



## F-T GULFSTREAM SALE WEDNESDAY

HALLANDALE BEACH, FL - After a well-attended under-tack show Monday, shoppers were out in force at the sales barns Tuesday ahead of Wednesday's Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream Selected 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale.

"We are busy as hell," confirmed consignor Eddie Woods. "We've been flat out since 8 a.m. with all the right fellas. What it leads to yet, I don't know--if they all land in the same spots again like they do a lot of times, historically, at this sale. But listening to the guys talking, it seems like there is a little bit more to go around. I don't know if there is. At OBS, there was no out-of-the-park horse, but there were a lot of horses who sold really, really well. And hopefully that is the case here. I haven't heard who the out-of-the-park horse is here yet. Usually, you hear the chiming in the trees and I haven't heard that yet. But several people who would know what they're talking about have said this a really good-looking group of horses. So that would be great--more to go around."

The Gulfstream auction has led off the 2-year-old sales season for the last several years, but this year it follows on an OBS March sale which produced mixed results, with the average down 10% and the median up nearly 16% from 2017 figures.

"The OBS median was up and hopefully the median here will be up," Woods said. "The median is the real number at the end of the day." **Cont. p3**

## BODY & SOUL: MAKING MAYHEM

It's one thing when a stallion comes along with some really nice horses in his first couple of crops, but it's a whole 'nother smoke when the next three crops come along and he hasn't sustained the drive, so to speak. At that point the market usually determines he was just into mischief in the sandbox and won't be able to make mayhem in the whole schoolyard.

In the case at hand, however, we have a horse actually named **Into Mischief** (Harlan's Holiday), now well beyond kicking sand in his rivals' blinkers and on his way to writing a remarkable tale that has a basis in at least four different qualities ranging from pedigree to biomechanics.

As a racehorse, Into Mischief came along before his multi-year champion half-sister Beholder (Henny Hughes) and his GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf-winning half-brother Mendelssohn (Scat Daddy). **Cont. p5**

Woods continued, “The median is the indicator for the whole market. A \$2-million horse will totally distort an average, it blows it right up, especially in a short sale where only 40 or 50 sell. The median is the number. Hopefully that’s in better shape here than it has been before, but the one at OBS was very good.”

Consignor Cary Frommer sold two of the three seven-figure lots at last year’s Gulfstream sale, including the \$1.5-million sale-topping filly by Uncle Mo, and she was responsible for a \$1-million Uncle Mo colt at the auction in 2016.

“It’s been crazy,” Frommer said in a rare break between showings at the sales barn Tuesday morning. “It’s been very, very busy.”

Frommer admitted she was slightly disappointed with her results at the March sale two weeks ago, when only two of her seven horses through the ring sold.

“We’re certainly busy [at Gulfstream], but we were busy at OBS, so I’m a little tentative about getting excited about the traffic here,” Frommer said. “I think I had very nice horses [at

OBS] and they did their jobs totally and a lot of them didn’t get sold. And the ones that did get sold, I feel like I undersold. It’s made me a little more tentative coming into this sale.”

Frommer will send six juveniles through the ring Wednesday afternoon, including a City Zip colt (hip 1) who worked Monday in :10 1/5 and who will be first through the ring when bidding begins in the Gulfstream paddock at 3 p.m.

“I think it was a tough track to work on [Monday] and the horses, for the most part, did their job,” Frommer said of her under-tack show results. “Our horses here are very nice. We paid more for them than we have in the past, we stretched to buy a really good horse. They did their job and hopefully we’ll get

rewarded for it.”

Tom McCrocklin sent out two fillies to work during Monday’s under-tack preview, including a daughter of Orb (hip 54) who turned in the bullet quarter-mile drill of :21 flat.

“How could you not be,” McCrocklin said when asked if he was happy with the filly’s work. “I think it was a really, really nice work. She trained very well all week. She prepped the week before the breeze show on Monday and she really duplicated it on breeze day.”

The filly is out of Taboo (Forestry), a daughter of Grade I winner Dream of Summer (Siberian Summer) and a half to Creative Cause (Giant’s Causeway) and Destin (Giant’s Causeway).

