

SENKOVICH HOPES SUCCESS MULTIPLIES

Joe Senkovich's American Equistock has already enjoyed a banner 2017 thanks to the graded stakes winning exploits of Multiplier (The Factor) and the operation will look to keep the momentum going when it returns to its more traditional role as seller at next week's Fasig-Tipton July Selected Yearlings Sale.

"Our primary focus is the yearling sales," Senkovich explained. "We've done it for a long time. We've just been doing it quietly--we're a very unassuming group."

American Equistock will send three pinhooking prospects and one homebred through the Fasig July sales ring with Paramount Sales.

For Senkovich and his wife Karen, their nearly three-decade involvement in the racing industry was mostly a matter of geography.

"Just living in Ocala, Florida," he said when asked how he first became involved in the game. "I was in the construction business and we raised our children in Ocala. [Racing] was something that I wanted to do for a long time."

Among the graded stakes winners who have passed through American Equistock hands over the years are GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Singletary, Grade I winner Wild Fit and Seize the Day, who carried the farm's colors to a third-place finish in the 2004 GIII Hollywood Prevue S.

A 'ROMAN' INVASION

In all sports, excitement and intrigue become palpable when there's a battle for an individual title that comes down to the season's final days. Whether that's a scoring title in basketball, a batting title in baseball or a duel for the top ranking in sports like golf or tennis, all eyes are on those players' every move as their campaign draws to a close.

Senkovich Hopes Success Multiplier cont.

From a limited number of horses in training, American Equistock had success in the sophomore ranks this spring when Multiplier won the GIII Illinois Derby. A \$62,000 Keeneland November purchase in 2014, the gray colt RNA'd for \$220,000 at the 2015 Keeneland September sale.

"We don't race that much, but Multiplier was a horse that our friends at Hunter Valley and Ted Champion had bought," Senkovich commented. "I went to look at him at the sale and I was actually going to buy a different horse from the same consignor because my trainer, Brendan Walsh, he really wanted this other horse. We tried to buy that horse and we couldn't and so Multiplier went through the ring and when I found out he went through the ring [unsold], I went back there and I looked at him and I said, 'Why was I looking at the other horse?' I just loved him to death and we bought him. The rest is history."

After his Illinois Derby victory, Senkovich sold Multiplier to Wachtel Stable, George Kerr and Gary Barber. He went on to finish sixth in the GI Preakness S. and 10th in the GI Belmont S.

Asked if it was difficult to sell his graded stakes winner, Senkovich said, "No, because we are very resolute in our game plan. I've always felt like, if it's reasonable, you have to sell, especially colts. Because if they don't work out, you have nothing and if they do work out, it's great because the next guy makes something and the next guy makes something. And that's the way our business should be. If it was a filly, I probably would have kept her because of the

broodmare prospects."

American Equistock maintains a broodmare band of about eight head.

"We've tried to upgrade our program over the years--it just takes a long time," Senkovich said. "For the most part, the mares that we're buying, we are trying to buy ones that match up with younger sires. We have mares in foal to Nyquist and California Chrome and Runhappy--the ones that we think people are going to want. I've sort of gotten away from the traditional, 'Let's breed to this sire because he's proven 10 years in a row,' because sometimes people say, 'We can't afford them.' But the whole program is trying to be in the moment--what's the hot ticket right now?"

In addition to its commercial broodmare band, American Equistock looks to pinhook between 15 and 20 weanling-to-yearlings a season.

"We don't have a big outfit or staff," Senkovich said. "We are sort of boutique and we look at every individual as an individual. Probably the greatest thing is that we have a good resource base of looking at horses and what they've sold for. Do we make it all the time? No. We make mistakes, but we look at every one of them and ask, 'Is this a money maker?' And if the answer is no, we take it off the list. Even if we reach out to buy a yearling to pinhook, it's got to be something that everyone is talking about, the buzz horse. Everybody is doing it, so it's not a big secret." **Cont. p4**

American Equistock's yearling sales season will kick off at Tuesday's July sale with **hip 16**, a filly by Uncle Mo purchased for \$75,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale. The July offerings also include **hip 96**, a homebred by Warrior's Reward; **hip 222**, a son of Take Charge Indy purchased for \$45,000 at Keeneland November; and **hip 254**, a colt by freshman sire Shanghai Bobby.

