



SONGBIRD CAN CAP OFF GOOD WEEK FOR PORTER

As much as he likes his horses and loves to win major races, Rick Porter's emphasis of late has not been on the racetrack, but on his health issues. For the last few years, Porter has been battling lymphoma and has not had much good news concerning the disease until this week when released from Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. Porter, 77, had been there undergoing a clinical trial.

"I just got home today," Porter said Thursday. "I had my last appointment as part of a clinical trial and there was good news. The treatment was very successful. I had a scan yesterday and it showed there's very little lymphoma left. That means a lot for not just me but for all the people who have what I have. That the clinical trial went well is excellent news."

Since his diagnosis, Porter has not been able to attend all of the races of his top horse **Songbird** (Medaglia d'Oro) in person, but he said he will be at Delaware Park Saturday when his champion filly heads the GI Delaware H. It's an important race for Porter and not just because of the big purse and the Grade I status.

Porter is a Delaware native and caught the racing bug when attending the races at Delaware Park with his parents when he was a child. But the Del 'Cap is a victory that has eluded him, despite his having run two outstanding horses. *Cont. p3*

ILLUMINANT RETIRED FROM RACING

Grade I winner **Illuminant** (Quality Road--Sparkling Number, by Polish Numbers) has been retired from racing after emerging from a workout last week exhibiting signs of minor discomfort, according to trainer Mike McCarthy. Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, SF Bloodstock and Sol Kumin said a decision was subsequently made to retire the filly while she was in otherwise healthy condition.

"Illuminant was a brilliant filly," McCarthy said. "She did some things in the morning time and come game time that only extraordinary racehorses can do. I have been very fortunate to be around some elite fillies and she ranks right up there with the best of them. We are sad to see her leave the barn because she is so special to me, my family and our team, but we are proud she heads back to Kentucky in good order and ready to go on and tackle her new career as a broodmare."



Songbird Can Cap Off Good Week for Porter (cont. from p1)

Eventual Horse of the Year Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) lost by a nose at 3-5 in 2011 and Jostle (Brocco) finished forth at 4-5 in 2001.

"It is important," Porter said. "No. 1, I don't like to go zero for three at anything and, No. 2, it is the Delaware H. It has a lot of history, especially with Mrs. [Jane] Lunger and all the great fillies and mares she brought to the race. I'd love to have my name as the winner of the 80th edition of the Delaware H."

Songbird is the 1-5 morning line favorite and faces six others. Not only does she have a huge class and speed figure advantage on her rivals, she has already proven herself at the tricky distance of a-mile-and-a-quarter (in the GI Alabama) and should be as

tight as she can be after she won the GI Odgen Phipps S. in her first start in more than seven months.

"I go on what Mike Smith tells me," Porter said. "He calls me after every work. He was really high on a couple of her last works and I asked him, 'Mike do you think the mile-and-a-quarter makes any difference regardless of the competition, would it matter if we ran against Stellar Wind (Curlin) or Vale Dori (Arg) (Asiatic Boy {Arg})?' He said, 'She's ready, the Odgen Phipps made a big difference. She's ready for a mile-and-a-quarter, she's ready for anything you want to do with her.'"

After her appearance in the Delaware H., Havre de Grace made her next start against males in the GI Woodward at Saratoga. She won that race by 1 1/4 lengths and it was the primary reason she was named 2011 Horse of the Year. Porter is ready to take the same route with Songbird, who has never faced males.

"I will seriously look at the Woodward," Porter said. "I have already warned Jerry [Hollendorfer] because I know it's going to be a problem with him. But I can convince Jerry the Woodward is the right race. I think she deserves to be Horse of the Year at some time in her career. I know that's going to be very tough this year with Arrogate (Unbridled's Song) out there, but in order for us to have any chance to be Horse of the Year we have to beat the boys. If she belongs in the Woodward and I think she

can win, I will very seriously consider it and she will probably run in it."

Havre de Grace would go on to run in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but Porter said that as long as Arrogate remains on the

scene, Songbird will not go anywhere near him.

"I'm not going to run against a freak like Arrogate, he's just something super," Porter said.

Owning Songbird is obviously a pleasure, but Porter didn't want to fall back on the cliche that she's helped him deal with his health issues. That role, he said, has been played by his family

"There are much more important things than a race horse that come into your life when you have lymphoma," he said. "I have been married to the same person for 55 years and I have a wonderful,

years and I have a wonderful,
supportive family. They are a lot more important and bring me
what I need more so than a race horse. But certainly the horses
get my mind off those problems when I start talking horse racing
and Songbird."

Illuminant came into her own in 2016 and notched a Grade I win in the Gamely S. at Santa Anita in May. Laid up for the remainder of the season, she returned in 2017 to annex the Mar. 10 Wishing Well S. in Arcadia and closed out her career with a triumph in that venue's GII Monrovia S. She retires with total earnings of \$536,243 and six wins from 14 starts.

"Illuminant was Grade I in every sense of the word," said Aron Wellman, President of Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners. "She was a beast of a mare who took our partners on a magical ride during her career. Michael did a masterful job developing her and it'll be tough to walk down his shedrow and not see that jet black beauty behind a webbing. That said, she owes us nothing and we'll keep a close eye on her offspring as she figures to be an incredible broodmare."

Originally acquired for \$180,000 by Eclipse as an OBS March 2-year-old, Illuminant hammered for \$900,000 to SF Bloodstock at Fasig-Tipton's November sale in 2016, with Eclipse ultimately retaining an ownership share.

"Illuminant provided us with some wonderful thrills this season," said Tom Ryan of SF Bloodstock. "It was a punch to the gut to arrive at the decision to retire her because she's been working exceptionally well and we had a Grade I campaign mapped out for her, but it's an honor to be associated with a filly of her caliber and we'll now focus on her next chapter. She's high class--a truly magnificent filly."

