



NAVARRO CLEARED TO RACE AT STRONACH TRACKS

Trainer Jorge Navarro will not have to worry about where he is going to race this winter. Tim Ritvo, the chief operating officer of The Stronach Group, reports that the trainer has been cleared to race at Gulfstream and all tracks owned by the Stronach team.

Navarro's status at Gulfstream was, at least for a time, uncertain because he was temporarily banned from racing at Laurel, another Strronach track. Navarro was the second leading trainer at last year's "Championship Meet" at Gulfstream. With 40 winners, he trailed only Todd Pletcher, who had 58.

Navarro found himself in the middle of a controversy when a video surfaced of him and owner Randal Gindi cheering on a horse trained by Navarro's brother Marcial winning a race at Gulfstream. The video was shot at Monmouth Park. Among other controversial comments made by the pair, Gindi shouts out "the juice man" and Navarro says "we f--k everyone."

Just last week, the case was closed when the New Jersey Racing Commission accepted the Monmouth stewards' recommendation to fine Navarro \$10,000 and Gindi \$20,000. In the worst case scenario for Navarro, he could have been suspended or had his license revoked.

Navarro has apologized for his behavior. Gindi did not attend the New Jersey Racing Commission meeting. Navarro said the owner told him he is selling all his horses. *Cont. p3*

ECLIPSE PARTNERS ON OAKS TRAJECTORY WITH AUSTRALIAN BUY by Alan Carasso


Pinot (Aus) (Pierro {Aus}), the first horse campaigned in Australia by the U.S.-based Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, overcame some anxious moments with 200 meters to race in Wednesday's Kennedy Oaks Trial (1800m) at Melbourne's Flemington Racecourse to draw off by 3 3/4 lengths and set herself firmly on track for an appearance in A\$1-million event (2500m) Nov. 9.

Eclipse President Aron Wellman admits that his trip to the 2016 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale in Sydney was legitimately nothing more than a fact-finding mission, a proverbial dip of the toe into Australian bloodstock market. By his own admission, Wellman was there to do window shopping only--that is until lot 267 from the Coolmore Stud draft--failed to attract the attention Wellman thought she should from the buying public. Ritvo said that Laurel had refused to take entries from Navarro because his case was still pending in New Jersey. Now that a final ruling has been made and the penalties levied against Navarro were relatively light, Ritvo said The Stronach Group team did not believe there was a strong enough case for keeping Navarro out.

"It's a complicated situation," Ritvo said. "We did not let him run in Maryland because the case was still open in New Jersey and no one was sure how it was going to be resolved. But now that it has been resolved and there is nothing else pending, he will be allowed to race at our tracks."

The ban on Navarro might have cost Laurel an entry or two in the DeFrancis, which wound up with a field of just four. Navarro trains a couple of top sprinters, including EL Deal (Munnings), who seemed to be good fits for the race. The DeFrancis was won by Chublicious (Hey Chub), who had been trained by Navarro but was transferred to the barn of Claudio Gonzalez before the race. Ritvo said Maryland officials were convinced that Gonzalez, and not Navarro, was in fact training the horse.

Even before the video surfaced, Navarro was a source of constant controversy because of his extraordinarily high winning percentage and his ability to transform ordinary horses into stars. El Deal finished ninth at 102-1 for trainer Francisco D'Angelo in the Jan. 28 Gulfstream Turf Sprint. Some time after that race he was acquired privately by Navarro and owners Al and Michelle Crawford and has not lost since. He is three for his last three and in his last start he won the GI Alfred Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga by eight lengths. He is scheduled to start next in the GI Vosburgh S. at Belmont and appears to be a major contender for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Navarro is winning with 33% of his starters on the year.

Ritvo said that Gulfstream routinely enacts additional security measures when it comes to trainers that win at very high percentages, and that Navarro will be no exception.

"This is not a witch hunt and we're not trying to pick on anyone, but anytime a trainer has results at Gulfstream that can be considered abnormal, their barn will be under extra security," Ritvo said. "We do it to protect the public. There will be cameras in the barn and security officers stationed in the barn. We did this with Kirk Ziadie and Marcus Vitali when they were doing really well. We told them it was in the best interests of the racing public and something we need to do and they were okay with it."

"When this filly came into the ring, I thought there was very light action during the bidding process," Wellman explained. "I was standing with [trainer] Gai [Waterhouse] at the time and she knew I was fond of this filly and the bidding was going slowly and she was hovering around the A\$150,000 level. I felt, at that point, that there was too much value in her with her pedigree and the type of physical she presented not to throw our hat into the ring.

