BACK TO PARIS FOR GHAIYYATH



Ghaiyyath | Scoop Dyga

Europe's first Group 1 race of the season takes place at ParisLongchamp on Sunday and the responsibility falls on **Ghaiyyath (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) to get a rampant Godolphin operation off the mark in that sphere in the Prix Ganay. Utterly dominant with shades of Dubai Millennium (GB) in the 10-furlong G2 Prix d'Harcourt here last time Apr. 7, his 1 1/2-length advantage over the re-opposing **Soleil Marin (Ire)** (Kendargent {Fr}) was no measurement of his superiority after he was heavily eased close home. Charlie Appleby picked out the 4-year-old as his one to follow from his stable recently and anything other than a win will be a disappointment.

"It was there for everyone to see how impressive he was on his first start as a 4-year-old in the Prix d'Harcourt," he said. "His last two runs have been at Longchamp, so he ticks that particular box in terms of handling the track. He's going another half-furlong on Sunday, but we don't think that will be a problem. If he brings his A-game I think he's the one to beat, but at the same time we are stepping up. If we were lucky enough to win we could look at races like the Prince of Wales's S., but let's get over this hurdle and go from there."

Soleil Marin's trainer Andre Fabre has a better claim at toppling Ghaiyyath with **Waldgeist (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) who is back in action for Gestut Ammerland and Newsells Park Stud following a successful 2018 campaign. [Cont. p2](#)

VARIAN CONFIRMS DUO FOR 1000 GUINEAS

Roger Varian has confirmed he will be double-handed with **Qabala** (Scat Daddy) and **Mot Juste** (Distorted Humor) in the G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas at Newmarket on May 5. The pair pleased Varian in a workout on Friday to rubber-stamp their places in the fillies' Classic over the Rowley Mile next weekend. Qabala leapt to the head of the ante-post market with an impressive victory over her stablemate in the G3 Nell Gwyn S. at Newmarket's Craven meeting, in the hands of David Egan, who has the call in the Guineas and will be competing in his first Classic. Varian has booked William Buick for Mot Juste while Andrea Atzeni serves his riding ban.

"Having come through their work from yesterday morning very well, we are delighted to confirm that Qabala and Mot Juste are very much on course to run in the 1000 Guineas next weekend," the Newmarket trainer said on his website.

Last year's G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud is running over a trip shy of his ideal and is having his first start after a fifth placing in Sha Tin's G1 Hong Kong Vase, so should strip fitter afterwards while the Niarchos Family's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club hero **Study of Man (Ire)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) has to get back on track after a tepid end to his Classic season. Only ninth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe over 12 furlongs here when last seen in October, he has ideal conditions to offer connections some hope for the year ahead.

Godolphin's influence is felt elsewhere on the card with **'TDN Rising Star'** and G3 Prix de Fontainebleau runner-up **Epic Hero (Fr)** (Siyouni {Fr}) tackling the seven-furlong Listed Prix du Pont Neuf and **Morgan Le Faye (GB)** (Shamardal) pointed at the G3 Prix Allez France Longines. The latter was third in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak and G1 Prix du Cadran over extreme trips last term, but showed ample speed for the 10 1/2-furlong Listed Prix Zarkava here last time Apr. 7 and is unexposed in this sphere.

"We are hoping that Morgan Le Faye can confirm her ability over this distance in a group race, as it would open up a lot of options for her this season," Godolphin's Lisa-Jane Graffard commented. "She is in very good form at home and we are very hopeful that she can run another good race. Epic Hero is making a quick reappearance, but Andre Fabre is very happy with the horse and feels that this is a good opportunity over seven furlongs. The feeling was that he didn't get the mile in the Prix de Fontainebleau, when he was beaten by a very good horse in Persian King."

Over at Krefeld, the G3 Dr Busch-Memorial sees the exciting **Noble Moon (Ger)** (Sea the Moon {Ger}) reappear with the weight of the country's expectations on his shoulders. The race is on to see who can provide the sire with a first Classic triumph and Eckhard Sauren's homebred looked tailor-made when beating Django Freeman (Ger) (Campanologist) and the re-opposing **Man On the Moon (Ger)** (Sea the Moon {Ger}) in the G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten over a mile at Cologne in October.

The 1,550,000gns Tattesalls October Book 1 graduate and full-sister to The Pentagon (Ire) among others oozed class on her winning debut at Gowran Park in October, but she is passed over by Ryan Moore in favour of **Pink Dogwood (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}). Only fifth in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at ParisLongchamp in October, she was only beaten over a length on that occasion and appears to be a strong homeworner as the vibes have been strong for her recently. His Highness The Aga Khan's Leopardstown maiden winner **Tarnawa (Ire)** (Shamardal) warrants respect from the Dermot Weld stable.

