## KEENELAND JANUARY SALE STARTS MONDAY

The Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale begins its four-day run in Lexington Monday morning, with bidding scheduled to begin at 10 a.m. A total of 1,583 horses, including 678 broodmares and broodmare prospects, 628 short yearlings, 264 horses of racing age, and 13 stallions and racing or stallion prospects, have been catalogued for the sale.

"This is always a very useful sale for a lot of folks," said Keeneland Vice President of Racing and Sales Bob Elliston. "It brings together some very solid horses and some at the top end of the market." *Cont. p3*

In recent weeks, Winchell Thoroughbreds and Three Chimneys Farm's five-time Grade I winner **Gun Runner** (Candy Ride {Arg}) has by all accounts been training forwardly ahead of his final career start in the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational at Gulfstream Park Jan. 27--a \$16-million race that provides a fitting finale for the speedy chestnut, who recently captured the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 4. Elliston continued, “We’ve got **Mrs McDougal** (Medaglia d’Oro) (hip 781A), who is a multiple graded stakes winner, who I think would be fancy at any sale. We’ve got **Minks Aprise** (Northern Afleet) (hip 391A) in here who is also multiple graded stakes placed. So you’ve got that kind of type in here. And then you’ve got some exceptionally well-covered broodmares who are coming to hand, when you look at the likes of American Pharoah, Bernardini, Candy Ride (Arg) and Empire Maker.”

The January sale also boasts some impressive recent

graduates. Mind Your Biscuits (Posse), winner of last year’s G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen and 2016 GI Malibu S., sold for \$47,000 at the 2014 auction, multiple Grade I winner Practical Joke (Into

Mischief) brought \$135,000 in 2015, and GII Remsen S. winner Catholic Boy (More Than Ready) RNA’d for \$170,000 in 2016. Giant Expectations (Frost Giant), a 2014 graduate of the sale, recently won the GII San Antonio S.

“You’ve got some horses that have demonstrated, by what they’ve accomplished on the racetrack, that there are opportunities here to find hidden treasures that end up really working out on the

racetrack,” Elliston said of the sale’s graduates. “So it really is a very useful sale and it’s got good stock in there this year.”

The January sale follows on the heels of a strong renewal of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale and those results, plus current societal economic conditions, have Elliston looking forward to a strong renewal of the auction.

“Hopefully the trends from the ‘17 season will carry over into the New Year,” Elliston said. “Each sale builds upon the next. As hard as it was to get a horse bought in November, you’ve got to believe there remains pinhook demand.”

He continued, “And if you look at the stock market and the passage of the tax reform act, I think there are a lot of folks who have some optimism about the economy and they are willing to invest. I think there were some beneficial things that occurred in the tax reform law that will treat depreciation matters and other things for horse owners in a positive way. All of that goes into what I think is a dynamite environment right now.”

During last year's five-day January sale, 961 horses sold for \$28,785,500. The average was \$29,954 and the median was \$10,500. Don Alberto Corp. purchased the auction's most expensive offering when paying \$1.025 million for the broodmare Siren Serenade (Unbridled's Song).

This year's sale has been pared down to four sessions and includes 1,583 catalogued offerings, down from 1,796 in 2016.

"I think if you look at the quality of the book, I would probably say that we have, on average, better stock in here in terms of the quality offerings," Elliston said of the smaller catalogue. "We had significant outs last year and the averages were down for the January sale. I am looking for a couple of those trends to reverse. I think our median and average will probably go up and hopefully we'll get more commerce done and the clearance rate improves. We sold just short of 1,000 horses last year. We have a couple hundred outs [so far this year], so we are down to around 1400 horses, a little less than that, so I think there is a potential that we'll sell more horses and I think the average and the median are looking up."

The January sale runs through Thursday with sessions beginning daily at 10 a.m.

According to Grant Williamson, Director of Stallion Nominations and Sales at Three Chimneys, Gun Runner has already received a warm reception from breeders.





"We're seeing the type of response that you'd expect," Williamson said. "We're closing in on about 150 mares to him."

While Williamson said he is pleased with the external response to Gun Runner, Three Chimneys will also be offering significant support with their own

diverse broodmare band.

"We've got a nice broodmare band here, and we're breeding the likes of an older mare who's a proven producer, **House of Danzing** (Chester House)." Williamson said. "We're trying to give him a nice range of mares. Grade I winners like **Malibu Prayer** (Malibu Moon) and **Love and Pride** (A.P. Indy) will visit him, as well as younger, stakes-producing mares like **With Flying Colors** (A.P. Indy), who has an exceptional family. Those are the kind of hand-picked mares that fit both from a pedigree standpoint, as well as physically."

House of Danzing is responsible for Grade I winner and sire Twirling Candy and Grade III winner Dubai Sky--both of whom are sired by Gun Runner's sire Candy Ride--as well as Grade II winner Ethnic Dance (Tribal Rule). Malibu Prayer, meanwhile, is an intriguing match for Gun Runner, as the mating represents the intersection of two accomplished families developed by the late Edward P. Evans. With Flying Colors hails from the outstanding Phipps family of Personal Ensign, while Love and Pride's second dam is Cara Rafaela (Quiet American), herself the dam of champion and prominent sire Bernardini (A.P. Indy).