He continued, "We jumped in on the bidding and it was hovering around A\$190,000 and Gai and I turned to each other and we could tell what each other was feeling and we thought,

'Let's give it one more hit' at A\$200,000 and sure enough, that's where the hammer dropped. Gai, being the dynamic person that she is, jumped for joy and gave me a big hug and was thrilled that Eclipse had taken the plunge. It's been a very interesting and educational journey, but to be in this position now and to think she could be this kind of filly is very gratifying."



Wellman said he valued the assistance of U.S.-based

bloodstock agent Marette Farrell, Blue Sky Bloodstock's Julian Blaxland and Waterhouse stable liaison Su-Ann Khaw on his inaugural Australian foray.

By the Waterhouse-conditioned Triple Crown winner Pierro, who stretched out admirably enough to run third in a G1 Cox Plate (2040m), Pinot is a daughter of Dizelle (Aus) (Zabeel {NZ}), herself winner of the 2005 G1 AJC Oaks at Randwick. Pinot's Group 1-winning second dam Danelagh (Aus) (Danehill) produced Dizelle's full-brother, Hong Kong Horse of the Year and G1 Dubai Sheema Classic winner Vengeance of Rain (NZ).

Wellman believes that the filly's longer-winded pedigree turned away some would-be suitors at Easter.

"There has become such an emphasis on precocious, early, fast 2-year-olds and the [Australian] stallion market stresses those Wellman reported. "It was an ideal introduction to racing. After that, she stretched out and we put blinkers on her and she was an entirely different filly. After her race at Bendigo--she just got beat on the wire--[jockey] Steven Baster thought maybe she was cheating a little bit with the blinkers on and potentially waiting on horses, so we took off the hood and the blinkers."

Sent off the \$5.50 (9-2) second favorite Wednesday, Pinot enjoyed the run of the race, but was stuck inside once into the Flemington straight.

"You could tell that Steven Baster was completely loaded with a ton of filly beneath him," Wellman said. "At the eighth pole when he was looking for a seam and got stopped, I thought to myself, 'It's unlikely that she's good enough to overcome that,' but she sure was. When he redirected her down to the rail and the hole opened up, it was quite impressive and exciting."

was going to require more time to come into herself. Gai was phenomenally patient and gave her spell after spell and sent her to the beach and then to the farm. Everyone who had their hands on her did a great job

hands on her did a great job letting her catch up to herself. Gai's horsemanship has been on full display."

A debut ninth over 1300m at Bendigo Aug. 13, Pinot finished runner-up at Geelong (1321m) Sept. 3 and back at Bendigo when trying a mile for the first time Sept. 14.

"We gave her a quiet run sprinting to start and we knew that wouldn't be her thing," And, after speaking with his trainer, Wellman is riding a wave of optimism with the Oaks on the horizon. Pinot was made the \$7 (6-1) ante-post choice following her victory.

"Gai's confidence in this filly has been booming for the past month or so," Wellman reported. "From afar, even though she was a maiden

through her first three starts, Gai is sending me texts and emails to nominate her for this big race and that big race. She was 100% adamant after her second run that this was an Oaks filly

and that she was going to get her to the Oaks. All credit to them for executing an ambitious game plan. She certainly validated Gai's enthusiasm and conviction [Wednesday]. Last night when I spoke to Gai immediately after the race, her reaction to me was, 'Wait until we get her to 2000m and beyond.'"

Wellman says that, all being well, Pinot is set for another run between now and the second Thursday in November. Pinot, who is owned in partnership by Waterhouse, Newgate Farm and James Bester, holds entries for the G1 Schweppes Thousand Guineas (1600m) Oct. 14 and for the G1 Ladbrokes Classic (2000m) Oct. 21, each run at Caulfield. Should she make the gate for the Oaks, Wellman would love to be there.

"It's taken time for our people to wrap their heads around it, but they're over the moon with the position we happen to be in and we'd be only too happy to make the trip--with a horse that's live on top of it," he said.

Wellman also did not rule out the possibility that Pinot could one day race in the U.S.