In the G3 Sequence Events Vintage Crop S., the 2017 G1 St Leger hero **Capri (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) returns as he builds towards an intended tilt at the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot on June 20 and he is joined by stablemate and 2018 Leger third **Southern France (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Success for either would see Aidan O'Brien extend his already remarkable record in this race to nine wins in 14 runnings, with the former staying giants Yeats (Ire), Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Order Of St George (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) on the honour roll.

Successful in the 2017 Listed Washington Singer S. over this trip at Newbury, Hey Gaman was a neck second in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains the following May and probably found the 10 1/2-furlong trip of the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club too far when seventh in that Chantilly Classic in June. Going backwards with a subsequent fifth in the G1 Prix Jean Prat reverting to a mile at Deauville the following month, the imposing bay regained his form when third in the G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein at ParisLongchamp in October. Only 10th under more aggressive tactics in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot a fortnight later, he may have been finding his metier dropping back to seven on this seasonal bow which was arguably a career-best. Committed from the outset by Frankie Dettori, he shook off pace pressure Cardsharp and continued to apply the pressure to some useful rivals and one very smart one in last year's G1 Commonwealth Cup hero Eqtidaar (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}).

"It was faster than he normally runs on, but he let himself down on it," trainer James Tate commented. "He's a big, strong, genuine and brave horse and a straight seven or a mile around a bend suits him well. When it's a straight mile it probably stretches him. There are a couple of nice races at Longchamp over seven and one is at the end of May [the May 30 G3 Prix du Palais-Royal]. He was second in a Group 1 last year and we hope to creep up the ranks. We might get there."

The dam, who was placed in Royal Ascot's Listed Sandringham H. and the G3 International Istanbul Trophy, unfortunately died in 2016 after producing her second foal which turned out to be Godolphin's dual-winning handicapper Marhaban (Ire) also by New Approach. That Hey Gaman finds a mile his maximum is unsurprising given that his family also features the G2 King's Stand S.-winning five-furlong specialist the Tatling (Ire) (Perugino). **Click for the Racing Post result. Taking command with 3 1/2 furlongs remaining, the 5-6 favourite was eased down inside the final 100 yards to inflict a nine-length defeat on So High (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}). The dam is a half-sister to the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic hero Eastern Anthem (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}), the G3 Prix de Conde winner Zeitoper (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) and the Listed Polly S. scorer Kailani (GB) (Monsun {Ger}). They are all out of the operation's G1 1000 Guineas, G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Flower Bowl Invitational-winning European champion Kazzia (Ger) (Zinaad {GB}). He shares his unraced third dam Zarafa (Ire) (Blushing Groom {Fr}) with GSW G1 Criterium International runner-up Earnshaw (Medaglia d'Oro) and hails from a family featuring GSW sire Zayyani (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) and G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Saint-Alary heroine Zainta (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}). OVERSEAS ENTRANTS IN WITH A SHOUT ON CHAMPIONS DAY by Alan Carasso

History was made during December's Longines Hong Kong International Races meeting, as for the first time, the home team swept all four Group 1 events. The locals figure a collective tough nut to crack at Sunday's FWD Champions Day meeting at Sha Tin, but the foreign contingent are a good bet to make their presence felt by day's end.

Exultant (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) won the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase (2400m) in December, battling back gamely inside of Japan's **Lys Gracieux (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) to cement his status as the region's top stayer. Since her runner-up effort, the plan has always been for Lys Gracieux to return to Hong Kong for the QE II and she tuned up for the HK\$24-million test with a very sound second to the very talented Danon Premium (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G2 Kinko Sho last month.

Deirdre (Jpn) (Harbinger {GB}) covered herself in glory on her last visit to the New Territories, running loose-on-the-lead **Glorious Forever (GB)** (Archipenko) to a length in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup and she exits a meritorious fourth to Horse of the Year Almond Eye (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) in the G1 Dubai Turf Mar. 30. The eye-catching **Win Bright (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}) got the better of Deirdre in a successful title defence in the G2 Nakayama Kinen Feb. 24 and could be a factor from reasonably close range. Japanese-based runners have won the QE II four times this century and twice since 2012.

In addition to Exultant, Hong Kong is represented by 'TDN **Rising Star**' and 2018 QE II hero **Pakistan Star (Ger)** (Shamardal), Hong Kong Derby winner **Furore (NZ)** (Pierro {Aus}), to be ridden once again by Hugh Bowman and the beaten Derby favourite **Waikuku (Ire)** (Harbour Watch {Ire}).