"We talked extensively about what kind of mares suit him, and you don't want to breed the same type of mare to him over and over again--because you want to figure out what works," Williamson explained.

Williamson noted that many of the mares booked to Gun Runner are young mares purchased out of the November sales. He said Gun Runner’s brief visit to Three Chimneys following the Breeders’ Cup provided prospective breeders with an opportunity to observe the colt’s class in person.

“It’s one thing to see a horse at the track under tack and be impressed by how he moves, but when he comes to the farm and behaves the way he did, that’s what impressed people,” Williamson said. “He’s such a good-looking horse.”

One factor Williamson believes will play only a very minor role in the shaping of Gun Runner’s stallion career is the outcome of the Pegasus. While the Steve Asmussen trainee looms as a heavy favorite in the world’s richest horse race, the colt is already a proven commodity by virtue of his 2017 campaign, which is expected to land him Horse of the Year honors.

“I think the interest was strong straight off the bat, and I don’t think the Pegasus has any bearing on people’s response to the horse,” Williamson said. “Obviously, the purse money available is the main attraction for Mr. Winchell and Mr. Torrealba...He’s coming off an exceptional year and the opportunity is hard to pass up.”

Plans call for Gun Runner to return to Three Chimneys soon after his run in the Pegasus.

## PAOLUCCI SECURES DEAL TO RUN SHARP AZTECA IN PEGASUS

Ron Paolucci of Looch Racing Stables has reached a deal to lease his spot in the Jan. 27 GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational to GI Cigar Mile H. winner **Sharp Azteca** (Freud) after agreeing to terms with the 5-year-old's owner Ivan Rodriguez Sunday. Paolucci, who will also run his **War Story** (Northern Afleet) in the race, said he had been in ongoing discussions with Rodriguez as of Sunday morning. The news that the deal had been officially completed was first reported by the *Daily Racing Form*.

"Sixteen million reasons," Paolucci said when asked why he was interested in partnering to run Sharp Azteca. "I try to compete at the highest level, but I don't always have the highest money to be able to compete at that level. When you get an opportunity like that with a War Story and [another potential starter in] Game Over (Mineshaft)--and maybe you can rent a horse and try to get a horse in the spot-- it's a race you want to win. Everybody's watching the race."

Sharp Azteca breezed five furlongs for trainer Jorge Navarro at Gulfstream Park West Sunday morning, stopping the timer in 1:00.20 under Javier Castellano [[video](#)].

"It looked like to me he got stronger as he went," Paolucci said. "Javier was trying to pull him up a little on the backside and he wanted to keep going. It's a great sign if you're going a mile and an eighth."

War Story was also on the worktab for Navarro and Paolucci, completing five furlongs in an easy 1:03.40. The 5-year-old graded stakes winner was last seen finishing fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic behind Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}).

Likely 2017 Horse of the Year **Gun Runner** breezed six furlongs in 1:13 1/5 at Fair Grounds in company with workmate **Gettysburg** (Pioneerof the Nile) Sunday. Starting off a couple of lengths behind his workmate, Gun Runner reeled off splits of :12 1/5, :24 2/5, :36 2/5 and :49 1/5, going the final quarter-mile in :24 flat and galloping out seven-eighths of a mile in a strong 1:25 4/5 and the mile in 1:39 4/5. Gun Runner worked beneath regular pilot Florent Geroux.

"They worked head-and-head last week, and this week we chose to back him off Gettysburg early and just let him settle," Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen said. "I thought he handled it really nicely and galloped out really good. It wasn't as intense of a work as last week, and I feel good about it...He was probably two or three [lengths] off of Gettysburg away from the pole, engaged him probably by the three-eighths pole and Gettysburg carried him to almost the sixteenth pole."

Charles Fipke's Pegasus contender **Seeking the Soul** (Perfect Soul {Ire}), winner of the Nov. 24 GI Clark H. in his most recent start, also worked Sunday in New Orleans, completing

five-eighths of a mile in 1:03 1/5 under exercise rider Emerson Chavez.

“Just a little bit easier today--he came back good and looked great,” trainer Dallas Stewart said. “So we’ll have two more works--we’re on schedule.”

Back in Florida, champion **Stellar Wind** (Curlin) breezed for the first time as a 6-year-old Sunday morning, continuing preparations for a start against male rivals in the Pegasus. Stellar

Wind worked five furlongs in 1:01.50 in company with ‘TDN Rising Star’ Shagaf (Bernardini) [video] for trainer Chad Brown at Palm Meadows.

“She worked terrific. She worked with Shagaf, a horse who’s on the comeback trail and who’s a nice horse, and I thought she did really well,” trainer Chad Brown said. “She particularly galloped out super. So, right now we’re on target for the Pegasus.”



