Chuck Fipke likes to challenge himself. That's why he became a geologist. That's why he sold his stake in Canada's Ekati Diamond Mine, the discovery that made him wealthy, to be able to further explore the rest of the planet. It's also the reason he's coming off of two enormous Grade I victories in three weeks and is, naturally, pointing both winners toward the world's richest horse race.

At the 2007 Keeneland November sale, Fipke made a big splash when he went to \$2.5 million to secure the previous year's GI Kentucky Oaks heroine, Lemons Forever (Lemon Drop Kid). That's where he met Dallas Stewart, who campaigned and co-owned the filly with Willis Horton.

"I went over to congratulate him because that's what you do and we had a small talk," Stewart recalled. "He said, 'Hey, I'm going to send you some horses one day. I've been watching you.' I said, 'Man, that would be great.' He sent me some horses, we had a couple of winners right off the bat, Lemons Forever had one baby who was OK, then Unbridled Forever came down the pike and she was a superstar. Then Forever Unbridled came."

A daughter of Unbridled's Song, Unbridled Forever placed in five graded stakes as a 3-year-old before busting out in the GI Ballerina S. the following summer. But it was her one-year-younger full-sister who has taken Fipke and Stewart into a new echelon. *Cont. p3*

WILDFIRE REACHES SAN LUIS REY DOWNS, ATTEMPTS MADE TO RESCUE HORSES

A fast-spreading wildfire descended rapidly on the San Luis Rey Downs training facility in Bonsall, California Thursday afternoon, leaving horsemen with no choice but to turn horses loose on the property to avoid the flames. Images from local San Diego County news stations and Twitter posts from horsemen showed videos of horses running freely on the track and in the stable area as smoke and flames engulfed the surrounding areas and early reports indicated a number of equine fatalities and destroyed barns.

Trainer Mike Machowsky, contacted via phone by the *TDN* late Thursday, said his assistant at San Luis Rey reported that the fire began on the nearby hillside and quickly reached some of the barns at the edge of the property. (Click to continue to p5)





Fipke Families Shining Bright (cont. from p1)

Like her kin, **Forever Unbridled** progressed markedly from three to four, going from a Grade III winner as a sophomore to a multiple Grade I victress the following season, capturing the GI Apple Blossom H. and GI Beldame S. in 2016. But even that was just an appetizer for her 5-year-old success. After running down the brilliant Songbird (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GI Personal Ensign S. at Saratoga, the dark bay gave Fipke and Stewart one of the biggest thrills of their lives by triumphing in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Nov. 3 at Del Mar.

"Forever Unbridled is a pretty awesome horse," Fipke said. "She's a long-legged, beautiful animal. Her conformation is unreal. She's got the physical down. And if you notice in her last four races, she's never been whipped. We don't whip her, she goes by encouragement, and we feel that if she was whipped, she wouldn't win. It's in her heart. You don't have to whip somebody who has a great heart."




Chuck Fipke and Dallas Stewart in the winner's circle after the Personal Ensign | Sarah K. Andrew

A year before Fipke went to the mat for Lemons Forever at KEENOV, he had turned heads with his purchase of Title Seeker (Monarchos), an unraced daughter of undefeated Hall of Famer Personal Ensign (Private Account), for \$1.7 million. The filly was pregnant with a foal by Seeking the Gold. That foal became Seeking the Title, who captured the GIII lowa Oaks and was placed in the GI Gazelle S. for Stewart in 2010.

Seeking the Title's first three matings were with Perfect Soul (Ire), who gave Fipke his first Grade I win in the 2003 GI Shadwell Turf Mile en route to a Sovereign Award for champion turf horse. The second mating produced **Seeking the Soul**, who RNA'd for \$37,000 as an OBS June 2-year-old in 2015.

Seeking the Soul proved a fortunate buyback. Graded stakes placed as a sophomore, he has found a whole new gear as a 4-year-old this fall.

Versailles, KY • (859) 873-1420 Inquiries to Clifford Barry or Nancy Stephens www.pinoakstud.com Closing into a slow pace to be third in the Lukas Classic Sept. 30 at Churchill, the bay broke the track record for 1 1/16 miles on the Keeneland dirt in a nine-length allowance romp Oct. 21 at Keeneland. That effort got Fipke and Stewart thinking big.