The G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize lost some of its intrigue when top local hope Mr Stunning (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) was withdrawn Saturday, but it remains a high-class test, headed by Australia's **Santa Ana Lane (Aus)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}). Like Chautauqua (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), breathtaking winner of the 2016 Chairman's Sprint Prize, the 6-year-old gelding will look to parlay a victory in the G1 T J Smith S. into success at Sha Tin. **Viddora (Aus)** (I Am Invincible {Aus}) was a respectable fourth to Blue Point (Ire) (Shamardal) in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint last month and was passed fit to run Saturday after suffering some lameness issues earlier in the week. **Beat the Clock (Aus)** (Hinchinbrook {Aus}), third in this event last year and a Group 1 winner since, looks the best of the Sha Tin-based gallopers.

The G1 FWD Champions Mile has attracted no foreign entrants, and with good reason, as **Beauty Generation (NZ)** (Road to Rock {Aus}) is a money-back proposition to win the race for the second year running. A victory, as expected, could lead to an appearance in the G1 Yasuda Kinen at Tokyo in early June and a must-see match-up with the aforementioned Danon Premium. The reigning Horse of the Year in Hong Kong, Beauty Generation shoots for nine in a row Sunday afternoon.

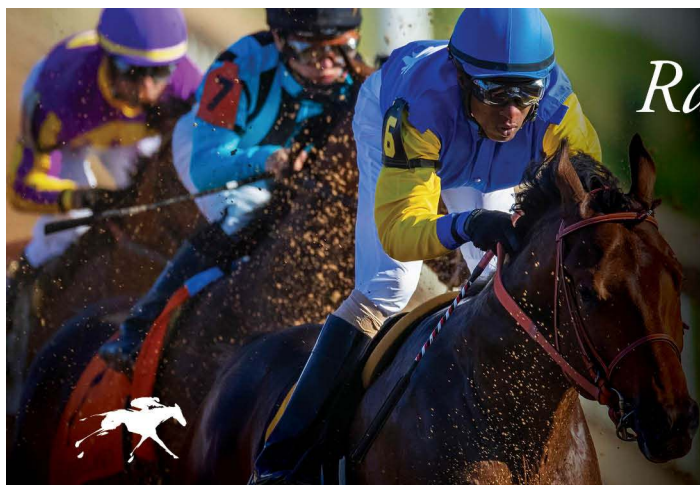

ADRIAN NICOLL: A CHAT WITH THE KING

Adrian Nicoll, Chairman of BBA Ireland, has been coming to Australia for Thoroughbred auctions and racing since 1974. Jo McKinnon caught up with him as he recently attended his 45th Inglis Easter Yearling Sale in Sydney.

In Australian bloodstock circles they call him 'The King'; a nickname conjured during Melbourne Cup week of 2005 when a couple of yearlings he purchased won two Group 1s and a Group 2 race between them. Rising 70 years of age this July, Adrian Nicoll distinctly remembers the first time he made the long journey to our shores, a sliding doors moment that opened up his life in more ways than he could possibly imagine.

"In 1974, BBA Ireland had no representative in Australia in what looked a very up and coming market," he recalled. "So it was decided that my then partner Jonathan Irwin (who left to run Goffs the following year) and I should make an exploratory trip. By sheer luck we boarded a plane in London, lo and behold who gets on but Robert Sangster.

"Back then there was only the front and the back of the bus and needless to say we were at the back. At this stage I didn't know Robert but Jonathan did, so he invited us up to the first-class lounge where we played cards and backgammon for most of the trip. What a great introduction."

That long plane ride was the beginning of a business and personal relationship until Robert's untimely death in 2004.

Pioneering the Stallion Business

"We started buying a few yearlings and mares and he along with John Magnier innovated the shuttling of stallions to Australia," said Nicoll. "This was John's brainchild and I was fortunate he asked me to source the studs to stand the stallions. The first of the shuttle stallions was Mount Hagen (Fr) (Bold Bidder {USA}) who was leased to Newhaven Park Stud in the late 70's.

"I remember flying down to Cowra to meet John Kelly, Sr. which was a pretty frightening experience for a guy in his 20s. I got the impression that he thought 'what is this young fellow doing here?' but we got it done."

Many stallions followed in the footsteps of Mount Hagen, some to the Hunter Valley and others to Victoria and South Australia with mixed success. Godswalk (Dancer's Image {USA}) was the first to make a significant impact, he was followed by a horse who rewrote the Australian Stud Book: Danehill (USA) (Danzig {USA}).

Whilst the stallion business was a major focus in Australia at that time, so too was finding quality yearlings. It was an era where agents had to rely very heavily on their own expert eye and gut instinct. Apart from the pedigree page and physical type, there wasn't much else to base a purchase decision on.