"We are happy with them," Senkovich said of the group. "We put a lot of faith in Pat Costello. He is my partner on all that we do with Paramount Sales. Pat and I have been friends forever and the horses stay at his farm. He's got an equity interest in the horses, so you couldn't have any better person because he's got skin in the game."

He continued, "I've learned over the years, some people put horses where their clients want to go. I just tell Pat, 'Let's analyze them and see where they're going to go. And he says, 'This is where we need to go.' That's why he's one of the top consignors in the world, because he knows where to go. So I think we're going into this sale with the horses in the right spot. Now whether they make money for us remains to be seen, but that's where they belong."

Senkovich thinks his operation has plenty to look forward to for the rest of the yearling sales season as well.

"We have an outstanding Scat Daddy colt--he's probably the best colt we've ever had," Senkovich said. "And he couldn't come on the heels of any better world-wide recognition as part of Scat Daddy's last crop and following a Royal Ascot for the history books. And we're walking into the [Keeneland September] sale in the fall with probably the best horse we've ever had. Also in this crop, we have a Pioneer of the Nile, we have an Arch, an Uncle Mo and a Union Rags. I try to buy all the hot horses that we can."

Following on from a strong series of juvenile sales, Senkovich sees reason to be optimistic about trade at the upcoming yearling auctions.

"Living in Ocala and being around all the [juvenile] pinhookers, I think they had a good year--and I think that's great because they are the hardest working people in show business these guys down in Ocala. And then, I think that there is a sentiment in the country that the economy is good and the stock market is strong, interest rates are still low. So people are not hearing any negatives. Overall, whether you're a farmer or a president of a bank, when sentiment is good, people are spending. And people are buying cars and houses and boats and everything else and that transcends down to our business. The economy is good and I think the sales will be good."

The Fasig-Tipton July Horses of Racing Age Sale will be held Monday evening beginning at 5 p.m. The Yearling sale takes place Tuesday beginning at 10 a.m.

Heading into the meet's final day, however, it was Roman, the recently turned 19-year-old from Puerto Rico, who was in pole position, two wins ahead of Prat. Roman's agent, Tony Matos, watched in anticipation as his client was shut out and Prat picked up victories in the second and fourth races of the day to draw even at 41 wins apiece.

"I wasn't nervous, but I was hoping that at least I could tie," Matos reflected. "Tying with Flavien Prat is the same as winning, because I have a lot of respect for him. He's a very good rider, and it was good for racing. Everybody was so excited about the whole championship. It went down to the last race."

Prat looked poised to overtake Roman in the day's seventh event aboard favored Steve Miyadi trainee Powerful Thirst (Grazen), as the colt took a clear lead into the final sixteenth. Well-bet firster Sunset Seven (Lucky Pulpit) unleashed a big late rally

though, and nailed Powerful Thirst on the line by a neck. Neither Prat (one mount) nor Roman (three mounts) found the winner's circle in the meet's final three races and the riding crown ended up, fittingly, being shared.

Roman becomes the first apprentice jockey since Gordon Glisson in 1949 to capture a Santa Anita riding title. It was the exclamation point on an extraordinary meet that started off inauspiciously, with the bug boy having to be benched three separate times for riding infractions in two months after arriving at Santa Anita in February.

"He wasn't adjusted to the turf riding here," Matos said. "After the suspensions, he went to look at film, got advice from his fellow jockeys and tried to better himself. Now, he's just as good a rider as you could see."