Midnight Bisou came up a nose short when second behind undefeated Grade I winner Dream Tree (Uncle Mo) in her first two career starts and found the field in Sunday's GII Santa Ynez S. to her liking, bounding home to break her maiden by 4 1/2 lengths. The filly mounted a wide bid on the turn and finished full of run beneath Hall of Fame pilot Mike Smith, earning 10 qualifying points towards a berth in the GI Kentucky Oaks starting gate.

"This is a hell of a way to break her maiden," said winning co-owner Jeff Bloom of Bloom Racing. "[Trainer Bill Spawr] has been so patient with her and she just exhibits so much class and maturity. We really felt that she deserved to be in a race like this. Mike [Smith] gave her a great ride and this was a lot of fun."

Away to alert beginning, Midnight Bisou settled into stride

tracking the pace as the third of four horses across the track behind a quarter-mile in :22.38.

Biding her time in the four path on the turn as her forwardly placed rivals were asked for more, the filly circled the field willingly, rallied to the front in midstretch and edged away to win convincingly. Favored Win the War and 25-1 longshot Steph Being Steph hit the wire together, with the latter getting her nose down in front to complete the exacta.

“Bill told me one simple thing,” Smith said. “He told me to not be surprised if she was a whole lot closer than I would have thought today. ‘She’s pretty sharp and it’s ok if she is.’ I’m really glad he told me that because I was up there pretty close and thought I was too close. I still hit the front a little soon but she’s a really good filly and she wants every bit of seven-eighths of a mile.”

Spawr added, “She wants to route, no question. Being around her, the way she acts, her temperament, she’ll relish a route.”

Midnight Bisou was overlooked at odds of 21-1 in her career unveiling Oct. 27 at Santa Anita and made up good ground from seventh to hit the wire just short of \$750,000 Fasig-Tipton Florida buy Dream Tree, who was also making her debut that day. The pair met again in the Nov. 18 Desi Arnaz S. traveling seven furlongs at Del Mar and the same exact scenario played itself out again, with Midnight Bisou rallying to just miss, beaten a nose by her talented rival. Given a brief freshening following that effort, the dark bay trained steadily over the local strip in recent weeks and sharpened up for the Santa Ynez with a three-

furlong breeze just two days prior to Sunday’s tilt.

**Pedigree Notes:**

Midnight Bisou’s dam Diva Delite captured the GIII Florida Oaks and two other stakes events in 2010. She produced a colt by Congrats in 2016 and a colt by Warrior’s Reward in 2017 before being bred back to Wicked Strong.



For a non-graded stakes run in January, the one-mile, one-turn event drew a surprisingly tough field. Dale Romans sent out the highly regarded stakes winner **Dak Attack** (Ghostzapper) and Todd Pletcher's **Bal Harbour** (First Samurai) was coming off back-to-back stakes wins. Meanwhile, all Mask had done was win a 6 1/2-furlong maiden race at Belmont, albeit in impressive fashion. Six others lined up against him and he turned the Mucho Macho Man into a one-horse race.

With Javier Castellano aboard, he did have things his own way, breaking sharply this time after a slow beginning in his debut, and then going right to the front. When he opened up on the field after fractions of 24:43 and :48.13, it was clear the race was already over. It's what he did from the top of the stretch to the wire that was so impressive.

With his horse galloping along effortlessly on the turn, Castellano asked Mask for some run, but for no more than six strides or so. That's all the time it took for him to spurt away from the field. Castellano then put the brakes back on and Mask cruised through the final three-sixteenths with absolutely no urging from his rider. He won by 6 1/4 lengths.

Is Mask the best 3-year-old in the country? It's far too early to tell. But there is every chance that he could be, and that's the exciting part about this.

Brown was non-committal about where Mask would run next, but the logical spot would be the Feb. 3 GII Holy Bull. Brown's other 3-year-old star, GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner **Good Magic** (Curlin) is, according to owner Bob Edwards, being pointed to the March 3 GII Fountain of Youth S., so it's unlikely Brown will circle that race on his calendar for Mask.

Mask's victory was just another reminder that Brown seems intent on separating himself from the pack, moving ahead of rivals like Todd Pletcher, Steve Asmussen and Bob Baffert in a

quest to firmly establish himself as the sport's top trainer. The days when he was "just a grass trainer" are long gone. He's already won a Classic, the GI 2017 Preakness with Cloud Computing (Maclean's Music), and in Mask and Good Magic he trains the two leading East Coast contenders for this year's Derby.

If Brown does not win this year's Kentucky Derby, a race that eluded his mentor, Bobby Frankel, it may be because someone on the West Coast has a horse that proves to be better than Mask and/or Good Magic. With Baffert having a handful of serious Derby contenders in his barn, that's very possible.

Mask shared the spotlight Saturday with the Baffert-trained McKinzie (Street Sense). While his win in the GIII Sham S. at Santa Anita wasn't quite as electric as Mask's victory hours earlier, it was pretty darn good.