Gut Instinct

“Back in 1974 it was very different to what it is now,” he said. “Everything has got so much more professional including the selling and presentation of yearlings. In those days there was no scoping or X-rays. Then, most of the top-priced yearlings were sold on pedigree and there wasn’t anything like the emphasis there is today on conformation which there should be because if you are buying an athlete you need an athlete.”

European agents in the 70s and 80s had an edge in an era where internet and mobile phones were not the tools relied on today in this information age.

Said Nicoll, “There was very little information on Australian Racing and breeding in Europe and no internet or mobile phones. It was possible in those days to source a relation to a top Australian group performer before it was known in Europe and we sold many fillies and mares this way.”

Having access to Robert was also very beneficial as not only was he a major buyer of bloodstock but also a great seller. Adrian bought a number of very high-class mares from him for Australian clients including Princess Tracy who became one of the great foundation mares in the Australian Studbook.

“Robert was one of the first really entrepreneurial owners of the 20th century,” he said. “He surrounded himself with top trainers and stud masters including Vincent O’Brien and John Magnier in Ireland and Colin

Hayes in Australia. They dominated the yearling market globally until the coming of the Maktoum family in the early 80’s.

“Robert was also very popular on the racecourse, people loved to see him win. He brought great theatre to the racetrack and liked nothing better than having a punt. He was a most generous host and I have great memories of lunches and dinners, his golf tournament in Barbados was a must. Sadly, he died much too young and we all miss him greatly to this day. Robert was the first professional racehorse owner, bringing a business style approach to it.”

In the 90s and 2000s, Adrian enjoyed one of his most successful periods in Australian racing when he teamed up with champion trainers David Hayes and Lee Freedman.

An Affable Character

Lee, now training in Singapore, reflects fondly on those heady days and their association.

“I have great memories of Adrian Nicoll over many years. We were first acquainted when I was 18 or 19 living in Yass at Hardwicke Stud when he visited with Robert Sangster. I thought he was a pompous arrogant pom at the time,” Lee said with a laugh. “For years our paths didn’t cross again until the late 80s and we hooked up and started buying some horses together, mainly through a common friendship with the Magnier family in Ireland and the rest is history.”

“I always found him to be a very affable character who always liked fun and loved a drink, and still does. I always found him to have a heart of gold and to be a good friend over many years.”

The best horse Lee and Adrian selected together was a filly at the Easter sales that went on to become 2005 VRC Oaks (2500m) and 2006 Australian Oaks (2400m) winner, Serenade Rose (Stravinsky).

“I suppose the highlight of our friendship was Serenade Rose,” said Lee. “Adrian picked her out and I have unswerving faith in

his picks of yearlings, particularly fillies--not to say he can’t buy colts--but fillies he’s been outstanding. It’s been his expertise.”

Lee vividly recalls that day in 2004 at the old Inglis Newmarket sales complex.

Said Lee, “He picked this filly out and it was going for about A\$350,000 and I said that’s probably enough, we don’t have any clients. He said well we have come this far and so quite rightly he bought her for A\$400,000.

Later we then sat down over a glass of vino and worked out who we could sell her to.

“It wasn’t too hard. Keith Biggs came to the party and so did Lord Vestey and several others made up the Partnership. What a great filly she was. To win two Oaks and several other group races was a very fine moment.”

Nowadays Adrian operates on a smaller scale. “I am very dependent on a group of loyal clients who I go back with over a long period of time but am quite happy to take on a new one,” he noted.

Australian Industry the Envy of the World

In conjunction with Coolmore and partners he forked out A\$640,000 at the recent Inglis Easter yearling Sale for a Fastnet Rock (Danehill {USA}) x Personify filly from the Cressfield draft. Ironically he purchased her stakes winning dam as a yearling 15 years ago for the Hayes stable and this filly will be trained by David Hayes. **Cont. p3**

In the 40 plus years Adrian's been associated with racing in this country he's observed significant changes and development in the funding of the sport. He comments that strong input from State governments and visionaries such as John Messara has seen the Australian industry become the envy of the world.

"This is the healthiest breeding and racing country in the world," he said. "There is no country that has the prize money you have. That states of NSW and Victoria have more prize money than England, Ireland and France put together. That makes it more viable for people to get into racing and syndication has made it very possible."

A fan of the industry and the Aussie lifestyle, Adrian plans on coming to Australia for many years to come. "It's been a great experience down here, I love coming here, have made some great friends and know a lot of people. You have a great climate and wonderful beaches and restaurants."

So, what is the key to longevity in the cutthroat bloodstock business and 'The King's' advice to the younger generation of bloodstock agents?

"Loyalty, integrity, work hard and always listen," he said. "People are much more knowledgeable than they were in my early years there was nothing like the knowledge there is now."