"We do have some partners, so it would have to be a team decision, but when Gai and I originally connected, the program that we attempted to execute would be to prove a high-class runner in Australia that warranted consideration to bring her to the States," Wellman said. "She has plenty of work to do before then and a lot would depend on timing and assessing where her value lies. We'll have to weigh all variables and we'll have to huddle up with our partners and decide what's in her best interests in establishing her ultimate value. But we would certainly love to see that come full circle like that." (Click to return to p1)

PAGE MCKENNEY'S OWNER DRAWS ROYAL

His sire now stands in Libya, his primary owner was a selfdescribed "working stiff," a poker dealer in Las Vegas, the horse lost his first 12 starts and he was claimed out of a \$16,000 maiden claimer. More than four years after that claim, **Page McKenney** (Eavesdropper) has won 20 races, 13 stakes and has earned \$1,756,378. Stranger things have happened in racing. But not much stranger.

Page McKenney, now seven, added another chapter to the story when he won the \$150,000 Pennsylvania Derby Championship S. Sept. 23 at Parx for his fourth win on the year. With Ben's Cat having been retired and then dying only a few days later, Page McKenney has picked up the mantle as the Mid-Atlantic region's favorite overachiever. He has his own Facebook page, which describes him as "Super Awesome Race Horse at Pimlico Race Course."

"When we went to claim him, we thought there might be something hidden there," said primary owner Adam Staple. "Obviously, we didn't think it was a hidden gem."

Staple, a graduate of Boston University and a New York City native, had worked on and off in the racing industry. He worked for the short-lived *Racing Times*, was the director of stallion season shares at William Schettine's Signature Stallions in Ocala and dabbled in pinhooking and ownership. But an interest in poker took him away from the sport and he moved to Las Vegas to work as a dealer at the Monte Carlo Resort and Casino.

Because the poker room at the Monte Carlo is near the racebook he would occasionally pick up copies of the *Daily Racing Form* that customers had left behind and noticed an ad for someone looking for a partner to go in on a horse. He bought into a horse named Jack Reacher (In Excess {Ire}) and though Jack Reacher didn't enjoy much success on the racetrack, Staple had the bug again.

This race to the **new pari-mutuel regulations** was definitely a route and not a sprint. Despite great effort and preparation by the NTRA, along with many others within the industry, the effort was slow out of the gate and blocked down the backside. Urged on by the support of many thousands within the industry the team continued to work all the way to the wire and eventually won the race.

As Chairman of the National Horseplayers Championship (NHC) Players Committee, I feel fortunate to have played a role in the effort. I remember the weekend at the NHC when the NTRA informed Judy Wagner and me that U.S. Rep. John Yarmuth (D-KY) had secured a meeting with the U.S. Treasury and that he wanted us (along with Kevin Flannery, President of Churchill Downs racetrack) to go to Washington to represent horseplayers and the industry and make our case for change.

It required several years of additional effort from the NTRA team and many others, but here we are. This is truly something the entire industry can celebrate and profit from. Hopefully, we can build on this success and momentum and apply it toward other important challenges facing the racing industry.

He did better with a horse he claimed named Avie (Strong Hope), who consistently picked up checks and that encouraged Staple to expand his small stable.

It's doubtful many people other than Staple and trainer Mary Eppler were interested in claiming Page McKenney when he was entered in a June 20, 2013 race at Colonial Downs by trainer Jazz Napravnik. Not only was he winless in 12 career starts, but he was 10-1 that day. But Staple likes to study pedigrees and thought the horse would turn a corner if turned into a full-time grass horse. That the horse was Pennsylvania-bred and eligible for that state's lucrative state bred programs was also a plus.

"Mary kept touting the Pennsylvania program to me," Staple said. "They were throwing money at people for Pennsylvania breds."

Staple will admit there was some luck involved. With his pedigree research, he thought Page McKenney could turn the corner if converted to a full-time grass horse. Though the gelding is a five-time winner on the grass, he is a far better dirt horse.

Owned at the time by breeders Dr. James Bryant and Linda Davis, Page McKenney broke his maiden the day of the claim. Staple later sold a 10% share in the horse to Bryant and Davis.

It took a while for Page McKenney to start to improve, but there were signs of better things to come when he reeled off four straight wins in 2014, with the streak concluding with his first stakes win, the Robellino S. for Pennsylvania-breds.

By 2015, his career had gone to another level. He finished third in the GIII Charles Town Classic and second in the GIII Pimlico Special. A year later, he finished second in the Charles Town Classic, earning \$234,000. By then, Staple was no longer a poker dealer.

"Who could have ever have imagined this?" Staple said. "As a life-changer it couldn't have been more of one. I actually had enough where I could quit the my job. I was a working stiff, a middle class, average guy from New York City. My association with racing was reading about it in the *Daily News* and going out to Aqueduct occasionally on the A train. Back in high school, my idea of a fun Friday night was to go to Meadowlands on the bus. All my friends thought I was insane."