"He ran so big at Keeneland, I immediately started talking to Mr. Fipke about the Breeders' Cup Classic and told him that we should consider it," Stewart said. "He listened and we talked about it, but we came to the decision--me, Sid Fernando and Mr. Fipke thought it would be better for the whole family, coming back against Gun Runner in two weeks, I might get him out there and wish I wouldn't have brought him out there and then that would mess us up. We didn't really have enough time to figure it out, but I was thinking about it."

Instead, Stewart stayed home with Seeking the Soul, and the colt rewarded him. Given a near 8-1 chance in the GI Clark H. Nov. 24 at Churchill, he took advantage of a ground-saving ride by John Velazquez and held gamely for a 3/4-length upset.

"He's one of those horses who can really run, has a natural way of going and so you're blessed whenever you get a horse like that," Fipke said. "It's what everybody is hoping to get. If you go and visit him in the stable and look at him next to all the other horses, he's just different. He's like a loaded gun ready to go off. He's a serious racehorse."

Fipke announced that Forever Unbridled would be pointed toward the \$16-million GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational in the winner's circle of the Breeders' Cup Distaff. Now he has thrown Seeking the Soul's hat in the ring to challenge likely Horse of the Year Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}) as well.

"He could win the Pegasus," Fipke said. "Gun Runner is the horse to beat, nobody can take anything from him, he's wonderful, but the bull at the top of the mountain, they don't stay there forever."

Fipke is looking to purchase one \$1-million entry for Forever Unbridled and find an investor to buy Seeking the Soul's spot in the gate.

"We have the two that could go in the Pegasus, both might go in, I think we're going to reserve a spot for one of them," Fipke said. "John Velazquez would like to ride the colt, so we're hoping that will come about."

In his day-to-day work, Fipke is soaring as well. Closing in on another potentially large diamond mine in northern Canada, he is active in an array of different explorations across the globe.

"We're working in Brazil, Morocco, we explore for everything, diamonds, base metals, gold," Fipke said. "It's in my blood. I've been trained to find mines and that's what I do."


As for racing, Fipke is sure to savor his high points in a challenging spot.

"The horse business can be so depressing for months and months," he said. "For all the horses and races that you lose, there are not too many winners, so it's kind of neat that you keep pressing on and all of a sudden, you get a couple good horses. It's so hard to get a good horse. It's not easy. It requires a great team and you can't have any holes or weaknesses in the chain. You have to cover everything.

"There are many good horses, super horses sometimes, that break down. You can think a horse is going to do so well, everybody loves it, then the horse breaks down or there's a throat issue or something like that and it just destroys everything. It's pretty lucky when you can get a couple of good horses who can break down all the barriers and beat all those odds."

Luck aside, Fipke has built a foundation for his operation off of just two mares he believed in over a decade ago. And the entire team has enjoyed the fruits of their lineage.

"To be a part of these two families, I've got to thank Lemons Forever and Seeking the Title," Stewart said. "They got us where we are today. Two of the strongest [families] in the world, if you ask me."

Wildfire Reaches San Luis Rey Downs

"Some of the lower barns--portable barns--caught on fire," Machowsky said, relaying a phone conversation he had with trainer Michele Dollase a half-hour earlier. "They turned horses loose to keep them out of the fire and they [were] running around on the track--that's what I heard."


Dollase was taking care of one of Machowsky's trainees at San Luis Rey.

"They said they've never seen anything like it," Machowsky added.

A major contributing factor to the rapid spread of the fire was the intense Santa Ana winds, which apparently downed palm trees and allowed new fires to begin. Machowsky said other trainers related that it was difficult to navigate around the property as a result of limited visibility, while fire trucks attempted to stake out various barns in an attempt to control the blazes.

"With these winds, you can't control much," Machowsky said. "We've had the fires before around us...These Santa Ana winds this time of year, they get into the brush and fires start almost instantly."

