



## STRADIVARIUS ANSWERS GOLD CUP CALL



Stradivarius prevails in a Gold Cup thriller | [racingfotos.com](http://racingfotos.com)

Thursday's G1 Ascot Gold Cup was mostly talked of as a match between **Order of St George (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Stradivarius (Ire)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}), but the 2016 winner and 2017 runner-up could manage only fourth this time while Bjorn Nielsen's 4-year-old excelled in a fight with **Vazirabad (Fr)** (Manduro {Ger}). Successful in the G2 Queen's Vase at this meeting 12 months ago, the chestnut--who was the 7-4 joint-favourite alongside the Ballydoyle stalwart--was kept back in fourth off the moderate early pace by Frankie Dettori. Angled out to grab the lead with a furlong remaining, he had Vazirabad to deal with from there but saw out the two and a half miles thoroughly to score by 3/4 of a length, with a head back to **Torcedor (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) in third and Order of St George a further three lengths away.

"It went perfectly--it was a great race and we had to fight for it, but he was very brave and did all the running for me," Dettori commented as he savoured a 60th Royal Ascot winner and a sixth win in the Gold Cup which lived up to all expectations. "The crowd were behind it and I was loving it. Full credit to the horse, he was brave as a lion. Sometimes a race looks a great match on paper, but this turned out to be a great renewal. I come alive here--I love it! The Gold Cup is the showcase of the week and to do it for the John Gosden team is amazing--they are all my friends." [Cont. p2](#)

## IN IT FOR THE LONG HAUL

The longest day, and in more ways than one.

## Stradivarius Answers Gold Cup Call Cont. from p1

Stradivarius's success means that he is a potential winner of the WH Stayers' Million in its inaugural year, having captured the 14-furlong G2 Yorkshire Cup on May 18. He only has to repeat his win in the July 31 G2 Goodwood Cup and then take the Aug. 24 G2 Lonsdale Cup back at York to provide his owner-breeder with the ultimate reward for his devotion to concentrating on staying types. This colt's early period featured a maiden win on Newcastle's Tapeta as a juvenile and he is yet another Royal Ascot winner to have previously scored on an all-weather surface. Second in a Chester handicap last May before coming to the fore in the Queen's Vase, his acceleration up the ranks was marked thereafter as he beat the Gold Cup hero Big Orange (GB) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) in receipt of 13 pounds weight-for-age in the Goodwood Cup before running third in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster in September.

Admirable when third again behind Order of St George and Torcedor on soft ground which played against him and into the hands of that duo in the two-mile G2 QIPCO British Champions Long Distance Cup, he had danced through the Yorkshire Cup on his return to set up this tilt.

As he had in the Goodwood Cup, Stradivarius was a touch keen throughout the early stages with **Mount Moriah (GB)** (Mount Nelson {GB}) left in charge of pacesetting duties and Torcedor and Order of St George in second and third. With Ryan Moore keen to lift the tempo in the back straight as Johnny Murtagh used to on Yeats (Ire), he had to angle three-wide to do so but the response was laboured which was perhaps predictable given how mulish he had been going down to the start.

Frankie was tracking his every move while Christophe Soumillon was on his mount's tail and Torcedor was refusing to give in up ahead, so the first of the main protagonists to crack was Order of St George as he was squeezed out at the furlong pole. Once in front, Stradivarius kept rolling to deny the French raider who brought further international credibility to this vintage renewal.

John Gosden, who was winning this for the first time, said, "It was an extraordinary race. Frankie said they didn't go that quick and his heels were definitely down early on, which meant the horse was taking him on. As usual, Mr. Soumillon was waiting like all good Frenchman to pounce late and frustrate us and it was a fascinating tactical race, because if Frankie had gone too soon there was the danger that Vazirabad would nail him. It was a proper finish and look at the line-up as they headed to the line. This little fellow stuck his neck out and on this ground he can flick off it. He's a gorgeous little staying horse that we call Mighty Mouse because he's not very big--he looks a bit like a mini Trigger with his four white feet, but he's done it really, really well. He'll go for the Goodwood Cup next."

Trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre finally got His Highness The Aga Khan's leading French stayer to this race only to be undone by the new class act on the scene, but he took defeat with grace despite casting doubt on his charge's winning attitude. "When Vazirabad got to the front, he stopped. He doesn't like to be in front too long," he explained. "He was touched two or three times by the winner and after that, he refused to give the maximum. He can have a long career as he only does the minimum. Christophe rode him well and he couldn't have waited any longer. We might look at something like the Goodwood Cup and the Group 1s in France at the end of the season."

Jessie Harrington said of the G3 Sagaro S. winner Torcedor, who ran another solid race here, "He saw the trip out very well today and kept on finding all the way to the line. He goes on that ground, but on soft ground he probably goes on it better than other horses. He goes just as well as other horses on fast ground, but I think he does like softer conditions. It was a great performance and hopefully we'll bring him back again next year."

Derrick Smith, part-owner of Order of St George, commented, "We are happy enough. He just didn't pick up when Ryan wanted him to."

For the fact that they were able to do owed much to three top-class jockeys in their prime, who eked out the reserves of their mounts by individual variations of the seasoning gained through decades of shared experience.