“She’s scary talented,” McCrocklin, who signed the ticket on the filly for \$130,000 at last year’s Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, said. “She already has a built-in pedigree. I think she’s the whole package for a racing or broodmare prospect.”

McCrocklin agreed action at the barns Tuesday was frenetic.

“[Hip 54] has been out all morning,” he said. “I’m starting to feel a little bit bad for her because she’s literally been out more than she’s been in. But that’s why we are here, to show her to people. Traffic is very good. Given the number of horses here, we have tons of people.”

McCrocklin will be looking to carry on from a strong start to the sales season at OBS March, where his pair of \$410,000 sales included a homebred colt by Kantharos.

“I’ve got eight mares and actually they called me from the farm and I just had a foal this morning,” McCrocklin said of his breeding program. “I don’t have expensive mares and I typically breed everything in Florida, occasionally in Kentucky, but I try to support the local Florida breeding industry. And that was one [hip 368] that worked out. He was a very talented horse, a very fast horse. I miss Kantharos, I’m sorry he went to Kentucky, but I think he’ll do great there, he’s a really solid stallion.”

Niall Brennan will be offering six fillies at Wednesday’s Gulfstream sale, including a filly by Medaglia d’Oro (hip 9), who was one of 11 to share the bullet furlong time of :10 flat.

“They all came home good and they all ate up,” Brennan said Tuesday morning. “They were a little tired. This track is a testing track for these babies, especially when they are going blazing at full speed. So I find that it does tire them out a little bit, but they all have good energy this morning.”

During last year’s Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream sale, 74 juveniles sold for \$25,115,000. The average was \$339,392 and the median was \$270,000.



Into Mischief was fast and consistent in Southern California, winning the GI Hollywood Futurity and the Listed Damascus S., while placing in three other stakes from a well-spaced career of only six starts.

It was that speed which was the strong suit he had going for him when he entered stud at Spendthrift in 2009 at a \$12,500 fee because he really didn't have much of a commercial pedigree behind him at the time. His dam, Leslie's Lady, was a restricted stakes winner by a nice, but not leading, sire in Tricky Creek. The next two dams were by the very good Stop the Music and decent One for All, but the quality of the black-type in the family was best represented by Roanoke, a Grade I winning half-brother to his third dam, One Last Bird--Roanoke became a very modest sire. Indeed, the family was a bit moribund until the Storm Cat line came along, first through Harlan's Holiday, sire of Into Mischief, then through Hennessy, paternal grandsire of Beholder and paternal great-grandsire of Mendelssohn.

In addition, up until then his sire, Harlan's Holiday, though gaining momentum as a leading sire, had not emerged as a potential sire-of-sires. Indeed, there was hardly any thought back then of him becoming as influential as he did until his untimely demise--after all, his own sire, Harlan (Storm Cat), also died early, while Harlan's other top-class son Meniffee, was exported to Korea early in his stud career (see our previous column, Mar. 7th, "USA! USA! USA!"). This was a line that was generally overlooked.

For all these reasons, it was hardly surprising that Into Mischief attracted a modest number of mares in his first four years at



stud which resulted in foal crops of 42, 27, 37 and 37--a total of 143 foals, which was 18 fewer than the number of registered foals (161) in his fifth crop. By that time, he'd churned out seven SWs from his first crop, including Canadian multi-champion Miss Mischief, GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Goldencents, multiple Grade 2 winner Vyjack, who were followed in his next crop by GII Super Derby winner Vicar's in Trouble and Grade III winner Can the Man.

There have been 11 SWs thus far from that fifth crop of 2014, including multiple Grade I winner Practical Joke (who entered stud this year), who helped his sire to top the list of Juvenile Sires in 2016. The current 3-year-olds include Classic prospect Audible, winner of the GII Holy Bull S.

Along the way, Into Mischief's stud fee has rocketed to \$100,000, thank you very much.

You can look at his success from a pedigree perspective, but more interestingly are several findings our team has made in researching what characteristics he possessed that generated his speed and how he manages to "fit" so many mares besides the fact that the Storm Cat line seems to have worked pretty well with his family.