The fire in north San Diego County, dubbed the Lilac Fire, forced numerous evacuations among private horse owners in previous days and had reached an estimated 100-150 acres as of Thursday afternoon, prompting Del Mar and Fairplex to open the doors of their stable gates to displaced horses. Keith Brackpool, chairman of West Coast operations for The Stronach Group at Santa Anita, noted that transportation between tracks was made difficult because the fire around San Luis Rey necessitated significant road closures.

"[The] immediate safety of the horses is the priority," Brackpool tweeted, responding to TVG's Simon Bray. "[We are] hoping also that the roads open up to allow trailers to evacuate."

Various reports indicated that the fire crossed some of the main roads around the training center. Among the prominent trainers stabled at San Luis Rey are Richard Baltas, Peter Miller and Doug O'Neill.

David Meah, assistant to Baltas, reported all of their horses were unharmed as of Thursday evening.

"Richard confirmed all of our horses are safe right now," Meah said. "Our barn is concrete, so ash isn't going to fall on it and burn it down."

Meah continued, "I was at Santa Anita and I was getting in my car, but Richard said not to bother because they aren't letting

anyone in. Earlier, vans were allowed in and horses were evacuated to Del Mar, but now they are not letting anyone in. It all happened very quickly--the winds are about 40-60 miles per hour. Richard said several horses had died--we all need to pray for the people and horses around there."

A post on O'Neill's Facebook page indicated that O'Neill's assistant Leandro Mora was on site at San Luis Rey to assist with the evacuation process.

"Emergency evacuation happened almost immediately and at this time, we are doing all we can, but it's extremely difficult," the post read. "We will update our owners as soon as we can. We ask that you please pray for all of us effected by this horrific event. Southern California horsemen need it right now. Our thoughts and prayers go out to all."

According to the training center's website, there are 500 stalls on-site, over 400 of which are occupied.

In a message posted on the Del Mar Racetrack Twitter page Thursday afternoon prior to the fire at San Luis Rey, the track encouraged evacuees to bring bedding, feed and horse identification to make the process go as smoothly as possible. Fairplex had 23 horses residing in its stable area as of Thursday, with more expected in coming days. (Click to return to p1)

ZAYAT LOOKS FOR SOLOMINI TO STEP

FORWARD IN FUTURITY by Jessica Martini

Zayat Stables' **Solomini** (Curlin), already a runner-up in a pair of Grade I race in just three lifetime starts, will have another chance at a top-level victory when he faces four rivals in the

GI Los Alamitos CashCall Futurity Saturday. The Bob Baffert trainee contested the pace before settling for second behind Good Magic (Curlin) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last time out and connections look for continued improvement Saturday.

"He came out of the Breeders' Cup in good shape and the last couple of weeks he's been training very well," said Justin Zayat. "Obviously, being by Curlin, he's bred to get better

with age. Next year, hopefully, he'll improve and be even better, but right now he's training really well for the Los Al Futurity and we're very happy with him and with the way he's doing."

Solomini faces stiff competition in the Futurity from his promising stablemate **McKinzie** (Street Sense), who was tabbed a 'TDN Rising Star' after his 5 1/2-length debut victory at Santa Anita Oct. 28.

"It looks like McKinzie may be a pretty special horse," Zayat


admitted. "On paper, we've done more so far. McKinzie has only had one race and he hasn't gone two turns yet, so he has some questions to answer. But he ran a 5 on the Ragozins first time out. That's pretty sensational for a 2-year-old first time out. If he moves forward off of that, I'm sure he'll be super tough to beat. I know Bob is high on him also. I've been in that position--we had American Pharoah against Dortmund-sometimes you've just got to run against your stablemate."

After a determined debut victory at Del Mar Sept. 2, Solomini was second

behind the highly regarded Bolt d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro) in the Sept. 30 GI FrontRunner S. He will be making his third start at 1 / 16 miles in the Futurity.

Zayat admitted Solomini's early success has been something of a surprise.

"We always thought he was a nice horse, but we never expected him to win that early on, in his first race," Zayat said. "Then running in the Grade Is, he kept on stepping up to the plate. The Breeders' Cup was a big test for him to see if he was a really good colt or if he had just run two good races. And he ran a really big race in the Breeders' Cup."