Page McKenney looked like he might be slipping a bit when he finished second in the Mountainview S. at Penn National earlier this year and then fourth in the West Virginia Governor's S. at Mountaineer. But he came back with a win in the Roanoke against Pennsylvania-breds and then beat open company in the Pennsylvania Derby Championship. With the exception of his win in the 2016 GIII General George S., his only graded stakes victory, his most recent win might have been his most impressive as the field was a good one.

Eppler, who says she believes Page McKenney has at least few good years left in him, understands he doesn't have the breeding to be a top horse and that he struggled early in his career. But she says he has an intangible--heart.

"If you look at his last race, Just Call Kenny (Jump Start) came flying up on him in the last five strides," she said. "Page wasn't going to let him get any closer than he was. It was like Page was telling him I'm not going to let you get any closer than this. Since I have had him, there have only been two or three races that he has been caught and passed in the stretch. Once he gets to the front he wins."

The \$2-million mark in earnings is a goal and as long as Page McKenney stays healthy it seems well within his reach. No matter what, Adam Staple is not going back to dealing poker any time soon.

JOCKEYS' GUILD ISSUES STATEMENT ON RACING INTEGRITY ACT

The Jockeys' Guild released the following statement Wednesday, acknowledging the need for regulation, but also offering concerns about the Horse Racing Integrity Act of 2017.

The board of directors of the Jockeys' Guild, composed of leading Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse jockeys selected by their peers, supports the view that there needs to be a change to better protect the integrity of our industry and promote the level playing field that all members of the racing community desire and deserve.

The Board spent an extensive amount of time, including multiple discussions with industry participants such as The Jockey Club, National Horsemen's Benevolent Protective Association, Association of Racing Commissioners International, as well as others, discussing the proposed legislation and considering the most appropriate position for all of the Guild's members.

It is always the position of the Guild that the safety of the jockeys, as well as the horses, shall always be the first priority. Additionally, the Board took into consideration the possible impact of the adoption such legislation on the entire industry, including the horsemen and owners, as well as the regulators and the racetracks.

The Guild agrees that the proposed Horse Racing Integrity Act of 2017 ("HRIA") has many needed elements that will standardize and improve uniform regulation of equine medication in our industry, and, in general, is supportive of a legislative solution. However, the Guild offers the following observation, which it believes needs to be addressed before the proposed legislation could be supported:

1. Lasix - The Guild is opposed to the elimination of Lasix on race day because we believe it is necessary for the safety of both the horse and the rider. The Guild believes that until there is a consensus reached within the industry that the elimination of Lasix on race day is in the best interest of the horse, it should not be prohibited. In addition, the Guild strongly suggests that all racing jurisdictions adopt rules requiring the administration of *Lasix on race day be done by a licensed, independent third party.* 2. Funding - The Guild agrees that state of the art testing and the expansion of out-of-competition testing is critical to provide a safe and level playing field and enhance the integrity of our industry. The Guild has concerns that extra costs for the proposed anti-doping agency will place severe burdens on race tracks and owners, especially at smaller tracks where many jockeys began their careers and where many of our members ride. The Guild urges more discussion on the costs of the proposed legislation and how it may be productively allocated within existing revenue sources.

3. *RMTC* - The Guild has long been a strong proponent for the Racing Medication Testing Consortium (RMTC), and notes its significant contribution to the racing industry, in particular the establishment of the National Uniform Medication Programs and its campaign for those rules to be uniformly adopted by the states. In that regard, we feel that the RMTC must continue to have a major role moving forward under any federal legislation and would urge amendments to the legislation that would provide the RMTC with the same significant status it enjoys today.

4. Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) - The Guild believes that in many areas, outside of the regulation of medication in racing, ARCI and the various State Racing Commissions should have a unified set of rules and regulations coordinated by the ARCI. Any federal legislation should enhance the role played by ARCI in coordinating these regulations. 5. Oversight/ Governance - The Guild believes that the horse racing industry should develop a consensus on the governance of the new entity created by the HRIA, with more general rights granted to the industry on matters of the overall performance of the new anti-doping agency. The Guild believes that the federal government review of the Horseracing Anti-Doping and Medication Control Authority (HAMCA) should be conducted at the third anniversary of the founding of the organization, not the fifth anniversary as the legislation provides. Furthermore, the Guild, while respecting the no-conflict governance structure, wishes to see the legislation amended to specifically provide for a board seat for the direct nominee of the Jockeys' Guild.