- Into Mischief is a bit of a biomechanical exception in the way he is structured to be a racing machine in that the length of his ilium--which is the bone that goes from the hip to the rear of the horse and forms an acute angle with the femur--is longer than his femur and tibia (the bone from the bottom of the femur to the hock). These three bones have a great deal to do with forward projection needed at the start and the kick that is needed at the end. If they are equal in size, power is generated evenly. If the ilium is longer than the other two, the power generated from the top is forwardly pronounced and leads to greater early speed--but sometimes at a risk of front end problems especially if the horse's front legs are a bit short or its body set in the front is low. But if the horse is gathered and allowed to stalk, it can generate explosive speed. This structure is inherited occasionally from what we have observed in others over the years. In time, we will have a representative sampling of Into Mischief's offspring to determine if he is passing this component on, and how the ones who have the trait have performed.

- There is a striking similarity among Harlan's Holiday and Into Mischief and their sons at stud in Kentucky when it comes to Phenotype. The accompanying chart shows (in red) where Into Mischief and his sons Can the Man, Goldencents and Practical Joke fall on our Phenotype Target along with Harlan's Holiday and his other sons Majesticperfection and Shanghai Bobby (in blue). They are all Power-type horses, best adapted to display


speed from sprints to middle distances. Except for one off to the left (still a Power type), these seven are pretty much the same Phenotype. As many observers have noted, offspring of Into Mischief, who resembles his sire to the eye, also seem to be uncannily similar (to the eye) to those of Harlan's Holiday. Maybe this helps explain it.

- In terms of size and scope (different than Phenotype, which is a physical expression of genotype) the following stallions pop up "clustered" among two or more of this line: Giant's Causeway, Notebook, Dixie Union, War Front, Wildcat Heir, Forest Wildcat, Scat Daddy, Bernardini and Mr. Greeley. In our experience this rarely happens within a sire-line or branch. (Could this give a hint as to which broodmare sires might work best with this line?)

Every once in a while a horse comes along whose name defines his aura as a racehorse and progenitor. The one in question has caused a serious amount of mischief thus far on the track and at stud for his competition--we would not be surprised if he turns that mischief into mayhem.

## CANCER-FREE OLCZYK GEARING UP FOR BUSY SPRING *by Perry Lefko*

Former National Hockey League player and horse racing broadcaster Eddie Olczyk is celebrating a huge victory in his life having won his battle with colon cancer.

The 51-year-old learned a few days ago via a scan that the cancer is gone, ending a health scare that began last July when he was diagnosed with the disease. Although the scan was supposed to take place in early April, it had to be done ahead of time because Olczyk had to undergo hernia surgery. He had been told it was not uncommon to develop a hernia because of the surgery, which was five hours long.


"It was quite the battle through the whole process of the surgery with the tumor and then I developed a blood clot in

treatment three [of 12] and then I get done with the treatments and then I have the hernia surgery," he said from Florida, where he is taking a "celebration holiday" with his wife, Diana. "It's been a lot going on, but it's over, it's in the rear-view mirror. I'm just very lucky. I feel relieved. I'm pretty much [beginning] the rest of my life. That's the way I'm looking at it. After everything was done [with the surgery], they felt very confident they got it all, but they didn't know if there was anything in the birthing stage that they couldn't see. They just recommended with the size of the tumor and the seven lymph nodes that were tainted that the right method to treat it would be to take the six months of hell and trade that in for 50 more years.

"I had every belief after the surgery in July that they felt like they got it all, but they weren't sure so that's why we went through [the treatments]. When my

wife and I met with Dr. Mary Mulcahy, the lead oncologist at Northwestern, for the first time we sat with her for 45-50 minutes going over the chemo and the schedule and what's going to take place. I probably only heard two or three sentences what she said because you're thinking about everything other than what's going on in the current moment, but she kind of got my attention saying, 'Eddie, I'm here to cure you, not treat you.' Out of that meeting, that was the only thing I remembered."

He is scheduled to have a final meeting with Dr. Mulcahy sometime in April and then he will undergo a checkup every three months for two years.

Olczyk laughed when asked if the last seven months were like a blur.