Solomini is out of the unraced Surf Song (Storm Cat), who is a half-sister to Midshipman and to Fast Cookie (Deputy Minister), dam of Grade I winner Frosted (Tapit). The Zayats purchased the colt for \$270,000 at the 2016 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. And, while the family had plenty of success pinhooking juveniles this past spring, Solomini was not under consideration for resale.

"He actually wasn't one we thought about it," Zayat said. "We had another Curlin that we took instead of him."

"On the day that we bought him, for some reason, I just fell in love with him," Zayat continued. "I always thought something was special about him. I always had a good feeling about him, especially with his pedigree. He's out of a Storm Cat mare and you don't see that many of them out there anymore. It's a very deep pedigree with Frosted down there, so he's an exciting prospect."

In preparation for the Futurity, Solomini worked five furlongs in 1:01 4/5 Sunday at Santa Anita.

"It's a good position to be in at this time of year," Zayat said of having a promising juvenile. "It lets us dream a little bit. Hopefully, he'll do something good Saturday and we can continue the dream."





STRIKING A COMMERCIAL BALANCE AT QUESNAY

Striking the right balance between breeding for a private family and commercial breeding is often a dicey affair, requiring an acceptance from would-be purchasers that just because mares are for sale doesn't mean they're not valuable. But a glance through the 42 horses on offer (click here) from the Head family's Haras du Quesnay at the Arqana December Breeding Stock sale, part of a farm reduction, will offer buyers plenty of assurance as to their quality.

Quesnay will be offering the family's entire 2017 foal crop along with 50% of their mares between this sale and Arqana's February Mixed sale, looking to reduce duplications in families and open up space at the farm in order to make room for clients to increase their boarding numbers.

The farm, which enjoyed its greatest success with one of its classic families, the family of two-time Arc winner and 2013 European Horse of the Year Treve (Fr), who was born and raised on the farm, is looking to reduce the number of mares they have from similar families and perhaps acquire some new blood.

"We have been working for a long time with the same number of mares and the same families and there are too many horses for what the Head family wants to do," explained the farm's director, Vincent Rimaud.

RECORD-BREAKING DECEMBER SALE ENDS BOOM YEAR FOR TATTERSALLS

The roar of Tuesday's action at Tattersalls had become a whimper by Thursday but that didn't stop the Tattersalls December Sale breaking yet another record as 105,255,000gns changed hands over a fortnight at Park Paddocks for yearlings, foals, fillies and mares. That tally ensured that turnover for the whole year in Newmarket rose to 331 million gns from last year's high mark of 265 million gns.

"The 2017 Tattersalls December Sale will live long in the memories of the huge number of people who have all contributed to another outstanding sale here at Park Paddocks," said Chairman Edmond Mahony as Tattersalls went into hibernation until the February Sale.

Rimaud continued, "It's a new way of running Haras du Quesnay, a way to start something else, to make some room for better-quality horses and make some room for clients who would like to board mares with us, stand stallions, or prep their horses with us."

The December consignment includes 25 foals (including some for clients), 18 mares, three fillies out of training, and the 12-year-old stallion Dunkerque (Fr), whose son Blacktype (Fr) just won the GII Knickerbocker S. at Belmont Oct. 9.

"All of these mares we're selling are coming from families we have, and we're keeping mares from each of the families, of course," said Rimaud. "These are families who are very well-known.

Every year, we take yearlings to the sale from these families, or keep horses in training from these families. It's time to take a step back and maybe give ourselves the opportunity to invest in some new families, like when we bought two mares at last year's December sale, one from a nice Aga Khan family (Shahmeen {Fr}, by Shamardal) and one Wertheimer family (Born Cross {Ire}, by Dubawi {Ire})."


Rimaud said that 10 additional mares and two foals would be

sold in February, and that all of the stock being sold were owned by Haras du Quesnay, while Criquette, Freddy and Alec Head would retain their own personal mares. That will leave the farm with 16 family mares.

Highlights among the mares include:

*Hip 202, Maimara (Fr), a dual Group 3 winner out of training, who is the sister to two black-type horses. "It's quite an interesting pedigree," said Rimaud. "You don't find any Northern Dancer blood back through the fifth generation.

She's quite interesting for a breeder, and was a good racing mare over a mile."

*Hip 103, Totally Mystic (GB), is a filly out of training by Invincible Spirit (Ire) out of a sister to the dam of Moonlight Cloud (GB).