It's an international business, the world is a village and everyone knows everything in five seconds so the calibre of people working in the industry has to be better as there is huge competition."

And the fundamental thing, he says, is having a love of the horse. "Never forget that you have got to love horses. It's all about the horse and working and learning from good people that know the industry can be very rewarding."

THE NED EVANS ENGINE IN ROADSTER

To those of us who view Arthur Hancock as a beacon not just of professional illumination but also of human warmth, there's only one horse to be rooting for in the Kentucky Derby this year. Because for Hancock to breed another winner, having already raised and/or co-owned three, would add truly senatorial laurels to those earned through the gladiatorial strife of his earlier career. Pending any such fresh consummation of his genius, however, let's be grateful that his own, living legacy has become entwined with the extraordinarily dynamic bequest that keeps alive the memory of Ned Evans.

Nobody can know what fate next has in store for **Roadster** (Quality Road), or the 19 horses still liable to get in his way next Saturday. But Hancock has always had an ear for the whisperings of destiny and couldn't resist sending a mare bought at the Evans dispersal to a stallion also bred by his late friend.

As a result, the GI Santa Anita Derby winner represents a top-to-bottom tribute to a man whose own lack of an heir has ultimately made grateful legatees of us all.

First and foremost, there is the charitable foundation that bears his name, majoring in research into myelodysplastic syndromes of the type that cut down Evans himself, at just 68. Shortly before his death, moreover, Evans gave \$50 million towards a new campus for the Yale School of Management. *See p3*

KENTUCKY DERBY DOINGS: WAR FRONT DUO DRILL AT THE DOWNS

With exactly one week remaining to the GI Kentucky Derby, a pair of War Front colts—one with a growing reputation and the other with a bit of a tarnished image—took to the Churchill Downs main track Saturday morning to turn in their final serious pre-race drills. By all accounts, each worked beautifully and much to the satisfaction of their trainers.

Fox Hill Farm's **Omaha Beach**, who is expected to be one of the favorites if not the top betting choice next Saturday afternoon, breezed five-eighths of a mile in :59 flat under the watchful eye of trainer Richard Mandella, clicking off fractions of :12, :23.60 and :35.40 before galloping out six furlongs in 1:12.80.

THIS SIDE UP

So while it is difficult to argue that his contribution to our sport can ever match those made to somewhat less frivolous endeavours, even a record-breaking \$62-million dispersal (itself a spectacular windfall for the Foundation) cannot put an adequate value on bloodlines since shown to be priceless.

Evans died on the last day of 2010. Horse of the Year, in 2011, was Havre De Grace--a graduate of the only crop sired by Saint Liam (Saint Ballado), bred by Evans and accorded the same accolade himself in 2005. Saint Liam's half-sister Quiet Giant (Giant's Causeway), fresh off a Grade II win, brought \$3 million at the dispersal and her first foal became another Horse of the Year in Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}). And meanwhile, above all, we have seen the rise and rise of Quality Road (Elusive Quality), who covered his first mares at Lane's End just weeks after the loss of his breeder.

Quality Road actually straddles the margin between the Evans who concerns us here, and the Evans whose endowments are making no less impact out in the "real" world. For the Foundation retains eight shares in the stallion--equity, happily, that has gone through the roof after he sired another five Grade I winners last year.

Elevated to a giddy \$150,000, Quality Road is certainly proving immune to vertigo, promptly giving himself a legitimate shot of the Oaks--Derby double between Bellafina and Roadster. But it is his maternal line that compounds the potential for Roadster to carve the ultimate monument to Evans. Because you have to go all the way back to his sixth dam to break the Spring Hill Farm connection, the fifth being one of the first purchases made for the pasture Evans was beginning to acquire around Casanova, Virginia.

Her name was Lunar Dancer, and she was from the third crop of Northern Dancer out of a sister to Lincoln Road, runner-up to Tim Tam in the 1958 Kentucky Derby and Preakness. In time, Evans mated her with Tentam, whose phenomenal dam Tamerett happened to be a daughter of Tim Tam. Hancock will doubtless approve Evans having worked these concentric circles of fate.

(Besides Tentam, who set a world record on turf at Saratoga, Tamerett produced European champion miler Known Fact; Secrettame, dam of Gone West; and is also fourth dam of blue hen Oatsee {Unbridled}).

Lunar Dancer's daughter by Tentam, Intentional Move, gave Evans millionaire Gold Mover (Gold Fever) plus Grade I winner Dance Teacher (Smarten). The latter's daughter Ransom Dance (Red Ransom), though unable to win herself, produced a handful of useful performers and/or producers including Ghost Dancing (Silver Ghost)--who caught Hancock's eye at the Evans dispersal and joined Stone Farm for \$220,000. (Carrying, as it turned out, a subsequent Grade I winner in Ascend {Candy Ride {Arg}}).




