



WRONG-DISTANCE RACE OVERSHADOWS MORE PERVASIVE TIMING WOES

The incorrect starting gate placement that caused the fifth race at Saratoga on Aug. 8 to be run at 1 1/8 miles instead of the as-carded 1 1/16 miles over the outer turf course was an embarrassing gaffe made worse by the failure of multiple track officials to recognize the mistake before the race went off.

The New York State Gaming Commission (NYSGC) has launched an investigation into the bungled race, and any sanctioning of track officials is likely to hinge on whom the commission believes should bear the ultimate responsibility on the checks-and-balances totem pole. But in reality, this mistake could be more aptly termed a lack of team effort.

The off-kilter fractions that were posted during the running of the race were the catalyst for realizing the race was being run over the wrong distance--as opposed to anyone in a position of authority figuring out beforehand that the gate had been placed in the wrong spot.

A race run over the wrong distance is a scenario that doesn't appear to be directly addressed in the NYSGC racing rules. The closest applicable entries I could uncover by searching the 185-page document for the separate terms "distance" and "wrong" were the following two sections, and neither appears to fit properly in this instance: *Cont. p3*

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY - The records set during last year's Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearlings Sale were short-lived as the 2018 edition of the auction, which concluded in Saratoga Sunday evening, set new highwater marks for gross, average, median, overall top price and top-priced filly.


The New York sale built to a fevered pitch and bidding was fast and furious as the auction reached its finale Sunday night. At the close of business, 172 yearlings had sold for \$18,492,000. The average of \$107,512 rose 20.7%, crushing last year's previous record figure of \$89,088 and the median increased 9.3% to a record \$76,000.

4039.17. Objection to distance of course. An objection to the distance of a course officially designated must be made not less than 15 minutes before the race.

4039.18. Objection to matters occurring in race. An objection to

a horse on the ground of the horse not having run the proper course or of the race having been run on a wrong course or of any other matter occurring in the race must be made before the numbers of the horses placed in the race are confirmed officially.

Regardless of how this lapse is adjudicated, several important questions will linger unanswered. Most notably, did not knowing they had to cover an extra 330 feet in a 2-year-old race make a difference in

the way the jockeys rode the breakaway pacemakers, who jumped out to a lead of nearly five lengths on the backstretch?

The eight-length winner, **Somelikeithotbrown** (Big Brown) certainly looked like he was going to inhale the field at any distance.

But the New York-bred MSW race also featured five first-time starters--including the beaten favorite--and no one can say for certain how the extra sixteenth of a mile factored into their efforts considering they weren't being prepped in training to negotiate nine furlongs at first asking.

After initially publishing adjusted times, Equibase, the sport's official record-keeper, has opted not to assign any recalculated or hand-clocked final time to the race.

Yet here's the more pervasive problem: I don't buy the logic that a single race at Saratoga is unclockable when every week, at tracks all across the country, races

are being "silently" contested with skewed fractional and final times, largely because of ambiguous "about" distances, clocking equipment malfunctions, human errors, and ever-changing timing beam run-ups that vary not only from track to track, but from race to race over the same courses.



With performance like this, shouldn't you be buying and racing NY-BREDS?

A single botched race at the nation's premier Thoroughbred venue will get plenty more attention than the day-to-day inaccuracies that get logged into charts and past performances. But the latter scenario is the one that deserves more scrutiny. The general public rarely notices so-called "run-of-the-mill" timing errors. But if you check out online message boards and handicapping forums devoted to figure-making, you will see no shortage of complaints about timing inaccuracies on a regular basis.

One such thread that started about 2 1/2 years ago on PaceAdvantage.com lists 588 posts that have been viewed 81,460 times by forum readers under the heading "Fractional Time Errors." The tracks alleged to have mistakes range from small- and mid-level venues to the sport's most elite race meets.

Pointing out timing errors is hardly new. In a 2014 Washington Post column titled "Horse Racing's Runaway Run-ups are Moving the Starting Line," Andrew Beyer, the dean of turf writing and the creator of Beyer Speed Figures, wrote that the system of allowing up to hundreds of feet between the starting gate and when the first horse triggers the electronic timing beam is "preposterous" because "Thoroughbred racing is the only sport that can't produce accurate timing of its own events.... In a perfect world, Thoroughbred racing would do what every other sport does: Run races at exact distances and time them from the start."

Earlier this year, Craig Milkowski of TimeformUS wrote in a blog post that the problem might be bigger than it appears at first glance. As an example at just one repeat offender, he cited data from 2009 through 2017 at Gulfstream Park showing the popular 7 1/2-furlong distance had been run nearly 800 times over the Florida's track's grass course. Yet in races at that distance, an astounding 100 different course set-ups were used, including one rail- and gate-placement configuration that resulted in a run-up of 384 feet--exceeding the sixteenth-of-a-mile gaffe at Saratoga on Wednesday by a full 54 feet.