GIRVIN LATEST ADDITION TO HASKELL

Brad Grady's MGSW **Girvin** (Tale of Ekati) is the latest addition to what is expected to be a deep renewal of Monmouth Park's July 30 GI Haskell Invitational, trainer Joe Sharp said Thursday. The GII Risen Star S. and GII Louisiana Derby winner recently finished a narrowly beaten second behind GIII Indiana Derby entrant Irap (Tiznow) in the June 24 GIII Ohio Derby at Thistledown.

"He arrived at Saratoga this morning," said Sharp. "We'll get a work or two into him up here prior to the Haskell and ship down a couple of days before the race. I'd like for him to get a look and feel for the track, maybe school in the paddock before the race just to get to know his surroundings."

Girvin seems to have bounced out of the Ohio Derby in fine form, posting a bullet four-furlong workout in :47.20 (1/22) July 9 over the Churchill Downs training track.

Sharp and Grady recently teamed to win Monmouth's final prep race for the Haskell, the July 8 Long Branch S., with the

improving **Phat Man** (Munnings). Girvin, meanwhile, has finished out of the exacta in only one of his six career starts--a 13th-place finish over a wet-fast strip in the May 6 GI Kentucky Derby.

GUN RUNNER THIRD IN LONGINES WBRR

Winchell Thoroughbreds and Three Chimneys Farm's **Gun Runner** (Candy Ride {Arg}), a romping seven-length winner of the GI Stephen Foster H. June 17, has been weighted on 125 pounds to assume third place in the most recent edition of the Longines World's Best Racehorse Rankings, released Thursday.

The 4-year-old occupied the same position (123 pounds) following his runner-up effort to top-rated (134 pounds) 'TDN Rising Star' Arrogate (Unbridled's Song) in the G1 Dubai World Cup in the April edition of the Longines WBRR and held that spot into June before being relegated to a joint-fourth behind G1 Queen Anne S. victor Ribchester (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}, 124 pounds) and G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas hero Churchill (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}, 123 pounds) when the June rankings were released. Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}), owner of a 17-race winning streak, remains the world's second-rated galloper on 132 pounds as she eyes an August return to action.



Highland Reel (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) was raised to a share of fifth with Churchill and Hartnell (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}) courtesy of a tough-as-nails success in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot, while G1 King's Stand S. conqueror 'TDN Rising Star' Lady Aurelia (Scat Daddy) joined Chautauqua (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) as the world's top-rated sprinter on a rating of 122 pounds. Caravaggio (Scat Daddy), impressive winner of the G1 Commonwealth Cup at the Royal meeting, was rated one pound inferior to that top sprinting pair on 121, but has the chance to improve his position in Saturday's G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket.

"He's back at the barn," Sherman told the *TDN*. "He's still for sale [as a stallion], but we put him back into training just in case."

Sherman speculated that Dortmund will race again, but emphasized that no specific plan has been determined.

"He's just been jogging two miles [lately]," Sherman said. "He looks pretty good. He's put on some weight."

The chestnut finished sixth in the grassy GI Kilroe Mile Mar. 11 and fourth in the Santana Mile S. on dirt Apr. 1

EL AREEB "FANTASTIC" IN RECOVERY

MMG Stables' two-time graded stakes winner and 'TDN Rising Star' El Areeb (Exchange Rate), sidelined since March after enduring a fractured knee, has been cleared to resume light training after a successful healing process, trainer Cal Lynch said Thursday. The gray will be relocated to Fair Hill Training Center under the care of Bruce Jackson and is scheduled to begin exercising on the AquaTred, an underwater treadmill that reduces stress on joints.

El Areeb had surgery April 3 at the New Bolton Center in Kennett Square, Pa. and stitches removed Apr. 17, and subsequent exams showed the healing process is on schedule.

"He's doing really well," Lynch said. "He's had his 90 days, and we're very pleased with him. He looks fantastic. The X-rays were very good, so the guys are excited. It won't be long now."

El Areeb was tabbed a 'Rising Star' after capturing the Nov. 19 James F. Lewis III S. and added wins in the GIII Jerome S. Jan. 2 and GIII Withers S. Feb. 4. He is unraced since finishing third in the Mar. 4 GIII Gotham S.



HUSHION PREPARES FOR WELL-DESERVED RETIREMENT Edited press release courtesy of the NYRA

Trainer Mike Hushion, a respected mainstay on the New York Racing Association circuit, will bring the curtain down on nearly five decades in horse racing with his final two entries, Jupiter Rising (Exchange Rate) and Voodoo Song (English Channel) in the sixth race Sunday, closing day of the spring/summer meet at Belmont Park.

Hushion, who will turn 69 Sept. 14, announced last month his plans to retire at the end of the meet, an ostensibly rare decision in a vocation that regularly sees trainers continue their craft into their 70s and even 80s.

"I think like anybody my age, I've been thinking about it for a while," said Hushion. "My owners have all been wonderful and this is the right time for it, that's all. [The runners] keep us busy. It gives us a little something to do, but the winding down has gone pretty smoothly."

Since he informed his owners, Hushion has spent the last few weeks quietly transferring horses--including those for longtime clients Barry K. Schwartz, Blue Bison Stable, and Chester and Mary Broman, among others--and helping to secure new jobs for his employees. In that time, he's whittled his dozens-strong stable down to a handful of starters during closing week, including the Schwartz-owned duo of Jupiter Rising, drawing post 12, and Voodoo Song on the also-eligible list, in a New York-bred allowance at a mile on the Widener turf on Sunday's closing day program.

"I've been with him for 25 years, so that pretty much says it all," said Schwartz. "We've had a great relationship. He's a terrific guy and a wonderful trainer. It's sad to come to an end but I'm very happy for him. It'd be nice for him to win with one of them but, regardless, he's done such a great job with so many horses over the years. We've had some amazing times together, a lot of highs."

Hushion, who battled leukemia in 2015 and has since gotten a clean bill of health, said his immediate retirement plans are to spend time with his three grown children, sons Ryan and Quinn and daughter Casey, and his "three and eight-ninths" grandchildren. His son, Quinn, and daughter-in-law are expecting their first child in the coming weeks.

