of the life of a horse is important. It's also helpful in combating a lot of the misconceptions about how racehorses are treated. If people just knew how well these horses are treated, that would be an

easier battle to fight." --Todd Gralla, director of equine services for Populous architects, on why racetracks of the future should be designed to give fans access to the backstretch

"Our biggest concern is that there is a lack of standards. There's a horse racing statute

that allows for federal regulation of gaming, but there's no federal standard for the humane treatment of horses, the animals at the center of the enterprise. They should be at the center of our thinking for the purpose of their welfare and their well-being. "Anti-doping is really not about catching people. It's really about deterring people from doing that behavior in the first