The hype machine went into overdrive on this one, too, after he broke his maiden, so it was actually a bit of a disappointment when he won the GI Los Alamitos Futurity, but did so only because the stewards took down stablemate **Solomini** (Curlin) after a hard-fought three-horse stretch duel. Baffert took the blinkers off for the Sham, and it appeared to help. The Sham was an easier sport than the Los Al race, but the horse clearly had more zip on his fastball as he won by 3 1/2 lengths and was, like Mask, geared down as he crossed the wire. Obviously, McKinzie is a major player.

### Eclipse Finalists Yield Few Surprises

The Eclipse Award finalists were announced last week and we pretty much learned nothing. Not that there was much to learn. The announcements of the 2017 Eclipse winners figures to be one of the most anti-climactic ever as most divisions fall into the slam dunk category.

The most competitive category is the 2-year-old male championship, which will be won by either Good Magic or **Bolt d'Oro** (Medaglia d'Oro). After polling some fellow voters, I've been hard pressed to find anyone voting for Good Magic. Bolt d'Oro is 1-5 to win.

It was interesting to note that Todd Pletcher was not one of the three finalists in the trainer category. That has not happened since 2009. Pletcher is a seven-time Eclipse winner.

And despite his best efforts to bring attention to his accomplishments in 2017, Sol Kumin was not a finalist in the owner category.

Through his bloodstock advisor, Liz Crow, Kumin sent out a missive to Eclipse voters asking them to consider his accomplishments. His point was that his success on the track was likely to be overlooked because he owns virtually all of his horses in partnerships and runs under three different stable names. Kumin owned all of or part of 25 graded stakes winners, including 7 Grade I winners.

Crow and Kumin made a valid point and he certainly deserved

to be among the top three, if not the outright winner. Voters should have done a better job, but, that said, it was not easy to fully realize what Kumin did. That's because statistics made available to voters don't combine an owners accomplishments if they include several different partnerships. Kumin also didn't help himself. Not only is it rare when a horse runs under his name and not that of a stable, he runs under three different stable names. There are likely voters who didn't even know who he is. Kumin could help his case by

simplifying things and attaching his name, and not those of a stable, to the ownership listing of any horse he's involved with.

## Another Big Year for Maryland Racing

The Laurel-Pimlico circuit continues to be one of the brightest success stories in racing under The Stronach Group and the head man in Maryland, Sal Sinatra. It was announced this week that total handle on races at Laurel Park and Pimlico Race Course in 2017 exceeded \$600 million for the first time since 2008. Total handle was \$627.3 million compared to \$560.1 million in 2016 while average handle was \$3.3 million, up from \$3.091 million in 2016.

Wagering on racing at Laurel Park and Pimlico Race Course has been up year-over-year since 2015 and is up \$216 million since 2014.

Laurel is following in the footsteps of its sister track, Gulfstream, which has also seen impressive increases in business over the last few years. The Stronach Group is making it look easy, and its success makes you wonder why other racetracks can't do the same. The answer is not straightforward, but it definitely involves the fact the Stronach Group is a "racing first" company and its executives generally care about the sport. That's certainly not the case at a lot of tracks these days.



Ruis Racing's **Bolt d'Oro** (Medaglia d'Oro), a two-time Grade I-winning finalist for the Eclipse Award for champion juvenile male of 2017, will be pointed toward the Mar. 10 GII San Felipe S. after missing an expected start in the Feb. 10 GII San Vicente S. with a pulled muscle, owner/trainer Mick Ruis said Sunday. While Ruis was at his ranch in Big Fork, Montana checking in on his yearlings, Bolt d'Oro galloped Sunday morning at Santa Anita.

"My first preference would be to run in the San Felipe and then the [GI] Santa Anita Derby [Apr. 7], because I would love to stay here and run where we've been stabled," said Ruis when asked about future plans. "It looks like we'd do that, for sure."

Ruis said he would likely sharpen his star colt up with a series of works in company leading up to the San Felipe.

Another newly turned sophomore colt making a name for himself at Santa Anita is Michael Pegram's **McKinzie** (Street Sense), a decisive 3 1/2-length winner of the GIII Sham S. in Arcadia Saturday. Trainer Bob Baffert said all was well with the colt Sunday morning.

"He looks great today," Baffert said. "Now I can sort of ease off him a little bit, find two spots--it could be here, it could be out of town--I don't know yet."

## A 'TOAST' TO DREAMS

Toast, or Fairytale? "Got on a lucky one, came in at 18 to one," the song says. "I've got a feeling this year's for you and me."

The odds against **Toast Of New York** (Thewayyouare) getting to this point have been infinitely higher, but the bells could yet be ringing out for him in 2018. Visiting his trainer after Christmas--his horses galloping into a spiteful squall of sleet, a world apart from Florida and the world's richest race--it felt impossible to resist the sense that this animal is playing out a fairytale of some kind.

Ten years ago, Jamie Osborne's business was on the rack. The whole market was reeling, of course, but its generic issues were given brutally personal expression when his principal patron (indeed, his landlord at the time) went broke.