First there was Colm O'Donoghue, throwing down the gauntlet on Torcedor (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) as a man transparently emancipated by his new responsibilities as a stable jockey. Then came Christophe Soumillon, playing late cards with all his familiar verve on Vazirabad (Fr) (Manduro {Ger}). But ultimately both had to yield to the track's presiding genius, Frankie Dettori, on Stradivarius (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}).

In the bigger picture, moreover, Dettori's renaissance with John Gosden--for whom he had also ridden a treble on the opening day--is itself a model of sustained vitality. That he should remain at the peak of his powers, at 47, is a measure of the renewal by which he has maintained the median of his stardom, no matter how steep the occasional troughs.

With his showmanship, of course, Dettori was also able to renew his connection with those who had resorted, from so early in the day, to a more artificial form of effervescence. Uniquely in his generation, Dettori has equal celebrity among the professionals who judge him as a horsemen; and the dilettanti whose curiosity the industry will perhaps only value once he has gone.

These appreciated his flying dismount from Stradivarius no less than Wesley Ward, nowadays something of an Ascot institution himself, did the hug and kiss that interrupted a television interview after the opening race. Ward responded by cheerfully reproaching Joel Rosario for his failure to master a flying dismount for the G2 Norfolk S. success of Shang Shang Shang (Shanghai Bobby).

If this markedly different race must also have enthused the casual fan, simply by dint of the desperate margin, then it also contained an important lesson for the cognoscenti. [Cont. p5](#)

True, European breeders are mistaken if they view American blood as a conduit purely for speed: the Kentucky sire's hallmark is sooner the ability to carry that speed over Classic distances.

But you can see why the incursions of Ward speedballs over the past decade might have nourished the myth.

In that case, however, why should such a cult have developed around European sires who often impart a degree of speed and precocity, but seldom any real class? Because whether by training or breeding, the indigenous sprinter has been routinely exposed by bare handfuls of American or Australian raiders at Ascot.

If you want class as well as speed, by this stage you really should know where to get it.

So here was a perfect barometer of the state of play for European commercial breeding. Five furlongs, flat out, on

summer ground at Ascot. And the first two home, divided by a nostril, were the only American-breds in the field; closely followed, in a clear third, by a colt from the first crop of No Nay Never (Scat Daddy), whose track-record success in this same

race, five years ago, helped bring both his sire and trainer to wider notice in Europe.

If the winner had a familiar profile, as another to pour on the pace for Ward, then much could be learned from runner-up Pocket Dynamo (Dialed In). For while Robert Cowell arguably loses as much as he gains from his expertise with sprinters--however diverse a trainer's talents, pigeonholing tends to become self-fulfilling--then his acuity in the discipline makes it highly instructive that he should be one of few European trainers

prepared to put in the legwork to sift the deeper recesses of the Keeneland September Sale.

Cowell found Pocket Dynamo there in 2017 as Hip 2934, for \$35,000 from Hunter Valley Farm. In admitting to the value he finds falling through the cracks at Keeneland, Cowell can rest assured that these will not suddenly be closed by an influx of neighbours from home. Hip 2934! Read it and weep. Especially if you are one of those trainers who a) complain about being overmatched by the stables of the big owner-breeders; and b) lack the imagination and balls to hang around Lexington when the only familiar faces still in town belong to breeze-up pinhookers.

"I've been going for six or seven years, and it's something I'm very keen on," Cowell said. "I just feel there are a lot more horses and a lot fewer buyers. I'll be there through Books 4, 5 and 6, and do it all on my own. I came back with six last year, including a couple of others that trialled for Ascot but just weren't there yet. But they will be. It's just that they're a different shape, bigger horses."

"This horse didn't cost much, but I thought him a beautiful yearling: a really strong, sturdy type. He's so tough and genuine, when he won at Longchamp last time he was taken on a long way out in quite a snazzy race but just kept that nose of his in front. And he's maturing all the time, there's better to come."

Few trainers operating at the same level could afford Scat Daddy yearlings but that, sadly, will no longer be a problem. The three members of his last crop to have run at this meeting so far, incidentally, have finished second (in a photo), third and fourth. But while Scat Daddy was clearly exceptionally potent, Cowell has had the enterprise to explore the wider ripples, and not just the stone cast into the middle of the market.

It was the beginning of a sumptuous summer afternoon, but the long evening to follow was bound to be lost on some. Thinking back to the morning train, I am reminded of the tot of Caribbean rum I was once offered. The brand was Sunset. "Coz it don't matter what time you start drinkin' it," the barman explained. "Your day is over." **Cont. p7**

## THE MAGIC IS BACK

Having beaten Forever Together (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) with a degree of ease in the May 9 Listed Cheshire Oaks, **Magic Wand (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) was the pick of Ryan Moore in the June 1 G1 Epsom Oaks before trailing that stablemate by 11 lengths in fourth. Back on Royal Ascot's summer surface, she was clear best in the G2 Ribblesdale S. to provide Ballydoyle and Ryan Moore with a third winner for the week. Always happy in second tracking **Highgarden (GB)** (Nathaniel {Ire}), the 10-3 shot was sent past that rival and to the lead at the top of the straight and powered to a four-length-success from the 9-4 favourite **Wild Illusion (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), with **Sun Maiden (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) 1 1/2 lengths back in third.