Silver Ghost, incidentally, was out of a half-sister to the mother of Quiet Dance, herself dam of Saint Liam and second dam of Gun Runner. So really this is a ball of Evans wool. But Hancock also noticed that Ghost Dancing is out of a half-sister to the dam not only of GI Prioress S. winner Cat Moves (Tale Of The Cat) but also of More Hennessy (Hennessy).

More Hennessy only managed one start but was carrying a foal by the rookie Quality Road when purchased by Barronstown Stud for \$360,000 at the dispersal. That foal turned out to be Quality Road's first elite performer, Royal Ascot and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Hootenanny. That settled it for Hancock, who sent Ghost Dancing to Quality Road.

Another first-crop son of Quality Road to achieve synergy with an Evans family was Blofeld, sold in utero with his dam Storm Minstrel (Storm Cat) to Keats-Grove Farm for \$150,000 at the dispersal. Blofeld won two Grade IIs as a juvenile and one of his owners, the estimable Joe Minor, duly alerted to the promise of the sire, sent his mare Akron Moon (Malibu Moon) to Lane's End the following spring. The result is Bellafina.

Evans built families on performance, believing it created its own value. He was immune to commercial fads and, his Jack Russells apart, evidently was no more of a bonhomous sentimentalist than you would expect in the son of a pioneer of the hostile takeover. His father, of course, won the 1981 Derby with Pleasant Colony. But if Roadster can emulate that success then the Evans legacy, through the providential agency of Hancock, will be crowned by something that--well, darn it, something that just feels right.

At the behest of owner Rick Porter, Omaha Beach breezed in company. His workmate, the stakes-winning Kowboy Karma (Kodiak Kowboy), was supposed to break off just ahead of Omaha Beach, but instead ran off and put four lengths on his company. Julien Leparoux, who was tabbed to put Omaha Beach through his paces in the absence of big-race rider Mike Smith, took a hold of his mount, allowed him to draw on even terms in upper stretch and the duo finished well clear of Kowboy Karma.

“I just wanted him to have one more good work; that’s all he needed,” Mandella said. “He got it today. They were supposed to go off together, but it all worked out fine. He went and got him. I really liked that he settled right down after the work. He acts like a professional racehorse. I don’t think this work took much out of him at all. It couldn’t have gone better. It’s all working out just right.”

“I’m glad to have it [the work] done. You need to get past all the obstacles. This is one of the big ones. I’m glad it’s over.”

Mandella, who has not had a Derby starter in 15 years, is clearly relishing the experience with a colt that has taken him there.

“I’ve never had a 3-year-old doing this well this early. He’s just special,” Mandella said. “Since the Rebel [his victory in a division of the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park Mar. 16], he’s filled out and just gotten better. He’s pure class. And he’s a kind horse. A horse that’s easy to be around.”


Gary Barber’s **War of Will** trained and ran like a horse that could be the Derby favorite with commanding victories in the GIII Lecomte S. and GII Risen Star S. before going down to defeat as a long odds-on selection after losing his hind-end action briefly in the GII Louisiana Derby and emerging muscle-sore.

Whatever may have been ailing War of Will seems a thing of the past, as he fired a bullet half-mile in :47.60 Saturday morning.

With jockey Tyler Gaffalione at the controls, War of Will was clocked in splits of :12, :24 and :36.20 before drawing well clear of a stablemate. His five-furlong gallop-out was timed in 1:00 flat with six panels in 1:13.60.

“What you got to see this morning, if you weren’t impressed with him this morning, I don’t know what we’re supposed to do,” Casse said. “The [workmate] was only there for about an eighth of a mile. I don’t know how you could ask for a horse to work any better than he just did.”

Additionally, Gaffalione believes he will be sitting on a ‘horse for the course’ come next Saturday.

“Every track that he’s run over he handles fine, but he especially loves this track,” Gaffalione said. “I don’t know what it is—it might be all the people. I think he knows he’s a star so he likes the attention. I’ve been so high on this horse since I first got on him. I worked him here before he broke his maiden [last November]. The thing about him now is he’s just all together mentally.”

“He went a little faster than we wanted early on and the last thing I wanted to do was do too much with him right now. Then, when he left the lead horse, he lazed a little bit and it was fine. I wanted 1:02 and out in 1:15 and that’s exactly how he went. We don’t need to see anything spectacular right now from him in the morning and he’s never going to do that anyway. I actually really like the way he was doing it. He did it so easy once he leveled off and was moving great.”

UAE Derby Runner-Up Drills at SLR Downs...