"We also have a few nice mares selling Sunday," said Rimaud. "Hip 340, Sea Horn (Fr), is in foal for the first time to Wootton Bassett (GB). She's the first and only foal of the dam, who is full-sister to Imperial Monarch (Ire) who won the Grand Prix de Paris, so it's a rare opportunity to get into this family, from the only foal from this dam, who is by Galileo (Ire)."

Sunday will see the sale of some mares from classic Haras du Quesnay families, like the family of GI Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner Silvermine (Fr). "We are selling a few from this family," said Rimaud, mares like Sea Life (Fr) (Hip 341), Silvery Bay (Fr) (Hip 353), and Silvaplana (Fr) (Hip 354) which are from this nice family, mainly in foal to Haras du Quesnay stallions like Intello (Ger), Motivator (GB), and Anodin (Fr).

Quesnay will also offer 25 foals, including the only two Siyouni (Fr) fillies in the sale. Hip 195 and Hip 88. The latter, Sea Mood (Fr), is the first foal from the black-type mare Upbeat Mood, and is a half-sister to Antonoe, a Grade I winner in America.

"We will also offer Hip 126, a very nice Dabirsim (Fr) filly. She comes from a very nice German family, and is half-sister to the German two-year-old Champion, Acadius (Ger). We also have several Motivators and Intellos, out of young mares."

One of those Intellos is Hip 83, an Intello colt who is the first foal out of a Toride (Fr), an unraced full-sister to Treve (Fr).

"We also have eight foals we are selling who have Anabaa as a broodmare sire. Anabaa is one of the leading broodmare sires in Europe and Australia, so that's quite exciting, and it's a nice opportunity to pick up foals with Anabaa as a broodmare sire."

Dunkerque's loss will be offset this year with the addition of Attendu (Fr), who will be the first son of Acclamation (GB) to stand in France; Acclamation has already produced successful sires Dark Angel (Ire) and Equiano (Fr). A Group winner at 2, 3 and 4, Attendu stands for €5,000, and is free of Northern Dancer blood back through the fifth generation.

Rimaud points out that he is one of 26 new stallions to stand in France for 2018. "We are very pleased to get Attendu, who raced for the Wertheimers as did Anodin. He has a pedigree and a racing career that doesn't go against stallions that we're already standing. I think it's important to have the opportunity to suit all type of breeders and mares, and I think for Haras du Quesnay, the right number of stallions is between four and six."

After the mares sell in February, Haras du Quesnay will have, in addition to clients' mares, 16 farm-owned mares on the property. "We have enough room to board 70 mares on the farm, and have 55 or 60 foals every year, so that's why we'll be pleased to board mares for any client."

"We would," he concluded with a wry smile, "be happy to

board mares at the farm and raise foals on the land where Treve was born and raised."



A 32% rise in aggregate for the the December Sale as a whole came at an average price of 68,303gns (+34%) and median of 25,000gns (+14%) for 1,541 horses of varying ages sold at a clearance rate of 78%.

For these last four days of fillies and broodmares, 675 lots were sold, just six fewer than in 2016, and by the time all 857 offered had passed through the ring, the aggregate weighed in at 68,315,300gns (+53%). The average was also vastly improved at 101,208gns (+54%) but the median figure dropped by 7% to 25,000gns and the clearance rate was 79%.





Thursday's session topper lot 2433 | Tattersalls

Despite the glowing figures of earlier in the week, it was hard work for vendors at Tattersalls on Thursday with a dearth of buyers left on the sales grounds. The session was led by the very last lot through the ring, 2433, the winning 4-year-old filly Angelical (Ire) (Dark Angel (Ire)), bought by Bill Dwan for an undisclosed client at 35,000gns.

"She is for a friend who was looking for a well-bred filly. He went home and left me in charge," said Dwan.

An average of 5,294gns (-9%) and a static median of 3,000gns, with 656,400gns in total being added to the coffers for 124, or 73%, of the lots on Thursday's list, illustrates the lack of demand for horses at this lower end of the market. It is a tale that is repeated at sales across the board and the disparity between sessions should serve as a warning to breeders ahead of finalising mating plans for 2018.