"I've got to laugh now because I think I just cried myself, worried myself, questioned myself and all that kind of stuff," he said. "You go through such an emotional roller coaster, and not only the patient but the caretaker, family and friends. Honestly, it seemed like it was forever. I can remember just laying in the basement sometimes and looking at the clock and saying, 'Man, it's the middle of November. How am I going to get to the middle of February?' What seemed like days were 48 hours, but I'm lucky. I'm lucky for the support. I'm lucky I had the team of doctors that I did."

"I'd like to think I was a pretty good patient. I'm going to put this as far away from the rearview mirror and continue to fight the fight for other people that are going through it or will go through it and just share my message. I don't want to be overbearing. This is always going to be with me the rest of my life, and that's okay because my goal has always been to help one person either fight it or stay away from it; prevent them having to go through what I did."

"My oncologist said 'If you had had a colonoscopy when you were 45, we probably would have kept you away from going through chemo treatment.' If I can help one person stay away from it absolutely 110% I want to do it because it's hell on you and everybody in your circle. I'm going to continue to spread the word and make sure people are looking after themselves. That's kind of been my mission and will continue to be."

"I've had hundreds and hundreds of people tell me they've gone in to see a doctor about having a colonoscopy or they are convincing their father or their mother, and that makes you feel good and I hope that continues."

He will slowly get back into his NBC broadcasting duties, which are about to rump up with the upcoming National Hockey League Stanley Cup playoffs and coverage of the races leading up to the Triple Crown. He plans to be in attendance in California for the GI Santa Anita Derby.

"I'm slowly getting back into my schedule, but once it comes playoff time, it's full steam ahead," he said. "I've been very lucky with my bosses. John McDonough, the President of the Chicago Blackhawks, and Sam Flood of NBC Sports told me to make my own work schedule. You feel like you are letting everybody down. I take pride in working and doing what I do and what I love to do, so I'm very thankful that they would be so accommodating in checking up on me all the time. When you work for people like that--the Wirtz family in Chicago and NBC--I'm lucky in a lot of ways."

He is looking forward to the Santa Anita Derby and the likelihood of a match race between Bolt D'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro) and McKinzie (Street Sense).

"The rematch will be interesting," he said. "Oldtime hockey fans would have appreciated the San Felipe race because there was a lot of clutching and grabbing, bumping and grinding. I did not agree with the disqualification of McKinzie and not because I was on McKinzie. I just thought there were multiple infractions on both sides. That will be for my opinion on the broadcast. I hope we have a field of 10 or 11, but that's highly unlikely."

He is reserving picking a Derby winner at this point or even offering an opinion.

"Right now I could make a case for six or seven, but it seems like Justify (Scat Daddy) has all the makings," he said. "Whether he's ready for the Derby or not, this is a horse that you're going to be looking at in July and August for the Travers and the Breeders' Cup. He's a very, very young horse and going against the grain and the numbers say what it is and we understand he never raced as a 2-year-old. If anybody could [get this type of horse to the Derby], certainly a guy like Bob Baffert can. Time will tell, but that is the one horse that kind of sits out there. Chad Brown's Good Magic (Curlin), he probably needed the [GI Fountain Of Youth S.] race off of the [GI] Breeders' Cup Juvenile. We know that he can run a large race like he did last year in the big race."

Olczyk is picking a Stanley Cup final between the Tampa Bay Lightning and the Nashville Predators, which he had publicly predicted at the start of the season.

"As far as picking who's going to win, I stopped doing that a long time ago," he said. "The sleeper team is Winnipeg, which is really on the come. They are right there and have had a great year. Boston has emerged as a real dangerous team with all the moves and the young players they have. But I'll stay with Nashville and Tampa."

"I'll go to Oldsmar for some simulcasting if Tampa is in the finals. I can drive over to Kentucky Downs when I'm in Nashville if that ends up being the case. Everything is built around if there is live horse racing whatever city I'm in."