The Guild looks forward to working with the Coalition for Horse Racing Integrity and other members of the industry, as well as legislative leaders, to develop the best program of medication control for the horse racing industry.

ZAYATS INVEST IN ORBY-TOPPING FRANKEL COLT

KILDARE, Ireland--The Zayat family, who raced Triple Crown winner American Pharoah (Pioneerof The Nile), has entered into partnership with the Coolmore team to have their first horse in training in Ireland after buying the top lot at Goffs' Orby Sale, a €1.6-million son of Frankel (GB).

Justin Casse, who has been working the sale with Justin Zayat, was sent in to do the bidding on the family's behalf and had plenty of opposition in the early exchanges from Jeremy Brummitt and Kerri Radcliffe before Anthony Stroud joined the fray for Godolphin. This time around Sheikh Mohammed's team played underbidder to Casse, who confirmed that the colt will be trained by Aidan O'Brien.

"As we said [on Tuesday] we are looking for colts with stallion potential and this horse's pedigree speaks for itself. This mare has been a good producer and Frankel is tremendous--I think I've bought four by him now, including in South Africa," said Casse. "Aidan will train him. He liked the colt and so did the Zayats. Between the parties involved there are plenty of people who know what stallions should look like." (*Click here for more.*)

The colt (lot 330) was bred by Eddie Irwin of Marlhill House Stud and in joining Ballydoyle, he will be following his half-brother Assign (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who raced in Ireland under the name of Adjusted before being exported to Australia where he won the G2 Herbert Power S. and G3 Neville Selwood S. for Lloyd Williams and Robert Hickmott. Their dam Belesta (GB) (Xaar {GB}), a 280,000gns purchase in 2010, has also produced Giuseppe Piazzi (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), a dual Group 3 winner in Scandinavia.

Marlhill House Stud's delighted manager Brian McConnon said, "I knew from the day he was born that he was something special but it's nice when it all works out. It's a relief really. If all horses were as straightforward as he is my job would be easy. He was the type of horse who you could have brought here almost straight from the field, he was just such a good physical specimen."

Based in New Inn near Cashel, the 150-acre Marlhill House Stud is home to 15 mares.

"Topping the sale is a big deal for us as we're only a small farm. It's great for the mare that this colt is going to such a good trainer. She has a Starspangledbanner (Aus) colt foal, but was empty this year. It makes sense to go back to Frankel next year," added McConnon.

Figures Hold Up Well...

Turnover was up slightly overall at \in 40,702,500 but Goffs group chief executive Henry Beeby pointed to the fact that while figures across the sectors remained largely on par with last year's results, this year's Orby did not benefit from the inclusion of some desirable Wildenstein-bred youngsters, as was the case in 2016. He said, "Of course last year the sale was boosted by a group of yearlings that formed part of the once in a generation Wildenstein Stables Ltd Dispersal and it is gratifying that we have bettered the sale when you take out those one-offs whilst an improved clearance rate of 86% is very much a positive."

That 86% came from the sale of 373 of the 433 yearlings brought forward to the ring and was up from 84% last year. The overall average remained static at \in 109,122, while the median fell by 2% to \in 65,000.

On day two, \in 19,557,500 was added to the final tally, at a 7.5% rise in median to \in 64,500 and an average of \in 109,874. The second session clearance was a tick higher than the sale as a whole at 87%.

Beeby continued, "Two millionaires, by Galileo and Frankel, were the clear highlights of another strong renewal of our flagship Orby Sale which has been well supported by a huge international cast of buyers who flocked to Co Kildare to buy some beautifully-bred world-class yearlings that had been sent to us by leading breeders."

"With the likes of Ribchester to promote our wares--and you can't do much better than have the world's best horse sold at a European auction--we were hopeful of a big attendance and I think it was revealing that the only complaint we received on Saturday was that a vendor was 'too busy,' he said. "That demonstrated a real desire for Orby yearlings and led to a sustained demand for the very best over the two days with two millionaires versus one and more lots realising over €250,000."

As is always the case, not all vendors went home happy, with a distinct lack of middle market being a common complaint.

"Indeed, Orby is all about the best selling very well and it was perhaps the case that those few that did not live up to that billing were less popular," Beeby conceded. "The fact is that Orby is very much a premier European sale and that is what our huge cast of buyers require at this sale, so they will overlook any that do not fulfill that strict criteria. There is certainly some food for thought when autumn turns to winter but it is very clear that Orby competes with any sale at the top of the market as we saw on so many occasions with titanic six-figure bidding battles very much the norm on both days."