"Balios has the physical strength of Shamardal and the good temperament of Galileo, two essential criteria for a racehorse, which every breeder dreams of reconciling. We intend to send several mares to this promising young stallion," said a representative of Al Asayl Bloodstock. Balios was bred by Sheikh Sultan Bin Khalifa Al Nahyan and is a grandson of the mighty triple Group 1 winner Elle Danzig (Ger) (Roi Danzig). The 5-yearold retires to stud at a covering fee of €2,500, a race record of 6-2-1 and earnings £168,361.

LUCK--BOTH GOOD AND BAD--IN THE HKIR

HONG KONG -- Fields were drawn Thursday morning in the state-of-the-art parade ring at Sha Tin Racecourse for Sunday's HK\$84.5-million Longines Hong Kong International Races, with

results that satisfied a good many of the connections of the 51 entered horses, while others were more subdued.

The day's featured event is the HK\$25-million G1
Longines Hong Kong Cup, and if anything, Werther (NZ) (Tavistock {NZ}) will have tightened his grip on favourtism after landing gate three, just to the outside of Neorealism (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}), who defeated Werther into third in the course-and-distance G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup in April.

"Good barrier," enthused jockey Tommy Berry when speaking with owner Johnson Chen before adding that Werther went well in his Thursday morning gallop (see Trackside Report).

Trainer John Moore was also pleased with the outcome.

"We wanted three, four or five--when the owner drew three, I couldn't believe it," he said. "The owner did a great job drawing gate three, especially with Neorealism drawing the inside and Time Warp (GB) (Archipenko) in gate five. The pace influences

are all around us so they are going to go forward, so we are going to get the gun run. He's got enough gate speed, so he'll be tracking the speed."

Like Werther and Neorealism, Poet's Word (GB) (Poet's Voice (GB) is rated internationally on 119 and while he is not as accomplished as that duo, he arguably has the greater upside. He is drawn widest in 12, but that barrier has produced as many winners (3) in the last 18 runnings of the Cup as has the inside gate.

The skies were decidedly darker for the connections of **Lucky Bubbles (Aus)** (Sebring {Aus}), who figures the second favourite at worst for the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint (1200m). After encountering all sorts of traffic trouble when ninth to Mr Stunning (Aus) (Exceed and Excel (Aus)) in the G2 Jockey Club Sprint last time, the popular chestnut drew the dreaded one hole and will need all of jockey Hugh Bowman's skill to get the job done. Jockey Nash Rawiller was noticeably relieved when he pulled barrier four for Mr Stunning, while GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner Stormy Liberal (Stormy Atlantic) difficult task was made that much tougher when drawing the 11 hole.

"If I'd had the chance to choose the barrier then I would have gone for four or five so the four's just perfect," Rawiller said.

Of Stormy Liberal's draw, Rockingham Ranch Racing Manager Brian Trump tweeted, "Well wasn't the post we were hoping for, but Stormy Liberal looks great and with Silvestre de Sousa guiding us, anything can happen."

The G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile looks the most wide-open of the days events and its nominal favourite, G2 Jockey Club Mile hero Seasons Bloom (Aus) (Captain Sonador {Aus}) landed a good gate in five, prompting a smile out of jockey Joao Moreira who was watching in the audience. Japan's Satono Aladdin (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) will start just to the inside of Seasons

Bloom, while defending champion **Beauty Only (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor (Ire)) drew gate 12. Connections would not be unduly concerned with that result, as the blaze-faced 6-year-old defeated **Helene Paragon (Fr)** (Polan {Fr}) from gate 13 last year. The latter is in the other end of the machine in stall two.

A deep field of 12 was drawn for the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase (2400m) and Talismanic (Medaglia d'Oro) could fall into the same trip he parlayed into victory last time in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf after drawing gate one, the same stall from which he departed at Del Mar. Highland Reel (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) was third in the Turf and will likely be ridden for speed from gate eight by Ryan Moore. Max Dynamite (Fr) (Great Journey {Jpn}), third in the G1 Melbourne Cup, drew gate two, while G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St Leger) winner Kiseki (Jpn) (Rulership {Jpn}) has the three, assuming he is cleared to run by HKJC stewards. But the Vase is a race that runs much deeper than those three top stayers.