Roman started to gain momentum in May and, other than Prat and Mike Smith, no one had as much success in the final two months of the meet. **Cont. p6**

He earned his first stakes victory June 25, one of four wins that day, aboard West Point Thoroughbreds’ Street Surrender (Street Boss), who upset Grade I winner Nickname (Scat Daddy) in the Southern Truce S. The following Sunday, he tallied another four-bagger to poke his nose in front of Prat and set the stage for Tuesday’s drama.

Over the winter, Matos was looking for apprentice riders from the Escuela Vocacional Hipica, Puerto Rico’s jockey school that has produced a tidal wave of talent on America’s East Coast in recent years, headlined by the superstar Ortiz brothers. He talked to Joe Bruno, a prominent Puerto Rican horse racing journalist and television commentator, who showed Matos a handful of young riders looking to make the jump to the United States and told him to pick which one he liked best. **Cont. p6** “I liked the way Evin looked on a horse, so I called him,” Matos remembered. “He was going to go somewhere else, but I talked him into coming to California. I wasn’t even dreaming of being close to leading rider. It just happened.”

Roman’s ascent was buttressed by Jerry Hollendorfer, the trainer of Street Surrender, who started using the teen on live mounts earlier in the spring. Soon enough, like a snowball going downhill, Roman picked up calls from powerhouse outfits in

Peter Miller, Steve Miyadi and John Sadler, and even rode a few times for Bob Baffert, who rarely legs up apprentice jockeys.

“He’s riding for everybody,” Matos said. “You can see, he rides almost every race. He’s very talented, he’s very good out of the gate and it is a privilege to be leading rider at Santa Anita. I’m very excited to have a rider with this much ability at his age. He’s got a lot of upside.”

The tutelage of the older riders at Santa Anita has been crucial for Roman’s development. Racing is unique in that direct competitors will sometimes take it on themselves to teach young upstarts the tricks of the trade, and Matos says that it’s Roman’s attitude that has drawn the encouragement of California’s riding colony.

“They do it because he’s such a nice kid,” Matos offered. “He’s very humble, very low-key. He was going to be leading rider and he never even got excited. He’s got nerves of steel. He just took it one race at a time.” **Cont. p7**

Even if he were to fail to win a single race in the second half of the calendar, Roman likely has an Eclipse champion apprentice award in his future. But the sights are much higher now and the hard-working kid is named on mounts in seven of eight races on Thursday's opening day card at Los Alamitos as he looks to carry his momentum into the Del Mar meet.

"I have a lot of business lined up at Del Mar," Matos said. "We just have to keep everybody happy because we need everybody. We've won a lot of races for small stables. I hate to say one name and not the other, because there were so many people that went to help us."

It's going to be tough to top the history Roman made at Santa Anita, but for a 19-year-old who is now the talk of Southern California racing, and who still has his weight allowance until next March, that may have just been the beginning.

BREEDERS' CUP SMALL BOARD ELECTION STARTS THURSDAY

Voting opens Thursday at 8 a.m. for three director spots on the Breeders' Cup's small board and will run through July 11 at 5p.m. Only Breeders' Cup members are eligible to vote for the small board directors.

"The Breeders' Cup members elect the board of directors," explained Fleming. "There are 13 [people on the small board], plus our CEO Craig Fravel. They have an election every year for three to four spots. We do it that way so there is a rotation and the board is not 100% fresh faces."

The three open positions were previously filled by *TDN* columnist Bill Oppenheim, owner/breeder Roy Jackson and Dr. J. David Richardson, chief of surgery at the University of Louisville and a longtime owner/breeder. All three are running for re-election and also in the running is Glen Hill Farm's Craig Bernick and Siena Farm's Anthony Manganaro, part-owner of GI Kentucky Derby winner Always Dreaming (Bodemeister). "We have three spots for directors and there are five individuals running for director," said Drew Fleming, Senior Vice President of Operations and Development at the Breeders' Cup.