Well Related Dubawi To America...

Justin Casse's name also appeared on the buyers' sheet next to the Dubawi (Ire) half-sister to Zoffany (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), who was initially knocked down to BBA Ireland for \in 380,000. The filly (lot 251) was later listed as a private sale to Casse at \notin 400,000.

"I don't know who her owner will be yet, but she's not for Zayat Stables," he said. "With a pedigree like that, she doesn't even have to do too much on the racetrack to retain her value. It's rare to be able to get your hands on a Dubawi, not least one who has a Group 2 winner for a half-brother this year. I'll get her back to America and I'm sure one of my clients will be keen to take a share."

The agent didn't have to wait for long as before the day was out the filly had been bought by Gatewood Bell for Everett Dobson's Cheyenne Stables.

Denis Brosnan's Croom House Stud acquired her dam, the Machiavellian mare Tyranny, from Philippa Cooper of Normandie Stud for 230,000gns back in 2007 when carrying the subsequent G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. winner and successful sire



Zoffany. Among Tyranny's other offspring are the G3 Anglesey S. winner Wilshire Boulevard (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and this season's G2 Futurity S. winner Rostropovich (Ire) (Frankel {GB}).

Another regally-bred filly, Airlie Stud's Galileo half-sister to Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway) (lot 390) will race in the famous colours of the Niarchos family, who bought the daughter of Daneleta (Ire) (Danehill) for \in 420,000 under their Flaxman Stables banner.

Mayfair's Galileo Love-In Continues...

The Mayfair Speculators, in partnership with Coolmore, spent €2.6 million on Galileo yearlings at Arqana in August and, making their first visit to Goffs, the team of investors also gave €625,000 for Barronstown Stud's half-sister to G3 Minstrel S. winner Air Chief Marshal (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) (lot 455).

Her 21-year-old dam, the Aga Khan-bred Hawala (Ire) (Warning {GB}), has been a hugely reliable producer, with 11 winners to her name including the listed winners Slip Dance (Ire) (Celtic Swing) and Misu Bond (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}).

Buying in various partnerships across the last two days, including with fellow South African outfit Form Bloodstock, the Mayfair Speculators made their trip to Ireland worthwhile by getting involved in nine yearlings bought for a total of €2,355,000.

Murray-Hayden's Dabirism Delight...

Most pinhookers look to spread the risk by buying a range of foals in partnerships but the coup of the sale was pulled off by Edie Murray-Hayden of Gormanstown Stud, whose sole foal purchase of 2016, a \in 56,000 son of Dabirsim, made almost 10 times his weanling price when selling to Alastair Donald for \notin 500,000.

Pinhookers In Clover...

Another decent pinhooking result came for Norman Williamson, whose Kodiac (GB), colt picked up for €82,000 at Goffs in November, returned to fetch a staggering €500,000 as a yearling. Lot 276, a half-brother to the four-time winner Moon Over Cuzco (Malibu Moon), was the subject of a tug of war between Shawn Dugan and Shadwell, with Sheikh Hamdan's team eventually having the final say. His unraced dam Wonderful Town (Bernstein) is a half-sister to the G3 Prix Miesque winner Magic America (High Yield).

Wonderful Town was not sold at \$55,000 when offered at the 2012 Keeneland January Sale, but Moon Over Cuzco made \$200,000 at Keeneland September the following year and the mare has subsequently found her way to Ireland's Ballyreddin Stud, which bred the Kodiac colt.

Another lucrative pinhooking result was recorded by Tally-Ho Stud, which raided last year's Wildenstein Stables Dispersal for a Pivotal (GB) colt out of the listed-winning Bering mare Adventure Seeker (Fr) for \in 68,000. Named American Graffiti (Fr), the great grandson of All Along (Fr) (Tagowice) is now the property of Godolphin, who bid \in 320,000 for lot 288. Adventure Seeker, who was also among the dispersal and sold in foal to Siyouni (Fr) for \in 125,000 to Brendan Bashford, has been covered this year by Zoffany (Ire).

Juddmonte's Belief in Invincible Spirit...