To be fair, different grass race rail and gate placements need to be incorporated to save wear and tear from starting at the exact same spot on a turf course. But this still doesn't address the bewildering array of fluctuations that exist on dirt-track configurations or the near-daily timing errors that only diehard figure-makers seem to catch.

So when you read in a few days or weeks about which Saratoga official (or officials) are on the hook for a very public wrong-distance miscue, bear in mind that the industry as a whole remains unmotivated to fix or accept responsibility for a more widespread problem that undermines the sport's most crucial data point: Exactly how fast and how far did a horse run?

THE JOCKEY CLUB COULD EMERGE AS **OPERATOR OF TRACKS; TO PUSH FOR NEW**

BETTING PARADIGMS by T.D. Thornton

After establishing that North American betting handle on Thoroughbred racing has been essentially flat since 2011 and that the number of tracks, races, horses, and owners is in a "slow decline," The Jockey Club announced that it will explore a series of paradigm-shifting initiatives that could radically change the landscape of how tracks and races are run, how bets are taken, how takeout affects those wagers, and how the sport is promoted.

Most startling among the ambitious, game-changing concepts listed by chairman Stuart S. Janney III at the end of Sunday's 66th annual Round Table Conference in Saratoga Springs, New York, was the revelation that The Jockey Club will "develop plans to consider track ownership and operations" in an attempt to keep foundering racetracks from going out of business.


"Quite simply, we would willingly step in as an owner, lessor, or partner when a racing resource is imperiled, not unlike what The Jockey Club of the United Kingdom has done," Janney said. "The Jockey Club has and will be there for this industry."

Janney did not offer specifics or funding details about the potential bailing-out of tracks, although he did qualify his

THINK FAST \$7,500 THINK FAST ANNA remarks beforehand by saying that it was only on Saturday that The Jockey Club's management team got "the go-ahead to further investigate some additional projects" from its board of stewards.

Two of the initiatives Janney listed deal directly with moving away from North American racing's eight-decade reliance on pari-mutuels as the primary way to place bets.

"Since 2011, we've been intrigued with single-pool wagering, which would potentially end late odds changes and facilitate new bet types," Janney said. "We'll be working with several industry stakeholders, and we'll seek to introduce a pilot for single-pool wagering in the North American market as soon as we can."

Single-pool wagering aims to create a larger, more liquid betting market comprised of numerous different bet types. In theory, more uniform payouts can be calculated based on "reverse engineering" the total market support in straight and exotic bets for a particular wagering entity.

Janney said The Jockey Club will also lobby for a fixed-odds

wagering pilot program that would enable a bettor to lock in a guaranteed return on investment at the time a wager is placed.

"Virtually all sports bets are placed with fixed odds...and customers are accustomed to it," Janney said. "They want to know the payoff they'll win. Especially in this era of sports betting, shouldn't horse racing be able to offer fixed odds like everyone else?"

Advocating for tracks to experiment with decreased straight-wager takeouts will also be on The Jockey Club's to-do list, although no details were offered

on how this would be accomplished.

"This has been a hot-button issue for our fans for years, and more than a third of our fans will cite it as a major concern," Janney said.



Circling back to a 2017 Round Table presentation that asserted the racing industry could recoup an estimated \$400 million in unrealized annual betting handle if the sport invested in advanced data analytics to minimize the daily problem of conflicting post times, Janney said The Jockey Club would explore funding a "permanent office of race-day scheduling." A pilot program to better coordinate post times among a handful of volunteer tracks was already undertaken earlier this year, yielding promising results.

"We heard a year ago, and again today, how badly the overlapping of races is hurting our industry," Janney said. "The creation of this office and strict adherence to a schedule by participating racetracks would solve that problem."

The promotion and marketing of the sport was also listed as a priority. Among the concepts Janney said The Jockey Club would be involved in were the cross-marketing of sports and horse betting, pushing for more live racing on national television, and a digital/online investment in the America's Best Racing platform that will transform it into "a full-fledged digital media services company" that could "engage as many as a million casual fans in one year."

In an attempt to upgrade the industry's behind-the-curve quality of simulcasts--which Janney underscored by citing the statistic that more than half the 50,000 races shown on TVG annually remain in lower-quality, standard-definition formats--The Jockey Club will aim to develop a capital improvement grant fund for high-definition (HD) broadcast conversion and on-track improvements.

"The program would feature grants of up to \$150,000 to qualifying tracks for the purchase or long-term lease of HD television and production equipment," Janney said.

Janney's closing remarks were preceded by survey results and state-of-the-sport presentations by representatives from McKinsey & Company, the management consulting firm that has been retained by The Jockey Club since 2011 to offer long-term looks at the industry from an outside perspective.

Among other speakers, a representative of The Jockey Club of England gave a "From 1750 to Today" retrospective on that organization's activities, and the head of sales strategy for Google shared observations on digital marketing strategies for fan development in horse racing.