## THE PLAYER UNDERGOES SURGERY, BRADLEY HOPEFUL

Carl Hurst and “Buff” Bradley’s **The Player** (Street Hero) underwent extensive surgery Monday at the Louisiana State University Farm and Large Animal Veterinary Services clinic and emerged from the procedure in fine condition, owner/trainer Bradley reported on Facebook Monday night. The 5-year-old chestnut, who has become a fan-favorite in recent years due to his **unique temperament**, fractured two sesamoids in his right front during the running of Saturday’s GII New Orleans H. at the Fair Grounds and was quickly pulled up by jockey Calvin Borel.

“Great news so far,” Bradley wrote after a day spent at the Baton Rouge facility. “Surgery went well and they have put a plate and 16 screws in his leg. This took well over seven hours and getting up took another few hours (I did tell the vet he will stay down as long as he could). Dr. McCauley and his staff at LSU have done a wonderful job in a complicated surgery.”

The Player won over fans with his tendency to sit upright in his stall as a 3-year-old in 2016--a year which saw him run second in the GII Indiana Derby in his stakes debut. A strong 2017 campaign saw him breakthrough with a win in the GII Hagyard Fayette S. at Keeneland last autumn, and the homebred added a second graded success to his resume with a score in the GIII Mineshaft H. Feb. 17. The Player led the New Orleans through a half-mile in :48.18 before backing away and sustaining the injury.

“I am a bit emotional after seeing him stand on his own and bearing weight on all four legs and then walking to his stall,” Bradley continued Monday. “Now we have to hope for no infections and that no Laminitis sets in. Keep praying (it’s working), as he still has a long way to go.”

Bradley noted that The Player displayed his usual fondness for peppermints and said he would pay his stable star a subsequent visit Tuesday.

## JOCKEYS’ GUILD STATEMENT

*The Racing Industry needs to do more to protect the jockeys and exercise riders who risk their lives every day for our sport. Racetracks and state regulators need to ensure that there are proper medical personnel trained in trauma, most importantly having paramedics on the track (both during training and racing hours), and protocols in place at every single racetrack.*

*Racing still remains one of the only sports, professional or amateur, that does not have concussion protocols in place, which is something that is at the forefront of our concerns. We are continuing to work to get with regulators and racetracks to address this issue. The Guild was instrumental in establishing the Jockey Injury Database (“JID”), an injury data collection vehicle.*

*Unfortunately, this initiative has received little support from racetracks and regulators.*

*Additionally, the Guild reached out to basically all Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse organizations to establish a research and development committee to determine if the equipment that is being used by jockeys and/or exercise riders is the safest possible. After the first year, financial commitment faded.*

*It is absolutely vital the industry uses every mechanism possible to reduce injuries for both the equine and human athletes. This will in turn help owners, trainers, and racetracks lower the risk of liability and reduce the costs of insurance, as well as improving the public perception of our sport. Furthermore, regulators in each jurisdiction need to adopt the model rules pertaining to safety standards. It is also imperative that they are actually enforcing regulations that are currently in place. The industry, as a whole, must be committed to rider safety.*





## CHURCHILL WILL SHUTTLE TO COOLMORE AUSTRALIA

Champion and dual Classic hero **Churchill (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}--Meow {Ire}, by Storm Cat), will shuttle to Coolmore Australia in the second half of 2018, the stud announced on Tuesday.

"I travelled to Ireland last week to inspect a number of stallions and I was blown away by Churchill," said Coolmore Australia Sales and Nominations Manager Colm Santry. "He has an unbelievable combination of size, power, quality and athleticism. He is bred in a similar mould to Frankel (GB), Galileo over a speed mare, and the result is an outstanding animal. I have no doubt that people are going to be very taken with him, particularly when they see him in the flesh."

Trained by Aidan O'Brien for a Coolmore partnership, the bay was highweighted in both England and Ireland as a juvenile on the back of victories in Newmarket's G1 Dubai Dewhurst S. in October of 2016, The Curragh's G1 Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S. that September and the G2 Futurity S. and Leopardstown's G3 Tyros S. earlier that season.

Resuming at three, the full-brother to 2017 Irish champion juvenile filly and G1 Juddmonte Cheveley Park S. heroine Clemmie (Ire) took the first British Classic of the season in the G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas S. last May, and he doubled his Classic total with a 2 1/2-length defeat of Thunder Snow (Ire) (Helmet {Aus}) in the G1 Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh later that month.