As a successful owner-breeder operation, Juddmonte Farms is a rare name on buyers' lists at yearling sales, but Prince Khalid's team picked up two new recruits at Goffs on Wednesday, headed by lot 440, a filly by Invincible Spirit (Ire), for \in 450,000. Bred and consigned by the Irish National Stud, the May foal is a daughter of juvenile winner Gift From Heaven (Ire) (Excellent Art {Ire}), a half-sister to G3 Bengough S. winner Lightning Moon (Ire) (Shamardal) who is now at stud in Spain at Yeguada Torreduero.

"She looked a very classy filly who should have a bit of speed and we've had some luck with Invincible Spirit," said Lord Grimthorpe. **Cont. p8**

"I thought he was a fantastic specimen," said Varian. "We had to dig a little deeper than we thought we'd have to but he had so much quality and is a terrific advert for his sire."

Mick Flanagan, who signed for the Knocktoran Stud-bred colt as a foal, added, "We took a position on him last year and thought that we'd try for him if he sold for less than 200,000gns. He has a proper pedigree and it's rare when you get a horse in a premier sale whose physical qualities match such a pedigree. We wish Roger and [his wife] Hanako the very best of luck with him."

The grey colt is a half-brother to the listed-placed Juliet Fair (Ire), who raced in the Moyglare colours, and to Cheveley Park's recent G3 Sweet Solera S. runner-up Juliet Capulet (Ire), who is declared for Friday's G2 Shadwell Rockfel S.

Capulet Monteque is a half-sister to G2 King's Stand S. runner-up Flanders (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}), who has founded her own successful branch of the family as the dam of champion sprinter G Force (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}) among her four black-type performers. Dark Angel has also worked well with another of the mare's half-sisters, Land Army (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}), who is the dam of the top speedster, Lethal Force (Ire).

Yulong Owner Invests Again...

Chinese owner Zhang Yuesheng is a regular visitor to Goffs and has increased his string of horses in training in Ireland with several significant purchases this week.

Assisted by Michael Donohoe of BBA Ireland, Zhang ensured that lot 340, a brave €100,000 pinhook by Guy O'Callaghan of Grangemore Stud, returned a tidy profit on that investment when signing for the son of Invincible Spirit (Ire) at €300,000. His half-sister Katla (Ire) (Majestic Missile {Ire}) has already won three listed races and his dam Bratislava (GB) (Dr Fong) is herself a half-sister to the former champion juvenile and young Haras d'Etreham sire Wootton Bassett (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}).

Zhang, the owner of China's Yulong racecourse who also has horses in training in Australia, has his Irish-based representatives predominantly with Michael Halford, though no trainer has yet been selected for the colt. Zhang will also race a Dubawi half-sister to the classy Banimpire (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) (lot 87), who was bought from the Kilcarn Stud draft on Tuesday for €150,000.

Bahen All Smiles...

Justin Bahen, buying on behalf of Hong Kong-based Orbis Bloodstock, opted for a half-brother to Intern (Ire) (Rip Van Winkle {Ire}), who has already proved to be a decent performer for the same owner, finishing second in the G3 Classic Trial at Sandown earlier this season. Australia Day...

This season we've seen Ulysses (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) come of age with two Group 1 victories and juvenile Magic Lily (GB) (New Approach {Ire}) make an explosive debut to win by eight lengths and earn favourable quotes for next season's Classics. The Oaks winners Light Shift and Dancing Rain (Ire) have provided these two classy individuals, while Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) already has a Classic winner to her name in Australia (GB), who, like his mother and father, also triumphed at Epsom and The Curragh.

It's far too early even to speculate on how successful his stud career will be, but his first yearlings on sale this year have so far been given a warm reception at Goffs. A colt and a filly offered in the second session of the Orby sale each passed the €200,000 mark, with lot 272, a half-brother to the dual Group 2 winner and young sire Universal (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) selling for €270,000 to Dr. Jim Hay through Hugo Merry. Bred by the Wicklow-based Grangecon Stud, the April-born colt was offered by the Castlebridge Consignment.

The Mayfair Speculators continued their spending and teamed up with Jehan Malherbe of Form Bloodstock to buy Barronstown Stud's Australia filly (lot 265) out of Weekend Fling (Forest Wildcat), a half-sister to GI Arkansas Derby winner Archarcharch (Arch), for \in 220,000. In total, 14 Australia yearlings were sold from 16 offered for an average of \in 101,143.