"The three existing ones, which are Bill Oppenheim, David Richardson and Roy Jackson, and then Craig Bernick and Anthony Manganaro. Voting starts July 6 at 8a.m. on Votenet and continues on July 11 through 5 p.m. on Votenet."

FASIG-TIPTON NY-BRED SALE CATALOGUE NOW AVAILABLE

Fasig-Tipton's New York-Bred Yearlings Sale, scheduled for Aug. 12-13 in Saratoga Springs, will feature 296 entries in a catalogue that is now available for viewing on the company's [website](#). Print catalogues are also available starting Thursday. Sale sessions will begin each evening at 6:30 p.m. in the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion.

Notable graduates from the New York-bred sale in recent years are headed by leading sprinter Mind Your Biscuits (Posse). The chestnut, who RNA'ed for \$47,000 at the sale in 2014, ran second in the GI TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint before capturing the GI Malibu S. and the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen when last seen Mar. 26. Haveyougoneaway (Congrats), who sold for \$105,000 at the 2012 sale, captured the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga last summer before hammering down for \$1.1-million at the Fasig-Tipton November sale. She was also a finalist for the champion female sprinter Eclipse Award.

"Buyers will find the cream of the New York-bred crop at this sale once again this year," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "Whether your goal is to compete in the New York-bred program or to race on the world's biggest stages, this sale is the proven place to find a horse that will take you there."

They also mandated that only independent, third parties can administer race day treatments. These practices have become the national standard.

The National Owner and Trainer Legal Defense Fund, the Pennsylvania HBPA, as well as other HBPA affiliates, provided legal support for thoroughbred trainer Murray Rojas because they strongly believe the federal Department of Justice overreached on what is clearly a state regulatory issue.

The court correctly found Ms. Rojas not guilty of charges related to this attempt to set a new legal precedent. We also take issue with how the federal government applies unlimited resources against a member who is charged with a crime and brings them to the brink of bankruptcy. We support the ability of our membership to properly defend themselves in the court of law, and we respect the ultimate decision of the court.



OP/ED: DO FILLIES REALLY IMPROVE WHEN RACING IN FOAL?

The great triviality that is horse racing is full of unanswered questions, most of which are destined to remain unanswered for as long as thoroughbreds are raced. However, today for the very first time, one such question can finally be addressed using robust statistical evidence that has never before been collected or examined.

The effect that being in-foal has on the racing performance of fillies has been the subject of discussion for decades. Every year without fail, fillies win races in the 120-day period during which they are permitted to race after becoming pregnant. There are multitudes of examples of this occurring from the lowest levels of the sport right up to the headline-making Group 1 wins of in-foal fillies such as Indian Queen and Chinese White. All of these successes have understandably served to reinforce what is a very commonly-held theory that pregnancy can often correlate with improved racing performance in fillies.

On the face of it, the theory seems to carry plenty of weight. As well as masses of anecdotal evidence of the fairer sex winning whilst in foal, there are seemingly sound physiological explanations for why pregnancy could well lead to an improvement in racing performance.

EON ON TOP OF THE WORLD IN SWEDEN

SWEDEN—It could hardly be argued strongly that Tuesday's inaugural Lady Jockeys' Thoroughbred World Championship did not deliver a suitable winner.

Maryline Eon was the highest-placed woman in the French standings last year and recently broke new ground, as well as earning wider recognition, when becoming the first female to ride in the G1 Prix de Diane Longines.

Certainly this invitational competition at Europe's newest racecourse Bro Park just outside Stockholm has a grand title and forms part of loftier aspirations by Swedish racing organisers Svensk Galopp. However, its purpose is rather to offer some accessible, enjoyable sport that gains promotion than an intention to disrupt the global order of the Turf on its own.