HKIR TRACKSIDE REPORT: JAPANESE TEAR **UP THE TURF** by Alan Carasso

HONG KONG -- Veterans of the Hong Kong International Races know precisely what Thursday morning means in the lead-up to the Sunday Group 1s. Notwithstanding the fact that it is just over 72 hours to Sunday's four big events, the Japanese runners--in this case a most impressive octet--take center stage to top off their preparations. And there were some impressive moves to be witnessed.

Neorealism (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}) was first to grace the Sha Tin turf course around 8:45 a.m. Thursday and, with Joao Moreira aboard, finally came through the lane moving nicely, if

not asked to extend fully as he readies for the G1 Cup.

The 'Magic Man' was also given a leg up on his G1 Vase mount Tosen Basil (Jpn) (Harbinger {GB}) who was accompanied by Cup contender Staphanos (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and Hugh Bowman. The duo loped leisurely along the riverside, the two top-class jocks conversing all the while, before picking it up down the lane, and it was the longer-winded Tosen Basil who did arguably the better of the two through the line.

Other big-day riders made the short trip down to Hong Kong to partner horses in their final serious work. Mirco Demuro was in to team up with Kiseki (Jpn) (Rulership {Jpn}), and one of the top Vase fancies worked steadily over the final 400 metres. Yutaka Take was astride the gray mare **Smart Layer (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who was reaching out nicely along the grandstand-side rail.

Bowman also has the call aboard Satono Aladdin (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G1 Mile and the 6-year-old G1 Yasuda Kinen hero made a favourable impression, as is his custom.

Japan has two longshot contenders for the G1 Sprint in the form of Once In a Moon (Jpn) (Admire Moon (Jpn)), a longbodied bay who moved sweetly through the lane; and the curiously named Let's Go Donki (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), who streaked past onlookers as the international training session wound down.

The Vase is carded as the first of the four internationals Sunday and the 2017 running could very well be its best ever. Highland Reel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) led the five Ballydoyle HKIR participants through the lane and has been routinely less warm than he usually gets in the morning. To this observer, no horse has made a more striking impression than Max Dynamite (Fr) (Great Journey {Jpn}), who powered through two laps of the dirt track looking every bit a world-class stayer. One wonders if the

12 furlongs is too short a trip, but he looks fantastic physically. Danehill Kodiac (GB) (Kodiac (GB)) put in a sharp gallop Thursday and appears to be doing as well as he can, while **Sharp** Call (SAf) (Ideal World), who was allowed to open up down the lane Wednesday, did so with even more vigour Thursday. Don't be shocked if she runs a placing.

The French-trained The Right Man (GB) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) and Signs of Blessing (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) were put through their paces on the dirt track in an effort to keep them ticking over. Not surprisingly, neither travels especially well on the dirt and both are powerfully built, move efficiently and are low to the ground.

Blond Me (GB) (Tamayuz {GB}) and Garlingari (Fr) (Linngari {Ire}) may or may not be good enough in Sunday's Cup, but their connections are clearly thrilled to be here. A smile cannot be wiped off the face of the former's owner Barbara Keller, who slipped under the rail and onto the turf to give her mare a pat on the neck when heading back to the quarantine stables. Corine Barande-Barbe, who owns and bred Garlingari, was equally cheerful as she snapped pictures of the 6-year-old gelding with her cell phone. Garlingari may not be Cirrus des Aigles (Fr), Barande-Barbe's now-retired beloved world traveler, but it's clear he has a special place in her heart.

Moore Entrants Do Their Thing...

Thursday ahead of any big race is also the day that contenders from the John Moore barn tune up and this was no exception.

The star of the show was G1 Cup favourite Werther (NZ) (Tavistock {NZ}) who went 1200m in 1:21.5 with a final quartermile in :23.5.

"He was the pick of them this morning," the conditioner said. "He hit the line really well. And he's certainly my best chance of a win on the day."

Moore was more disappointed in the work of last year's G1 Mile runner-up **Helene Paragon (Fr)** (Polan {Fr}).