"We did feel the [rain-softened] ground was a factor at Epsom and we were hoping she would be back to the filly she was at Chester on good ground here," Aidan O'Brien commented. "Forever Together might go to the [G1] Pretty Polly [S. at The Curragh on July 1] and this filly could maybe go to the [G1] Irish Oaks [at The Curragh on July 21] and then maybe they both might head for the Arc or something like that."

Jumping from a Leopardstown maiden third on her return on Apr. 16 to the Cheshire Oaks, Magic Wand--who is a €1.4-million half-sister to the G1 Irish Oaks heroine Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and was the top lot at Arqana's August yearling sale two years ago--grew several feet in stature there when making all as Forever Together gave off her own signals with an eye-catching effort in behind. When the ground turned against her at Epsom, she was not given a hard time by Moore and like the stable's colts Kew Gardens (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Hunting Horn (Ire) (Camelot {GB}), was able to rebound from a Classic almost looking as if she had been freshened up by it.

Charlie Appleby was yet again having to settle for second to a Ballydoyle runner with 'TDN Rising Star' Wild Illusion, but was making no excuses. "A lot of people are going to ask about the ground, but William [Buick] said the ground was no issue and that she lowered into it," he said. "As at Epsom he said 'I just wonder if she would be better coming back in trip'. She's a great traveller in races, and looking at what we've got to campaign against for the rest of the season it might be better to accept we've been beaten twice over a mile and a half and it's time to look at going a mile and a quarter."

Another 'TDN Rising Star' in Sun Maiden covered herself in glory by sticking on for third after just a Salisbury maiden win

and trainer Sir Michael Stoute is looking to the future. "This is the first race she has had really," he said. "She went to Wolverhampton and stood up when the stalls opened, even though we had given her plenty of schooling because she is slow learning. At Salisbury it wasn't competitive and she didn't learn much. It was difficult for her today because she was drawn 10. I think she has acquitted herself really well. She has a lot of scope and a lot of strengthening up to do, but she has a good mind."

It was inconceivable that Wesley Ward would go home with a blank at Royal Ascot and Breeze Easy's Apr. 26 Keeneland maiden special weight winner **Shang Shang Shang** (Shanghai Bobby) duly stepped up to provide the customary victory in the G2 Norfolk S., a "Win And You're In" for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint. Quickest away under Joel Rosario in contrast to the barn's G2 Queen Mary S. favourite Chelsea Cloisters (First Samurai), the 5-1 shot kept finding as **Pocket Dynamo** (Dialed In) fought hard and at the line it was just a nose that separated them, with **Land Force (Ire)** (No Nay Never) a half-length back in third. Despite celebrating a 10th Royal winner, Ward was quick to send the attention elsewhere. "I want to say something about the jockey--he's fabulous and put his time and effort in every day for me over the winter and that's why he's here," he said. "This is the best--there's nothing like it. I went to bed early last night, as I wanted to get rid of the bad luck and look forward to the rest of the meeting and it was a beautiful ride from Joel. He had ice water in his veins."

Sold at the OBS Winter Mixed Sale before going back for OBS March, Shang Shang Shang--who had won over an extended four furlongs on dirt at Keeneland--represents Michael Hall and Samuel Ross's Breeze Easy LLC in Florida. This is their biggest moment after the Jim McKay Turf Sprint S. success of Imprimis (Broken Vow). Ward added, "To do this with a filly is quite unbelievable. I come here every year, but we were kinda scratching our heads for a few days and felt like we were back at the beginning and wondering if we were in the wrong place or not. I felt this filly was better than Chelsea Cloisters on firm ground, but not on soft ground. Unfortunately Chelsea Cloisters just didn't get a breather like this filly did."

Rosario, who was winning here for the second time having steered No Nay Never in the 2013 G2 Norfolk S., commented, "She broke well and was very calm in the beginning. I had to use a bit of her pace to get to the front and to help her get into her stride. She was very brave. It means a lot to me to have another winner at Royal Ascot. There are amazing people who come here and it is a dream come true to win—I'm really happy and blessed to be here."

There was an American feel to the result, with the runner-up Pocket Dynamo by Dialed In and from the family of the GSW Blue Tone (Birdstone). [Cont. p10](#)

His trainer Robert Cowell said, "I thought he was over-priced going into the race, as he's a tough horse who has been in a battle before at Longchamp so I expected him to run well. They went frenetically fast and he was in front a metre after the line, so I'm very proud of him and he's an exciting horse for the rest of the season. Probably, [Glorious] Goodwood will be on his agenda. Mickael said he's done everything beautifully and probably feels like he's won the race. He said he felt almost a stone better than when he last rode him at Longchamp, so he's maturing a lot."

Land Force's trainer Aidan O'Brien said, "He ran really well and we're pleased. We will probably move him back up to six furlongs now."

**HUNTING HORN GIVES MOORE A LANDMARK**

Performing with credit when sixth from a wide draw last time in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club, **Hunting Horn (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}) was on song on Wednesday in the Susan Magnier silks as he won the G3 Hampton Court S. with authority to provide Ryan Moore with a 50th Royal Ascot winner.

Racing in sixth without cover early, the 5-1 second favourite was sent past **Crossed Baton (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and despite lugging down towards the rail stayed on strongly to score by 4 1/2 lengths from that rival, with a half length back to **Zaaki (GB)** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in third. "We were delighted with his last run and he can travel and quicken well like his sire," Aidan O'Brien commented on his 63rd Royal winner. "We thought a mile and a quarter would suit well and Ryan gave him a lovely ride. You could look at the [July 7 G1] Eclipse [at Sandown] or step back up to a mile and a half and go to France [for the July 14 G1 Grand Prix de Paris] or have a little rest. He has a lot of options, but he's been busy for the last few weeks and might have a break."