Eon took two of the five races, with the selection of predominately locally-trained horses decided by a team of independent experts to give each rider one strong chance, two medium and a couple of outsiders. The 22-year-old had just enough points in hand to hold off the Dane Sara Slot, whose mount Norse Magic (GB) (Norse Dancer {Ire}) pipped her Loop De Li (Swe) (Merchant Of Venice) close home in the finale.

Eon received her trophy from the competition's patron, ABBA's Benny Andersson.

"I wasn't very confident even though I've ridden in the Prix de Diane," she said. "It's been a really good experience and I hope other lady jockeys will have the same experience."

Andersson is more a benign figurehead than a driving force of the LJWC, even crediting its creation to the presenter and event compere Derek Thompson. A renowned owner-breeder, he is a regular and recognisable face at the course, not least as his appearance is slightly greyer but otherwise undiminished since the 70s pop glory days.

"It was a fun idea, I don't know who first said it, was it Tommo?" he said. "There were races last year (when Bro Park opened) with female jockeys. They asked me and I said 'fine', I'll support it." [Cont. p4](#)

It is well known that being in season can detrimentally affect both the behaviour and racing performance of fillies. Thus, the fact that fillies cease to come into season once they are in foal is considered a significant positive offshoot of pregnancy in a racing filly. As well as that, the calming effect of the hormone progesterone which is produced during pregnancy could also have a positive impact on racing performance.

That said, there has always been the possibility that the perception of this apparent correlation has been exaggerated by the confirmation bias caused by the racing public only tending to be made aware of or take notice of the fact that a filly is in foal after they have won a race. Sceptical observers suggest that there are likely to be multitudes of in-foal fillies that race without success that the racing public doesn't hear about and that if we were privy to all of those, the full set of data would show that it isn't the key to improvement that many consider it to be.

While there has been unending conjecture on the subject from both sides of the debate, until now the matter has progressed no further than that. The primary reason for this is that while it has been considered on numerous occasions in multiple racing jurisdictions, it has never been made compulsory for trainers to declare if the fillies in their care are in foal. This lack of reliable official information has made it very difficult for anyone to draw a robust evidence-based conclusion on the matter.

However, that doesn't mean that this long-standing question is destined to remain unanswered. Indeed, I believe I have answered it with a strong degree of certainty using historical data that has been hiding in plain sight all along.

Weatherbys require owners/breeders to formally report the last date that their filly/mare was covered by a sire, as well as the result of that covering including the date that those which successfully carried their pregnancy to full term give birth to their foal. Thus, while it was anything but a quick and easy process, it was possible to source that information from Weatherbys and cross reference it with a racing form database on a case-by-case basis to identify those that raced after their last covering date and subsequently carried their pregnancy to full term.

By only including fillies/mares that carried their pregnancies to full term, we can be all but certain that they were indeed pregnant in all of their runs that came after the date of their last covering. Thus, this methodology is exceptionally unlikely to throw up false positives and therefore provided a reliable set of data which can be used to better answer the question at hand.

As is the case with any statistical study, one of the most

important requirements is that there is enough data collected to make the conclusions drawn from it as reliable as possible. With this in mind, I examined all the data from the seven years from the beginning of 2009 through to the end of 2015. This resulted in the identification of a total of 443 qualifiers that raced on the Flat in Great Britain and Ireland while in foal.

Once this set of data was isolated, the next step was to come up with a fair methodology to assess their racing performance whilst pregnant. In terms of the basics, the number of runs and wins after their last covering date was recorded in each case. After that, "improvement" was defined as registering a career-best Racing Post Rating whilst in foal. This improvement was then measured by the difference between their best pre-pregnancy rating and their best rating whilst pregnant. Here is what the research revealed:

The 443 in-foal fillies/mares had a total of 1,549 starts whilst pregnant, an average of 3.5 starts each, and they achieved a win strike rate of 8.26%. To put that into context, the win strike rate of the entire population of three-year-old and older fillies/mares in Great Britain and Ireland in the same period was 9.35%. Thus, the strike rate of pregnant runners was 11.7% LOWER than non-pregnant fillies/mares. This is a statistically-significant difference that would not have been at all expected by many.