The first 23 minutes of the online stream of the Round Table conference were inaccessible, and the live stream thereafter occasionally cut in and out because of technical difficulties.

OSCAR PERFORMANCE BEING EVALUATED AT ROOD AND RIDDLE

Amerman Racing's Oscar Performance (Kitten's Joy), who was pulled up near the wire and vanned off in Saturday's GI Arlington Million, was sent to Dr. Larry Bramlage at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital, trainer Brian Lynch said from Saratoga Springs Sunday morning. While Lynch said nothing seemed

obviously wrong after an initial inspection, the six-time graded stakes winner was sent to Rood and Riddle as a precaution.

"He seems okay. To us, it wasn't anything real apparent after the race, but Jose said he definitely took a bad step," Lynch said. "He did the right thing and eased him up. When he got back to the barn, you couldn't see anything on him, so just to be on the ultra-conservative side, we're having [Rood and Riddle] do an evaluation and make sure there's nothing that we're missing."

Winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at two, Oscar Performance captured both the GI Belmont Derby Invitational and GI Secretariat S. The 4-year-old is slated to stand at Mill Ridge Farm at the conclusion of his racing career.

"Hopefully, it's not an early retirement and it was just one of those things," Lynch said. "There was nothing pronounced, we're just keeping our fingers crossed that everything's okay."

Lynch added that his other stable star, **Heart to Heart** (English Channel), who finished last of six in the GI Fourstardave H. on Saturday at Saratoga, emerged from the race fine and likely threw in a poor performance due to the rain-softened turf course condition.

"He's a funny old horse," Lynch said. "On days he decides he doesn't want to play, he just looks after himself. He's done that to us before."


Call Paul showed his grit in the GII Saratoga Special S. Sunday, exchanging bumps with a pesky Tight Ten in upper stretch before digging in to hold on strongly to the wire and prevail.

The colt did not break on top, but punched through to set the pace along the inside through a quarter-mile in :22.48 with pressure being applied by Tight Ten to his outside. Call Paul's rival moved up to his throat latch cornering for home and the pair appeared to make contact twice, but Call Paul shut the door and strode home to claim the victory.

"He's a nice colt," said winning trainer Jason Servis. "I've been breezing him behind horses and covering him up and we were thinking if he got stuck down inside and we were laying second or third, not bad. He's got a great mind."

Call Paul worked on a steady basis at Monmouth Park leading up to his July 5 debut at Delaware, where he scored by a convincing 2 1/4 lengths as the 2-5 favorite. The form of that race received a boost earlier in the day Sunday when runner-up Mind Control (Stay Thirsty) returned to annex a Monmouth maiden special weight by three lengths. Call Paul posted three more workouts at Monmouth in preparation for his tilt in the Saratoga Special.

"This horse acts like he'll run farther," Servis added. "I did the same thing with [2017 GII Sanford S. winner] Firenze Fire (Poseidon's Warrior)--broke his maiden shipped him the day before, and he won the Sanford. I'll probably leave him here and we're thinking maybe the [Oct. 6 GI] Champagne."

The Waya, originally scheduled for last Saturday and postponed until eight days later due to heavy rain, was ultimately contested on the main track anyway and captured by Tricky Escape in wire-to-wire fashion.

With the race distance shifted from 1 1/2 miles on grass to 1 1/4 miles on dirt, Tricky Escape broke sharply and set a measured pace through a half-mile in :49.81 and six furlongs in 1:14.40. Turning for home with a diminishing advantage as Mom's on Strike nearly reached even terms, she dug down and found more in the final furlong, forging clear to notch a clear victory.

"She has that kick and even after that, with slower fractions, it was so masterfully done," winning trainer Lynn Ashby said of the trip carved out by Tricky Escape and veteran pilot Chris DeCarlo. "She is really special. She's been a dream come true for all of us."

Winner of last term's GIII Violet S. over the Monmouth turf and the GIII Cardinal H. over a sloppy/sealed surface at Churchill Downs, the dark bay recently annexed the July 7 GIII Robert G. Dick Memorial S. traveling 1 3/8 miles over the lawn at Delaware in her third start of 2018.

Pedigree Notes:

In addition to producing Grade III-placed Felifran (Discreet Cat), dual stakes winner Island Escape is also responsible for an unnamed juvenile full-brother to the winner, as well as a yearling half-brother by Stay Thirsty named Tequila. Champagne Problems steadily worked through her allowance conditions throughout her career and proved her effectiveness at a stakes level when runner-up in the Dogwood S. at Churchill Downs last September. Last seen capturing a high-level optional claimer over today's same trip beneath the Twin Spires June 23, the dark bay put it all together here and earned her first graded stakes success.