Having beaten the useful Latrobe (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) in a 10-furlong maiden at Naas on Apr. 13, Hunting Horn was an eye-catching closer when third in the G3 Sandown Classic Trial at that trip a fortnight later before running into the same spot in the May 9 G3 Chester Vase trying a mile and a half. Ridden by Seamie Heffernan in the Jockey Club, he was wide the whole way but stuck to his guns to finish best of the stable's quartet and less than three lengths off Study of Man (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}). That experience stood him in fine stead here as it was a similar story, with his double-figure stall meaning that he had no cover throughout but his rider was always confident and when he sent him in the straight he was ultimately impressive. 

John Gosden said of Crossed Baton, "Rab [Havlin] gave Crossed Baton a great ride from the outside and they had every chance. I thought the winner was just too good. We would have been beaten with any draw as the winner was impressive and I'm just thrilled to be second. He is a horse who likes to use his stride and he is a lovely horse--that was a solid race."

"I came here with Godolphin and we'd always have four favourites on the first day, second day, third day--we'd win two, be beaten in the other two, 65-odd winners at the highest level, but I have to say, we never won the Britannia! So I've ticked that box now."

Of the winner, he added, "I thought the handicapper had under-rated him; when he was second at Yarmouth to Without Parole, I said to Sheikh Mohammed Obaid, we were beaten by a good horse there. We were well clear of the third; the sectionals told us that we were much better than the horse that won the first division of that race and, without wanting to put a curse on the horse, I really fancied him and thought he would go well. Sheikh Mohammed Obaid is a great traditional owner-breeder who supports racing through thick and thin and has had some wonderful horses. My association with him goes back to the Dubawi days. Hence when I started training, he supported me and has been a great supporter. It was not the plan to make all. I said to Silvestre, 'He could be a bit gassy, just hold on to him a bit, he's got a turn of foot--just try and stalk the best. Anyway, I thought he was going far too quick in front and that about halfway we had cooked our goose. But he knows what he's doing.'

Champion jockey De Sousa was gaining a fourth Royal Ascot win and first since 2014 and this was yet another stirring display of front-running riding prowess he demonstrated earlier in the month on Salouen (Ire) (Canford Cliffs {Ire}). "The horse enjoyed that," he said. "He was bit gassy early on, so I wanted to get to the rail to support him. I always had a plan in my mind to go to the stand's side." Ostilio is a half-brother to the owner-breeder's G1 Prix Jean Romanet heroine Ajman Princess (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and the listed-placed Cape Byron (Shamardal) who contested Wednesday's Royal Hunt Cup. Their listed-placed dam Reem Three (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) is kin to the G2 Celebration Mile and G3 Sovereign S. winner Afsare (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), who was until this race Sheikh Mohammed Obaid Al Maktoum's sole Royal winner having taken the Listed Hampton Court S. in 2010. ## ROYAL ASCOT FRIDAY: STAR 3YOS AND RISING JUVENILES

Friday's Royal Ascot card is one of the strongest of the week, with real commercial concerns on the line in the G1 Coronation S. and G1 Commonwealth Cup and the supporting G2 King Edward VII S. and G3 Albany S., two of the more significant pattern races of the week. Ballydoyle have had a mixed bag of results so far and could possibly supply the favourite for the fillies' mile contest in **Clemmie (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who was effectively prepping for this prize when ninth in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh on May 27 and who needs no introduction after her victories in last year's G1 Cheveley Park S. and G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. at Newmarket.

"She has come forward since the Guineas, but she will come forward again," Aidan O'Brien commented. "She needed the run in the Guineas badly. She ran well and just got tired. She had a little bit of a setback and lost a good bit of fitness, but she is coming back. I think a mile will be within reach, but we will see. We weren't sure if it was the trip or if she got tired in Ireland, but we think she got tired. It will be interesting."

The Irish Guineas winner and 'TDN Rising Star' **Alpha Centauri (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) is also here and the Niarchos homebred faces the test of consistency now which she failed last term, having started out so brightly. Jessie Harrington has delivered her in the best form she can and it is just a question of whether she can mix it with these new rivals on the quickest ground she has raced on. Her trainer said she believes the surface will be a positive. "All has been good since [the Irish Guineas]," she said. "She is tough, genuine and pretty talented. What she loves is a nice, firm surface. She's a very big filly and I think what happens on soft ground is that she basically can't pull her body out of it." [Cont. p16](#)

## I THINK IT'S THE FIRST TIME FOR 30 YEARS THE WINNERS OF THE ENGLISH, IRISH AND FRENCH GUINEAS HAVE ALL MET IN THE CORONATION.

### Royal Ascot Friday Cont.

The Hannons are firmly entrenched in British racing folklore thanks largely to their uncanny efficiency at unearthing high-class talent from relative small-change purchases and the products of small-scale breeders. When it comes to the 66-1 G1 1000 Guineas heroine **Billesdon Brook (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}), the latter applies as she is a homebred of Stowell Hill Stud, which is a Somerset-based establishment steered by the late Bob McCreery. Descended from Anna Oleanda (Ire), whose sire Old Vic (GB) was bred by McCreery and who fetched just 45,000gns at the 2005 Tattersalls December Sale, she is the latest prodigy from a family that runs deep with class. It also includes the Listed European Free H. winner and Guineas seventh **Anna Nerium (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who has since been runner-up to the subsequent G2 Duke of Cambridge S. third Wilamina (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) in Epsom's G3 Princess Elizabeth S. on June 2.