What makes this so surprising is that even if pregnancy had no positive effect on racing performance, it would have been expected that the strike rate of pregnant runners would have been higher than that of non-pregnant runners, as there is almost certainly a positive selection bias at play in the pregnant group. As well as it being likely that the quality and pedigree of those chosen to race whilst pregnant would be above average, what is certain is that with their trainers having a maximum of just 120 days to race them whilst pregnant, they would be pulling out every stop to get them in the winner's enclosure and/or show improvement. Thus, for them to have a below-average strike rate is very much an unexpected eye-opener.

There were more surprising results to be found when the sample was examined in search of how many of the pregnant runners showed improvement. Just 67 (15.1%) of them produced career-best efforts while pregnant, with the average rate of improvement being 5.8lb. Just 13 of them (2.9%) improved by 10lb or more and 23lb was the most improvement shown by an individual. While there isn't an appropriate means to compare these percentages against the overall population as was done with the win strike rates above, given just how widely it is considered that pregnancy brings about improvement in racing performance, that 84.9% of the fillies/mares in this sample did not show any improvement is likely to come as a major surprise to many.

Similar statistics were revealed when the performance of fillies/mares that raced over jumps while in-foal during the same period were examined as part of this study. While the sample is smaller with just 169 qualifiers, their strike-rate over jumps was 7.4% compared to 7.81% for all four-year-old and older fillies/mares over jumps in the same period. The percentage of those that produced career-best efforts over jumps while pregnant was just 12.4%.

Thus, rather than supporting the commonly-held view that being in-foal is a positive for a racing filly/mare, this data makes the quite sensational suggestion that being in-foal could actually have a negative influence on racing performance.

While it remains to be seen whether this significant new evidence will have any effect on the popularity of putting fillies/mares in foal while they are in training, it will hopefully serve to better inform breeders, pundits and racing public in how they consider such situations.

The widely-believed theory of the "improving in-foal filly" has escaped rigorous statistical examination for decades, but the above study goes a long way to debunking it.

Notes:

Fillies/mares that were returned as having aborted early, slipped their foal or as having "no return" were not included in the above data sample. While there is a chance that they were in foal when they raced, there isn't enough specific detail returned officially to allow us to be sure whether they were or not, so in the interests of the integrity of the sample they were left out.

Fillies/mares that were returned as having given birth to a dead foal, a foal that died after birth or a foal that was born abroad were all included in the data sample, as all of them carried their pregnancy to full term, which is what is relevant to this study.

With regard to the time period used for this study, it is worth noting that the win strike rate of all three-year-old and older fillies/mares in Great Britain and Ireland went through a significant gradual change in the last 15 years or so. It increased from an average of 7.76% between 2003 and 2008 to 9.35% between 2009 and 2015. This is likely to be attributable to the growth of the programme of races for fillies and mares. Thus, in an effort to make this study as reflective as possible of the current situation and programme book, the time period of the seven years from 2009 to 2015 was selected, as the fillies/mares strike rates remained quite stable in this time.

The study did not include data from the 2016 racing year as the returns from breeders for their 2016 coverings were very much still incomplete at the time of writing. [Cont. p4](#)

One of the most eye-catching qualifiers in this study was Your Gifted. Having been covered on May 13th 2011, the sprint handicapper raced more times (15), won the joint-most races (four) and showed the joint-second highest amount of improvement (22lb) when in-foal than any other qualifier in the seven years examined. While the foal she subsequently produced didn't show much ability on the track, Your Gifted was put back in training the year after giving birth and has gone on to win five more races. She is still racing and has had more than 100 career starts.

It is the limit of his administrative ambitions, though. "I've been at this for 25 years, maybe more, and I've tried to stay away from the politics in racing. I do my own stuff."