His Coolmore studmate No Nay Never has also made a splash thanks to support from the Mayfair Speculators and MV Magnier, who have purchased two of his highest-priced colts at Goffs for €350,000 (lot 239) and €300,000 (lot 39) apiece. Meanwhile Alastair Donald signed for Lynn Lodge Stud's colt (lot 426) out of the unraced Fancy (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Bought for €46,000 as a foal by Mags O'Toole, the grandson of G3 Park Express S. winner Danehill Music (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) leapt in price to €325,000. From 21 offered, 19 No Nay Never yearlings sold for an average of €125,000.

The action continues at Goffs Thursday with the one-day Sportsman's Sale from 9:30 a.m. local time.

ELARQAM TAKES TO THE ROWLEY MILE

"Mark has always liked him, but it was obvious fairly early he wasn't going to be a six-furlong horse and we think he'll stay further. At York, Dane [O'Neill] said he only hit top gear in the final furlong and he couldn't pull him up. His trainer and breeder say he resembles his mother, who wasn't really a looker, but for a Frankel he appears to have a very good mind, by all accounts. We're looking forward to seeing him in action again and hope he can take the next step up."

Two other once-raced maiden winners are Al Shaqab Racing's **Fajjaj (Ire)** (Dawn Approach {Ire}) and Godolphin's **Morlock (Ire)** (Epaulette {Aus}), with the former scoring at Ascot Sept. 9 and the latter getting off the mark at Kempton Sept. 8.

Fajjaj is held in high regard by connections and Al Shaqab's racing manager Harry Herbert said, "He's a very nice horse, a magnificent looker. It was a lovely debut at Ascot and he was ridden very well to win given how green he was. Physically and mentally he should have sharpened up since then and he's been working well enough since for Hugo [Palmer] to want to run him in a Group 3. He warrants the appearance and deserves the opportunity. When they do what he did on debut it is all positive and they can only get better."

Charlie Appleby said of Morlock, "I was pleased with Morlock on his debut, when he did everything very professionally, and the form of that race looks to have worked out quite well so far. This is his next step, but he looks to have come forward for his first run and hopefully he will be competitive."



Tip Two Win impressed at Doncaster last time | Racing Post

Anne Cowley's **Tip Two Win (GB)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) comes here on the back of a success in the Listed Flying Scotsman S. at Doncaster last time Sept. 15 and that was a smart performance on his first try at this trip. "I was nervous that this would come a bit too soon after Tip Two Win's Doncaster victory, but he is so well at the moment that it has encouraged me to run him again," trainer Roger Teal said. "I had not expected him to romp home by two lengths in the Flying Scotsman, but the race went smoothly and once Adam [Kirby] switched him he quickly put it to bed. What really struck me was when it looked like the others were going to come to him near the finish he picked up again. The step up to seven furlongs seemed to benefit him as he takes a bit of time to get into top gear--he's got a lovely big stride and wants to use it."



SUSPENDED BAN FOR MCGUINNESS

Dublin trainer Ado McGuinness has been handed a two-year disgualification from training by the Turf Club though significantly for him it has been suspended for the duration, provided the trainer does not breach any similar rules in the next two years. The sanction stems from a District Court appearance by McGuinness last year after the Department of Agriculture found unauthorised animal remedies at his training premises during an inspection in 2014. McGuinness who has enjoyed a good season with 15 winners to date, was originally fined €2,500 and was ordered to pay €1,000 towards Turf Club costs for the latest judgement. McGuinness was keen to stress that none of the substances found were performance enhancing and following the verdict he commented, "I'm just relieved it's all over. This is something which happened three years ago and I'm glad it's been brought to a close. I just want to now carry on trying to train as many winners as possible."

The Turf Club Referrals Committee issued a statement which read, "In relation to the offence itself, the Committee felt that it was a middle range offence which would normally attract a licence suspension of two years. What occurred was damaging to the good reputation of racing as a licensed trainer had been convicted in the District Court with the resulting publicity. With regard to Mr McGuinness, the committee noted that the probable consequences of the loss of his licence would be catastrophic. They also noted that the substances found were not prohibited at all times, that Mr McGuinness had a clean record, that there was a guilty plea and that he volunteered certain information. Mr McGuinness accepted the penalty and agreed that the penalty can be imposed together with any other penalty which may apply for any new offence if he breaches similar rules within the relevant period."

Carrying six and a half kilos less than her nearest rival and eight and a half to others, last season's G1 Golden Slipper S. winner **She Will Reign (Aus)** (Manhattan Rain {Aus}) is the lone 3-year-old filly in the G1 Moir S. (1000m) at Moonee Valley and will carry just 50 kilos on her back. SPELL LIKELY FOR OSCIETRA