The New York native saddled his first winner, Tugboat Ryan, at Aqueduct in 1975, and has amassed 1,426 winners with more than \$52 million in purses through Thursday, mostly based at NYRA tracks.

"With my past experience, the one thing I was sure that I didn't want to do is go from here to basically the hospital," he said. "I wanted to take some time and enjoy everything that's supposed to be in between. As soon as I made the phone calls to my owners, there's never been a doubt in my mind, and that's a good sign. My horses will be getting good care where they go, and I'll move on and see what happens."

Hushion credited the unwavering support of his owners with making the transition as seamless as possible.

"He's been through so much with his owners and to get through that and survive it and be healthy, he's certainly entitled to enjoy himself now," Schwartz said. "He's got grandchildren that he's very fond of, he's got three wonderful kids and, after working seven days a week for so many years, he wanted to spend more time with them. He's going to be doing what he really wants to do. He'll get to take it easy."

Hushion was an economics major at the University of Oklahoma when he became enamored with horses. He had a friend back east who recommended him to trainer Allen Jerkens. "The Chief" hired him, and Hushion spent six educational years working for the Hall of Famer, rubbing horses like Step Nicely, who beat Forego in the 1973 Jerome in record-setting time. Hushion ultimately served as an assistant trainer to Jerkens before going out on his own.

"Probably the horse I remember the most about was a horse I groomed, Step Nicely," said Hushion. "He was just a tough guy in a lot of ways. Between working for Allen Jerkens and being around that bully, I learned a lot about horses. [Step Nicely] was a big-time overachiever." **Cont. p2**

Hushion continued, "He went head-to-head with Forego from the top of the stretch to the wire and beat him in the Jerome. I think he gave Allen his first 2-year-old stakes winner. He ran against the greatest crop there ever was, in my opinion, the 1970 crop with Secretariat and all of them. You could name 20 serious horses out of that crop, and he held his own with all of them."

Since taking out his trainer's license, he's maintained a 20% win rate over a 42-year career, running the gamut from the claiming levels to the graded stakes ranks.

In 1993, Hushion and Schwartz claimed Boom Towner for \$50,000, who went on to win several graded stakes and more than \$640,000 for the team. Hushion counts three Grade I wins among his many stakes victories, with Schwartz's 2012 GI Vosburgh S. winner The Lumber Guy (Grand Slam) and the Bromans' Artemis Agrotera (Roman Ruler), winner of the 2013 GI Frizette S. at two and the 2014 Ballerina at three, described by Hushion as "the ones who gave me the most thrills."

At the current meet, Hushion has seven wins from 34 starts, including his most recent stakes winner T Loves a Fight, who posted a 2 1/4-length score in the Mike Lee S. May 29. More importantly to those who know him well, Hushion leaves behind a breadth of knowledge and a legacy of humility and horsemanship.

"As a trainer starting out, he was always very supportive and has been a great personal friend through the whole process," said trainer Leah Gyarmati, who worked and rode races for both Jerkens and Hushion before training on her own. "Huge kudos to him for being able to do what he's doing now, because there are very few people who can walk out of this business and still look forward to having years and years of fun...Little by little, this business is changing and we're really going to miss people like Mike. With all that he's learned, he's a great source of information and advice. He's a very, very good horseman and, integrity-wise, you couldn't ask for anyone better."

Hushion still plans to spend much of the summer in Saratoga Springs, as he has for the last few decades, albeit with very different objectives this year. Instead of trying to win races, fishing and golfing will take top priorities this summer, said Hushion, who has stayed with Schwartz and his family the last few years.

"I love Saratoga like anybody else and I'll be able to take advantage of all the other stuff there," Hushion said. "I'll find some things to do, I don't think I'll be spending too much time at the track. I think I'll know how to enjoy Saratoga: fish, play golf, go to dinner with friends. That doesn't sound like a bad couple weeks to me."

Tomaszewski Wins Frankel Scholarship:



JUDDMONTE JEWEL HEADS TO QATAR

The trade for horses-in-training picked up dramatically at Tattersalls' July Sale in comparison to last year, with an impressive 96% clearance rate through the session in which colts with good recent form in particular sold at a premium.

Two separate Qatari entities went head-to-head to buy the Dubawi (Ire) colt Jewel House (GB) from Juddmonte and it was owner Abdualtif Hussain Al-Emadi who came out best, bidding 215,000gns for the 3-year-old (lot 552). The Newmarket maiden winner, a son of Arizona Lake (GB), a Dansili (GB) half-sister to the dam of Frankel (GB), will be trained by Ibrahim Al-Malki for the Qatar Derby. His rival trainer Jassim Al Ghazali had to settle for the role of underbidder on this occasion.

"The fact that he is by Dubawi is a big plus. He has some good form and goes on the fast ground. He ticks a lot of boxes for Qatar," Al Malki said. "He has been bought for the Qatar Derby in December and will ship out shortly to give him plenty of time to acclimatise. He has a stallion's page so if all goes well he could stand at stud in Qatar or anywhere around the world."

Of the 179 horses led through the ring on Thursday, only eight exited unsold, and that strong clearance rate saw figures shoot up in all sectors. The aggregate improved by 43% to 3,500,900gns, while the average was up by 37% to 20,473gns and the median almost doubled to 12,500gns. Cont. p2

SAFEGUARDING A FRENCH BREEDING JEWEL

Normandy is replete with picturesque stud farms of varying sizes but few can boast the rich history of Haras de Saint Pair. Originally established in 1883 by Leonce Delatre and for many years under the ownership of Count Evremond de Saint Alary, the farm on the outskirts of the pretty village of Cambremer has for the last 10 years been the property of Andreas Putsch, who views its 130 hectares as something of an equine Camelot.

"It's a powerful place," he says as we sweep past paddocks up the main drive to the lovingly restored manor house at its heart. "I don't feel like the owner, I feel like the custodian."