"In a way Toast, and the timing of him coming into our lives, was the start of the rebuilding process," Osborne says. "Those nights I lay staring at the ceiling, wondering how long before the banks pull the plug, there was always a small part of me that believed when your back's really against the wall, a twist of fate will occur. It was my way of staying sane through the whole thing. That belief, that if you do the right things, something will happen to help you out."

As tends to be the case, that twist arrived--at Goffs in 2012--in impenetrable disguise: a left-field yearling by a left-field sire, one who has tried his luck in four countries without getting anything within a street of this graduate of his first crop. But Osborne could see why Timmy Hyde should have picked him up in Keeneland that January: he hadn't seen a better walker all year. **Cont. p2**

Throughout a distinguished career, Arrowfield Stud's John Messara has gotten it right a whole lot more than not.

Having helped to launch the career of leading sires Redoute's Choice (Aus) and the latter's record-setting son Snitzel (Aus), Messara has opted for some outside-the-box thinking in recent years, importing Real Impact (Jpn) and Mikki Isle (Jpn)--both sons of the all-conquering Deep Impact (Jpn)--to stand in New South Wales, while also shuttling in Japanese Horse of the Year Maurice (Jpn) (Screen Hero {Jpn}) for the Southern Hemisphere breeding season from Shadai.

Given the faith he has shown in the Japanese Thoroughbred, it is not the least bit surprising that Messara has also supported Japanese-based stallions with his own mares and foaling them once returned to Australia. **Cont. p7**

"I followed him through the ring thinking: 'I might just nick this'," Osborne recalls. "I was in a really deep hole, and not feeling very brave. Down from 100 horses to 25, and my yearling spend would have dropped significantly: I was probably averaging 20 grand a horse at the time. And here was this big, raw animal, bit of a plain head, four white legs, with a pedigree nobody could understand. But you very rarely nick a horse from Camas Park. So he was led out unsold, €60,000, and I eventually did a deal in the bar in the evening."

Neither party to the negotiation could have begun to suspect the rivers of gold extending ahead of this unlikely keel: the richest 3-year-old prize on the planet, in Dubai; a photo finish for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic itself; and last month--most unfeasible of all, after a tendon injury and an abortive stud career in Qatar--a winning comeback after 1,130 days to set up a crack at the \$16-million GI Pegasus S. at Gulfstream on Jan. 27.

As it was, Osborne brought him home to Lambourn and wondered who on earth might take this strange creature off his hands. One of the most dashing jump jockeys of his generation, in his first career, he had to admit that Toast Of New York resembled "a National Hunt store" among his other yearlings. The horse threatened to take forever: a slack palate, growth spurts, you couldn't even think about working him. Perhaps as many as 20 clients turned him down; at one point the horse was nearly offloaded to the late John Hills, a great friend who thought he might have a man for him in his own yard. It was not until Royal Ascot, by which stage the Goffs financial director had Osborne on speed-dial, that Michael Buckley came to the rescue--naming his new acquisition for a 1937 film about the 19th Century robber barons, featuring a rising Cary Grant.

Then one morning Toast Of New York appeared to do something "a bit abnormal for a horse that hadn't done a proper breeze." Osborne despondently concluded that those accompanying him must all be useless, but 10 days later he did it again. Before long the ugly duckling had unmistakably become a swan. After a green debut spin, Osborne assured Buckley that he would be rewarded for his leap of faith next time, a Kempton maiden--and that he could confidently back him, too.

Now you only need a few minutes in Osborne's company to know that you are dealing with a properly rounded character: relaxed, articulate, honest and humorous. And his description of the way Toast Of New York contrived to get himself beaten that day would be neutered on the page, without his infectious, self-deprecating laughter. At the time, however, it was hard to see the funny side. He already had designs on Dubai and, even when the horse won by 12 lengths at Wolverhampton a fortnight later, there was a fresh disaster: the handicapper gave him a rating of just 74. He needed to be at least 100 to get into the Dubai race.

Osborne got onto the phone. "I'm going to be the nicest trainer in the world," he told the bemused handicapper. "I'm not going to run this in a nursery and embarrass you."

Instead he went for a novice race back at Wolverhampton, where he caused equal perplexity in Adam Kirby when issuing his riding instructions. "You're here for one purpose and one purpose only," Osborne said. "I need this horse rated 100 at the end of the race."

Kirby was given a two-day ban for giving the horse a slap when winning by 16 lengths, but the rest is history. If the Dubai success came at a price--a raw horse had put in a lot of work through the winter, and thoughts of Epsom had to be shelved as he went off the boil in early summer--then clearly the prizemoney made it one well worth paying. Nor had Osborne exhausted his sense of adventure.