Away in midpack, she was shuffled back a bit rounding Ellis's slight corner into the backstretch behind a quarter-mile in :23.76. She was patiently handled in traffic after a half in :46.96, made a swift move to extricate herself from a tight spot midway on the final bend and set sail for a trio of leaders with a strong rally. Maintaining her momentum through the stretch, she surged past pacesetting Sense of Bravery and won going away.

"She used to be really nervous, tough to saddle, and she really has gotten into a nice niche lately," said trainer Ian Wilkes.
"We've eyed this Groupie Doll for a while because of the Grade III status with it. It really helps enhance her value. We've been planning for this about three or four races back. I told Calvin [Borel], 'Everything we do is for the Groupie Doll.' Sometimes a plan comes off."

The winner's dam is a half-sister to MGISW and sire Southern Image (Halo's Image) and GSW Back Bar Spin (Put It Back), as well as Dixieland Event--herself the dam of GI United Nations S. winner and sire Turbo Compressor (Halo's Image). Yuvetsi proved no match for champion Unique Bella in the GI Clement L. Hirsch S. going two turns here July 29, but she upended another high-profile daughter of Tapit on the cutback Sunday. This event was bet like a procession for Anonymity, a full-sister to champion juvenile Hansen who had won her last two in optional claiming company by open lengths. Anonymity had a narrow early advantage in the bunched-up field of four, but Yuvetsi took over after a :22.08 opening quarter. That pair separated themselves from their other two competitors hitting the head of the lane, but Yuvetsi was always going better and she left her chalkier foe in the dust without much resistance.

A second-out winner down the hill at Santa Anita towards the end of her juvenile season, Yuvetsi went winless in four tries at three before an optional claiming tally on the Arcadia main track this January. She was a distant third in the GIII Desert Stormer S.

Decorated Soldier went from claim to fame with a victory in Woodbine's Sunday feature. Previously in the barns of high-profile trainers Todd Pletcher and Steve Asmussen, the 5-year-old gelding has recently blossomed under the care of Norm McKnight.

Sent straight to the front, Decorated Soldier showed the way with Shakhimat locked on his outside flank through splits of :23.54 and :46.69. Traveling comfortably into the far turn as his pace rival was urged for more, the chestnut had plenty of gas left in the tank once straightened out for the drive and bounded home a decisive winner. Gigantic Breeze held off a late bid from Florida Won to complete the exacta.



Records Fall at Fasig-Tipton New York (cont. from p1)

"The last half of the session tonight was just electric," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "Obviously, that's reflective of how the horses happened to fall in the catalogue, but we had a run of horses that were just one beauty after another beauty after another beauty that sold remarkably well."

A colt by Pioneerof the Nile (hip 588) became the auction's highest-priced offering when selling for \$600,000 to John Ed Anthony's Shortleaf Stable. The yearling was consigned and bred by Jonathan Thorne's Thorndale Farm. During Saturday's session of the two-day sale, a daughter of American Pharoah became the sale's highest-price filly when bringing \$450,000. That yearling was bred by Joanne Nielsen's Sunnyfield Farm.

"Jonathan Thorne and his family are long, long time supporters and advocates of the New York markeplace," Browning said. "And last night, we had the Nielsens, who were another sort of taproot human family to the New York breeding program. So it's a testament to their commitment, both to the overall Thoroughbred industry, and to the New York program, and also to producing quality horses. They were richly rewarded as a result of that."

"I think you saw tremendous diversity among the buyers tonight," Browning said. "There were certainly some new names on the results who haven't been active previously in the New York-bred marketplace. I think that's a direct result of the quality and the success New York-breds are achieving all over the world."

Pioneerof the Nile Colt Sets Record

Ed Anthony, bidding on behalf of his father John Ed Anthony's Shortleaf Stable, bid a sale record \$600,000 to acquire a colt (hip 588) by Pioneerof the Nile late in Sunday's final session of the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearling Sale. The colt, who bettered the mark of \$500,000 set by a Cairo Prince colt last year, is out of Score (A.P. Indy). The mare is a daughter of multiple Grade I winner Educated Risk (Mr. Prospector) and from the family of champion Inside Information.

"With that pedigree, I knew there would be plenty of competition," said Anthony, who is responsible for the pedigree analysis for potential Shortleaf runners, having worked for Three Chimneys, as well pedigree analyst Bill Oppenheim. "Pioneerof the Nile is a sire of sires and it looks like he's going to go a lot further than he already has. If you're looking for stallion prospects and want to be relevant in the Classic picture and the Triple Crown trail, you have to pony up sometimes and play the game."

Under the name of Loblolly Stable, John Ed Anthony campaigned champions Temperence Hill, Vanlandingham and Prairie Bayou.

"My dad has raced up here for 50 years and he likes to race in the big races," Anthony explained. "This is the deep end of the pool, and if you're going to play in the deep end of the pool, you better come loaded for bear, so to speak." The bay yearling was consigned by Jonathan Thorne's Thorndale Farm. A longtime New York breeder, Thorne purchased Score, with this record-setting colt in utero, for \$120,000 at the 2016 Keeneland November sale.