Under the fastidious stewardship of the man whose bloodstock knowledge is largely self-taught but expansive, the stud which has been the birthplace of four G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winners and once stood the ill-fated champion sire Omnium II (Fr) is gradually returning to its former glory.

Five-time winner Laidback Romeo (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) entered the ring with a rating of 98 and lot 535 was the subject of plenty of interest, with Jake Warren winning the battle at 115,000gns. Trained by Clive Cox for Alan Craddock in the same colours of Lethal Force (Ire), the 5-year-old will continue his career in Bahrain eventually, but may initially race on in the UK for an undisclosed owner.

The 105-rated Baydar (GB) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) (lot 474)

was the highlight from Hugo Palmer's draft, but will be returning to his Newmarket home after being bought for a new owner by agent Richard Knight Bloodstock for 110,000gns.

"Stuart and I really liked him," Norris said. "He was one of the first horses we looked at with Geoff Price of the Happy Valley syndicate and he was at the top of the list all week. We tried on the horse that was sold to Hong Kong yesterday [Gino Severini], but we liked this horse better and he has some really good form in the book."

Immediately preceding Via Serendipity was the Frankel colt Majoris (Ire) (lot 527), a grandson of the dual Oaks winner Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and a dual winner at two for Palmer and Al Asayl Bloodstock. The 3-year-old attracted a bid of 82,000gns from Greg Chung of Linden Lodge Bloodstock who offered that the colt could end up racing in Hong Kong eventually.

The final day of trade at the July Sale starts today at 9.30, with a final follow-up session after racing from 6pm. Cont. p3

The G1 Prix du Moulin winner Vadamos (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) is the most decorated graduate of the most recent phase in its history, but he may soon be challenged for that title by **Trais Fluors (Fr)** (Dansili {GB}), unbeaten until finishing runner-up to Thunder Snow (Ire) (Helmet {Aus}) in last weekend's G1 Prix Jean Prat; and **Via Ravenna (Ire)** (Raven's Pass), the winner of the G3 Prix Imprudence in April who heads next for the G1 Prix Rothschild next month.

"I looked for a farm for a long time because I wanted to be close to Deauville to have somewhere I could come home to after the sales and the racing. It took me five years to find it," says Putsch. "It's been a lot of work, a real learning process and a great adventure. I wouldn't want to miss any minute of it."

His residency in Switzerland for two-thirds of the year means that he is physically unable to enjoy the farm on a daily basis, but one senses that even while ensconced in the mountainous Engadine valley, Putsch's questing mind wanders constantly back to the more verdant pastures of Normandy's Orne valley.

"The thing that interested me about this farm was that it had a long history of producing good horses but then had a spell," he said. "I thought it should be possible to go back there. I'd bred horses before, boarding on other people's farms, so I had to learn about farming and that was a fascinating process. I think when you learn, you can read as many books as you like but the thing that really sticks is when you have your own experience. Every place is different and I had to learn how this farm works. Once you have that intimacy with the farm, it becomes interesting. But I'm convinced that genetics is only one third of the breeding process, then another third is how you raise them, and then of course the training. If there's one weak part, it's not going to happen." Cont. p5

Born in Germany, not far from Baden-Baden, it was the sport horse world which initially sparked Putsch's equine interest, and he bred his first show jumper from one of his grandmother's mares at the age of just eight.

"I loved racing and once I had sold my part of the family business to my brother I could really get involved," Putsch says. "You have to love what you do. All my energy and thinking goes into this farm, that's why I'm happy."

Under his former 6C Racing banner, Putsch's initial involvement in racing and breeding was purely commercial.


"I was breeding to sell. I tried to buy mares with good pedigrees who didn't have such good racing records. Some of their offspring sold well, so commercially it was a success, but what bothered me was that there weren't enough good results on the racecourse with those horses. Then I read Joe Estes's book which compared mares' performances and I studied all the dams of the good stallions. I decided that the way to go was to buy performance over pedigree--it's very difficult to afford both."

The G1 Prix Vermeille winner Pearly Shells (GB) (Efisio {GB}) is the only survivor from that previous operation within the broodmare band at Saint Pair, and she has earned her place, not just on the track but as the dam of three black-type horses. Her Group 3-winning daughter Pearl Banks (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) and Listed-winning granddaughter Pearly Steph (Fr) (Oasis Dream {GB}) are also among the herd. However, there is little room for sentimentality when it comes to restricting the numbers, as any sensible breeder must do.

Putsch says, "I believe it's dangerous to have too much faith in your own families, so I am always into keeping what works and changing what doesn't work. You have to keep investing all the time. I never have more than 60 horses on the property.



I always try to stay under 25 mares, which is good because it forces me to be selective. If a new one comes in she has to be better than the worst one here."

Some tough decisions will have been made then in order to make room for some well-credentialed purchases from last season's breeding stock sales, including the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches runner-up Irish Rookie (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}), a December Sales acquisition at 935,000gns who is now in foal to Dubawi (Ire). Putsch was back in action at Tattersalls this week, adding La Patria (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) to the ranks at 270,000gns. The breeder has retained five shares in Vadamos, who has been given a flying start at one of the most commercially astute farms in Europe, Tally-Ho Stud.

"It's fantastic, he covered 185 mares in the end," Putsch says. "Getting him onto such a commercial farm which has so many mares and which supports their own stallions was really important to me. I will support him, but the programme of Saint Pair is not to make stallions, it's to make families. Vadamos is not part of the breeding programme: I'm not going to do a Lagardere and send all my mares to him. I feel I need to be free to choose the stallion that I think fits."

The development and planning of the modern-day Saint Pair does not end with the equine residents. Putsch has built two matching barns--one for colts and another for fillies--in which the yearlings can seek cover, and a deep straw communal bed in the winter, with each opening out onto paddocks to allow

freedom of movement while the summer paddocks are rested.

"They have plenty of space and fresh air to move around and they have shelter, too. They do come in, we know that, but the choice is theirs."