Though a first American raid proved fruitless, on turf at Belmont in July, Osborne persevered to Del Mar on the basis that, like Meydan, it was then operating a synthetic surface. In the GI Pacific Classic, Toast Of New York beat all bar Shared Belief (Candy Ride {Arg})--who would start hot favourite for the Breeders' Cup Classic. An admirable effort, vindicating a clever punt. But it was here that Osborne, by any conventional measure, appeared to get carried away: he decided to follow Shared Belief to Santa Anita, on dirt. A son of Thewayyouare, out of a mare by a half-brother to Selkirk?

"We just had a hunch his style would suit it," Osborne says. "In New York, when cantering on the dirt, Jimmy [McCarthy, assistant and another ex-jump jockey] always said: 'This horse loves it, he feels better on it.' And Jimmy would be a very good judge. If you look at the horse's style of racing, it's hard, it's a war of attrition, it's who can keep going. And while he has this absolute template of a walk, at the gallop you'd say he's an efficient mover, he's not grassy, flicky; no, it's a little bit lifty, a little bit grabby. And the dirt horses I've seen, they've big backends on them, and big strong thighs and wide hips--and that's what this horse has." **Cont. p4**

It proved a stroke of genius. Seldom, in fact, can the sport's obsession with first place have seemed so maddening. Everyone marvelled to see Toast Of New York foiled only by a nose; everyone congratulated his trainer. But the difference those fateful inches might have made to Osborne's international profile is impossible to quantify.

"The extremes of emotion, in a 15-second period, were very hard to compute," he admits, laughing even as he concedes that the scar still smarts. "I can still cry talking about it. I don't often get nervous before races, but we'd gone to the expense of getting him out there, paying the entry fee, we had plenty at stake; and Michael doesn't have an oil well. So this was a big roll of the dice, and it was a huge relief."

"But turning in you see Shared Belief is beaten, you see where California Chrome is, and there's just this horse Bayern that I must confess I hadn't given an awful lot of attention," he says. "And just for those few seconds down the straight I thought we could win the Breeders' Cup Classic. So being 'nuttled' was a sort of emotional confusion to me."

"On the one hand, you are proud of the horse, feel vindicated in the moves you've made, he's run the race of his life, you could ask for no more. On the other, if you're a competitive animal, getting beaten an inch is a gutter. I told myself for a yard of our size, the horses we're fed, it's such a miracle to get there--with a horse bought as a yearling at a European sale--I shouldn't be annoyed. That's fine. But if you really do believe that, you're in the wrong game."

So many twists, in a story extending through just nine races. A month after Toast Of New York was purchased by Al Shaqab to run in the Dubai World Cup, he injured his tendon. A trying call to the new owners, who sportingly took the news the chin. Then, as he resumed fast work the following winter, with Dubai again in view, a reciprocal shock: Toast Of New York was to be diverted to kick-start the local breeding programme in Qatar. "We understood their decision," Osborne insists. "But he'd become like a member of the family, so seeing him go--on Christmas Eve--was tough."

To their credit, however, his owners also proved prepared to take an audacious gamble after Toast Of New York's desert harem never really got off the ground, and last March restored the horse to Lambourn. [Cont. p5](#)

"I think he's got about 10 babies," Osborne says of the G2 UAE Derby hero. "Now obviously bringing a horse back after this kind of absence, it's been done over jumps but I shouldn't think too many Flat trainers have ever tried it. And since the process is a bit unknown, you kind of make it up as you go along--how much you dare do. You're dealing not with a tendon, but a mixture of tendon and scar tissue. But touching wood it's been consistent now for a long time. Everything we did was extremely small steps and thanks to Al Shaqab, they never put me under any pressure."

All the old fire seemed to be there at Lingfield; literally so, as the horse had always become aggressive before a race and duly discarded Frankie Dettori going to the start. But in the race he saw off a subsequent listed winner--and now he has a Pegasus slot, still in Al Shaqab colours, but with the risk shared by Dean and Patti Reeves (best known for racing Mucho Macho Man) and Randy Hill, whose collective enthusiasm makes Osborne still more ardent for this latest remarkable punt to pay off.

As a rule, he has to be fairly ruthless with himself. "This has had to evolve into a trading operation," he reflects. "We do have to sell a lot of horses, I feed other parts of the world where we've regular customers that trust us. In a way, I'm a sifting station. When you have four kids, being a pure trainer doesn't work."

But doesn't he resent the lost opportunities for professional fulfilment, when a flourishing horse is exported to continue his improvement elsewhere? He shakes his head.

"Two things stop trainers taking a sensible business view of this," he says. "One is the desire to experience the excitement of having a good horse. And the other is ego. I had a lot of that for 16 years riding: I got to ride some very good horses and win plenty of big races. I had all the ego massage I needed. So I'm

kind of immune to that. What's more important is to have happy customers, and secure the future for the family. A lot of my clients now get as much of a kick out of selling a horse well as they do out of winning a race."

Here, however, is a horse who can match every cent of even the world's biggest purse with commensurate romance. "And his desire to win is unflinching," Osborne says. "Whether he's coming at a horse, or a horse is coming at him, he just grits

his teeth. If you've got that on your side, and combine that with being an elite athlete--which he is: his heart rate, his recovery rate, his lactate levels are different from any other horse in the yard--you've the makings of a proper animal.