"I think it's the first time for 30 years the winners of the English, Irish and French Guineas have all met in the Coronation," Hannon said, referring to the inclusion of Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Thani's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches scorer **Teppal (Fr)** (Camacho {GB}). "Billesdon Brook is in great form, we're very happy with her. People can question the form of each Guineas if they want, but we need to meet to see who is the best. She's as good as she was going into the Guineas, this will be a fantastic race and if she wins then great. We haven't done anything different with her, she's not doing handstands or anything but she wasn't before the Guineas."

### Speedsters Do Battle...

Inaugurated in 2015, the Commonwealth Cup already feels like its been around for a while and the only question surrounding it is why it took so long to establish. Most of this year's protagonists sidestepped the European Guineas which they would formerly have been steered towards in the absence of any alternative at this time of year and now there are definite lead-up races of merit to pave the way.

The Cool Silk Partnership's **Sands of Mali (Fr)** (Panis) took the chief one, Haydock's G2 Sandy Lane S. on May 26, where he made all and knuckled down to deny Saeed Manana's G3 Pavilion S. scorer **Invincible Army (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) by a nose. Jockey Paul Hanagan is hoping he will have a lead this time. "We are kind of hoping they are going to go quick," he said. "He is not the type of horse you can mess about with, as he jumps so quick and gets into that big, long stride. I don't think the distance he won last time told the whole result, really. He got a bit lonely in front, but he was always holding on. He showed a good attitude and determination to stick his head out again. It was a good Sandy Lane and we've always thought a lot of this horse, so we are pretty confident. He is the one I've been looking forward to all meeting."

James Tate said he maintains the belief that the cast-iron consistency of Invincible Army can reap its rewards eventually and said, "We're looking forward to the rematch. He should keep improving with every race."

Last year's G2 Norfolk S. winner **Sioux Nation** (Scat Daddy) is back after winning Ireland's main trial for this, the G3 Lacken S. at Naas on May 20, and this fast surface is an absolute prerequisite. "He won over five here last year and he is a fast horse. He seems in good form and he has been progressing with his runs," Aidan O'Brien said. "We think he is ready for this, but it will be his first time over six furlongs on a real stiff track."

Denied with Battaash (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) in Tuesday's G1 King's Stand S., Charlie Hills is hoping to go one better with the totally unexposed **Equilateral (GB)** (Equiano {Fr}), who bids to continue a stellar week for Juddmonte. "I think he's a very talented horse with a great attitude," the trainer said of the eight-length Doncaster novice stakes winner. "He's lightly raced and obviously it is a big step up in class but, for me, he's got the right mindset to overcome the step up in class." **Cont. p17**

## Stars On The Rise...

The Albany features two TDN Rising Stars from Ballydoyle in **Fairyland (Ire)** (Kodiak {GB}), who beat two colts from her stable in the Listed Marble Hill S. over this trip at The Curragh May 26, and **Just Wonderful** (Dansili {GB}), who won despite looking green on her sole start also at that Kildare venue on May 26. The runner-up Lethal Promise (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) has since been an easy winner, while the third Gossamer Wings (Scat Daddy) was very close to winning Friday's G2 Queen Mary S., so it is no surprise to see Ryan Moore opting for her over Fairyland, who he also passed over in the Marble Hill. "Fairyland is a very straightforward filly and it looks like she will get further than six furlongs," Aidan O'Brien said. "Ryan's filly has only won a maiden, but was very impressive and he loved her when she won it. She is a nice filly as well, but we will learn a lot about them both after the race. Fairyland has done well to win twice and the other filly did very well to win as she was across the other side of the track at The Curragh, but she still won very nicely."

Moore knows what to expect from the unbeaten **Main Edition (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}), who he partnered on her winning debut at Windsor on May 21, but he has that Mark Johnston-trained filly to fear nonetheless.

Aidan O'Brien and Ryan Moore also combine with another 'TDN Rising Star' in **Delano Roosevelt (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the King Edward VII and the win of Kew Gardens (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) on Wednesday will surely have boosted the stable's hopes of this fellow Epsom Derby also-ran. Also in the line-up is the Listed Dee S. scorer **Rostropovich (Ire)** (Frankel {GB}), who is upped to a mile and a half after a ninth in the June 3 G1 Prix du Jockey Club staged on unsuitably soft ground, and the progressive Listed King George V Cup winner **Giuseppe Garibaldi (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}).

"Delano Roosevelt ran well in the Derby and he has come out of it well," O'Brien said. "He has been in good form since. We are not really sure what happened with Rostropovich in France, but we were a little bit disappointed with his run. He is stepping up to a mile and a half now. He should like the ground and the track. He also seems to be in good form. We were going to go a mile and six [with Giuseppe Garibaldi], but we just said we would leave him at a mile and a half. He travels well in his races. We will probably step him up after this."