The first crop of yearlings to enjoy these state-of-the-art structures included Trais Fluors, who was offered for sale later that year, but was bought back by his breeder after behaving badly at Tattersalls. His juvenile misdemeanours are now fully forgiven, as Trais Fluors, under

the tutelage of Andre Fabre, has progressed from one facile maiden victory at two, to Listed and Group 3 successes this year.

A win at the highest level is surely within his compass.

"He's a gentleman today but we had to bring him home from the sale--lucky me," adds Putsch.

Not so lucky, however, is that the colt's Group 3-winning dam, Trois Lunes (Fr), also a Saint Pair homebred from the first crop of Manduro (Ger), has been tricky to get in foal since producing her

> talented son at the first attempt. She has had just one subsequent foal--a colt by Kendargent (Fr)--and is not in foal this year.

> More and more, Putsch and his counterparts can call on a burgeoning array of desirable stallions among the domestic ranks in Normandy, a situation which suits the breeder's plans.

"My experience is that it's tough to send pregnant mares abroad," he says. "When the foals come back and I compare them to the foals here, there's a huge difference. Thankfully the

stallions are getting better in France, so I try only to send the empty mares and maiden mares abroad." **Cont. p7**



In planning his matings and potential purchases, he calls on his "sparring partners", the brothers Crispin and Jocelyn de Moubray. "I don't call them advisors but I like to discuss things to make sure I'm not galloping totally in the wrong direction."

In addition to his private solo venture at Saint Pair, Putsch has maintained strategic links with other noted French breeders at Ecurie des Monceaux and Haras des Capucines.

"It's paramount that this place plays for itself, so I do a lot of commercial trading on the side, if you like," he explains. "I would like to think that my breeding programme at Saint Pair is not commercial. Whenever I make a mating it's for racing."

Such trading has included selling half of Vadamos during his racing

career to John Camilleri of Winx (Aus) fame, while multiple group winner Jimmy Two Times (Fr) was recently sold privately to Godolphin.

"You have to sell a lot of yearlings to be paid the same amount that you can get for a Vadamos or a Jimmy Two Times, so I really shouldn't send yearlings to the sale, I should race them all," he says.

Haras de Saint Pair does sell yearlings however, but never at

Haras de Saint Pair does sell yearlings, however, but never at

the August Sale, despite having stock more than worthy of inclusion at Arqana's flagship auction.

"I've found that selling at the October Sale works very well for us. It gives the horses more time in the paddocks and then we are a big fish in a small pond. I think I've sold yearlings well in October that wouldn't have made the same amount in August as they wouldn't have been ready," he explains.

"I want to raise them as naturally as possible. I always think that when you go to a good horse farm you see lots of cows and hardly any

horses. When you see horses everywhere, forget it, it's not a good farm."

As already alluded to, it is important to learn from mistakes, especially in breeding. Putsch is happy to admit to his, and even to reverse an earlier decision if it will help his farm. He bought the Group 3 winner Via Milano (Fr) (Singspiel (Ire)) as a 3-year-old in training for 170,000gns and then sold her on at six for 55,000gns after she produced two small foals. Her second foal Via Medici (Ire) (Medicean {GB}) went on to become a Group 3 winner herself in Putsch's colours.

"When the trainer of Via Medici started telling me she had talent, I made sure I bought her dam back privately and she's been a tremendous mare since then--she's probably the most consistent mare on the farm," he admits. "She goes back to the family of Ribot and she produces precocity, speed, toughness --it's all there. Obviously when I started I wanted those big, strong, good-looking horses and that's what you get paid for at the sales, but the small ones seem to have fewer problems and generally they stay sound. If you are a commercial breeder you might not have the luxury to breed from the small families."

Putting commerciality aside, at least when it comes to his cherished personal project at Haras de Saint Pair, has allowed some flexibility in tempting to solve the puzzles which intrigue so many breeders and clearly have Putsch in their grasp.

He says, "I've always been fascinated by breeding. I am a horse breeder, nothing else. It took me a long, long time to understand a few things, and it took me even longer to understand that I will never understand everything." (Click to return to page 1)

After a latest below-par effort in France, Hawkbill was overlooked by the punters in favour of the fellow Charlie Appleby-trained Frontiersman but it takes special mettle to win an Eclipse and the likeable chestnut proved too good for his stablemate on a card the Maktoum family dominated. The duo had finished second and third in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 2, where Frontiersman was ahead chasing home Highland Reel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and after Hawkbill had run sixth in the July 2 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud it was obvious where the money would go this time. Add to that the fact that Appleby categorically stated his preference for Frontiersman beforehand and William Buick deserted him for the first time in 14 starts and the enthusiastic free-sweater was firmly the underdog here.

Sent straight to the front by James Doyle, he visibly thrived out in a clear lead as Muntahaa (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) eventually crossed over from his isolation away from the rail. As the business end neared, he had only his barnmate to worry about but when the two in royal blue came together Hawkbill put his head down and fought while Frontiersman dived away from Buick's whip. Surrendering vital ground passing the furlong pole, the market-leader was brought back to the battle but was always coming off second-best as they stayed clear of Algometer.

After upsetting The Gurkha (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) in the Eclipse last July, Appleby had talked about giving Hawkbill a break to help his maturing process and he was out three times afterwards without success before re-emerging with a fifth in the G1 Prix Ganay over 10 1/2 furlongs at Saint-Cloud May 1. Back up to the 12-furlong trip over which he had been third in the G1 Grosser Preis Von Bayern at Munich in November when making all in the G3 Aston Park S. at Newbury May 20, he was unable to get to the front in the Coronation Cup and paid for a tussle with Highland Reel by losing second to Frontiersman. Another below-par effort in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud had led his trainer to revisit plans for a sojourn, but he had clearly advertised his wellbeing in the interim and was pitched back into action. "You can't not love him--he's been a great campaigner for me," his trainer said. "I'm always trying to give him a break, but after two easy days he's climbing over the top of his stable door again. He's dangerous when he's left alone on the lead and is a horse that sweats up, so we'd be worried if he didn't."