"We'll take him back to the stable and see if there's anything we can improve. He worked OK, but he could have worked better," he added after the 5-year-old entire went six furlongs in 1:20 with an ultimate 400m in :23.6.

Eagle Way (Aus) (More Than Ready) heads to the G1 Vase off an interrupted preparation, but closed in :22.9 to complete 1200m of work in 1:21.6.

"That was a good piece of work for a horse that's been under a cloud," said Moore. "But he's going into a very tough race."

KINGSTON CLASSIC IS SOMEWHAT OPEN

With the eastern state raiders possessing the key in the final Australian Group 1 race of the year, the A\$1 million G1 Kingston Town Classic (1800m) at Ascot, a trio of locally-trained 3-year-olds hold the weight advantage to cause upset. Third over 2000m at his most recent start when finishing behind Tosen Stardom (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn} and Happy Clapper (Aus) (Teofilo {Ire}) in the G1 Mackinnon S. Nov. 11, the James Cummings-trained It's Somewhat (Dynaformer) won a local barrier trial recently and connections have always indicated this was his campaign target.

A winner of the G1 Doncaster H. in April of this year, the 7-year-old gelding is likely to find multiple Group 1 winner Black Heart Bart (Aus) (Blackfriars {Aus}) the hardest to defeat. A narrow second behind Great Shot (Aus) (Magnus {Aus}) in the traditional lead-up, the G1 Railway S. over 1600m two weeks ago, the Darren Weir-trained gelding has been racing as if Saturday's distance is going to be ideal, a distance he claimed the 2016 G1 Underwood S.

Finishing ninth when contesting the 2015 Kingston Town Classic behind 3-year-old filly **Perfect Reflection (Aus)** (More Than Ready), is another filly of the same age that looks capable of making a race with the top-rated pair. Carrying the minimum of 50kg, the Bob and Sandra Peters-owned Perfect Jewel (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) comes into the race off four wins from just five starts highlighted by a last start victory in the G2 W.A. Guineas (1600m) Nov. 25 over Achernar Star (Aus) (Gingerbread Man {Aus}), who she meets here again.

Out of the top two just once from eight starts, Achernar Star will carry just 52kgs and from one of the inside barriers and jockey Chris Parnham should be able to get the gelding well positioned in the run and ready to strike on the home turn. Yet to really run a bad race since joining the Waller stable, perennial placegetter Tom Melbourne (Ire) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) produced a fighting effort for third in the G1 Railway S., and is capable of once again doing the same here, but he just lacks that winning capability, recording six placed efforts from his last seven starts, three times a Group 1 level.

Although a big priced winner of the G1 Railway S. last start, the Rhys Radford-trained Great Shot has the form to be competitive, as long as the significant weight rise and barrier 12 pose no issue for the 5-year-old.

CAPTAIN COOK CHALLENGE FOR KAWI

Trentham's 1600-metre G1 Captain Cook S. drew a field of 10 older gallopers following the scratch of Mime (NZ) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) and six-time Group 1 hero Kawi (NZ) (Savabeel {Aus}) is still looking for his first win of the season in the NZ\$200,000 contest. The 2016/2017 New Zealand champion middle distance horse resumed with a third in the G2 Foxbridge Plate at Te Rapa on Aug. 19, but dropped a spot in the G1 Tarzino Trophy S. on Sept. 2. Reporting home third in his latest two efforts--the G1 Windsor Park Horlicks Plate near the end of September and in the 1600m G2 Tauranga S. on Nov. 18 one behind Oct. 22 G3 Cuddle S. heroine Miss Wilson (Aus) (Stratum {Aus}), Kawi will need to raise his game to add a seventh topflight ring.

Michael and Matthew Pitman send out challenger Son of Maher (Aus) (Al Maher {Aus}), who has won his last two on the bounce at Riccarton, including deadheating with Shadows Cast (NZ) (Per Incanto) in the G2 Coupland's Bakeries Mile on Nov. 15.

G2 Brisbane Cup winner **Chocante (NZ)** (Shocking {Aus}) returns to New Zealand on the back of a third in the Sept. 30 2400-metre G1 The Metropolitan to Foundry (Ire) (Galileo {Ire})

and was last seen running seventh in Randwick's St Leger S. going 2600m on Oct. 14.