## TIARA A NICE FIT FOR INVINCIBELLA

A last start winner of the G2 Dane Ripper S. (1350m) when jumping from barrier 14 of 15, the Chris Waller-trained **Invincibella (Aus)** (I Am Invincible {Aus}) has shown that she appreciates galloping room and could be a player at odds in Saturday's G1 Tattersalls Tiara (1350m), the final Group 1 event of the Australian racing season, despite another wide barrier.

With a trio of runners in the field, and another as third emergency, Waller's runners all show chances, with last start G1 Stradbroke H. sixth-placed **Shillelagh (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}), already a Group 1 winner herself, looking suited in the race if there is solid speed on throughout, whereas Invincibella can sprint off a slow tempo and be charging late.

Likely race favourite is Bjorn Baker's **Champagne Cuddles (Aus)** (Not A Single Doubt {Aus}) after another exciting third last start behind Santa Ana Lane (Aus) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) in the Stradbroke. From just 10 starts to date, the 3-year-old filly has recorded four Group 1 placed efforts, and a forward showing here could secure her an Everest slot with connections looking to aim that way in the Spring. **Cont. p24**

Finishing in front of Champagne Cuddles in the Stradbroke was Andrew Noblet's **Super Cash (Aus)** (Written Tycoon {Aus}) who endured a wide passage throughout and was entitled to knock up. If that run hasn't taken any toll on the mare, she looks capable of once again running a classy race, even though she has been allocated an extremely wide barrier.

Arguably one of the most consistent mares in training, the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained **Prompt Response (Aus)** (Beneteau {Aus}) deserves her very own Group 1 win. Having contested four Group 1 contests in the last 12 months including her gallant second in this race last year, the mare has not finished further back than fifth in any of those elite level races, and the honest proposition is sure to once again be in the firing line when the whips are cracking.

Another who has drawn wide in the race, but comes in off the back of third behind Invincibella and Prompt Response at Group 2 level is the 3-year-old **Moss Trip (Aus)** (Mossman {Aus}), impressive in her two most recent victories highlighted by the G3 James Carr S. Although drawn the complete outside barrier, she is on the up and even though she might find it hard, she is clearly one to watch for future races.

## BODY AND SOUL: ALL HAIL!

The other day, we rolled down various leading sires lists in search of a topic for this installment and immediately came to a halt. That's because we noticed that Eclipse champion **Blame** had suddenly snuck up a few of those lists, to the point where he has to be considered a serious bet after what was probably a fair assessment that--echoing his racing career--he'd gotten off to a slow start as a sire.

That statement was not meant to be anything other than a logical observation. One has to consider that even though he is from one of the most incredible families of the past 75 years--that of \*Rough Shod II, his fifth dam--it was always his sire, and his sire line, which was mostly greeted with a bit of hesitancy by a market oversaturated with commercial hyperventilation. But with ten stakes winners this year (four graded), headed by filly Fault (GI Santa Margarita S.) and the turf colt Maraud (GII American Turf S.), attention must be paid.

But the eyebrows were arched when we continued scrolling down the list and discovered that his deceased sire, Arch, and his now exported (to Korea) speedball son, **Archarcharch**, were ranked among the top 50 sires in cumulative 2018 earnings. To double check, we ran the 2017 list--and they were in the Top 55 at the end of the year. That's an interesting discovery for a branch of a sire line that snuck up on a lot of people and is often overlooked by more, i.e. that of Kris S., a son of Roberto.

Taking a step back, we wondered how other Roberto branches were doing and discovered of course, that there's only one other which is prominent in North America, that of Dynaformer. The latter has some young sons at stud, but only **Temple City** and second-crop sire **Point of Entry** are beginning to make any noise that might compete with that of Blame. One reason is that aside from the ill-fated Barbaro (whose full brother Lentenor is now at stud), many good racing sons of Dynaformer were geldings.


More interestingly, except for Darby Creek Road, Lear Fan and Silver Hawk, each of whom had successful records but never established viable branches, the sons of Roberto who left sons behind did so overseas, e.g., Brian's Time in Japan and Red Ransom in Australia.

Thus, we come to Kris S. In contrast to Dynaformer, who raced more than 30 times and won graded races around two turns, Kris S., a foal of 1977, made only five starts, winning two sprints at two and the listed Bradbury S. at Santa Anita at nine furlongs at three. He was undoubtedly of high class considering the horses he ran against (e.g., Raise a Man, First Albert, The Carpenter, Rumbo).

Surprisingly, none of his starts came on turf and along with the speed he showed at two, he set himself apart from other sons of Roberto when he went to stud. His sons who carried on his line more efficiently showed that tendency on the track and at stud. They included Prized, You and I and Rock Hard Ten, a diversified branch who, unlike Arch, did not leave any impactful sons behind.

So much for first impressions.


Things like this bother us because as sire lines fade, there are questions as to what factors may have affected the transitions from gangbusters to busts. We tend to look at things from three points of view, not necessarily in order of importance: Biomechanics, pedigree, and environment. The latter is a somewhat esoteric factor that includes cultural and economic issues which affect acceptance of a line, see Franco Varola's *The Functional Development of the Thoroughbred*, Chapter 11.

Ironically, if we look at biomechanics first, we get a very powerful slap upside the head--Roberto has a profile similar to Halo's, whose line we explored in our essay in the Feb. 1 edition of *TDN*. We noted on our Phenotype Target that Halo and his son Southern Halo were somewhat heavier in body structure than most successful sires.