Limerick-based trainer Richard O'Brien will be back in his dentistry practice later this week glowing in satisfaction after **Dianthus (Ire)** (Epaulette {Aus}) provided him with the biggest win of his nascent training career. The 3-year-old filly claimed some notable scalps in the €50,000 Madrid H. on the opening day of the Irish flat season at Naas last Sunday, including the runner up **London Icon (Ire)** (Elzaam {Aus}) who holds an entry in the G1 Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas. O'Brien is only in his second full season with a trainers license and while he has no plans just yet to quit the day job, he harbours great ambitions to increase the size of his string.

"We have 17 or 18 riding out at the moment but its hard to make a proper impact with that number of horses," O'Brien told the *TDN* on Monday. "I'd love to build it up into a proper enterprise but it will take time and hopefully the filly winning on Sunday will help move it along a bit. [Cont. p2](#)

The Irish-bred filled the frame twice more in four starts at Group 1 level, running second to Ulysses (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in York's G1 Juddmonte International S. when resuming that August and also took third in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. last October. All told, Churchill retired with seven wins from 13 starts and \$1,847,877 in earnings and was once again champion in both England (7-9 1/2f and Ireland (7-9 1/2f & 9 1/2-11f) at year's end.

From the family of English highweight older mare Jwala (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), Churchill counts multiple champion and G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine Airwave (GB) (Air Express {Ire}) as his second dam, as he is out of her daughter, the Group 2 Queen Mary S. placegetter Meow (Ire). Meow is a half-sister to GSW Aloof (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and SW Orator (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Churchill commands €35,000 at Coolmore Ireland this season and his fee at Coolmore Australia has been set at A\$27,500.

## **O'Brien Extracts Biggest Win to Date Cont.**

After a nice introduction in a maiden at Leopardstown last year won by September (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), she took a serious disliking to the Polytrack surface at Dundalk on her next start when pulled up by jockey Gary Halpin two furlongs from home.

"I don't really know what happened that day, she just wouldn't let herself down on the surface and thankfully Gary did the sensible thing and pulled her up. He had ridden her work and knew she had plenty of ability so he knew something was amiss."

Dianthus showed her true colours next time out when second at Gowran at odds of 100-1 and while disappointed not to win that day O'Brien believes defeat may have been a blessing. "Had she won that day she may not have been as well treated in the weights on Sunday so perhaps it was for the best," he said. "We weren't surprised with her performance at Naas. We were always keen on her and the only problem now for me is that she is very saleable and I might not have her for much longer."

Sunday's win will see Dianthus elevated to a handicap mark of 86 and should she remain with O'Brien, he feels another handicap could be within her capability before she begins the hunt for black-type.

"I suppose she could run in a Guineas Trial, I think she is fairly adaptable regarding the ground. She handled soft ground well on Sunday, I think she will be fine on good ground but may need to go a bit further on nice ground."

It was always the plan for O'Brien to branch into training. He made good use of his time working as a dentist in Edinburgh by shadowing trainer David O'Meara for as much time as work would allow and it is clear that he picked up plenty from his time with the Yorkshire-based trainer. In his first full season, O'Brien trained 13 winners from just 12 individual runners. **Cont. p4**

He showcased his talent of rejuvenating second or even third hand horses by coaxing four wins from **Tom Dooley (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) and three wins from **Alan's Pride (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) while **Beach Bar (Ire)** (Azamour {Ire}), another inherited from a different trainer, has ensured 2018 got off to a solid start by adding to the two wins he contributed to the tally last year when scoring at Dundalk last month.

Victory for Dianthus last Sunday proved that while O'Brien is adept at adding a new lease of life to seemingly exposed horses he is also equally at home in getting young horses to fulfil their potential and he is hoping her win will stimulate an increase in numbers at his Ballingarry based facility.

"Winning with the older horses was great to get us noticed, but I didn't want to get pigeonholed as a one dimensional

trainer," he noted. "To me it doesn't matter if they are a 2-year-old or a 9-year-old, its all about keeping them right and healthy. We've found a routine that seems to allow the ones with

potential fulfil their ability and we tend not to over complicate things."