"Probably some horses' desire wanes over a period of time but with the character of this one, that wasn't an issue in my mind," he says. "The issue was: had the period of time off lessened his physical capacity? And, to a certain degree, we don't yet know the answer. I am 100% confident the desire is there. Florida may tell us he wasn't as good as he was. But I think there's also a chance Florida will tell us he's better than he was. **Cont. p6**

Said Osborne, "He's had nine runs in his life. Does their ability diminish over a period of time through wear and tear? Or is it just aging? I don't know. Is he a more mature, a better horse now? The way we gallop them, I don't know the answer to that. I'm not a trainer who'd be trying to find all the answers in the morning. I will let the racecourse be the arbiter of that one. My job is to get them there retaining their desire; as fit as I can get them; as comfortable, as sound, as pain-free as I can get them; and to give them the opportunity to show whether or not the ability still exists."

"We'll let this race tell us where we are," he notes. "We learned a little bit from Lingfield. But we didn't learn everything. His next race, we'll learn everything. In many ways, what we're doing is a ridiculous roll of the dice. Because we're going to use a race with a \$1-million entry fee to find out whether or not this horse is as good as he was that day at Santa Anita."

Again, that self-deprecating laughter. "But if I, really deep down, believed we are dealing with a lesser animal there's no way I'd have encouraged this. I could be wrong. But I think there's a very strong chance he's as good as he was. And if the unbelievable happened, that would be a career-defining stroke of luck--anything we consider to have been bad luck, to this point, would be very clearly negated."

And remember the Fairytale, as told by the Pogues: "Can't make it all alone, I've built my dreams around you."

"If something like this could happen, it's just such a phenomenal tale isn't?" Osborne says. "There's a part of me that still allows myself to have a little dream. Because you know what, if you don't, what's the point?"

### Lord Kanaloa Fillies Cont. from p1

The always-formidable Arrowfield consignment at this week's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale includes a pair of fillies from the third crop of Horse of the Year **Lord Kanaloa (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), whose stud career is off to a most promising start.

A good many judges anticipated that the now 10-year-old stallion would be among the leading first-crop sires in Japan in 2017, and he did not disappoint. According to statistics from Japanese Bloodstock Information System (JBIS), Lord Kanaloa topped the freshman standings with 32 winners, some 12 clear of Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}), good for progeny earnings in excess of ¥435 million. Those results were strong enough to make Lord Kanaloa the second-leading sire of 2-year-olds among the general sire population, with only Deep Impact's remarkable 50 juvenile winners and progeny earnings of ¥728 million proving superior. While he has yet to sire a black-type winner from his initial runners, his son Stelvio (Jpn) (--L'Archetto {Jpn}, by Falbrav {Ire}) was second to likely champion Danon Premium (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G3 Saudi Arabia Royal Cup and G1 Asahi Hai Futurity.

You can count Messara amongst the sire's fans.

"Anyone in Australia who saw Lord Kanaloa win the [G1 Longines Hong Kong] Sprint [twice] over there were very impressed," Messara said. "He's offering a little bit of precocity, which is also useful in Australia. He's of the sprinting mold, he offers precocity, he's a good physical. He's got a lot of things

that are going to be suitable down here. We were taken with him from the start and lucky enough now just to get some mares in foal to him, so we have some to offer here at the sales."

The Lord Kanaloa fillies go under the hammer Thursday and Friday, respectively. **Lot 479** is an August-foaled daughter of Adempiano (Jpn) (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}), a close relative of MSW & G1SP Peer Gynt (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). **Lot 617**, an Aug. 8 produce, is the second foal from Classic Curl (Jpn) (Jungle Pocket {Jpn}) and hails from the female family of Rulership (Jpn) and G1 Tokyo Yushun winner Duramente (Jpn). Both of those talented runners are sons of Lord Kanaloa's sire King Kamehameha.

Messara believes a selling point is the lack of Sunday Silence in Lord Kanaloa's pedigree and expects his offspring to be popular.

"There's always a bit of reticence in the market, here as much as Northern Hemisphere markets. It's just a lack of intimacy with the breed," he said. "I think they will think he's a different candidate to be an absolutely top stallion and he's started off in the right way. He's from a sire line that we understand here. Overall, I can't see that they won't find him attractive. He's left some attractive types.