"The horse is an incredible horse," Thorne said. "He's been a beautiful horse since he was born and he's just gotten better and better. He's a very intelligent and honest horse. I'm proud of my horse and I'm proud of my team at the farm to get him to this point. It's special. I think he's got a great future, so I can't wait to watch him."

Thorne is the ninth generation to live at his family's Thorndale Farm in Millbrook, New York. His family began breeding horses in 1980 when he was six. While he grew up on the family farm, he admitted it was one horse in particular that cemented his love of racing. Thorne served stints at Gainesway, Eaton Sales and Derry Meeting Farm before going out on his own at Thorndale, where he bred 2009 GIII Florida Oaks winner Don't Forget Gil (Kafwain).

"It feels great," Thorne said of the record achievement. "All of us around here have been doing this for a while and everyone has stepped up their game as the quality of the New York-bred crops continues to rise every year. We are all trying to up our game and keep producing high-quality horses."

Asked if he had considered sending hip 588 through the sales ring during last week's select sale, Thorne said, "Fasig-Tipton had offered that, but I like to support Fasig-Tipton for conducting this [New York-bred] sale and the October sale in the first place. It really helps the program and a lot of the players. This is a great sale and it continues to get better and better every year. I don't see that stopping--I'm just trying to keep up. I'm trying to keep up with my good friend Joanne Nielsen."

Nielsen's Sunnyfield Farm sold a colt by American Pharoah

during the select sale for \$1 million and topped Saturday's open session of the auction with a filly by the Triple Crown winner who sold for \$450,000.

As for Score, Thorne's partnership with the mare was profitable but short-lived.

"She did not get in foal last year, so I thought it might be an ok idea to sell her in Fasig February last year and some good friends bought her from me, Alex Solis and Jason Litt," Thorne said. "So they have the mare and they bred her back to Classic Empire. She is a lovely mare and a pretty good buy. So I hope for the best for them as well."

Solis and Litt purchased the mare for \$45,000 at this year's February sale.

'Risky' Pays off Again for Bacon

Sanford Bacon, who campaigned his homebred filly Risky Rachel (Limehouse) to six stakes wins between 2011 and 2014, offered the first foal out of the mare named after his granddaughter and was immediately rewarded when the colt by Scat Daddy brought \$1 million from Coolmore's M.V. Magnier at this year's Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream sale. Through the Paramount Sales consignment, Bacon offered Risky Rachel's second foal, a filly by Into Mischief, Sunday in Saratoga and the yearling (hip 573) attracted a final bid of \$350,000 from Jeff Drown's Kindred Stables.

"We have a Tiznow [weanling] coming up, so we will see what happens with him," Bacon said after watching the yearling sell. "And then we a 50%-share taking another shot with Into Mischief."


Bacon admitted he was hoping the filly's new owners take full advantage of her New York-bred status.

"I just hope the people who bought her keep her here in New York and give her the opportunity to make a lot of extra breeders awards," Bacon said with a chuckle. "In the end, the money is all going to charity anyway."

Risky Rachel is a daughter of Bacon's graded stakes winner Dancin Renee (Distinctive Pro), who is a half-sister to multiple graded stakes winner Say Florida Sandy.

Asked if he was tempted to retain any of the mare's foals to race himself, Bacon said philosophically, "When you get to be my age, you'd love to race them all. I'd love to be here to race them, but at 90, I'm not counting on it. But I would love to do this same interview next year."

City Zip Colt Destined for Resale

A colt by City Zip will likely reappear in a sales ring next spring after Randy Bradshaw signed the ticket at \$300,000 for the yearling (hip 530) out of the unraced Nick's Honor (Jump Start).

"I liked everything about him," Bradshaw said. "He's a June foal, but he has plenty of size. He's by City Zip and the mare has done nothing wrong. She's a very good mare. We are just hoping down the road we can make a little money with him. We'll probably put him in the April sale at OBS and see if we can do well with him."

The yearling was consigned by Indian Creek on behalf of breeders Jamie Lamonica, Lee Sacks and Soave Stables.

"He was a nice colt, a June 2 foal, but he's never done anything wrong," Lamonica said. "He's just nice horse."

The 14-year-old Nick's Honor never made it to the races, but her offspring have enjoyed plenty of success in the afternoon. She is the dam of stakes winners The Lewis Dinner (Posse) and Kelli Got Frosty (Frost Giant) and the stakes placed Princess Phoebe (Defer) and Frosty Gal (Frost Giant).

Lamonica was co-founder of Empire Stud and Nick's Honor was a part of that program.