Heavy or light-bodied stallions often pass that characteristic on. That can result in inconsistency for a progenitor because more energy is required to bring versatility on the racetrack. Heavier types often tend to be sprinter-milers; light-bodied horses often can handle two turns but unless blessed with good cardio systems for energy storage can run out of gas if pressed too soon. Neither type generally succeeds at stud.

Even though it made little difference in the racing careers of Halo and Southern Halo, their genetics fell into a biomechanical limbo that required their mates to bring less weight to the table so as to produce efficient racing progeny, which apparently happened.

When we ran the biomechanical profile of Roberto and Kris S., we hit a "holy moly" minute: Both also carried more weight than we expected. And as is the case of Halo and Southern Halo, the most successful sires in this branch had obvious biomechanical balance from their dams so that they were somewhat more balanced in terms of weight and efficiency.

This is more clearly explained from a glance at the two Phenotype Targets attached, one for Halo and Southern Halo (which also appeared in the Feb. 1 article), and the other for Roberto and Kris S. Note how the proximity of Roberto and Kris S. is similar to that of Halo and Southern Halo. This is almost mystical.



However, we have another curve to throw. This one involves the esoteric, which begins with the fact that Roberto and Halo were both foaled in 1969. Coincidence, no? Both were out of very decent but totally unrelated female families and both were sired by Hail to Reason, foal of 1958, a huge, somewhat heavy horse who was among the most charismatic, and to many at the time, over raced, horses in history--18 starts, all at two when he was champion but broke down without racing again.

To the mind of a high school sophomore who grew up a few miles from both Aqueduct and Belmont, in the same borough as the owner-breeders of Hail to Reason, Hirsch and Ethel Jacobs (along with quiet partner Isidore Bieber), what mattered just as much was the oft-repeated references made by them in the press of how the son of \*Turn-to and his dam, Nothirdchance (1948, by Blue Swords), came by their names.

If you grew up around that time and knew the history of the two world wars and survivors who were friends and neighbors, you knew instinctively that Nothirdchance was a specific wish the Jacobses had for the world to never give fascism a third try. That we live in a world in which many would argue there are examples of third chances emerging everywhere in the West, we can hope that reason may prevail, as have the descendants of that stallion, whose name inspired so many, on the 60th anniversary of his birth.

We both also contended with similar demons, were open about it and found consolation in speaking to one another. My only regret is not having taken the time to sincerely know Olin my entire life; things could have been more enjoyable and definitely entertaining. He had a heart of gold. He was not egotistical. He was most concerned with how you were doing or how your significant other was doing and since Friday afternoon when I last saw him that is what I've thought most about. It is also the most significant thing I hope to take away from knowing him. He cared *A LOT*. So much so that he gave his 'heart of gold' to a transplant recipient in the North Florida Regional Medical Center the day that he died, along with any other piece of him that could help another human being. ## CHRB VOTE ON OOC TESTING DEVOLVES INTO ARGUMENTATIVE SNIPING

After 16 months of rule-writing, committee meetings and public comment periods, what was supposed to be a long-awaited vote on a comprehensive out-of-competition (OOC) drug-testing protocol for California racing devolved into chaotic shouting and the trading of personal barbs at Thursday's California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) meeting.

When the debate (a solid hour on this one issue alone) finally simmered down amid repeated requests from CHRB chairman Chuck Winner for the opposing sides to stop squabbling, no vote was taken, and the plan to bring California into alignment with the model rules established by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) got bounced back to the committee level for yet another round of review.

Prior to Thursday's meeting, the Thoroughbred Owners of

California (TOC) and the California Thoroughbred Trainers (TCC) had submitted written opposition to the passage of OOC rules based on "compelling legal and scientific reasons why these rules should be sent back to committee and revised."

But when repeatedly pressed by CHRB commissioners on Thursday for verbal, bullet-point specifics rather than the hundreds of pages of legalese that had been crafted by attorneys for the two groups, the CTT and TOC had difficulty articulating exactly what they wanted changed so commissioners could try to move the process forward.

"The problem is—and I read every word of it—there's too much baloney in it," said commissioner Madeline Auerbach of the legally dense objections. "If you'd cut to the chase and tell us what the heart of your concern is, then we can address it....There's just too much fluff in it."

Alan Balch, the CTT executive director, did attempt to outline several key concerns, and he said a critical objection to the OOC testing rules in their current, proposed form is the problem of correctly identifying who the responsible party is if cheating is detected away from a licensed CHRB facility.

"That's been a standing problem with every iteration of the OOC rules that we've seen in any state," Balch said.

The back-and-forth bickering took a nasty turn when CHRB equine medical director Rick Arthur, DVM, accused the TOC and CTT of using stall-and-delay tactics to put off or derail the passage of the new OOC rules.

"This is really silliness, and I'm just going to tell you I'm fed up with it," Arthur testified. "Ninety-nine percent of the trainers, this will never, ever affect. And it's the one percent that it will affect that we're interested in." **Cont. p8**

Arthur noted how since 2014, the OOC model rules have gone through multiple levels of national review by both the Racing, Medication & Testing Consortium and the ARCI. In California, he added, "it was presented here a year and a half ago. And [just now horsemen are] coming up with these last-minute changes."