Appleby continued, "He's run his race on the plane on the way over to France twice, but we know him now and I feel he has one more big pot in him. With ease in the ground or even in extremes, he excels. Frontiersman was still running around a bit there and I feel he's a good horse. This was no disgrace and he's learning on the game. We'll look towards Ascot and the [July 29 G1] King George [VI and Queen Elizabeth S.] for him. He won't look out of place there."



Early indications are that there is little between the form of Royal Ascot's G2 Norfolk S. and G2 Coventry S. and it was one who emerged from the former contest who had the bragging rights here in Cardsharp. Third and two lengths behind Sioux Nation (Scat Daddy) in that five-furlong test of raw speed, the bay proved adaptable with this strong-staying effort over one of the stiffest examinations of stamina in the country. Leading two others up the centre of the track early as U S Navy Flag was in front of the main bunch stand's side, he gradually crossed over after gaining a narrow lead with two furlongs remaining and stuck on gamely to assert from that Ballydoyle raider. The Coventry winner Rajasinghe was racing under a penalty and looked for a while as if he would be disappointing, but stayed on late to make the frame and suggest that extra distance will suit.

Cardsharp had debuted over an extended five when making all at Brighton May 3 before running fourth in an Ascot novice race 10 days later and runner-up to De Bruyne Horse (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) in Epsom's six-furlong Woodcote S. which is now downgraded from listed status June 2. Cont. p11

Back eight days later to earn his Royal Ascot tilt by making all in Beverley's Brian Yeardley Continental Two-Year-Old Trophy Conditions S. also at five, the homebred had only 12 days's breathing space to the Norfolk and duly entered this race with almost veteran status among the juveniles. "We've been umming and ahhing over his trip and had chopped and changed, but he showed so much speed at Beverley and tired at the end so we switched from the Coventry to the Norfolk and clearly we were wrong," trainer Mark Johnston said. "He was better for six furlongs today and is a tall rangy horse--when I was putting the jockey up today I did look at him and wonder what I had been doing running him over five. I wouldn't rule out seeing him over further later in the season." Jockey James Doyle added, "He hit the line very well and felt a different horse today. In the Norfolk, he was up there under sufferance only and he travelled much smoother here. Six is definitely his right trip, as he has a strong cruising speed and can quicken well off that."

Kevin Buckley, Coolmore's UK representative, said of U S Navy Flag, "He is laid-back and he travelled over really well. We were very happy with that run. Ryan Moore planned to jump out and make plenty of use with him. He lost an off-fore shoe and we are not making excuses, that is just a fact of what happened. He only won his maiden 12 days ago, so you can see he is a durable animal. Hopefully his full-sister Roly Poly can keep the good run up for the family tomorrow." Of Rajasinghe, trainer Richard Spencer commented, "We were disappointed that he didn't win, but he put up a brave effort to finish third. He is going to get further, as I've said all along, and the ultimate aim is a mile in next year's Guineas. We will probably step him up next time. Whether we go to Goodwood for a potential go at the [Aug. 1 G2] Vintage Stakes, we will see how he is, but the owner bought him to enjoy, not stand in his box."

I think he's a proper horse."

Lightly-raced for a 5-year-old, Giuseppe Piazzi who started out at Ballydoyle before joining Bettina Andersen and then his current trainer Flemming Velin was sixth in the G3 Stockholm Cup International over this trip at Bro Park in September before returning to win over 11 furlongs at Klampenborg May 26. Restrained in rear early, the bay entered the fray with a furlong remaining and despite his efforts came off second-best to Eye In the Sky. The real drama came in the stewards's room afterwards, with the first-past-the-post judged to have cost Hurricane Red at least one position inside the final furlong and subsequently demoted to third. The winner is a half to the G2 Herbert Power S. and G3 Neville Sellwood S. winner Adjusted, while the dam also has a 2-year-old filly by Fastnet Rock (Aus) and a yearling colt by Frankel (GB). It is the family of the G1 Prix de l'Opera heroine We Are (Ire) (Dansili (GB)), the G1 Hong Kong Vase-winning champion Dominant (Ire) (Cacique {Ire}) and a clutch of other notables including the recent G2 Prix de Malleret runner-up Listen In (Ire) (Sea the Stars {Ire}).

Friday's Previews STRIKING OIL

Staged as it was in 2016 at Saint-Cloud, Friday's G1 Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris sees a strong overseas presence headed by Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum's **Permian (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) who should prove a tough nut to crack. Successful in the G2 Dante S. over an extended 10 furlongs at York May 18 and G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot June 23 either side of a 10th in the June 3 G1 Epsom Derby, he could yet lay claim to being one of the leaders of the current crop of middle-distance colts. The Dante runner-up and fourth Benbatl (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Rekindling (GB) (High Chaparral {Ire}) and the King Edward fourth Raheen House (Ire) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) have all gone on to win pattern races subsequently and it is easy to forgive his Epsom flop.

Jockey William Buick picked him of all the Maktoum representatives in the Derby and was also on board at Royal Ascot. "On paper, from what we know so far, it's not the strongest group one, but sometimes you say that and further down the line or later in the season, these horses go and prove to be group one horses," he said. "He disappointed at Epsom, but bounced back in the King Edward. He won well that day and stays a mile and a half well. He probably had the run of the race at Ascot, but he was still never going to get beat from a long way out. He's uncomplicated and has got a great mind. He is probably a horse that could still be on the up." Trainer Mark Johnston's son and assistant Charlie added, "The first thing William said after he pulled up at Ascot was he was just a completely different horse [to Epsom]. At home, going into both races we thought we had him spot on. Something wasn't quite right at Epsom. Nothing came to light, but thankfully the horse bounced back in great style."