Andersson is fascinated by British racing and is already looking forward to the debut of his Amanda Perrett-trained filly Sing A Rainbow (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) out of his homebred Group 3 winner Beatrice Aurore (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). He has also had a number trained in Sweden by Jessica Long.

"It's a small sport in this country, very small compared to the trotting business," he continued. "This track, it's just one year old, is going to be really nice. It's nice already. It's a decent track compared to the other two tracks we have in this country, the old one in Täby and also in Jägersro."

Taken strongly in context, the LJWC felt more like the demonstration year for a sport at an Olympic Games before it received full recognition. Nonetheless, there were very few obvious omissions from the line-up with the American Chantal Sutherland having to drop out late and reduce the line-up to

nine.

Michelle Payne is suspended and there is a strong suspicion the organisers will attempt to attract Josephine Gordon along next year, along with a title sponsor.

Above all, rather than the moderate handicappers they were riding, it was about the names, with Hayley Turner's brief second stint out of retirement taking the headlines in Britain, even if she finished last overall. Each played along with a spirit that might have been less forthcoming from leading male counterparts.

Kei Choing has been the sole representative of her sex in Hong Kong while Danielle Johnson, who is likely to finish second in the New Zealand championship, looked particularly assured aboard Stonefield Flyer (GB) (Kheleyf) in the opening contest and took overall third.

There was plenty of sympathy for the charismatic and clearly competent Slot. Her book reduced to three after a couple of non-runners, she won twice and finished second on the other, delivering Flying Barrel (Swe) (Zaahid {Ire}) with aplomb in leg two over a mile.

Public interest and betting on thoroughbred racing here is still dwarfed by turnover on trotting, and breeding almost a cottage industry. No-one ever knows exactly why, but one school of thought is that trotting seemingly has more egalitarian connotations and the horses become more familiar.

Attendance, not including a pleasantly surprising amount of dogs on leads, was close to a couple of thousand and considered fairly decent for a Tuesday night given it takes about 40 minutes to reach from the capital. The grass course is a galloping, slightly undulating circuit of a mile and a quarter benefitting hold-up horses, with a small, smart and typically modern Scandinavian grandstand.

Svensk Galopp went out on a limb to acquire the Bro Park land and there may well be a similar plan to replace Jägersro with a new facility in Malmö.

"If Swedish racing was a stock, I'd say it was an emerging market," said Dennis Madsen, the head of racing. "It's where you should put your money!"

"I think we've got world-class trainers and world-class jockeys, but to be able to compete at the top level you need the right stock."

The sport benefits from state-monopolised betting and subsidy from the trotting but looming on the horizon in 2019 will be the movement of wagering to the open market.

Part of Madsen and his team's brief will be to ensure the thoroughbred arm remains attractive and competitive to a home audience with the potential to sell it overseas.

Certainly supportive of this event was Julian McLaren. The slick young Swede of Scottish descent currently has 17 in his yard, placing him in the top quartile of roughly 20 trainers based in purpose-built stables just across from Bro Park.

"I think it's brilliant," he said. "We're a very competitive country. We want to be able to compete with the likes of the UK, Germany, Ireland. We've got the prize-money for it, we need to open up the market, for people to see our racing and keep coming back."

"I'm very optimistic about the future. We've got racing on Wednesday lunchtimes, some evening meetings, and the way the turf races are run seems to give plenty of them chances."

Roy Kvisla, who was based in Lambourn for a few seasons and is now at the same facility, is broadly in agreement. "We're doing OK," he said. "There's been some tough times but it's far better to look at the positives than the negatives."

SPRINTER SACRE'S BROTHER ON TOP AT ARQANA

A full-brother to the outstanding champion chaser Sprinter Sacre (Fr) (Network {Ger}) would be a stand-out in any National Hunt catalogue and the 2-year-old AQPS gelding Flinteur Sacre (Fr) duly led proceedings as Arqana's Summer Sale got underway in Deauville.