"We have three mares, two of them are in New York," Lamonica said. "We love the New York program and we had the farm up here, Empire Stud, for a long time. This mare started out as a product of that. We bought that mare with a partnership as a 2-year-old in training and she was very talented. She's a huge mare, she's 17.1h. She fractured a hip before her first start, so we just bred her to the house stallions. And then she kept having stakes horses, so we decided to go to Tale of the Cat and City Zip. Actually it's a little sentimental

because this yearling was the last City Zip ever born. City Zip was very good to me over the years. So this was important."

Nick's Honor is currently in foal to GI Kentucky Derby winner Nyquist.

Of the increasing success of the New York breeding program, Lamonica said, "It's remarkable the job that everyone has donethe New York breeders, the sales company, the farms up here. That mare foaled at Rock Ridge and Lere [Visagie] did a great job with her. They come down [to Kentucky] and go to Indian Creek and they, in turn, did an amazing job in turning him out here. It's all those type of people that are raising the bar here. It's the farms in New York. And it's the people in Kentucky doing their job, too. So they are working well together. And you're seeing it in the sales ring."

Emotional Pinhook for Jones

When hip 520, a filly by Normandy Invasion, sold for \$170,000, it was a successful, but bittersweet, result for Danielle Jones. Jones purchased the yearling with her mother Brenda for \$30,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton New York Mixed Sale.

"My mom had been in the business a long time," Jones explained. "She and I came up in October to buy a couple of horses and this filly was one of them. She passed away a week ago. So this sale was bittersweet, but she would have been very happy."

The Joneses own Silver Oaks Farm in Ocala and Danielle is a client liaison at Gainesway and runs inspection cards at the farm's sales barns.

Of the yearling's appeal last fall, Jones explained, "I loved her leg and the way she walked. She was very elegent. She is by a first-year sire, so there is nothing going against her. Normandy Invasion is a son of Tapit, so I don't think you can go wrong with that."

She continued, "[The final price] far exceeded what I thought was going to happen. I tend to keep realistic expectations, but I wasn't willing to give her away for less than \$75,000. So I was very happy with what she brought and who she is going to."

Out of Muffy (Tomorrows Cat), the yearling was purchased by Vineyard Ventures.

Honest answer produced Sweet Swingin (Street Sense), GSP, \$118,370, in 2012 and Law Abidin Citizen (Twirling Candy), GSP, \$185,285, in 2014 before selling for \$48,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November Sale while carrying Feedback. She has since produced a Street Sense yearling filly and a Distorted Humor colt foaled Apr. 6. She was bred back to Street Sense.







STAR OF WONDER, AS CENTAURI LANDS MAROIS



Alpha Centauri | Scoop Dyga

After the sparks had extinguished following Sunday's G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois, a "Win And You're In" for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill Downs in November, the early debate about whether Deauville's preceding rain would compromise Alpha Centauri (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) suddenly seemed trivial. While the Niarchos Family's 'TDN Rising Star' had so far failed to show the same level of intensity on an easy surface as she had on summer going, the way she sauntered through her boldest test suggests it is more a case that she has come of age now. In effectively using fellow 'Rising Star' and G1 Prix Rothschild winner With You (GB) (Dansili {GB}) as a lead horse, the increasingly popular grey emphasised her elevated status as Europe's leading miler. Swamping that rival 500 metres from the finish, the 9-10 favourite was soon into the clear in customary fashion and there were 2 1/2 lengths between her and Recoletos (Fr) (Whipper) at the line as she provided her owner-breeders with a ninth renewal of the race they have so proudly sponsored since 1986.

"She is just amazing," their racing manager Alan Cooper said.
"This is a race we dearly want to win, so to have success for the family with Miesque, East of the Moon and this one is special.
She is such a great filly and it was breathtaking."

Prior to Sunday, Alpha Centauri's record on ground softer than good read one win from three outings, with her form deteriorating markedly the heavier it became. **Cont. p2**


The success, on good-to-yielding in the Listed Coolmore Stud Irish EBF Fillies' Sprint S. at Naas in May, was a five-length one over the smart G3 Anglesey S. winner and G1 Phoenix S.-placed Ballydoyle filly Actress (Ire) (Declaration of War) and her sire was impressive on heavy ground in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. With the rain coming in insufficient amounts to give her rivals any kind of chance, she saved up all her venom by sleepwalking through the preliminaries and as soon as the gates opened was luminated as she had been in the May 27 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas, June 22 G1 Coronation S. and July 13 G1 Falmouth S. Able to follow With You's tempo so easily at the head of the main stand's-side group, she was comfortably within range of the pace set by Success Days (Ire) (Jeremy) who led a guartet up the middle of the track. As soon as Colm O'Donoghue pulled her out approaching the three-furlong marker, she was tanking to George Strawbridge's talented homebred causing her jockey Aurelien Lemaitre to instantly set to a drive. While With You gave generously, it was to no avail and only the G1 Prix d'Ispahan winner Recoletos could give meaningful pursuit.