Aidan O'Brien sends across a trio headed by **Orderofthegarter** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who has looked a group 1 performer in the making so far and needs only a normal slice of luck to prove that point. Denied a run when only three-lengths sixth in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club over 10 1/2 furlongs at Chantilly June 4, he was inconvenienced by a wide draw when second to Benbatl (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in Royal Ascot's G3 Hampton Court S. over 10 furlongs June 22. Adding intrigue is the Takaya Shimakawa's impressive May 21 G2 Derby Italiano hero **Mac Mahon (Ity)** (Ramonti {Fr}), who may not have much to find on that form to put his native country back into the spotlight.

Heading the home defence is the sponsors's Ice Breeze (GB) (Nayef), who beat His Highness The Aga Khan's Shakeel (Fr) (Dalakhani {Ire}) and Muteb Bin Abdullah's Falcon Wings (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Hocquart over this trip at Chantilly last time June 18. One of the least exposed is Godolphin's Parabellum (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), who scored by eight lengths over this course and distance June 15 and who bids to provide his record-holding trainer Andre Fabre with a 14th renewal. "Parabellum won his maiden over the same course and distance and is in good order at the moment," Godolphin's Lisa-Jane Graffard said. "It is a big step up to group 1 level, but he has shown a decent level of form on all three of his starts so far. We are hopeful that he can run well, but he is an exciting horse for the future whatever happens here."

PROOF IN THE PUDDING

With just two older fillies in the line-up, Friday's G1 Tattersalls Falmouth S. at Newmarket looks poised to go to the Classic generation and one of those who has already accomplished time and again at this level is 'TDN Rising Star' Roly Poly (War Front).

Falmouth S. Preview cont.

Successful in this meeting's G2 Duchess of Cambridge S., Michael Tabor's daughter of Misty For Me (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) has been without a win since but has been second in three group 1s with only stablemates Brave Anna (War Front) and Winter (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) having her measure. The latter beat her in both the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 28 and the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 23 and although there is nothing of that substance to stand in her way here there is the unquantifiable aspect of Wuheida (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}). Not seen since doubling her tally in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac over this trip at Chantilly on Arc day, Godolphin's homebred faces a stiff task on her seasonal bow. "She has done nothing but please us, but as I have stated all along, it is not week by week with her it is day by day," trainer Charlie Appleby said. "She has done everything we have asked of her. She went to Chelmsford City for a gallop the other day and pleased us there and she put in a nice piece of work on Saturday. The most important thing is she has come out of that fit and well. I was delighted with what she did at two and always felt she would be better at three. She really was pleasing us in the spring. We are taking on race-hardened fillies, but this is a good starting point. We are confident she will run a big race and it will be something to build on. If she is the filly we think she is, she should be very competitive regardless of needing it a bit."

Godolphin are also represented by **Arabian Hope** (Distorted Humor), who captured the Listed Ganton S. over nearly this distance at York June 17 but who needs to find significant improvement to feature. Trainer Saeed din Suroor said, "Arabian Hope won well in a listed race at York and has been working nicely. Josephine Gordon has partnered the filly to all of her victories and gets on very well with her. This is a big step up for Arabian Hope, but I have been happy with her and I am looking for another good result." Almost three lengths ahead of Roly Poly when second in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Deauville May 13, Sunderland Holding's **Sea of Grace (Ire)** (Born To Sea {Ire}) adds further strength to the 3-year-old presence and has ideal conditions.

BUSY BUSY...

Ballydoyle's **Clemmie (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) does not believe in shirking hard graft and Churchill's sister is racing for the fourth time in under seven weeks as she tackles Friday's G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. at Newmarket. Breaking her maiden 12 days ago when taking the G3 Grangecon Stud S. over this trip at The Curragh, she was coming back off another short break having run seventh in Royal Ascot's G3 Albany S. nine days beforehand. Third behind in the Grangecon was her compatriot **Mamba Noire (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}), who intriguingly is pitched in again by trainer Ken Condon but who has plenty to find with the likely favourite.

Runner-up to Clemmie's stablemate September (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in Royal Ascot's Listed Chesham S. over seven furlongs June 24, **Nyaleti (Ire)** (Arch) may find this trip more suitable having been overhauled late on there. That came just six days after her debut success at Salisbury and she deserves much credit for her performance in what looked an above-average renewal of that race. "She ran great in the Chesham. I followed her and finished just behind on quite a nice colt [the third-placed Masar]," jockey William Buick commented. "Six furlongs looks her trip, as she has got plenty of speed. This is a nice ride to get. She should be fine on the track as she won at Salisbury, which isn't the easiest track. She ran very well at Ascot on a big day with lots going on. She looks pretty straightforward."

FULL STEAM AHEAD

Having mastered all his compatriots in his native land, Dioscuri Srl's Full Drago (Ity) (Pounced) takes to Saint-Cloud for Bastille Day and lines up for the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil on a fascinating evening for Italian racing. Successful in the G2 Premio Federico Tesio over 11 furlongs at the San Siro in September and runner-up to Ventura Storm (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) in that track's G1 Premio Jockey Club over a mile and a half the following month, he returned to dominate the Capannelle's G3 Premio Carlo d'Alessio (video) over the latter trip by four lengths May 21 prior to adding the June 18 G2 Gran Premio di Milano (video) to his tally last time. Godolphin's Talismanic (GB) (Medaglia d'Oro) is also stepping up in trip for the first time after finishing a neck second to Silverwave (Fr) (Silver Frost {Ire}) in the June 4 G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly. "Talismanic is a very straightforward horse, who always tries his hardest," Godolphin's Lisa-Jane Graffard said. Cont. p15

MINDING RETIRED FROM RACING

Derrick Smith, Mrs John Magnier and Michael Tabor's seventimes Group 1 winner and multiple champion **Minding (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}--Lillie Langtry {Ire}, by Danehill Dancer {Ire}) has been retired from racing according to multiple reports. No plans on her future as a broodmare were immediately revealed.

Bred by Orpendale, Chelston and Wynatt, Minding won three of her five appearances at two in 2015, leading home a Galileo top-three sweep in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh in defeating stable companions Ballydoyle (Ire) and Alice Springs (Ire) (video) before completing a championship season with a 4 1/2-length romp in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Newmarket (video).