Gray Magician (Graydar), second to Plus Que Parfait at Meydan four weeks ago, had Drayden Van Dyke in the irons when working five furlongs in 1:00.40 Saturday morning at the San Luis Rey Downs training center in Southern California.

“He worked super and came home really well,” trainer Peter Miller said. “I couldn’t be happier with how he did it. He came home (his final quarter-mile) in :23 1/5 and that was very good. He galloped out another eighth in 1:12 2/5. This is a fast race track here, but it was the way he did it.

He added, “Drayden came and worked him and the horse really did it on his own. He just shook the reins at him once and he opened up on his workmate. He started out about three lengths behind him and finished about 12 lengths ahead. Drayden got along well with the horse and in all likelihood, unless the owners think otherwise, he would ride him [in the Derby]. As long as he comes out of the work well tomorrow, he will ship on Monday.”

PARADISE WOODS BACK TO WINNING

WAYS IN SANTA MARGARITA *by Alan Carasso*

Backed as if she couldn’t lose Saturday’s GII Santa Margarita S. at Santa Anita, ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ **Paradise Woods** (Union Rags) made her off odds of 3-5 look generous in demolishing seven overmatched and outclassed rivals.

Looking for her first victory since romping home in the 2017 GI Zenyatta S., Paradise Woods broke smoothly from the widest alley in the field of eight and was kept well off the inside and well away from ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ **Just A Smidge** (Into Mischief), who set a fair pace at the fence. Always traveling on the bridle and well within herself, Paradise Woods eased into the lead under her own courage passing the three-eighths marker, was wide off the final turn and cantered in to win as she pleased. **La Force (Ger)** (Power {GB}), the only of Paradise Woods’s rivals that was remotely in the market at 5-2, ran on to complete a chalky exacta.

Third in the 2017 GI Breeders’ Cup Distaff and runner-up to eventual champion Unique Bella (Tapit) in that year’s GI La Brea S., Paradise Woods was winless in three tries in 2018 and joined the Shirreffs barn for a 5-year-old campaign. Fifth in the GII Santa Monica S. Feb. 16, she rounded out the triple in the GI Beholder Mile S. Mar. 30.

“She has tremendous ability and we need repeatable performances and we need her to develop a style,” said winning trainer John Shirreffs. “As you saw today, she was sitting there relaxed, she was just off that filly, but she wasn’t pulling. This is very gratifying because Marty Wygod really wanted to campaign her this year and there was a lot of criticism about not breeding her.”

One of six winners from as many to race for her unraced dam, a half-sister to British Group 3 and U.S. Grade III winner Tajaaweed (Dynaformer) and from the extended female family of Mr. Greeley and GI Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense, Paradise Woods has a yearling full-brother. Wild Forest was barren to Tapit for 2019.

BLITZKRIEG A SAN FRANCISCO TREAT

Claimed for \$25,000 three starts back, **Blitzkrieg** (War Front) remained undefeated in three runs for his new connections and gave his wildly successful stallion his newest graded winner when parlaying an ideal trip into victory in Saturday's GIII San Francisco Mile at Golden Gate Fields.

Ideally drawn in gate two, Blitzkrieg broke running and had inside position, but Rafael Bejarano was only too happy to allow longshot **Many Roses** (Many Rivers) to take over before guiding his mount into the two path to watch that front-runner's every move. Allowed to stride into the lead midway on the second turn, the second favorite pinched a winning break into the final three-sixteenths of a mile and was always holding a late rally from favored **River Boyme (Ire)** (Dandy Man {Ire}) in the run to the wire. The latter found a decent position in midfield and one off the inside after breaking from gate 10, but was shuffled back a bit nearing the half-mile, was wide into the lane and ran with credit for second. **Choo Choo** (English Channel) raced prominently throughout and held well to be third.

Unplaced in his first six runs for Perry and Ramona Bass and trainer Richard Mandella, Blitzkrieg got the job done for a \$50,000 tag at Del Mar last November. Off the board in a pair of Santa Anita starter races, the dark bay was claimed out of a victory down the hill Jan. 19, took a Feb. 17 starter allowance by 6 1/2 lengths and most recently added a 2 1/2-length allowance tally Mar. 31.

Pedigree Notes:

The 46th group/graded winner and 82nd black-type winner for his sire and bred on the same cross responsible for G1SW Helene Super Star (ex Lines Of Battle), Blitzkrieg is a half-brother to the 2-year-old colt High Tide (Malibu Moon), a yearling Medaglia d'Oro filly and a filly by Ghostzapper foaled this past Feb. 22.

KEENELAND'S SPRING MEET CLOSSES STRONG

The 2019 spring meet at Keeneland concluded Friday with strong cumulative results in wagering and attendance.