Topping the first session of the two-day sale, **Lot 152**, consigned by Beatrice Nicco, brought the hammer down at €125,000, with agent Hubert Barbe acting on behalf of leading Irish jumps owner JP McManus.

An improved clearance rate, which jumped from 69% to 77% for 102 lots sold of 133 offered, helped first-day figures to improve across the board. **Cont. p6**

The aggregate of €3,001,000 was up by 17.5%, while the average rose by 14% to €29,442 and the median increased from €16,000 to €22,000.

The increases were generated predominantly from the buoyant store-horse section, emulating the trend set earlier this season at sales of young unbroken jumping stock in Britain and Ireland.

This group followed a final batch of 27 Flat breeze-up horses offered at the start of the sale and headed, as so often at this venue, by a colt from the Grove Stud consignment (**Lot 8**). The son of Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) is out of the 2-year-old winner Milena's Dream (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}) and was bought by Chantilly-based trainer Alessandro Botti for €74,000.

The Summer Sale continues today with a session of fillies and mares, followed by horses in training, from 11am local time.

LORD YEATS MAY HEAD TO AMERICAN ST LEGER

Jedd O'Keeffe enjoyed 48 hours to remember last week when he saddled his first four-timer at Newcastle and Doncaster on Friday, including a Listed win for **More Mischief (GB)** (Azamour {Ire}), swiftly followed by another Listed win for **Lord Yeats (Ire)** (Yeats {Ire}) at Newmarket on Saturday.

The Middleham-based trainer now has the American St Leger on August 12 and Irish St Leger on September 12 on his radar as potential targets for the latter, whose victory in the Fred Archer S. was the third of his career.

"He came out of the race well and we were obviously very happy with him on the day," reported O'Keeffe.

"He put everything he had into it at Newmarket, so I wouldn't be in a rush to bring him back and we haven't made any firm

plans at this stage. We're looking at the American St Leger and the Irish St Leger and I'll have to discuss with the owners whether to give him an entry in the Ebor at York."

He added, "He's rated 108 now, which would make it difficult in a handicap, but we'll see what happens."

The Hoppings S. victory of 5-year-old More Mischief, a half-sister to Oaks fourth Horseplay (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), was the first Listed success of the trainer's career.

O'Keeffe said: "We waited a long time to win our first Listed race and then we went and had another the following day with Lord Yeats, so it's unbelievable, really.

"It was a phenomenal couple of days, but we've been brought back to earth since by a few losers."

Like Lord Yeats, More Mischief could be on her travels later this summer, with the Give Thanks Stakes at Cork amongst her options.

"She's in good form and we might take her back to Ireland for the Group Three she ran in last year if the ground is right," said O'Keeffe.

"If she could be placed or even win, that would be brilliant, but she has to have ease in the ground.

"We'll look at options in Ireland and France as well at home and try and pick the right race on the right day."

Al Shaqab Racing's recent G2 Duke Of Cambridge S. winner **Qemah (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) looks set to bid for a repeat win in the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville on July 30.

The 4-year-old filly is also entered for next week's G1 Falmouth Stakes at Newmarket, but seems likely to stay at home.

"She was very impressive at Ascot. It was an attractive race where the conditions suited her," said Al Shaqab racing manager Harry Herbert.

"Being a dual Group 1 winner in a Group 2 with no penalties is always very positive. Jean-Claude Rouget and Gregory Benoist were certainly delighted with her.

"At the moment it is not certain where she will go, but I suppose she is more likely to go to the Rothschild again as that was the favoured route from Jean-Claude after the race.

"She is back on track now and you would like to think there is another Group 1 in her."

The Al Shaqab team is also looking forward to the debut later this month of Erdogan (GB), a son Frankel (GB) and out of the treble Group 1 winner Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}).