The blaze-faced bay had Ballydoyle and Alice Springs behind yet again when proving easily best in the G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas on her 2016 debut (video), then was just turned over by Jet Setting (Ire) (Fast Company {Ire}) in the Irish equivalent three weeks later.

So impressive in overcoming a checkered passage to land the G1 Investec Oaks (video), she bested her peers in the G1 Pretty Polly S. and in the G1 Nassau S. (video) ahead of a third to Almanzor (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) and stablemate Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Irish Champion S. Minding returned to form with a half-length tally from Ribchester (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. last October (video) and made one appearance this term, a smooth success in the G2 Mooresbridge S. at Naas May 1.

Minding heads to the breeding shed with a record of 13-9-3-1 and earnings of £2,344,930.

GREDLEY CLAIMS NEWMARKET TOWN PLATE, SHEIKH FAHAD ESCAPES INJURY

Tim Gredley lived out a life-long ambition in steering Bivouac to glory in a dramatic 348th Newmarket Town Plate Thursday. The former international show-jumper used his skills in the saddle to galvanise the former Nicky Henderson-trained gelding to a facile success in three-mile-six-furlong contest.

Having sat just off the early pace, Gredley sent his mount on to what was to be a race-winning advantage just over a mile and a quarter out.

As Bivouac continued to find more out in front there was late drama in behind, with Sheikh Fahad Al Thani aboard last year's winner Almagest coming off his mount and over the rails inside the final two furlongs, just as he was beginning to close the deficit. Cont. p16

Despite getting tired close to the line the James Owen-trained gelding Bivouac was kept up to his work by Gredley to cross the line a comfortable 12 lengths clear of All We Know.

The winning rider said: "You don't realise how far it is until you turn into the home straight. Luckily I was on a nice horse and he got me home. To be honest I had been training very hard for it. You don't appreciate how hard race-riding is until you try it yourself. I bought him to do a bit of point-to-point riding. Nicky Henderson said he was basically in full training. He probably needed a bit of a confidence booster, and so did I. James Owen trains him and has been fantastic. I have been going to his to ride out every morning.

Watching on was his father and leading owner Bill Gredley, who was as delighted with the victory as his son. Gredley, Sr. said: "It's extraordinary. He was determined to win it. If not this year, next year. He had trained very hard for it. I saw the horse work the other morning with a nice colt from Michael Bell's. We knew he would run well, but we didn't know if he would stay the trip."

Clerk of the course Michael Prosser reported Sheikh Fahad, the head of the Qatar Racing operation, to have suffered no injuries as a result of his fall.

He said: "He is fine and has been checked over in the medical room."

Sheikh Fahad later tweeted: "What a shame. Saddle slipped. Thankfully I'm fine, just off to get a stitch or two to minor head wound. Thank you medical team at Newmarket."

Initially trained by Darren Bunyan, Beat the Bank scored with authority on debut over seven furlongs at Dundalk Feb. 24 and marked his debut for Andrew Balding with a follow-up success at the expense of Godolphin's useful Salsabeel (Ire) (Exceed and Excel (Aus)) in a conditions event over that trip at the Craven meeting on the Rowley Mile here Apr. 18. Saved for the G3 Jersey S. also at that distance at Royal Ascot June 21, the bay was 10th there but rebounded in easier company to prove a mile is well within his compass. Held up in rear early, he was unleashed towards the far rail to take the lead approaching the furlong pole and drew away readily on the ascent to the line.

Balding holds the winner in high rehard and said, "I don't think he was at his best before Ascot, but he's thrived after and is a fair horse. It was only his third run at Ascot and the ground was very fast. He just found it a bit quick for him there, but he showed his true colours today. I thought if he was as good as he had looked at the Craven meeting he had a right chance. I'll look at Glorious Goodwood and the group 3 [Aug. 4 Thoroughbred S.], but I'm not convinced that is his track. The best is yet to come and he is an exciting horse for the yard to have." Balding revealed a postscript to this race named in honour of one of the town's legendary figures. "Sandeep Gauravaram, who looks after the horse, looked after Frankel so it is great to win his race," he added. "I think Henry organised that to be honest."

Tiana, who was third in the Listed Oh So Sharp S. at the other track here, is also the dam of the useful listed-placed sprinter Salt Island (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) and has a yearling filly to come by that sire. She is a half to the G3 Molecomb S. runner-up Mary Read (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) and hails from the family of the G1 Middle Park S. and G2 Gimcrack S.-winning sire Stalker (GB).

3rd-NEW, £100,000, Hcp, 7-13, 3yo, 6fT, 1:11.72, gd. EKHTIYAAR (GB) (c, 3, Bated Breath {GB}--Bayja {Ire}, by Giant's Causeway), who won the Sprint Trophy over this trip on the Rowley Mile May 20 before finishing fifth in a competitive handicap at York June 17, started at 13-2 and raced off the pace towards the far side early. Squeezed for room approaching the furlong marker, the 110,000gns TAOCT yearling was through the gap in time to seize the advantage 75 yards out and secure a head verdict over Tommy Taylor (Mizzen Mast). "The ground was probably a bit too quick for him at York, but today he travelled nicely," rider Jim Crowley said. "He was one of the last horses off the bridle. He won well at Newmarket when there was a bit of cut in the ground and was impressive, but at York when it was fast he missed the kick and was on his head a bit, so it didn't really happen for him. I was a little bit outpaced early on, but I was able to fill up and get him back on the bridle for the stiff uphill finish and he picked up well. He's a lovely-moving horse with plenty of size and scope and will hopefully carry on improving."

Trainer Roger Varian added, "We're learning about this guy and his three wins have come with some cut in the ground. Maybe the ground is a bit dead today and this stiff six really helped him.

"He has a good mind and he's shown twice here now that he is very tough, as he didn't get the clearest of runs today.