Opening on a Thursday for the first time in 60 years, Keeneland saw on-track attendance for the 16-day meet total 242,547 with average daily attendance of 15,159. All-sources wagering on Keeneland racing totaled \$153,116,119, with average daily all-sources wagering at \$9,569,757. On-track wagering was \$16,490,636, with average daily on-track handle at \$1,030,665.

While overall attendance and wagering were slightly down from last year, Toyota Blue Grass Day set a record for an opening Saturday crowd of 34,775 fans in attendance.

Keeneland Meet Wrap cont.

Single-day all-sources handle for the 11-race Blue Grass card totaled a record \$25,809,20 with several other single-day records also broken that day, including the daily double pool at a record \$249,934. The following Saturday, another multiple graded-stakes program anchored by the GI Coolmore Jenny Wiley S., was witnessed by 34,527 patrons.

Keeneland offered record average daily purses of \$770,618 this spring, up 7.84% from last year, to rank among the richest in North America. The leading trainer was Wesley Ward with 11 victories, while Florent Geroux earned the leading jockey title with 15 wins. Four owners tied for the leading owner title with three visits to the winner’s circle each: Kirk Wycoff’s Three Diamonds Farm; Kosta Hronis’s Hronis Racing; Khalid Abdullah’s Juddmonte Farms; and Robert J. Edwards, Jr.’s eFive Racing Thoroughbreds.

“The extraordinary support and sense of pride the Central Kentucky community demonstrates time and again for Keeneland are truly gratifying,” said Keeneland President and CEO Bill Thomason. “Keeneland’s success is a team effort with contributions from horsemen, sponsors, media partners, local businesses and hospitality, staff, and most of all, our loyal fans. They are the reason we strive to create the most memorable racing experiences possible for each of our guests.”

The TDN has polled some of the top riders in the history of the sport and asked them to answer this simple question: If given a choice of any of the 20 starters in the GI Kentucky Derby, who would you choose to ride? We continue the series with Hall of Famer Eddie Delahoussaye, who won the Derby in 1982 with Gato Del Sol and the following year with Sunny’s Halo.

“It’s so wide open, but if I had to pick one, I guess I would pick Game Winner, because he’s so consistent. He keeps just getting beat, just getting beat, and you can’t throw him out. It’s like riding a bicycle. You have to keep at it. He keeps trying, keeps trying. He’s a horse who will like the added distance and he never quits. He’s been tested where a lot of these horses, like Mandella’s horse, Omaha Beach, he was tested the other day, but he had run two easy races before that. He’s a good horse, too, though. Like I said, it’s wide open. But Game Winner is just a consistent horse, and if he runs on that day--and we know it’s which horse runs that day--then he’s the horse to beat.

He’s a horse you have to encourage along. That’s what I’ve heard about him. You can’t just sit chilly. I think it’s a good thing, because he has such stamina. You ask him to go and he keeps going. A lot of these horses don’t want to go a mile and a quarter; that’s the way our breed has changed.”

Coming in off a career-best Beyer Speed Figure of 81 in a fourth-place finish in the Gazebo S. Mar. 23 at this distance behind fellow Bachelor entrant Gray Attempt, **'TDN Rising Star'** Nitrous was primed for a top effort here.

Outsprinted in sixth as they flew up front through fractions of :21.31 and :44.26, the gray began to wind up on the far turn, and came thundering down the stretch down the center for a good-looking victory.

"He ran a very good race today," trainer Steve Asmussen said. "I think the race last time didn't go his way. Ricardo [Santana Jr.] wanted another chance at him. He let him settle today and he came home beautifully."

Therapist has been running exclusively in black-type events since he broke his maiden at first asking in July 2017. He came into the Elusive Quality with five black-type wins and a placing in last year's Gill Palm Beach S. Last seen finishing third in the Tropical Park Derby at Gulfstream Dec. 29, he took the last four months off and went to post here as a first-time gelding.

Undefeated in three previous trips over the Belmont turf, Therapist trailed the field behind fractions of :23.46 and :47.60. Coming off the turn, he was still last. He tried to sneak through on the rail, but got squeezed and had to check. Therapist then split horses, swung wide, and dug in with grit to run down the leader, getting up just in time to secure the victory.

Jo Jo Air took it to heavily favored Bulletin (City Zip) from the get-go and proved best in the lane to pull off the upset. The dark bay finished last of 12 against males in the Indian Summer S. Oct. 7 before breaking her maiden emphatically Nov. 18 at Fair Grounds. Filling out the superfecta in a Gulfstream optional claimer when last seen Jan. 11, the \$325,000 KEESEP graduate was let go as the distant fourth choice here as the money poured in on undefeated Breeders' Cup winner Bulletin.