As Alan Cooper stated in his post-race initerview, Alpha Centauri's success in this prestigious affair has momentous gravity for the esteemed Niarchos operation. One year after taking up the sponsorship, Stavros Niarchos watched this winner's third dam Miesque (Nureyev) capture the first of two for herself and the long love affair with Deauville's feature was sealed. The colts Hector Protector and Exit To Nowhere added two more editions in 1991 and 1992, before Miesque's daughter East of the Moon (Private Account) made it five in 1994. Spinning World dominated in 1996 and 1997, but there had been a long wait since Six Perfections (Fr) (Celtic Swing {GB}) had masterminded an eighth in 2003. Now that she has fulfilled her main European ambition for 2018, Alpha Centauri may be able to enjoy a sojourn at home for the immediate future.

"She is in all the major races in England, but now she has travelled over here we might not want to ask too much of her and she could stay in Ireland," Cooper continued. "The Breeders' Cup Mile is a race we would love to win again, but we'll give her time and see how she comes out of this. We will just savour this moment."

Trainer Jessie Harrington was relishing another landmark in her distinguished training career which is increasingly taking a more serious turn towards the flat.

"She is such a relaxed filly I sometimes have to pinch myself," she said. "I was a little bit anxious beforehand as to whether or not she would wake up, but once on the course she is a different proposition and travelled so well into the race. She's been amazing throughout the season and I'm very proud. I must admit, I thought I must be mad bringing her here to take on colts and older horses. Once given her head, she just kept going away from them and when she does that you hope she's not burning up too much energy because there are several possibilities now. She's in the [Sept. 15 G1] Matron S. at Leopardstown, the [Oct. 6 G1] Sun Chariot at Newmarket and the mile at Ascot [the Oct. 20 G1 Queen Elizabeth II S.] and if she does make it through to the Breeders' Cup, it will have been a very long season by then. She's given me a few sleepless nights, I have to admit that, but it's not quite like training Moscow Flyer as there are no fences to worry about!"

For Recoletos, this was a welcome return to form after his below-par showing when seventh in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. "He has run a great race and all I can say is he did not run his true race at Ascot," trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias said. "In my opinion, it was a shame because one hour before the

race the stewards asked for a blood test on my horse and you can't give injections to him easily. He is very delicate and it turned him upside down. When I came to saddle him, he was mad and that is the reason why he ran so badly."

Pedigree Notes...

Alpha Centauri's dam Alpha Lupi (Ire) (Rahy) never made the racecourse, so the record of her damline for those fillies to have run in this race remains at 100%. Far exceeding the achievements of her Listed Golden Fleece S.-winning and G2 Royal Lodge S.-placed half-brother Tenth Star (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), she is also a fourth generation Classic heroine along with the aforementioned East of the Moon and Miesque.

The latter is the second dam of this year's G1 Prix du Jockey Club protagonist Study of Man (Ire) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who could be Breeders' Cup-bound himself making for potentially a magical presence at the meeting for the Niarchos Family. Karakontie (Jpn) (Bernstein) was the latest member of this dynasty to score there four years ago and it is a family that never takes too long to throw up something high-class. Alpha Lupi's unraced 2-year-old filly by So You Think (NZ) is named Etoile Filante (GB), while she also has a yearling filly by Sea the Moon (Ger). 
In recent times, some smart Brits had come to this race and been turned back with their reputations dented including the short-priced favourites Buratino (Ire) (Exceed and Excel (Aus)), Kool Kompany (Ire) (Jeremy), Strong Suit (Rahy), Art Connoisseur (Ire) (Lucky Story) and Three Valleys (Diesis {GB}). Advertise had followed a progressive trajectory to this point, winning on debut at Newbury May 18 and finishing a neck ahead of Sergei Prokofiev and a length behind Calyx (GB) (Kingman {GB}) when on top of the far-side contingent in Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 19. Taking the July with the minimum of trouble July 12, he had solid claims in a renewal where only one of the rivals he faced was trained outside of a Ballydoyle stable which has been under a cloud for a spell. Despite the widely-held and correct view that racing in Ireland is intensely competitive at the moment, only Jessie Harrington was prepared to mount an offensive to Advertise along with the usual strength in numbers from Rosegreen. Her representative Indigo Balance (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) ran his second consecutive disappointing race and in the end it was the G3 Grangecon Stud S. scorer So Perfect who put it up to the favourite.

Trainer Martyn Meade had been quoted earlier in the week as saying that Advertise would win and so he was largely relieved afterwards. "Some of my comments this week were taken a little bit out of context, but I was being a bit over the top," he admitted. "When you've got great confidence in a horse, you tend to go a bit exuberant but luckily he proved the belief in him was right. He's always been held up in his races, but today wasn't run like that and luckily Frankie took the bull by the horns. Firstly, he'll have a break as I don't believe in overdoing horses and the [G1] Dewhurst [at Newmarket on Oct. 13] is his aim. The big question is if he'll get a mile, but he'll definitely get seven."