Everyone is aware that being a racehorse trainer in Ireland is not for the faint of heart and that so many who are operating at the mid to lower levels are finding it increasingly difficult to make the game pay. O'Brien has never been deterred and puts a lot of pressure on himself to be a success.

"Training horses can eat you alive," he said. "Sunday's win was fantastic but soon after I

began thinking, if she is sold where is my next winner going to come from?"

O'Brien then pointed out that he quite fancies his **Oneoveryou (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) at Dundalk on Wednesday. "She's a grand filly, very consistent and hopefully she will be involved." **Cont. p5**

**TERTULLIAN PENSIONED**

Champion German stallion **Tertullian** (Miswaki--Turbaine, by Trempolino), has been pensioned at Gestut Erftmuhle, *Galopponline.de* reported on Tuesday. The 23-year-old sustained an injury to his genital area during the past year, interrupting his covering duties, and he has been officially pensioned after a recurrence of the injury. Bred and owned by Gestut Schlenderhan, Tertullian proved most effective as a sprinter/miler, scooping five Group 3 contests in France, Germany and Italy during a five-year career for trainer Peter Schiergen.

"It's the same penile injury that happened last yera," said Heinz Hoening, owner of Gestut Erftmuhle to *Galopponline.de* of the 2014 German champion sire. "The impairment is currently not so bad, but if I let him cover two or three mares, then nothing works. The stallion is otherwise in good health and now deserves to enjoy his retirement."

Retired to Gestut Schlenderhan in 2002 with a dozen wins from 35 starts and \$342,010 in earnings and moved to Erftmuhle in 2013, he sired 16 black-type winners, including Group 1 winners Guiliani (Ire) and Mawingo (Ger). Out of a winning SP half-sister to the great blue hen Urban Sea (Miswaki), who produced top sires Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Sea The Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) among many others, Tertullian also sired German highweight sophomore Irian (Ger) and Scandinavian champion juvenile filly Illiana (Ger).

**EBF MAY NOMINATION DATE CHANGED**

The deadline for nominating yearlings to the European Breeders Fund is now May 31, the EBF announced on Tuesday. Any yearling by a sire not registered with the EBF and standing outside Europe can be made eligible to run in the EBF programme of races, worth €5 million in additional prizemoney, for a \$600 fee.

"We review our nominations process annually and as the yearling sales landscape has changed over the years, we felt that it is now possible to move this deadline out to May 31, giving breeders that intend to race their yearlings or those that are consigning them to a sale plenty of time to nominate," said the EBF's Kerry Murphy. **Cont. p6**

**EBF May Nomination Date Changed Cont.**

“Those nominated at \$600 by May 31 will be confirmed as EBF nominated on their page in the major yearling sales catalogues. This nomination stage is mostly applicable to breeders using American or Japanese stallions that are not registered to the EBF. Thanks to increasing support the list of internationally registered stallions has grown significantly and we advise breeders to check with us to see if their yearling does need nominating.”

### Listed Prix Francois Mathet Cont.

Off the mark on debut over 9 1/2 furlongs on Deauville's Polytrack in October, Gyllen was fifth tackling the 10-furlong Listed Prix Delahante at Marseille Borely the following month before returning to score over this track and trip Mar. 11. Settled with just stablemate Masterpiece behind him throughout the early stages, the bay was asked to close as the field crossed towards the stands side in the straight. Gaining the lead with 150 metres to race, he asserted in a slow-motion finish to open his black-type account.

Gyllen is a half-brother to the GIII Transylvania S. scorer Stormalory, with the dam Miss Halory who was bred to Hard Spun for 2018 being a half to seven stakes and black-type performers. They are headed by the GII Toyota Blue Grass S.-winning sire Halory Hunter (Jade Hunter) and the G1 National S. runner-up and G2 Futurity S.-winning sire Van Nistelrooy (Storm Cat). Also among the abundant number of notable runners under Halory is last year's G2 Champagne S. winner and G1 Dewhurst S. third Seahenge (Scat Daddy), with the third dam Cold Reply just as influential. Her descendants feature the GI Spinaway S. and GI Matron S. heroine Strategic Maneuver (Cryptoclearance) and her G3 Flying Five-winning sire son Ishiguru (Danzig). **Click for the [Racing Post result](#). After springing a surprise when winning the two-mile Grand Handicap de la Manche at Deauville last August, Against Rules gained her first piece of black-type when third in the Listed Prix Scaramouche over 14 furlongs here the following month. Taking her course record to three wins when making a breakthrough in that sphere in the Listed Prix Denisy over nearly two miles in November, the bay who was still contesting claimers in July reappeared in imperious form to suggest she can try pattern level this term.