He continued, "His service fee has gone up to the equivalent of A\$94,000 this year, which is a pretty significant fee. It'll be a fee in the range of some of the top proven stallions in Australia. Snitzel stands for A\$160,000, so this guy isn't far behind. People love discovering these things at sales, you have to let them discover it themselves, which they will. Most of the international buyers that are here are fully aware of what's going on in Japan and the Australians, too, are beginning to look closely at Japan. Because, in our region and all over the world, when [Japanese horses] travel to race in other countries, they perform pretty credibly and they've got a very good record. We know that they are world competitors and this is one of their leading stallions there now." **Cont. p8**

### Lord Kanaloa Fillies Cont.

In addition to the success of his progeny at the races in 2017, Lord Kanaloa has also proved a commercial hit at Japanese bloodstock sales. While his first-crop foals fetched as much as ¥71 million, the stallion was represented by his first 'nine-figure' sales in 2017 topped by a yearling son of G1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas winner King's Rose (NZ) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) and a colt foal from G1 Australian Guineas and G1 ATC Derby winner Shamrock (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), each of which sold for ¥194 million (about A\$2 million) at the JRHA Select Sales last July.

Messara said that while the Lord Kanaloas are 'typey' sorts, his experience tells him there isn't a whole lot to be read into that at the end of the day.

"Snitzel doesn't throw anything that is typical of him, they come in every shape and size and they run like hell," he commented. "After what I've experienced with Snitzel, I realized that, while it gives you comfort to see something that is typical of the sire, it doesn't really necessarily go on to success and the alternative sometimes works just as well, if not better. I remember my manager at the time, when Snitzel had his first crop, ringing me and saying, 'Hey boss, they're in all shapes and colours here, I think we're in trouble.' And I said, 'Why don't we just wait, until we see how they run before we decide if we're in trouble.' Now, we have Snitzel on our hands. That's a story that's worth remembering."

The Arrowfield consignment aside, Messara is bullish on the prospects for the Gold Coast sale, given the 2017 results from auctions in the Northern Hemisphere and given the current strength of the racing product in Australia.

"Australia is in a particularly good situation in terms of stake money," he said. "Our returns to owners are about the best in the world other than Japan and Hong Kong. Our returns are far better than the States and in Europe--returns to owners that is--prizemoney to cost of racing. There's a lot of good reasons to be racing horses in Australia. So there is a good fundamental support there for a good market for those yearlings. I'm expecting the market to be around last year's, I'm hoping. I don't know if there is going to be any growth in it, but the sale should be around last year's, even with what's happened all around the world. We do get a good contingent of investors. I think that's what everyone's expecting."

Messara also issued an upbeat report on Maurice's first season covering mares at Arrowfield.

"He did very well," Messara said. "He got 120-130 mares. Nice mares, we supported him strongly as well. He's a lovely physical. His pedigree is a little obscure, but he was such a dominating racehorse. He exudes sex appeal, frankly, when you look at him, and that took a good lot of people in. People were really impressed by his appearance, his athleticism, his sheer power. And again, had he only ever raced in Japan and not raced in Hong Kong, the Australians may not have seen just how good he was, but he won three Group 1s in Japan and the same [in HK] and you couldn't miss just his dominance."

Following a 2017 Gold Coast sale in which they sold 48 of their 53 yearlings offered and finished as the sale's leading vendor for the premier level and for Books 1 and 2 overall, Arrowfield will look to display their dominance once again this week at Magic Millions. ## SHADAI RELEASES 2018 ROSTER AND FEES

Shadai Stallion Station released its 2018 roster and fees, *Racing Post* reported on Sunday. Multiple Japanese champion sire **Deep Impact (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) leads the way at ¥40,000,000 (*US\$353,767/£260,969/€294,307/A\$449,967*), an increase of ¥10,000,000 from his 2017 fee. The stallion led all sires worldwide last year with over \$58 million in earnings, among them 25 black-type winners, 17 of them at the group level. The 20-year-old also celebrated six winners at the highest level last year, including Japanese Group 1 winners Al Ain (Jpn); G1 Asahi Hai Futurity S. victor Danon Premium (Jpn); **Satono Aladdin (Jpn)**, who joins his sire on the Shadai roster at ¥1,000,000; Tosen Stardom (Jpn), who tasted top-level success in Australia, G1 Racing Post Trophy hero Saxon Warrior (Jpn) and MG1SW Vivlos (Jpn), who raced to victory in the G1 Dubai Turf at Meydan. Second in worldwide earnings is Deep Impact's barnmate **King Kamehameha (Jpn)** (Kingmambo), who stands at an increased fee of ¥12,000,000 and earned north of \$38.5 million. **Harbinger (GB)** (Dansili {GB})'s progeny blossomed this fall, with three Group 1 winners, and the young sire's fee reflected their success, rising to ¥3,500,000.

Shadai will also stand four other new sires in 2018 besides Satono Aladdin: 2016 U.S. champion sprinter **Drefong** (Gio Ponti) will command ¥3,000,000; Japanese champions and 2000 Guineas victors **Isla Bonita (Jpn)** (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) is priced at ¥1,500,000 while **Logotype (Jpn)** (Lohengrin {Jpn}) will hold court at ¥800,000.

The final new stallion for the 2018 season is 2016 Japanese Horse of the Year and seven-time Group 1 winner **Kitsan Black (Jpn)**, by Deep Impact's full-brother Black Tide (Jpn). The champion was feted in a **retirement ceremony at Kyoto Racecourse** on Sunday and will stand for ¥5,000,000.