The Irish Rover's rider Donnacha O'Brien said of the third, "He's always worked like a smart horse and has run a solid race, but there's probably not much between those good 2-yearolds."



PERSONAL BEST

Twice unsuccessful at the top level in Germany, Godolphin's **Best Solution (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) made it third time lucky on Sunday as he swooped late to capture the G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin at Hoppegarten. Successful on his European 4-year-old bow in the July 12 G2 Princess of Wales's S., the 12-5 favourite



arrived on the scene in the nick of time to overhaul the long-time-leader **Royal Youmzain (Fr)** (Youmzain {Ire}) and **Sound Check (Ger)** (Lando {Ger}) 75 metres from the line and beat the latter by a neck.

Registering a second Group 1 win in this country in the space of two weeks after the stable star Benbatl (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) led the way in the Grosser Dallmayr-Preis, Saeed bin Suroor said, "Best Solution deserved to win a Group 1 race. He beat some good horses when he won the G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket last time and had been in good form at home following that success."

Already well-travelled by the time he took the Listed Lingfield Derby Trial last May, Best Solution had been third in Veliefendi's six-furlong International Trakya Trophy, second in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud and fourth in the UAE 2000 Guineas Trial on dirt at Meydan. Proving a potent force at Lingfield as he had when winning the G3 Autumn S. at Newmarket at two, the bay backtracked under positive tactics when eighth in the G1 Epsom Derby and 10th in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot. Runner-up in the 10-furlong G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis at Munich and fifth in the G1 Grosser Preis Von Baden in September, he returned to winning ways in the G3 St Simon S. back on his favoured soft surface at Newbury in October before going back to the desert for the latest carnival. His best efforts at Meydan were a five-length handicap win Feb. 15 and fifth in the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, but it was not until he wore down Mirage Dancer (GB) (Frankel {GB}) late in the July meeting's middle-distance feature that he suggested he could turn into one of those stalwart older horses his trainer was once so famed for.

Missing the break again here as he has been prone to do throughout his career, Best Solution raced in last early under a patient Pat Cosgrave who kept his cool despite the G1 Deutsches Derby third Royal Youmzain looking to have given the field the slip at the top of the straight. Left with a lot to do two out, he relished the pursuit up the rail and got the gap in time when he needed to switch off and reel in the 3-year-old. As he did so, last year's winner Dschingis Secret (Ger) (Soldier Hollow (GB)) had to be snatched up between him and Sound Check but he looked beaten at the time and it was Best Solution who had the greatest force for the finale.


"An option for him now could be to go to Australia for the [Oct. 12 G1] Caulfield Cup and the [Nov. 6 G1] Melbourne Cup," his trainer continued. "We will talk to His Highness Sheikh Mohammed and he will make the decision."

DUE REWARD

Sir Henry Cecil always said that the three things needed when training racehorses was "patience, patience and patience" and his former assistant David Lanigan was re-asserting the point at Deauville on Sunday as the aptly-named Worth Waiting (GB) (Bated Breath {GB}) forged her way into the limelight in style in the G3 Prix Minerve. Coming off a first black-type success in Newmarket's Listed Aphrodite S. July 21, the 5-1 shot tracked the leading duo throughout the early stages and when given the command by Stephane Pasquier turning for home responded with a strong effort which took her to the front approaching the furlong pole and on to a three-length verdict over Hermaphrodite (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}).

"We thought she was a black-type filly last year and if she had won first time this year she would have gone for an Oaks trial as we saw her as that type," Lanigan said. "She took time to come in her coat early in the season after the bad winter so we took the safer road and it's paying off."

Runner-up to the potentially smart Ganayem (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) and ahead of two subsequent listed winners in Adorable (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) and Magnolia Springs (Ire) (Shamardal) in a strong novice contest over an extended mile at Nottingham on her second start and 3-year-old bow May 11, Worth Waiting was sent to Redcar to break her maiden over a mile and a quarter May 29 before defying a penalty in a novice contest also at that trip at Windsor June 25. Her Aphrodite success was her first

outing over 12 furlongs and her first opportunity to draw on the stamina that flows from her distaff side. Her trainer is keen not to overtax her this term.

"There is some improvement to come and although she is entered in all the group races in England, she also stays in training as a 4-year-old so we'll see," he added. "If she goes to a Group 1, it could be the [Sept. 16 G1] Prix Vermeille [at ParisLongchamp], but we could wait until next season as I think she'll be much better then."

Pedigree Notes...

Lanigan's expectations are in part due to the evidence of the pedigree of Worth Waiting, with the dam being a half-sister to Montare (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) who went on to capture the G1 Prix Royal-Oak at four and a second renewal of the G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris at five. She in turn is the dam of the G1 British Champions Fillies & Mares S. heroine Journey (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), who was runner-up in last year's Vermeille as a 5-year-old.