Arthur then voiced frustration at the CHRB itself, lashing out that board members seem to be blind to the fact that how, in his opinion, the horsemen's groups are allegedly stringing out the process for far too long.

"If you don't see how you're being played, well I don't know what to do," an exasperated Arthur told the commissioners.

"Sometimes the CTT moves in bewildering ways—they're horse trainers, let's face it," Arthur sniped. "I've been in the game all my life, and I know that somebody's convinced themselves that something terrible is going to happen [to horsemen] about this. [It's the] same game they played with third-party Lasix. It took two years—two years—to make a more complicated regulation [than the one initially presented]."

"It's not you," Arthur continued, again referencing the board members. "It's the horsemen that are coming in at the last minute and putting up a roadblock...They don't understand what they were talking about..."

At this point, Greg Avioli, the TOC's president and chief executive, began shouting over Arthur's dressing-down of the horsemen.

"I've had just about enough of Dr. Arthur, and I'd like the board to remember his outburst in June of 2017 that was so bad that we complained to the CHRB," Avioli yelled. "We were told this was Dr. Arthur's last year, and Dr. Arthur is still here—enough is enough! He's supposed to represent the state, and I'm sick and tired of his detrimental, challenging remarks to the TOC and the CTT. He should go do something else."

Chairman Winner intervened to end the chaos that had erupted in the meeting room.

"Look guys, let's stop this nonsense, okay?" Winner said. "We're all trying to do what's in the best interest of racing—everybody knows that. Dr. Arthur has his viewpoint. You guys have your viewpoint...any kind of personalization is a bad, bad idea. This is not about personal values or personal disagreements. This is about people who disagree on the merits of the issue. So let's keep it that way. Let's stop the yelling, and try to achieve what we all want to achieve, which is the safety and the health of the horses and the people on their backs."

Winner said that the CHRB's Medication and Track Safety Committee would take another crack at crafting a set of OOC rules on July 20, its next scheduled meeting. --@thorntontd



**OSARE (f, 3, Medaglia d'Oro--Bubbler {MSW & GSP, \$211.622}, by Distorted Humor)** the half-sister to champion and 'TDN Rising Star' Arrogate (Unbridled's Song), Ch. 3yo Colt & MGISW, \$17,422,600, returned 6-1 to her backers when graduating at second asking Thursday afternoon at Belmont Park. Enjoying a cushy ground-saving journey after a smooth departure from gate two, the Bridlewood colorbearer was shoved on and under a left-handed stick from Javier Castellano fully three furlongs from home. Cracked right handed in upper stretch, she still appeared destined for defeat entering the final eighth of a mile, but kept plugging away and grabbed longtime leader Windjammer (Ger) (Campanologist) on the wire to score by a head. Osare was offered by her breeder Clearsky Farm at the 2016 Keeneland September sale just a few weeks after Arrogate recorded his jaw-dropping 13 1/2-length victory in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga, but was remarkably sold on a bid of \$300,000 from John Malone's operation. Arrogate would go on to add the GI Breeders' Cup Classic over California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) and the inaugural running of the GI Pegasus World Cup, defeating future Horse of the Year Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}). **Cont. p2**

Osare was bet down to 18-5 for her Apr. 15 at Tampa and did her best work late to finish fourth. She was adding blinkers for Thursday's much tougher test.

"This was a complete team effort," said George Isaacs, general manager of Bridlewood Farm. "I was fortunate to be at the right place at the right time to buy her as a yearling. There wasn't black-type in the catalogue at the time and I just got very lucky and bought her for what I did. She was worth a lot after we bought her and obviously with what Arrogate managed to accomplish, she only got more valuable over time."

Isaacs said that Osare had no physical shortcomings at the time of his purchase.

"She was very immature at the sale--she was narrow, immature and we got her home and just did what we normally do with a yearling like her," he said. "She looked like the kind that if you gave her time, she would reward you for your patience. [Trainer] Jonathan [Thomas] and I agreed time would be her best friend, took a long approach, give her a chance to grow up. She grew like a weed when we got her. We treated her with a lot of TLC, and she has blossomed into a 16.3 filly, stands over a lot of ground, very scopey, big strapping filly. She got over turf well, broke poorly [at Tampa], [but she] broke sharp [Thursday] and Javier gave her a great ride. We determined that distance would be her true calling."

For the time being, Isaacs suggested Osare's home would be on the turf.

"I just talked to [Mr. Malone], and his opinion is if it ain't broke don't fix it, so she'll probably stay on the turf for now," he said. "I'm not going to say she won't try the dirt at some point, but now that we got the W, we'll probably just keep her there. NYRA writes plenty of races long on the turf, and even some black-type races, so we'll look that way."

Bubbler was a three-time stakes winner and Grade III-placed at the races before being purchased by Clearsky's Eamon Cleary for \$170,000 at the 2010 FTKNOV sale. Osare was followed by a Giant's Causeway filly of 2016 and Bubbler was offered in foal to Into Mischief at FTKNOV in 2016, only to be led out unsold when bidding stalled out at \$4.7 million, an amount that otherwise would have topped the sale. She produced a filly by the Spendthrift stallion in March 2017 and a Tapit filly this past May 1. A half-sister to SW Unbridled Femme (Unbridled), Bubbler is a maternal granddaughter of Eclipse Award-winning juvenile filly Meadow Star (Meadowlake). Sales history: \$300,000 Ylg '16 KEESEP. 