Anchored last of the bunch by a confident Maxime Guyon, she travelled easily into contention as they fanned out in the home straight and swooped on the lead with 300 metres remaining. Staying on powerfully in the testing conditions, she had her rivals strung out at the finish to prompt trainer Stephane Wattel to up his ambitions.

"She gets better with age and has a great liking for that sort of ground," he explained. "I thought beforehand she might need the race, but obviously didn't as she won very nicely. Usually, at this time of year when the ground gets better I give her a break but this time I'll keep her in training and aim her at the [G3] Prix de Barbeville."



## LEGAL DISPUTE OVER ZOUSTAR

G1SW and exciting young sire **Zoustar (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}--Zouzou {Aus}, by Redoute's Choice {Aus}), who has stood in alternate years between Widden Stud in New South Wales's Hunter Valley and Victoria's Woodside Park Stud for the first four years of his stud career, is now the focus of a legal dispute between the two stallion farms, *Racing.com* reported on Tuesday. The deal between the two studs has now ended, with Zoustar bound to stand exclusively at Widden Stud going forward, following the decision made by three independent advisers to maximise his earnings potential for shareholders. Woodside Park immediately began legal proceedings to challenge that ruling.

Already responsible for Magic Millions heroine Sunlight (Aus), Zoustar has stood for A\$44,000 his first four years at stud covering 184 mares in 2017 in Victoria, compared to 159 in 2016 in New South Wales. Already returned to Widden, where he stood in his first and third seasons, Zoustar is expected to receive a substantial fee increase based on the results of his first 2-year-olds.

Zoustar will also be the focus of a separate court battle, regarding his original purchase and the subsequent purchase and valuation of the colt following his Coolmore win in 2013 between BC3 Thoroughbreds and Qatar Bloodstock.

**ERA HORSES IN TRAINING SALE HELD**

The Emirates Racing Authority held its single-session Horses-In-Training Sale on Monday, which grossed AED3,041,500 (US\$828,182/£585,084/€667,730). Topping proceedings was **Galvanize** (lot 18a), who sold for AED525,000 (US\$142,954/£100,998/€115,260) to Hamid Radan.

By Medaglia d’Oro, the four-time winner is out of MGSW Enthused (Seeking the Gold) and originally brought 48,000gns from Abdul Mohsen Al Abdul Kareem back in the 2016 Tattersalls October Autumn Horses in Training Sale. The Kentucky-bred has recently saluted twice at Meydan, winning a pair of 1600-metre dirt handicaps on Nov. 9 and Dec. 7, respectively for Kareem and trainer Doug Watson. He is a half-brother to GSW Norman Invader (War Chant) and to the dam of G3 Tercentenary S. scorer Energizer (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}). G1 Coronation S. heroine Magic of Life (Seattle Slew) is the 5-year-old entire’s second dam, while triple GI Pattison Canadian International S. hero Joshua Tree (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and South African MG1SW Inara (SAf) (Trippi) also trace to her.

Lot 60, MGSW **Le Bernardin** (Bernardini) was the second dearest lot on the day and will be joining the Russian stallion ranks. The 9-year-old was purchased by Zalim Kashirgou for AED220,000 (US\$59,904/£42,317/€48,296). Successful in Monmouth’s Gill Pegasus S. in 2012, the half-brother to GSW Taittinger Rose (Menifee) captured the 2016 and 2017 runnings of the G2 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 1 in 23 starts, but has not been seen in action this season. The \$325,000 2010 FTSAR yearling’s second dam is GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies victress Twilight Ridge (Cox’s Ridge).


